COMMUNIQUE OUT OF F/M TURF

G.W. Watts Humphrey Jr.'s **Communique** (Smart Strike) will not run in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf after developing an abscess in her right front foot. "She

worked good Saturday morning," said trainer Rusty Arnold. "But she had a pulse in the foot this morning. We had the blacksmith pull the shoe and [that] revealed the abscess. It's not serious, but the timing is obviously bad. The plan is to race her next year." The homebred captured the GIII Be-

witch S. and GIII Modesty H. before a runner-up effort in the GI Beverly D. S. in August. In her most recent outing, the bay finished third in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational Sept. 27 at Belmont.

No Juvenile for Believe in Hope...

Jay Em Ess Stable's Believe in Hope (Thunder Gulch) won't participate in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile after coming down with a fever. The chestnut was coming out of a close third in the GI Norfolk S. Sept. 28 at Oak Tree. "He spiked a fever of 104 [Sunday]," explained trainer Ron Ellis. "The blood came back and that's not quite right, either. We've started to treat him with penicillin and he's out of the race. It'll be six weeks or so before I can think about having him right." Ellis added, "I think this is something that's been coming on. It's hard when things like this happen, but that last work of his [1:15 3/5 for six furlongs Oct. 14 at Santa Anita] was one I wasn't too happy with, and I think he was starting to tell us something. It wouldn't have worked out if we'd run him. So you've just got to step back and hope for the best in the future. Things like this are hard, but you've got to take care of your horses." WORKING LIKE A CHAMPS

Juddmonte's **Champs Elysees (GB)** (Danehill), a Grade I winner on turf, tuned up for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic on Pro-Ride with a five-eighths breeze in :59 3/5 yesterday at Santa Anita. Equipped with blink-

ers, the regally bred bay worked in company with multiple Grade I-winning stablemate Country Star (Empire Maker), who was timed in 1:00. "I put the blinkers on him for this and he'll run in them Saturday," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "I like the way he responded to them here, and I think they can move him up. He's not

usually a good work horse; he's usually lazy in the mornings. But he likes this track, and he could run good." In his only other non-turf start, the homebred finished third in the GI Santa Anita H. back in March on Cushion Track. A victory Saturday would give his dam Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}) an unprecedented three Breeders' Cup winners; she previously produced F/M Turf heroines Banks Hall (GB) and Intercontinental (GB)--both by Danehill--in the 2001 and 2005 renewals, respectively.

Runner-up in the GI Santa Anita H. in March, the five-year-old hasn't faced the starter since topping Well Armed (Tiznow) by a neck in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24. Mott's Breeders' Cup contenders are slated to arrive in the Los Angeles area today. "[F/M Turf hopeful] Dynaforce is leaving New York early on Tuesday morning," said Mott. "Then, that

plane will pick up my other horses in Kentucky and they will all head to California. Once they get there, it won't be anything fancy. It's going to be gallop, school and race for all of them."

Pyro Looking to Fire in Classic...

Winchell Thoroughbreds' **Pyro** (Pulpit) was crossentered in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and the Classic,

"With how fast the racetrack has been playing, for him going a mile, they [the pacesetters] would have to back up considerably," explained trainer Steve Asmussen. Julien Leparoux will have the mount aboard the three-year-old. Runner-up in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Pyro was

timed in :51 1/5 for a half-mile breeze yesterday.

J Be K out of Sprint...

J Be K (Silver Deputy) is out of Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and will be shelved until the start of his four-year-old season, according to Zayat Stables' racing manager Sobhy Sonbol. "We plan to freshen him up and plan for a strong 2009 campaign," Sonbol said. Trainer Steve Asmussen felt that J Be K had not rebounded sufficiently from a fifth-place finish last out in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 27, so the decision was made to skip the Breeders' Cup. "You don't always get a horse like that, and when you do, you try to do right by them," Sonbol added. "He deserves to be a Grade I winner."

The withdrawal of Believe in Hope (Thunder Gulch) from Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile will allow Emerald Downs shipper Gallant Son (Malabar Gold) to

draw into the \$2-million affair. "I was informed there was a scratch in there, so we'll get in for sure," said trainer Frank Lucarelli, who had cross-entered his charge in the Juvenile Turf. "That's where we were hoping to go." He added, "It's unfortunate for them, but it's good for

us." The dark bay colt is riding a four-race winning streak, including a six-length success last out in the Gottstein Futurity Sept. 27.

No Bluff: Southern Equine Going for Juvenile

Souther Equine's timely acquisition Elusive Bluff (Elusive Quality) will opt for the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile instead of the \$1-million Juvenile Turf. The

bay is perfect in two starts on the sod, breaking his maiden first out for Pegasus Dream Stable and trainer Bill Badgett Jr. Sept. 5 before taking the GIII Pilgrim S. Oct. 1 at Belmont. Southern Equine purchased the colt after

his debut for a reported \$600,000. New trainer Eric Guillot confirmed the decision to try the Pro-Ride event. "There are a lot of reasons," explalined Guillot. "[The Juvenile] is more prestigious, it's graded, it's further and our colt is by a dirt sire. We've got a come-frombehind horse. The mile is a tougher trip. The distance was the key. If the grass race was nine furlongs, then we'd run there." Guillot watched his new charge breeze five panels in 1:02.20 at Hollywood yesterday with jockey Michael Baze in the irons. "I asked him [Baze] to go 1:02, so it was perfect," said the affable conditioner. "We like the way he goes on it [synthetic track]."

Quarter Crack Could KO Mast Track



Going for an unprecedented fifth straight start in the Turf, he is scheduled to ship to California today. "We're really not just going there so that he can run in his fifth Breeders' Cup Turf," trainer Graham Motion insisted. "We feel that he belongs in the race and feel that he has a good chance to win." Fourth in last year's edition of the race, the dark bay is winless since taking the 2007 GI Manhattan H. Runner-up in the Aug. 16 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga, he comes off a seventh in the Sept. 7 GI Northern Dancer S. at Woodbine.

Salute the Count May Not Make Turf Sprint

Turf Sprint hopeful Salute the Count (Count the Time) may not fly out to Santa Anita due to a hind-leg issue. The eight-year-old gelding missed a scheduled breeze yesterday at Aqueduct. "He had filling in a hind leg," said trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. "I don't know if he's going to make the race at this point. If he's better in the morning, we'll put him on the plane, but right now I'm not sure if he's gonna make it."



A Bold Move

Bold Chieftain (Chief Seattle) will have his final drill for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Mile this morning at Golden Gate. "That'll tell the story," said trainer Bill Morey Jr. "[Jockey] Russell Baze will be up, and we'll see how he goes. If everything goes well and he comes out of it OK, we've got a 4 a.m. ship on Wednesday." Winner of the California Dreamin' H. at Del Mar Aug. 2, the five-year-old ran second to Whatsthescript (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}) in the GII Del Mar Mile H. Aug. 24, and comes into the Breeders' Cup off another runner-up effort in the Cal Cup Mile Oct. 5. "Oh, this is a big step up," Morey continued. "We understand that. But the owners want to give it a try, and I'm not in the business of spoiling their dreams. This horse brings his game every time--you've got to like him for that. And if he runs to the race he put in at Del Mar, you'll hear from him. I'm not saying we're going to win it, but we'll be heard from."

California Flag Ready to Fly in Turf Sprint

In 2006, the California-bred Cambiocorsa was nearly

unstoppable on the downhill turf course at Santa Anita. Her full brother California Flag (Avenue of Flags) followed in her hoofprints with a 22-1 success in the GIII Morvich H. Sept. 24, and will take his chances in the \$1-million Turf Sprint for 81-year-old owner/breeder Keith Card. "This is a chance of a lifetime for that man," said trainer Brian Koriner. The horse ran a terrific race down the hill and set a course record. They're running back down the hill again Saturday. It was a 'Win-and-You're-In' race, so when they asked us if we wanted

to run, the answer was: 'Why not?'" The grey Cal-bred blew out three furlongs in :34.80 yesterday at Santa Anita.

First Defence Feeling Good

A son of 2000 Sprint runner-up Honest Lady (Seattle Slew), Sprint entrant First Defence (Unbridled's Song) walked the shedrow yesterday after flying through five furlongs in :57 4/5 Sunday morning. "I didn't want him to go that fast," admitted trainer Bobby Frankel. "I told him [rider Goncalino Almeida] to work him in a minute. But what are you going to do? I'll tell you, though, I've been watching these sprints for a long time, and it seems to me that the horses that work fast win them. I remember when I ran Squirtle Squirt (Marquetry) in New York [2001] and won. He worked: 45 coming up to that race." First Defence secured his future at stud with a dominant score in the GI Forego S. at Saratoga this summer, but faded last out in a sloppy renewal of the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 27. "I've got to think the sloppy track did him in in that last one," Frankel offered. "That won't be an issue here."

Pro Or Con?

GI Frizette S. winner **Sky Diva** (Sky Mesa) will be making her first start on the synthetic when she tries

out Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface in the Oct. 24 GI Breeder' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and that has trainer Steve Klesaris a bit worried. "That's my only concern," Klesaris admitted. "She's trained well over whatever we've put her on, including the Tapeta. The synthetics are deceiving. There are very few horses who won't train good

over it, but running on it in a competitive situation in the afternoon is a different story. Mani Bhavan is a perfect example of that." But the conditioner is confident that the undefeated miss belongs in the Breeders' Cup. "She's the typical two-turn filly," Klesaris said. "She's tall and long-legged with an upright body. She has the tactical ability of a sprinter, but she'll run as far as they write races. That's a great weapon."

Considering that Giant's Causeway's first 10 graded-stakes winners of 2008 comprised a quintet of five-year-olds, a quartet of four-year-olds and a solo three-year-old, it looked safe to say that his progeny generally improve with age. But then Britain's premier juvenile race, the Darley Dewhurst S., fell to a son of Giant's Causeway for the second time in the five years he's had runners, this time going to the 20-1 Intense Focus. Racing for the ninth time, the progressive Intense Focus lived up to his name in managing to keep his nose fractionally ahead of those of two other well-seasoned performers, Lord Shanakill and Finjaan, in a thrilling three-way finish.

When a championship race like the Dewhurst sees the first seven colts separated by only two lengths, the immediate response has to be that none of them is outstanding. The bookmakers generally have Intense Focus on offer at 16-1 or 20-1 for next year's 2000 Guineas, so they clearly don't hold him in the same regard as Jim Bolger's last two Dewhurst winners, Teofilo and New Approach. But it would be hasty to dismiss Intense Focus as a possible future Classic winner, especially if he gets the fast ground he seems to favor. Shamardal, the Giant's Causeway colt who won the 2004 Dewhurst in great style, went on to complete a Classic double in France. Then Sir Percy, who had only a neck to spare in the 2005 Dewhurst, went on to win the Derby, and so did New Approach, the halflength winner in 2007, who was so impressive in his swan song in Saturday's G1 Emirates Airline Champion

Intense Focus is the fifth Northern Hemisphere Group 1/Grade I winner of 2008 for Giant's Causeway, and his 11th in all. Giant's Causeway's 2008 five-timer puts him level with New Approach's sire Galileo, and the Ashford resident also has Group 1 winners in Australia and South Africa.

I've heard a few people say that they don't quite know what to make of Giant's Causeway's record as a stallion. I think the confusion stems partly from the tendency for data services to include his Southern Hemisphere progeny in his totals. For example, *The Blood-Horse* credits him with having 868 foals in his five crops of racing age, when his Northern Hemisphere total of named foals appears to be nearer to 662.

While we can't ignore the foals sired by Giant's Causeway during the three seasons he spent in Australia, from 2002 to 2004, experience has taught us that shuttle stallions often fail to replicate one hemisphere's success when switched to another. Perhaps they are less well suited by the bloodlines available to them or perhaps the ground conditions and training methods are less to their progeny's liking.

Whatever the explanation, Giant's Causeway has so far failed to live up to expectations in Australia, where he started out at A\$137,500. He has three Australian group winners from his first two Southern-Hemisphere crops, his third and largest Australian crop having recently started its sophomore season.

It has been a similar story so far with Galileo. He has two group winners, including the recent Group 1 winner Sousa, a newly turned three-year-old from his third crop. As he still has two large Australian crops to come, Galileo may yet restore his reputation down under.

It is probably wiser to separate the two hemispheres when trying to assess a stallion's merit. Giant's Causeway's 26 Northern Hemisphere graded/group winners equate to nearly 4 percent of his 662 named foals. Even this figure may be a little misleading, as 151 of his 662 foals (nearly 23 percent) are two-year-olds of 2008. More than 90 of them have yet to race and, judging by his high proportion of older graded winners, this crop can be expected to produce several more graded winners. It also contains Dreamtheimpossible, a Group 1-placed listed winner.

To get back to Intense Focus himself, the bottom half of his pedigree also supports the view that he could improve further from two to three. His dam Daneleta is by Danehill out of a Kahyasi mare, which means that she is bred to the same pattern as those distinguished performers Dansili, Banks Hill, Intercontinental, Cacique, Champs Elysees and Promising Lead, produced by the sisters Hasili and Arrive. Incidentally, both these mares will be bidding to add to their family's Breeders' Cup gains when Champs Elysees and Visit compete at Santa Anita later this week. Only Intercontinental earned black type at two.

Daneleta was bred by Jim Bolger, who trained her to win over seven furlongs at two in his wife's colors. The Danehill filly also showed a lot of potential when third to Rock of Gibraltar and Hawk Wing in the G3 Railway S. on what proved to be her last appearance for Bolger. Unfortunately, she failed to add significantly to her reputation when switched firstly to France, where she raced at up to a mile, and then the USA. Perhaps she would have been suited by a mile and a quarter or more, as her younger sister Danelissima was a Group 3 winner over a mile and a half for Bolger, before being sold for 470,000qns.

Danelissima has a two-year-old Sadler's Wells colt and a yearling filly by Montjeu. The Montjeu filly failed to find a buyer at Tattersalls earlier this month, and Daneleta's yearling colt by Mr. Greeley was led out unsold at \$675,000 in September.

Perhaps these are two occasions where the vendor is now happy they failed to sell.

The chances are that Intense Focus will stay a mile and a quarter next year, as Giant's Causeway shone at around that trip and so did three of his 2008 Grade I winners--Heatseeker, Frost Giant and Red Giant. His other Grade I winner, the mare Carriage Trial, shone when returned to a mile and an eighth in the Spinster S., and his 2008 graded winners also include Niagara Causeway, who scored over a mile and a half.

The majority of Giant's Causeway's good winners, therefore, seem to need a route, but they are more versatile when it comes to track surface. This year's five Grade I winners have scored on dirt, two types of synthetic and turf.

Intense Focus's third dam, La Meilleure, is also the second dam of Soldier of Fortune, winner of the 2007 Irish Derby, and she's the dam of Sholokhov, runner-up in the 2002 Irish Derby. A listed winner over a mile, La Meilleure showed plenty of versatility on the track and she also proved versatile as a broodmare, producing stakes winners to four different stallions. One of them was Intense Focus's second dam Zavaleta, a tough performer at up to a mile and a quarter who scored three times as a juvenile, despite being by the Derby winner Kahyasi.

There is clearly an attractive mix of speed and stamina in this tough family, which once produced the champion sprinter Double Form.

RED SPIDER ADDED TO TROPHY LIST Princess Hava of Jordan's Red Spider (GB) (Red Ransom) has been supplemented for the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster on Saturday. Impressive on debut with a 3 1/4-length success on Kempton's Polytrack Sept. 22, the John Gosden-trained colt will face a maximum of 22 rivals for the £200,000 one-mile contest. The trainer's Racing Secretary Peter Shoemark told PA Sport, "Hopefully he has improved since his first run, and while it probably wasn't the greatest maiden in the world, he won it like a nice horse. He is a horse who has always shown us a good deal of ability and we were very pleased with that first run. Obviously this is a massive jump up in class, but we just felt there was nothing else for him this year and thought it was worth having a look." Ballydoyle still have seven entries engaged. Saturday's G1 Dewhurst S. seventh Rip van Winkle (Ire) was a notable scratching at the five-day stage, but Aidan O'Brien can still call upon 2 "TDN Wells), who was third in the G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh last time Sept. 28; and Malibu Bay (El Prado {Ire}), successful on debut in a Navan maiden last time Oct. 8. John Oxx is set to run His Highness the Aga Khan's Beresford runner-up Mourayan (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}), while Mark Johnston may let Alan Spence's 3 "TDN Rising Star" 🕹 Jukebox Jury (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) attempt to supplement his win in the Sept. 27 G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot. Once again, Fred Pope intelligently outlines a plan to revitalize the Thoroughbred industry.

The current efforts of the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance are to be commended, as they are urgently needed. The selection of Tommy Thompson as the individual to provide oversight is also commendable.

However, we as owners and breeders are still incapable of tackling the big issues Fred Pope alludes to, the economic imbalance of the Thoroughbred industry.

Obtaining control of satellite betting rights and returning those rights to the racetracks and owners and breeders, who inadvertently gave their intellectual property rights away years ago because they didn't understand or couldn't imagine what the word "cannibalization" implied, is the number one cause of a stagnant purse structure and less profitability for racetracks. The result is that the profits from satellite wagering ended up in the hands of the receiver of the signal, not the sender where horse racing occurred: A totally inadequate result for owners and breeders.

The future of Thoroughbred racing cries for a major league, a national racing schedule for championship racing, a commissioner given the authority to lead, and national standards of integrity which the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance is addressing.

As Fred Pope suggests, the racing fans deserve honesty, integrity and treatment commensurate with their support of racing through parimutuel wagering.

The present system does not allow racetracks to be profitable, which prevents them from raising purses to levels needed to support owners' and breeders' investments. They also cannot improve facilities, and they cannot afford to make the racing experience what racing fans deserve and seek.

How do you fix the problem? Not easily done, but as Fred Pope suggests, it's possible. The government does not want to run racing or manage our industry, but they could help us by setting national racing standards for a major league, which all states would have to comply with or just not be involved in major league racing. The government could also allow owners and breeders to rewrite just one section of the IHA of 1987, which would give racetracks and owners and breeders control of the satellite signal, and the ability to price that signal for the benefit of both the sender, racetracks who present the races, and the owners and breeders who supply the product, the horse!

All that is missing is leadership determined to make an effort to keep the ship from sinking. If you don't try, you can't expect success.

I applaud the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance efforts as the first major step to improving our great sport. I am hopeful an equal effort can be made to improve the economic problems that face our industry. We have a broken economic model, it needs to be adjusted!

You did some moonlighting during your riding career. Can you tell us about that? The LA Kings have a good, young team. They may not be Stanley Cup contenders yet, but they should be real good in a few years.

Favorite food or meal? Swordfish. I became a vegetarian, but it's still swordfish on the barbecue.

Proudest moment? When my two sons were born. I had been married before and this is my third wife, and it looks like the third time has been the charm.

Drink of choice? There's a beer in Canada called Steam Whistle, but it's not available everywhere. When I'm in the U.S., I like Stella.

MANGURIAN OF MOCKINGBIRD DIES AT 82

Harry T. Mangurian Jr., owner of Mockingbird Farm in Ocala, died Sunday in Fort Lauderdale. He was 82. Born

in Rochester, New York,
Mangurian served in the
Navy in World War II. His
business career involved retailing, construction and development, and real estate,
and he owned the Boston
Celtics during their 1981
championship season.
Mangurian's interest in racing started in 1966, and at
the peak of his involvement,
he had more than 800
horses, including an extensive broodmare band at his

1,100-acre Mockingbird Farm. His best racehorses were champion Desert Vixen, who was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1979, and Canadian champion and GI Met Mile H. winner Exciting Story. From 1998 through September 2001, Mangurian led all North American breeders in purses and races won, and set a record with 88 individual stakes winners. He himself earned an Eclipse Award for Special Merit in 2001. Mockingbird freshman sires Diablo (Devil's Bag), End Sweep (Forty Niner), Rizzi (Afleet), Storm Creek (Storm Cat) and Valid Expectations (Valid Appeal) each led the country in either money earned or races won. Mangurian is survived by his wife Dorothy and daughters Terry Skuse and Tracy Jenkins. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to the Michael and Diane Bienes Cancer Center, Holy Cross Hospital. There will be a memorial from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. at Coral Ridge Country Club in Fort Lauderdale Oct. 22.

SAM HOUSTON MEET CANCELED Sam Houston Race Park, which had been scheduled to run a Thoroughbred meeting from Nov. 28, 2008 through Apr. 4, 2009, announced yesterday it will be forced to call off the entire season due to damage sustained during Hurricane Ike. The grandstand, barn area and tote board were all affected by the high winds and heavy rain brought by the Sept. 12 storm. "We have worked hard to find a solution and meet the deadlines in order to race this year," said Andrea Young, chief operating officer of Sam Houston Race Park. "However, with the timeline for construction, it wasn't a realistic option." The track will be open for simulcasting during the repair effort, and it is expected to be back in operation for the Quarter Horse meet, which starts next May 1.

FIGURES FALL AS GRAND SLAM FILLY TOPS F-T FALL OPENER A filly by Grand Slam topped yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale in Lexington. The yearling (hip 197), consigned by Gainesway, agent, was purchased for \$115,000 by Sunrise Stable South. The session topper is out of Pout (Deputy Minister), a daughter of MGSP Bedroom Blues (Cure the Blues) and a half to the dam of GISP Past the Point (Indian Charlie). The yearling, bred by Paragon Farms, sold for \$140,000 at last year's Keeneland November auction, but failed to meet her reserve at \$145,000 at Keeneland September. Also bringing six figures at yesterday's first session of the three-day auction was hip 37, a son of the late Forest Wildcat. Consigned by Baccari Bloodstock, agent, the chestnut sold for \$100,000 to P Miller, as agent for Darkside. Bred by Fred Hertrich III, he was a \$53,000 KEENOV weanling purchase for Reata Thoroughbred Farms. A total of 364 yearlings were catalogued for yesterday's session, with 292, or 80 percent, going through the ring. Of those offered, 110 (37.7 percent), were reported not sold and 127 (70 percent) of those sold brought final bids of \$10,000 or less. The first-day average fell 33 percent from the two-day venue a year ago to \$11,940, while the median dropped 50 percent to \$5,000. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

TRADE HOLDS UP AT DEAUVILLE Bucking recent trends, the opening session of Argana's October Yearling Sale in Deauville yesterdaysaw the median reach €24,000, actually eclipsing last year's total. Despite the almost inevitable drop in average, the fall of nearly 13 percent read respectably in the current climate, and there was a six-figure yearling for the management team to celebrate. That came with the last lot through the ring, Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard's Green Tune filly, who sold to the Broadhurst Agency for €100,000. Laurent Benoit's operation came out on top for the halfsister to this year's listed scorer Turning for Home (Fr) (Spinning World), whose immediate family includes the classy Ballydoyle sprinters Devil Moon (Ire), South Dakota (Ire) and Abraham Lincoln (Ire). Marc-Antoine Berghgracht's MAB Agency secured the day's toppriced colt when paying €80,000 for hip 105, a January-foaled son of Titus Livius (Fr) consigned by Haras de la Louviere. He is from the extended family of this year's G3 Prix d'Hedouville scorer and G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly third Not Just Swing (Ire), and the G1 Falmouth S. heroine Nahoodh (Ire). "He is a very good-looking colt who also looks very precocious and has been raised by one of the best stud farms in France," Berghgracht commented, adding, "The market is very selective, and so you have to pay the money for something that is good. It seems a little bit below last year and some of the yearlings are not up to standard, so when you see something you like, you have to go for it." Robert Collet was earlier on hand to pay €77,000 for hip 50, a son of Danehill Dancer (Ire). Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, he is a half to a pair of classy performers in the 1999 G3 Prix de Guiche runner-up Fils de Viane (Fr) (Kadounor (Fr)) and Alix Road (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}). The latter, who is still racing for the Miriam Bollack-Badel stable, has been in the first three in four group contests and was runner-up in last month's Listed Prix des Tourelles. Bansha House maestro Con Marnane later snapped up one of the sale highlights in the full brother to Doctor Dino (Fr) (Muhtathir {GB}) from the draft of Haras du Logis St Germain. Hip 64 may prove a bargain at €70,000, if he has a share of the talent of his dual Group 1-winning sibling. Dubawi (Ire) has been in demand so far in 2008, and a member of his first crop proved no exception yesterday when selling to FBA for €67,000. Hip 46 is a son of the stakes-placed Lia (Ire) (Desert King {Ire}), who shares her page with the Classic winners Lawman (Fr) and Latice (Ire). Selling continues today, with a pre-racing session taking place at 10 a.m. and an evening session starting at 4 p.m. Full results can be viewed on www.arqana.com.

Curlin Kin Could Return Big Dividends...

When David and Moira Reynolds were at the 2006 Argana December Breeding Stock Sale, they couldn't help but notice a nine-year-old daughter of Chimes Band. The dark bay, out of the Bates Motel mare Barbarika, was winless in four starts during her racing career and had a modest produce record. But there was something about **Texarika** that convinced the Reynolds to buy the mare for €22,000. "My husband just liked her," Moira Reynolds explained. A month and a half later, a three-year-old colt out of a half-sister to Texarika was a 12 3/4-length debut winner on the GI Donn H. undercard at Gulfstream Park. His name was Curlin. "When we bought Texarika, Curlin hadn't done anything yet," Reynolds said of their good fortune. Texarika's first foal bred by David and Moira Reynolds, a filly named Texa's Honor (Highest Honor), will sell as Lot 275 today at Argana's October Yearling Sale in Deauville. It will be the first time their Normandy-based breeding operation Elevage de la Galerie has offered a horse at auction. "This particular yearling is very nice," Reynolds said. "She's a large filly. She was born in mid-May, so she was never going to the August sale." Reynolds had "always ridden," and eventually bought an ex-racehorse named Galbas Park for dressage. The next step was to make the foray into Thoroughbred breeding. "I adore the breeding side," she said. "There's nothing quite as satisfying as a newborn." The natives of Scotland have also lived in England, South Africa and Colorado before deciding to settle in France. But after living in so many countries, why France? "Easy answer: property prices," said David Reynolds. "And the fact that our investigations revealed that in France, we could create a 'branded, added-value, hands-on' reputation for excellence more cost-effectively. Remember, Moira does everything herself, from the first feed of four at seven in the morning to the last at nine in the evening. You might say 24/7/52." While Moira takes care of the horses, David works for Balton CP, splitting his time between his London office and field work in Africa. Commuting to London requires a seven-hour train ride, so David lives in a small apartment in London and returns to Normandy only on weekends. Balton CP, in David's words, supports "the development of sustainable business" in Africa, focusing on agriculture, power and water, information communication technology and public health. David, who plans to "fill a book or two with stories from Africa," said working on that continent requires a "huge sense of patience," citing a lack of capital investment and infrastructure. Breeding and developing Thoroughbreds requires the same trait, and transferring that patience into preparing Thoroughbreds for auction "produces well-balanced, calm yearling colts and fillies, still with plenty of attitude." -JF.
