SHOWING HER MEDAL

Dr. Karen Sanderson, sitting alongside trainer Paul d'Arcy, handed John Ferguson the rare defeat when

outdueling the Darley rep for yesterday's session topper at Keeneland September, a striking Medaglia d'Oro--Amizette filly, for \$1.1 million. Tom Evans's Trackside Farm consigned the bay for breeders Liberation Farm and Stonewall Farm. The fireworks came midway through Thursday's fourth session and entertained those in attendance, as the two parties locked horns around the \$600,000 mark and exchanged salvos until d'Arcy launched the winning bid from the left side of the sales pavilion.

"I knew it was Ferguson back there," Sanderson said with a wry smile. "Let the best man win, but I have enormous respect for John."

Produced by the 16-year-old Amizette (Forty Niner), the filly's half-brother went on a tear in Ireland since the publication of the September catalogue. King of Rome (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), won the G3 Meld S. and G2 Royal Whip S. in successive starts in July and August. The three-year-old colt is owned by Coolmore associate Derrick Smith.

An oral surgeon based near London, Sanderson is a new and welcome face to American sellers. It is Sanderson and d'Arcy's first trip to Keeneland September; the filly was the second of three purchases for the team. Earlier in the session, d'Arcy signed the ticked for hip 972, an Afleet Alex--Real Cat colt for \$75,000, and later went to \$120,000 for hip 1132, an Indian Charlie--Christmas Affair filly. D'Arcy said the strength of the British pound versus the American dollar was a factor in making the transatlantic trip.

Speaking of yesterday's topper, Sanderson offered, "We thought she was a very good purchase. We have a lot of confidence in King of Rome, and she's a fine filly who walks very well. Paul thought she was probably the nicest filly of the day. We came to buy the best, and we think we've done that. We knew she was going to be expensive, but we came with a purpose and decided to just go for it." *Cont. p2, Top Fillies cont. p4*

D'Arcy, whose training yard is in Newmarket, added, "She was very athletic, she's got a very good page. She has a nice, deep chest with plenty of heart room, a good eye; you don't have much more to go on than that."

Sanderson currently has a small three-horse string with d'Arcy, and hopes to be able to build a strong international stable capable of competing on the world's stage. She has raced a few horses in America and has one broodmare at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway.

Sanderson is from Aintree, home of the Grand National, and says she has spent all her life around horses.

"But I kind of got into [owning horses] by default, through a patient," said Sanderson. "I had a patient who trained jumpers, and that's how it started."-LM

A Golden Partnership...

In 2006, Liberation Farm's Rob Whiteley partnered with Stonewall Farm to buy approximately 25 mares meant for Stonewall's burgeoning stallion roster. The mares, acquired primarily at Keeneland's January and

November Sales, ranged in price from \$40,000 to \$175,000. Remarkably, two yearlings from that group have accounted for a pair of seven-figure transactions at the September sale, including yesterday's topper, the \$1.1 million Medaglia d'Oro--Amizette filly. Two days earlier, during Tuesday's session, an El Prado (Ire)--


Swift and Classy colt bred by Liberation and Stonewall was knocked down to Legends Racing for \$1 million. Whiteley had selected Swift and Classy, with that colt in utero, at the '06 November Sale and purchased her for \$75,000.

"Rob's the master at finding value when picking out mares, so we let Rob select them, he and I would inspect them, and then we'd figure out which of the stallions to send them to," explained Stonewall's Bert Welker.

Another of those purchases was Amizette, a daughter of Broodmare of the Year Courtly Dee whom Liberation and Stonewall purchased for \$90,000--in foal to One Cool Cat--at the '06 January Sale. Whiteley purchased the mare with Medaglia d'Oro in mind and, after being sent to the big El Prado (Ire) son that spring, Amizette produced yesterday's topper on Apr. 25 of last year. Amizette, in foal to Stonewall's A.P. Warrior, sold for \$75,000 at the 2008 January sale to Pilltown Stud.

In the meantime, Amizette's Medaglia d'Oro daughter developed into a fine prospect, and Whiteley was cautiously optimistic of his chances coming into this sale despite selling on Day 4.

"She deserved to bring that level, but it's always hard to know on Thursday whether that's realistic to expect," he said. "But she combines everything. Physically, she's scopey and athletic, and she's by the most promising sire I've been around at this stage. No one expected Medaglia d'Oro to have two-year-olds, and in my opinion, he has the favorite for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies [C.S. Silk]. When she won the GIII Arlington Washington Lassie S., she went: 45 and change in a gallop and then drew away in a gallop. She could be any kind of filly. And King of Rome [the filly's half-brother] has come up with two smashing group wins since the catalogue, and I truly hope they bring him over here. I'd love to be able to breed to a stallion from that family, which is the other thing she had going for her. In my opinion, it's one of the two or three American families of all time."

One notable point regarding the sales of the aforementioned million-dollar yearlings is the relatively advanced ages of both Amizette and Swift and Classy when they were purchased by Whiteley. Bucking popular trends, Whiteley secured Amizette when she was 14; Swift and Classy was 15. The former, a half-sister to the brilliant champion Althea, had been through the ring four times before Whiteley purchased her. Bloodstock Advisory bought her, in foal to A.P. Indy, from Middlebrook Farm for \$1.4 million at the 1999 November Sale. She RNA'd for \$475,000 the following year while in foal to Kris S., then sold three years later, in foal to In the Wings (GB), for 35,000gns to B.B.A. Ireland Ltd. In her fourth appearance under the hammer, at the 2005 Tattersalls July Sale, Amizette sold to J. O'Byrne for 150,000gns while in foal to Cool Coal Cat. She had yet to produce a stakes horse prior to being purchased by Whiteley.

"I'm very appreciative of Stonewall to let me pick out mares that would fit their stallions, and to work with Bert Welker in the selection process and in the matings," said Whiteley. "To have two million-dollar yearlings to come out of our initial efforts is way beyond our expectations."

Asked if he expected to team with Whiteley in future ventures, Welker said, "I sure hope so." -LM



Afleet Alex Colt Heading Overseas...

A colt from the first crop of champion Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) out of multiple graded stakes winner Solvig (Caerleon) will be heading to Europe after selling to Shadwell Estate Company Ltd for a final bid of \$600,000. "He's by a new sire, and we'll try him in England," said Shadwell's Rick Nichols. "The female family is all turf--we'll see if Afleet Alex will work over there." Solvig, with this foal in utero, sold at the 2007 Keeneland January sale for \$750,000. The mare was purchased by Dave and Adrian Munro's Highfield Farm and the yearling was co-bred by Highfield and Margaux Farm. Margaux Farm consigned the colt and the farm's Steve Johnson said the price was well over the reserve. "The reserve was definitely not a factor," Johnson confirmed. "We had enough interest in the horse where we hoped to be in that kind of situation, but you don't really expect to be. Everybody was on him, and they had every reason to be. It just so happened that the stars lined up, the people lined up and raised their hands, and it worked out for us. I'm really happy for Dave Munro. We owned a little piece of her, but Dave owned most of him." Highfield, based in Alberta, Canada, owns approximately seven broodmares in various partnerships in Kentucky. "We are very excited," said Adrian Munro. "It was more than we expected. We were hoping to get \$500,000, so to get \$600,000 is a very positive result. This was our first Kentucky crop under the Highfield banner, so we're very excited. We have seven mares in Kentucky and about 26 in Alberta." Solvig, who won the 2000 GIII Regret S. and GIII Pucker Up S., has a weanling colt by Seeking the Gold and was covered by Smart Strike this past spring. Out of Incha (GB) (Nashwan), Solvig is a half sister to graded-stakes placed Lady Carlock (Chester House). In addition to Solvig, Highfield's broodmare band also includes Argentinian champion Netherland (Arg), whose yearling by Vindication sold for \$145,000 yesterday. Solvig is in foal to Smart Strike and has a weanling by Seeking the Gold which Munro expects to sell at Keeneland next September. -JM



Legends Lands Tiznow, Gone West Colts...

Legends Racing continued to be active during yester-day's fourth day of selling, landing a quartet of horses, including the day's top two colts. Leading the way was a son of Tiznow from the family of dual Grade I winner November Snow (Storm Cat). With trainers Bob Baffert and D. Wayne Lukas in tow, Legends' Olin Gentry signed the ticket for hip 1224 at \$700,000.

When informed they had purchased Thursday's highest-priced colt, Lukas quipped, "We're not happy about that; we'd have rather bought him for \$500,000."

Joking aside, Lukas said there was plenty to recommend the colt, not the least of which is his red-hot sire. "I've had good luck with Tiznow; I had a world champion with him [Folklore], and Bob's had good luck with him," said Lukas. "So it pretty much cemented it--he's our kind of horse. And we all liked the colt a lot; there were a lot of things about him that you'd have to like. He's a horse that might get two turns, with his pedigree."

The Feb. 26-foaled dark bay, catalogued through the consignment of Lane's End as hip 1224, was produced by the unraced Indian Snow (A.P. Indy), a daughter of November Snow. Indian Snow is a three-parts sister to Grade II-placed November Slew (Seattle Slew). Hip 1224 was bred by Dell Ridge Farm in Kentucky.

Legends also nabbed hip 1255, a flashy-looking son of Gone West for \$625,000. Hailing from the consignment of Top Line Sales, agent, the colt is a son of the 12-year-old Phone Trick mare Laptop, a half-sister to the \$1.1 million KEEJAN yearling and SW Value Plus (Unbridled's Song), GSW Roll Hennessy Roll (Hennessy), etc.

Through the end of trading Thursday, Legends had purchased 19 horses for \$9,920,000, an average of \$522,105. Legends ranks the third-leading buyer at September. Lukas added that he hopes some of those buys will land the Legends team on the Kentucky Derby trail in 2010.

"We're excited about getting back in the Classic arena, and I think sparks are going to fly when these things start hitting the race track," he said. -LM

Big Score for New Operation Top Line...

Jim "Jimbo" Gladwell doesn't turn 25 until next week, but got an early birthday present when a Gone West colt from his Top Line Sales consignment, hip 1255, was knocked down to Legends Racing for \$625,000. It was the third-highest price for a horse yesterday and represented a big pinhooking coup. The colt, out of the Phone Trick mare Laptop, was acquired earlier this year for \$135,000 at the Keeneland January Sale.

"We helped short list and picked him out," said Gladwell, son of respected juvenile pinhooker and Florida horseman Jimmy Gladwell. Blue Sky Stables signed the ticket for the colt in January. Gladwell declined to the name principals.

Gladwell and his girlfriend, Torie Burns, started Top Line Sales earlier this year. They offered their first group of yearlings at Fasig-Tipton July and also sold at the OBS August Sale.

"We started the consignment this year, but we've been pinhooking weanlings to yearlings for the past few years," explained Gladwell. The operation is based out of Ocala, Florida, on the same property on which the Gladwell family runs a prepping operation.

Top Line brought 11 yearlings up to September. The first two went through the ring yesterday. In addition to the Gone West colt, Top Line sold a Forest Danger--Trust Fund colt to Zayat Stables for \$275,000. The colt was another pinhook, having been purchased for \$190,000 at the 2007 KEENOV Sale by B.T. Wilson.

Gladwell estimates 75 percent of the consignment is made up of weanling-to-yearling pinhooks; the remaining horses are being offered by their breeders.

Gladwell and Burns were all smiles back at Barn 38 shortly after the colt sold toward the end of the day.

"We couldn't be happier," he said. "He's a classy horse. Physically, he's balanced, he's put together right-he's got all the features."

Some of those features include an interesting paint job. The eye-catching chestnut had four white socks that extended to his knees, along with a broad white blaze and a large splash of white on his belly.

"We only had two people said they didn't like the white," said Burns. "Other than that, everybody liked him. But we did think about painting him black before we brought him here."

As for the future, Gladwell hopes to main Top Line's current modest size. "The industry doesn't need another Eaton or another Taylor Made--those guys do a great job of it--but we felt that if somebody has a specialneeds horse or a horse that needs a certain spot, that we can help them out." -LM

Winchell Buys Back Into Summerly's Family...

Five years ago at the 2003 September Sale, Ron Winchell spent \$410,000 for a daughter of Summer Squall. Named Summerly, the filly went on to win the



GI Kentucky Oaks and over \$900,000 for the Winchell family. Winchell returned Summerly to the sales ring in 2006 as a multiple graded stakes winning broodmare prospect and she sold to WinStar Farm for \$3.3 million. Yesterday at Keeneland, Winchell had the opportunity to buy back into the family. Sitting next to long-time Winchell farm manager David Fiske, Winchell bid \$540,000 for hip number 1209, a Summerly NTRA.com daughter of Giant's Causeway out of

Summerly's dam, Here I Go (Mr. Pros-

pector). Winchell cited the yearling's close relationship to Summerly as the primary attraction. "We owned Summerly, we won the Oaks with her, so obviously we were drawn back to the family," Winchell said. Asked if the yearling looked like her Classic-winning sister, Winchell said, "Not really." Winchell currently has a broodmare band of around 25 and admitted he is already looking ahead to adding this yearling to the group. "We're looking ahead," he said. "I sold Summerly and I wanted to go back in the family and find a nice filly to bring back and use in our breeding operation." Tom VanMeter purchased Here I Go as a Keeneland April juvenile in 1998 for \$500,000. Here I Go's 2008 two-year-old by Tale of the Cat sold this past April for \$800,000. VanMeter co-bred the Giant's Causeway yearling and she was consigned through his Eaton Sales. Here I Go has a weanling colt by Bernardini and was covered this year by Harlan's Holiday. -JM

A.P. Indy Colt Brings \$500k...

Darley representative John Ferguson went to \$500,000 for a son of A.P. Indy out of the Fusaichi Pegasus mare Piu Bella to lead the early action yesterday. "A.P. Indy's one of the great sires in the United States, and this was a very good-moving horse," Ferguson said after signing the ticket in back. "And he comes from a good farm in Brookdale; I saw him a few times down there and loved the fact that he was an athletic horse."

Brookdale Sales consigned the colt for his breeders, International Equities Holding, which purchased Piu Bella for \$250,000 as a yearling at this sale five years ago. Piu Bella never made it the races for International Equities, the bloodstock operation of Oussama Aboughazale, but has paid immediate dividends in the breeding shed. This was her first foal. Piu Bella is a halfsister to graded winners Smooth Runner (Local Talent) and Hidden Assets (Mt. Livermore).

Aboughazale, who was born in Jerusalem in 1943, is a resident of Santiago, Chile, where he operates a largescale fruit and produce business. Aboughazale may be more familiar to race fans as the owner of Sumaya Us Stables, the banner under which he races. Among Sumaya Us's best runners are graded winner Newfoundland (Storm Cat), who now stands at Brookdale, and the Grade I winner Wild Spirit (Chi) (Hussonet). -LM

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Coolmore/Darley Thaw?

Two years ago, it was widely report that the principals at Darley and Coolmore had engaged in a sort of unofficial boycott of each other. Absent from Coolmore's shopping list were horses by Darley stallions, and Coolmore-bred or -sired horses rarely if ever found their way into the Darley camp. Well, if there was such a boycott, there is evidence of a thaw. Yesterday, Darley's John Ferguson purchased hip 1127, a colt by Mr. Greeley out of the Storm Cat mare Cherokee. The colt, consigned by Padraig Campion's Blandford Stud, was bred by Strategy Bloodstock, which is believed to be a Coolmore-related entity.

In 2000, Coolmore purchased Cherokee's dam, Totemic, for \$1.075 million at the Keeneland November Sale. A foal of 2002, Cherokee, also bred by Strategy Bloodstock, broke her maiden on debut in the G3 Round Tower S. in 2004 while racing for Mrs. John Magnier and Michael Tabor.

It should be noted that last summer, Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne paid €400,000 for a yearling colt by Haafhd (GB), and also purchased a yearling by Cape Cross (Ire). Haafhd stands Shadwell Stud, which is owned by Sheikh Mohammed's brother, Sheikh Hamdan, while Cape Cross stands at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland. -LM

Hockey Star Craig Drops in at September...

Union on its way to a gold medal, stopped in to check things out at Keeneland after giving a motivational speech in Lexington yesterday morning. Craig, a goalie who later played in the NHL for the Boston Bruins, Minnesota North Stars and Atlanta Flames, said he wasn't shopping, but was appreciating the beauty and history of Keeneland. "I just enjoy watching horse racing--I think the jockeys are amazing athletes, as

well as the horses," said Craig, who now lives near Boston. Craig also was assembling a sort of fantasy stable. "I'm just excited because I picked out a horse I liked--hip 946 [a Stormy Atlantic filly purchased by Lavin Bloodstock for \$360,000]," he laughed. "I'm not sure; I just liked the way she looked. Now I can follow her and see if she gets good. I'll put her in my computer." He added, "I spent a lot of money on boats; maybe I'll come back and do this someday." -LM

Penn Brothers Shoot, Score....

Six years ago, John Penn was leading a mare down to the sales pavilion during the Keeneland November Sale when he saw Street Scene (Ire) (Zafonic) walk by. Penn was struck by her size--she stood 17.1 hands-and impressed with her conformation. A day later, the four-year-old Irish-bred, in foal to Parade Ground, was his. The follicle-ly challenged Penn purchased the mare in partnership with his brother Frank for \$17,000 as Chromedome Partners.

"There was no research, no nothing," Penn said of the mare, a half-sister to South African Group 1 winner Chief Advocate (Ire) (Law Society) who had sold for roughly \$200,000 as a Deauville August yearling in 1999.

That first foal didn't amount to much, but Street Scene has developed into a nice producer for the Penns since. Her second foal is the four-year-old Traffic Guard (More Than Ready), who over the weekend ran New Approach (Ire) to a half-length in the G1 Champion S. at Leopardstown.

That effort didn't hurt the chances of hip 1001, a half-brother to Traffic Guard from the second crop of Grade I winner Toccet, who yesterday was knocked down to Amerman Racing for \$335,000. John Amerman stood with his bloodstock agent Bob Feld in the back while the bidding transpired.

Hip 1001 is a big, strapping fellow, which wasn't necessarily what Penn was going for when he selected Toccet as a sire.

"I was trying to breed a horse that's not a monster," Penn explained when asked why he chose Toccet. "We've been breeding her to short horses--Toccet's not very tall. We bred her to English Channel this year, and if that one comes out the same size, maybe I'll go the other way and breed to Dynaformer."

Of his Toccet colt, Penn added that, "For a horse his size, he's a very good mover."

This spring, Street Scene produced a More Than Ready full-brother to Traffic Guard.

"It's been a lot of fun watching him run--I wish he'd win one," said Penn of the Jane Chapple-Hyam runner, whom the Penns sold for \$60,000 at the 2005 September Sale. "He's been second or third in five [group] stakes, and in four of those he's been beaten a half length, a head, a head, and a length."

The Penns have a long history in the horse business-their father and grandfather began operating in the 1930s. They currently have a farm in Bourbon Co. in Kentucky. -LM

More of the Same at Keeneland Thursday...

The fourth day of the Keeneland September sale offered more of the same, as figures remained consistently off last year's statistics. For the session, the average was down 13.4 percent and the median declined 16.7 percent. Through four days, the average fell 14.2 percent to \$244,562. The median was down 10 percent to \$125,000. The buy-back rate was down for the second straight session, coming in at 27.6 percent. The total buy-back rate remains up 3.3 percent at 28 percent, compared to 27.1 percent a year ago. "The market is broader at these levels [during the open sessions], so we're hoping the broadness of this market will help," commented Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. Russell continued to be satisfied with the falling buy-back rate. "The not-sold rate reflects the consignors' ability to adapt to the market," he said. "It is a challenge to gauge this changing market and to get these horses sold and they should be commended for being able to adapt to these changes." Russell did observe that the presence of a seven-figure yearling on day four was proof that buyers were still willing to pay for quality individuals. "The comment that we all use, and overuse, is very apparent today with a \$1.1-million horse on Thursday, 'a good horse sells,'" he said. With a dark day on Friday, the Keeneland September sale resumes Saturday at 10 a.m.

ginning Monday, Sept. 15, Margaret Layton, who was Marketing Director at Three Chimneys for nearly two decades, can be found "doing cards" at Barn 44 for her family's Loch Lea consignment. Layton went out on her own this year as Layton Communications, providing mar-

keting, public relations and media relations services to a variety of Thoroughbred and non-Thoroughbred clients. The intimate consignment (hip 2906 sells Tuesday, and hips 3775 and 4044 on Friday) varies quite distinctly from the 'air traffic controller' role she played with the much larger Three Chimneys consignments. Layton laughs, "after working for an operation the size of Three Chimneys for so long, I think I can handle our [considerably smaller] consignment." Layton said she was looking forward to renewing old acquaintances next week. "So far, most of the work I'm doing is for non-horse clients; I love to get back to the sales to see familiar faces and let people know what I'm up to." The Loch Lea consignment wraps up the following Tuesday with hips 5439 and 5473.



NEWSELLS PARK'S JACOBS DIES

Klaus Jacobs, a German-born entrepreneur and billionaire who founded and bulit Newsells Park Stud into

a successful breeding and racing in England and beyond, has passed away in Zurich following a lengthy illness. Reportedly suffering from cancer, he was 71 years old. A Swiss citizen and a resident of Britain, Jacobs is survived by his second wife Renata and six children.

A Successful Businessman...

The eldest son of a German coffee merchant, Jacobs was born in the northern German city of Bremen Dec. 3, 1936, and went to and graduated from a business school in Hamburg. He founded his first coffee export company of his own in 1958, and became a

company of his own in 1958, and became a member of the senior management board of Johann Jacobs & Co. Jacobs made the decision in 1982 to merge with Swiss chocolate purveyor Interfood, landing the popular Toblerone brand and creating Europe's largest and most important coffee and chocolate manufacturer, renaming the company Jacobs Suchard. He later sold the conglomerate to Phillip Morris for 3.1 billion Swiss francs (about \$2.6 billion). In 1996, Jacobs created Adecco SA, which has become the world's biggest temporary employment company, left the company in 2002, but returned two years later amid an accounting scandal, which cost the company 35 percent of its market value in a single day. He remained with the company until last year. In 1988, Jacobs launched a foundation to promote youth causes. In 2001, he donated a large portion of his fortune to the organization.



The Birth of Newsells...

Jacobs bought Newsells Park Stud located on 1200 acres between Newmarket and London in July 2000 and immediately set out to build a broodmare band of the highest quality, acquiring horse which have achieved Timeform or equivalent ratings of 90 or better

at the races. Under the guidance and counsel of bloodstock advisor and Newsells General Manager Robert Acton, Jacobs was a major presence at Central Kentucky breeding stock sales between 2000 and 2002. Newsells signed tickets on at least 69 mares over that three-year stretch at Keeneland, accounting for over \$38 million in gross receipts. Among Jacobs's more prominent purchases were G1 Prix Vermeille winner Volvoreta (GB) for \$2.4 million; GI Beverly D. S. victress Snow Polina for \$2.1 million; Teggiano (Ire), who took the G1 Fillies Mile in 1999, for \$2.1 million; and the accomplished globetrotting mare Ela

Athena (GB) for \$2 million. Newsells' first significant yearling crop hit the track in 2006 with great success. Soapy Danger (GB) (Danzig--On a Sopabox) won the G3 Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot and later won the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket in the colors of Renata Jacobs. Best Name (GB) (King's Best--Flawly (GB)), bred by Newsells, won a Listed stakes in France before finishing runner-up in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and an unlucky fourth to Rail Link (GB) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The stud is consigning 24 yearlings to the upcoming Tattersalls sales in Newmarket. Newsells was also active in the stallion business, including 2003 G1 Derby Italiano hero Osorio (Ger), who stood his first year at stud at Newsells in 2008. The stud has also has shares in G1 Epsom Derby winner Motivator (GB), Dr Fong and Green Tune.







Trainer Andrew Balding, whose father lan never captured this prize, said, "Phoenix Reach finished third for us behind Brian Boru in 2003 and he went on to win at Group One level, so the St Leger is certainly not a race for horses that can't run anywhere else. The ground was probably too soft for Top Lock when he ran in the German Derby but he still ran well. He ran well at Ascot behind Campanologist and just needed the run last time out in the Great Voltigeur. We had doubts about whether he would stay before he ran in Germany, but he has subsequently shown us that he should get the trip."


Unsung but Undefeated...

Half of the cast for this year's renewal will carry colors already successful in the Classic, but Unsung Heroine (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) will sport the unknown silks of the Adahessonsplusone Syndicate as she bids to become the first filly to win since User Friendly (GB) 16 years ago. She is the sole runner in the line-up with a perfect record, having followed a battling defeat of the subsequent winner Shreyas (Ire) at Fairyhouse July 17 with a dismissal of the useful yardstick Hasanka (Ire) in Cork's G3 Give Thanks S. last time Aug. 8 and while this represents a major step up in class, trainer Tommy Stack's son and assistant Fozzy feels she has earned her spot. "We thought she was a good filly around this time last year, but she was still growing so we decided to leave her alone until the spring," he explained earlier this week. "She was having a pick of grass in the paddock in the spring and managed to injure herself, which meant she finished up spending two weeks in the veterinary clinic. It was a bit of a rush to get her ready for the summer and she gave us a bit of fright when she won first time out at Fairyhouse. She then won her Group Three at Cork and the form of that win has worked out well. When she runs on Saturday, it will be the first time she has actually had a bit of a break between her races. She needs to improve, but at least has had the time to do so."



Honolulu Seeks Redeption at Doncaster...

With both Septimus (Ire) and Yeats (Ire) absent, those who have trailed that high-class duo have an opportunity to shine in their own right here. Ballydoyle rely on **Honolulu**, who was third in the G1 St Leger here 12 months ago and who showed an aptitude for marathon trips when beating old-stager Distinction (Ire) in Royal Ascot's Queen Alexandra S. on his penultimate start June 21. He has to bounce back from a subsequently disappointing sixth in the July 31 G2 Goodwood Cup,


The Jockey Club Releases 2007 Breeding Statistics:

The Jockey Club reported yesterday that 3,638 stallions covered 61,262 mares in North America during 2007, according to statistics compiled through Sept. 4, 2008. These matings have resulted in 34,561 live foals of 2008 being reported to The Jockey Club on Live Foal Reports. As in past years, The Jockey Club estimates that the reporting of live foals, at this point in time, is approximately 90 percent complete. The reporting of live foals of 2008 is down 4.8 percent from last year at this time when The Jockey Club had received reports for 36,317 live foals of 2007. "The decline in live foals of 2008 reported to date corresponds to the decline in mares bred during 2007," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services. In addition to the 34,561 live foals of 2008 reported, The Jockey Club had also received 7,199 No Foal Reports for the 2008 foaling season. The number of stallions declined 6.3 percent from the 3,881 reported for 2006 at this time last year, while the number of mares bred decreased 3.7 percent from the 63,629 reported for 2006. Kentucky-based stallions accounted for 35.8 percent of the mares reported bred in North America in 2007 and 43.5 percent of the live foals reported for 2008. The 21,938 mares reported bred to 358 Kentucky stallions in 2007 have produced 15,040 live foals, a 1.6-percent increase on the 14,801 Kentucky-sired live foals of 2007 reported at this time last year. The number of mares reported bred to Kentucky stallions in 2007 increased 2.3 percent against the 21,455 reported for 2006 at this time last year. The 2007 breeding statistics are available alphabetically by stallion name through the Publications and Resources link on The Jockey Club homepage at http://www.jockeyclub.com.

Hammond Named Thoroughbred Club Honor Guest:

Television sportscaster Tom Hammond, who has hosted horse racing telecasts for a guarter-century, has been named honor guest of the Thoroughbred Club of America's 77th Annual Testimonial Dinner by its board of directors. The dinner will be held at Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, Kentucky, on the evening of Nov. 16. A native of Lexington, Hammond has covered a wide range of sporting events, including all but one of the first 23 Breeders' Cup telecasts on NBC. In 2001, Hammond overcame serious illness in time to fulfill a dream of broadcasting the Kentucky Derby. A veteran horse owner in partnerships over many years, the 64vear-old has also served for two decades as an announcer at Keeneland sales. Hammonds honors in Thoroughbred racing include an Eclipse Award and Charles W. Engelhard Award, and he has been involved in numerous Emmy Award-winning telecasts involving various sports.

Hammond also was the first A. B. Chandler "Kentuckian" Award winner and was named a University of Kentucky Distinguished alumnus as well as being elected to the Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame and Kentucky Sports Hall of Fame. "We recognize that Tom Hammond is prominent in the sports world overall, but Thoroughbred racing is proud to claim him as our own," said TCA President Burnett. "We know that, in addition to his on air personality and wide knowledge of the game, he has been a staunch supporter of Thoroughbred racing. I have every confidence that the amount of national coverage the sport has received is in part a result of his dedication to it."

Consigned by Cloverdale Bloodstock as hip 84, she hails from the extended family of Royal Applause (GB), Lyric Fantasy (Ire) and In Command (Ire) and was certain to attract attention following her half-sibling's success in the G3 Sandown Sprint S. in July. Hip 114, Mickley Stud's Needwood Blade (GB) colt out of a half to the listed scorer Yabint El Sultan (GB), was later purchased by Roy Bedding for £30,000. He was knocked down to Bedding, whose silks the stallion carried on the track, after he outbid the Italian agent Federico Barberini, Trainer Jedd O'Keefe also paid £26,000 for Trickledown Stud's hip 149, a son of Choisir (Aus) who is a half to four winners. At the sale's close, when the average fell steeply but the median stayed close to 2007, the DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby commented, "The market is selective, but bring a likely sort in to the sales arena and competition is as fierce as ever. Whilst we have failed to match last year's figures, the consensus amongst our vendors was that they were happy with the trade, pinhookers made profits and the unique St Leger Sales atmosphere was backed up by plenty of potential buyers viewing proceedings. 
