Barring a major upset, Stonestreet Stable's Curlin (Smart Strike) will make history in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Saturday afternoon at what promises to be a rain-soaked Belmont Park, and owner Jess Jackson is humbled by the opportunity to pass 1995 Gold Cup hero Cigar on the all-time money list. "It's so exciting to think he might break the record,"

Jackson commented. "But first he's got to win." On paper, there's not a single reason to believe that will not happen as he seeks to become the first repeat winner of the 10-furlong event since Skip Away went back-to-back in 1996 and 1997. Cont. p2

Deja Vu for Jerkens?

Trainer Allen Jerkens has won three prior runnings of the Gold Cup, first in 1973 with Prove Out and again two years later with Group Plan. But it was over 20 years until he struck again in an event which very much parallels this year's renewal. Going for an unprecedented third consecutive win in the race, Skip Away was sent off at 35 cents on the dollar on a rainy second Saturday in October. But the reigning Horse of the Year engaged in a suicidal speed duel with Gentlemen (Arg) for six furlongs and the Jerkens-trained Wagon Limit, the 34-1 second-longest shot on the board, rallied from last in the field of six to win going away. The Hall of Famer sends out Merchant Marine (Tiznow) to take on Curlin and he figures that you can't win if you don't play. "You train them and you hope you can get a piece of it," Jerkens offered. "Merchant Marine has been training well and we hope he's a better horse than he was when he ran [in the June 28 GI Suburban H.]." Winner of the Sept. 7 Devil Diver S. going 7 1/2 furlongs over the Belmont strip, Merchant Marine has been up against it in graded company, finishing fifth in the Suburban and sixth in the GI Whitney H. July 26.

While Mambo in Seattle (Kingmambo) will be accorded the best chance to delay history, fellow sophomore Stones River (Monarchos) brings sneaky good form into the Gold Cup. He was a close fourth in the GII Pennsylvania Derby in his lone graded-stakes test Sept. 1, but, prior to that effort, the gray won four races in a row by a combined 22 lengths. Three of those were over wet tracks, but it's not just the likelihood of an off track that has trainer Larry Jones feeling postive. "We wanted to give him the opportunity to run a mile and a quarter," he said. "I'm not looking for a pace that Hard Spun would have set, but I think if he gets a legitimate pace, he can close into it."



It was family that first got Jim Donnan and his wife Treasa into horse racing and the together-time that the sport provides has kept the Donnans involvement in the game going strong.

"In 1999, my family lost some children in a pretty tragic car accident,"



Jim Donnan recalled. "It was a tough time for my family and I tried to find was to get my wife more involved in other things at that time. Horse racing was something that someone suggested."

The couple initially had horses in training with Cole Norman, who conditioned their 2002 GIII Texas Mile S. winner Unrullah Bull. And they also enjoyed success in the claiming ranks.

The pull of business meant a temporary withdrawl from the sport. The couple had purchased Ameri-Tech Building Systems in 1996 and the growth of the modular building company left less time for racing.

"In the last couple of years, our business has grown and we're in the process of selling a portion of our business," Donnan explained. "We weren't as heavily involved with racing from 2005 through the end of last year, or the middle of last year."

But the cut-back was only temporary.

"Our interest picked up again," Donnan said. "We moved some horses to Steve Asmussen. We felt that we enjoyed racing a lot and felt that Steve could bring a lot of that back. We have three in training now and we'll continue to work to build the stable and go after the better horses."

Donnan credits Asmussen with picking out the stable's newest star, Trinity Magic.

"I had a plan on how I thought that I'd like to proceed and [Steve] more or less focused that on the two-year-old market and tried to pick out horses that had big up side to them and that's just what he did," Donnan explained.

With Asmussen's advice, Donnan purchased Trinity Magic for \$50,000 out of this year's OBSAPR sale. The colt won his debut at Saratoga Aug. 15 and returned to take the Bertram Bongard S. at Belmont Sept. 21.

Donnan and his wife were able to enjoy their colt's victory surrounded by family.

"We flew to New York with one of our sons, and his wife and some other family members attended the races with us that day," said Donnan. "And that's what it's all about. It keeps everyone in the family involved. Sons, daughters-in-law. It's a great place to go and spend an afternoon with your family. And then to win a race like that and have horses that win at that caliber, and the pageantry that is associated with those races, it's a great experience for the whole family."

Donnan plans to continue finding value at the two-year-old sales.

"We started in the claiming business and we claimed a lot of horses and moved them up and made substantial returns on small investments-\$25,000 claimers turned in 12 -16 months to \$250-300,000," he said. "But I think that area has changed some and it takes a continuous effort to locate those horses. We don't have that time today. I think the twoyear-old-in-training market offers the opportunity to, without buying a horse that has already been successful and paying a premium for that, buy horses that have the opportunity to improve and realize a good return on investment."

Donnan's business plan is simple.

"I think you have to make intelligent decisions and analyze your horse prospects carefully," Donnan said. "They don't all work, but if you study the prospect enough, evaluate it and use the best advice available, you can make the right choices and make your business profitable. And you have the enjoyment of it, too. If you can enjoy the thrill and the pageantry of it, as well as have a profit or, at the minimum break even, then you have very much succeeded in this sport."

For the present, Donnan is looking forward to more family time around Trinity Magic.

"We have had a lot of outside interest in him at this point," Donnan admitted. "But I don't think that we're going to be interested in selling him. I think we'd rather race him and have some fun with him." -Jessica Martini



off. "We're very excited about our first Kentucky stallion," said Eric Guillot, trainer for and a partner in Southern Equine. "We plan to substantially support him with some of our best mares. 



He seems fine after his Sandown run and is in good form. I was delighted with that effort; I think greenness just beat him and possibly the track. I think a straight track will suit him much better. I don't want any extreme of ground for him, but it doesn't look like it's going to be, so he'll be fine. At the moment, I think Richard Quinn will continue his partnership."

NEW EI CASE IN SYDNEY? A horse at Sydney's Eastern Creek Quarantine Station has tested positive to Equine Influenza, according to NSW Primary Industries Minister Ian MacDonald. Speaking at a National Summit on the issue of a permanent vaccination regime in the wake of last year's outbreak that cost the racing and breeding industry an estimated A\$1 billion, MacDonald said the case was a reminder that a voluntary vaccination program should be considered. "It sends shivers down the spine of anyone that's associated with trying to manage these disease outbreaks," MacDonald offered. He added that, while it was unlikely the infection had spread, there were no guarantees. "The best walls are often breached," he said. New South Wales chief vet Bruce Christie indicated the horse has returned one positive and one negative test at the Eastern Creek quarantine station and would undergo further testing. Jane Axon, from the Equine Veterinarians Association, said vaccination would not guarantee no further occurrence of EI in Australia. "Equine influenza is actually a virus, which actually changes shape and mutates into a different strain, so if we haven't vaccinated exactly against the strain that affects Australia or comes into Australia, it's not going to protect our horses at all," Axon said. The Callinan Report, released in June, blamed last spring's crisis on biosecurity failure at Eastern Creek. The Federal Government was forced to provide a A\$234-million rescue package, and some Thoroughbred breeders are still considering legal action to recover costs. Australia was declared El free in March this year.
