Regal Ransom, a debut winner for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin at the Spa Aug. 25, was originally slated to contest Keeneland's GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity S. Oct. 4. "It's actually a plus," McLaughlin told *DRF*. "We get a month back to the Breeders' Cup instead of three weeks and we'll get to see if he likes the true Santa Anita synthetic track, not just Keeneland's."

#### **DUKE A GREAT LEIGHS NO-GO**

Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill), who was mooted as a possible runner in the Thoroughbred Open Classic at Great

Leighs on Saturday, will forego his entry in that extended nine-furlong event and instead point to a similar contest at Dundalk Oct. 3 or the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp two days later. "It looks as if we won't be represented at Great Leighs on Saturday and that Duke of Marmalade will either run in the Arc, if

the ground is suitable, or in the race they have put on at Dundalk next Friday night," trainer Aidan O'Brien told Racing Post.

#### Wanderin Boy To Wander No More...

Arthur Hancock's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup hopeful Wanderin Boy (Seeking the Gold) is a horse that often is overlooked. He has never won a Grade I race, he rarely

posts gaudy speed figures, and his seasonal campaigns are generally limited to a handful of starts. But take a closer look at his record, and it's hard not to gain a healthy admiration for the veteran, who will head to the breeding shed at year's end.

At seven, the Nick Zito-trained Wanderin Boy is in his fifth season as a racehorse. Since debuting late in his three-year-old year, he has won a quartet of graded races, including at least one each in 2005 (GIII Mineshaft H.), 2006 (GII Brooklyn BC H., GIII Ben Ali S.) and 2007 (GIII Alysheba S.). Wanderin

Boy's biggest victory came in the '06 Brooklyn, which he annexed in wire-to-wire fashion. But a race like last year's Alysheba stands out, too. In that 1 1/16-mile event at Churchill, Wanderin Boy outfooted a couple of nice horses in Half Ours (Unbridled's Song) and Student Council (Kingmambo) to win by 4 1/4 lengths in the slop.

Two starts ago, Wanderin Boy pushed his bankroll past the million-dollar mark with a victory in a seven-furlong optional claiming race at Saratoga, which he won in a crisp 1:21 4/5. He added another \$50,000 to the coffers when, in his most recent, he was third-beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Curlin (Smart Strike)--in the GI Woodward S. In all, Wandering Boy has amassed a record of 23-9-5-3 and earnings of \$1,063,758.

Such consistency would endear a horse to any owner, but Hancock said Wanderin Boy has become one of his favorites for more than just that.

"It's also because of all he's had to overcome," explained Hancock, who, among others, bred and raced in partnership Horse of the Year Sunday Silence.

"Wanderin Boy fractured a sesamoid when he was a young foal," Hancock continued. "He suffered a fracture to one cannon bone [before making the races], and later had a fracture in his other cannon bone. Nick always said the horse would have been Man o' War if everything had gone right for him."

A few other things that haven't gone right for Wanderin Boy is a tendency to catch monsters when tried in Grade I company. So far, he has completed the exacta in a trio of events at the highest level, and in each case did so against a future champion putting up a big effort. He was second to Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes) in the GI Pim-

lico Special in 2006, the same year he was runner-up to the runaway train Bernardini (A.P. Indy) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. And last year, he was second to Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr) when that one broke the track record in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga.

"It gets frustrating," laughed Hancock. "I mean, Lawyer Ron runs the fastest Whitney ever; in many other years, we would have won that race."

Hancock says that, no matter what Wanderin Boy does in the Gold Cup, or for the remainder of the year, this will be his last season.

"He's seven, he's a fast, good-looking, very correct horse, and I'll think he'll make a very nice stallion," said Hancock, who will retire Wanderin Boy to his Stone Farm in Kentucky. "Plus he's by Seeking the Gold."

Hancock, of course, hopes Wanderin Boy will land that elusive Grade I event before hanging up his tack. He'll get his chance Saturday in a very tough renewal of the Gold Cup that features reigning Horse of the Year Curlin. The GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct in November is currently penciled in as his final start.

"I would love to see him win a Grade I, which obviously would be lucrative for us, but I'd really like to win one for him," said Hancock. "He tries so hard and runs every race--he deserves it." -L.M.

**LEAR FAN DEAD** Group 1 winner and successful sire **Lear Fan** (Roberto--Wac, by Lt. Stevens) died of natural causes July 7 at Gainesway, the farm announced yes-

terday. The 27-year-old had been pensioned since the fall of 2004. Bred in Kentucky by C.P. Karpidas, the bay was produced by a full sister to the dam of Alysheba. He was acquired by agent James Delahooke on behalf of Ahmed Salman, carrying those colors to success in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and G2 Champagne S. He also finished second in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and third in the G1 2000 Guineas, and

retired with a record of five wins in eight career starts. Lear Fan entered stud in 1985 at Gainesway and provided a reliable source of top turf performers. From his first crop came Italian champion Sikeston, who was later followed by Eclipse winner Ryafan, Sovereign Award heroines Chopinina and Windsharp, as well as French highweights Loup Solitaire, Tiraaz and Verveine. The dark bay has also sired Grade/Group 1 winners Dublino, Glaieul, Good Ba Ba, Labeeb (GB), Lear's Princess, Sarafan and Vacare among his 66 stakes winners to date. His daughters have become successful broodmares, with representatives such as Grade/Group 1 winners Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), Dessert (Storm Cat), Johar (Gone West), Precious Kitten (Catienus) and Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), in addition to 2004 champion turf horse Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}).

#### HORSEPLAYERS' COALITION ADVISORY PANEL FORMED

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) announced Tuesday an 11-member Advisory Panel that will serve on the Horseplayers' Coalition, a consortium of horseplayers whose common objective is to seek legislative and regulatory solutions to tax and business issues that impact racing fans and pari-mutuel racetracks.

Chairing the Horseplayers' Coalition is Mel Moser. Other members of the Advisory Panel are Herman Bell, Steve Byk, Gupta Etwaru, Ron Geary, Jim Goodman, Bob Hansan, Louis Licata, Mike Moloney, Mike Mayo and Judy Wagner.

Members of the Horseplayers' Coalition Advisory Panel will serve two years, be available for grass roots lobbying in Washington, D.C. and help the Coalition identify, shape and prioritize issues that affect horseplayers at the Federal level

#### **MARKET FORCES**

At least when a market is down virtually across the board, as the horse market has been throughout the yearling sale season so far, there's less confusion about the whys and wherefores. With virtually the same number of horses catalogued (5,555) as last year (5,553), the number sold at Keeneland September (3,605) was down by five percent (from 3,799). Gross sales, though (just under \$328 million), were off by 15 percent (from \$385 million), and the overall average (\$90,984) was therefore down by 10 percent (from \$101,347). The number of seven-figure yearlings was down by 42 percent, from 31 last year to 18 this year. Even though, as always, there were pockets of strength, overall the numbers are sobering, a word I think Rob Whiteley used.

Two very important points need to be made about the sale, and the 2008 Thoroughbred auction market in general, before we discuss the one relative bright spot. That was the above-the-market performance of Books 2-4, which actually constituted a very significant 43 percent of the number catalogued, 46 percent of the number sold, and 56 percent of the sale's gross. This sector, which saw 1,666 yearlings average \$109,293, way outperformed the top and bottom of the market, as the attached small table shows (see below).

The first point that has to be kept in mind about the sale is that people expected it, and at no point did the market panic--unlike some of the markets external to our business. The horse market's internal reasons for decline, most notably overproduction and the chronic lack of new buyers, were discernible factors even when the market was peaking. It hasn't surprised anybody that those chickens came home to roost. The factors external to the horse market no doubt took certain potential buyers out of the market and restricted the budgets of many others, but, on the whole, we have enough of our own problems to explain the 2008 market decline.

Secondly, though, there is the issue of profitability. The declines have come with cost bases of record stud fees in a massive number of yearlings by top sires. Breeders will have been scorched by some of the numbers for the top stallions.

Storm Cat has an average of \$687,272 and a median of \$575,000 at the sales this year (per Insta-Tistics)-off a 2006 stud fee of \$500,000; who made money there? Giant's Causeway, who had 95 yearlings average \$290,783, with a \$200,000 median in 2007, off a \$150,000 stud fee in 2005, has had 59 yearlings average \$287,237, with a \$190,000 median so far this year. That's off a \$300,000 stud fee in 2006. Ghostzapper, ultimately the wide margin leading first-year sire in North America, has had 33 yearlings average \$283,272, with a \$270,000 median--off a \$200,000 stud fee. Who's making money there? Even connections of Distorted Humor, who did well enough this year off his \$150,000 stud fee in 2006 when averaging \$416,220 with a \$381,264 median, must be wondering how his now \$300,000 stud fee is going to play with breeders. Nobody's safe when you're paying six-figure stud fees, which means probably even more foal-sharing among the top rank of stallions. Oppenheim cont.

The less you paid in stud fee the better the chance you had a decent sale, both in real-money terms and profitability. This is why the performance of Books 2-4 was such good news. Whereas there were 11 percent fewer horses sold than last year in Book 1 (the top of the market), and 10 percent fewer sold in Books 5-8 (the bottom), there was actually a one-percent increase in the number sold in Books 2-4. The Book 1 gross was down 22 percent; Books 5-8 were down 28 percent in gross, yet Books 2-4 were down just six percent. The Book 1 average was off 12 percent; Books 5-8 were off by 20 percent; Books 2-4 were off by eight percent. There's no doubt the middle market very much held its own in comparison to the top and bottom.

Nonetheless, the sobering message for stallion managers is crystal clear: stud fees have to drop, and not a little bit, either. Every stallion standing for a six-figure stud fee has to drop, from A.P. Indy (2008 median: \$450,000) and Distorted Humor on down--except maybe for Giant's Causeway, whose fee had already dropped by almost 60 percent between 2006 and 2008. Further down the scale, a hot sire will be defined as one whose stud fee doesn't drop, but stays the same. I don't envision a lot of stud fees going up.

The major European sales resume next week at Goffs, after some tough sledding at Fairyhouse this week, followed by Arc weekend and two weeks of Tattersalls yearling sales in Newmarket. The Irish property boom propelled the Goffs' Million sale to the point where it has grossed over €50 million the last three years. I don't think there's any danger of seeing anything in that range next week.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. 


"Here's confirmation of what we already know: after three years when revenues topped the \$384-million mark, Keeneland September's gross was off 15 percent (\$47-million) this year. Keeneland has accounted for 57 percent of the yearlings sold so far in the second half of 2008, and 70 percent of the \$446-million in yearling sales. The cumulative gross is off by about \$75-million (14 percent) from the peak years of 2006-07. Not surprisingly, both the percentage sold of those catalogued, and the average, were also down."

California Flag, winless in three starts for Doug O'Neill in 2007, debuted for trainer Brian Koriner with a maiden tally on the Santa Anita lawn Feb. 11. Following three off-the-board finishes, the gray bounced back with a two-length win in a state-bred allowance at Hollywood July 2. He faded to finish sixth in an open allowance going a mile at Del Mar July 24, then delivered by a neck as the 7-5 chalk in a \$40,000 optional claimer going five furlongs Aug. 8. Not given much of a chance here, California Flag broke on top, blazed the way through fractions of :21.11 and :42.53 and drew off in the stretch to punch his ticket to the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. "It was a step up, but he had the speed," Koriner said. "The lineup didn't have any, the horse is training super, so we took a shot. The only race here for him was the Cal Cup [Oct. 5] and it's on the [main track]. The horse likes the grass way better. We had to go in this spot. I just told [jockey] Joe [Talamo], 'I won't be disappointed if you hit the dirt and you're five [lengths] in front, OK?' We'll pay the entry fee and go in the Breeders' Cup [Turf Sprint, Oct. 25]." The final time of 1:11.10 took .03 of a second off the former course record set by Lennyfromalibu in 2004.




#### PREVENTION OF EQUINE CRUELTY ACT AP-

PROVED The "Prevention of Equine Cruelty Act of 2008" received approval by a voice vote Tuesday afternoon from the House Judiciary Committee. The bill, introduced in July by Representative John Convers (D-MI) will now be passed on to the full House of Representatives for its consideration. The bill as proposed would criminalize the possession, transport, sale, delivery or receiving in interstate or foreign commerce of a horse or horse meat with the intent that it be used for human consumption. It would apply to the transport and sale of horses for slaughter in the United States or into a foreign country. The practice of slaughter in the U.S. has been curtailed by the shuttering of all slaughterhouses, but there has been an increase in the number of horses being transported to Canada and Mexico. H.R. 6598 gives federal officials the authority to police that practice. Penalties may include fines and/or imprisonment for a first offense or one involving five or fewer horses. An infraction involving more than five horses or repeat offenders would face increased fines and imprisonment of up to three years. During the committee's consideration of the bill, several amendments were offered, but only one was adopted. Under the current legislation, the Attorney General would take control of any seized horses and would be charged with placement and disposition of those animals. The amendment offered was made by Congressman Bob Goodelatte (R-VA) and would ask the Attorney General to consult with the Secretary of Agriculture regarding the final disposition of all horses. "By moving this bill, Chairman Conyers, lead cosponsor Representative Dan Burton (R-IN) and Representative [Bobby] Scott (D-VA) are acting in line with the more than 70 percent of Americans who oppose the senseless slaughter of our nation's horses," said Chris Heyde, AWI deputy director of government and legal affairs. "But opponents of this legislation persist in their attempts to mislead the public, and make horses pawns in their political games." Tom's had a wonderful year and has been lucky with horses he has bought from here and let's hope that this colt can continue that run," commented Sackville. "This colt was a very nice horse and I thought that he was probably the best individual that we have seen here. He's a half-brother to a decent horse from a good farm." The silver-medal honor was achieved by Meadowlands Stud's hip 378, a filly representating the first crop of Coolmore's Antonius Pius. Hailing from the extended family of dual Classic hero Bachir (Ire), she went the way of trainer Thomond O'Mara for €42,000. That price was almost matched later in the session when Ballinahown Stud's Tagula (Ire) filly was won by trainer Eddie Lynam for €41,000. Offered as hip 417, she is a full sister to Beaver Patrol (Ire), who was just touched off in the prestigious Wokingham H. at Royal Ascot in June and has since hit the board twice in pattern company. "I don't know who she is for yet, but she was just a filly that we liked," commented Lynam. "She was a good, sharp and straightforward type and is the sort of yearling that we like to buy. Her ownbrother is quite a good horse too." Reflecting on the sale, Tattersalls (Ireland)'s Managing Director George Mernagh said, "There has been good atmosphere here over the two days with active trade, particularly on the first day. In an ideal world we would have liked to have sold more lots, but at the same time there was certainly no shortage of bidders on any of the good, correct athletic horses and some nice pinhooking touches. Business has been significantly encouraged by the fact that most vendors, keeping the wider financial market in mind, have been realistic with reserves and also the presence of a good range of buyers. EI SUMMIT IN SYDNEY The furor over last spring's disastrous Equine Influenza outbreak is not over, although EI is officially eradicated. Thoroughbred breeders are at loggerheads with the Federal Government over the need for a permanent vaccination regime. The issue will be discussed at a National Summit in Sydney today, with recommendations to be handed down in November. Thoroughbred Breeders' Australia (TBA) President John Messara is lobbying fiercely for permanent vaccination. "I estimated within my own group of Arrowfield that we lost revenue of approximately A\$10 million. That's terribly significant for a family-owned concern. Redoute's Choice (Aus), our leading stallion, stands at a fee of A\$330,000 there were 20-odd mares that were coming to him last year that couldn't travel from New Zealand and other places to come," he told ABC Radio. The TBA has brought international El experts, Dr David Powell from the University of Kentucky and Professor Ann Cullinane from the Irish Equine Centre, to push their case at the summit. "That's how serious we think the whole issue is. We've flown two world experts in the field to come up here...they're telling us that we're stark-raving crazy not to have ongoing vaccination," said Messara, whose stance is supported by Racing NSW. "The outbreak cost the industry more than a billion dollars," Messara said. "If it had gone on, the industry may not have survived. That's how close we came. It will cost A\$10 to A\$15 million to vaccinate the Thoroughbred population, which the industry is prepared to pay. There are billions of dollars invested in this industry, and it must not happen again." Dr. Jane Axon, president of Equine Veterinarians Australia said her organisation was against vaccination. "The AVA does not support ongoing vaccination and this will not stop another outbreak," she said. "Only strong and effective quarantine systems can keep this disease out of the country." Australian Horse Industry Council (AHIC) President Barry Smith said on-going vaccination would make disease detection more difficult and would not prevent the introduction or spread of virus, saying movement restrictions played a large part in the eradication program. "Overseas experience clearly demonstrates that equine influenza vaccination does not stop the virus from progressing through a population and it doesn't stop horses from becoming infected with equine influenza," Smith said. Australia and New Zealand are the only countries in the world with significant commercial horse populations that do not vaccinate against El.
