'APPEALING' LONGSHOT IN SUPER DERBY

Conditioner Tom Amoss has enjoyed plenty of success in his native Louisiana throughout his 21-year

training career. The Louisiana State University graduate, who saddled the top three finishers in three different stakes races at Louisiana Downs in the 1990s, has stood atop the Fair Grounds trainer standings eight times and was inducted into that racetrack's Hall of Fame in 1999. Amoss can continue to add to his legacy in the Pelican State with a big effort from Roulette Racing's Real Appeal (Successful Appeal) in Saturday's GII Super Derby at Louisiana Downs.

"For about 10 years I trained in Shreveport over the summer and both of my kids [daughters Ashley

and Hayley] were born there, so I'm very familiar with Shreveport and have a lot of ties to the area," said Amoss, who currently trains a string of 50 based out of Churchill Downs and Arlington Park. "The Super Derby is their signature race and it would be great to win it. I'm going to be down there and it should be a lot of fun."

Real Appeal stamped himself as one to watch for trainer Anthony Reinstedler during his juvenile season after finishing a creditable fourth behind subsequent GII Pennsylvania Derby hero Anak Nakal (Victory Gallop) in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 24. The gray, sent off as the longest shot on the board that day at 33-1, raced toward the back after breaking in the air, but showed plenty of interest in the stretch, rallying down the center of the course to round out the superfecta, beaten only two lengths. Transferred to Amoss for his sophomore campaign, Real Appeal made a good first impression, scoring by 2 1/2 lengths in the Texas Heritage S. at Sam Houston Mar. 1. *Cont. p4*

KEENELAND REBOUNDS THURSDAY

As the marathon 15-day Keeneland September Yearling sale marched onward yesterday, Book 5 figures rebounded from a dull day of business Wednesday. During Wednesday's ninth session of the auction, the average was down 24.8 percent from the corresponding 2007 session, while the median fell 28.6 percent. After bidding concluded Thursday, the session average was down just 5.8 percent and the median was down 9.1 percent. "There was a definite drop-off [Wednesday]," admitted Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "But we got back close enough to last year's numbers today. The median [Thursday] was down about \$2,000 or something. And the average was comparable. I thought it was a fair sale from start to finish." Leading the way during yesterday's bidding was hip 3553, a son of Tale of the Cat out of the stakesplaced Dehere of the Dog (Dehere). The bay colt, consigned by Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm, Agent VIII, was purchased for \$190,000 by Maverick Racing. He was bred by Mia Gallo, Dave Stack and Fred Gorsline in New York and is from the family of graded stakes winners Sunray Spirit, Heavenly Cause and Northern Soldier. Dehere of the Dog failed to sell twice as a two-year-old--first for \$70,000 at the 1999 OBS February sale and then for \$12,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky April sale. On the racetrack she was third in the 2000 Goldfinch S. and earned over \$63,000 for Thomas Gallo. She was well-represented in the sales ring at this year's Tattersalls Breeze-Up sale when her juvenile colt by Mr. Greeley brought a final bid of \$772,341. Through 10 sessions, Keeneland has sold 2,492 yearlings for a total of \$313,084,500. The cumulative average is \$125,636, down 11.5 percent from a year ago, while the median of \$70,000 is down 6.7 percent. RNAs Spike in Recent Days...

After Monday's session realized a very solid not-sold rate of 20.9 percent, buy-backs at Keeneland September have spiked sharply over the past three days. On Tuesday, the session RNA rate was 28 percent (vs. 22.9 percent in '07); on Wednesday, it was 24.6 percent (vs. 20.6 percent); and yesterday, it soared to 29 percent (up 43.6 percent from 20.2 percent last year). So what's behind the jump? Craig Bandoroff, who runs Denali Stud with his wife Holly, alludes to that old political truism: It's the economy, stupid. And not just the American economy.

"You kind of expected that [the market] would run out of steam and that there would be less available dollars for the product, and I think that's what starting to happen," said Bandoroff. "I think it's definitely a reflection of the economy. Last year, you had people from other countries come in--and of course the economy was stronger--and be able to buy a horse for \$25,000 or \$50,000. That is the guy who is probably feeling the effects of this economy right now. It's not that racing all of a sudden fell off a cliff at this level. I think if it was an industry issue, you would have seen it show up sooner. I thought through yesterday Book 5, the showing was fine. Now, the showing is very sporadic and probably lighter than normal."

Bandoroff added that it has been a tall order selling horses who don't meet all of a buyer's criteria.

"I think the reason you are seeing the RNA rate go up is that sometimes, no matter what you want, you can't get it," he offered. "If there is nobody there who wants the horse, there's nobody there that wants the horse at any price."

Sometimes, a spike in the RNA can be attributed to sellers being overly aggressive with their reserves. Three Chimneys Sales' Case Clay doesn't believe that's been the case in recent days.

"I think that, in stronger markets, during the first day of the sale the RNAs are a little higher than the second day, because the sellers are being more aggressive with their reserves, and it takes a day or so for the buyer and seller to reach some sort of harmony," he said. "But at this point in the sale, I don't feel that the sellers are necessarily being more aggressive; it's just the buyers are not as willing to spend what they did in the last couple of years."

On Wednesday, Three Chimneys--or its clients--opted to buy back a total of nine yearlings, a reflection of sellers who are willing to go on and race them, said Clay. Cont. p3

"From a consignor standpoint, our first question, if we're selling for someone, is to ask them, 'Do you want to keep this yearling or not?'" said Clay. "There are some owners who have racing stables of their own. I wish there were more, and I think there needs to be more. Those owners will say, 'I'd like to get X for this yearling, but if I don't, I'm happy to race.' We had a few of those on Wednesday. But if they don't race, we'll advise them to be less aggressive with the reserve and let the market decide what the horse is worth."

Dapple Stud's Mike Akers, who operates in nearly all sectors of the industry, from breeding and selling at the yearling sales to pinhooking juveniles, views the RNA spike simply as a reflection of market economics.

"I think we've got more supply than demand," Akers said yesterday. "I think we're a little light on buyers right now, especially end-user buyers. I think people buying to resell at the two-year-old markets are carrying the market. You could write a magazine on why, but right now we've got a lot of product on the market, and for the buyers, it's a smorgasbord. They can look over a lot of horses before landing on the one they really like. There's plenty of money for a really nice horse--I think the prices are very fair. But maybe a correction is in order."

Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales, says that it was perhaps unreasonable to expect last year's RNA rates to carry through to 2008.

"I think last year's number was remarkably low," Russell said after the close of trading last night. "I think this is more of the norm. I think last year was slightly abnormal."

Appealing Longshot in Super Derby (cont. from p1)

Things didn't go quite as well in his next two starts--a well-beaten seventh in the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 5 and a 10th-place finish in the GIII Lone Star Derby May 10--but he has bounced back well in his most recent pair. The \$47,000 FTMMAY graduate annexed Lone Star's Alysheba S. June 28, then rallied from a 19-length deficit to place third, only three lengths behind TDN Rising Star" Ready Set (Touch Gold) in the GIII West Virginia Derby last time Aug. 2.

"We feel that he's on the right track now, not because of the recent race he won [Alysheba S.], but more importantly the race he ran in the West Virginia Derby," Amoss commented. "He came from a position where he couldn't win from that far back and still ran a really big race. That race is the one that made us want to take a shot in this one. He's been solid; he's won some very nice races for us and he's definitely one of the main players in the barn."

Real Appeal has put together a solid worktab since the West Virginia Derby. He fired a best-of-34 four-furlong bullet in :47 3/5 at Churchill Aug. 19 and also owned the quickest time for five furlongs beneath the Twin Spires when stopping the clock in 1:00 1/5 Sept. 7. He is 12-1 on the morning-line for the Super Derby.

"I don't ever work for speed like that," Amoss said. "If a horse really works fast, it's because they're finishing so well in a work. This horse has trained very well over the last three weeks."

Amoss honed his craft working for Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg, Frank Brothers, Larry Robideaux and John Parisella.

"They each had their own style, and the edge I had was that I was able to learn beneath them and take what I wanted from their style and leave the rest and create my own style--for better or worse," the 46-year-old said. "From all those guys, I took pieces of what they do and then made it my own."

Van Berg accounted for a pair of Super Derby victories with Gate Dancer in 1984 and Alysheba in 1987. Brothers won it with Arch in 1998.

Amoss, currently ranked among the top 20 trainers in the country by earnings, reached a milestone earlier this year in April, when he saddled his 2,000th winner at Churchill. "The thing about 2,000 wins, at least to me, is that a lot of the people are responsible for that--the people I work with at the barn and my assistants--are still around," Amoss offered. "I feel a lot of pride in that, when you come to our barn, you see the same faces. When we won the 2,000th race, we all got together after the races for a drink and reminisced over some of the old war stories. It was a lot of fun. We always had a great working relationship, but I think that was kind of a bonding experience for us all."

Heritage of Gold (Gold Legend), heroine of the 2000 GI Apple Blossom S. at Oaklawn and GI Go For Wand H. at Saratoga; Fly Cry (On to Glory), a hard knocking multiple stakes winner of \$479,460 in the mid-'90s; and MGSW Rush Bay (Cozzene), are among the best horses to walk Amoss's shedrow.

"There were other horses I really loved too," he continued. "It's the real horse you make a difference in. When you know you made a difference in that horse's career, that's what really stays with you." -S.S.

"The only trouble for the others is that he's improved," McDonald said. "He's still only 7 1/2 out of 10 in terms of fitness, but they'll have to improve six lengths to beat him." McDonald, who trained Tristarc (Aus) to take out the Underwood-Caulfield Cup double in 1985, added, "Caulfield Cup day he'll be at his top. That's our major goal." Lining up to face the champ are an additional nine Group 1 winners. Among them is Bob and Rosemary Scarborough's classy Light Fantastic, a last-start fourth in the Makybe Diva. Here, the homebred will have to overcome barrier one, a concern for jockey Craig Newitt. "It's definitely better than 13, but it's not perfect," said Newitt. "He's a big-striding horse, but I'll take it anyway. I'm sure he won't be far away. It depends on the speed."

"I don't think there would have been a horse in Australia that would have beaten Weekend Hussler the other day, but we've got all the confidence in our horse that he can bounce back," Newitt added. Light Fantastic's trainer Mick Price is chasing back-to-back wins in the Underwood after Rubiscent's upset victory last year. Weekend Hussler has been backed into A\$1.75 favoritism for the race, but trainer Mark Kavanagh is not giving up the fight with Maldivian. "His weight is spot on, exactly the same as around Caulfield Cup time last year," Kavanagh said. "Read into that what you like. I'm not saying it means he's going to come out and beat Weekend Hussler. I'm just saying it's a good sign." Maldivian was a luckless fourth in the Dato Tan Chin Nam S. at Moonee Valley Sept. 13.

Singspiel (Ire) Trainer Wendy Kelly is chasing back-to-back wins with smart sprinter Bon Hoffa, and the six-year-old entire has had an ideal lead-up, winning the Bob Lewis S. Sept. 6. "He had to do it a lot tougher [this year]," said Kelly. "He [carried] three kilograms more and he ran a half-second faster." Going into the Bob Lewis, Kelly was unsure how Bon Hoffa would perform after a poor autumn. "I wasn't sure what to expect," she said. "If he was back to his old self, I thought he would win, but the autumn was still lingering in my mind." Trainer David Hayes is hoping Niconero, who finished third to Bon Hoffa last year, will have better luck this time. "He probably should have won that race, in which we protested against the winner," Hayes said, adding that the seven-year-old's two recent Adelaide failures should be forgotten. "It was a good run last start, but he had no luck and he wasn't suited by the wet track first-up," Hayes said.

When Lee Einsidler took the decision to begin racing Thoroughbreds, he did so in a big way, signing for one seven-figure yearling at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale while finishing as the underbidder on the \$2-million sales-topping filly by Fusaichi Pegasus--Collect Call. He continued his aggressive bidding a few weeks later in Lexington, where trainer John Kimmel acted on Einsidler's behalf to acquire a Storm Cat half-sister to champion Vindication for \$1.7 million and a bay colt by Storm Cat out of multiple Grade I winner Tomisue's Delight for \$3.9 million. The colt was named Mr. Sidney, ostensibly in honor of Sidney Frank, the chairman of a liquor importing company, which Einsidler joined in 1991 and rose through the ranks to become its chief executive officer in October 2005. Mr. Sidney made his debut in early 2007 for Kimmel, finishing a respectable third in a Gulfstream maiden, but he didn't face the starter again for 17 months.

"We had to put a screw in his cannon bone," explained trainer Bill Mott, who saddled Mr. Sidney to a 1 3/4-length victory in an Aug. 9 turf maiden at Saratoga, his first start for the Hall of Famer. "He had a little stress fracture, so we had to give him time for him to heal. It was in the right fore."

The veteran horseman, who has trained his share of outstanding turf runners, thinks he may well have another, but is inclined to take his time.

"He's still green, obviously," Mott said. "He's a light-raced horse, but he showed a good deal of tenacity. We have to go through the process of elimination and we need to try the other surfaces. We may well try synthetic, and at some point, we'd like to try the dirt. He'd be quite a popular horse to breed to if he ran on both surfaces. We may give him another shot in allowance conditions, mainly because he's inexperienced. We'd like to work our way into stakes company."

Einsidler's best runner to date has been **Timber Reserve** (Forest Camp), a \$400,000 Fasig-Tipton Calder graduate in 2006, who scored a mild upset in last year's GII Pennsylvania Derby. The dark bay, who remains under the care of Kimmel, most recently won a Saratoga allowance Aug. 29.

SELLING IN THE GLOOM Set against the backdrop of a crisis in Italian racing, the latest renewal of the SGA Select Yearling Sale at the Settimo Milanese complex will be a welcome focus away from the bad tidings over the next two days. With the recent ITS and two trotting sales held in Milan in the last week witnessing sharp falls and decision in the spring to increase the tax on horse sales from 10 to 20 percent, there is a natural air of pessimism surrounding this auction. That is spreading from the racing scene, where betting turnover and prizemoney is steeply down and the winter circuit of Pisa is unable to afford its usual quota of race meetings from October to December. Despite all of this negativity, SAG's management is hopeful that they can avoid a disaster and a slight loss will be even welcomed as they prepare to welcome around 50 foreign investors to the sale alongside the two major investors La Nuova Sbarra of Sergio Scarpellini and Incolinx of Diego Romeno. It will be interesting to see if some of the big trotting names like Roberto Cavalli, Giuseppe Pisati and Gina Biasuzzi spend here as they did at ITS and Deauville.

As a standalone feature, this is a sale on an upward trend, thanks mainly to the exploits of its graduates on the track over the past few years and their progress shows no sign of halting. Following Electrocutionist (Red Ransom) have been a host of top-class performers at home and abroad, including last year's G1 Premio Roma and recent Topkapi Trophy winner Pressing (Ire) (Soviet Star); last year's G1 Derby Italiano hero Awelmarduk (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}); dual G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica scorer Distant Way (Distant View); and the 2005 G1 Middle Park S. winner Amadeus Wolf (GB) (Mozart {Ire}). In the past 12 months, Permesso (GB) (Sakhee) and Farrel (Ire) (Fruits of Love) have finished second and fourth, respectively, in the latest edition of the domestic Derby, while the G3 Premio Carlo Chiesa scorer Love Intrigue (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) and G1 Gran Premio di Milano runner-up Voila Ici (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}) have provided a handsome return on their relatively low purchase tags. There is a fair chance that this sale could boast Europe's champion juvenile by the end of 2008 if the vibes from Ballydoyle are right about the recent G3 Tyros S. winner Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Sold to John O'Byrne for \$170,000 last year, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's unbeaten colt has raised the profile of this auction even higher and there are two sons of Galileo to whet the appetite this time. Other high-profile sires represented among the 264-strong catalogue include Acclamation (GB), Anabaa, Dalakhani (Ire), Green Desert, Indian Ridge (Ire), Invincible Spirit (Ire), Nayef, Oasis Dream (GB), Red Ransom, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Samum (Ger), Selkirk and Verglas (Ire).

Those whose first crop are selling at these sales are Azamour (Ire), Dubawi (Ire), Oratorio (Ire) and Shamardal. As usual, the Compagnia Generale draft consigned by SARL will be of interest. The breeders of Electrocutionist and the 2004 G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner Prince Kirk (Fr) (Selkirk) are responsible for two daughters of Red Ramson closely related to the above. Hip 86 is out of a half to Godolphin's ill-fated G1 Dubai World Cup winner, while hip 59 is out of a half to the dam of Prince Kirk. Selling gets underway at 2pm today.
