Mast Track A Go For Dirt Mile...

Trainer Bobby Frankel called an audible yesterday and entered GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner **Mast Track** (Mizzen Mast) in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, rather

than the 10-panel GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "The four-year-old, who faded to eighth in the nine-furlong GI Goodwood S. at Oak Tree Sept. 27, came up with a quarter crack Monday. "The quarter crack is in his right front, on the outside," Frankel said yesterday. "It's a small one--you could even say it's tiny. My blacksmith wanted to

put a patch on it, but I told him I didn't think it was that bad. I think it's going to bust out through his coronet band. By the time we get to the race, I think we'll have it all cleaned up. I'm going to train him like he doesn't have one and bring him up to the race right." As for the decision to target the Dirt Mile, the Hall of Famer added, "It's a better spot for him; he fits better there. And the entry money is a whole lot less. The money is a factor, absolutely." The entry fees for Mast Track, who is owned and bred by his conditioner, are \$25,000 for the Dirt Mile, versus \$125,000 for the Classic.

Defending champ Kip Deville flew to California yesterday, and trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. is confident the grey will make it two in a row in the Mile. "The hardest part of my job with Kip at this point is figuring out how much money I'm going to bet on him to win," Dutrow said. "I'm counting my money right now." The five-yearold bids to become the fourth double Mile winner, following Miesque (1987-88), Lure (1992-93) and Da Hoss (1996, 1998). The Oklahoma-bred comes off a lackluster fifth in the Sept. 7 GI Woodbine Mile. "We went over him a bunch of times after the Woodbine race and couldn't find anything wrong with him," Dutrow said. "The only thing I can say is I guess he didn't like the turf course." GII Del Mar Mile H. and Cal Cup Mile runner-up Bold Chieftain worked a half in :48 1/5 on the Tapeta at Golden Gate yesterday. "Russell [Baze, aboard for the move] told me he felt like a million bucks. We're a go," said trainer Bill Morey Jr. The five-year-old Cal-bred will van to Santa Anita this morning. "My van guy gets down there pretty good," Morey noted. "They stop for water along the way, but he'll be there in seven or eight hours."

A Head for the Game...

CHAMPIO

Few people can boast having trained a Breeders' Cup champion, but French conditioner Freddy Head will try



to make history by becoming the first individual to train a Breeders' Cup winner after having collected that honor as a jockey. In 1987, the super filly Miesque took Hollywood Park by storm with a narrow victory in the Mile before successfully defending her title the following year at Churchill Downs. Head,

who was aboard for both victories, will try and complete the unparalleled Breeders' Cup feat when he saddles **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) in Friday's Mile.

"I would be very happy, because people say that good jockeys can't make good trainers, so I will show them that is not true," Head said, laughing. With many likely to look for parallels between the two fillies, Head was quick to outline their differences.

"It's hard to compare the two, because Miesque was something really special," he explained. "They didn't have the same start to their careers. [Goldikova] was more backward than Miesque was, I suppose. She has a lot of speed and is very easy to ride, which wasn't the case with Miesque. She is not as brutal as Miesque was, you can ride her with more finesse. She is definitely easier to ride than Miesque was."

For all their differences, however, Head also pointed out their important similarity.

"They are both genuine milers," he added. "I don't know if [Goldikova] is as good a horse, but I think she could be. I think she will be a champion."

Earlier last week, the bay was pre-entered in both the Filly & Mare Turf and the Mile, but the racing gods or, more accurately, trainers Aidan O'Brien and John Gosden, had something to do with the decision to send the three-year-old to take on the boys in the Mile. English and Irish Derby winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), both pre-entered in the Mile, will bypass the race in favor of the 1 1/4-mile trip of the Classic.

"That was very good news," commented Head after hearing of those plans. "We decided to run in the Mile largely because those two horses were running in the Classic." A.P. Indy - Corrazona, by El Gran Senor

While Head understandably wanted to avoid those titans, his filly has proven that she can take on the big guns and still win, having defeated the likes of threetime Group 1 winner Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar), G1 1000 Guineas winner Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) and G1 Prix de la Foret hero Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in her two most recent starts. Lightly raced at two, Goldikova was beaten in her first three starts this season, including defeats by subsequent G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Zarkava in the French 1000 Guineas and French Oaks in the spring.

"At two, I didn't think she was ready to take on the best horses, so she had two easy runs," Head explained. "At three, we went for the French Guineas, and unfortunately, we fell on a super horse called Zarkava; now that we are away from that filly, we have won three in a row, including two Group 1s."

Head, who was been graced with four Group 1 winners this year, including five-time Group 1 winner Marchand d'Or (Fr), Naaqoos (GB) and Tamayuz (GB), was modest about his recent successes.

"I think it's luck," he offered. "I think someone up there is helping me. It's funny that I seemed to get all those horses at the same time. I have the best sprinter, the best miler, and maybe the best three-year-old. What more can you ask for?" Head cont. p8

When asked which role he prefers to play, the role of the jockey or the trainer, Head quipped, "I prefer to be 20 again. Being a jockey is the greatest profession in the world. It's great fun, but training is good, too. When you train good horses, it's very rewarding. It's a great experience."

Notably absent from this year's Breeders' Cup is Head's crack sprinter Marchand d'Or, winner of three Group 1s in his last three races, including the G1 Prix de L'Abbaye de Longchamp Oct. 5. According to Head, the decision to bypass the Breeders' Cup with his star was more logistical than an issue of performance.

"He won't run here because we would have to pay because he wasn't engaged [nominated] as a foal," he said. "Maybe that's why some other French horses may not have come over as well."

According to Head, he will take it easy with the filly, who was sent out for a leisurely jog yesterday. "She will do the same thing today and will canter Friday morning," he said. "She is ready and we just want to keep her happy." --Christina Bossinakis

Don't Count Out McGaughey...

Trainer Shug McGaughey is no stranger to the Breeders' Cup, having saddled the likes of Juvenile winners Easy Goer and Rhythm; Distaff heroines Personal Ensign, Inside Information and Pleasant Home; dual Mile winner Lure; and Storm Flag Flying and My Flag, who both took the Juvenile Fillies. And while he is flying a little bit under the radar with some of his entries this time around, the Kentucky horseman warned that they are not to be overlooked. McGaughey has five entries over the two-day championship series, including Carriage Trail (Giant's Causeway), who is set to take on Zenyatta in the Ladies' Classic Friday. The winner of the GI Spinster S., the five-year-old mare galloped an easy mile yesterday, and McGaughey is pleased with the mare's progress since her 7 3/4-length score at Keeneland Oct. 5.

"I am comfortable with the way she came out of the [Spinster]; I do I wish she had another week or two, but she doesn't," McGaughey admitted. "That was one of the reasons I left her in New York, so that I could stay there and watch her, and if she had made a mistep, I wouldn't have come. I also knew the weather was going to be cooler there than here, so I felt that would help her bounce out of her race. I think she bounced out of her race good, but honestly, I wish I had more time."

Is McGaughey concerned about her tendency to meander out late in the stretch of her races, something which she also did in the Spinster?

"Well, if she's five in front, I won't worry about it," dead-panned McGaughey. "But if she turns for home and she's got a shot and she starts drifting like that, it will take away from her. But I do think she can be restrained somewhat from doing that. [Jockey] Kent [Desormeaux] knew that she was so strong and so far in front, that he didn't try to do anything about it."

McGaughey also sent out Juvenile Fillies Turf entrant **Consequence** (El Prado {Ire}) and Juvenile Fillies hopeful **Persistently** (Smoke Glacken) yesterday, both galloping an easy mile and walking to the paddock for schooling.

"They worked Sunday and had a day off [Monday]," said McGaughey.

And while the trainer feels Consequence is probably one of his best chances for a win on Breeders' Cup day, he sounded his biggest warning about overlooking his Turf competitor, **Dancing Forever** (Rahy).

"I think if somebody overlooks Dancing Forever because of his two last races, they're gonna be wrong," he emphasized.

Winner of the GI Manhattan H. at Belmont June 7, the chestnut finished fifth in Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer H. over a turf course listed as 'good' Aug. 16 before fading to seventh over the yielding turf in Belmont's GI Turf Classic Invitational Sept. 27.

"I think he's a much better horse on the hard turf," explained McGaughey. "When he won the Manhattan at Belmont, I thought we had the best distance grass horse in the country. I did make a mistake running him at Saratoga, and I also shouldn't have run him at Belmont in the Turf Classic. That was my mistake. I tried to make an excuse that it was the Saratoga turf, and the Friday before [the Turf Classic], I wasn't going to run him either. I should have taken him to Keeneland and run him at a mile, which is not his game, but I could get a solid race into him."

He is encouraged by his charge's most recent works, but McGaughey thinks the betting public might overlook Dancing Forever come Saturday.

"I expect him to run well here," he said. "He worked good at Belmont before he came here Sunday, and he is a true 1 1/2-mile horse. I'm not sure I realized how thin this turf course really is, but that shouldn't bother him. I'll say this, if he goes off at 15-1, I will definitely make a bet on him."-*Christina Bossinakis*






TWO SEPARATE PATHS

A modest seven percent gain in gross of $\in 2.5$ million at the resurgent Argana Yearling Sale at Deauville in August was about the last time we heard of revenues going up in this, or just about any other business, for that matter. There's no doubt the global financial crunch wiped out scores of orders from established racehorse owners over the past few weeks, and that undoubtedly exacerbated the imbalance in the supply and demand equation at Tattersalls' two-week October Yearling Sale (Books 1-3). But we've seen ever since August that the ingredients for that imbalance already existed internally in the horse market. It's not just simply 'overproduction.' In fact, it wouldn't be overproduction at all except for a lack of buyers. But, for all the reasons we can recite, on top of the global financial crunch, at this point in time we have a lot more supply than demand. Tattersalls' two-week gross dropped by 24 percent, which was 22.2-million guineas--around \$40 million. Keeneland September had dropped \$47 million, 15 percent off its 2007 gross; and Goffs plunged €25 million (roughly \$33 million)--a 41-percent drop in gross, largely due, as we knew at the time, to the Irish property bust. Those three major sales lost around \$120 million in gross among them. That's a lot of money off the table.

At the two biggest sales combined, Keeneland September and Tattersalls October, there were 7,497 yearlings catalogued and 4,795 sold--64 percent of those catalogued, which right away means that over a third of the horses catalogued, for whatever reason, did not get sold in the ring. The nearly 4,800 that did sell grossed around \$480 million, so an average of right at \$100,000 per horse for the two biggest sales. But the divergent buying patterns of the game's two Titans, Coolmore and the Maktoum family and friends, make interesting reading.

Both groups bought more at Tattersalls than at Keeneland. Demi O'Byrne signed for just six horses at Keeneland, totaling \$3,240,000--less than one percent of the sale's total receipts. The three Maktoum entities, buying as John Ferguson Bloodstock, Shadwell, and Rabbah, bought 75 yearlings at Keeneland, spending \$37.2-million--about 11 percent of the total revenues. The Coolmore team bought 19 at Tatts', spending just over five million guineas. So they bought 25 yearlings in the two sales combined, spending about \$12.5 million. But the focus of their operation has always been to have a limited number--well under a hundred-two-year-olds at Ballydoyle each year.



With their large, established breeding operation keyed around Europe's top stallions, they go to the sales to top up the Ballydoyle intake as well as supporting their stallions, at least to tha extent, in the marketplace.

The Maktoums are pursuing a different philosophy. Their three 2008 yearling buying entities bought a staggering 190 yearlings in the three books of Tattersalls October, spending just over 20 million guineas. This was 16 percent of the horses sold--one of every six--and a whopping 29 percent of the sale's gross, which was just over 72.3-million guineas. As far as I can tell, not one of those 190 Maktoum purchases was by a Coolmore stallion.

Between the two sales, the Maktoum entities bought 265 yearlings and spent around \$75 million. They bought more than 10 times the number of horses as Coolmore, and they spent six times as much money. Clearly, quantity, as well as quality, is part of the strategy; and they certainly converted a lot of breeders who sold them yearlings or saw how much they bought, even if they didn't buy their yearlings this time. It'll be a lot easier to sell seasons to Darley stallions after these sales.

With 100 horses reportedly going to Andre Fabre, and big numbers already racing with Mark Johnston (for Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed, Sheikh Mohammed's son and designated heir) and John Gosden (for Sheikh Mohammed's wife, Princess Haya), not to mention the Shadwell and Rabbah purchases, the Darley interests are once again spreading well beyond the confines of Godolphin. With probably as many two-year-olds in each of those four training yards as there are at Ballydoyle, the Maktoums are going to have sheer numbers working in their favor--even if none (or very few) of their 2009 two-year-olds are by Coolmore sires.

In that regard, a glance at the top of the charts for European sires by yearling average shows why assaults in such quantities may be necessary. Four of the top five European sires at the sales this year are Coolmore stallions, though the incomparable Sadler's Wells will have his last yearlings next year. In 2009 Montjeu will be 13 years old; Galileo will be 11; and Danehill Dancer, 16. Pivotal, who will be heavily patronized by the Maktoums, will also be 16, while neutral Dansili, 13 next year, is on the shopping list for both camps. So, of the five top European commercial sires which are still in service, you'd say Coolmore's advantage is 3 1/2 to 1 1/2. That's the advantage on the breeding side the Maktoums have to overcome.

In Europe, the Maktoums are making inroads among their younger stallions. Kheleyf (Green Desert) and Exceed and Excel (Danehill) rank ahead of One Cool Cat (Storm Cat) among European freshman sire this year, though all three now trail Elusive City (Elusive Quality) after Soul City's win in the Goffs' Million colt race. Among sires with their first yearlings this year, the Maktoums' Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) tops the charts, with Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) narrowly second, ahead of Coolmore's Oratorio (Danehill) in third. Coolmore's other first-year representative, Footstepsinthesand (Giant's Causeway), ranks seventh in 2009, wearling overage (through last Saturday), with

in 2008 yearling average (through last Saturday), with 'neutral' stallions Motivator (Montjeu), Azamour (Night Shift), and Whipper (Miesque's Son) in between.







Woodford Racing I, LLC will sell all 14 of its remaining four-year-olds at the Keeneland November Sale from Nov. 3 to Nov. 17, it was announced Tuesday. Included among the group are: Hip 197, Sprung (Gone West), winner of the GIII Natalma S. a two; Hip 815, Quiet Action (Forest Wildcat), winner of the Ontario Damsel; Hip 4983, Approval Rating (Lemon Drop Kid), winner of the Victoria Park S.; and Hip 4979, Legal Move (Bold Executive), most recently fifth in the G3 Phoenix S. BLACKOUT CONTINUES There will be at least another eight days before Italian racing can resume after the strikers set out their demands yesterday. Following a meeting with Unire officials, the "Comitato di Crisi" collection of trainers, owners and other interested parties released a statement confirming that the government will have to guarantee prize money at 2007 levels. They are asking for €220 million and a new system for the organization of Italian racing. In response, the government is preparing to approve a special "emendemento" to allow racing to profit from the selling of 3,000 betting shop licences and is considering a cut in the percentage of tax income on race bets. That currently stands at 4.75 percent, which is two percent higher than sport bets, but these moves will have to meet with approval in parliament which will take until next Thursday at the earliest. In the event, another Group 1 race in the Premio Lydia Tesio--scheduled in Rome on Sunday--is set to be lost. There will be a major protest today in Milan, starting at the San Siro track and ending in front of the RAI TV studios in town. Similar protests will take place around Italy, in Sicily at Palermo and at Civinatova Marche close to the trotting track of Montegiorgio. There has been no racing since Oct. 8 as a result of Unire's decision to drop prize money to €175 million due to poor betting turnover and promising to make further cuts in 2009 to possibly €130 million.
