

CIRCULAR QUAY RETIRED TO JOURNEYMAN

Michael and Doreen Tabor's **Circular Quay** (Thunder Gulch--Circle of Life, by Belong to Me) has been retired

from racing and will enter stud in 2009 at Brent and Crystal Fernung's Journeyman Stud. He will stand as the property of a syndicate; his fee will be announced at a later date. "Circular Quay is the entire package," said Brent Fernung. "He is by a champion sire out of a Grade I winner, and was a

spectacular two-year-old. He fits Florida perfectly, and helps to fill a spot in the Florida market that has been recently depleted." As a juvenile, Circular Quay began his career with three straight wins, including the GIII Bashford Manor S. and the GI Hopeful S. At three, he won the GII Louisiana Derby. This year, Circular Quay bested Grasshopper (Dixie Union) in the GII New Orleans H. He retires with a lifetime record of 13-5-2-0 and \$1,505,434 in earnings. He is the son of Tabor's Circle of Life, who won the GI Spinaway S. and also produced MGSP The Roundhouse (Fusaichi Pegasus).

KEEPING THE FIRE BURNING

With an astounding 18 Group 1 wins already registered so far in 2008, Aidan O'Brien holds a host of aces in his Ballydoyle stable. His attention turns to Doncaster today as **Frozen Fire (Ger)** (Montjeu {Ire}) spearheads the team for the G1 St Leger. Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's bay rebounded from a disappointing effort in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby to take the Irish equivalent at The Curragh last out June 29. While his stamina for this kind of test is unproven, he has stronger credentials than most as he bids to provide his trainer with a fourth renewal. "Frozen Fire is a horse who has always shown a lot of class," O'Brien said. "He got caught back at Epsom in a slowly run race, but then went to the Irish Derby, and we all saw what he did there. We were delighted with him that day, and have been happy with him since." **Cont. p4**

This colt was produced by the stakes-winning mare Simply Runaway. A half-brother to the chestnut, a Maria's Mon colt named Horowitz, was hammered down to Zayat Stables for \$220,000 at this sale a year ago. "His father really stamps his foals, and he looks exactly like Lion Heart," said consignor Reiley McDonald. "This colt has great balance and looks fast."

The Supporting Cast...

Backing up Frozen Fire is a quartet including the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner **Alessandro Volta (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Washington Irving (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who despite being a maiden has placed in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial and finished fifth in the Epsom Derby. Alessandro Volta, who was a place behind the latter at Epsom, was to blame for the melee at the end of the Irish Derby and was subsequently demoted from third to fourth before finishing sixth in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp. Washington Irving, who was unplaced in the Curragh Classic, was runner-up to the subsequent G1 Irish Champion S. third Mores Wells (GB) last time in the G3 Ballyroan S. at Leopardstown Aug. 17. "We think Washington Irving stays well and his last race was a mile-and-a-half Group 3 at Leopardstown," O'Brien added. "Two horses went past him and he stayed on again to be second, and you would think the mile and six would suit him well. He is a horse who is progressing all the time and getting stronger every day."

Look Closer...

After much will-she-won't-she pondering, the G1 Epsom Oaks winner **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) is ready to start in her biggest test for the Ralph Beckett stable. Julian Richmond-Watson's homebred has not been seen since her emphatic defeat of the subsequent G1 Irish Oaks winner Moonstone (GB) in the June 6 Classic, but has recovered from a minor setback to join the party here. Few fillies have tried to win this in recent years and the two who had similar substance to their form--Quiff (GB) and Ramruma--were both second. "I was very surprised how easily she won the Oaks," Beckett said. "The form of the Oaks seems to have worked out well, especially with Lush Lashes and Moonstone. She's not a flash worker, but did a good piece of work with a couple of fillies on turf at the weekend. She's done very well over the last fortnight and I'm more than hopeful she will turn up in the same shape as when she won the Oaks."

If the Cap Fits...

Frankie Dettori, who has worn the winning cap four times since Classic Cliche (Ire) opened the scoring in 1995, has been handed the job of steering the progressive **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) after Ryan Moore opted for **Doctor Fremantle (GB)** (Sadler's Wells). Sir Michael Stoute's hopes of a first St Leger had suffered a setback when long-time favorite Patkai (Ire) blew out in the Voltigeur, but in Conduit he has another Ballymacoll homebred to go to war with. Runner-up in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 20, he ground out his first stakes win in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood last time July 29 and bids to emulate Sixties Icon (GB), Millenary (GB) and Nedawi (GB) in doubling up here. I haven't sat on Conduit yet, but it's a great ride to have," Dettori said. "It's been a great race for me in the past. It's an open Leger, and any one of six in the field could win the race."

Going With the Wind?...

Owners Paul and Susan Roy and trainer Jeremy Nosedo enjoyed their day in the sun two years ago with Sixties Icon and rely on **Whistledownwind (GB)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), who is appearing for the first time since his fourth in the Listed Cockeyed Hat S. at Goodwood May 21. "I'm happy with Whistledownwind and the progress he has made," Nosedo commented. "With the wet weather, it has been a little bit of a struggle to do as much work in the right conditions as I would have liked in order to get him ready for this, but I think we're as near enough as we can be for a first run after a break of three and half a months. This is a very different situation to Sixties Icon, but we've got nothing to lose and everything to gain, so we'll see how things pan out." Willie Muir saddles another outsider in **Enroller (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), who has a mountain to climb on the evidence of his latest fourth in the Aug. 12 Listed Prix Michel Houyvet at Deauville. "This horse gets the trip fine," Muir said. "This horse will be a Cup horse next year. He will get better--the family just get better with age. The ground probably doesn't matter to him too much, but he maybe has a preference for soft."

Third in this meet's G1 St Leger last September, Honolulu closed his sophomore campaign with another third in the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. at Ascot later that month and an eighth in the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine in October. Coming back this term to run fourth in the May 16 G2 Yorkshire Cup, he garnered the stamina-sapping Queen Alexandra S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and was a last-out sixth in the July 31 Goodwood Cup. Honolulu was ridden with patience in third for most of this marathon until sent in pursuit of pacesetter Royal and Regal approaching the final quarter mile. Rolling by that rival passing the eighth pole, he bounded clear as Balkan Knight claimed second nearing the line. "Persistently might be something good, looking ahead," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "She's a big gangly thing and, from her first two races, she looks like two turns might be more to her liking. She seems to take more after her mother's side than her father's [champion sprinter Smoke Glacken]." **Doremifasollatido** was off to a slow start and raced wide around the bend in the Aug. 13 GII Adirondack S., but still finished second behind subsequent GI Spinaway S. winner Mani Bhavan (Storm Boot). The \$110,000 KEESEP yearling demonstrated an affinity for the Belmont surface with a six-length maiden victory versus state-breds July 4.

Septimus will bid for a first Group 1 success here in the likely absence of stable companion **Yeats**, who has been declared only as a precaution. Aidan O'Brien, who won this last year for the first time with the latter, is poised to become the first trainer to complete the clean sweep of both Irish Guineas, Derby, Oaks and St Leger since 1935. Septimus, who beat the subsequent G1 Irish Champion S. third **Mores Wells** in the June 28 G3 Curragh Cup on his only start this term, ended 2007 with the highest rating in the stayers' division of the World Rankings. That came courtesy of wins in the G2 Lonsdale Cup at York in August and G2 Doncaster Cup the following month, where he handed Geordieland (Fr) three pounds and a five-length beating. "The thing about him is he is very genuine, and we think he will handle the ground," jockey Seamus Heffernan told *PA Sport*. "I haven't ridden him in a little while, but he seems to be working very well at home, so I would be very hopeful." Should Yeats deputise for his stable companion, O'Brien's bid for history should be an almost foregone conclusion as the seven-year-old appears in the form of his life after a third win in the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 19 and repeat success in the July 31 G2 Goodwood Cup. Mores Wells, who was third behind Yeats and Scorpion (Ire) in this 12 months ago, beat Washington Irving (Ire) in the Aug. 17 G3 Ballyroan S. at Leopardstown in between his Curragh Cup and Irish Champion efforts, and is also at a peak bidding to provide trainer Kevin Prendergast with a fifth edition. John Oxx, whose third win came when Kastoria (Ire) upset Yeats two years ago, relies on **Hasanka**, who needs to improve off her latest success in the Listed Ballycullen S. over course and distance last time Aug. 23. "She ran a cracking race the last day, but that was of course against much lesser opposition," he told *PA Sport*. "She is a big, rangy filly and she is probably just coming to herself now and is finally maturing."

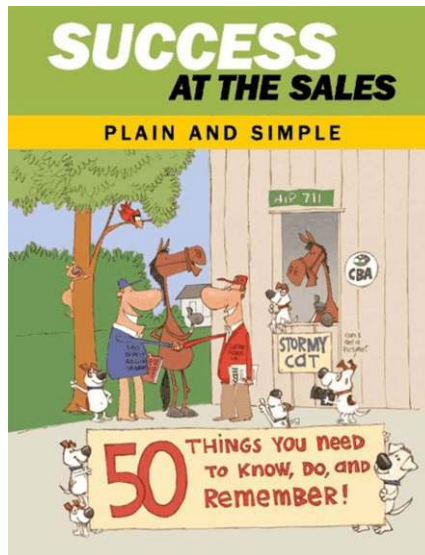

There is just no escaping the rain in Britain and Ireland at present, but at least Haydock's Sprint Cup found a second home here following the abandonment of last Saturday's card. Fourteen of those engaged at the Lancashire venue are still declared, and the similarly flat nature of this track should ensure that none are at a major disadvantage due to the rescheduling. **African Rose** is still in the mix and bids to build on her runner-up placing in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 10, where **Utmost Respect** was in fourth and the three-way dead-heaters **US Ranger**, **Astronomer Royal** and **Diabolical** were fifth. "She's stayed over down in Newmarket and everyone seems very pleased with her," Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to African Rose's owner-breeder Khalid Abdullah, told *PA Sport*. "She was a good second last time in the Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville and we are very hopeful." The G1 July Cup runner-up **US Ranger**, **Astronomer Royal** and **Abraham Lincoln** form a three-pronged attack from Ballydoyle. The latter pair were first and second, respectively, in the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh May 24. **Equiano** was second to Marchand d'Or (Fr) in the June 1 G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly before besting Takeover Target (Aus) in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 17. Fourth in the G1 Nunthorpe S. staged at Newmarket last time Aug. 22, the former Spanish-trained three-year-old will bid to provide Barry Hills with a third renewal following the exploits of Royal Applause (GB) in 1997 and Red Clubs (Ire) 12 months ago. That stalwart of the British turf's son and assistant Charlie said, "Equiano came out of the Nunthorpe well. He probably had too much of a layoff really, it's a long gap between Royal Ascot and Newmarket as it was, and he certainly looks a lot sharper for the race. They went flat out and he never traveled and didn't get any confidence. I know he won a Group 1 over five furlongs, but I think six would really suit him down to the ground. I think the switch from Haydock will probably come into his favour."

PAST GLORIES

In 2004, the second year without the July sale and the first year after the MRLS debacle that decimated the 2002 Kentucky foal crop (2003 yearlings), the Keeneland September sale grossed \$324 million, with 3,370 yearlings sold, an average of around \$96,000. In 2005, a total of 3,545 yearlings grossed \$384 million; and in 2006, the September market set an all-time high for a horse sale, as 3,556 yearlings grossed \$399 million--almost the world's first \$400-million horse sale. The market fell by \$14 million, to \$385 million last year, with a record 3,799 yearlings selling. But, after Book 1 last year, the next eight sessions were all up; Sheikh Mohammed's 'spend' was down from his record of nearly \$60 million in 2006, to \$17 million. So if his spend was down \$42 million, but the whole sale was down just \$14 million, it means the rest of the 2007 sale was up by \$28 million. Moreover, since his 2006 spending spree has proven to be uncharacteristic in light of his buying patterns the last two years, the real high-water mark for the September Sale isn't the record \$399 million, but the \$385-million figure from 2005 and 2007.

Here's why it's important: if the true top of the September market is \$385 million, the number at the end of Book 8 will provide as good a gauge of the decline in the horse market as there can possibly be. Last year, Book 1 proved to be a totally misleading indicator to the rest of the sale. This year, Book 2 also declined, but not nearly so much as Book 1. The Book 1 gross was down by \$32 million, or 22 percent. Book 2 actually saw 20 more horses sell than last year (four percent more, 537 to 517), and the gross was down \$6.6 million, or seven percent, from \$97.9-million to \$91.3 million. This suggests that the rest of the sale will again outperform Book 1.

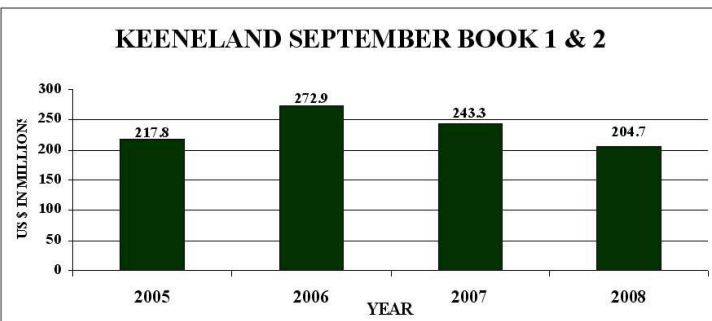

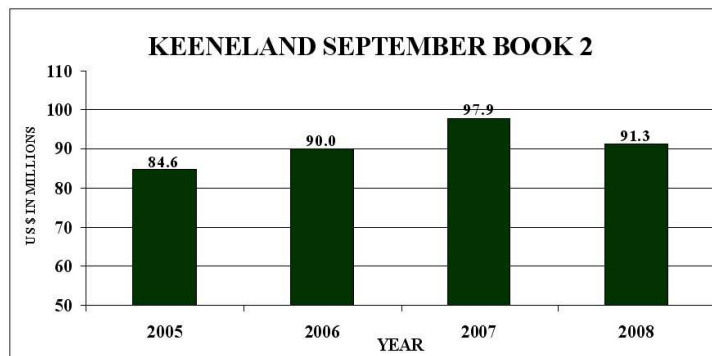

Depending on whether the declines for the next few books can be held to single digits (under 10 percent) or not, I'm going to say now that the key figure we'll be looking for when this sale is over is \$335 million. That would be a decline of 13 percent from the practical high water mark of \$385 million for the September sale. To the extent the gross ends up above \$335 million, we may say the sale would have outperformed expectations, but if it ends up below \$335 million, that would, in my view, be the measure of how much the sale underperformed. Prices aren't up, that's for sure.

Maktoum family entities continued to constitute the most important buying group through the first two books. John Ferguson, Shadwell, Rabbah Bloodstock (the umbrella group for 'friends of the family'), and Darley Stud combined to buy 76 of the 837 yearlings sold in the first two books--one of every 11 yearlings sold. Their total spend was \$36.6 million (18 percent of the gross), but it's very likely that at least some of the yearlings signed for by Dick O'Gorman (three) and trainer Mark Johnston (13) will run in the name of Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed, son of Sheikh Mohammed and designated as the Crown Prince and heir. Almost certainly, the Maktoum spend is right around \$40 million--20 percent of the entire Book 1-2 gross.

There was plenty of action on behalf of American buyers, too, none more so than the new Gaines-Gentry production Legends Racing. Legends spent just short of \$10 million on 19 yearlings, making them by far the leading American buyer. Ben Glass, as agent, and Zayat Stables also splashed out over \$4 million each.

SIRE POWER

The top 11 North American commercial sires have exerted a huge influence over the sale so far. These 11 sires accounted for 288 of the 837 yearlings sold (34.4 percent), and over \$107 million in sales--more than half the Books 1-2 total of just under \$204.7 million. If you look at yesterday's Instatistics table (which includes all yearlings sold since July, not just Keeneland September), 11 of the top 13 sires on average, with eight or more sold (the exceptions are European sires Galileo and Montjeu) are the ones I mean. With the number sold in Keeneland Books 1-2 only in parentheses, they are, in all-sale average order: Storm Cat (19), A.P. Indy (27), Distorted Humor (29), Kingmambo (8), Unbridled's Song (35!), Empire Maker (19), Smart Strike (16), Ghostzapper (23), Giant's Causeway (53!), Mr. Greeley (36) and Dynaformer (25). It is the last-mentioned, Dynaformer, that presents the most interesting story: he hit the commercial big-time with a vengeance this year, and it seems like the Maktoum family couldn't get enough of them. John Ferguson (1), Shadwell (4), and especially Rabbah Bloodstock (7, including five in a row) signed for nearly half the Dynaformer yearlings sold in the first two books--12 out of 25.

Among first-year sires (now counting all yearlings sold since July), Ghostzapper is now comfortably the crop leader, with 28 sold averaging \$320,535. Rock Hard Ten has sustained his position as a genuine contender for top honors, though: his 18 sold have averaged \$252,277, over five times his 2006 stud fee. European Shamardal occupies the number three spot on yesterday's Instatistics chart, with eight yearlings averaging \$196,940. Afleet Alex is fourth, with 25 yearlings so far having averaged \$193,899--again, almost five times his \$40,000 stud fee. Saint Liam is fifth, with 16 yearlings averaging exactly \$180,000. There are many to come, by Afleet Alex in particular.

2 Hotstufanthensome [Awesome Again](#) Pompay 12-1

Was very good at five, six and seven, but has dropped off severely this year. His last two are not even as good as they look-he got rail trips (1w1w, upper left) in both.

3 Shakis (Ire) Machiavellian McLaughlin 7-2

Will take action off his Grade II win at Saratoga, but that effort wasn't as good as it looked--Garcia got through on the inside around the turn (upper left) before swinging out him out, and the figure wasn't that big. In fact, he's never run a really big figure, and at the age of eight, there's no reason to expect one now.

4 Big Brown Boundary Dutrow Jr 2-1

Put in some enormous efforts in the spring, and showed the effects in the Belmont. He's been managed very gingerly since then, and his connections have made a point both of picking the softest spot they could, and of saying it's just a prep race--all of which makes us think he won't run his best. It's also worthy of note that while he won impressively on grass as a juvenile, the figure was good, not great, and very few horses are capable of running really big figures on both dirt and grass. At a short price, we have to try to beat Big Brown.

5 Kiss the Kid [Lemon Drop Kid](#) Tarrant 10-1

Has run a lot of very good figures in his life, but has somehow managed to avoid winning a big one. He fired his best shot last time, but only finished third because of a very wide trip (4w3w). In the past when he's run that fast it has taken at least four months to do it again, which means he's likely to go back now, but if he only goes back two to three points he could still get a piece of this, and it's not impossible that would be good enough to win.

6 Proudinsky (Ger) Silvano (Ger) Frankel 4-1

Was pretty good at three, went wrong, and disappeared for a year. Since he's been back he's been even better, and the figure he ran to win the Muniz at Fair Grounds is the best anyone here has ever run on grass.

In his last he finished sixth behind Shakis, but he lost more ground on the turns than he was beaten at the wire, and actually earned the best figure in the race. The guy has had three straight very wide trips (upper left), and gets a big jockey switch here--Dominguez is one of the best grass riders in the game.

7 Drum Major [Dynaformer](#) Weaver 8-1

Obviously has issues, with a history of short campaigns. Although Weaver is usually better off layoffs than the time after (see trainer profile), that hasn't been true with this horse, and he did have some trouble last time. If he does get back to his top, he should get a piece of this, and he will be a price.

8 Get Serious [City Zip](#) McBurney 15-1

Was very good over the summer at three, tailed off for a year, and finally came around again recently. Overall this is not a healthy pattern, and he's a couple of points short of competitive, though he might save ground here on the lead.

9 Fagedaboutit Sal Yarrow Brae Carvajal Jr 30-1

Shows a bad long-term pattern (much worse this year than last), and a good short-term one (coming up to the best race of this cycle). On his absolute best he could get a piece of this.

10 Ballonenostrikes Lost Soldier Manning 20-1

Threw a big figure out of nowhere in February, but everything else in his life makes him way too slow to compete here.

11 Silver Tree Hennessy Mott 6-1

Will be overbet, again. He won his last by getting a rail trip both turns, which is extremely unlikely to happen again from this post, and it's been over a year since he ran fast enough to make any impact here.

Bottom Line: Proudinsky is the best grass horse in the race, and since his last is concealed, he'll be a square price. Kiss the Kid and Drum Major are usable in the exotics.

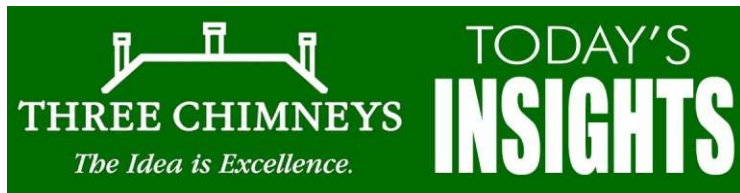
NYRA EMERGES FROM BANKRUPTCY The New York Racing Association announced Friday that it has emerged from Chapter 11 bankruptcy and is ready to begin its new 25-year stint as the franchise operator of Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga Race Course. NYRA, which has run racing in the state since 1955, filed for bankruptcy in November of 2006. The organization was awarded the franchise extension this February, but had to put its financial affairs in order before that agreement became official. A deal between NYRA and the state was finalized yesterday that brought the company out of bankruptcy, and papers were filed with the Secretary of the State of New York at noon, creating the new NYRA that will operate the three tracks going forward. "Today's birth of the newly constituted, not-for-profit NYRA is the culmination of complex negotiations that will secure and enhance the interests of Thoroughbred racing in New York for the next 25 years," said NYRA Chairman C. Steven Duncker. The legislation awarding the franchise to NYRA also called for a new Board of Trustees, consisting of 14 members appointed by NYRA and 11 by the state. NYRA will announce its appointees early next week.

State Takes Possession of NYRA Land...

Under the terms of the deal worked out with the state, NYRA surrendered the deeds to the land on which its three tracks are located, some 900-plus acres. As owner, the state will now be responsible for all real estate taxes, and NYRA will pay a token \$1 annual fee to lease the property. The agreement also provided NYRA with \$105 million from the state--\$75 million is earmarked for creditors, and \$30 million will be used for NYRA's ongoing expenses. Outlining the disbursement of funds to creditors, NYRA Vice President Jim Heffernan said, "The biggest payment is approximately \$24 million to the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation, and that goes a long way towards getting us to an adequately funded level with our defined benefit plans. After that, it breaks down into real estate taxes that have been past due, and interest on the real estate taxes. Those are the two biggest chunks." In the future, NYRA will receive four percent of revenue from the proposed video lottery terminals for operating expenses, but it will be some time before that revenue stream begins flowing. The \$30 million going directly to NYRA will help keep the company in business in the interim. "There is going to be a substantial period of time between now and when the VLT operation is actually up and running, since the VLT operator has not been selected yet," Heffernan said. "We've got to stay alive."

Looking Ahead...

With all but the final housekeeping in the Chapter 11 process behind them, NYRA can now concentrate on issues that have been on the back burner. Some projects, such as new dormitories for backstretch workers at Belmont and Saratoga, will have to wait until the VLT operations begin, as the dorms are projected to cost \$30 million apiece. But NYRA President and CEO Charlie Hayward remarked, "I think that those things that are particularly important to the fan and essential to straightening out the industry in New York can go front and center on our agenda." Those issues include steroid testing, which Hayward said would be in place by the time the first graded stakes is run in New York next spring. NYRA will also focus on helping the state in its takeover of the OTB operations, as well as potential changes in the takeout and in establishing uncoupled entries. But, Hayward cautioned, "I would say, in the near term, until we know a date certain when we're going to get the VLTs up and operating, we'll be careful. You won't see any significant expensive improvements, but we have some money to be able to do some things."

CALDER CUTS PURSES, SLASHES STAKES Citing a slowdown in business, Calder Race Course announced yesterday that, effective Sept. 18, purses for overnight races will be cut 17 percent. Stakes purses will also take a \$1.02-million hit, but overnight stakes will retain a \$55,000 purse level. "A number of factors require that these reductions be made," said Kevin Flanery, senior vice president of Churchill Downs Incorporated, Calder's parent company. "Calder has not fully recovered from the 2 1/2 months at the beginning of the season when its signal was not allowed to be simulcast out of state. In addition, Calder racing has not been available through advance deposit wagering platforms, such as TwinSpire.com, since the season began on Apr. 21 due to an ongoing dispute with the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group." Calder cancelled eight stakes that were to carry \$100,000 purses: the Shocker T. H., Hollywood Wildcat H., Challenge of the Americas H., Kris S. S., Cherokee Frolic S., Chaposa Springs H., Pete Axthelm S. and Tropical Park Oaks. The Brave Raj S. and Foolish Pleasure S. were reduced from \$150,000 to \$90,000, and the GII La Prevoyante H. and GII W.L. McKnight H. were decreased from \$200,000 to \$150,000.

SAKHEE'S SECRET RETIRED Last year's G1 July Cup winner **Sakhee's Secret (GB)** (Sakhee--Palace Street, by Secreto) has been retired to Whitsbury Manor Stud following two disappointing efforts. The four-year-old will stand for a fee of £6,500. Bridget Swire's homebred was virtually pulled up in the G1 Nunthorpe S. at Newmarket a fortnight ago, having previously finished down the field in Royal Ascot's G1 Golden Jubilee S. in June. It was later found that he had pulled muscles in his back exiting the gates at Newmarket, and trainer Hughie Morrison was quick to pay tribute. "Sakhee's Secret had the rare ability to quicken off a very fast pace--that is why he was the best sprinter of his generation," he said. "He has been a pleasure to train since the day he arrived, as he has an excellent temperament and has always been the supreme athlete." Sakhee's Secret entered last year's July Cup on the back of successes in the Listed Carnarvon S. at Newbury in May and Listed Cathedral S. at Salisbury the following month. In beating Dutch Art (GB), Red Clubs (Ire) and Marchand d'Or (Fr) in the Newmarket feature, he set a lofty standard which he was unable to match in four subsequent starts. Only fifth in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup on his last three-year-old start in September, the chestnut returned with a promising second in the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket in May before his two below-par runs at Ascot and Newmarket. He retires as the winner of five of his 11 starts and £282,178 in prizemoney.
