Smarty Jones' BE SMART Runs Today in the Alcibiades S. (G1)

KEENELAND KICKS OFF IN STYLE

Keeneland, which begins its 17-day fall meeting in Lexington today, boasts plenty of quality on its opening day. Heading the 10-race card are a pair of Grade I tests for fillies, including the GI First Lady S., which

features four ladies who have already triumphed at the highest level. Among them is Precious Kitten (Catienus), who came up a half-length short behind Vacare in last year's renewal of this race before losing all chance when knocked sideways in the early going of last fall's GI Breeders'

Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Monmouth. A close-up fifth in the GII Jenny Wiley S. over this course Apr. 12, the dark bay came back to score in the GI Gamely S. May 26 before tiring to be fifth in her latest, the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 9. The GI Del Mar Oaks heroine Rutherienne (Pulpit), winner of the Jenny Wiley, comes into this off four consecutive third-place finishes, including the aforementioned Gamely and most recently the GII Ballston Spa H. at Saratoga Aug. 21. The champion two-year-old filly of 2006, Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) opened up the current season with consecutive wins in the GIII Endeavor S. and GIII Hillsborough S. this winter. The chestnut added the GIII Mint Julep H. at Churchill in June after a runner-up finish to Bayou's Lassie (Outflanker) a month earlier in the GIII Distaff Turf Mile and tired late to be fourth in her most recent start in the 1 3/16-mile Beverly D. One race later, the

juvenile fillies get a chance to shine in the Darley GI Alcibiades S. Standing above the rest is **Mani Bhavan** (Storm Boot), winner of Saratoga's GI Spinaway S. in her latest start Aug. 31. The front-running filly, who is undefeated in three starts, also accounted for the GII Adirondack S. Aug.

13. A filly looking to add some black-type to her nifty pedigree is **Devotee** (Elusive Quality). Out of UAE 1000 Guineas heroine Danuta (Sunday Silence), the chestnut graduated in convincing style at the Spa Aug. 31. The only other filly with a stakes win on her resume is **Bon Jovi Girl** (Malibu Moon), who chased home winner Mani Bhavan home in second in her career debut at Delaware July 12, but most recently galloped home a much-thebest 9 3/4-length winner while trying two turns for the first time in that track's Fairway S. Sept. 13. **Fields p4**

WITHIN RANGE

Even without a Ballydoyle runner, Coolmore still hold a favorite's chance of garnering today's G1 Shadwell Middle Park S. at Newmarket with the David Wachmantrained **Bushranger (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}). Derrick Smith,

Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's bay had Gallagher (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) a halflength back in second when annexing the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville last time Aug. 24, and sets the standard on that form. "You can never be confident going into a race like this,"



Wachman told *PA Sport*. "The horse is very well, he's pleased me since his run in France. It's a stiffish six furlongs at Newmarket, but he certainly wasn't stopping in France; in fact, he was finishing best of all."

ON THE BORDERLINE

In an open renewal of the G1 Cheveley Park S., **O** "TDN Rising Star" Mythical Border (Johannesburg) steps up to the plate at Newmarket today needing only to find a sliver of improvement to be in the shakeup. Having shown a sharp turn of acceleration to win on debut over five furlongs at Lingfield May 9, Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al-Thani's chestnut was running for the first time subsequently when a neck third in Doncaster's G2 Flying Childers S. over that trip last time Sept. 12 Trainer Jeremy Noseda also puts forward Cheveley Park Stud's Sept. 5 Kempton maiden scorer Adorn (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) as he chases a third renewal following the exploits of Wannabe Grand (Ire) in 1998 and Carry on Katie five years later. "I feel she will move forward [Flying Childers] and goes into the Cheveley Park with credentials that suggest she'll be very competitive," Noseda said. Field p3







EUROPES 'BEST' INVADES KEENELAND

John R. Best may be a little known quantity on this side of the Atlantic, but not for long. The Kent, England-based conditioner wields a triple-loaded arsenal of up-and-coming juveniles in Saturday's GI Lane's End Futurity S. at Keeneland. Heading the team is Square Eddie (Smart Strike), a \$200,000 KEESEP yearling purchase. Racing for David Gorton, the colt was overwhelmed in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 17, but relished the drop back to easier company when breaking his maiden going six furlongs at Salisbury July 22. Bolstered with confidence off that effort, the chestnut was a game runner-up to Elnawin in the G3 Sirenia S. Sept. 6. Sold soon after, the

colt will make his first start for J. Paul Reddam in Saturday's Futurity.

"John always wanted to run horses abroad," said Neil Morris, Best's traveling head lad, who is accompanied at Keeneland by Donna Brincat.

Also making the trip is Flashmans Paper (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who got off the mark in his third

career start when taking the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot June 17. The runner-up that day--beaten a half length--was subsequent Group I stakes winner Bushranger (Ire) (Danetime), who is set to contest today's Shadwell G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket. The British gelding finished fifth in his

"We had a couple of wins at Royal Ascot, and I think that's given him a boost of confidence," Morris added about Best, who also saddled Kingsgate Native (GB) to a Group 1 victory at the meeting. "He decided to go with his heart."

Last year, Best dipped his toe in on this side of the pond with Group 2 winner and Irish Classic-placed Rising Cross (GB), who finished fifth in Aqueduct's GIII Long Island H. Back for the spring meet in April, Rising Cross finished third in Keeneland's GIII Grey Goose Bewitch S.

"[Rising Cross] ran a big race, and we decided to run some more over here," said Morris, explaining the decision to send over Best's juveniles. "The prize money is better over here than it is in Great Britain, and the owners are happy to do it."

> Rounding out the trio is Deposer (Ire) (Kheleyf), a son of hot freshman sire Kheleyf (Green Desert). The colt broke his maiden at second asking over the Polytrack at Lingfield, but failed to land a blow when moved up to group company for his two latest starts, including a sixthplace finish in the Sirenia.

> "You have to go into races like this feeling confident," said Morris of this year's team. "You have to go out to win."

> Asked about how the Best crew will stack up against their American counterparts, Brincat added, "We think they have a chance, because John wouldn't have

Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe

KAMSIN IN Stall Blankenese's Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}), who has three Group 1 successes to his name this term, was the only addition to the field for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe after yesterday's supplementary stage. The G1 Deutsches Derby hero, who was awarded the Aug. 17 G1 Rheinland-Pokal and who took out the Sept. 7 G1 Grosser Preis von Baden last time, joined 16 likely candidates after connections decided to pay the €100,000 entry fee. Trainer Peter Schiergen admitted the current track conditions played a significant part of the decision process. "It was decided to supplement Kamsin in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe as it looks like the ground is not going to be too firm," Schiergen told *PA Sport*. "That was basically what pushed us into taking our chance."

LOOK OUT Julian Richmond-Watson's Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), who was mooted as a possible supplementary entry for Sunday's Arc, will not make the line up for the €4-million contest, according to trainer Ralph Beckett. The G1 Epsom Oaks heroine, a gallant third in the Sept. 13 G1 St Leger at Doncaster last time, may also have run her last race of the campaign after blood tests failed to satisfy connections. "Look Here was not supplemented for the race. We had to run all the tests on her and we were not happy with her blood sample," Beckett told PA Sport. "She looks fantastic and we have been happy with her work, but you have got to be in top order for a race like the Arc, so she will not run at the weekend. It is unlikely she will run again this year. She is entered [in the Oct. 18 G2 Pride S.] at Newmarket so that is a possibility, but I would say it is less than likely."

ARQANA TO OFFER RNAS ON WEB Argana will offer buyers a second chance at horses that fail to sell in the sales ring during Saturday's Arc Sale. Lots that do not sale in the ring will be offered for private sale through Argana's website, www.argana.com. Horses that were led out unsold or were bought back by their vendors will appear on the site with a "Make an Offer" button next to their name. Interested buyers will fill out an on-line form that will be immediately forwarded to a member of the sales company's accounts team, who verify the information and notify the vendor. "Our vendors' interests are a constant worry," commented Argana managing director Olivier Delloye. "We are confident that this pro-active measure will develop into a significant asset in order to keep the market fluid and maximize vendors' opportunities to sell their consignments at our sales." The new option will be available at all future Argana auctions.

[at Hollywood] on Saturday." The half-brother to GI Belmont S. winners Rags to Riches and Jazil has not raced since capturing the GII Peter Pan S. May 10 in just his second career outing; he was scratched on the morning of the Belmont with a bruised foot. His connections are looking to run the three-year-old in an Oak Tree allowance race before a tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25.

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Finjaan (GB) represents Marcus Tregoning. He has enjoyed a break since his hard-fought win in Goodwood's G3 Molecomb S. July 29, and his conditioner is expecting a bold show. "His preparations have gone great and he's in very good form," Tregoning told PA Sport. "I've got no concern at all about the trip; he was doing his best work close home at Goodwood, so he should stay. He's got plenty of scope and at this stage, I would say that there's every chance he will stay further next year, but tomorrow is judgement day, I suppose, we'll learn a lot about him." She was subsequently third, beaten a head, behind Geoff Howard-Spink and Peter Marshall's Infamous Angel when spotting that rival three pounds in the G2 Lowther S. staged at Newmarket last time Aug. 23. Infamous Angel, who represents the red-hot Richard Hannon barn responsible for the 2006 heroine Indian Ink (Ire), bids to emulate recent scorers Carry on Katie and Queen's Logic (Ire) in completing the Lowther-Cheveley Park double. Conditioner Rae Guest has a rare shot at the highest level with the unbeaten Serious Attitude, who booked her ticket with a success in the Listed Dick Poole Fillies' S. at Salisbury Sept. 4, while another relative minnow seeking a fairytale result is Alan Bailey. His representative, Aspen Darlin, captured the Sept. 20 G3 Firth of Clyde S. on ground which was at the other end of the spectrum to that which she will encounter here, and it remains to be seen whether that win came as a result of the testing conditions. Winner of the one-mile Martha Washington S. at Oaklawn and WinStar Oaks at Sunland Park on the dirt earlier this year, the bay failed to score in three subsequent starts on the main track, but marked her return to the synthetic with a win most recently in the GIII Arlington Park Oaks Aug. 2. Golden Doc A recorded a career high in the GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita Feb. 9, and followed that with a pair of runner-up finishes in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 8 and the GII Beaumont S. over this track Apr. 10. The chestnut came home fourth as the even-money choice in her latest in the Torrey Pines S. at Del Mar Aug. 31.

Trainer Nick Zito brings two legitimate contenders to the Meadowlands in search of his first Meadowlands Cup victory. The duo is headed by the upset Classic winner Da'Tara. That dark bay gave a glimpse of bigger things to come when runner up in the 1 1/16-mile GII Barbaro S. at Pimlico May 17 and broke through in style, running away to an emphatic score in the GI Belmont S. June 7. Seventh in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27, he tired to fifth after showing speed early in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23. Also representing Zito is Anak Nakal, winner of the GII Pennsylvania Derby in his latest Sept. 1. Third behind stablemate in the Belmont, he could only finish fifth in the Jim Dandy, but, according to jockey Joe Bravo, the colt is improving with time. "This is a big talented horse," Bravo said. "While he was younger, he had his mind in other business. If he's happy, he'll overcome everything and, hopefully, we'll see the same Anak Nakal we saw in his last race."

Eagle Mountain, runner-up in the G1 Champion S., makes his first start for new connections. "We've got him entered in a Group 1 race in Milan, and there is also the possibility of the Breeders' Cup in America," trainer Mike de Kock said. "He could also run in the Champion S., but we will see how he comes out of his next race before making any firm plans." Bankable returns to a mile after suffering a surprise defeat over nearly 10 furlongs in the Sept. 14 G3 Select S. at Goodwood. 



Exhibiting signs of greenness when breaking through on debut at Newmarket's July course Aug. 15, Ashram was done no favors and endured a troubled trip when suffering defeat in a Kempton conditions event last time Sept. 6. With that previous experience standing him in good stead, he steered clear of any potential danger here and dented some sizeable reputations by securing a first pattern victory in emphatic style. Ashram was settled last of the seven runners until beyond halfway as North East Corner (Giant's Causeway) set solid fractions. He made smooth headway under coaxing to challenge with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and ran on strongly to go clear up the hill for an impressive win. "He's been working so well at home that he deserved to take his chance and he showed a lovely turn of foot, so I was really pleased with that," said trainer John Hills. "We ran him on the all-weather surface at Kempton because there was so much soft ground around at that time, but he ran into all kinds of trouble. The [G1] Dewhurst S. is in 2 1/2 weeks, so we'll take a look at what's left in and what's likely to pitch up on the day, but we'll get him home and make sure we're happy with him first. Although he's a slow learner and a big baby, he's got himself a ticket now. We've not got to worry about the going and the timing's right so we'll probably come back here and take our chances." It's been nine years since David and Jill Heerensperger had a horse start in the Breeders' Cup, but the couple might soon be making travel arrangements for California should their three-year-old filly **Indyanne** (Indian Charlie) put up a big effort in tomorrow's GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland. The gray filly has been nearly perfect in five starts. She captured her only two starts at two, including the Bay Meadows Debutante, then returned this year to win a Golden Gate allowance in June and the GIII Azalea S. at Calder in July. The combined margin of victory for those races was 32 1/2 lengths. It was only in her latest that Indyanne took a step back. Sent off at 2-5 odds in the Aug. 23 GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga, Indyanne was pressured through rapid fractions and was run down late by Porte Bonheur (Hennessy). Indyanne is trained by Greg Gilchrist, who picked her out of the '07 Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale and purchased her on behalf of the Heerenspergers for \$375,000.

"She's coming into the race great, and if she runs first or second, I think we probably would go to the Breeders' Cup [Filly & Mare Sprint]," David Heerensperger confirmed.

Jill and David Heerensperger were both born and raised in Washington and still call the Evergreen State home. David was the CEO of Pay 'n Pak Hardware Stores and retired for a brief time before launching Eagle Hardware and Garden, which he sold to Lowe's about nine years ago. David is now officially retired, though these days is a minority owner in Emerald Downs near Seattle. The Heerenspergers have long had ties with the local racing scene, which they credit for first drawing them into the business back in 1980.

"We went to a Washington sale and had a few beers, and went a little crazy and bought a horse," David, 72, remembered with a laugh. "I think we wound up buying about five that year, and got a little horse called Dave's Reality who won five straight for us--so we thought this was an easy game."

Around 1997, trainer Neil Drysdale, acting on behalf of the Heerenspergers, privately purchased a Rahy gelding who was racing in England named Hawksley Hill (Ire).

"He had run out of his conditions over there and was carrying a lot of weight, and Drysdale saw him," David said. "We did very well with him; he made about \$1.5 million for us."

The Heerenspergers first trip to the Breeders' Cup was courtesy of the very good, and perhaps somewhat unlucky, Hawksley Hill. The gelding had won five graded races for the Heerenspergers by the time he stepped into the gate at 15-1 odds in the '98 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, but he nearly belied that price by rallying from last to be beaten just a head by Da Hoss. The following year, Hawksley Hill seemed to atone for a series of narrow losses over the summer by finishing first in the GI Atto Mile. But the stewards at Woodbine ruled that his jockey, Pat Day, had struck a rival in the face with his whip and the pair was demoted to fourth. Bettors nonetheless sent Hawksley Hill favored in the '99 BC Mile. Hawksley Hill again closed from the clouds, but could only get up to be fifth, beaten a length by Silic (Fr).

Despite two tough beats, David fondly remembers those trips to the Breeders' Cup.

"It was our first time there, and that first time we were 15-1," said David. "I was just happy we were competitive. And the second time wasn't all that bad."

Just before that second Breeders' Cup, the Heerenspergers purchased a robust son of Cryptoclearance at the Keeneland September Sale for \$1.2 million. The colt was a half-brother to that year's dual Classic winner Charismatic, and proved to be worth his steep price tag. Trained by David Hoffmans, Millennium Wind won the GII Santa Catalina S. in his third start and romped by daylight in the GI Blue Grass S. in his fifth. He emerged from an unplaced finish in the 2001 GI Kentucky Derby with an injury and would make just one more start before being retired to stud. He now stands at Highcliff Farm in New York.

While the Heerenspergers' operation was as big 60 to 80 horses in the 1980s, they currently have 14 horses. In addition to Indyanne, they can boast this year's GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. winner **Artiste Royale (Ire)** (Danehill) and the three-year-old filly **Sky Mystic** (Sky Mesa). The latter was another filly purchased last year by Gilchrist, who acquired her for \$400,000 at the Calder Sale.

Sky Mystic has won three of five, including the \$100,000 California Oaks in February. She hasn't raced since then, but is nearing a return.

"She was a little off so we gave her some time," explained David. "She was actually ready to come in Tuesday, but kicked something. Nothing serious, and she'll be in next week, hopefully. She's a nice filly, but I don't think she's the quality of Indyanne. They're two totally different horses; Indyanne is so calm and carefree, and the other one has a bit of Storm Cat in her--she gets a bit hot."

The Heerenspergers are friends with Gilchrist, but relatively new clients to the Northern California conditioner.

"We had watched Greg for years and all the luck he had with Harry Aleo's horses," said David. "Harry was pretty sick last year, and so we went in with Greg. There were a couple he liked a lot--Indyanne and Sky Mystic--so we said go ahead and buy them. Greg's really got a good eye and is kind of a genius at doing this. He picked two out for us and they both became stakes winners. He bought us two more this year, but they haven't started yet."

The Heerenspergers 2008 purchases include a Speightstown colt named He's Speightful who was knocked down for \$300,000 (Ricky Leppala consigned); and a Mineshaft filly named Jill's Gem who was purchased for \$150,000 (Stephens Thoroughbreds consigned). Both were Calder grads. "We just turned the Mineshaft out, and the Speightstown just came in from Florida and is probably two or three weeks away from her first breeze," David reports. -LM





KEEPING BREEDERS AFLOAT: ANOTHER MODEST PROPOSAL

There's not much more I can say about the silliness of "humane" whips and counting the number of times those whips are used to hit a horse in front of fans, would-be fans, and out-raged critics, when the real folly is not the whip, but the act of whipping. Somewhat modifying the use of the whip is a bit like trying to put band-aids on a deep, three-inch gash. As I have no more to say on that important matter, however, I will speak out in this essay about an even more pressing and fundamental crisis facing our industry, the perilous plight of the breeder.

We are in the midst of a far-reaching economic crisis. No, not the cataclysmic implosion facing some of our major financial institutions and the bailouts and steadily declining stock market, although those events affect all of us and bear on the problem at hand. I refer, instead, to our recently concluded September yearling sale and its implications for the survival of our breeding industry as we know it.

The context. If we picture our industry as a large pyramid, breeders form the supporting base. If we picture our industry as a chain of dominoes, breeders are the first domino in the sequence, and none of the others will be activated if that first one is not able to move forward. No matter how we picture it, breeders produce the horses and are the cornerstone, or the foundation, for every subsequent Thoroughbred activity.

It should be alarming to the entire industry, therefore, that Keeneland's recent September sale has fully exposed the vulnerability of the breeding community. The supporting base of our industry pyramid is critically weakened and in danger of crumbling. Breeders are facing an unprecedented and dangerous level of unprofitability, and, unless significant short-term changes occur, many breeders will be forced to close up and find another endeavor.

In particular, the least capitalized operations (in other words the little guys who make up the backbone of the industry), are being especially hammered, and many will disappear.

Obviously, our supply-and-demand curve is out of kilter, and we need some degree of short term shake-out and reduction in mares bred. We will not have to wait for this. Things are so bad now that a shake-out is currently in progress and will continue for the foresee-able future as demand will continue to shrink. Declining purses, poor marketing, rising costs, and a softening economy will extend this downward spiral as few new racing owners will be inspired to jump in, and many current owners will be cutting back or heading toward the door.

Free market factors are clearly in place and need to be allowed to operate, which means that some breeders will either go under or drop out. This is as natural as it is painful. That said, however, many participants at the upper end are able to operate without a strong profit motive. These relatively wealthy participants benefit from tax advantages or substantial assets beyond their equine holdings and don't depend on profitability to stay in business. They can, and will, weather the storm.

But what about the little guy, the small breeder who tries to make his way from year to year with bank loans and the sale of his horses? Do we want him to disappear? Do we want this to only be a niche game for a small group of rich guys who pretty much trade horses with each other? Do we only want to produce horses bred on big stud fees? I don't think so. We need horses for every stratum. We need horses for Belmont, Churchill, and Santa Anita, but, we also need horses for Turfway, Hawthorne and Golden Gate, River Downs and Remington. We need participants at every level, and it is a given fact of the Turf that no one knows where the next big horse will come from, so everyone deserves a shot. Horsemen who read the stakes results every day and check out all of the pedigrees know that the gene pool is very deep, and that Grade I winners and many damn good horses also come from the ranks of the so-called "lesser" matings. The main point, therefore, is that, at this very difficult time, breeders at every level have a place and a purpose, and we need to find a way for most of our breeders (those who breed for books one through four as well as those who breed for five through eight), to stay in business. cont. p13

Op Ed..Rob Whiteley cont.

Those of us who have persisted at this venture over several years know that, historically, breeding racehorses, just like owning racehorses, is generally unprofitable (except for those who control the 100 or so commercial stallions). Yet, many breeders persevere by subsidizing their efforts through income from other sources, and by finding improvisational ways to cut corners and scratch their way through in order to keep doing what they love to do. But, these are exceptional times and only so many corners can be cut.

While demand for breeders' yearlings declines amid a deteriorating general economy and a poorly run and poorly marketed broader industry, the costs of goods, supplies, and services (general production costs) are steadily rising. Over the last year, basic items used to produce yearlings have had very worrisome price increases: Mixed hay (+20%), Alfalfa (+30%), straw (+25%), feed (+25%), 50" Diamond Mesh fencing (+50%). Breeders are drowning in a perfect storm.

THE PROPOSAL. For the calendar year 2009 (and for this one year only), the three major service groups, whose profitability is not much impacted by overproduction or the current economic hardship faced by breeders, will roll-back their fees. Stallion owners will reduce their stud fees by 50%. Sales companies will reduce their fees and commissions by 50%. Veterinarians will reduce their fees for services and procedures by 50% and their mark-up on medications by 50%.

Consignors are not included in this proposal because most of them already negotiate their fees with breeders, do not have relative control over the production cycle or sales scene, and work with a much lower profit margin than the Big Three. Nonetheless, they should also participate in a roll-back of fees to the fullest extent possible.

THE RATIONALE. The rationale is simple. This is a practical proposal in the interest of everyone involved. The three dominant service groups control the sales scene and the production cycle, and it is in their long-term best interest to make huge cuts now. Significantly fewer breeders and fewer horses will generally mean less revenue for each provider over time. Unless these service groups work together to lower their fees dramatically for 2009, there will be much less for them to control and profit from as events go forward year to year. If this proposal is implemented, the stallion owners, sales companies, and vets will still be just fine at the end of 2009, and breeders will have a fighting chance to stay in place. Now is the time to act before the bulk of the breeders are beyond resuscitation.

THE PROFITABILITY DATA. You might want to have a drink before you read this next part that details September yearling profitability using 2006 advertised stud fees, session by session and book by book.

The table below gives a sobering overview of results. It is even more sobering to note that many of the yearlings marked as "profitable" were really "break-even" or negligibly profitable. This sale was not only ugly for the low-end breeder. It was ugly across the board. As Bill Oppenheim pointed out in his TDN auction review of September 25, even breeders at the top end were "scorched by some of the numbers for the top stallions."

(Percentages are based on the number of yearlings catalogued in each session because, in most cases, yearlings that are withdrawn or RNA are unprofitable, with the meter still running. The few that are withdrawn and sold privately or sold at the barn for a profit are probably off-set by the "false-solds" who were not actually sold, but signed for by an owner's agent).

FORMULA FOR PROFITABILITY. It takes 2 1/2 years of expense and effort to get a horse to the September sale, and it sometimes amazes me that most sales participants do not know the true cost of producing sales yearlings. New participants sit in the seats and see yearlings appear from behind the podium almost like magic, and do not have a clue. Although many competent and responsible veterinarians work the sale and understand what is at stake, a small handful of them do not seem to comprehend the cost and effort to get a yearling to the sales ring, or the financial damage that they do to breeders. When members of this small sub-group casually perform an exam or report, or use inexperienced interns, or don't read or employ their peers' research related to racing performance, or fail to take the time to communicate fully and in ordinary language with their clients, or approach yearling evaluations by looking for problems instead of helping clients find athletes who can overcome minor flaws or irregularities, they do a disservice to all parties and add to the cost of doing business. Even a lot of veteran breeders are not aware of the exact costs involved. They simply do not want to know the harsh detail of a final tally. As long as they can borrow or dip into cash reserves, they prefer to just "keep on keeping on" and doing what they live to do, rather than "keep on counting up."

As a prominent horseman and good friend once quipped to me, "If people really knew, they probably wouldn't want to do it." But, that's not really so. It's in our blood. Many of us have no choice; we have too much love and passion for the horses and for our way of life. It is what we do, and we will go down with the ship if we have to. I'm hoping we don't have to.

Therefore, for reference and in order to further discussion, I am providing the often ignored detail. While building and directing Foxfield, I had to answer to Carl Icahn's accountants for every penny. Using that experience, the following is a close approximation of the actual cost and break-even point for a September auction year-ling bred in central Kentucky on a \$20,000 stud fee:

This illustration uses a stud fee of \$20,000. You can plug in other stud fees and adjust the supporting items accordingly, particularly value of mare, cost of money, and sales commissions.

CONCLUSION. Faced with weakness in the broader economy, rising costs, declining purses, fewer buyers, insufficient leadership at a national level, lack of effective marketing and cooperation throughout our entire industry, breeders need to see across the board, dramatic cost reductions to remain viable.

I, therefore, submit this research and opinion to a jury of my peers. What do you make of the situation? What do you think needs to be done? What percentage of profitability do you think is fair and reasonable for breeders, stallion owners, sales companies, and vets? What do you think of the proposal? Speak up now, or we won't have a lot to speak up about in the near future.

SPORTSMAN'S HOLDS UP Goffs suffered more losses yesterday as the one-day Sportsman's Sale brought the company's flagship week to a close, but the drop was less dramatic than it had been over the three previous days of the Million sale. As expected, the average and median were down, but their fall of 17 and 25 percent, respectively, was almost welcomed by Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby. "Trade at today's Sportsman's Sale followed a similar trend to that witnessed during the Million Sale, although the scale of the slowdown was happily less severe," Beeby said. "We produced a quality catalogue of Sportsman's yearlings, but a number of external factors were at play that are simply out of our hands. It has been a spectacular year for graduates of both the Million and Sportsman's Sales and, while there have been some excellent results in the sales ring this week for vendors and purchasers, overall it has been a tough week which coincided with the worldwide financial crisis that caused such consternation as it seemed to lurch from one disaster to another."

Prime Destination...

Enjoying the top shot at the Sportsman's Sale yesterday was a son of Dubai Destination consigned by Castlemartin Stud as hip 814. He is the latest progeny of the O'Reilly's Yara (Ire) (Sri Pekan), who was runnerup to Fasliyev in the 1999 G1 Phoenix S. and who has already produced the listed winners Emirates Gold (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}), Yarastar (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the stakes-placed Yario (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). It was Bobby O'Ryan who paid €90,000 for the colt and the eventual leading buyer later snapped up Ballyhane's hip 855, the only representative of Elusive City, for €60,000. Elusive City has been one of the season's success stories, with group scorers Elusive Wave (Ire) and Soul City (Ire) flying the flag for his first crop. The Irish National Stud resident had a red-letter day on Sunday thanks to the Million race success of the latter and a second and third in this sale's €100,000 graduates' race. His February-foaled colt was out of the Listed-placed Bonne Mere (Fr) (Stepneyev {Ire}). "He's a good colt with plenty of size and a good step to him, too," O'Ryan said of the topper. "I've bought him for an owner with Dermot Weld."

Of the fillies, it was a daughter of Anabaa who was the centre of attention when selling to John Ferguson for €80,000. From Loughtown and Chevington Studs, hip 937 is out of Hope Town (Fr) (Sillery), who raced for the Head family in France and was a Listed scorer on the fringes of the best class. Offerings by the late Indian Ridge (Ire) were in demand all week during the Million and it was no different yesterday as his sole lot, offered as hip 784, sold to Dermot Weld for €75,000. From the draft of the Irish National Stud, which housed the highly influential sire, she is out of a half to the former top-class Weld trainee and sire Definite Article (GB), the 1999 G2 Dante S. scorer Salford Express (Ire) and 2004 G3 Greenham S. winner Salford City (Ire). Her half-sister Anice Stellato (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) was also off the mark at the first attempt at Newmarket in August. "She's been bought for an established client," Weld explained. "She's by Indian Ridge, who has been very lucky for me and she's also closely related to Definite Article, who is by Indian Ridge and won an Irish National S. for me before being touched off in an Irish Derby. She looks like she will mature into a very nice filly. The two-year-old out of the mare looks useful too." Peter Doyle's purchases of both this year's Million race winners has entered folklore already and he paid €48,000 for Owenstown Stud's hip 746, an Aprilfoaled filly by Noverre. She is out of a close relative of the champion Negligent (Ire), the dam of the classy Godolphin duo Blatant (GB) and Songlark (GB). "I've bought her for one of my longest-standing clients and she will be staying in Ireland to be trained," Doyle said. "She's a really lovely filly." That price was later matched by John Hassett for hip 890, who was the sole Dansili (GB) offered and whose sale was enough to promote Castlemartin Stud to leading vendor status. Out of a Listed-placed three-parts sister to the 2000 G1 Irish Oaks, G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine Petrushka (Ire), his extended family includes Spectrum (Ire), Stream of Gold (Ire) and last month's G1 St Leger winner Conduit (Ire).

"Based on the evidence, verbal and visual, we did find him in breach of rule 156 in that he failed to ride out approaching the finish on a horse that we judged, having only been beaten a short head, would have been second. "He was a bit fresh going down to the start as he hadn't run for two months, but he did it well in the end," said trainer Luca Cumani. "Frankie [Dettori] came back and said we haven't got to the bottom of him yet and there's plenty more to come. I don't think there's much left for him [this term], so I think we'll put him away and start again next year. The way he's bred he might get two miles next season and maybe he's a Cup horse in the making."
