GALILEO RULES IN GOFFS OPENER

With past Million graduates New Approach (Ire) and Lush Lashes (GB) putting their stamp on the 2008 season, it was no surprise that the pair's sire Galileo



The Ring at Goffs

(Ire) provided the two top-priced colts on the first day of the latest renewal of Goffs' flagship sale. With his early offering as hip 12 selling for €330,000, Coolmore's heavyweight was already assured top billing as the final lot of the session entered the ring. But the price for hip 220 quickly sailed past that mark, the tote board finally noting Jim Bolger's €500,000 winning bid. Consigned by Angus McDonnell's County Wicklowbased Ballymoney Park Stud on behalf of the 'S' Thoroughbred Syndicate, the day's topper is out of a half to the smart

middle-distance performer Puce (GB), who has so far produced the 2004 G2 Lancashire Oaks winner Pongee (GB) and another stakes-winning Luca Cumani inmate in Lion Sands (GB). Puce's half-sister Shouk (GB) is becoming a notable broodmare in her own right, thanks to the exploits of Coolmore's stellar distaffer Alexandrova (Ire), the 2004 G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Magical Romance (Ire), this year's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial runner-up Washington Irving (Ire) and Masterofthehorse (Ire), who was third in Sunday's G2 Beresford S. Fittingly, it was Bolger who won the day to ensure that Coolcullen will house another potential Classic contender over the following months. "He was a standout and I've bought him for my friends and I," Bolger commented. Goffs cont. p2

Falling Figures...

At the end of the first day, the figures made for gloomier reading than Goffs would have hoped, with the gross of €10,813,000 markedly down on the 2007 figure of €17,482,000 and the average of €71,609 and median of €50,000 down by 34 percent and 29 percent, respectively. Chief Executive Henry Beeby was facing up to the new economic reality afterwards. "Trade is operating at a different level to what it has been at for the last few years, but this is not unexpected and it has to be said horses are changing hands and our clearance rate today was 76 percent," Beeby said. "There is a correction going on, but when you take the wider economic situation into account, what can you expect? We are selling a luxury item and we are selling at the top end of that market. It should also be remembered that the figures for this sale have climbed steeply over the last few years and we are now operating in a different climate. However, we would have to say that we are far from disappointed. The major buyers are here, there is a good buzz around and vendors are being realistic." The sale's second session gets underway today at 11 a.m.

Shadwell Spree Continues...

Shadwell has been at the fore at all of the major European yearling sales so far in 2008, in addition to Keeneland September, and yesterday was no exception. Stephen Collins was in action when paying €210,000 to secure the day's top-priced filly from the draft of the Ryan Family's Swordlestown Stud. Hip 93 is by the late Indian Ridge (Ire) out of the group-placed Nausicaa (Diesis {GB}) and hails from the family of the talented duo Bin Rosie (GB) and Generous Rosi (GB). "Obviously, she is among the last of the Indian Ridges and she was a lovely, quality, athletic filly who we all liked," said Collins." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's setup also paid €160,000 for hip 181, a March-foaled daughter of their resident Marju (Ire) out of a sister to the 2000 G1 Prix Saint-Alary scorer Reve d'Oscar (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) consigned by Jockey Hall Stud.

Demi Dominates...

Demi O'Byrne made his presence felt in customary fashion and his name was on the docket for four of the

top six yearlings. The renowned vet had acted early to secure the session's aforementioned longtime leader from the draft of the County Tipperary-based Garraun Stud. Hip 12 is a Galileo halfbrother to the 2004 GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H. winner Mr. O'Brien (Ire) (Mukaddamah), whose dam is a half to the multiple group-winning sprinter and sire Paris House (GB). Farther back are the high-class trio of siblings Latice (Ire), Lawman (Fr) and Satri (Ire). He was not long in making another high-profile purchase when stepping in for hip 37, one of only two yearlings by Encosta de Lago (Aus) in the catalogue consigned by Paul

Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud. Out of the stakes winner Mary McGlinchy (Pleasant Colony), he hails from the extended family of the high-class Heritage of Gold and America Alive, as well as the group-winning European performers Gallant Special, Weldnaas and Raise a Grand (Ire). With the distinction of being the first yearling by his sire to sell in Europe, he achieved €280,000. Later on, O'Byrne paid €300,000 for a son of Sadler's Wells consigned as hip 142 by David Nagle's Barronstown Stud. Representing the proven cross with Darshaan, the April-foaled bay is a close relative of the unraced Ballydoyle juvenile Stately Home (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) out of the group-placed Pescia (Ire) (Darshaan (GB)). The third dam is the 1986 G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Lacovia, who is responsible for the 2000 G1 Prix de la Salamandre and G1 Dewhurst S. hero and sire Tobougg (Ire). O'Byrne also signed for the session's top-priced offering by Montjeu (Ire). Consigned by Clare Castle, hip 121 is a Februaryfoaled three-parts brother to the 2003 G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Fidelite (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) out of a half to the 1995 G1 Irish Derby winner and sire Winged Love (Ire). While O'Byrne paid €650,000 for the three-parts brother Francisco Goya (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) at this sale 12 months ago, he needed only to go to €240,000 this time. "The Galileo was a gorgeous colt and the sire's record already speaks for itself," he commented. "I thought that the Encosta de Lago was a very good example of his sire, who has done so well in Australia where he is a champion. There are only so many Sadler's Wells's left and he was out of a Darshaan mare, which is a cross that has worked well--[Coolmore's G1 Irish St Leger S. winner] Septimus (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) is out of a young Darshaan mare, too."





Biancone Busy...

Patrick Biancone made a rare visit to Goffs a memorable one when playing a major role in the afternoon's proceedings. He began by paying €200,000 for hip 94, a March-foaled Lion Heart half-brother to the stakesplaced Silver Navasha (Silver Hawk) from Meadowlands Stud. The yearling is a descendant of Balidaress (Ire), dam of the top-class Park Appeal (Ire), Desirable (Ire) and Alydaress whose page includes Cape Cross (Ire), Iffraaj (GB) and Russian Rhythm. The conditioner later secured Ashtown House Stud's hip 187, a Sadler's Wells half-sister to Skiddaw Peak (Aus) (Generous {Ire}), a stakes winner in Australia. His dam is a half to Sabria, whose progeny include the 2002 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and GI Keeneland Turf Mile hero Landseer (GB) and the 2004 G1 Prince of Wales's S. third Ikhtyar (Ire). His €220,000 purchase of that significant broodmare prospect was consolation for losing out to Hugo Merry 20 lots earlier for Carriganog Stud's colt from the first crop of Oratorio (Ire). Out of the listed winner Queen Titi (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), he hails from the extended family of Henrythenavigator and a host of luminaries, including the sires Dolphin Street (Fr) and Saffron Walden (Fr). Merry commented after a successful bid of €260,000, "He's been bought for an existing client and it has yet to be decided where he will be trained. I thought that he was one of the nicest horses in the sale and he looks an ideal candidate for next year's Million race."

BBA Bonanza...

This sale's stalwarts BBA Ireland were once again in the thick of the action and its top three purchases were Camas Park Stud's hip 161, an April-foaled colt by Oratorio who is a descendant of the multiple stakes winner Buckwig for €170,000, and fillies by Tiznow and Sahm. The Tiznow filly, the sole offering by the Taylor Made/WinStar sire in the catalogue, is a half-sister to the multiple graded-stakes placegetter Dover Dere (Cherokee Run), whose page features the dual champion Committed and top-class turf runners Hap and English Channel.

Consigned as hip 77 by Airlie Stud, she also fetched €170,000. BBA's Adrian Nicholl paid €150,000 for the daughter of the deceased former Shadwell resident Sahm consigned by Seamus Burns' Lodge Park Stud as hip 50. She is a 3/4 sister to the stakes scorer Mutasallil (Gone West) out of a half to the 1995 G1 1000 Guineas scorer Harayir. "I've bought both fillies for Dean Fleming, who is an Australian owner," Nicholl explained. "I bought Hula Angel, who won an Irish 1000 Guineas, in this very ring for Dean's late father Jim a few years ago. Dean owns Tyreel Stud there and he will send both of these fillies into training up here--probably one in Ireland and one in England--before bringing them down to Australia to breed. I thought both fillies were smashing individuals from good families."

Chasing More Millions...

It has certainly been a year to remember for Peter Doyle Bloodstock, and the buyer of both of the weekend's Million winners, Soul City (Ire) and Minor Vamp (Ire), was smitten with a son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) yesterday. From the Lodge Park draft, hip 15 boasts a listed-winning dam who is a half to Catchascatchcan (GB), producer of Antonius Pius. "He was a most charming colt, a lovely topped horse with some very high-class horses close up in his pedigree," Peter Doyle commented after paying €160,000. "He'll be going into training with Richard Hannon." That price was matched by Dermot Weld for the Irish National Stud's hip 202, a colt from the first crop of Darley's Shamardal who is a half to the 1997 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish Derby hero and sire Desert King (Ire) (Danehill). F R Racing paid €150,000 for the Ballybin Stud Consignment's hip 53, a filly from the first crop of Whipper who is a half to this year's G1 Falmouth S. scorer Nahoodh (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}) out of a half to the G3 Prix d'Hedouville scorer Not Just Swing (Ire). David Wachman has enjoyed considerable success in his short career so far with progeny of Danehill Dancer (Ire) and he made an early purchase of a son of Coolmore's resident for €140,000. From the draft of Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud, hip 4 is out of the stakes winner Lac Dessert and his pedigree includes the 1996 G1 Cheveley Park heroine Pas de Reponse and Green Tune.

His other halfsiblings include the dual listed-winning stayer Akarem (GB) (Kingmambo) and stakes-placed Multazem (Kingmambo) and the unraced Flame of Gibraltar (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who fetched €900,000 for Kilcarn at last year's Million. Spirit of Tara is a sister to Salsabil (Ire), whose son Sahm is a sire firmly on the up at present, as well as a half to Marju (Ire).

EQUINE BANKER BERGE HIRED BY

JPMORGAN CHASE JPMorgan Chase has hired Ted Berge as its new senior banker overseeing the company's equine lending division. For 20 years Berge has specialized in lending to the Thoroughbred industry, having previously worked for PNC Bank, National City Bank and Fifth Third Bank. "I took the opportunity at Chase because it's one of the strongest financial institutions in the world," Berge said. "It's a global presence and I think it provides a significant opportunity to expand the equine banking program, not just domestically but internationally as well." Berge said the equine account at JPMorgan Chase primarily consists of Thoroughbred breeders, but company also does business with Thoroughbred service groups. He also commented on how he believes the company will weather the current credit crunch. "I think JPMorgan Chase, because of its strength, is in a position to continue to do business with anybody," Berge said. "But people need to be prepared for a tightening of credit, not only in the horse business, but in all businesses in which they are involved."

CUP ANNOUNCES WAGERING MENU The Breeders' Cup has announced its wagering menu and post times for the 25th Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Friday, Oct. 24 and Saturday, Oct. 25. For the first time, the Breeders' Cup will offer a wager called the Super High 5, where bettors have to select the first five finishing places on one ticket. The Super High 5 will be available on the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic and GI Breeders' Cup Classic. If no one hits the wager on Friday's Ladies' Classic, the pool will carry over to Saturday's High 5 on the Classic. Bettors will also have the option of 10-cent superfectas on every race except the High 5 races. Further, the Breeders' Cup will guarantee a \$3-million Ultra Pick 6 pool Saturday. "With 14 World Championship races over the two days, racing fans around the world will have the opportunity to watch and enjoy the 'best betting days in sports,' as the Breeders' Cup has proven year after year," said Ken Kirchner, who has overseen wagering programs for the Breeders' Cup since 1996. There will be a total of 10 races--five Breeders' Cup races--on the Championship Friday program. ESPN2 will televise the five Breeders' Cup races beginning at 3:30 p.m. until 6:30 pm ET. Championship Saturday's first post time is 1:10 p.m. ET. The program will begin with nine consecutive Breeders' Cup races. ABC Sports will televise four races from 1:00-3:30 p.m. ET, followed by the remaining five races on ESPN from 3:30-7:00 p.m. ET. The official race order for the World Championships will be announced on Thursday, Oct. 16.

last 10 years. The first to do so--Chilukki--went on to finish a creditable second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Next came Halfbridled, who proved too good for Ashado in the 2003 Juvenile Fillies, and a year later the same treble was achieved by Sweet Catomine, who

had nearly four lengths to spare on Breeders' Cup Day. So the omens look very good for the aptly named Stardom Bound, who took the Debutante by more than four lengths and now the Oak Leaf by three and a half.

Stardom Bound's impressive exploits have helped promote her sire Tapit to second place among the freshman sires, with extra help coming from Retap, runner-up in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. three days ago. These two rank among 14 winners from Tapit's first crop of 96 foals. Caulfield cont. p8

Tapit started out at a fee of \$15,000 at Gainesway in 2005 after a racing career which showed the occasional flash of high-grade ability. A wide-margin maiden victory at Delaware had set him up nicely for the GIII Laurel Futurity, in which he used his excellent acceleration to overcome traffic problems. This highly encouraging victory was good enough to earn Tapit a weight of 114 on the Experimental Free Handicap, and there seemed every reason to expect a colt by Pulpit out of an Unbridled mare to prove even more effective in his second season.

Unfortunately, the winter didn't pass smoothly for the Winchell Thoroughbreds color-bearer, who was forced to miss a significant amount of work because of shin problems. Only sixth in the Florida Derby, Tapit came out of the race with a serious lung infection. Consequently, trainer Michael Dickinson was convinced his colt was some way short of peak fitness when he lined up for the GI Wood Memorial four weeks later. But, to Dickinson's delight, Tapit stormed through from last to first in a style which suggested he would be well suited by the extra furlong on Kentucky Derby day. He duly started third favourite behind Smarty Jones and Lion Heart at Churchill Downs, but could finish only ninth. A four-month break failed to revitalise Tapit and his disappointing effort in the Pennsylvania Derby proved to be his last appearance.

With his fee set at \$15,000, Tapit was some way down the pecking order among the new stallions of 2005, which also included Smarty Jones at \$100,000, Pleasantly Perfect and Speightstown at \$40,000, Medaglia d'Oro at \$35,000 and both Lion Heart and Strong Hope at \$30,000. In these circumstances, he did particularly well when his first weanlings reached the sales in 2006, with 13 selling for an average of \$108,692 and a median of \$87,000.

Buyers clearly liked what they saw and their enthusiasm translated into considerable demand for Tapit's services in 2007. From a book of over 170 mares, he has nearly 130 live foals this year, so here is one stallion who should be immune to declining results with his third crop. He is bred to make a stallion, with a pedigree which features 3x4 inbreeding to Mr. Prospector and 5x3 to Nijinsky.

With a graded winner and a graded-placed horse, Tapit has already matched the juvenile achievements of the first crop by his sire Pulpit. Pulpit was the first son of A.P. Indy to retire to stud and he remains the champion sire's most successful stallion son by a sizeable margin, with 20 graded winners to his credit, including six Grade I winners.

Tapit is the first of those Grade I winners to sire a Grade I winner, but Stroll has also made an interesting start. This very smart turf performer started out at only \$7,500 at Claiborne, but he was advertised to stand the 2008 season at a mere \$2,500, having covered only 11 mares in 2007. Instead he was sent to Italy. Remarkably, his first crop has produced three stakes-winning fillies. Another of Pulpit's Grade I winners, Sky Mesa, may not have fulfilled the high hopes originally held of him, but he ranks third among the second-crop sires by 2008 earnings, with two graded winners.

Tapit isn't the first notable stallion produced by his female line, as his third dam Moon Glitter was a stakes-winning sister to Relaunch. Relaunch sired the Breeders' Cup winners Skywalker and One Dreamer and his son Cee's Tizzy was responsible for the dual Classic winner Tiznow. Incidentally, this sire line was in magnificent form over the weekend, with Cee's Tizzy adding a new Grade I winner to his tally when Cost of Freedom took the Ancient Title S. and Tiznow doing likewise with Well Armed in the Goodwood S. Relaunch and his sister were gray, inheriting their color from the dam Foggy Note, whose grandsire, Mahmoud, ranks as one of the few grays to have won the Epsom Derby in the last 75 years.

Of course Stardom Bound and Tapit are also gray, as are Tapit's first four dams. Indeed there are an unusual number of grays in Stardom Bound's pedigree. This \$375,000 two-year-old is out of My White Corvette, a gray daughter of the gray stallion Tarr Road. Grey Dawn, the sire of Tarr Road, was another who owed his coat color to Mahmoud, who sired his dam Polamia.

Tarr Road is an unfamiliar name. He was only a minor stakes winner and his only graded performer was Stardom Bound's dam My White Corvette, who was placed in a Grade II event at two and a Grade III at three.

My White Corvette's broodmare sire, the Santa Anita Derby winner Marfa, was yet another gray. Marfa inherited his gray coat via his female line, his first three dams being grays. The third dam Singing Witch was by Royal Minstrel, a gray grandson of one of the Thoroughbred world's most famous grays, The Tetrarch. It was The Tetrarch's brilliant daughter Mumtaz Mahal who ranked as the second dam of Mahmoud, so all three gray lines in Stardom Bound's pedigree trace to The Tetrarch, who earned superstar status during an undefeated juvenile career 95 years ago.

A HISTORY OF TATTERSALLS

Across the street from Harrods' famous department



store in central London is a nondescript bar named the Tattersalls Tavern. It is one of the few lasting reminders that this exclusive part of Knightsbridge was where the world's oldest Thoroughbred auction company began.

Richard Tattersall, an en-

trepreneur from Yorkshire, set up a sales company in 1766 at Hyde Park Corner in London. Selling took place there until 1865, when it moved a short distance to the Knightsbridge site. Tattersalls had also held sales outside the Jockey Club in Newmarket since the late 1700s, moving to the present Park Paddocks site in 1870. Selling continued in London until the outbreak of the second World War in 1939, and Tattersalls' offices remained in Knightsbridge until transferring to Newmarket in 1977.

Although the famous fox rotunda and entrance arch from the original sales venue can still be found in

Newmarket, the 21st century Tattersalls is a very different company. Tattersalls' 2007 turnover was 244.8 million guineas (a guinea equals £1.05), comfortably more than the combined gross of all the other European sales companies.



Tattersalls is the

only remaining firm to still sell in guineas, retaining the long-standing commission structure of charging vendors five percent and buyers nothing. Rivals Goffs and Doncaster, as well as Tattersalls'Irish division, all take a total of 7.5 percent, with buyers paying six percent and vendors 1.5 percent.

Irishman Edmond Mahony--who first sold from the Newmarket rostrum at the age of 21--has chaired Tattersalls since 1993. The Tattersalls board also includes Mahony's brother-in-law Todd Watt, whose family have a long involvement in the company and are major shareholders; and Accounts Director Paul Ryan, Marketing Director Jimmy George, Sales Director Martin Mitchell and the Duke of Bedford.

With the rules of modern-day racing established at a similar time to Tattersalls, the firm has been responsible for selling some of the greatest horses of the past 200-odd years.

Sceptre sold for a then-colossal 10,000 guineas to Bob Sievier in 1900, and is the only horse to have won four British Classics outright. In 1967, two years after the present Tattersalls sales pavilion opened, two-year-old Vaguely Noble posted a then-record price of 136,000 guineas, and went on to win the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

More recently, Diaghilev (renamed River Dancer in Hong Kong) set a European yearling record of 3.4 million guineas in 2000, while Magical Romance created a broodmare record price of 4.6 million guineas at the 2006 December Sale. Meanwhile, three of the last four Epsom Derby winners--Motivator, Sir Percy and Authorized--were all sold at Tattersalls.

Just as Keeneland's elite July Sale ran its course and merged with the more all-encompassing September Sale, Tattersalls' select Houghton Yearling Sale was held for a final time in 2003, when numbers had dwindled to just 165 lots.

The Houghton merged into the October Yearling Sale, which this year is split into four parts. There are 611 lots in the Betfair-sponsored Book 1 (Oct. 7-9) this year, a drop of 122 lots on 2007. Conversely, Book 2 (Oct. 13-15), more popular with vendors, has grown to 846 lots, an increase of 224 yearlings.

"In an ideal year, we would have wanted a few more in Book 1, but for whatever reasons some people seem to be more comfortable in Book 2," said Marketing Director Jimmy George. "But, having said that I think the strength in depth in Book 1 is phenomenal--it's just a very, very strong catalogue with something to appeal to all sectors of the market."

George accepts that the sale is unlikely to be immune to external economic factors, but reports good international interest.

"We're not going to make bold predictions, but we're reasonably encouraged by the response to Book 1 at this stage. We've had interest from Japan, Australia, throughout Europe and North America. We expect to see some new faces and also some returning--buyers who don't come every year, but we're expecting to be back this time.

"The sales we've seen so far this year suggest nobody is immune to the markets, which is no surprise, but we are trying not get sidetracked by issues beyond our control and just focus on what we know." Cont. p2

Tattersalls History cont.

Since the disappearance of the Houghton, Book 1 has made steady progress, peaking with a record average of 127,396 guineas and record median of 82,000 guineas in 2006, when 432 yearlings were sold for 55,035,000 guineas.

Last year, there was a record aggregate of 64,922,000 guineas for 510 sold, but both the average of 127,298 guineas and median of 80,000 guineas dipped slightly.

Tatts Sales Races...

Graduates of this year's Book 1 will have the chance to contest four different sales races--branded as the



Tattersalls Timeform Millions and worth a total of £2.3 million in prize money. Following criticisms that owners are asked to pay too much to enter sales races, Tattersalls have increased their contribution, and the cost to run will be £6,000,

rather than the £10,000 required to line up in the 2008 contests.

"We've committed an awful lot of money to these races," explained Marketing Director Jimmy George. "We were conscious that the entry fees for sales races can be prohibitive at times and were keen to bring the cost to the owners down as much as we possibly could. At the same time, we've added another race and increased total prize money by £100,000 to £2.3 million.

"We worked closely with the Racehorse Owners' Association on this and think we've produced the best value race series we could."

The 2009 races will be a £1-million seven-furlong contest for colts, geldings and fillies, an £800,000 fillies' only event over the same trip, and a £250,000 six-furlong sprint. There will also be a £250,000 10-furlong three-year-olds' contest run in 2010.

"The fact that there are four races attached to the sale--one over six furlongs, two over seven and one for three-year-olds--gives everyone a very real prospect of buying a yearling and being able to compete for huge prize money at some point in its career. I think that's a big bonus," George added.

The Tattersalls October Yearling Sale has produced the winners of three of the last four Epsom Derbies: 2007 Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) - 400,000gns 2006 Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) - 16,000gns 2005 Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) - 75,000gns



Online Bidding...

For the first time at a European sale, would-be buyers next week will be able to bid via the Internet. The online bidding system, operated by Live Global Bid, was used earlier this year by Inglis & Son in Australia, a company in which Tattersalls is a shareholder.

"We bought a stake in Inglis earlier in the year and went out to their main yearling sale," said Marketing Director Jimmy George. "They introduced online bidding this year, and it seemed an innovation that worked very well. It gathered momentum as their sales season progressed and they sold a good number of horses to online bidders.

"We thought it was something worth exploring, and actually looked at it a few years ago. But the technology was not quite advanced enough to make it work to everybody's satisfaction then."

Thorough credit checks will be made on all would-be online buyers, and George expects current customers to mainly utilise the facility initially.

"To begin with I think it will be mainly existing clients, but it might be the type of person that, for one reason or another, attends our sales sporadically," he remarked. "For instance, people from overseas who can't find the time to travel; this will allow them to participate in the sales more often. It is something that can only grow, and we're very confident on the security side of it."

Another innovation this year is that Tattersalls is offering vendors the opportunity to post online Sirecam video clips of yearlings (see www.tattersalls.com).

End of Wall Boxes...

Tattersalls' historic wall box stables close to the sale ring will be razed, levelled and replaced at the end of this year. Although picturesque, the stables have never met universal approval from vendors and would-be purchasers because of the fact that they are on steeply sloping ground.

"It has long been deemed an area that needs attention and, in January, the wall boxes will be knocked down and we'll start again. There won't be any major change in the number of boxes," revealed Jimmy George. "It is a major project and there were planning issues that we had to overcome to get this far. We had to make several amendments to the original plans.

"Everybody should be very pleased with the outcome and they should be up and running in time for the main sales next year. It will be impressive and is just another one of the ongoing improvements to the site."

It's exactly 50 years since Mount Coote Stud in Co Limerick, Ireland, began consigning at public auction

and this year the famous farm will send 19 lots to Books 1 and 2 of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale at Newmarket, England. Luke Lillingston, who has taken over the stud's management from his father Alan, believes that he has a particularly strong group of yearlings this year.

"We've got some lovely horses going over to Tattersalls--probably the best we've had for a while. It is just a very strong group and I don't think there are

any weak links in the batch," explained Lillingston, who is also a partner in the Kern Lillingston agency with Kentucky-based Lincoln Collins.

On paper, the standout is lot 460 (<u>Tattersalls</u> <u>Sirecam</u>) in Book 1, a Royal Applause half-brother to this year's three-time Group 1 winner Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), who was consigned for her veteran British breeder Ann Jenkins by Mount Coote when sold at Goffs two years ago.

"Ann sells with us, but we raise them in part. We've had him since May and he is a grand horse, really nice. The mare, Dance For Fun (GB) (Anabaa) is in foal to Galileo again," Lillingston said.


Another of the Mount Coote consignment who is sure to attract plenty of attention is lot 521 (<u>Tattersalls Sirecam</u>), their home-bred full-brother to Group 3 winner Championship Point (Ire) (Lomitas {GB}) out of German champion two-year-old filly Flying Squaw (GB) (Be My Chief), who was also trained by Mick Channon.

"Championship Point's full-brother is a beautiful colt, a very high-quality horse," added Lillingston. "He's very similar to his brother I would say. He might be marginally sharper, though Championship Point did win at Royal Ascot at York [Chesham S.] as a two-year-old."

Lillingston wasn't keen to single out any yearling, concluding, "I like them all and I really mean that. We've got a lovely Singspiel colt and a lovely Cape Cross colt. There's a very racey Galileo filly, too, and we've got a Green Desert filly out of a very good mare, (Broken Romance (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {GB}), and she's as a good as that mare has produced for a long time."

(<u>Tattersalls Sirecam</u>) at Tattersalls. She is the first yearling consigned at a European sale bred to Northern Hemisphere time by Australian champion sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill).

Watership Down is offering the Jan. 17-foaled filly, out of Group 2 winner Catnipped (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}), on behalf of Australian breeder Carl Holt, a longstanding client.

"The filly came up to us in November and has been on the stud ever since. She's an extremely nice filly and we're very happy with her," revealed Simon Marsh, manager of Watership Down Stud.

Redoute's Choice cont.

"We have sold horses here for Carl Holt before, including a horse a couple of years ago called Young

Pretender (Fr) (Oasis Dream), who won a Group 3. He made 175,000gns, and we are consigning an Exceed and Excel half-brother this year for him."

Marsh is also looking forward to offering lot 467 (<u>Tattersalls Sirecam</u>), the last foal out of Watership Down Stud's finest producer, Darara (GB) (Top Ville), a Tiger Hill (Ire) colt. Darara, purchased for by the Lloyd-Webbers by Charlie Gordon-Watson in

1994 for Ir470,000 guineas, produced the champion Diaghilev (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) (renamed River Dancer in Hong Kong), who still holds the European yearling auction record of 3.4 million guineas set when topping the 2000 Tattersalls Houghton Sale, as well as this season's Group 1-placed filly Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}).

"We're not expecting things like Diaghilev's price to happen with the Tiger Hill colt, but he's a very nice individual. He is the last foal out of the mare and, since the catalogue was published, Dar Re Mi is a Group 3 winner and twice a Group 1 runner-up, so we'd be very hopeful," said Marsh.

"Darara was the first 'big one' we bought, and she has been amazing to us," he added. "She sold some yearlings for an awful lot of money. After Diaghilev, she was barren for four years and never actually had a filly. After those four years, she had a filly by Selkirk called Evita and then she had Da Re Mi, and this Tiger Hill colt is her last foal, as she was retired earlier this year.

"Dar Re Mi will go to either the G1 Prix de l'Opera or the Prix de Royallieu this weekend. She has had a fantastic season and we will keep her in training next year. I think she will only improve and get better."

The manager of Watership Down Stud is pleased with the global sales results the farm has achieved already this year.

"So far, things are going according to plan this year and I think we've got a really nice, balanced draft of horses for the October Yearling Sale. There are horses in all sectors of the market," Marsh told *TDN*.

The 19-strong Watership Down draft catalogued for Tattersalls part 1 includes lot 570 (<u>Tattersalls Sirecam</u>), a brother to this season's G1 Coral-Eclipse winner Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}), consigned for Philip Freedman's Cliveden Stud.

"Mount Nelson's full-brother is a really nice horse, and his half-brother Monitor Closely (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) ran very well when third at Doncaster earlier this month. He looked very good and is a horse that is going to improve for Peter Chapple-Hyam," said Marsh.

Watership Down Stud, along with Kiltinan, the sister stud close to Coolmore in Ireland, runs to about 60 mares. Eighteen belong to the Lloyd-Webbers, who have been keen to test the yearling market on a global scale in recent years.





Distorted Humor-Crystal Music colt Equi-Sport

"It wasn't one of our best sales over there, but it went okay.

"We did have a horse that we bred who won a Group 1 over there last year called Pink Cameo (Jpn) (French Deputy). We sold her as a foal, and I think we're the first European-based breeder to breed a horse in Japan, sell it in Japan and then have it win a Group 1 in Japan. We've been doing it for a number of years and are just ticking away at it. It's a good thing and it diversifies everything.

"We sold three in Deauville this year--a €400,000 Oratorio (Ire) colt, a €260,000 Pivotal (GB) colt and a €140,000 Tiger Hill (Ire) filly, and also two at Keeneland September. John Ferguson paid \$500,000 for an Elusive Quality colt out of Sumoto there, while a Distorted Humor colt out of Crystal Music made \$1.2 million, the second highest-priced colt in the sale. He was sold to WinStar Farm, who stand the sire."

Watership Down Stud had 17 yearlings sell during Tattersalls October Book 1 last year for 2,678,000 guineas.

Continued Success for Breeding Capital?

Part 1 of the Tattersalls October Sale sees Breeding Capital, the tax-efficient bloodstock investment scheme founded in 2006, offer the first yearlings bred from its select broodmare band. Launched by William Sporborg, Simon Marsh and Christopher Holdsworth Hunt in Britain, the initial venture attracted 164 investors, and its success has already spawned Breeding Capital I and Breeding Capital II.

"This is the first year that we'll be selling yearlings," commented Marsh. "The first fund has been incredibly successful, we sold three mares last year at the December sales that made very good profits on what we had bought them for the previous year."

Included in that trio was Madura (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}), a half-sister to world champion Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), carrying to Monsun, who sold for 710,000 guineas. Breeding Capital had purchased her for 170,000 guineas at the same venue 12 months earlier.

"This year," continued Marsh, "we are selling an Invincible Spirit (Ire) half-brother to Vital Equine (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), who was second in last year's G1 2000 Guineas."

Breeding Capital purchased the colt's dam Bayalika (Ire) (Selkirk), in foal, for 525,000 guineas at the 2006 Tattersalls December Sale. Exciting Times (Fr) (Jeune Homme) was bought at the same auction, carrying to Dubawi (Ire), and that youngster is also offered in Book 1 of the sale.

"He is a half-brother to GI Beverly D S. winner Gorella (Fr) (Grape Tree Road {GB}), who was the highest-rated turf filly in North America," Marsh said. "I think we have good ammunition, but we'll see what the market is like. That would be the only worry."

Last Year's Top Vendor Reflects...

Britain's Highclere Stud was the top vendor last year

at Books 1 and 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, and another strong draft will appear at Park Paddocks, Newmarket, this year. Last year's Book 1 Highclere draft of 17 grossed 3,667,000 guineas and averaged 215,706 guineas, helped in no small measure by the 1,000,000 guineas sale of a Gone West colt out of Myth To

Lady Carolyn Warren has managed the historic Berkshire farm

for the past 16 years--taking over from her late father Lord Carnarvon--and, after seeing a Highclere Stud yearling make 100,000 guineas at the Doncaster St Leger Sale in August, she is optimistic of another good sale despite the unsettled global economic climate.

Reality.

"We've got a lovely draft of horses," she said. "Last year is always going to be a hard act to follow, but I feel we have a really good draft for part 1. There is a very good spread with something for everybody and a variety of different types of horses.

"I was really encouraged by the way the market was at Doncaster. I felt that the good horses made good money. I think we are all aware of the worldwide economy and where it is, and we can't expect to be immune from it.

"Equally, people do not know where to put their money at the moment; not in a bank, not in property or the stock market. There is an argument to say that commodities that are slightly different from those are doing well at the moment. I can't think of a much better investment than a well-bred filly, who has got a fantastic residual value. I think we have got to be positive and cautiously optimistic that the nice horses are going to find buyers.

"I am never confident, but I am positive. You can't be confident until the hammer falls. So many things with the horses can go wrong, let alone the economy, before that hammer falls. If we can get them there in one piece, I think we have a strong draft of horses and the rest is beyond one's control," she concluded.

Even More in 2008...

Highclere Stud's consignment of 24 yearlings heading to Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale includes three from the first crop of resident stallion and G1 Derby winner Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). The pick of the trio could be a colt out of Model Queen (Kingmambo), whose 2006 offering by Motivator's sire Montjeu fetched 600,000 guineas two years ago.

Lady Carolyn Warren said, "We have a Motivator half-brother to this season's Ayr Gold Cup winner and Royal Ascot winner Regal Parade (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), out of Model Queen. All three Motivators in part 1 are really smart. They're an excellent advertisement for the sire himself--very good moving horses and well-marked. He seems to really be stamping his stock, which is exciting."

Highclere is also consigning a Montjeu three-parts sister to Saturday's G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile runner-up Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells), lot 400, bred by Ronchalon Racing.

"She is a lovely, elegant, great-moving filly with a lovely head and outlook--she's a real classy filly," commented Warren, whose bloodstock agent husband John assists with the running of Highclere.

"We also have three nice Shamardals for the Book 1 sale and the filly out of GII Mrs Revere S. winner River Belle (GB) (Lahib) is particularly well-grown and strong, especially as a first foal. She is a good hard bay and walks well. She's a very straightforward, tough, smart filly," she added.

Lot 563, a Green Desert half-brother to dual Group 1-winning sprinter Reverence (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}) is another to note, being consigned on behalf of breeders Gary and Lesley Middlebrook.

"He is very typical of his sire, being close-coupled, strong--an attractive horse. He is a really nice colt," Warren said. "We're consigning on behalf of the Middlebrooks, for whom we sold the horse that made a million last year. And there's a very nice Mr. Greeley filly out of Tincture (GB) (Dr Fong), who is strong, attractive and sharp. We also have a lovely Dubawi filly as well out of Abide (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}). Her's wouldn't be the most eye-catching page, but she is a really outstanding individual. It's a very strong group of fillies."

A Brief Tale of the Town...

Newmarket's title as the Headquarters of British racing is unquestioned, and with the sport dating back to the late 12th century, it deserves its status. Racing emerged organically, and it is understood that the sight of the Spanish horses retrieved from the wrecked vessels of the Armada in full flight sowed the seeds initially. King James I got the ball officially rolling at the start of the 17th century, but the enthusiast Charles II is credited with making the game what it is today by transferring his Royal court from London for the major meetings. One-time home to Queen Boudicca's Iceni tribe and their war armies, the hallowed ground of the Heath has a timeless feel.

The earliest reference to the town, which stands on the prehistoric lcknield Way, is in 1227, when it was named after the recently established market later disbanded due to the spreading plague. On the north side of the main street you are in the county of Suffolk, while on the south you will be in Cambridgeshire. Just outside the town, and splitting the two racecourses, is the "Devil's Dyke," which is over seven miles long and which has been the site of excavations uncovering Roman artifacts.

At the end of the High Street, near the famous Clock Tower--which was officially opened in 1890 and takes 115 turns to fully wind every week--stands the Rutland Arms Hotel on the site of King Charles' palace. Other draws include the 18th century houses in Sackville Street and Terrace House, which commemorates Lord Lonsdale of boxing fame.

Throughout the area in and around Newmarket are buildings of interest and history, including the 17th century Palace House, the 18th century Jockey Clubs Rooms with the bronze of Hyperion standing proud outside and the main offices of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, International Racing Bureau, Federation of Bloodstock Agents and the Animal Health Trust. The local studs include Dalham Hall Stud, Cheveley Park Stud, Banstead Manor Stud and the National Stud.

Racing is at the very core of the town, whose human population is approximated at 15,000 against 2,500 horses and in which one in four jobs are estimated to be connected to the sport. To hammer the point home is "The Newmarket Stallion," a monument unveiled in the millennium year which dominates the roundabout near the July Course.

TATTERSALLS' AMERICAN IMPACT

North American racehorse owners have been aware for years of the impact of European-bred and Europeanraced horses in American racing. In the past 12 months alone, there have been 23 Grade I or Grade II winners in North America sired by European stallions. Last autumn, for example, Alexander Tango (Danehill Dancer) won the Garden City, and Lahudood (Singspiel) doubled up in the Flower Bowl and Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. In 2008, European-sired Grade I winners include Man O'War winner Red Rocks (Galileo), previously the winner of the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Turf, as well as the victors in a Grade I double on Arlington Million day, when Maurakalena (Muhtathir) won the Beverly D., and Spirit One (Anabaa Blue) won the Million itself. In fact, it was a clean sweep for Europeans that day, as Winchester (Theatrical), by an American sire but trained in Ireland, won the third Grade I on the card, the Secretariat S.

As Europe's leading auction sales company, Tattersalls' graduates, whether sired in Europe, America or elsewhere, have also had a huge impact on the American racing scene. Since the beginning of 2006, no fewer than 80 Tattersalls graduates have won stakes races in North America. They scored a Grade I double at Del Mar, with Magical Fantasy (Diesis), who went through the Tattersalls October Sale as a yearling, winning the Del Mar Oaks, and Monzante (Maria's Mon) winning the Eddie Read. Tattersalls has sold nine Grade II winners in North America this year alone, including Rebellion (Mozart), winner of the Commonwealth Breeders' Cup at Keeneland, and Diamond Diva (Dansili), winner of the Cashcall Mile.

The upcoming Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, divided into three books over two weeks, is the top yearling sale in Europe, and features large numbers of yearlings by Europe's top sires. Dansili, sire of Diamond Diva, is an example. Considered one of Europe's top five sires, and with 14 yearlings in Tattersalls' three-day October Book 1, Dansili also has the distinction of having sired five European stakes winners on all-weather surfaces, which demonstrates his versatility, and the likelihood that his yearlings would be right at home in American racing.

Red Rocks' sire Galileo, considered the top sire in Europe and sire of the last two European champion two-year-olds (Teofilo and New Approach), has 35 yearlings catalogued.

There are also big consignments by other top European sires like Danehill Dancer (sire of Alexander Tango and 2008 North American Grade II winner Callwood Dancer), Cape Cross, Montjeu, Pivotal (sire of American Grade I winners Megahertz and Golden Apples), and, of course, the great Sadler's Wells, 14 times champion sire. Most of these have tremendous records in North America, including Pivotal (9.72 APEX A Runner Index in North America since 2002; average is 1.00) and Sadler's Wells (9.91), emphasizing again that European quality, such as that which will be on offer at Tattersalls over the next two weeks, makes good sense for American racing.

SILVER DEPUTY COLT TOPS FASIG OPENER

Fasig-Tipton's three-day Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearlings Sale got off to a shaky start yesterday in Timonium, Maryland, with average down a third and a clearance rate of under 65 percent. In all, 171 horses sold for \$2,783,400, an average of \$16,277. That's a 33.3percent drop from last year's average of \$24,399, and reflects a severe hit to what's usually the top of the Maryland market. In 2007, 10 horses made \$100,000 or more on Day 1, compared to three this year. Similarly, 19 made \$75,000 or more in '07, compared to six yesterday. The median did remain static at \$10,000. Topping the first session was hip 205, a colt by Silver **Deputy** who was knocked down to Scanlon Training Center for \$155,000. The May-foaled, Maryland-bred colt was consigned as property of Candyland. The chestnut hails from the family of Cozzene and was produced by the 12-year-old Geiger Counter mare Run For Joy, a multiple stakes winner of \$411,139. Peppers Pride Goes for Record in Allowance Race:

Joe Allen's **Peppers Pride** (Desert God) has been entered in a six-furlong allowance race at Zia Park Saturday, when she will attempt to set the record for consecutive wins. The Joel Marr-trained Peppers Pride has won each of her 16 career wins and shares the record for consecutive wins with Triple Crown winner Citation, two-time Horse of the Year Cigar, GI Santa Anita Derby winner Mister Frisky and the Louisiana-bred sprinter Hallowed Dreams. "She's doing well," said Marr. "She hasn't raced since April, but has had two works." The daughter of Desert God won the Foutz Distaff H. at SunRay Park on Apr. 26. Peppers Pride was scheduled to make her record attempt on two occasions this summer at Ruidoso Downs. She was slated to run in the Lincoln H. on July 27, but that racing card was cancelled after the remnants of Hurricane Dolly damaged Ruidoso Downs. When the Lincoln H. was rescheduled for Aug. 31, Peppers Pride was entered before being scratched due to an off track. She has only raced on fast racing surfaces. This means that Marr has twice prepared to race and then the five-year-old mare has not competed, not the optimal training regimen for a racehorse. "It probably has had an effect and we'll find out Saturday," Marr said. "But, she has been training well." Peppers Pride has raced at Zia Park each of the last three years and is five-for-five over the Hobbs oval. Peppers Pride will point to the New Mexico Cup Championship for fillies and mares after Saturday's allowance race, providing she comes out of the event in good order. New Mexico Cup day is Nov. 9.





HAATEF TO DERRINSTOWN Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's homebred four-year-old Haatef (Danzig--Sayedat Alhadh, by Mr. Prospector), winner of last season's G2 Diadem S. at Ascot, has been retired to stand at Derrinstown Stud, according to official website www.derrinstown.com. Trained by Kevin Prendergast, he was being primed for an attempt at Royal Ascot's G1 Golden Jubilee S. in June, but an injury sustained on the gallops scuppered those plans and, ultimately, his racing career. "Although he only ran twice as a two-year-old--and wasn't completely spot-on for the Dewhurst--he proved beyond doubt that he was one of the best of his age group," commented General Manager Stephen Collins. "When he beat his elders in the Group 2 at Ascot, we thought he'd definitely go on to win a Group 1, but luck was not on our side. However, racing's loss is our gain, and it's exciting to stand another good-looking horse with such excellent conformation at Derrinstown. His sire, Danzig, needs no introduction as a sire of sires like Danehill and Green Desert, and his dam has already produced four stakes winners, including Shimah and Walayef. We think he'll go down extremely well with breeders." Haatef retires with a record of four wins from eight starts and earnings of £110,574.

(Oasis Dream {GB}), unbeaten winner of the Aug. 30 G3 Solario S. at Sandown, remains on target for Saturday's inaugural running of the Tattersalls Timeform Million at Newmarket after yesterday's five-day declaration stage. The Michael Jarvis trainee impressed work watchers in his latest exercise under Philip Robinson on the Limekilns on Saturday and is one of 27 entries left in the seven-furlong contest. "Sri Putra seems in good form and looks well," commented Jarvis. "I'd be happy to see some rain come, as I believe that he likes to get his toe in a bit." Boasting a guaranteed minimum prize fund of £1 million, the Tattersalls Timeform Million is Britain's most valuable two-year-old race and is exclusively for horses catalogued in Book 1 of the 2007 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. 
