

LEGENDS BACK IN BUSINESS AT KEESEP

After buying 28 horses over the course of the first seven days of trade at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington, the collective forces of Legends Racing took a breather from bidding on Tuesday and did not sign a ticket. But the team was back at work Wednesday at Keeneland, going to a session-topping \$400,000 for a filly by Tiznow out of Katz Me If You



Can (Storm Cat). The dark bay was consigned by Reiley Mc-Donald and Tom Van Meter's Eaton Sales agency on behalf of Overbrook Farm, who bred and raced Katz Me If You Can to victories in the GII Genuine Risk H. at Belmont Park and the GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. just up the hill at Keeneland. Ironically, Katz Me If You Can, a daughter of GI Hollywood Starlet victress Cuddles from the distinguished Overbrook family of Seaside Attraction, her champion Golden Attraction. Cape Town and Cape

Canaveral, was conditioned for Overbrook by D. Wayne Lukas, one of the three trainers that will be employed to train Legends's purchases. "Wayne has a definite partiality to good horses he trained and I am sure she was memorable to him," commented Overbrook's Ric Waldman, who said the result was a pleasant surprise. "No," he said when asked if they'd appraised her near yesterday's hammer price. "But closer to the sale when we saw the action on her, we knew she'd sell well. But you never know how well they'll sell until you put them on the auction block. We were fortunate that she was well-spaced in the session and that she was such a standout this deep into the sale. It shows that there's still good money for a good, well-bred horse." KEESEP cont. p2

Tiznow On a Tear...

WinStar stallion Tiznow has had a tremendous year at the races in 2008 and ranks second only to Smart Strike on the leading sires listing. He has been represented by 10 stakes winners, including GISWs Colonel John, Classic hero Da' Tara and Tough Tiz's Sis. Retired to stud following his repeat success in the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Tiznow sired a champion from his very first crop when the D. Wayne Lukas-trained Folklore completed her two-year-old season with a score in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Belmont Park. She was produced by the Storm Cat mare Contrive, and yesterday's topper can boast of being produced on the same cross. Waldman explained the decision to visit Tiznow.

"Largely, we think a lot of him and the mare needed some size," he stated. "Tiznow is a good-sized horse and he breeds a good-sized horse. There's a good deal of consistency that you see with his yearlings. The mare is close to Storm Cat and Mr. Prospector and Tiznow is void of Mr. Prospector and the Northern Dancer in his pedigree is far enough back. It's as close to an outcross as one can get these days and it served our purpose with the size. So we let it rip."

The dam of a colt by Unbridled's Song for 2008, Katz Me If You Can was bred to Bernardini for the current season.

Fillies Lead the Way Again...

The fairer sex accounted for four of Tuesday's top five offerings and the top two slots were also filled by fillies during yesterday's session. Bidding on behalf of Blandford Bloodstock, Richard Brown went to \$250,000 for a filly by Songandaprayer--Forty Gran (El Gran Senor) from the consignment of Anderson Farms, acting as agent for the filly's breeder, David Wilmot's Windhaven Farms. "She was beautifully balanced and really stood out today for filly that could suit Europe," Brown offered. "Her half-brother is pretty decent twoyear-old in England. The mare was a stakes performer and she produced a good horse." Windhaven purchased Forty Gran for \$245,000 out of the 2001 Keeneland January sale and the mare has done nicely at stud, producing the stakes-placed Reverently to the cover of Pulpit, but it is her current juvenile, Square Eddie (Smart Strike), who is livening up the page. A maiden winner at Salisbury July 22, the colt was most recently runnerup by a head in the G3 Sirenia S. at Kempton Sept. 6. Brown indicated that his purchase would go into quarantine in preparation for her transfer to England. Brown, who was acting on behalf of some "established clients who wish to remain anonymous," was not certain who would train the filly.

Another Steep Day of Losses on the Street...

For the second time in three days, Wall Street endured a loss of over 440 points, casting a pall over the proceedings at Keeneland. Still, there were a pair of marquee sales, much to the pleasure of Keeneland officials. "Like in any market, there is plenty of money for special items and horses that stand out, as was proven today with a \$400,000 horse and a \$250,000 horse," said Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "But I think the market has performed just about where we thought it would be," he continued. "Going in, we knew that the latter part would be more difficult than the early part because the economic part is harder on those people than the others. We have six more days to go and it'll be getting a little tighter and tougher." Commenting on the 'contribution' made by Legends Racing to this point, Russell added, "Any time you have a new, major player in the industry, it gives it a great boost. They've been very busy, both as buyers and as underbidders. They haven't bought everything they've bid on, so they've been great assets to the sale from start to finish." The fledgling operation has accounted for just over \$12 million in gross receipts. Only John Ferguson for Sheikh Mohammed (\$18,185,000) and Shadwell (\$14,115,000) have spent more.

CHURCHILL, KEMPTON OFFER KENTUCKY DERBY CHALLENGE Churchill Downs and Kempton Park Racecourse have joined forces to create a ninefurlong race at Kempton which will reward the winner with an automatic berth in the 2009 GI Kentucky Derby. The \$150,000 Kentucky Derby Challenge S. will



be run clockwise over Kempton's Polytrack next Mar. 18. The winner will also receive a \$100,000 bonus if the horse competes in the Kentucky Derby. The race is designed to encourage international particpation in the Kentucky Derby, which has not had a

foreign-based entrant since 2002. Venezuela-based Canonero II is the only non-North American horse to capture the roses when he upset the field in 1971. "The Kentucky Derby is naturally a compelling and exciting event, but the presence of international contenders always adds to the anticipation and intrigue surrounding America's greatest race," said Steve Sexton, president of Churchill Downs and executive vice president of Churchill Downs Incorporated. "It has been wonderful to work with Kempton Park and officials of its owning body, Britain's Jockey Club Racecourses, in this innovative effort to encourage the presence of an international competitor in the starting gate at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May. A consistent international presence in the Derby will strengthen worldwide interest in our race and, in the long term, boost demand for the event as we work to expand distribution of Kentucky Derby wagering opportunities into new international markets." Churchill will provide \$90,000 of the KDCS purse and Kempton will contribute \$60,000. Churchill Downs will offer the \$100,000 bonus.


RAHY'S ATTORNEY TO MISS BC MILE Rahy's

Attorney (Crown Attorney) won the Sept. 7 GI Woodbine Mile, thus guaranteeing him a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 25. However, the four-year-old will not be making the trip to Santa Anita, according to trainer Ian Black. "It would just cost too much," Black told *Daily Racing Form*. The Canadian-based trainer cited the \$180,000 supplementary fee and the associated costs of the trip as the reason for the decision. Black indicated that Rahy's Attorney will make his next start in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 4.

Catalano Appealing Futurity DQ:

Arlington Park's leading trainer Wayne Catalano, who is also the co-breeder and co-owner of **Jose Adan** (Crypto Star), first but placed third in last weekend's GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity S., has filed an official appeal with the Illinois Racing Board. Catalano contends that the alleged interference caused by Jose Adan did not affect the original third-place finisher **Terrain** (Sky Mesa), who crossed the line third, but was moved up to the victory on a double disqualification. "I've watched it 100 times," Catalano told *Daily Racing Form*. "It didn't cost [Terrain] a placing." The conditioner isn't quite sure where the Illinois-bred might show up next. "He came out of it excellent, ice cold, perfect," Catalano told *DRF*. "I'm going to sit tight with him right now--I don't know what I'm going to do with him yet."

★ SO. CALIFORNIA ★

CHRB Creates Special Claiming Rule:

The California Horse Racing Board will begin implementing a rule which will allow horses returning from a layoff of six months or longer to be entered in a claiming race from which they will not be eligible to be claimed. The one-time exemption is designed to encourage owners to give horses time off as needed. As proposed by the Thoroughbred Owners of California, the horse will have to be entered for a claiming price equal to or greater than the price at which it last started and must have been away from the races for at least 180 days. "We would like to have horses have the opportunity to be rested, lengthening their career," said TOC Director Tom Bachman in testimony before the CHRB. "It is to the owner's advantage to be able to bring that horse back and run one time [and] not have to worry about somebody claiming the horse and taking advantage of the time and money spent in the rehab of the horse. It's as simple as that." Horses entered for the non-claiming option will be identified in the official track program. Equibase is also taking measures to indicate which horses are ineligible to be claimed.

COMMITTEES CONSIDER RACING LEGISLATION

The House Judiciary Committee is expected to mark up H.R. 6598, the Prevention of Equine Cruelty Act of 2008. The bill seeks to eliminate horse slaughter through criminal penalties for "whoever knowingly possess, ships, transports, purchases, sells, delivers, or receives ... any horse with the intent that it is to be slaughtered for human consumption." The bill would require the Attorney General to provide for the humane placement or other humane disposition of any horse seized in connection with an offense.

By a vote of 30 to 19, the House Financial Services Committee on Tuesday passed H.R. 6870, the Payments System Protection Act of 2008. The bill would halt the process of developing regulations to support the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act (UIGEA), passed in 2006. UIGEA prohibits the use of credit instruments for online betting, except pari-mutuel wagering on horseracing. Sports leagues, which support UIGEA, are opposed to the legislation. The current bill contains specific protections for the horseracing industry.

That firm became the official track photographer at Santa Anita in 1991 and now serves in that role for all the major tracks in Southern California. Benoit's photography business will be continued by his partners Rayetta Burr and Tom Abahazy.

Headley Stakes Trio Breeze on Pro-Ride:

A Bruce Headley-trained threesome of talented stakes performers hit the Santa Anita synthetic surface Wednesday morning for workouts. Prepping for the GI Ancient Title S. Sept. 28, leading sprinter **Street Boss** (Street Cry {Ire}) went five-eighths of a mile in :59.80. **Surf Cat** (Sir Cat) covered six furlongs in 1:10.20 as he gets ready for a start in the GI Goodwood S. the same afternoon. **Magnificience** (Stormy Atlantic), tuning up for the Pine Tree Lane S. Maryland Racing Commission Bans Steroids:

Following a unanimous vote, the Maryland Racing Commission approved the ban of anabolic steroids in racehorses, beginning Jan. 1, 2009. The MRC decided to move ahead with the ban after research conducted by Dr. George Maylin, the head of drug testing and research program at Cornell University, failed to produce results of ongoing blood plasma-based research. The ban will cover stanozolol, nandrolone, boldenone and testosterone, and the commission will follow the guidelines developed by the racing Medication and Testing Consortium. The commission did not establish what the penalties would be for the violation of the new rule, but is expected to do so before the ban takes affect in January. Neighboring states to have already adopted the ban includes Kentucky, Delaware, Pennsylvania and Virginia.
