NTRA ANNOUNCES REFORM ALLIANCE

National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) President and CEO Alex Waldrop and Thoroughbred racing industry leaders held a press conference in New York Wednesday to announce the creation of a Safety and Integrity Alliance, a new organization that aims to enact a series of industry-wide safety and integrity reforms. The Alliance is comprised of numerous horsemen's groups in the U.S. and Canada and a total of 55 racetracks. Membership in the Alliance is voluntary.

Tommy G. Thompson, former four-term Governor of Wisconsin and Secretary of Health and Human Services, will serve as independent counsel for the Alliance. Thompson will conduct an ongoing review and provide an "independent and public assessment,"

according to the NTRA. Thompson will issue reports at least annually, and perhaps as often as quarterly.

The Thoroughbred industry has been under increasing scrutiny in recent years--both from within and without. The much-publicized breakdown of Eight Belles in the Kentucky Derby proved to be a catalyst. Her death prompted The Jockey Club to establish a Thoroughbred Safety Committee and to host a Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit. The NTRA said it has drawn from the recommendations of those efforts, as well as others. Among the reforms the Alliance hopes to address and/or enact are:

- Uniform medication rules for each racing state
- Ban of steroids from racing competition
- Out-of-competition testing for blood and gene doping agents and pre-race testing
- Uniform penalties for all medication infractions
- Mandatory on-track and non-racing injury reporting
- Mandatory installation of protective inner safety rail
- Mandatory pre- and post-race security
- Adoption of a placement program for Thoroughbreds no longer competing

RECORDS FALL AT TATTS BOOK 2 FINALE

Tattersalls October Book 2 Yearling Sale record price was broken twice yesterday at a lively closing day in Newmarket. The two toppers were a 420,000gns colt and 400,000gns filly by Coolmore's Danehill Dancer (Ire). Trainer Sir Michael Stoute bought the colt through agent Maxine Cowdrey on behalf of Elizabeth Moran's Pennsylvania-based Brushwood Stables. Moran, who bred Stoute's G1 1000 Guineas winner Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo), also owned the G3 Jersey S. winner Jeremy (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) with

Stoute. "He's been bought for the owner of Jeremy, who we never really replaced and is obviously by the same sire as him. I thought he looked a fine athlete," said Stoute, who outbid Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne. The colt was sold by Paul and Marie McCartan's Ballyphilip Stud for breeder Dermot McAuliffe, a farmer from Co Cork. Cont. p2

KEENELAND SELECTED TO MARKET SEALED BID AUCTION OF CURLIN MINORITY INTEREST

Keeneland has been selected to market a sealed-bid auction of the 20-percent minority interest in Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike). On Sept. 25, Boone County (Ky) Circuit Court Judge Roger Crittended issued an order allowing Matthew L. Garretson, the court-appointed Receiver for Shirley Cunningham and William Gallion's Midnight Cry Stable, to offer the 20-percent interest they own in Curlin via a sealed-bid process. Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable owns an 80-percent interest in the colt. "This is a rare opportunity to acquire a significant interest in an extraordinary racehorse and an exciting stallion prospect," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales. "Curlin is arguably one of the greatest horses of the modern era." The deadline for submitting bids is 3 p.m. EST Nov. 5, 2008. Cont. p5

O'Byrne was successful in outbidding agent Peter Doyle for the 400,000gns filly, a three-parts sister to this season's G2 Lowther S. winner Infamous Angel (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) bred by Geoff Howard-Sprink's Bricklow Ltd. "To me, she was as

good a filly as I've seen at any sale this year," said O'Byrne, buying for the usual Coolmore partnership. "Obviously, her sister is very good and her sire is very reliable." Shadwell Stud principal Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum was at the sale in person again, and his main buy was a

270,000gns full brother to 2004 G3 Dee S. winner African Dream (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}). "We've bought 23 this week, which is about the same number as last year," said Sheikh Hamdan's racing manager Angus Gold. "Last week was more about the pedigrees, while this week we have concentrated on the individuals." The colt had been bought back for just 25,000gns at last year's Tattersalls December sale.

Book 2 By the Numbers...

Book 2 produced a 19,672,700gns turnover, down 18 percent on 2007. The 38,650gns average fell by 24 percent and the 29,000gns median by 17 percent. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "By common consent Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale produced a remarkable set of figures, considering the extraordinary financial climate we find ourselves enduring, but it would have been unrealistic to expect complete immunity from the global financial crisis. Rarely, if ever, have the financial markets experienced this sort of turbulence, and in the context of such conditions, the three days of Book 2 have demonstrated surprising resilience. Positive aspects have included two lots comfortably exceeding the previous record price for the sale and solid commercial horses fetching good money from start to finish. Inevitably, however, the market has experienced a significant correction despite major contributions from those who made Book 1 such a success and a wide cross section of buyers from throughout Europe. It is never easy to respond to a falling market, but our vendors have adjusted to the prevailing conditions with commendable realism and deserve our thanks for their support and their positive approach at a testing time." Book 3 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale begins today at 10 a.m.

NTRA Hopes to Spark Change...

According to the NTRA, the Alliance is meant to be a long-standing organization and will function as a certification/accreditation body. The purpose of the Alliance is to recognize and encourage compliance by all stakeholders. While the Alliance will be without any enforcement capabilities, it hopes that the incentives of being an accredited member will be a sufficient lure.

Reforms will be undertaken immediately using a phased approach. Until individual states and regulatory agencies can catch up via statute and regulations, many Alliance-backed reforms will need to be enacted under an Alliance member's "house rules." The Alliance hopes to transition to a broader strategy that relies on licensure requirements, continuing

education programs and the state regulatory process.

The NTRA states that nearly every leading racetrack and horsemen's association in North America, representing some one million industry participants, has pledged its support to the Alliance and the reforms. Waldrop indicated that, in the coming weeks, the Alliance will be broadened to include other racing organizations, individuals and fans; and that additional reforms, including wagering integrity issues, will be addressed by the Alliance.

"Our industry is taking strong, positive steps to ensure the safety and integrity of our sport," said Waldrop. "Despite challenges and significant short-term and long-term costs, there is an unprecedented level of commitment among Thoroughbred racing's leadership to see these measures through."

Tommy Thompson is currently a partner in the Washington, D.C., offices of the law firm Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer and Feld.

"Our first priority is to insure the health and safety of the athletes and horses in the racing industry," said Thompson. "On its own initiative, the NTRA has taken a great step forward in committing to reforms and the creation of an important new body to oversee implementation of the reforms. I will take my independent oversight role seriously and work to assure transparency in this process."

Redoute's Choice edged one clear of arch-rival Encosta de Lago when Gallica became the stallion's 14th Group 1 winner after a copybook ride by Damien Oliver resulted in a deserved victory at the highest level. Oliver positioned the talented filly one off pace-setting Cats Whisker in a race that favoured the leaders and pounced at the 200-meter pole to score by a length. Trainer Mick Price, who prepares the filly for long-time stable clients Richard and June Harding, has taken a "softly, softly" approach with the sophomore he admits was wanting in the conformation department and hence fetched only A\$250,000 in a season when the progeny of her sire averaged close to A\$600,000. She was sent out in three modest out-of-town outings before stepping up to the plate to score the G2 Edward Manifold S. last time out. "It's just fantastic for the Hardings. They've probably been my biggest supporters since day one," enthused Price. "Right back when I had my little stable at the back of Epsom. He's been a great owner and he's bought a few fillies who've been a bit slow. But then there's this one." Price added that, although he was initially tempted to target the G1 Victoria Oaks, Gallica would be sent for a spell. "I reckon I've used plenty of horse to get here and I'm not a very big fan of 2500-meter races for these fillies," he said. "She doesn't have to prove herself now." The diminutive filly Romneya (Aus) (Red Ransom) was a gallant fourth, while Portillo (Aus) (Red Ransom) found it difficult to make up ground and finished seventh.

RAHY'S ATTORNEY OFF TO JAPAN **Rahy's Attorney**

(Crown Attorney), who upset the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 7, will make his next start in the G1 Mile Championship at Japan's Kyoto Racecourse Nov. 23, *Daily Racing Form* reports. "I can't see any good reason not to go," trainer Ian Black told the publication. "He's in good order and, for all of us involved, it will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience." Despite his win in the Woodbine Mile, a "Win-And-You're In" event for the Breeders' Cup, connections decided to pass on the race because of the \$180,000 fee to supplement. Rahy's Attorney is not nominated to the Breeders' Cup. GOING FOR GOLD

When Criquette Head-Maarek saddles **Full of Gold (Fr)** (Gold Away {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Emirates Airlines Champion S. at Newmarket, it will be a family affair. The three-year-old, who is rated an outsider following some indifferent displays this summer, was bred by Head-Maarek's parents Alec and Ghislaine. The race could also continue the trainer's run of success in 2008. Thanks to the Juddmonte fillies African Rose (GB) and Proportional (GB), Head-Maarek's fortunes have been revived at the highest level this year.

French racing's most celebrated female has launched many successful raids on Newmarket down the years, with G1 Cheveley Park S. and G1 1000 Guineas victories supplied by Ma Biche, Ravinella, Pas de Reponse and Hatoof, the latter of whom became her sole winner of this race in 1993. Full of Gold looked likely to provide more highs for the 59-year-old when capturing the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in November, but after a successful return in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp in April, something went awry with the chestnut. Only fourth in the G2 Prix Hocquart back at that track the following month, he beat no rivals in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly in June and G2 Prix Niel back at Longchamp in September. Last time, there was a glimpse of a return to form in his second--under a six-pound penalty--in the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte and his trainer thinks she has him back. "After the French Derby, he had some problems we had to sort out and he was far from his best in the Niel," she explains. "His run at Maisons-Laffitte was very good, as he was giving weight away and he is coming back to his best now. A mile and a quarter is probably his best distance."

Her father must also retain belief in his homebred, as he recently bought back his half-brother by Numerous for €340,000 at the Arqana August Sale in Deauville. His half-brother Fuisse (Fr) (Green Tune) earned **TDN Rising Star** status at Longchamp last month and was runner-up in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon at Saint-Cloud. Alec Head knows what it takes to collect here, having saddled Hafiz (Fr) and Rose Royale (Fr) to success in 1955 and 1957 and the enduring legacy of French racing and breeding's most notorious dynasties is set to continue, win or lose, on Saturday.

Forever Together 'Barley' Takes a Deep Breath

A Grade I winner at eight and nine furlongs, Augustin Stable's **Forever Together** (Belong to Me) will try to duplicate the feat when she tries 10 furlongs for the first time in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf a

The four-year-old filly prepped for that event yesterday at Keeneland, breezing five furlongs on the Polytrack in 1:00.80 beneath exercise rider and assistant trainer Barry Wiseman ([video](#)). "It was easy for her," he commented. "She finished strong. That's what we wanted, a mini-work." Forever Together leaves


for California Oct. 22, and trainer Jonathan Sheppard is a bit concerned about how the filly will handle the hot weather, given that she does not sweat. She receives supplements to try to combat the problem, including a can of Guinness poured over her evening feed. "You know your friends that drink a lot of beer tend to perspire heavily?" Sheppard said. "The same thing with horses."

Frankel Changes Course; Mast Track to Classic

Trainer Bobby Frankel has called an audible and, in the notable absence of Big Brown, will send GI Hollywood Gold Cup hero **Mast Track** (Mizzen Mast) to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic instead of the Dirt Mile. "With Big Brown out, it changes the picture," the conditioner said Wednesday morning. "My horse has speed and he can get the distance. He won the Gold Cup at a mile and a quarter." Tyler Baze, who guided the Frankel-owned colt to the win in the Gold Cup, will have the mount in the Classic after a two-race absence. "I guess Bobby figured Tyler was the last one to win a Grade I million-dollar race on him at a mile and a quarter," said Baze's agent, Ron Ebanks, in explaining the reunion. "Tyler was available, so he put him on. I was looking at another horse or two. I got offered Mast Track and I jumped on him, because they were lucky together, and the Classic is setting up without much speed, so it could be a big opportunity. We've got a chance to get lucky here. Tyler's very excited. You've got to turn the page in this business. The last race is over with. We're looking at the next one." In other news, Frankel said Juddmonte Farms' **Champs Elysees** (GB) (Danehill) will also run in the Classic, with Alan Garcia to ride. The five-year-old raced reasonably well in his lone start over a synthetic track, finishing third, beaten 3 1/2 lengths, behind Heatseeker (Ire) and **Go Between** (Point Given) in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 1.

Conduit Faces Turf Challenge

Ballymacoll Stud's G1 St Leger winner **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) will run in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita, connections confirmed yesterday. The Sir Michael Stoute trainee was given the green light to take on Soldier of Fortune (Ire) and company in the Oct. 25 contest. The Stud's Manager Peter Reynolds told *PA Sport*, "It's very exciting to be going over to America with a Classic winner. If he can manage to win a race such as this after winning a Leger it would be great for his stud value. Hopefully he has enough speed for it."

FALSE POSITIVE

We knew beforehand that the shift of a day from Tattersalls October Book 1 (four days last year) to Book 2 (two days last year) meant that we wouldn't be able to really assess either Book (three days each this year) until all six days were completed. They now are. In 2007, after six days of selling, there had been 1,365 yearlings catalogued. A total of 983 sold (72 percent of those catalogued), for 88,829,000gns, an average of 90,365gns.

Through yesterday, after six days of selling this year, there had been 1,457 yearlings catalogued--seven percent more than last year. Yet seven percent fewer (919) sold--just 63 percent of those catalogued. That means, in comparison to last year, one out of every eight horses which did sell last year did not sell this year. The clearance rate from the catalogue suffered a 12.5-percent drop. Gross revenues for the 919 yearlings which were listed as sales dropped 22 percent, to 69,493,700gns, and the average dropped by 16 percent, to 75,619gns. That's for the whole six days.

Consignor demand forced the transfer of a Book 1 day to Book 2, but those plans clearly backfired, since the three remaining days of Book 1 suffered only a five percent drop from the 2007 average, whereas Book 2 this week was carnage. There were 34 percent more horses catalogued over this year's three days (847) than last year's two (632), yet only eight percent more (509 this year, 473 in 2007) were listed as sales. This is because only 60 percent of this year's Book 2 yearlings were sold, versus 75 percent last year; the clearance rate from the catalogue dropped a massive 20 percent.

Even with 34 percent more horses catalogued and eight percent more sold, this year's three-day Book 2 gross (19,672,700gns) dropped 18 percent from last year's two-day gross (23,907,000gns). This year's Book 2 average dropped by 24 percent, from 50,543gns last year to 38,650gns. In fact, the Book 2 market didn't just drop, it practically hemorrhaged.

When we talk about the plunge in Book 2 value, though, it's important to remember every buyer interviewed says it's still very tough to buy a nice horse. Clearly, the difference has to be there are relatively fewer nice horses, and relatively more which the contracting number of buyers don't want. I'll bet the percentage of yearlings which went through the ring for less than 10,000gns is way up.

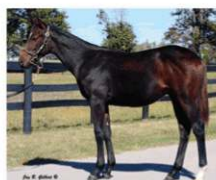

However you cut the cake, what was absolutely clear was the difference between Book 1 last week and Book 2 this week. Though gross revenues were off 23 percent last week, the number of yearlings catalogued was down 17 percent, and the week's average was off just five percent, to 121,515gns this year from 127,298gns last year, with exactly 100 fewer yearlings sold. Demand was plenty strong. I guess demand was still strong in Book 2, but the bar is relatively high, and there were relatively fewer which met the buyers' strict criteria. Thus, 40 percent of those catalogued did not end up listed as sales. **Cont. p9**

Now that we've dissected the 22-percent drop in gross and 16 percent drop in average over the whole six days, the other highly significant aspect, in market terms, was the massive buying by the Maktoum family and friends. Even given that they prefer buying at Newmarket to anywhere else and given that it's hard to compare prior years because Rabbah has only been used as the umbrella buying vehicle for Maktoum family friends the last couple of years, making comparisons before that somewhat problematical, they rolled out the big guns this year. John Ferguson, Shadwell, and Rabbah combined bought 177 yearlings over the six days (not one of them by a Coolmore stallion, by the way), and spent 20,394,500gns--29 percent of the entire sum spent by all buyers. Their 177 purchases represent 19 percent of all horses sold. Last week they bought 106 yearlings, 26 percent of all yearlings sold, but almost 40 percent of all the Book 1 yearlings not by Coolmore sires. Even given the Maktoums like buying at Newmarket, it was a massive statement. When you think the overall market was down 23 percent even with their 177 purchases--well, the supply and demand equation would look even worse than it does now, that's for sure.

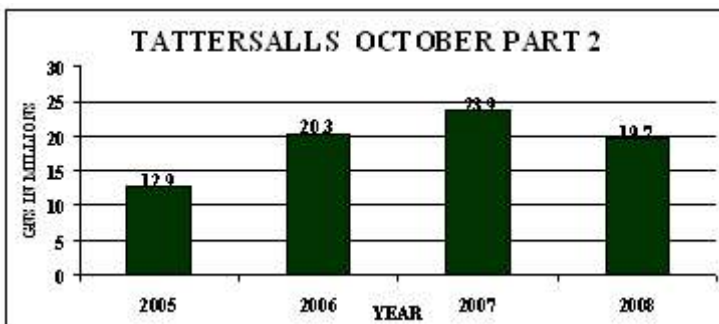

There has been much discussion about the best way for the Thoroughbred industry to handle the current economic downturn. What steps do you think are required to weather the storm?

Owner J. Paul Reddam:

I think we need to look at the fundamentals of running a business. We get fixated on the little issues, but miss the big picture. Looking at the overall economy, we need to realize that markets go up and markets go down.

Marketing for the sport has been non-existent. We need a complete change in the marketing and take a look at the fundamentals of wagering. Why be embarrassed about what your business is? Our business is gambling on race horses.

We're struggling to compete with other sports. When Del Mar ran this summer, there were no entries in the Los Angeles Times, but there was page after page of stories on steroids. So what people were seeing wasn't good.

I know people who know I'm in racing, and yet they don't know Oak Tree is racing right now. If you don't have handle, you don't have anything. If you want more owners in the game, you have to figure out how to push up handle.

When a company is weak and is trying to cut their budget, they often reduce marketing. But from my perspective, you have to go the other way and increase marketing.



The people who are up on the learning curve don't need to be marketed to. Why are there ads for TVG on TVG? Those ads need to be on channel seven to expose new people to racing. Why sit and watch some sitcom rerun when you can have action?

Even when people's disposable income was going up, things were sliding [for racing]. Personally, I can't sit at a slot machine for more than a few minutes. People love an intellectual challenge. In racing, you can go anywhere along the continuum, from "Red is my favorite color" to "The Sheet pattern is XYZ and the track bias is favoring speed."

Sitting in a crowded track is exciting, but sitting in a section with two other people is not. And racing is all about electricity.

Owner Cot Campbell, Dogwood Stables:

Since we have no central governing body, every aspect of racing will automatically adjust to any downturn in its own way, but racing will not be as affected as much as some other industries, if we are to be guided by hard times of the past. But a low tide drops all boats. I would think stud fees and outrageous vet bills, thank God, would be the first serious adjustments. There will always be racetracks and racing, but less of it. Hard times may bring more partnerships.



Owner Hal Earnhardt:

We, no doubt, have to connect with the fans and with the bettors. That is the lifeblood of all of us. We all know it's handle. We all know it's how the tracks do--giving people the best service, from concessions to the quality of horses running, etc. It's important now. Everybody's dollar is going to be leaner. There are a lot of other options in the marketplace, there are a lot of other sporting events going on. So we need marketing, service, great horses and great names. Cont. p11

We have to keep the fans we have, and we need to capture new fans. We're not going to capture them all because of the economic turn around, but I think we have to give people reasons to come to the track. The Curlins and the Big Browns of the world provide really good stories. We also need events like the Breeders' Cup. The two-day event exposes us to more of the public. And they get to react with a sports star, whether it's Curlin, Big Brown, Zenyatta, Indian Blessing--whoever it might be.

So I think it's the overall connection. It has to start at the ground up, by taking care of the fans. And trying to market as best we can in a diminishing market. At Keeneland, the very first day, I saw handle was down and attendance was down. And the weather was perfect. That just tears my heart out, because I know how great a venue that is. I've been there. I love it. It's unbelievable. And when you see the Santa Anitas and other big tracks going through some of these times, it hurts all of us. It trickles down to me as an owner, because we know what happens with purse structures, horse values, etc. So, I think if I had to connect to one thing today, it would be the fan base. As an owner, I have to have the fan base and the handle to come through to be able to race my horses and pay my trainer and do all those things. As much as we can, with the best marketing in the world, we have to connect with the people coming through the turnstiles.

How do we attract them to us when dollars are diminished? We've done some great things. Internet sites are available, TVG and HRTV, all those things are great to get more people in. The more things we can continue to do to keep our base coming is going to be the strength of us through these times.

Pinhooker/Farm Owner Becky Thomas:

I think the horse business has dual problems. The largest component is oversupply and lack of demand. There aren't enough buyers considering the size of stud books, which is a self-generated problem.

The current credit crisis has added to what we have been seeing. There's a large number of buyers who have been affected by the lack of credit and by the stock market.

You have to cut costs and eliminate the bottom-end product that has not been able to generate income. People thought they had a \$40,000 mare, but really she's a \$5,000 mare. And they need to put these mares out of production, which is what we're doing. You must be selective and be willing to cut your losses.



By far, our largest problems are within our own industry. The main problem has been greed, and we're all responsible for that. It's basically all our fault. People we're over-leveraged, just like in the mortgage industry.

Owner Satish Sanan, Padua:

I think there are many more deep-rooted problems in our industry than the current economic crisis, and we need to take multiple steps to fix it.

I think the biggest challenge we have right now is attracting new owners. We have lost many significant owners in the last 10 years. Back in 1996-1997, when I first got involved in the game, I used to go to the July, Saratoga and September Sales and see people like Bob and Beverly Lewis, Prince Ahmed Salman, B. Wayne Hughes, Mr. Young from Overbrook Farm, Coolmore partners, just to name a few (I could name 15 more people) who used to go to the sales and spend \$8, \$10, \$15 million annually as end users and race their horses. Now you go to the same sales, and it's essentially two major players--Sheikh Mohammed and Coolmore and perhaps one or two more.



We have lost some of these owners through natural attrition, but other owners because of the problems associated with the industry--be it the integrity of the sales or integrity of racing. But also, we have many owners like these turn from buyers to sellers, from racing to commercial breeding. There are owners like me, Rick Porter and Rich Santulli, who essentially breed to race. We have invested a tremendous amount of capital in the business and enjoy it. We make our money in other businesses. We need more new owners like these in our business.

Unfortunately, a number of owners like us have become commercial breeders or left the industry. As a consequence, there are very few race-loving, passionate, deep-pocketed owners left, and to make the matters worse we have not attracted anybody new in the last five, six, seven years to this wonderful and exiting game.

When you seriously look at our industry, there are only two constituents who actually put money into this business: the owners and the punters--the gamblers. There may be 10 or more other constituents in our industry, and most of these take money out of the business--from the sales companies to the consignors to horsemen to commercial breeders to the racetracks. We must change our business and revenue model if we want to fix our problems.

You need to respect these two critical groups- the owners and the horse players/punters if we are to attract new owners and new money in to this business and enjoy and grow the sport the way it used to be.

We also need to find a way to attract younger people to the game. We need to get them going to the racetracks. The perception is that our industry is not good--the media plays a big part in this negative sentiment.

We need to do a tremendous amount of marketing--adopt the NASCAR model. It's a proven model and it works.

There are too many selfish entities in the business--racetracks are run by corporate organizations that, frankly, either don't understand the business and if they do they are not passionate enough about the game. They're worried about their bottom lines and their earnings-per-share, and they forgot that the tracks exist because of owners, the fans and the gamblers. Another issue is too many horses and too many race tracks. There are 40,000 horses born each year; you need to reduce that number significantly and reduce the number of tracks running cheap claiming races--nobody goes to those tracks. We need quality verses quantity, and integrity in every aspect of our business--from sales, to racing to medication and to breeding.

The current downturn in the economy will make it harder to fix these problems. It's happened before, in the mid-1980s. But we managed to recover, as it was not a global and across-the-board crisis like this time. Every industry will suffer this time. There are a very few entities in our sport that may be immune to the global crisis--Coolmore, Sheikh Mohammed--but the rest of the industry will be impacted severely. If the industry is strong and we have a cohesive strategy, we can and will survive. But the bottom line is that the industry needs to be united to fix these problems--but sad part is that we are not.

WHOBEGOTYOU TO SKIP PLATE Brilliant Caulfield Guineas winner **Whobegotyou (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) will not be seen in the A\$3.5-million G1 Cox Plate, although Mark Kavanagh has faced a deluge of calls for the gelding to take his place in a race that looks wide open at this stage. Kavanagh, however, will not budge from his original stance that the sophomore, whose record now reads 6-4-1-0 for earnings of A\$783,950, will stick to his own age this spring. He will point to the G2 AAMI Vase over 2040-meters on the Cox Plate undercard ahead of a tilt at the A\$1.5-million Victoria Derby Nov. 1 at Flemington. "Everyone wants to jump on to the bandwagon and shove him to the top, but I want to give him a chance to be a better horse next year," Kavanagh insisted. "These horses just don't pop out of the fridge. I think we have done a good job nurturing the horse. The Derby distance [2500 meters] doesn't worry me. He's just a relaxed sort of three-year-old and has all the attributes to be a Derby horse."

Miss Plate Bound...

But if Whobegotyou will not line up in Australia's weight-for-age championship, the nation's best sophomore filly will be attempting to become only the second in history to capture the Plate. **Samantha Miss (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) is unbeaten this season after dominating the Sydney three-year-old fillies in four outings culminating with the G1 Flight S. The Kris Lees-trained filly is domiciled at trainer Ross McDonald's Caulfield base. Jockey Glen Boss aims to trim down to meet the 48-kilo minimum weight for the filly. Guineas runner-up **Time Thief (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) will head for a spell and the David Hayes-trained **Von Costa de Hero (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) is likely to be freshened for the G1 Coolmore Stud S. [Ascot Vale S.] on Derby Day.
