Aidan O'Brien yesterday ended speculation as to which of his contenders, Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) or **Soldier of Fortune (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Johnny Murtagh would partner in tomorrow's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Murtagh is set to ride "The Duke", but plans could change if Longchamp gets substantial rain before the main event. The Ballydoyle conditioner told Racing Post, "If the ground is going to be on the good side, then it's most likely Johnny will ride Duke of Marmalade and Seamie [Heffernan] will ride Soldier of Fortune. However, if the ground changes after declaration time and it comes up soft, then there is every chance Duke of Marmalade might not run and, in those circumstances, Johnny would switch to Soldier of Fortune." Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's duo vesterday drew post positions 14 and nine, respectively, for the \in 4-million prize, while His Highness the Aga Khan's unbeaten Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) will break against the rail. MCPEEK MAKES RIGHT DECISION

Livin the Dream Stables' **Dream Empress** (Bernstein) was entered for the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies at Turfway Park last Saturday, but trainer Ken McPeek opted to roll the dice. He scratched her from that spot in favor of the much tougher and much more valuable GI Darley Alcibiades S. on opening day at Keeneland and the decision paid dividends when the filly drew off to a convincing 4 1/4-length victory. "We expected her to run well, hoping for third or better," McPeek said, referring to a Grade I placing at the worst. He got that and more. "We didn't know how she'd handle the Polytrack. She's worked good over it. She's all class, a lovely filly." And one that earned a spot in the starting gate against Stardom Bound (Tapit) and company in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 24. Cont. p3

First Lady S. cont. Blossoming on the Main...

A \$27,000 purchase out of the 2005 Keeneland September sale, Forever Together was one of handful of horses to breeze an eighth of a mile in a bullet :10 ahead of the 2006 OBS March Sale and was hammered down for \$240,000. She kicked off her career on the main track and proceeded to win her first three trips to the post, including the GII Forward Gal S. in March 2007, but was shut out in her final four starts, closing the season with a fifth in the Chaposa Springs S. in December.

Testing the Turf...

Fourth in a main-track allowance at Gulfstream Feb. 15, the grey got a chance to try the turf in her return effort and the experiment paid dividends, as she rattled home to take the Reluctant Guest S. at Arlington May 17. A rallying third at 44-1 in the GI Just a Game S. on the Belmont S. undercard June 7, she overcame a 15-length deficit to best Dynaforce (Dynaformer) in the GI Diana S. July 26. The odds-on choice for the GII Canadian S. over a yielding Woodbine turf Sept. 7, she advanced along the rail into contention, but flattened out to be third.

She's a Lady...

Somewhat surprisingly, Precious Kitten was gunned to the lead by Rafael Bejarano and she set a modest pace just in advance of Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) and Bayou's Lassie (Outflanker) as Forever Together was patiently handled by Leparoux towards the back of the

field. Given her cue with three-eighths of a mile to run, Forever Together made good progress on the turn and into the stretch and set her sights on the favorite, who put away Dreaming of Anna at the head of the lane. Switched out in upper stretch, Forever Together

came with giant strides and drove past Precious Kitten for a handy success. "She's a very good filly and she's got a very good kick," the winning jockey commented. "Today she proved she's one of the best fillies in the country." Of the runner-up, Bejarano offered, "I was very comfortable. She was running very good. I knew when I saw the six [horse] coming she was going to get us. My horse was still running at the end; we were just passed by the better horse.

Putting her two-turn experience to good use, Dream Empress collared Be Smart at the 3/16 pole and galloped away to a decisive victory. Fourth on the Ellis Park turf in her July debut, the \$60,000 KEESEP yearling was coming off a nose maiden score going a mile and a sixteenth on the Saratoga lawn Aug. 22. She was an intended runner in the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies last Saturday, but was scratched from that spot in favor of this much tougher and much more lucrative event. She rated just off the pace in her Polytrack bow as 8-5 favorite and GI Spinaway S. winner Mani Bhavan (Storm Boot) led them along. Be Smart took over on the far turn, but 2-1 Dream Empress angled outside at the top of the lane and rallied to win going away. Will she go on to the Oct. 24 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies? "I would think so," trainer Ken McPeek told TVG. "You wouldn't want to deny her at this stage." Neither would the conditioner dream of denying her connections, who have now made nearly six times her \$60,000 purchase price. "It's a big group," McPeek said of the Living the Dream Stable. "Life's about opportunity. If they give me a chance, I try to find them the best horse, and we try to have fun. They're having a good time, and I think this filly is going to be the high point for all of them." McPeek has made something of a name for himself selecting relatively inexpensive yearlings. He was responsible for picking out Curlin for just \$57,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2005.

Bought for just 7,500 guineas at Tattersalls last year, Serious Attitude stretched her unbeaten record to three with this battling success. In doing so, the bay--supplemented this week--led home a one-two for bargain buys when beating the €10,000 TATIRE yearling Aspen Darlin in a pulsating finish. Having won by five lengths over six furlongs on debut at Windsor Aug. 10, Serious Attitude had a host of smart fillies, including yesterday's G3 Oh So Sharp S. winner Souter's Sister (Ire), behind when making a successful step up to Listed company in the Sept. 4 Dick Poole Fillies' S. over the same trip at Salisbury. She was held up early off the furious fractions, quickened through rivals to lead with 100 yards remaining and was drawing away from the game runner-up in the drive to the line. "I was a little bit concerned about the ground today, as there was plenty of give at Salisbury, but in fairness to her she handled it okay," commented Jimmy Fortune, who also rides the current crop leader Rainbow View. "I'd say she will be better with a little bit of juice, and she's a very nice filly. When I rode her last time, I told Rae that she could be the second-best filly in the country, and she might be." Trainer Rae Guest has a visit in mind to the G1 1000 Guineas in May. "She is a very good two-year-old filly, although that's not what we are renowned for," Guest said. "The breeder put me on to her because he didn't sell her in the ring, and she's done very well. She didn't look much at first, and it wasn't until January that she started to strengthen up; then she went weak again. It wasn't until July when we really knew she was something. She's by Mtoto, but she's very fast and hopefully we are going to go for the G1 1000 Guineas. She has so much speed [that] we are worried whether she stays or not, but she's usually laid-back at home. Although she was a bit keen today, she travels nicely through the race and settles, so I can't see why she shouldn't run there." Supplementing his success in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville on his latest start Aug. 24, Bushranger earned high rank among the current crop of juveniles with a battling win here to lower another track record. The bay got off the mark at first asking over five furlongs at Tipperary June 5 and was runner-up in the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot 12 days later before besting the subsequent G2 Champagne S. hero Westphalia (Ire) in the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 13. Only third behind the impressive Mastercraftsman (Ire) in the G1 Phoenix S. back at that track a fortnight later, he rebounded with a game career-best effort in Deauville's two-year-old feature and attracted strong support for this contest. Tracking Sayif and Jamie Spencer in the middle of a trio racing away from the main field towards the centre of the track initially, he responded to Johnny Murtagh's urgings to reel in that rival and hit the front at the furlong marker before asserting for a 1 1/4-length success. "He's very professional and an easy ride," commented Murtagh after steering home his 18th Group 1 winner in 2008.

"He's a very strong two-year-old and knows his job well," the jockey added. "David [Wachman] told me he was a banker at Royal Ascot, but I didn't really know him, and I probably hit the front too soon in the middle of the track there. I learnt a lot about him from that and he is a grand little horse who is progressing all the time." Sayif's trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam told PA Sport, "He just gets better every time. He's run a great race, but take nothing away from the winner, who's already won a Group 1. I don't think he'll run again this year, as he likes fast ground." On the board in all three juvenile starts with a third and two seconds, Skylighter made her 2008 debut on the turf, finishing third at Santa Anita Feb. 13. Sixth in a seven-furlong Polytrack maiden at Keeneland Apr. 12, the bay got the job done over the Belmont main track May 11, taking an 8 1/2-furlong heat by a neck. The Stonerside runner had just one subsequet appearance to her credit, a 1 3/4-length success in a Belmont entrylevel allowance July 10. A 14-1 longshot off the lengthy absence, Skylighter bided her time while saving ground in fifth as Whirlie Bertie (Stormin Fever) and Shining Image scrimmaged on the front end through fractions of :22.80 and :47.20. Skylighter was angled out for a clear run on the far turn, gained three wide into the stretch and outsprinted Shining Image to the money.





good news is he didn't have a hard race that day. We feel we have him in good shape for his autumn campaign. He's a remarkable athlete in that he can put out of the box every day with a big smile on his face. He loves his work." Quijano looks to improve on his strong effort in this event last year, when he came with a late rally to finish third by a length. Runner-up to Doctor Dino in Hong Kong, he took the June 15 G1 Gran Premio di Milano before a runner-up effort in the G1 Deutschlandpreis July 20. The chestnut locked horns with Champs Elysees in the GI Northern Dancer S. over track and trip four weeks ago and was unfortunate to lose the head bob. Breeders' S. winner Marlang will try to dictate from the front, and the field's lone three-year-old comes into this off a front-running success in the GIII Saranac S. Aug. 31.

Cheveley Park Stud and Sir Michael Stoute combined to win this three years ago with Peeress (GB), and they supply a live contender in Heaven Sent. Since her success in the G3 Dahlia S. here May 3, the homebred has put in respectable efforts when runnerup to Sabana Perdida (Ire) in the June 18 G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot, a third in the July 9 G1 Falmouth S. on the other track here and fourth behind Halfway to Heaven in the Nassau.

Paco Boy may represent the bigger danger based on his decisive wins over this specialist trip in both the July 29 G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood and Newbury's G2 Hungerford S. Aug. 16. He showed he stayed an extra furlong when third, despite a troubled trip, in this venue's G1 Prix du Moulin last time Sept. 7, but may be best served by a return to this distance. This year's G1 1000 Guineas heroine and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club third Natagora, who represents the Pascal Bary barn successful with Field of Hope (Ire) in 1999, was only sixth in the Moulin on her latest start, but is another who could benefit from a drop back in trip as the winner of the G1 Cheveley Park S. last term.

SOMETHING SPECIAL AT SAINT-CLOUD Provid-

ing Argana's Arc Sale does not suffer from the customary spate of last-minute withdrawals, today's renewal promises to be the most compelling yet to be held at the Saint-Cloud complex. In recent years, this auction embedded in Longchamp's Arc weekend has seen some large prices paid for classy horses in training, such as the €665,000 for the 2007 topper and subsequent group scorer Racinger (Fr) (Spectrum {Ire}). There has been a healthy flow of ex-French individuals who have shone in the States, and some of them have come from this auction. They include Atlando (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}), winner of the 2006 GII San Luis Obispo H.; Megahertz (GB) (Pivotal {GB}, who needs no introduction as one of the country's finest distaffers of recent years; the 1997 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Elmhurst (Wild Again); and the 1994 GI Yellow Ribbon S, heroine Aube Indienne (Fr) (Bluebird). Of course, this event can boast the sale of the subsequent 1993 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine and now legendary broodmare Urban Sea (Miswaki). Among the 51 horses catalogued this year--12 of which are already withdrawn--are cast-offs from the empires of His Highness the Aga Khan, Baron Georg von Ullmann, the de Moussac Family, the de Rothschild Family, Richard Strauss, Michael Tabor and Wertheimer et Frere, consigned by trainers such as Andre Fabre, Robert Collet, Jean-Claude Rouget, John Hammond, Criquette Head-Maarek and Freddy Head. Chief attraction this time is hip 35, Sean Mulryan's Linda's Lad (GB) (Sadler's Wells), hero of the 2005 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. He was also successful in that year's G3 Prix de Conde and the following season's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, but has not raced since finishing seventh in last year's GI Canadian International. The five-year-old is offered by Haras de Grandcamp. In total, 14 lots had been either successful or placed at group level at the time of the catalogue's publication. Argana issued a press release stating that a pair of catalogued horses, Elusive Wave (Ire) (Elusive City) and Tiza (SAf) (Goldkeeper), are confirmed runners Sunday at Longchamp. Elusive Wave, lot 18, is a contender in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, while Tiza--lot 12--is slated for the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye. Selling gets underway after the first day of the Arc meeting at Longchamp at 6:30 p.m. Full catalogue and updates can be viewed on www.arqana.com.

(f, 3, Pivotal {GB}--Danella {Fr}, by Highest Honor {Fr}) Consigned by Andre Fabre

Azabara contested the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches on only her third start in May and finished a highly respectable fifth behind Zarkava (Ire). She took the Listed Prix des Lilas at this track the following month.

15 Not Just Swing (Ire)

(c, 4, King's Best--Misbegotten {Ire}, by Baillamont) Consigned by Andre Fabre

Under the tutelage of France's champion trainer, this half-brother to the listed scorer Minoa (Ire) (Mujtahid) and the dam of this year's G1 Falmouth S. heroine and G1 Matron S. runner-up Nahoodh (Ire) has blossomed into a classy middle-distance performer. His win in Longchamp's G3 Prix d'Hedouville in May was followed by a third in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly the next month, and finished fourth in the G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp after the catalogue was printed.

18 Elusive Wave (Ire)

(f, 2, <u>Elusive City</u>--Multicolour Wave {Ire}, by Rainbow Quest) Consigned by Jean-Claude Rouget

As the winner of this year's G3 Prix du Calvados at Deauville and Listed Prix Roland de Chambure at Longchamp, Elusive Wave is hot property, and could become priceless if she wins tomorrow's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on the Arc undercard. She shares her second dam, the 1991 G3 Prix Corrida winner Echoes (Fr), with this year's G2 Queen Mary S. heroine Langs Lash (Ire).

21 Hello Morning (Fr)

(c, 3, Poliglote {GB}--Hello Molly {Fr}, by Sillery {Fr}) Consigned by Cristiane Head-Maarek

Last year's G1 Criterium International runner-up, Hello Morning was fifth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp in May and sixth in the following month's G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly. His fullbrother Hello Sunday (Fr) took the 2006 G3 Prix Quincey before he was sold to race in the States, where he was third in last year's GI Pacific Classic. Hello Morning holds entries in next month's GI Citation H. and GI Hollywood Derby.

37 Pallodio (Ire)

(c, 3, by Medecis {GB}--Bent Al Fala {Ire}, by Green Desert) Consigned by John Hammond

Pallodio provided one of the most significant updates to this catalogue when besting last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Full of Gold (Fr) in the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte last month.



I completely agree with Rob Whiteley's campaign to remove whipping from racing. This is the primary act that turns off potential new racing fans and should be banned except when needed for control relative to horse and rider safety. Whipping could be phased out so that performance of horses currently in training would not be negatively affected.

The main proposal of Rob's column that stallion own-



ers, vets and sales companies reduce their fees by 50 percent is unrealistic. While the level of fees incurred for these services by breeders may not always be justified, the potential cost to breeders are (or should be) known in advance and should be a factor in managing breeding operations. I suggest the primary problem of the breeding industry, relative to demand for its product, is that a number of its par-

ticipants have no clue about its economics. If they did, they probably would not be in the business.

All aspects of the Thoroughbred horse racing industry are intoxicating. Why else would so many of us commit major amounts of capital and effort to an industry that (as Rob points out) is generally unprofitable? Why else would so many type-A individuals who have successfully managed their professional and (sometimes) personal lives participate in an industry over which they have little control? We are all horse junkies to one degree or another and, yes, a number of us must subsidize our involvement in the industry by other sources of income, inherited or created.

Owners (except for an elite few) who must balance their addiction and financial condition continue to acquire, race, sell (or give away) horses within a disciplined framework. Breeders also need a business plan. I suggest that breeders can operate profitably, although their produce may be in books five through eight, assuming they properly scale their operations. If certain smaller breeders disappear, it may be that there is no economic justification for their existence in the business.

This gets back to the whipping issue as well as the general under-management of the Thoroughbred racing industry. If there is not an expanding fan base, then there is certain to be contraction of the breeding business.

This means that ground loss, and therefore post position and running style, become very important.

PP HORSESIREJOCKEYODDS1Shakis (Ire)MachiavellianBejarano7-2Is a very solid old timer, and the rail helps. But hisfigures just make him a borderline contender here, andhis late running style puts him up against it in a big fieldthat figures to bunch up, since there is very little earlyspeed here.

2 Kingship King Cugat Velasquez 12-1 Got very good in the fall as a three-year-old, running three big figures, but his form was somewhat concealed by a series of wide trips (4w4w etc, upper left). At that point, he looked like he could turn into a world beater, but he was injured early as a four-year-old, and only resurfaced recently, 18 months later. He's been prepped in two grass sprints 12 days apart, and now comes into this third off a layoff, at a distance he prefers, with an inside draw and tactical speed. There's a good chance he's ready to run the best race of his life.

3 Thorn Song <u>Unbridled's Song</u> Albarado 4-1 Has gotten better with age, and his sheet shows a good example of cycling. He ran a top last November, came back to it five months later, and again three months after that. Note also that the cycles themselves are getting better, which is to say that the off races in each cycle are getting progressively better. This is a healthy, developing horse, and guess what--it's now three months since his last top. He also has the advantage of having early speed in a field full of closers, making him a strong contender.

4 Elusive Fort (SAf) Fort Wood Douglas 15-1 Was beaten less than two lengths last time in a Grade II, but had a rail trip, and earned the same figure he did getting buried the time before with a wide trip (4w4w). He's never run fast enough to threaten here.

5 Lord Admiral <u>El Prado (Ire)</u> Theriot 6-1 Has earned a lot of money without running very fast, which a) tells you about the purses in Dubai, and b) the value of showing up. He gets Lasix here, but note it did not move him up two years ago.

6 War Monger <u>War Chant</u> Desormeaux 5-1 Got good last summer and looked like he had a big future, but he hasn't developed much since. Surprisingly, this is true of War Chant's runners in general--the TGI in his sire profile (lower left) indicates his runners develop very little from three to four. On his best this colt is a contender, but he has only run that well once, and would need to work out a trip.

7 Buffalo Man <u>El Prado (Ire)</u> Marquez Jr 15-1 Won a Grade III last time out after running fifth the time before, but on *Thoro-Graph*, he earned a much better figure two back. That's because we adjust our figures for ground loss, and this colt was the beneficiary of a rail trip last time, after racing four wide on both turns the time before (upper left). He actually had run three top efforts in a row before his last and, with good rest since then, he's likely to run his best again, which makes him a contender here.

8 Lovelace (GB) Royal Applause (GB) Ffrench 12-1 Is a little short of competitive on his best European figures, but note two things: in his last four starts, he twice ran with less than a week's rest, and he's first Lasix. With more rest now, he's not the craziest longshot we've ever seen.

9 Society's Chairman Not Impossible (Ire) Jones 15-1 Has never run fast enough to compete here, and his pattern is not forward moving.

10 French Beret Broad Brush Leparoux 20-1 Is solid, but only has one race in his life that gives him a shot, and the post hurts.

11 Karelian Bertrando Mena 20-1 Has a history of unsoundness and, like a lot of unsound horses, ran well fresh last time. But by the same reasoning, he's unlikely to move forward now.

12 Rahy's Attorney Crown Attorney Callaghan 5-1 Wasn't much early in his career, but has developed a lot since, and earned the best figure of anyone in this field last time to take the Woodbine Mile. With a terrible draw, that's the only effort of his life that would give him a chance here, and he's very likely to bounce.

AE MuseebDanzigBejarano20-1Has some good poly figures, and there is poly/grasscorrelation. But he may be in here as a rabbit.

Bottom Line: Shakis will be overbet because he finished close to Big Brown, and Rahy's Attorney will be overbet off the big effort in Canada. Buffalo Man, Thorn Song and Kingship are the live ones.


