





TAKING KEENELAND SEPTEMBER BY STORM

It has been quite a year for **August Storm** (Storm Creek). The nine-year-old mare has produced four foals to date--three are winners this season, including

GII Saratoga Special S. runner-up Break Water Edison (Lemon Drop Kid), and the fourth, a yearling filly by Dixie Union, was the thirdhighest seller at yesterday's session of the Keeneland September sale in Lexington. Consigned by Lane's End, agent for Caldara Farm, she was purchased by William Shively's Wood-

land Stable for \$200,000. Caldara Farm is operated by Ohio-born Callan Strouss and his wife Darcia. "We thought she might bring between \$200,000 and \$300,000," Callan Strouss said. "She's a beautiful filly and very balanced--that's my favorite thing about her. She looks very much like Dixie Union, and some very good people got her. It's been a good day." Strouss has worked for Lane's End since 1981 and is manager of their 986-acre Oak Tree division: Darcia is a Queens native who once walked hots on the backstretch at Aqueduct and Belmont Park. The two own five broodmares, alone and in partnership. They picked up stakes-winning August Storm, in foal to Lemon Drop Kid, for \$150,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. "She's a very attractive mare and was a good race filly herself," Strouss said. "I loved Lemon Drop Kid, I loved Kingmambo, so I was very happy when we got her." Her first foal, a colt now named Ezdeyaad, brought \$300,000 from Shadwell at this sale in 2005. The second, Bobby Sands (Gulch), was a \$60,000 KEESEP yearling and has won three in a row in 2008, and the third was Break Water Edison. The bay sold for \$150,000 as a KEESEP yearling to Off The Hook, then pinhooked for \$525,000 at OBS March. Tabbed a O "TDN Rising Star" O after breaking his maiden at Belmont in his July debut, he ran second by 1 1/4 lengths in the Saratoga Special and was most recently fourth in the Sept. 1 GI Hopeful S. for owner Eli Gindi and trainer John Kimmel. "We're hoping Bobby Sands might be a stakes horse, and nobody knows how good Break Water Edison could be," Strouss said. "He might be any kind." August Storm was barren in 2008, but is currently in foal to Indian Charlie. Keeneland September cont. p2

SPIRIT ONE SANTA ANITA-BOUND

Surprise GI Arlington Million winner **Spirit One (Fr)** (Anabaa Blue {GB}) will make his next start in the GI Goodwood S. at Santa Anita's Oak Tree meeting

Sept. 27; his connections are eyeing the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25, according to *Racing Post*. It will be his first attempt over the Pro-Ride surface. "We decided not to go for the [GI] Jockey Club [at Belmont Sept. 27]

as we will come up against Curlin," trainer Philippe Demercastel told the *Post*. "And I don't want to run him over a mile and a half in the Turf Classic [also at Belmont], so we have decided to go to Santa Anita." A close fourth to Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) in the G1 Prix Ganay in April, Spirit One was runner-up in the G3 La Coupe June 14 at Longchamp before wiring his rivals at 13-1 in the Arlington Million Aug. 9.

Political Decision...

Callan Strouss went to Miami of Ohio University and earned a degree in political science, but he knew from the start that he wasn't cut out for that field. "I wasn't very good at politics, and it's a lot more fun to be with the horses," Strouss said. "I've been around horses my whole life, and I love them. I spent one summer working for a law firm, and I hated it. I never even took the LSATs. My sister was working in Versailles, teaching riding, and when I graduated from college, I came down and stayed with her. I literally drove up and down Midway Road and went to every farm to see who needed help." Strouss was hired by Dr. R. Smiser West's Waterford Farm in 1978, and served a three-year stint there before joining Lane's End. He has been the manager at Oak Tree since 1993. The Strouss's 60-acre Caldara Farm is adjacent to Oak Tree. It was there they bred and raised C P West, a colt from the first crop of Came Home who was sold for \$425,000 at KEESEP in 2005. He went on to run second in the GII Futurity S., GII Jim Dandy S. and GIII Withers S., and was fourth behind Curlin and Street Sense in the GI Preakness S. "He was absolutely gorgeous," Strouss said. The couple don't sell all of their homebreds, however. They race C P West's two-year-old half-sister She's From Queens (Dixie Union), who will soon return to trainer Rusty Arnold's barn after a brief freshening, and have a yearling filly named She Knows Jazz (Dixieland Band) who they hope will add to their stable's success story next vear.



Hip 2729, an Empire Maker filly out of GIII Violet H. victress Changing World (Spinning World), brought a final bid of \$230,000 from Kenneth L. & Sarah K. Ramsey. Consigned by The Acorn LLC, agent for White Oaks (Mr. & Mrs. Samuel H. Rogers Jr),


the dark bay was bred in Florida by Mr. & Mrs. S. H. Rogers Jr. For the session, 270 yearlings were sold for gross receipts of \$14,116,400, down 11.6 percent. The cumulative gross of \$295,453,300 was also down 13.1 percent. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

A Rare Breeding Success for Sovereign...

Success is definitely not foreign to the Gatsas Family's Sovereign Stable, an offshoot of Gatsas Thoroughbreds which was born in 2001. Sovereign Stables, a

racing partnership based in New Hampshire, infrequently consigns one to the sales, and yesterday sold a colt by Cherokee Run from their stakesplaced Sweet Vision (Southern Halo) for \$120,000. Consigned by Hidden Brook, agent, hip <u>2629</u> was purchased by Joe Applebaum's Off The Hook LLC pinhooking operation.

Sovereign Stables and Gatsas Thoroughbreds were the successful bidders on Sweet Vision at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton July sale, and the chestnut broke her maiden at first asking and was second in the Mom's Command S. at two. Victorious in her sophomore debut, she was runner-up to Madcap Escapade in the 2004 Old Hat S. and was retired to stud in early 2005 with earnings of \$104,242.

Matt Gatsas, one of the principals in Sovereign Stable, entered into a foal share agreement with Darley and decided to breed his mare to Cherokee Run.

"I was looking for a commercial stallion and he had some horses that I thought could help him turn the corner," Gatsas explained. "Also, his being a champion sprinter along with her being a sprinter, I thought we could get a horse that could look pretty fast and that's what buyers seem to be looking for these days. I thought that cross would work pretty well and I thought he would be one of the nicer New York-breds around."

Gatsas was pleased with the outcome of the mating. "He was really the complete package, he was a good horse all-around," he stated. "He wasn't exceptional in any one way, just a good solid all-around individual. We thought he'd sell somewhere right around there, so we were very happy with that."--AC

Hills Making a Splash in the Middle Books...

Canadian-based owners Jim and Susan Hill have been active middle-market buyers at Keeneland over the past several years, and that trend has continued this September. The couple signed tickets on a half-dozen



youngsters through the first four books, capping their spending spree with the purchase of hip 2261, a Crestwood Farmconsigned son of Petionville--Untangled (Unbridled) which was knocked down to the Calgary, Alberta, residents for \$220,000 Monday afternoon. The bay is a half-brother to Panamanian champion Full (Victory Speech), a full brother to SW Political Web and is out of a half-sister to Scarlet Tango, the dam of GI King's Bishop S. winner Visionaire. The Hills accounted for gross receipts

of \$855,000 in their most ambitious plunge at auction as they continue to build their racing operation.

Hill, the director, president and chief executive of Pason Inc., an oil field services provider, got started in the Thoroughbred business in the early part of the 2000s.

"We were investors with another friend from Calgary in a partnership and we liked it enough to try it ourselves," Jim Hill explained. "We have been on our own for three years or so."

According to Hill, he and his wife own about 40 horses currently, most of which are yearlings and twoyear-olds. They have about 15 horses in training, mostly at Woodbine in Toronto, where they employ Reade Baker as their main trainer. They also have a few stabled with Paddy Gallagher in Southern California. The Hills' colors have been carried with the most success by New York-bred Northern Netti (City Zip), perfect in three career starts, and most recently the 9 1/4-length winner of the Bouwerie S. at Belmont Park May 4.

Hill tends to focus on buying yearlings as opposed to two-year-olds in training, and admits it's been much tougher sledding at the September sale than he expected.

"I have found it more challenging for the better horses than it was last year," he stated. "Even though the sales statistics are down 10 percent, I would say a horse we would have been able to get for \$140,000 last year, we've had to go to about \$200,000 this year. For the good horse, I'd say there's more competition and it's more expensive than it was last year."

It's all about the resellers, Hill said. Cont. p6

"There seems to be a lot more competition from the pinhookers," he continued. "I kind of thought last year when you went over \$100,000, some of the competition with pinhookers diminished, but they're going right to \$200,000 this year or more, so it's pretty intense on the top horses. I'd be a lot more comfortable at buying at half the level of where we are now, but it seems that's what we have to pay for the type of horse that we're looking for.

"I am definitely surprised given that the market has been what it's been. From a macro view, superficially, you would have thought that it would be lower. But if you look at it specifically, you've got the Legends group buying, so that sucked up a lot of horses and I think a lot of pinhookers haven't been able to get what they wanted, so it kind of pushed them back and created more competition in the middle market. There's clearly a lot of business done with pinhooking. We're not bidding often against other end users, it's pinhookers we're up against."--AC



said. "The two riders who have been on him, Robby Albarado and Edgar Prado, both came back amazed by the amount of raw talent this horse has. He trains big and he runs big and I've probably been doing him an injustice by running him at seven-eighths."

Ward admits Forest Command will likely be on the front end, but he thinks his charge is versatile. "He's the type of horse, and this is what the riders who have been on him tell me, you feel like you're sitting on a

horse that is totally rateable and has a tremendous amount of natural ability. He's naturally fast and he closes big, but I think he'll be forwardly placed unless someone tackles him out of the gate." Forest Command does have another advantage in the stretch out to nine furlongs. He is by GI Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos and is the first foal out of GI Acorn S. winner Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat). Both were trained by Ward and owned by the Oxleys. "I know how good Monarchos was," Ward said. "And his

dam won a couple of graded races at nine furlongs. I know the genes are there--both of them wanted to go long. So this should be a match made in heaven." Albarado has the mount in the Super Derby. Oxley and Ward teamed up for a victory in the 2006 Super Derby with Strong Contender (Maria's Mon).

JONES WON'T RULE OUT CUP FOR 'SPELL'

Trainer Larry Jones originally indicated GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Proud Spell** (Proud Citizen) would likely sit out next month's Breeders' Cup because of concerns about the filly's ability to handle Santa Anita's synthetic

track. But during a national teleconference yesterday, the conditioner would not completely rule out a trip to California. "We're taking it one race at a time," Jones said. "She is flesh and bone, she wants to be a machine, but she is flesh and bone and sooner or later she's going to start showing signs of being tired." Proud Spell will be making her eighth start of the year in Saturday's GII Fitz Dixon Cotillion S. at Philadelphia Park. Jones said he has con-

cerns over the way Proud Spell handles synthetic surfaces. She had the worst finish of her career when third over Keeneland's Polytrack in the Apr. 5 GI Ashland S. "She hasn't done as well on the synthetics as some of my others have," Jones admitted. "Her times are slower than the effort she is putting into it suggests." But Proud Spell has been training over the Tapeta surface at the Fair Hill training center just in case and Jones said, "If she comes out of the [Cotillion] as good as she is now, we could be heading to California."

INDIAN BLESSING SET FOR GALLANT BLOOM

Champion Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie), scratched out of the GI Ruffian H. Sept. 6, is set to line up in Saturday's GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Park. The Hal and Patti Earnhardt homebred worked a bullet five furlongs in :59 at Belmont Sunday. "She's training well, she's ready, she's jumping out of her skin--we're going to run her," trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. After suffering her first two career defeats when second in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 8 and the GI Acorn S. June 7, the **3** "TDN Rising Star" **3** has shown a new dimension in her last two sprinting, rating in the early stages before powering clear to decisive victories in the GI Prioress S. July 5 and GI Test S. Aug. 2.




