De Royer-Dupre also praised the ride of Christophe Soumillon, who steered the filly to a twolength defeat of Youmzain (Ire) in the Longchamp feature without recourse to the whip. "Christophe was the perfect man to have on board, because the Arc is not an easy race to ride," the trainer said. "We decided before the race to come very late, not too early. It was a great ride." The Chantilly-based conditioner refused to be drawn into comparisons to his 2003 Arc hero Dalakhani (Ire). "He was a great horse, because he had two accelerations," he said. "He could quicken, and then quicken again. The filly is different, because she has only the one acceleration, but that is a very strong one."

YEARLINGS ON TAP AT TATTERSALLS

In spite of the global economic downturn and falling yearling figures at Goffs and Keeneland, both buyers and vendors were yesterday approaching this week's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale (Book 1) with cautious optimism. The three-day sale begins today at 11 a.m. Representatives of many of the major buyers were inspecting yearlings at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks in Newmarket. Among them, Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum was present Sunday with an entourage including Shadwell's U.S.-based vice president Rick Nichols. Sheikh Mohammed's advisor John Ferguson and representatives of the Maktoum offshoot Rabbah Bloodstock were also seen inspecting the wares at Park Paddocks, as were John Magnier and members of his Coolmore team. Japanese yearling viewers included representatives of the Yoshida family's Shadai and Oiwake Farms, as well as Koji Maeda of North Hills Management. Representing a host of U.S.-based interests were trainer Patrick Biancone, Darby Dan Farm's John Phillips, Dan Rosenberg of Three Chimneys, owner Andrew Rosen and Renato Gameiro Alvares of the Lexington-based Albatroz Bloodstock. EASY BREEZE FOR CURLIN AT SANTA ANITA

Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables and partners' Curlin (Smart Strike) breezed an easy four furlongs vesterday in his first work over Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface. Curlin stopped the clock in :52 4/5. Trainer Steve Asmussen and company are in the process of evaluating how Curlin handles the underfoot conditions at Santa Anita as they ponder a defense of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25. Curlin is coming off a repeat win in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 27. "The work today was just to put his mind at ease, to just be a little patient. We have a little time between now and the race," Asmussen told TVG. "I spoke to Mr. Jackson and [wife] Barbara [Banke] immediately after the Gold Cup about being in this position; to get him out here to acclimate and start going through the motions. We felt that if we were on target but hadn't put all the variables into play, that it would be a lot more difficult." Asmussen confirmed that Curlin would continue to work on Mondays leading up to the Breeders' Cup until a decision is made.

Girls, Girls, Girls...

With many vendors keen to sell in Book 2 next week, there are 611 lots catalogued in Book 1, a total of 122 fewer than last year. Heading into this year's sale, many appeared to be impressed with what they have seen so far. Nicely bred fillies with residual value look sure to be in big demand, and that is a sector of the market that Eamonn Reilly of BBA Ireland was focusing upon.

"I've not seen too many colts, I've mainly looked at well-bred fillies, and the individuals have generally matched up to the pages," said Reilly. "The whole way through this year, from Deauville on to Keeneland and then Goffs, demand has been very strong for these fillies who are correct individuals. They will always be in demand, whatever the economic climate. I'm sure it will be strong at the top end, but the middle and lower markets will be a different market."

Consignor Jamie Railton, based at his usual position by the sales ring exit, said that yesterday was much his busiest day after a bout of bad weather.

"We've been showing since Friday, but the weather had been very bad over the weekend and we needed to be busy [yesterday], which we have been," explained Railton, who has 17 catalogued. "We've had a good day. I think we've got an even group of horses and I would be pretty positive, although it might be a different story next week [for Books 2 and 3]."

The Buzz Word...

Blandford Bloodstock has been busy at all the yearling sales this year and Richard Brown, who runs the Newmarket agency with Tom Goff, was another who reported more of a buzz yesterday.

"It was a bit quiet at the weekend and there seemed a really good feel about the place [Monday]," said Brown. "They are a good solid group of horses, but maybe they are missing one or two real stars. We've got a few orders and we'll be working away through this week and next."

Agent Larry Stratton was another in a positive frame of mind. "The standard of individuals is very high, it's commensurate with the quality of the catalogue," Stratton said. "I see no reason why it shouldn't be a solid sale."

Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George admitted that it was inevitable that global events would have some impact on the sale, but was still hopeful of a good week.

"None of us are immune from what's going on in the wider world, but on the positive side, we've got a very good catalogue, consignors have been busy over the last two or three days, and the buyers looking have said that these are a smart bunch of yearlings," said George. "The demand for quality has always been robust and the feedback we're getting is that there's some quality out there."

The sale runs today through Thursday, starting at 11 a.m. each day. Books 2 and 3 are scheduled to follow October 13 through the 17th.

CHURCHILL DOWNS TO HOST 2010 BREED-

ERS' CUP Churchill Downs has been selected as the venue for the 2010 Breeders' Cup, the *Daily Racing Form* reported. According to the *DRF*, Breeders' Cup Ltd. and Churchill Downs Inc. will make an official announcement Wednesday. It will be the seventh time Churchill has hosted the event, twice more than any other track. The *DRF*'s source confirmed that the 2010 Breeders' Cup had initially been given to Belmont Park, but a change was made in Churchill's favor. Darren Rogers, media relations director for Churchill Downs, said the track has "nothing to announce at this time," according to *DRF*.

NO CUP FOR PACO Richard Hannon yesterday revealed that Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) will not take in the Breeders' Cup following his impressive success in Saturday's G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp. Having beaten Natagora (Fr) by three lengths in the seven-furlong contest, the Calvera Partnership's sophomore will wait until 2009 to tackle the major mile events. "There is no doubt that he is definitely getting better and next year he will stay a mile well," Hannon explained. "Next year he could be taking in the best mile races. We've knocked out the Breeders' Cup, as I don't think he'd want to go round there on very firm ground, so we can look forward to a whole season next year. It was a hell of a time too, the fastest for 16 years, so he's going forwards."

Mares capable of producing four graded/group winners are all too hard to come by, but La Affirmed--a three-parts sister to the champion juvenile filly Outstandingly--achieved that notable feat, with considerable help from Storm Cat. Coincidentally, La Affirmed

made her presence felt again last week through Bernstein and Caress, two of her three Group 3 winners by Storm Cat. Bernstein was responsible for Dream Empress, who took the GI Darley Alcibiades S. in decisive fashion to become her sire's first American-bred

Grade I winner. The next day saw Caress's son Sky Mesa reach the same milestone when his daughter Sky Diva was just as dominant in the GI Frizette S.

It seems that Bernstein is finally fulfilling the very high hopes held of him virtually from the day he was born. Bred by Brushwood Stable, the weanling Bernstein was offered at Keeneland's 1997 November Sale, where his price of \$925,000 was \$250,000 higher than the next-highest-priced weanling.

Bernstein was also outstanding on his next public appearance, when he made his two-year-old debut in a six-furlong maiden at the Curragh on May 23. Trained by Aidan O'Brien and carrying the colors of Michael Tabor, Bernstein led virtually all the way for an effortless victory which prompted his handler to describe him as "very special."

"It's a big problem to get horses to lead him even cantering," O'Brien added. "I'm not ruling out Royal Ascot for him, but it is a long year and he is a big colt, so we might take things slowly with him in the immediate future."

Sure enough, O'Brien relied on Fasliyev, the year's champion juvenile, for the Coventry S. at Royal Ascot,

and Bernstein was reserved for the G3 Railway S. 12 days later. The son of Storm Cat turned in a repeat performance of his debut win and it looked as though the sky would be the limit. Bookmakers reacted by naming Bernstein favorite for the following year's 2000 Guineas.

Then the bubble burst. You can gauge Bernstein's reputation from the fact that he started at the prohibitive odds of 4-11 when he next appeared, in the G1 National S. in September. Unfortunately, he raced too freely following his lengthy absence and lost the lead inside the final eighth, fading into fifth behind the future star Sinndar. A subsequent examination unearthed a respiratory abnormality.

Bernstein's effort in the 2000 Guineas persuaded his connections to return him to sprinting and he narrowly won two of his next three starts, including the G3 Concorde S. over seven furlongs.

As he rated much better in the Concorde, the Breeders' Cup Mile was mentioned as a possible target, but he ended up contesting a nine-furlong Grade III at Churchill Downs the following day and faded to fifth.

In no time it had been announced that Bernstein had been sold to Doug Arnold to stand at Buck Pond Farm, at a fee of \$10,000. A career which had promised so much had yielded just two Group/Grade 3 victories.

With plenty of more familiar sons of Storm Cat available in Kentucky, Bernstein wasn't inundated with mares, but his 37-strong first crop quickly established his potential. Among his first runners in 2004 were Toll Taker, winner of the GIII Astarita S., and Berbatim, a stakes winner who trained on to land the GIII Providencia S. at three. Their early success prompted a change of location for Bernstein, and it was announced in November 2004 that the seven-year-old was transferring to Castleton Lyons, at an increased fee of \$15,000.

Further evidence of Bernstein's potential emerged from the exploits of his first Argentine crop, conceived in the second half of 2001. Storm Mayor, Storm Military and Stormy Kiss all became Group 1 winners in Argentina, with Storm Mayor taking two editions of the prestigious G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini. The group winners have continued to flow in South America, with the filly Savoir Bien doing extremely well this year. Some of these have continued to thrive after being transferred to the U.S., including Stormy Kiss and Storm Military. Caulfield cont. p8

Bernstein duly covered 164 mares in 2005, for 123 live foals. This crop has quickly proved that Bernstein merited greater support and Dream Empress is its third graded winner. First off the mark was

Doremifasollatido, a \$110,000 yearling who won the GII Matron S. and who has yet to finish out of the first two. Next came West Side Bernie, who maintained his unbeaten record in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. Interestingly, Dream Empress is out of Chinese Empress, a daughter of Nijinsky II, while Doremifasollatido is out of a granddaughter of the 1970 Triple Crown winner. Bernstein now has 18 winners from 39 juvenile runners and he stands second among the juvenile list, one place below Sky Mesa.

It is a feather in Bernstein's cap that he has succeeded in siring a Grade I winner from Chinese Empress. As a stakes-winning daughter of an outstanding stallion, Chinese Empress was given every chance as a broodmare, producing two foals to Mr. Prospector, three to Gone West and one to Unbridled. None of them earned black type. Dream Empress is the fourth daughter of the unraced Execution to have produced a

graded winner and they have seven between them, including three by sons of Storm Cat.

If Bernstein started his stallion career with plenty to prove, Sky Mesa was in the much more fortunate position of being considered a pretty safe bet for stallion success. When his first yearlings reached the sales ring in

2006, they achieved an average of nearly \$130,000 and a median of \$100,000, off a fee of \$30,000. One of his fillies realized \$1,150,000.

NUMBERS PLUMMET AT OBS OPENER The OBS Fall Mixed Sale, which began with a single consignor preferred session in Ocala yesterday, got off to an inauspicious start with numbers down across the board. Of significant concern was the big 45.5 percent dip in median from a year ago--\$22,000 to \$12,000. Not surprisingly, that number was coupled with a high RNA rate--53 percent--a slight increase from 2007's 50.9 percent. In all, 230 weanlings, mares and other prospects went through the ring, with 122 failing to find new homes. The 108 that did sell grossed \$1,979,600, an average of \$18,330 (down 34.9 percent). Last year, the consignor preferred portion of the sale was held over two sessions and was significantly larger than this year's; comparative numbers reflect the figures after Day 1 in 2007. Topping yesterday's action was hip 328, a weanling filly by Exchange Rate who was knocked down to Twin Peeks Racing for \$105,000. Consigned by Horses of Course, Inc., the Mar. 8-foaled bay was produced by the nine-year-old Passionate Bird (Birdonthewire), a multiple stakes winner of just over \$275,000. The filly was the lone horse to eclipse the six-figure mark. The sale continues with open sessions today and tomorrow. 
BARBARA CAMP DIES Barbara Pease Camp passed away Friday at her residence in Charlottesville, Virginia, after a long battle with cancer. She was 77 years old. With her husband Clay, Camp worked as an agent at the Saratoga Yearling Sale and sold many top yearlings, including the sale topper at the Saratoga Sales in 1975 and again in 1984. The latter, a \$4.6-million colt by Northern Dancer out of Bubbling later named Parlando, set a Saratoga record that still stands. Barbara was born Apr. 15, 1931 in Buffalo, New York, attended Syracuse University, and was an outstanding horsewoman. She was the 1948 National Champion Equestrian Good Hands Medal and Maclay Medal winner, and founder and president of the Virginia Pony Breeders Association. She owned and showed the 1960 national high point horse Sunset Hill. She also served as a navigator on her husband's U.S.E.T. combined driving team in three World Championships, held in England, the Netherlands and Germany. She was inducted into the Virginia Horse Show Association Hall of Fame. Camp and her husband owned and restored Glenmore Farms near Charlottesville and Highview Farm in Nelson County. Survivors include her husband; daughter Bunny Gibbons; son Jeff; two step children, Page and Clay; two grandchildren and two step grandchildren. There will be a private memorial held at a later date. 

It was February 2006, and Turfway Park was midway through its second meet over its Polytrack surface. In less than two months, Sinister Minister would win the GI Blue Grass S.--the final renewal contested over Keeneland's notoriously biased dirt track--by 12 3/4 lengths in gate-to-wire fashion. Santa Anita's Cushion Track headaches were still two years away. That month, turf writer and handicapper Andrew Beyer made a prediction about what sort of impact synthetic surfaces would have on racing.

Horseplayers had been able to profit from studying biased tracks, wrote Beyer, who feared "if the Polytrack advocates prevail, and all racetracks are basically the same, the game will lose many of its subtleties." He continued, "It might suffer the same fate as harness racing--becoming too understandable and predictable, producing too many small payoffs, driving gamblers to other activities that offer more challenge and better opportunities for profit."

Two-and-a-half years later, we now know otherwise. Synthetic tracks have only complicated, not simplified, the handicapping process. Instead of eliminating biases, synthetic tracks have created new ones. But cheer up beleaguered synthetic track horseplayers! Help is here in the form of Bill Finley's *Betting Synthetic Surfaces: Conquering Racing's Newest Frontier* (DRF Press, \$24.95, www.drf.com). (Finley is the sportswriter husband of *TDN* co-publisher Sue Finley.)

Those who want the secret to easy all-weather money will be disappointed, but anyone who has taken a financial risk in this industry--whether it's a \$5 exacta part-wheel or dropping six figures on a yearling--knows there are no shortcuts in racing.

There are many unproven-yet-perpetuated myths at the track, and synthetic surfaces have only compounded this problem. What makes *Betting Synthetic Surfaces* valuable are the statistics Finley has compiled, which separate rumor from fact.

For example, it has been accepted that turf horses do just as well over all-weather surfaces as they do on grass. Not necessarily, says Finley, who uses numbers to prove his point. *Cont. p9*



Finley has put together a 552-horse study of how sires have faired with synthetic tracks. The abysmal \$0.39 ROI for every \$2 bet on the progeny of Theatrical (Ire) every time they try a synthetic track for the first time shows that an aptitude for sod is not a sufficient condition for synthetic success. Meanwhile, his research shows that the sons and daughters of Lear Fan have returned \$7.45 when they make their all-weather debut. As always, there are no sure-things in racing.

He also lists the winning percentages of running styles over the different synthetic surfaces. For example, 32 percent of the final 200 races contested over Woodbine's old dirt track were won gate-to-wire, compared to 23 percent on Polytrack. Unfortunately, the data for Santa Anita's Cushion Track is already obsolete. The maligned Cushion Track has been replaced with Pro-Ride, which hosted races for the first time Sept. 24, and will be the venue for the main track Breeders' Cup races in 2008 and 2009.

The research shows that every synthetic surface plays differently, but, unfortunately, Finley has been forced to make generalizations to fit his findings into 159 pages. Finley almost entirely neglects Golden Gate's Tapeta surface and says it "played fair throughout the meet," but there are horseplayers who say inside speed is often at disadvantage at the Northern California oval.

But even if there is no substitute for diligently following the day-in and day-out trends of individual tracks, *Betting Synthetic Surfaces* still provides much-needed analysis of why synthetic tracks play differently than traditional dirt tracks.

Temperature and how much a surface is watered appear to make a difference in whether a synthetic track favors speed horses or closers, Finley suggests. And despite an overall drop in gate-to-wire winners, perhaps synthetic tracks don't so much give closers an advantage, but rather they negate a *disadvantage* stretch runners encounter on dirt: kickback.

Tidbits like these, in addition to sire data, should benefit horseplayers who have been relying on conjecture and hearsay to make their selections in races over synthetic surfaces.

It's easy to feel overwhelmed as a horseplayer as we have to cope with a constantly changing game. But it's the horseplayers who learn how to adapt to change who will find success at the windows. Synthetic surfaces, with all of their benefits and drawbacks, are here to stay, so we might as well learn to cope with them, says Finley.

"The world of horse racing is rapidly changing and synthetic tracks are going to be a big part of the sport," Finley predicts. "The handicapper is going to have no choice but to change with the times." One thing is for certain: Racing will never become "too understandable and predictable."
