YES IT'S TRUE Keeneland Sept. Yearlings Sold for up to \$400,000

FULFILLING DREAMS AT GOFFS

While the figures are not making for ideal reading at Goffs this week, the €1-million sale of the keenly anticipated filly by Danehill Dancer (Ire) pierced through the gloom during yesterday's middle session. Out of Starlight Dreams (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), hip 276 provided the focal point of the entire catalogue as a full-sister to this year's juvenile sensation Mastercraftsman (Ire).

Consigned by Paul Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud, the February-foaled chestnut already had much to commend her as a 3/4-sibling of this year's GIII Locust Grove H. winner Genuine Devotion (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}); it is also the extended family of Pressing (Ire), Sakhee and Celestial

Storm. That was before Ballydoyle's latest star juvenile emulated his sire in completing the double of The Curragh's G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. and planting himself at the head of the current European crop. When the bidding reached the million mark, opposition to the Coolmore collective halted abruptl,y and it was Demi O'Byrne who signed the docket to continue his domination of this renewal. "She was an obvious one, being an own-sister to such a good two-year-old," the leading buyer commented. "She's also a very goodlooking filly, and her sire is just going from strength to strength." In addition to Mastercraftsman, Danehill Dancer's juveniles this season include Group 1 winner Again (Ire) and Group 2 winnerWestphalia (Ire). Goffs cont. p2-5

Stardom Bound (Tapit), who made it back-to-back Grade I wins with a rousing score in the Oak Leaf S. at Santa Anita Sept. 27, will be offered at the Fasig-

Tipton November breeding stock sale Nov. 2, *Daily Racing Form* reports. That event comes just nine days after the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, a race for which the gray filly would likely be the favorite. Trainer Christopher Paasch told *DRF* that owner Charles Cono, a San Diego-based

real estate investment executive, intends to disperse his Thoroughbred holdings. But Paasch warns that it won't be easy to buy the filly, a \$375,000 graduate of this year's OBS March Sale. "I would say they're going to have to pay for her, because we would be foolish to give her away," Paasch told the publication. Runner-up in the GII Sorrento S. Aug. 6, Stardom Bound broke her maiden by 4 1/4 lengths in the Debutante Sept. 1 prior to her 3 1/2-length success in the Oak Leaf. Her current record stands at 4-2-2-0 with earnings of \$340,600.


Galileo Magnifico...

As on Day 1, Galileo (Ire) was responsible for the toppriced colt and the tag was again €500,000 for the afternoon's best. Capping a red-letter day for Ashtown House was a May-foaled colt out of Splendid (Ire) (Mujtahid), a half to listed-winning and group-placed Peking Opera (Ire). The yearling half brother to stakesplaced Bohunk was another to fall to O'Byrne after he saw off Tom Goff. Like Monday's Lion Heart colt who sold for €200,000, hip 267's third dam is Balidaress (Ire), under whose name sit the luminaries Cape Cross (Ire), Iffraaj (GB), Diktat (GB), Shadayid, Fath and Russian Rhythm. "He was a stand-out too," O'Byrne said. "He was just a very nice colt by a world- class sire and we liked him a lot." Seven lots later, it was another representative of the "heir apparent" who was making headlines when selling for €400,000. From the draft of Roundhill Stud, she is out of a sister to the 1997 G2 Flying Childers S. and 1998 G3 King George S. winner Land of Dreams (GB), dam of Godolphin's smart Into the Dark (GB). She was knocked down to Simon Christian, buying on behalf of Pat Fahey, owner of Sunday's Goffs Million winner Soul City (Ire). "She was just a lovely, sweet filly from a fine fillies' family and it's a fast family too," said Christian. "She's a great-walking, athletic sort and, although she's a first foal, we liked her an awful lot." John Magnier later paid €300,000 for another of Galileo's daughters consigned by Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud. Hip 349 is out of listedplaced Witch of Fife (Lear Fan), whose progeny include the 2006 G3 Solario S. winner Drumfire (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) and the 2001 G2 Gimcrack S. runner-up Ho Choi (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), later a top-class runner in Hong Kong. Her extended family includes unbeaten 2002 G1 Prix Vermeille heroine Pearly Shells (GB) and 1994 GI Hollywood Turf Cup winner Frenchpark (GB).

Goffs coverage cont. More Montjeu...

Coolmore sires were providing a near whitewash again yesterday and it was the turn of Montjeu (Ire) when hips 311 and 382 sold for €320,000 and €420,000, respectively. The former is from the draft of David Nagle's Barronstown Stud and is a half-brother to listed-placed Princess Wanda (Ire) (Polish Precedent). The February foal is out of Top Lady (Ire), who is a half to the 1997 G1 Futurity S. hero Emmson (Ire). Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff was gaining consolation for missing out on the colt topper. "He's a cracking colt, a very well-made sort from an excellent family and he comes from a very attractive cross, being out of a Shirley Heights mare," Goff explained. Later in the afternoon, hip 382 became the latest on O'Byrne's burgeoning shopping list. From the O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud, the colt is out of Altruiste (Diesis), a half to King's Best and Urban Sea. The March foal's page boasts one of the finest pedigrees in the world, with Galileo (Ire) topping a pyramid of talent which includes Anabaa Blue (GB), Black Sam Bellamy (Ire) and My Typhoon (Ire). His immediate relative Sea the Stars (Ire) looked destined for greater things when winning Sunday's G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh.

Dynamic Dancer...


Apart from the topper, Danehill Dancer was also responsible for seven other lots to breach the €100,000 mark yesterday and the next best proved to be Marlhill House Stud's hip 279, an April-foaled close relative of 2005 GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. heroine Luas Line (Ire) (Danehill). Out of a half to the 1987 G3 May Hill S. winner Intimate Guest (Ire), he sold for €380,000 to agent Jane Allison. "We felt that he was one of the stand-outs here at the sale and he has the pedigree to match," Allison said. "He was bought on behalf of Paul Roy and a partner and will be going into training with Jeremy Noseda." Later in the session, O'Byrne paid €340,000 for a daughter by that sire consigned as hip 420 by Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud.

Hip 420 is a half-sister to the 2006 G3 Craven S. winner Killybegs (Ire) (Orpen), who was also runner-up in that year's G2 Celebration Mile and G2 Challenge S. Angela Sykes secured another of his sons from the draft of Croom House when paying ${\in}260,\!000$ for hip 379, whose dam is a half to 2002 G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano scorer and 2003 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis runner-up Highdown (Ire).

That's the Spirit...

Every year that breeder Pat O'Kelly's prized broodmare Spirit of Tara (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) has been represented at this sale, her yearlings have commanded six-figure sums. Her latest offering was hip 265, a son of Oratorio (Ire) who kept up the tradition when selling to Paul Cole for €300,000. He is a half to five-time group winner and sire Echo of Light (GB) (Dubai Millennium {GB}), who topped this sale himself at €1.2 million five years ago. This is O'Kelly's finest family and includes none other than Salsabil (Ire) and Marju (Ire), who was himself represented by another €300,000 yearling consigned by Yeomanstown Stud as hip 374. Out of the group-placed Alexander Icequeen (Ire) (Soviet Star), he was knocked down to Shadwell, who had earlier paid the same amount for a colt by Indian Ridge (Ire) from the draft of Paddy Twomey's Hawthorn Villa Stud. Hip 318 is a grandson of the champion Filia Ardross (GB), whose progeny include 1998 G1 Fillies' Mile heroine and 1999 G1 Irish Oaks runner-up Sunspangled (Ire) (Caerleon). "Again, he's another from the final crop of a top sire," Shadwell's Stephen Collins said after his second high-profile Indian Ridge purchase in two days. "He's a lovely, athletic individual out a mare whose dam Filia Ardross was a champion in Germany. Filia Ardoss herself produced a champion two-year-old in Sunspangled, so it's obviously a very good family."

Prospecting for Gold...

Potential broodmares in demand were Mountain View Stud's hip 314, a Cape Cross (Ire) daughter of the stakes-placed Treasure the Lady (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) half to High Chaparral (Ire) who sold to Brian Grassick Bloodstock for €250,000 and hip 367, Barronstown's Sinndar (Ire) half-sister to 2002 G1 1000 Guineas third and GI E.P Taylor S. runner-up Alasha (Ire), who was knocked down to BBA Ireland for €280,000. Also up for grabs was Staffordstown's hip 366, a half-sister to Ballydoyle's smart juvenile Hail Caesar (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) from the family of Last Second (Ire), Albanova (GB), Alborada (GB), Aussie Rules, Yesterday (Ire) and Quarter Moon (Ire) who was purchased by Derryluskin Stud and Brighton Farm for €220,000. Peter Doyle Bloodstock snapped up another notable filly when paying €240,000 for Swordlestown Stud's hip 298, a Bahamian Bounty (GB) half-sister to this year's G2 Queen Mary S. winner and G2 Lowther S. third Langs Lash (Ire) (Noverre) from the leading French juvenile filly Elusive Wave (Ire).

Hard Reality Bites...

Yesterday witnessed more losses despite the drama surrounding the very top lots, and the middle market suffered as the median plummeted from \in 80,000 in 2007 to half that figure this time. Turnover decreased from in excess of \in 20 million to just \in 12,798,000, and the average dropped by 29 percent, down from \in 117,878 to \in 84,197 this term.



year's Arc. "The plan remains the same--Soldier of Fortune and Duke of Marmalade are being aimed at the Arc," O'Brien told Racing Post. However, Curlin (Smart Strike), who features among the 23, has just shipped to Santa Anita in preparation for a tilt at the Breeders' Cup meet later this month. Other probable runners include unbeaten G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Vision d'Etat (Fr) (Chichicastenango (Fr)) and the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. runner-up Papal Bull (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}).



Zarkava Pleases in Workout...

TDN Rising Star" Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) allayed fears she may repeat the slow exit which tempered victory in the Sept. 14 G1 Prix Vermeille--over the Arc course and distance last time--when working in company with two stablemates vesterday. The G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane victress was accompanied by Sindajan (Ire) (Medicean {GB}) and Shadiyna (Ire) (Dubai Destination) in the onemile exercise at Les Aigles gallops. Her connections were pleased by the start of her workout and the manner in which she finished several lengths clear of her colleagues. "She didn't have a hard race in the Vermeille and is doing very well, so I am very confident ahead of Sunday," said trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. Zambezi Sun Also Stretches His Legs...

Juddmonte Farms' Zambezi Sun (GB) (Dansili {GB}), a battling winner of the Sept. 14 G2 Prix Foy on Arc Trials weekend last time, also worked Monday. The Pascal Bary trainee sported first-time blinkers for the move and was accompanied by two companions. The homebred satisfied onlookers by pulling several lengths clear at the end of his piece. "The plan is still to run in the Arc," said Bary. "He tends to idle at times, which he did in the Foy, so that is why we fitted him with blinkers. We wouldn't want it soft as he's a fast-ground horse, so we'll just make sure we are satisfied with conditions and will wait until the last minute before making a decision."

Vision d'Etat in Easy Final Blow...

Unbeaten G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero **Vision d'Etat (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}), coming off a victory in the Sept. 14 G2 Prix Niel, enjoyed a final blowout at trainer Eric Libaud's private gallop. Working in the company of two others, he enjoyed a sedate spin over a mile on dirt. "It was an easy piece of work just to maintain his condition," said Libaud. "It wasn't to prove anything and it wasn't a test. It's not that he needs it heavy, but I would welcome some rain, because if it was on the soft side it would be a plus for him."

Look Here to Slip Under the Radar?

Julian Richmond-Watson's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), who ran a gutsy third in the Sept. 13 G1 St Leger at Doncaster last time, has emerged as a surprise possible for Sunday's feature, but requires a €100,000 supplement before making the line up. Originally slated to contest the G1 Prix de l'Opera on the Bois de Boulogne undercard, she will be partnered by Richard Hughes--who has lost the ride on Youmzain to Richard Hills--if making the main event. "Look Here is likely to run at the weekend, and although she is still a possible for the Prix de l'Opera, we are considering supplementing her on Thursday morning for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe," trainer Ralph Beckett told PA Sport. "We have booked Richard Hughes as he has ridden an Oaks Trial winner for her owner and has considerable experience of Longchamp."



A PIONEER ON THE POLY

At the very least, Zayat Stables and trainer Bill Mott seem to have a nice prospect for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf in **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker). On Saturday, they'll find out if they have more than that. That's when Pioneerof the Nile, whose only two starts have come going long on the grass at Saratoga, will try out Keeneland's Polytrack in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity. The stakes are potentially high. A good effort just might punch the two-year-old colt's ticket to the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, which will be run for the first time over another synthetic surface, Santa Anita's Pro-Ride. In addition to the added prestige, the Juvenile carries with it twice the purse (\$2 million) as the Juvenile Turf, plus a Grade I designation. But first thing's first: the science lab called Keeneland.

"We're experimenting a little bit," Mott confirmed during a national teleconference yesterday. "Although I've run him on the turf two times, I don't think he's going to be limited to turf racing. The main reasons he ran in those races is one, that he had worked well on the turf, but also because I wanted to run him in something with a little more distance. That's the only way you can get a two-turn race in New York that early in the year. So, it's a bit of an experiment, and he's got to earn his way to the Breeders' Cup. It's fair enough to give him an opportunity in the Lane's End. If he comes out of the race well, and he shows that he should go to California, then I think that's what we'll do. The race itself will dictate [whether the Juvenile or Juvenile Turf]."

Bill Mott said that Pioneerof the Nile's first test at Keeneland, a four-furlong work yesterday morning, was a success. The big colt covered the distance in :49 2/5 (21/36).

"He seemed to handle the synthetic well," Mott said. Pioneerof the Nile debuted at 1 1/16 miles at Saratoga Aug. 4. After settling near the back of the pack, he closed to be fourth, beaten just a length by Skipadate (Skip Away)--the subsequent runner-up in the With Anticipation S. at Saratoga who goes Saturday in Woodbine's Summer S. In Pioneerof the Nile's next start Aug. 25, at the same distance, he lunged at the break and found himself some 11 lengths behind the frontrunner, but he made a strong move under Kent Desormeaux and was up in plenty of time to win by one length.

It marked a historic win for Zayat Stables, as Pioneerof the Nile was the first homebred winner for Ahmed Zayt's outfit. Zayat purchased the Gone West colt Forefathers as a yearling, and was impressed enough with him that he later privately purchased Forefathers' dam Star of Goshen. The daughter of Lord at War (Arg) had displayed immense promise early in her three-year-old year, capturing her first three starts by a combined 27 lengths before being retired prematurely because of an injury. Her proficiency as a broodmare was still a bit of question mark when Zayat purchased her with Pioneerof the Nile in utero, but she now appears plenty adept at her second career, too. Mott, who sent out Forefathers to a fourth-place finish in the GII Kelso H. at Belmont last weekend, believes that while Pioneerof the Nile has some of mom's pep, he more resembles his Classic-winning father.

"She was a terribly fast filly,"said Mott, "But he is a big, long-striding colt who's probably going to take a little longer to come into his own. I don't think we've seen the best of him by a longshot. He's really going to be a horse for the spring of next year. Now, what surface he'll wind up on and be the best on remains to be seen, but he seems to be a quality horse."

The Torch is Passed...

During yesterday's teleconference, Mott was also asked how he felt watching Curlin (Smart Strike) surpass Cigar as racing's all-time leading money earner with a victory in Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. Mott admitted to some mixed emotions, but was philosophical about seeing his former charge's record fall. "There was a little gouge in my stomach just as he crossed the finish line, but I don't think it lasted long," said Mott. "But the reality of sports is that it's just going to happen, and if we think we can hold onto those records forever, we're kidding ourselves. There's really no long-lasting sadness. I was just pleased to watch a good horse run, and to see Curlin out on the race track rather than the breeding shed. Obviously, he could have been there a year earlier than he will be, and I think for everybody in the business it's great to see those type of horses run, so people can at least recognize their names. He's a good horse, and probably deserves to have the money record. Cigar held it for 12 years, and I think that's the second-longest anybody's ever held it, apart from maybe Kelso. So, Cigar's up there in good company, and now Curlin's up there in good company. I'm just happy to have been part of it." One reporter asked Mott to handicap a mythical match race between Curlin and Cigar. Mott just laughed. "I don't know who'd win, but I know who I'd be pulling for," he said. -L.M.

MCLAUGHLIN MAKING PLANS Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin would have had the likely favorite for Saturday's one-mile GI Champagne S. at Belmont with Charitable Man (Lemon Drop Kid), but has decided to train the colt up to the Breeders' Cup and instead will be represented by Darley's Girolamo (A.P. Indy). McLaughlin explained his decision during a national teleconference yesterday. "I thought it was back a little close for him," McLaughlin said of Charitable Man, who captured the Sept. 13 GII Futurity S. at Belmont in his second career start. Mr. and Mrs. William K. Warren's colorbearer would have had a three-week break to the Champagne. Instead, he'll now have six weeks to prepare for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 25.


"He worked this morning in :48 flat and is training very well," reported McLaughlin, who added that Charitable Man's preparations for the Juvenile hadn't been finalized, but that he would like to familiarize the colt to some extent with Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface. "I talked to Mr. Warren a few days ago," McLaughlin said. "We will probably go out there and work once on the track, maybe twice, but as I told Mr. Warren, I don't think working on the track is going to let us know if he likes it as much as a race is, obviously. But if the weather turns back East, I would get out of here quicker. That's the one plus with the synthetic tracks is that they're going to remain fast and consistent."

Yesterday, McLaughlin openly expressed his concerns about racing his horses on Pro-Ride, though not because of safety issues. Last weekend, McLaughlin shipped Darley's **Regal Ransom** (Distorted Humor) to contest the GI Norfolk S. The colt, hammered down to 7-5 favoritism, struggled home eighth, a lackluster effort McLaughlin attributes to his colt's inability to handle the new surface. "[Jockey Alan Garcia] used the words 'spinning his wheels,'" said McLaughlin. "That's just one horse, but he did not like the track that day. We'll run him on the dirt from here on out."

Meanwhile, McLaughlin has an intriguing Champagne substitute for Charitable Man in the impeccably bred Girolamo. Out of the Mr. Prospector mare Get Lucky, Girolamo is a full-brother to graded winners Accelerator and Daydreaming and to She's a Winner, dam of Bluegrass Cat. (He's also a half to the Storm Cat colt that topped the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale at \$2 million.)

"He's out of Get Lucky, but he's more A.P. Indy," McLaughlin said. "He's a big, strong, developing colt who will probably want to run all day. So that's why we thought to run him a mile back in three weeks. He needs racing. He's like a young teenage kid who's learning and growing. He's very talented, a beautiful mover and has a great disposition. He's the type that should get a mile and quarter."

Favored in his debut going seven panels at Saratoga, Girolamo came through to win by 3 1/4 lengths. He was part of McLaughlin's non-coupled entry in the Futurity, and was a solid fourth, beaten four lengths by his stablemate. Still, McLaughlin believes the colt had some things going against him that day.



"The track was very wet, even though it was labeled fast," McLaughlin explained. "Charitable Man had a wide trip, which often you would say is a negative. But on that day, being that these are two-year-olds, he stayed out in the clear and stayed out of trouble and had everything go his way, and we think Girolamo [who was in behind horses] will run better Saturday."

McLaughlin added that, big race or not in the Champagne, Girolamo isn't necessarily Breeders' Cup-bound.

"This is his third race in seven weeks, and he'd be going to a foreign track back in three weeks," McLaughlin said . "If he won the Champagne, it would be up to Sheikh Mohammed ...but at this point, I'd say it's doubtful we'd go back in three weeks. We might just wait and go to the GII Remsen S. or go to Dubai."

On Saturday, McLaughlin will also send out **Majestic Blue** (Forestry) in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. Another owned by Darley, the \$675,000 FTFFEB graduate broke his maiden sprinting 5 1/2 furlongs at the Spa Aug. 27. McLaughlin said the big question was again how his charge would handle the switch to a synthetic track.

"We've been training on the Poly at Sheikh Mohammed's Greentree in Saratoga all summer, and we thought it would suit Regal Ransom going out to California last weekend, which it did not," McLaughlin said. "You never know until you race one it. Majestic Blue just broke his maiden and is making a big step to a Grade I, but if he likes the Poly like we think he will, he should perform well." -L.M.


CRASHING WAVES

In light of the world's financial panic--which demonstrates why it's all right for horse markets to be essentially unregulated but not all right for the same principles to be applied to, say, international financial institutions--it's difficult to know how much of the yearling market's declines are internally generated (the result of factors to do with the Thoroughbred market itself), and how much are being externally generated. My guess is that we had enough problems of our own to explain most of the 2008 horse-market declines without taking anything else into account, though the availability (and, at this point, desirability) of credit are certainly entitled to impact spending decisions.

The issue in our small, essentially unregulated market comes down to those three little words: supply and demand. Or, in our case, oversupply and lack of demand. The oversupply part of it has been documented beyond argument. Lack of demand could be impacted by credit issues, but the 'end user'--the racehorse owner--has plenty of reasons not to want to own racehorses already. Not least of which, for those for whom financial considerations play a part in their decisionmaking, is the fact that racehorses as a whole only recover about half the money 'invested' in them. In other words, racehorse owners, as a group, only get half their money back; breeders and the ancillary industries (like us parasitic journalists, which I mean in the nicest possible way) are the ones making what money there has been to make. There's not a huge financial incentive to be a racehorse owner, which is fine if you're not in it for the money, but not so fine if you really don't want to lose half your money.

First-half 2008 sales (the Northern Hemisphere ones we cover) totaled \$365.8 million, almost exactly a 10-percent drop from \$408.7 million in 2007, and 12 percent below the 2006 high-water mark of \$415.9 million. With almost exactly the same number catalogued in 2008 as in 2007, Keeneland September was down 15 percent in gross, from \$385 million to just a hair under \$328 million. I think there's a good case for saying the horse market right now is down 20 percent, of which at least 15 percent can be ascribed to factors internal to our market, with maybe five percent ascribable to external market forces.

Against that backdrop, both of this week's major yearling sales kicked off with Black Mondays. The opening session of Goffs' Million sale was off 38 percent in gross, and 34 percent in average, from last year.



The Fasig-Tipton Maryland sale, again with a 900-strong catalogue, was down 35 percent in gross, and almost exactly one-third in average. Goffs recovered some on Tuesday, and it looks like it will be down around 30 percent when the figures are tallied at the end of today's session. I know there is the temptation to use the term 'market collapse,' but I think there are specific reasons why both sales are down 10 percent more than the Thoroughbred auction market as a whole.

In the case of Goffs, their Million sale rode the wave of the Irish property boom in 2005, when the sale grossed \in 51 million (their week-long Orby sale had grossed only \in 32 million in 2004), and 2006, when it reached a high of \in 59 million. It was already dropping from that peak a year ago, when it grossed \in 53.8 million--about 10 percent below the 2006 total. Gross revenues at the end of today's sale will be more in the neighborhood of \in 35 million. But, just as the Goffs gross leapt up as a result of Irish property money, so it must now pay the price; that wave has crashed, and washed that Irish property money right out of the horse market.

It's a different story in Maryland, more the raw supply-and-demand equation of too many horses and not enough buyers. This is traditionally a good sale, and plenty of good horses have come, and will continue to come, out of it. But most sectors of the North American market are centralizing in Kentucky; the two-yearold sales in Ocala are a notable exception. Yes, there is always the chance that a revamped Saratoga will provide a viable professional August diversion, as Argana has succeeded admirably in doing in Deauville (making them frontrunner in my mythical annual Sales Company of the Year award; that, and the fact their August yearling sale is about the only one which has actually been up this year). But the market is effectively centralizing in Central Kentucky. The Fasig Maryland sale is just the latest victim of truly limited demand in these troubled times.

It's time to be booking mares, too. Breeders aren't going to forget this year's results in the next 30 days, and there should be intense pressure on stud fees. To the extent that fees don't come down (by roughly a third, is my take on it), there will be a corresponding spike in the number of foal shares. My guess is that if fees came down a third, breeders would be willing to actually sign up to pay them. From the statistical point of view, I don't like foal shares because it makes it very difficult to analyze profitability. It's all very well to say, Stallion A stood for \$50,000, therefore a yearling had to sell for \$125,000, or whatever, to show a profit. But if nobody paid the stud fee, it's less clear where the profit threshold lies. But that's a technical problem, which the market takes no notice of. The real reason why foal shares are only a very short-term fix is because it masks the industry's failure to improve the demand side of the equation; just because you don't pay a stud fee doesn't mean there will be anybody there to buy your yearling. It improves the breeder's cash flow, but it doesn't create more buyers. That's the problem the industry--by which I mean the breeders and stallion owners, the only groups with any real money-needs to address, hopefully before our backs are really and truly up against the wall.




