### MONTJEU COLT TOPS TATTS DAY TWO

John Magnier's Coolmore team topped day two of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale yesterday in Newmarket when spending 650,000gns on a Montjeu (Ire) half-brother to dual French Group 1 winner Vespone (Ire) (Llandaff) and G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up Purple Moon (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) (Tattersalls Sirecam). Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff was underbidder on

the colt, who was consigned through Caroline Green's Templeton Stud on behalf of Marcel & Sibylle Egloff's Gestut Sohrenhof in Switzerland. "He's for the usual group at Ballydoyle, and you just have to look at the page and it's all there," Demi O'Byrne said after signing the buyer's ticket.

"He was a great-looking horse and you'd think he might be even better at three, like a lot of these Montjeus. I think there are some really nice horses here this week and I'm very pleased with what I've bought." The yearling is out of Vanishing Prairie (Alysheba), a half-sister to Group 1 winners Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) and Maids Causeway (Ire) (Giant's Causeway).

John Ferguson, accompanied to the sale by Sheikh Mohammed and Princess Haya, dominated the day, spending 2,985,000gns on 17 lots, including when outbidding O'Byrne for a 500,000gns Pivotal (GB) half-sister to the Sheikh's Group 3-placed Mathematician (Ire) (Machiavellian).

# Plenty of End Users...

There were again plenty of long-term breeders looking for fillies, including Ruairi O'Coileain, owner of the Co Meath-based Ennistown Stud. He outbid Marcus Tregoning at 400,000gns for a Pivotal filly out of a sister to Spartacus (Ire) (Danehill) and Johan Cruyff

(Danehill) and Johan Cruyff (GB) (Danehill) offered through The Castlebridge Consignment (<u>Tattersalls Sirecam</u>). "I've been involved with the stud for eight years and an owner for three years," said O'Coileain. "This filly is going into training with Jim Bolger." Just before the end of the sale, trainer Paul Cole spent 400,000gns on behalf of Jim and Fitri Hay to out-

bid German agent Jurgen Albrecht for a Montjeu three-parts sister to G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells). She was bred by Jean-Marc Charmat's Ronchalon Racing and was offered through Highclere Stud. "We're here to buy colts for the owner, but felt there was not a lot of value," said Cole. "The owner has breeding interests and we thought there was more value with fillies. She looks tough; she's a superb mover and there's a lot of depth to the pedigree." Epsom trainer Terry Mills earlier outbid Ferguson for a 320,000gns Pivotal filly out of a half-sister to G1 July Cup winner Stravinsky (Nureyev) offered from Gerrardstown House Stud. "We always seem to have colts and I thought it was time to get a nice filly," Mills said. "She'll race for a little syndicate including myself and a couple of others; I'll just have to get them to agree to go in her!" He added, "She was a real quality filly and Pivotal does nothing wrong and, please God, we'll breed from her eventually." Offspring of Pivotal were in great demand during the first two days of the October sale, with 16 selling for 3,672,000gns. Cont. p2

"The farm is owned by Joe Higgins and he thought this was the nicest filly we have ever had on the place," said Robert Byrne, who manages the Co Meath stud. "We primarily retain fillies to race, with the odd exception such as this one, and if they get black-type on the track, we keep them to breed from and have 15-20 mares."

Marcel Egloff of Switzerland's Gestut Sohrenhof was at Park Paddocks to watch his Montjeu (Ire) colt out of Vanishing Prairie sell for 650,000gns. The colt, who

was foaled at Coolmore in Ireland and raised at Templeton Stud in the UK, will return to the place of his birth, having been bought by Coolmore supremo John Magnier. "You can never be confident, but he's always been a nice colt, so we were very hopeful," said Caroline Green, who has eight vearlings in Book 1 under her Templeton Stud consignment. She boards Vanishing Prairie, who has a Galileo (Ire) filly foal and is in foal to Hurricane Run (Ire). G1 Prix du Jockey-Club winner Blue Canari (Fr) is the cur-

rent resident stallion at Gestut Sohrenhof, which is based just outside Zurich. The stud has also been home to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Arazi and Llandaff, the sire of one of Vanishing Praire's three stakes winners, the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Vespone.

# Tattersalls October cont. Cecil's Persistence Pays Off...

Henry Cecil hosted a press morning on Newmarket's Al Bahathri gallop on Thursday morning before returning to Tattersalls. After watching his two Oct. 18 G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. prospects, Phoenix Tower (Chester House) and Twice Over (GB) (Observa-

tory), Cecil bemoaned a fruitless opening day at the sale. "I don't have a lot to buy at the sales as I rely on a couple of owner/breeders," said the trainer, whose patrons include Prince Khalid Abdullah and the Niarchos family. "I have six or seven yearlings to buy, but I was blown out completely [Tuesday]. So

maybe I am going to be buying more at the middle end and bottom end, but I am taking on the top." He was quick to point out, however, that cheaper yearlings can sometimes make it to the very top, as with last week's Group 1 victory for Serious Attitude (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}), who is trained by Cecil's brother-in-law, Rae Guest. "Money doesn't buy everything as we saw with the winner of the Cheveley Park S., but it helps and you have more chance," Cecil commented. "It is not easy and it is not easy for a lot of people. Every now and again something comes through. Look at Rae Guest--a very good trainer--he does not get the ammunition, but he comes up with a filly who cost around 7,000gns." Cecil was successful later in the day, however, going to 45,000gns for lot 258, a colt by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). It's easy to see why the colt appealed to the trainer: the Straffan Park Stud-consigned youngster is the first foal of the unraced Grand Lodge mare Tafseer (Ire), who is out of a Sadler's Wells' half-sister to one of Cecil's former stable stars, the champion stayer Ardross. He also bought lot 363, a colt by Green Desert, for 75,000gns.

# Noonan Hoping for Repeat Success...


Australian trainer Tony Noonan was making his fourth successive visit to the Newmarket auction in the company of Peter and Jennifer McMahon, for whom he successfully bought last Friday's Listed Godolphin S. winner Buccellati (GB) (Soviet Star) for 25,000gns at Tattersalls October Sale in 2005. Based on the Mornington Penninsula in Victoria, Noonan has recently suffered the disappointment of having his Caulfield

1000 Guineas fancy Ortensia (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}) ruled out of the big race on Saturday with an infection, but was in good spirits in the autumn sunshine. "Buccellati was our first purchase and we've come back every year since," Noonan said. The four-year-old is in training with Andrew Balding at Kingsclere

and may head to Australia next year for a Cups campaign. Balding also handled the British leg of the career of Logician, a New Zealand-bred steeplechase winner for Noonan at Moonee Valley. "Andrew and I are great mates," explained Noonan. "I came up with the idea of buying some horses in Britain and racing them here and, luckily enough, I had some clients who liked the idea, too. If one of them can come back to Australia and win the [Melbourne] Cup, then that would be even better!" The McMahons, who have three horses in training with Balding in the UK, also own horses in their home country and Peter is on the board of directors of Racing Victoria Limited. Noonan said: "We're looking for mile-and-a-half type horses: Cup horses with a little bit more speed. In Europe they breed more staying types and the pool of horses we can select from now in Australia and New Zealand is shrinking. You end up paying a premium for that, which is why we've come here. In Australia, we probably look for a stronger type, a heavier-boned horse. The reason we've left some horses here is that I think young horses are trained better in Europe--the tracks are straight and the horses aren't put under as much pressure."



#### SAVE ON YOUR TAXES WITH THESE TAX CODE REVISIONS

Members of the equine industry will benefit from recent revisions to the Federal tax code via the Economic Stimulus Act and the Farm Bill.

#### Economic Stimulus Act

The Economic Stimulus Act includes two tax incentives that would allow a much bigger write-off for horses and other property <u>purchased and placed in service during 2008</u>. You must act this year.

- Increase in expensing allowance for horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property to \$250,000 from \$128,000
- Expense allowance reverts to \$128,000 (plus inflation adjustment) in 2009
- 50% bonus first-year depreciation returns for property placed in service in 2008

#### Farm Bill

Buyers and tax planners should note an important provision in the Farm Bill that benefits the equine industry beginning in 2009.

- · New, faster three-year depreciation schedule for all young racehorses
- · Yearlings are included in new schedule
- After two-year-old year, 62.5% can now be depreciated compared to only 29.5% under previous, seven-year schedule

# **CURLIN TO WORK MONDAY BETWEEN RACES**

Reigning Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) will take to the Santa Anita Pro-Ride surface for a public workout Monday between the fourth and fifth races. "Our biggest concern with Curlin is the difference in the way the track plays between morning and afternoon," said assistant trainer Scott Blasi. "This is going to be a smooth 5/8ths [mile] in company. We'll come on the

track up in the quarter-mile chute and just jog off from there and break off at the 5/8 pole. He'll be working with another horse of ours named Hawaii Calls. We're not looking for anything real fast, but it'll be done the way we do things in company." The Arcadia oval, normally dark

Mondays, hosts a special Columbus Day program next week and Curlin is expected to take to the track at about 2:45 p.m. PDT. Also expected to breeze Monday morning are 2007 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up **Pyro** (Pulpit) and **Student Council** (Kingmambo), both bound for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Trainer Steve Asumussen is expected to fly in to oversee all of the works. Curlin went a half-mile in an easy :52.80 this past Monday.

### Gomez on Go Between in Classic...

Jockey Garrett Gomez and his agent Ron Anderson have given the call in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic to trainer Bill Mott, who will send out **Go Between** (Point Given) in the \$5-million event. The Eclipse Award-winning rider had been aboard fellow Classic contender **Colonel John** (Tiznow) for his last two starts, including a thrilling nose success in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga

Aug. 23. Gomez has piloted Go Between in his last five appearances, most recently guiding the attractive chestnut to a neck success in the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar the day after the Travers. "We won three \$1-million races on Go Between," explained Anderson, referring to the Pacific Classic, the Sunshine Millions Classic over the winter at Santa Anita and the 2006 Virginia Derby. "Plus, he's won on synthetic," he added. In all Benoit photo fairness, so too has Colonel John, who took the

GIII Sham S. and the GI Santa Anita Derby earlier this season. The WinStar colorbearer drilled a half-mile in :46.80 yesterday morning, and trainer Eoin Harty said he'd been "inundated" with calls from agents trying to secure the mount. **Well Armed** (Tiznow), another Breeders' Cup hopeful for WinStar and Harty, went three-eighths of a mile in :35.20. The conditioner remains uncertain as to whether the GI Goodwood S. hero and Pacific Classic runner-up would point for the Classic or the Dirt Mile.

#### In Other Classic News...

Casino Drive (Mineshaft) was on the track yesterday morning at Hollywood Park and, with time ticking away to take in a local prep race, the colt is now likely to be

trained up to the Classic, according to Nobutaka Tada, racing manager to owner Hidetoshi Yamamoto. The chestnut is perfect in two career starts, having broken his maiden at Kyoto in February prior to a 5 3/4-length victory in the GII Peter Pan S. May 10. He was widely regarded as the biggest threat to Big Brown in the Belmont, but was

scratched on the morning of the race due to a stone bruise.

### **lavarone Envisions BC Turf for 'Court'...**

IEAH Stable's Michael lavarone told *Daily Racing* Form that **Court Vision** (Gulch) is "very much under consideration" for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Oct. 25. The three-year-old colt is coming off a

victory in last Saturday's GII Jamaica H. at Belmont Park. "To me, he looked awesome," lavarone told *DRF*. "He was in [jockey Ramon] Dominguez's hands the whole way. In previous races he needed to be nudged along. I don't see any downside. If he does-

n't run his race, then we can bring him back for the [GI] Hollywood Derby a month later. He could be one of the top grass horses in North America next year." The Jamaica was Court Vision's first victory on grass. In two previous efforts on the green stuff, he was fourth over a boggy course in the Colonial Turf Cup in June and second, beaten just a nose, in the GII Virginia Derby in July. Following the latter, he was sixth on dirt in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga. The Breeders' Cup Turf would be his first start against older horses. IEAH owns Court Vision, who is trained by Bill Mott, in partnership with WinStar Farm.

# Vineyard Maven Done for the Year...

Standing with some of his colleagues at Clockers' Corner Wednesday morning, trainer Bobby Frankel reiterated that GI Champagne S. hero Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}) would contest neither the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile nor any other event the rest of this season. "He won't run until next year," he confirmed. "He's run enough times this year." The gray, acquired privately off a Calder maiden win in June, is two-forthree since joining the Frankel barn, with a victory in the GI Hopeful S. ahead of the Champagne. Vineyard Haven is not nominated to the Breeders' Cup.

# O'Brien Sizes Up Cup Challenge...

Aidan O'Brien is set to run his Arc pair Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Breeders' Cup, he revealed to Racing Post. While Duke of Marmalade, seventh in the Arc, has the option of the Classic or Turf, Soldier of Fortune, third on Sunday, looks likely to contest the mile-and-ahalf Turf. "[Duke of Marmalade] seems fine and we have the choice of running him in either the Turf or Classic at Santa Anita," O'Brien told the trade daily. "We haven't sat down yet and discussed final plans for the Breeders' Cup meeting, but we will be doing that before long. It is very possible Soldier of Fortune will go for the Breeders' Cup Turf." O'Brien also revealed that Adrian Nolan's G3 Gallinule S. winner Hebridean (Ire) (Bach {Ire}) was the stable's main contender for the G1 Emirates Airlines Champion S. at Newmarket next Saturday and that the Melbourne Cup trio of Septimus (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Honolulu (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) were due to leave on Wednesday. Johnny Murtagh will renew his partnership with the former, while Wayne Lordan has been booked for Alessandro Volta and Colm O'Donoghue is likely to ride Honolulu."

Farish, Jr. "Churchill Downs has proven to be an outstanding Breeders' Cup venue and is extremely popular with our horsemen and fans from around the world. Churchill will also provide an extraordinary site for our expanded two-day program of the Championships." Home of the Kentucky Derby, Churchill has previously hosted racing's championship day in 1988, 1991, 1994, 1998, 2000 and 2006. The latter event was witnessed by 76,132 fans who accounted for an all-time record for on-track handle (\$18,259,971) and worldwide betting in excess of \$140 million. Added CDI President and CEO Bob Evans, "The return of the Breeders' Cup to Churchill Downs in 2010 is wonderful news for our track and Kentucky's signature horse industry, as well as the business owners and the state and local governments that will benefit from the economic boost this major international event will provide to our city and region. # **ZAYAT REFOCUSES**

On Tuesday, Zayat Stables chief Ahmed Zayat announced that he was launching an annual offering of a portion of his racing stock. At the upcoming Keeneland November Sale, Zayat will send some 90 horses--primarily those currently in training--through the ring via Eaton Sales. That includes GSW & MGISP Baroness Thatcher, among other intriguing prospects.

The stated reason of the sale is to trim numbers. Zayat currently has a vast stable that includes 170 horses in training, and more are on the way. Zayat recently purchased 30 yearlings at Keeneland September for \$6,732,000, pushing his portfolio to more than 270 horses in all.

Few operations have made a greater impact on the racing and sales industry over the past two years than Zayat. His runners have included Grade I winners Point Ashley and Downthedustyroad, as well as Saturday's GI Shadwell Turf Mile hero Thorn Song. Others to carry Zayat's yellow and turquoise silks to victory in stakes races include Massive Drama, High Again, Got the Last Laugh, Marcavelly, Belgravia, Forefathers, E Z Warrior Mushka, and J Z Warrior. Shortly after the announcement, Zayat talked with the *TDN* about his reasons for selling, his reasons for keeping, and his ultimate goal in racing.

# When did you make the decision to offer a good portion of your older horses?

It's something that's always been in our business plan. We're a fairly young stable; I only started this in 2005, and it's now 2008. Therefore, it's like a business cycle. We are a stable which is not in the business of breeding. Our business is racing, and racing young horses, trying to create stallions or the right broodmares.

Realistically, not every horse you buy will end up being a sire, and not every filly will be a Grade I or Grade II winner. So what do you do with the older horses that no longer fit your business plan? There has to be a way where other people can continue to have fun with, and continue to race, those horses.

I looked at different models and different countries to see what they do. There wasn't a concept, so to speak, of a sale of developed horses-in-training anywhere, though they do have a little one in England. Cont. p10

I consulted with operations like Coolmore. I said, 'What are you doing? You have tons of horses--what do you do with the horses you don't stand yourself?' And they said that they sell privately or they put them through a sale.

#### How did you decide on a venue?

I consulted with Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland in early May, and I told them my plan. I said that I'd really like to do it differently. I'd like it to be more sophisticated, to have my trainers talk to prospective buyers about a horse. I'd like to have Ragozin Sheets available. I'd like to show videos of their performances. I'd like to have a special catalogue.

They were very excited about it and both wanted to do it. The concept started to take on its own life. Because of the timing of things and the way the market and economy is, we weren't able to get it done in the appropriate time with Fasig-Tipton, and Keeneland was more aggressive and eager, since they've never had something like this in their catalogue.

We're not selling claimers, we're selling horses that have won stakes and graded stakes--allowance races and up. A lot of owners I know of--like IEAH--love buying ready-made horses without the risk of buying yearlings. And there's a market with new owners just getting into the business who want to do that. We've had people constantly approaching us about buying our horses. Now they're all in the sale, and people can come look at and inspect them and see what suits them. I've been approached by people from Turkey, from Russia, and there is a need for an American sale of horses of racing age.

# What was the determining factor between who stays and who goes? Will you be keeping any older prospects?

Yes, of course. Let me give you an example. We have 178 horses in training. We have about 70 racing prospects in the catalogue for November, and I assume there will be some scratches. So, maybe we will sell 50. So to give you a sense of magnitude, we'll still have 120 horses in training--and I'm not counting the two-year-olds or the yearlings. So by any measure, we'll still have a very sizeable stable. I'm just trying not to be a jack or all trades, master of none. I don't want to be the guy who breeds them, races them, stands them. I'd like to stick to the heart of our business, of what we know.

An example of a horse we'll keep is Alaazo. He's an A.P. Indy out of Atelier--he's royally bred. We just bought his brother out of the [September] yearling sale from Helen Alexander--he's by Distorted Humor. Anyway, the A.P. Indys are late developers. Not all of them have achieved everything they're going to by three, as you well know. So he'll be racing for us at four. I also have Z Humor, who's by Distorted Humor, who hasn't realized his potential.

He was a brilliant two-year-old, but he hasn't met our expectations this year. But he's coming back and it makes sense for us to keep racing him as a four-year-old.

Another example is Maimonides. We all saw the way he broke his maiden at Saratoga--it was breathtaking. He won by 11 1/2 lengths, totally without being asked.

There was actually a standing ovation. At Saratoga, for a maiden? It was an incredible feeling. In the Hopeful, he bucked his shins, then he chipped an ankle. I wanted to give him the time. He was supposed to start in May, but we didn't like the way he was going. So I said, I'm going to be very patient, because this is a

heckuva good horse. If you treat them right, they'll do right by you. Within a week, he is supposed start training again.

# You mentioned not wanting to be a jack of all trades, master of none. What do you see as Zayat's specialty? Kentucky Derby-type horses?

Obviously, everyone wants to win the Kentucky Derby. Is that our particular goal? No, because it comes with time and if I keep chasing it, it will never happen. I could be doing this for 30 years and never do it. My aim is to buy young, very nice horses, and see them fulfill their potential, and have fun with them as two-and three-year-olds. After that stage, it's not really something we consider as part of what excites us. Listen, all of us are obviously thrilled to see Curlin race as a four-year-old, but he's an exceptional horse. Not ever horse is like that.

Here's an example. We've got a horse named Premium Wine. He's incredibly talented and has done everything we've asked of him. He almost won a Grade I, he won the Gallant Bob H. But he's not bred to be a stallion, to be quite honest with you. He's by Prime Timber. I'm not going to stand him, and I don't know if others will. But he's got a lot of racing left in him, and I hope other people can have the same fun we've had racing him. They can take him and go to Dubai and run in the sprint [the Golden Shaheen] or the mile [Godolphin Mile]. For us, it's a business decision--we need to stick to a plan that makes sense.

# Why would a horse that didn't fit in your program fit in someone else's? In other words, why should people want a horse you don't?

Everybody has different appetites and different needs in the market. For instance, not everybody is buying a pedigree because they want to make a stallion. Some people are buying certain horses to compete at certain levels. It depends on where you want to compete.

For a lot of people, a win is a win. Believe me. I have horses that I've had to drop, and I'm as thrilled they're winning [at a lower level] as much as I am for another horse. I'd be lying if I said, 'Wow, it's as financially rewarding,' but I'm having the same thrill. I root for my allowance horses as much as my Grade I horses. I just want my horse to win--I'm competitive.

There are outfits, again, like IEAH, who have been very successful buying horses that aren't particularly well-bred, like Kip Deville. We have different programs. It's worked extremely well for them and others.

# Is it emotional to see some go?

Of course it's emotional. You become attached to them, like your kids, and it's hard to part with them. But sometimes you have to look at it from a business point of view. This is the one of the largest stables in America--probably the second-largest. We have huge overhead, and you have to be prudent about it if you want to treat it like a business, and we are. I didn't enter this industry just because I love horses alone. I do, but I also want to make a business model that works. It can be very daunting. People say that you can't make money racing, that you have to be in breeding. That remains to be seen. I am racing to create stallions for others to breed. It's a different angle. It's harder, but it'll be much more rewarding, I believe.

# How much time do you put into the stable each week?

You'd be very surprised. I'm putting probably 70 or 75 percent of my time into it, because I'm running it like a business.

# What are some of the lessons you've learned since you started in the business? Who are some of the people you've learned from?

That's a very loaded question! Well, first of all, it's a very humbling business. Think about it. I'll be a hero in the racing world if I'm batting 25 percent. So by definition, I'm losing 75 percent of the time.

I'm a very competitive person by nature. I've always prided myself on being very successful in whatever I do.

So the first adjustment I had to make was getting used to losing 75 percent of the time--and being happy about it! It's amazing. Someone told me once that only three percent of owners ever win a stakes. That's a very daunting statistic.

Every year you have a crop of, what, 39,000 to 45,000 Thoroughbreds? From that, you need to come and take the 20 of them that will start in the Derby. Think about how incredible that percentage is. For me, in my first year of having a full three-year-old crop, to have two horses in the Kentucky Derby, is so lucky. It was very rewarding. And that, to be honest with you, is what keeps me going.

But to answer your question, I've learned things every day--from my trainers, from my vets, from the pinhookers and from the consignors at sales. It's a learning curve, and a constant learning experience. The beauty of this industry is that it's constantly evolving and changing. Every day, there are so many variations thrown in your face. We've been dealing with the [synthetic] tracks for the last few years. It's a completely new variant. You're buying horses, and you don't know which horses will like the surfaces. And now we have the Breeders' Cup, two years in a row, on the Pro-Ride surface. And all the synthetic tracks are different. It's part of the challenge, and part of the excitement.

### What is the ultimate goal of Zayat Stables?

I think that these horses are so majestic and so beautiful. I think I would like one day to be in a position to-there's no such thing as a perfect horse--but to have a horse that has the looks, and has the conformation, pedigree and durability. When I look at the horses in the past that used to race 12, 15 times as a two-year-old. I can't even get a decent horse to run five or six times. Whatever happened to that special athlete that had the durability and was running all the time?

I think Sheikh Mohammed is doing an incredible joban incr

# BAD ROCKS, GOOD EXPOSURE By Lucas Marquardt

The bane of Bill Casner's existence? The rock.

No, we don't mean an out-of-the-car-long-hair, heavy-metal music kind of rock. We mean the every-one-of-you-in-a-field-is-a-wrenched-ankle-waiting-to-happen kind of rock.

Be they igneous, metamorphic or sedimentary, rocks

have no place in a paddock owned by Bill Casner, who operates WinStar Farm with partner Kenny Troutt. This aversion was something that Curt Ramsey, a former broodmare manager at WinStar, and his wife Kim were well aware of when they suggested to their son Alex's middle school football team that, as a type of

fundraiser, the team might scour the fields of WinStar for those little (and sometimes big) hoof bruisers.

So on Saturday, Sept. 27, some 50 members of Royal Spring Middle School's football squad did just that. They lined up an arm's length apart and marched down several paddocks at the Lexington, Kentucky-based WinStar. By all accounts, the day was a success. The football team received a generous donation from WinStar, and the farm rid itself of a truckload of rocks. But in addition to much-needed money for new equipment, the team received something else: a deeper respect and understanding of the Thoroughbred business.

"I grew up in the business, and I went to a school where a lot of people knew about the industry," explained Kim Ramsey, a daughter of bio-mechanic guru Cecil Seaman. "I grew up watching the weanlings play with each other and the stallions roam their paddocks. But of all the kids on the football team, I think our son was the only one who had been on a Thoroughbred farm before."

That might surprise some, given that Lexington likes to boast itself as the Horse Capital of the World. Ramsey found that, in addition to have little idea what does on at Thoroughbred farms, many of the middle

schoolers had misconceptions of how the horses are treated.

"All these kids came away with an altered view of the Thoroughbred industry--they all came away with a positive view of the industry," Ramsey said.

The trip to WinStar wasn't all work. After spending a few hours

collecting rocks, the team was piled onto a few wagons and given a tour of the farm. They visited the broodmare barn, the vet lab and even the hyperbaric chamber that WinStar has on premise.

"The kids thought it was pretty neat," said Ramsey. "We went past a field with probably 10 weanlings in it, and they were all laying down. About half of them got up just to see what we were doing. There were a lot of 'oohs' and 'ahhs' and 'how cool.' And the kids also got a chance to see [WinStar broodmare] Summerly."

"They just couldn't believe someone would spend so much for a horse," laughed Ramsey.

The trip to WinStar wasn't an eye-opener only for the kids, according to Ramsey.

"I talked to a few of their parents afterwards, and even they said how neat it was and how they had never been on any of these farms before, either," she said. "Plus a lot of the parents were really surprised about how well the horses really are treated on the farm. After what they've been hearing from PETA and organizations like that, they thought people in the industry didn't really care about their horses."

Ramsey said that she's been inspired by the experience and hopes that it can be the beginning of a closer relationship between Thoroughbred farms and the communities in which they're based.

"I'm trying to figure out ways to get a lot of the kids in this area onto the farms, so they can see what it's like," she said. "I'm hoping this will get other farms to say, 'Hey, there are ways we can get the community involved and get the kids out here.' I think it is a great opportunity for farms to let the community know that, 1) we're still out there; and 2) it's not a negative industry; it's a positive industry. We love our animals and they mean the world to us. Most people don't get to see that unless you're on the farm first hand."

For their part, the folks at WinStar were more than happy to host the children, and the field trip falls right in line with Casner's ideas about exposing people to the racing world.

"Bill's always tried to think of different ideas to get the community involved, to get children introduced to what happens on the farm," said Tony Cissell, general manager at WinStar. "It went really well. It was a very positive experience, for them and us. One of the things Bill's done is have a five-gallon bucket at every gate, and if we're out in the fields we'll pick up rocks and drop them in the buckets. If we can prevent one coffin bone fracture, we're in good shape. The kids picked up a whole wagon-load of rocks. They provided us a very nice service, we were able to make a donation and, hopefully, we've exposed them in a positive way to the farm."

### **DUTROW POSITIVE TO BE OVERTURNED?** A

hearing officer has recommended that trainer Rick Dutrow Jr.'s 15-day suspension for a clenbuterol positive at Churchill Downs in May be overturned. Dutrow trainee Salute the Count tested positive for an overage of clenbuterol after running second in the GIII Aegon Turf Sprint S. at Churchill May 2. A split sample confirmed the positive, but, during a hearing conducted by Officer James Robke at the end of August, Dutrow's attorneys argued that the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Withdrawal Guidelines call for a permissible threshold of 25 picograms per milliliter of serum, and Salute the Count's positive test showed an overage in the blood plasma, not the serum. Neither of the two testing laboratories, at Iowa State University and Louisiana State University, reported on the concentration in the serum, or addressed the difference in the two blood components. In a finding sent to Dutrow's attorneys and to John Forgy of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Tuesday, Robke concluded that the KHRC failed to show that Salute the Count had an overage of clenbuterol in his system May 2, and that the suspension, and the disqualification from purse money ordered by the Kentucky stewards, should be overturned. The KHRC now has 15 days to respond to the hearing officer. An appeal to the Circuit Court would need to be filed within 30 days. Jim Carroll, information officer for the KHRC, said, "We have just received the report ourselves, and have not had a chance to review it in detail." Carroll declided further comment, but added that there should be a response to the report "soon."
