

In a strong renewal filled with exciting prospects and a hot favorite in Ballydoyle's Rip Van Winkle (Galileo {Ire}), Intense Focus would not have been on many handicappers' lists. Splitting Art Connoisseur (Ire) and Lord Shanakill when runner-up in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot, he was beaten a neck when third to Mastercraftsman (Ire) in the G2 Railway S. at The Curragh June 29 before finishing fifth behind subsequent G1 Prix Morny and G1 Phoenix S. winner Bushranger (Ire) in the G3 Anglesey S. back there July 12. Sixth in the Sept. 14 G1 National S. and third in the Goffs Million a fortnight later, he was third once more behind Naaqoos (GB) in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp last time Oct. 5, after which the blinkers were swopped for a visor. Breaking well from his rail draw, he chased the generous pace set by the Million winner Soul City (Ire) (Elusive City), and needed some bravery to squeeze between Finjaan and Shaweel (GB) (Dansili {GB}) with a furlong remaining. Joined in battle with the former and the strong-finishing Lord Shanakill thereafter, he dug in gamely to thrust his nose in front in the final stride. "His last two runs were very solid coming into the race," Kevin Manning said. "In the Million, he was very good, and he put in a fantastic run in France, both times on ground slower than he probably wants. This was the first time he's had quick ground since Royal Ascot, so it was by no means a surprise. Both horses had the chance to beat him, but he came back at them and, on the day, the best horse won. He's a tough individual who takes it all in his stride and is very professional, so I don't see why he won't go on next year. He's a strong type of horse and handles quick ground, but how far he is going to get is another day's work." While many have scoffed at Jim Bolger's assertion that New Approach is the "European version of Secretariat," the chestnut provided a passable impression of that great here. The chestnut accounted for all bar Henythenavigator in both the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas in May before restraint was called for as connections sought to stretch his stamina beyond a mile. Despite an overabundance of enthusiasm during the early stages of the G1 Epsom Derby, G1 Juddmonte International and G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown last time Sept. 7, it is a mark of his class that his exuberance only cost him success in the middle of those contests--and he had the excuse of returning from an injury-enforced break when third in that test. Showing no signs of keenness following a sluggish start here, he tracked rabbit Upton Grey (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) until taking command passing the half-mile marker and surging clear. Kevin Manning said, "He actually fell out of the gates, but the pacemaker did a fantastic job, and when I picked him up he went about his business like a true professional. I couldn't believe how much light he put between them when I took a peep at the furlong pole and, although he's got his quirks, he's a very good horse and it would be hard to come across another like him." 

The stable's biggest prior wins in Australia came in in the G2 Queen Elizabeth S. at Flemington, with Hatha Anna (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {Ire}) in 2001 and Fantastic Love (Peintre Celebre) in 2004.

Hussler Off for Holiday...

Seven-time Group 1 winner and Horse of the Year Weekend Hussler (Hussonet) simply failed over the distance, despite being given every opportunity by jockey Brad Rawiller. 
Zagreb Scratched...

There has been much discussion about the best way for the Thoroughbred industry to handle the current economic downturn. What steps do you think are required to weather the storm?

OWNER DELMAR PETTIGREW, KEARNEY, NEBRASKA

Your selection of persons to query were good people who answered intelligently, and all touched on different issues bearing weight on industry problems--issues, quite frankly, that existed long before this recent economic crisis came to fore. Nonetheless, all agreed somewhat on the root of the problem...getting more fans to the racetrack. Mr. Reddam was correct, more marketing is needed. We should stop "preaching to the choir," and reach out to new fans.

Cot Campbell mentioned outrageous vet bills--I can attest to that. This September past, my vet charge on the one horse I have at the track was over \$600, and she's a sound horse (she earned \$1,500 that month, less than her training cost).

Mr. Sanan is correct in that more owners are needed. We could attract more owners if the purses were large enough to assure at least breaking even with a horse at the track. This would also help stop the attrition of owners leaving the business, never to return.

My wife and I recently drove 1,800 miles round-trip to attend Keeneland races, a track where young and old alike attend, filling the stands to capacity. Why? Because they offer a great product, marketed to the public, covered generously by the media. Their races are filled with quality horses, the facility is clean and beautiful, the staff friendly and helpful. They offer 17 days of racing in the fall, and 17 days in the spring. The fans are anxious to attend because they know, "it starts, and it ends." Other racing facilities should take a look at their program, and apply the lessons to be learned there. I know such a short meet would not be economically feasable for most facilities, but maybe somewhat shorter meets could be helpful.

One final thought. Your format seems to assume that only the super-rich could possibly contribute intelligent suggestions to the industry problems, when just maybe the small guy, too, might have something to contribute.



AND IN THIS CORNER, 2-YEAR-OLD SALES

Immediately following the Keeneland April this year, Jay Kilgore and I, who are partners in a company that offers selection services at the two-year-old sales, decided to take a look at the rationale, market and schedule for these venues. We sensed something was in the air, and no one was really addressing some issues that needed to be discussed.

We outlined our thoughts in a letter to *TDN* which was designed to spur discussion, but not necessarily to make recommendations. The letter was never published because, quite frankly, so much more was on the plate of the industry at that time, ranging from the Triple Crown to the subsequent events and controversies involving Eight Belles, Big Brown, steroids, and then the yearling sales season began.

Ironically, we're glad the letter never made it into print because in the interim not only has *TDN* issued an invitation to me to become an Op-Ed contributor, but also with the two-year-old season right around the corner (yes, it is, the first sales close in mid-October), the points we wanted to make in the spring seem to us to be more salient to set forth in the fall. Indeed, timing is everything.

The Background

Despite what might be charitably called a positive spin about the relative acceptance, let alone success, of some of the 2008 two-year-old sales, this segment of the Thoroughbred market is in the throes of one of the great watershed years in the history of the industry, and this happened before the 2008 yearling market tanked.

This watershed is not limited to this industry, of course--2008 is already proving to be one of the potentially historic breakthrough (or, some cynics would say, breakdown) years in recent history in a wide variety of industries. Many of those who invest in Thoroughbreds make their livings in those industries, so we aren't telling tales out of school here.

What is affecting the Thoroughbred two-year-old market is intimately tied to the economic, cultural and even political upheavals that are affecting all segments of the world's societies. It's crystallized in the United States where major problems are often given 15 minutes of talking-head television time and deeper analysis only on op-ed pages or, if you're lucky, magazines. **Op-Ed cont. p12**

Those factors include:

a) The extraordinarily high cost of doing business these days in industries where transportation and food supply are critical.

b) A stratification of the economic system that has driven the divisions deeper between high-end consumers and the middle market.

c) The turmoil in the financial and credit markets.d) The necessity to improve safety conditions for

man and beast alike.

e) The increased stress on families and communities where 24/7 workdays are commonplace.

These, and other factors such as the usual shortsightedness and greed, have combined to create the beginnings of a dialogue in the two-year-old sales market that is bubbling beneath the surface. It needs to be brought out into the open and put on the table for discussion so that market leaders can assess, and address, trends and concerns that threaten to open wide fissures next year.

The purpose of this treatise is to begin that dialogue, not because we want to lead it or even be part of it-we are more like catalysts, and everyone knows that catalysts sink to the bottom of the test tube. However, it is necessary for those who are leaders in the marketplaceconsignors, sales companies, buyers and their agents, and veterinarians--to start to plan and coordinate a little better for the benefit of all, beginning with the horse and ending with the consumer.

Here are what we consider to be the major factors that are reshaping the way the two-year-old marketplace is going to be positioned in the very near future, and questions that need to be asked (and answers found) to deal with them.

Breeze Show Surface vs. Racing Surface

The decision by Ocala Breeders' Sales Company (OBS) to install a synthetic racetrack this year for its four sales sent shockwaves through all segments of the industry for several reasons. Although only anecdotal evidence has surfaced, it seems that horses came out of their breezes with fewer aches and pains and injuries than on dirt tracks, which was one of the effects some consignors and buyers noticed last year when Keeneland switched over to its synthetic surface.

Secondly, not only have the breeze times been faster across the board on synthetic tracks, but also it is apparent from the internal figures that DataTrack compiles that many horses are able to stretch out more efficiently on synthetic surfaces-average stride lengths in our system have risen across the board at OBS and Keeneland.

This brings up a parallel factor-of the seven major sales, four are now on synthetic surfaces (OBSFEB, OBSMAR, OPSAPR, KEEAPR) and three on completely different dirt surfaces (FTFFEB, BARMAR, EASMAY). The latter are not likely to go over to synthetic soon and that means the market must make a judgment as to whether breeze show surface matters in regions where the racing is mostly on synthetic--and vice-versa. One of the most ironic upshots of the 2008 season is that not a single horse breezed on the turf at these sales. **Op-Ed cont. p13**

One Breeze Show vs. Two

The move to one breeze show at FTFFEB and KEEAPR, and the abbreviated second breeze show at OBSMAR because of threatening weather, has brought into question the viability of two breeze shows at OBSFEB, OBSMAR and BARMAR. Indeed, there was immediate jabber at the OBSMAR sale this year that it might not be a bad idea to restructure the sale, which was an astounding success despite a lack of horses that breezed back, in this manner.

The argument for reducing OBSFEB to one breeze show is stronger--very few horses come back at a quarter mile in the second show, and rarely, if ever, do horses do better on average at the second breeze show than at the first. Two breeze shows tend to increase the chances for injury, of course, but the system also exposes consignors and buyers to one of the major problems in the market that is perhaps stronger than all the others.

Reducing Costs and the Stress

One key to creating a more efficient two-year-old market is to recognize the horrendous scheduling problem that exists over the confluence of the timing of FTFFEB, BARMAR and OBSMAR which was crystallized once again this year, mostly due to the fact that BARMAR and OBSMAR had overlapping breeze shows. (In the past, this has also happened with FTFFEB and BARMAR). In our opinion, it must be addressed because soon one of these sales will probably suffer.

Just look at the tentative schedule for the 2009 FTFFEB, BARMAR and OBSMAR sales. Fasig-Tipton is looking to hold its only breeze show on Feb. 27 (Friday), and Barretts want to hold its first breeze show on Mar. 2 (Sunday)--a day before Fasig-Tipton begins selling. Oh, it gets better. While not set in stone, the first OBSMAR breeze will probably be either on Friday/Saturday (Mar. 6-7) or Saturday/Sunday (Mar. 7-8). Barretts has its second breeze show listed for that Sunday.

The exercise riders, the consignors and quite a few buyers and agents will have to miss part of the breezes in Miami, Los Angeles and Ocala just to make airline schedules in an era of flight cutbacks and at a time of the year when flight paths often head into bad weather over the Midwest. Barretts' auction begins on Tuesday, which gives everyone just a couple of days to go back to Ocala for the second OBSMAR breeze show.

One way to start sorting this out is for OBS to consider eliminating its first breeze show and just have one on the weekend before the sale. Can any person (or company) do a reasonably complete job at all three sales for clients in these conditions? Those who will suffer the most, in the end, will be consignors and the sales companies.

Consignors, buyers, agents, advisors and stable personnel who are forced to make increasingly difficult travel connections and deal with rising travel costs in the short period of time linking these three sales is not something to be met with the "business as usual" dismissal. It is a conflict that affects efficiency as well as well-being of the individuals involved, to say nothing of the stress on family life.

These sales, which are immediately followed by Keeneland's, wreak havoc with families trying to plan for spring breaks, Easter holidays, and various other events that take place at this time of the year. To us, that is the bottom line in this business--an industry that is constantly trying to replenish itself with younger talent cannot afford to overlook the socio-economic strains of its way of doing business just for the sake of conducting business as usual. ECLIPSE WINNER TAKES GRAND NATIONAL Reigning champion steeplechaser Good Night Shirt (Concern) made it five straight victories with a resounding four-length score in the Grand National Steeplechase at Far Hills, New Jersey, yesterday. Three-forfive during his Eclipse season, the seven-year-old capped the campaign with a win in the Colonial Cup in South Carolina last November. The chestnut was a perfect three-for-three to kick off 2008, taking the Apr. 12 Georgia Cup Hurdle S., May 10 Iroquois Hurdle S. and Sept. 21 Lonesome Glory Hurdle S., where he set a course record of 4:24.88 for 20 furlongs at Belmont Park. Content to sit second during the early going yesterday, Good Night Shirt drove to the front at the next-to-last fence and pulled clear under jockey Willie Dowling. "He's a machine and he's getting better," said Dowling. "He's unbelievable, just one of those horses that can do it." Owned by Sonny Via and trained by Jack Fisher, the gelding established a singleseason steeplechase earnings record of \$395,520 yesterday.

HAWLEY GOES GATE TO WIRE VS LEGENDS

Sandy Hawley sent Tribal Chief (Tribal Rule) right to the front and never looked back to win the Living Legends race at Oak Tree yesterday. The "Sandman" lulled his competitors to sleep after getting his mount off to a sharp start from post 2. Three horses lined up at the top of the stretch to challenge, but Tribal Chief switched leads and found more, drawing off to a 6 1/2length triumph. Dee Dee's Legacy and Jerry Bailey outgamed Scandalous and Gary Stevens for second, with Pat Day and Swift Demand another head back in fourth. "I was a little nervous going into the starting gate, because I haven't been out of a gate in 10 years. That was the part that I was worried about, so I grabbed a big handful of mane," the 59-year-old Hawley admitted. "All I had done really was breeze a couple of horses five-eighths--I was only ready to go three-guarters, and it was a seven-furlong race. But it was a great experience." A native of Ontario, Hawley captured the Eclipse Award in 1976 and won the Queen's Plate four times. During 31 years in the saddle, he won 6,449 races and captured 18 riding titles at Woodbine. He had not ridden since July 1, 1998, and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1992. The Livings Legend race, an entry-level allowance for Cal-breds, featured eight Hall of Fame riders. Bailey, who claimed to be riding his first horse since he retired in 2006, remarked, "I prepared perfectly. My legs, my air and my arms all went out at the same time. 
