TOUCHED BY AN ANGEL AT KEENELAND

Touched (Touch Gold) has been very, very good to the Mulholland family. The eight-year-old mare is the dam of yesterday's Keeneland September session top-

per, a colt by Indian Charlie who was consigned by Mulholland Springs and purchased by Hoods Up Stable for \$400,000. But the story doesn't start there. Bred by John and Martha Jane Mulholland. Touched was sold to B. Wayne Hughes as a \$240,000 KEENOV weanling. The bay made only two starts, placing once, and found herself back in the ring for the 2005 Keeneland January Sale. The Mulhollands bought her back for a mere \$27,000. "We really loved the

family, we wanted to promote the family, and we were tickled to death to get her back," Martha Jane Mulholland explained. "But the best part of it is that we gave the mare to our kids, our son John and our daughter Laura. We were thrilled that the colt brought so much, but we were even more thrilled that he brought so much for them." Laura Mulholland is 18; her brother John, the Mulholland Springs farm manager, is 26. The Indian Charlie was the first foal out of Touched, and John Mulholland worked with the operation's yearling manager, Noel Gutierrez, to get him ready for the sale. "They worked very hard," Martha Jane remarked. "He's a big, beautiful colt with an enormous walk and gorgeous conformation." Still, the hammer price came as something of a surprise. "He was getting an awful lot of attention, as much as we had for any of our colts, and all the right people were looking," she said. "We were hoping he would sell well, but he exceeded our expectations." The Mulhollands also own Touched's dam and a sister. The mare did not produce a foal this year, but she is currently in foal to Master Command.

TAMAYUZ HEADS FOR QEII

Trainer Freddie Head indicated yesterday that Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) will run in next Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois hero was the subject of an upbeat bulletin as the sophomore prepares for the mile showpiece. "The horse is very well and he really couldn't be better," Head told *PA Sport*. "I think he has even improved since Deauville. He was very impressive that day and, hopefully, the QEII is the plan for him now. He is getting better all the time, and while I would ideally like good ground at Ascot, softer ground would not stop him."

CURLIN READIES FOR GOLD CUP

Curlin (Smart Strike), who is expected to make his next start in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 27, breezed five furlongs in 1:01.80 over a fast Oklahoma training track at Saratoga Monday. Regular rider Carlos Rosas was aboard for the move. "Awesome," said Steve Asmussen's assistant Scott Blasi when asked about the performance. "He's had a race [GI Woodward S. Aug. 30] and with four weeks in between, we're pretty much just trying to keep him happy." Curlin, who worked alongside Hawaii Calls, covered the first three furlongs in :37 4/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14 4/5. Curlin's work was pushed back until after the first renovation break in order to allow NYRA track maintenance crews time to harrow the track, which had received substantial rain on Sunday. According to Blasi, the chestnut's final work will take place Monday, Sept. 22, and will be shipped to Belmont the following day.

Claim to Fame...


John Gunther might have felt a little unlucky after claiming Senorita Dehere (Dehere) for \$50,000 in December of 2002. The chestnut was fifth that afternoon,

and never raced again. But she is proving to be a fine addition to the broodmare band at Gunther's Glennwood Farm. The mare's yearling colt by Indian Charlie went to Arch Bloodstock LLC, agent for Avalon Farm, for \$275,000 at Keeneland yesterday. "He's a very nice"

colt, and we thought he'd bring a bit of money, but we didn't think he'd bring that much," said Glennwood Farm Manager Barry Robinette. "He sold very well." Recalling Senorita Dehere's acquisition, Robinette remarked, "She was running down in New Orleans, and John claimed her along with a partner, Don Winton. They were going to run her back, but she had a fracture and they had to stop on her. We eventually brought her back to the farm and bred her to Hold That Tiger." The former claimer produced her first foal in 2005. Carrying Winton's colors, that filly, Bella Roja made her debut at Churchill last November and, after a bad break, finished second by a neck to subsequent "TDN Rising **Star"** and MGSP Keep the Peace (Touch Gold). Bella Roja came back to graduate at Santa Anita in March, beating Million Dollar Run (Tejano Run) by a neck. That rival came back to break her maiden in the GIII Railbird S. in May. "She's a very good filly," Robinette said of Bella Roja. "She's had some shin problems, but she is back in training with Wally Dollase, and we're hoping she comes back as good as ever." Gunther and Winton also have a two-year-old son of Alphabet Soup--Senorita Dehere with Dollase, but they opted to send the 2008 Indian Charlie yearling to the sales. "It was just time to sell something," Robinette explained. The mare has a weanling colt by Eye of the Tiger (American Chance), a multiple graded stakes winner campaigned by Gunther who ran fifth in the 2003 GI Kentucky Derby. She is currently in foal to Consolidator (Storm Cat).



A Cuvee First for de Meric...

Well known on the juvenile scene, Nick de Meric played the role of agent yesterday, purchasing a colt by Cuvee (Carson City) for \$230,000 on behalf of a racing partnership during Keeneland's seventh session. "I was buying for a partnership out of the Northeast," said de Meric. "He's currently identified as a racing prospect, not for pinhooking. We always keep our options open, but for now, that would be Plan A." Offered as hip 2241, the bay is out of 11-year-old Tempo Di Bolero (Sultry Song), who is from the family of graded stakes winner Lakota Brave and group placed Silverdale. Offered by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm, the Kentucky-bred is by freshman sire Cuvee, whose biggest scores came in the GI Futurity S. and GII Saratoga Special S. at two. "He looked like a man among boys," said de Meric, explaining the yearling's allure. "He's a big, strong, well-balanced colt with a wonderful walk." Concerning the sire, de Meric added, "This is the first [Cuvee] I've bought. The jury is still out on Cuvee, but if he keeps siring horses like this, I think he has a pretty bright future." When asked whether the price was what he expected to pay, the British horseman remarked, "I knew I'd have to step up to get him. We didn't think we'd be able to steal him, but we were happy to get him for that." Only a day after the Gulf coast of Texas was slammed by Hurricane Ike, Kentucky had to face the remnants of that storm as it plowed through the area. "I happened to be looking at this colt [Sunday] afternoon," said de Meric. "We had a hurricane coming through and the wind was blowing at 60 miles per hour. It was the worst possible circumstances to try to show horses. The awnings were flapping and paper bags were blowing around horses' legs. This horse was just standing there, nibbling on one of the awnings, like a giraffe. That's a sign of a horse with a pretty special outlook on life. Coupled with his conformation and wonderful walk, he has the disposition to match."

Down But Not Out...

At the conclusion of a weekend that saw a financial meltdown in the stock market, which included the financial moguls Lehman Brothers declaring bankruptcy protection and Merill Lynch being saved from that fate by being taken over by Bank of America, Keeneland officials could declare themselves relieved with the results of Monday's first session of Book 4 of the Keeneland September sale. "Not that I'm glad it happened, but I'm glad it happened this week and not last week," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I thought it was very solid from start to finish. We had a great cross section of people here. There was very spirited bidding on the good horses and we hope it will continue for another week and one day. We anticipated a correction in the market. What I've been very pleased with over the past five days is the not-sold rate. The consignors have adjusted very well to the economy and market, and we're getting more of these horses sold, so that is very rewarding. Credit should be given to them."

Favored Maitena solidified her credentials as Peru's best three-year-old filly on dirt with a come-from-behind victory in the Peruvian 1000 Guineas, the opening leg of Peru's Quadruple Crown series. Smartly ridden by regular pilot Benjamin Padilla, the dark bay rallied strongly in the stretch to overhaul the pacemaker and dual stakes winner Tiza near the wire en route to a convincing victory. Winning trainer Juan Suarez, who saddled the top three finishers, secured his ninth Guineas victory. Maitena improved her record to five victories in six career starts, and is a top candidate to earn honors as Peru's champion two-year-old filly. A three-time winner at two, including a 3 1/4-length victory in the G3 Clasico Augusto Mostajo Barrera, she exited an 11-length romp in the June 28 restricted Clasico Selectos, Peru's most lucrative event for juveniles. Maitena is by the successful Forty Niner stallion Apprentice, Peru's 2002 stallion of the year.

Kipling's assertion that the female of the species is more deadly than the male doesn't often find support in the Thoroughbred world, but fillies have certainly been making their mark in recent weeks.

The main opposition to Conduit in the G1 St Leger came from the fillies Unsung Heroine and Look Here, and Music Note's facile victory in the Gazelle S.--her third at Grade I level--suggests her connections weren't being too fanciful when they contemplated pitching her in against the males in the Travers.

It was only 10 days ago that the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp saw Goldikova and Darjina achieve a notable one-two against some highly accomplished males. As Goldikova has previously twice been made to look comparatively ordinary by another filly, Zarkava, it was hardly surprising that Zarkava started a hot favorite for Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix Vermeille.

The Aga Khan's brilliant but quirky daughter of Zamindar duly recorded her sixth straight victory in spectacular style and is now on offer at 6-4 or 7-4 to defeat the males in the Arc Oct. 5.

The Aga's delight at Zarkava's achievements must be all the greater because her fifth dam is Petite Etoile, another spectacular distaffer who initially carried the colors of his father, Prince Aly Khan, before being inherited by the Aga. In addition to dominating her own division in the 1000 Guineas, Oaks and Yorkshire Oaks, the three-year-old Petite Etoile defeated the males in such prestigious prizes as the Sussex S. and Champion S. In the process she showed she was untroubled by moving up and down the distance scale, and Zarkava is similarly versatile, with Group 1 victories over a mile, 1 5/16 miles and 1 1/2 miles. Petite Etoile later took two editions of the Coronation Cup and failed by only a half length to add the King George to her wins.

Unfortunately, Petite Etoile was one of those exceptional racemares with a very patchy breeding record, and she produced only one daughter, Zahra. It is worth pointing out that the four mares which separate Zarkava from Petite Etoile all failed to achieve anything out of the ordinary: her dam, the Kahyasi mare Zarkasha, never raced; her second dam Zarkana won only in the French Provinces; her third dam Zarna won a mile handicap at Doncaster; and her fourth dam Zahra came closest to winning when second at Amiens. However, Zarkasha is bred along similar lines to the 1998 Prix de Diane winner Zainta, a Kahyasi filly whose second dam was Zahra, and to the very useful Zafazala, a Kahyasi mare whose third dam was Zahra.

European racing may already have seen the next Zarkava in the imposing form of Rainbow View, a graduate of George Strawbridge's Augustin Stable. This daughter of Dynaformer is now unbeaten in three starts and she was just as impressive in cruising to victory in the G2 May Hill S. as she had been when she took the G3 Sweet Solera S. by six lengths. The Racing Post currently rates her the best juvenile filly in Europe, her rating of 112 placing her 7 pounds behind the best males.

Rainbow View is just one of the reasons why European interests were so eager to acquire Dynaformer yearlings at Keeneland last week, with Rabbah Bloodstock leading the way with seven purchases for Darley associates. Rainbow View's trainer John Gosden has also achieved 2008 Group 2 success with two other Dynaformers, the Princess of Wales's S. winner Lucarno and the Ribblesdale S. heroine Michita, and Shadwell-the purchasers of four Dynaformers last week--won the G3 Dee S. with Tajaaweed. Another Dynaformer, the French-trained Americain, recently crossed the line first in the G3 Prix de Lutece, only to be demoted to second.

Most of these European group winners are out of mares by European-raced turf stars, the exception being Michita, whose broodmare sire, Storm Cat, is no stranger to success on turf. Rainbow View is out of Nureyev's daughter No Matter What, winner of the Listed Prix des Lilas over a mile in France and of the GI Del Mar Oaks over a furlong further.

This family must rapidly be coming one of Gosden's favorites, as his high-class three-year-old miler Raven's Pass is another product of this female line. This son of Elusive Quality has twice been beaten less than a length by Henrythenavigator in top mile races this year and could be heading for the Breeders' Cup Mile if all goes well in the Queen Elizabeth II S. later this month.

Raven's Pass is out of the Grade III turf winner Ascutney, who is a younger sister to Words of War, the second dam of Rainbow View. Words of War's earnings of more than \$680,000, and her career figures of nine wins, 10 seconds and seven thirds from 44 starts tell us that she was tough and talented. She was also versatile. Although the bulk of her starts and stakes victories came on turf, she was also a stakes winner on the main track as a juvenile.

Words of War and Ascutney have both produced a pair of group/graded winners, to add to the eye- catching record of Lord of War's broodmare daughters. In addition to No Matter What, Words of War produced the GII Suburban H. winner (and talented stallion) E Dubai, while Ascutney is also the dam of the Grade III-winning Gigawatt.

Words of War was bought by Stonerside Ltd for \$440,000 at Keeneland's 1996 November Sales while carrying her first foal, No Matter What. Stonerside sold this daughter of Nureyev for \$425,000 at Keeneland's 1998 July Yearling Sale as part of a three-horse consignment offered in partnership with Arthur B. Hancock. That consignment also contained Fusaichi Pegasus. Words of War has continued to reward the Stone Farm/Stonerside partnership, with E Dubai selling for \$1.35 million, her Danzig colt for \$1 million, her Coronado's Quest filly for \$750,000, her Unbridled colt for \$2.7 million and her Kingmambo colt for \$1.45 million.

Although Words of War's sire Lord At War initially struggled for support, he eventually did very well, siring 47 stakes winners from 381 foals, and his daughters have been doing sterling work as broodmares. In addition to Raven's Pass and No Matter What, they are responsible for such as War Emblem, Purim, Citronnade and Tali'sluckybusride. As Purim is a son of Dynaformer, this winner of the Shadwell Turf Mile is bred along similar lines to Rainbow View, and so is this year's good turf miler Boss Lafitte, another representative of the Dynaformer/Lord At War cross.

I must be careful not to give more credit to Lord At War than to Rainbow View's broodmare sire Nureyev. Daughters of this remarkable stallion could end the year with champions to their credit in three different countries, with Rainbow View in England, Big Brown in the U.S. and Tamayuz in France.



Sam Brown pulled out a gun and shot Cassius Clay, but the scabbard from his knife deflected the bullet. Clay got up and beat the hell out Brown, cutting off his ear and gouging his eyes. Brown sued Clay for beating him up after he shot him. Henry Clay came from Washington, DC, to defend his cousin (in the subsequent trial).






