CASINO DRIVE GALLOPS AT HOLLYWOOD

Away from the center of the media storm, unbeaten three-year-old **Casino Drive** (Mineshaft) breezed a very relaxed five furlongs at Hollywood Park yesterday morn-



ing. "It was a nice easy gallop in 1:10," Nobutaka Tada, racing manager for owner Hidetoshi Yamamoto, offered after the 7 a.m. move. "He went the same pace. It was perfect. It was just what Mr. Fujisawa [trainer Kazuo Fujisawa] wanted. We wanted to let him feel

well. He's fit enough." The time was not fast enough to make the Hollywood work tab. "He went too slow, like an open gallop," explained clocker Russell Hudak. "He was going a two-minute clip." Casino Drive hasn't registered an official work since winning a Santa Anita allowance in his return to the U.S. Oct. 12. The Japanese invader drew post two for the Classic, the same post he left from when taking the allowance. Victor [jockey Espinoza] said he likes the post," said Tada. Asked about race tactics come Saturday, Tada replied, "This horse can do anything. He is adjustable to any situation." Tada said Casino Drive will hit the track again at Hollywood this morning before being shipped to Santa Anita. Fujisawa and Yamamoto are scheduled to arrive today from Japan.

DIVINE PARK RETIRED TO AIRDRIE STUD

GI Metropolitan H. hero **Divine Park** (Chester House--High In the Park, by Ascot Knight) has been retired and, as previously announced, will take up stud duties at Brereton Jones's Airdrie Stud near Lexington. The four-

year-old will stand for a fee of \$17,500. "Divine Park absolutely checks every box for a major stallion prospect," Jones said. "He's a Grade I winner of one of the great stallion-making races, the Met Mile, and he's by a stallion who left us too early but who established himself as an elite sire both nationally and overseas. Plus he will be one of the best-looking

stallions in our barn--he's gorgeous." Divine Park opened his career with three straight wins, including a sevenfurlong allowance victory that established a new track record over Keeneland's Polytrack (1:21 flat) and a victory in the GIII Withers S. last year. Divine Park returned at four this season and won the one-mile GIII Westchester H. in 1:32 3/5--two ticks off the track record--then beat Commentator (Distorted Humor) in the Met Mile for owner James Barry and trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "Jim Barry and Kiaran McLaughlin are two of the truly good people in racing, and we at Airdrie are very grateful for the opportunity to stand a horse with the great promise of Divine Park," Jones added. By the late Chester House, Divine Park is from the female family of Grade I winners Sardula and Imperial Gesture. Divine Park concludes his career with six wins in nine starts and earnings of \$612,935.

PASS ON THE PRO-RIDE? NO WAY ...

In the months leading up to the Breeders' Cup, some trainers said they might be reluctant to send their horses out over Santa Anita's new Pro-Ride surface. John Gosden, on the other hand, pointed to the new underfoot conditions in Arcadia as the main reason he and his crack miler Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) are taking shot at the GI Classic, rather than the GI Mile on the grass. "I wouldn't be running in the Classic if it was still on the dirt," Gosden explained. "The problem with the dirt is not the surface you're going on, it's the kickback. European horses have never, ever, ever suffered kickback in their face. Let me tell you, it will put you right out of your stride. That's why, when I trained here, you could have a horse that could work a mile in 1:37 and change on the dirt breezing, you take them out in the afternoon they couldn't go a mile in 1:40 because they spend all their time avoiding the kickback. That's the issue. With this, I think it's a level playing field. It also makes it incredibly exciting because the top horses from all around the world can come together and meet. You're not going to find a dirt or a turf champion, but you're going to find a champion. I think that makes it truly exciting. It's bringing together the breed, really. We need a little unity these days, don't we? We've had enough negative press this year." Cont. p3

Raven's Pass cleared quarantine yesterday morning and made his first visit to the track. He will be ridden in the Classic by Frankie Dettori. Taking about the Classic, Gosden said he has enormous respect for the reigning champ Curlin. "I think he's a superb horse," Gosden said. "I love the way he travels in a race. I love the way he won his trial in the Dubai World Cup. He's a very, very superior mile-and-a-quarter, old and tough horse. He sets the benchmark and he would hold his own in most generations. He's a fabulous horse. I think it's so exciting. Someone has got to come and take him on. We can't all be wimps and hide. It's great to take him on. And he's going into a little unknown territory. They say he breezed brilliantly around here the other day. He's a machine. He'll probably go on anything."

She may be 3-5 on the morning-line for Friday's GI Ladies Classic, but **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) still was required to go school in

the paddock during yesterday's card at Oak Tree. The unbeaten filly's biggest fan could be her exercise rider, Steve Willard. "Is perfect good enough for you?" the 65-year-old responded when asked how Zenyatta felt beneath him. He should know. "I put her in the same category as when I got on Alysheba and Gentlemen," Willard said. "She's been special, ex-

tremely special, and getting more special every day." Willard lucked into his partnership with the John Shirreffs trainee. "She had a half-dozen different riders, and I got her by default because she bucked the others off," the veteran rider explained. "She's getting more settled, but can still be a little cantankerous. She bucked me off in the shedrow once and came close to bucking me off another time. She wants to do what she wants to do." Zenyatta has to get the job done from the rail, and out in post seven is longshot Santa Teresita (Lemon Drop Kid). "If she [Zenyatta] gets a trip, there's nothing in there that's going to beat her," trainer Eric Guillot opined. "I think she could beat Curlin [in the Classic]. She has nothing to prove, or to gain, by running on Friday. She could have been mentioned in the same breath as Lady's Secret, Rags to Riches and Winning Colors." Santa Teresita is coming off a third to Zenyatta in the GI Lady's Secret S. at Oak Tree Sept. 27. "She needed that race," Guillot said. "She'll run a big one, but she's up against the best in the world. We're glad to have drawn post seven in an eight-horse field. When she [Santa Teresita] is stuck inside, she tends to fight early." -- Marie Kizenko

DE KOCK ON CUP MAP WITH EAGLE MOUNTAIN

South African trainer Mike de Kock will saddle his first Breeders' Cup starter Saturday, but it won't be any of the horses he expected earlier in the year would make it to championship weekend. "I had three others



that I was planning to come here with and things didn't turn out that way," de Kock said. But they just didn't do well in England. They had really tough campaigns in Dubai. We took them to England and their coats never got good, they never ate well, never worked well. horse, you know. You don't want to come here just to be a number." Meanwhile, while his stablemates were excelling in Dubai, GI Turf hopeful Eagle Mountain (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) was spending a year on the sidelines recovering from a fractured pelvis. The fouryear-old, who was second in last year's G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Champion S. and third in the G1 Irish Derby, seemed a longshot to make it to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup. But he proved he was back in top shape in his comeback effort, winning Newmarket's one-mile Oct. 3 G3 Joel S. in course-record time in his only start this term. "We didn't think we were on target for the Breeders' Cup, but his last one showed that he was," de Kock explained. "So we were able to switch plans. We were lucky that we had a backup with this horse." The trainer is not concerned that Eagle Mountain's light campaign will hurt him Saturday. "He's got a good five or six months of hard work under the belt," de Kock said. "He's done a lot of miles. He's ready for it."

A Family Affair

When **Black Seventeen** (Is It True) goes postward in Saturday's \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, he'll be a

bit of a Cinderella story for Saronda Smith, Smith co-bred and sold the chestnut as a weanling back in 2004 and has kept a keen eye on his progress since. Smith hails from a family synonymous with Ocala's Thoroughbred history. Her grandfather Henry Lewis worked at Bonnie Heath Farm, and his three sons--Marion, Wesley and Larry--all made a living at raising horses. The late Marion Lewis worked as the stallion manager at Ocala Stud before managing Farnsworth Farms, while Larry

managed Vintage Acres prior to moving over to Ocala Stud. Smith's father Wesley ran Robin's Nest Farm, then went out on his own. "They were a great family of horsemen," said bloodstock consultant Steve Silver.

"I was born and raised in Ocala," said Smith. "I grew up with horses." One of the horses the 42-year-old Smith grew up with was Fuzzy Navel, a Strike the Anvil filly born in 1990. "I helped foal her. She was one of the last horses my dad was involved with--he died in 1991.

Fuzzy Navel made it to the races, but got hurt and was retired after two starts. The mare's offspring have been solid at the sales for Smith and her family, with her 1999 Tactical Advantage filly Peach Fuzz selling for \$35,000 as a weanling and \$70,000 the following season to Fox Hill Farm. Smith runs a hands-on operation, doing everything from foaling mares to sales preparation and readying young horses for the track. Black Seventeen was foaled in 2004, and was offered at Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's October by Smith and her husband at the time, Robert Smith.

"We sold him in October as a weanling," she recalled. "He was an outstanding baby. We work from the ground-up, from phase one to when they're ready to go to the track. We try to figure out who might sell as a weanling, or which ones will be better yearlings. For the ones that may not be too commercial, we might sell them as two-year-olds when pedigree might not matter that much. It's really about when it suits the horses. We try to have money coming in year-round."

Smith retained Fuzzy Navel when she and Robert split up in 2007, and now owns the mare in partnership with her mother, Marilyn Lewis.

"My mom has been my nightwatchman for 15 years, delivering foals," said Smith.

As a yearling, Black Seventeen sold for \$50,000 as a to Paul Sharp, but also caught the eye of bloodstock agent Tom McGreevy, who thought his bid had secured the colt that day. **Cont. p6**

"Tom has supported several of [Fuzzy Navel's] foals," Smith explained. "He called me and said, 'You need to breed this mare to something serious.' I said I don't really have the money for that, but he got a season to Rockport Harbor." Before striking out on his own,



McGreevy helped pick out horses for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm. Among his selections for that operation were Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song), who went on to become a multiple graded stakes winner before entering stud at Darley in Kentucky; and Round Pond (Awesome Again), the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine who sold for \$5.75 million at Fasig-Tipton in 2007. "He was a really good racehorse, and his first weanling sold for \$80,000 at OBS, which is really good in this market," Smith

explained. Fuzzy Navel is now in foal to the big grey, and next spring's baby will represent Smith's partnership with McGreevy.

"I bred her to Proud Accolade (Yes It's True) because the cross has worked," Smith added. The resulting filly RNA'd for \$72,000 at OBS August two months ago, but Smith worked out a deal there. "I kept a 20-percent interest and sold the rest of her to Tony Bowling. She's just starting training."

Having begun his career in California, Black Seventeen returned to Florida to triumph in the GII Carry Back S. during the 2007 Summit of Speed at Calder. He didn't face the starter for 11 months, but, after striking out in his first three starts off the layoff, pulled a 23-1 upset in outgaming Fabulous Strike (Smart Strike) in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 27.


"The way he was able to come back from all that time off, he's really got to be something special," said Smith. "[Trainer and co-owner] Brian [Koriner]'s done a great job with him."

Smith thinks the son is the image of his dam.

"She really stamped him," Smith offered. "She's got a tremendous hip and shoulder. She's a big mare, 16.2 hands, with good bone. She's a little straight in the knee, but is pretty correct."

A victory Saturday could give Black Seventeen an Eclipse Award, and as for Fuzzy Navel's date in 2009, that remains to be seen.

"I'm not sure where to send the mare next year," Smith admitted. "I was thinking Yes It's True because he's having a great year, and I like to stick with what works." --M Kizenko

A NEW FRONTIER

They say that the apple doesn't fall far from the tree, and in the case of Chad Brown, that is the highest of compliments. Having gained much of his early instruction while working for racing stalwarts Shug McGaughey and Bobby Frankel, Brown has grown into a rising star on the Thoroughbred racing scene since going out on his own late last year. He will face the best the game has to offer when he saddles his first Breeders' Cup starter **Maram** (Sahm) in Friday's Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Brown, who developed a passion for horses growing up in Saratoga Springs, got his start in racing with Standardbreds, competing along the East Coast circuit.

"I worked for some old, French-Canadian grooms, and they're the ones who taught me how to groom a horse the right way," said Brown, explaining his earliest racetrack experiences. "Some people think it's hard grooming Thoroughbreds, but you realize how easy it is compared to taking care of harness horses, with all their equipment and gear."

In the meantime, Brown frequented the races at Saratoga Race Course before deciding to make the switch 11 years ago, when he was introduced to the world of Thoroughbreds by McGaughey.

"After all the years of going to the races, I picked out my favorite trainers. With Shug I saw quality. I wanted to be careful who I learned from because I wanted to be sure that it wasn't someone with a lot of horses. I just liked his system. I didn't know much, but I knew certain guys were quality because they always had horses running on Saturday and Sunday, and didn't have a lot of horses but were often in the winner's circle."

After working as a hotwalker the first summer, Brown returned each summer during his college years to further his education in the McGaughey camp. Brown was moved up to the position of foreman after his college graduation, but soon after, realized that he needed to expand his options.

"He taught me a lot, but there was really no opportunity for me to move up, since he's had his assistants for a long time, so I decided to go."

Introduced to Frankel, Brown moved out to Hollywood Park in California to work under the guidance of Frankel and Frankel's key West Coast assistant Umberto Escanio.

"That's where things changed for me," Brown admitted. "Bobby moved the game to another level. I was lucky enough to join him right before the time Bobby won 26 Grade I's and I was there right in the middle of it. We were shipping horses all over, winning all over the country. We were really rolling."

And while the victories and successes were plentiful, Brown admits that the most valuable commodity that he gleaned from his 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ years in the Frankel camp was knowledge. Cont. p8

"I've learned by watching Bobby train, how he observe horses and making adjustments. If we had one work too fast, Bobby might get mad, but he would make the adjustment. If one worked too slow, he would adjust it. If one got sick, and had to miss one race, he would just modify the plan and get the horse ready for something else. That way of thinking really opened my eyes."

And while Frankel had an impact on the young horseman, Brown also credits another member of the Frankel team for his early education. "Umberto took me in and really schooled me in terms of what to do, and just let me work on horses and get them to look the right way."

With 40 horses currently under his direction, Brown launched his solo training career following last year's Breeders' Cup at Monmouth, where Ginger Punch collected a victory in the Distaff for Frankel and Frank Stronach. Owners Gary and Mary West and Ken and Sarah Ramsey were among the initial group of owners to support Brown early, but in the last few months others have joined the growing team, including Klaravich Stables, Michael Dubb and Sanford Goldfarb.

"Now that I have my own stable, I feel the pressure sometimes in running because a horse that is not running is an expense to the owner," added Brown. "But another really important lesson I learned from Bobby is that patience pays off. That is something try to do with my horses too."

Looking ahead to Friday's newly created turf event for two-year-old fillies, Brown is happy with the way his stable star is coming into the race. Maram worked five furlongs in 1:02.2 at Belmont Saturday, and was shipped to California Sunday.

"It was a nice, standard work for her," he said. "She went in 1:02 and change on the dirt. She's not much on the dirt, but she's really nice on the grass. She's also really taken to the Pro-Ride over here. She's become really aggressive, which is a good sign. She's been training really well."


Drawn in post 3, Maram will lineup against 11 other fillies, including morning-line favorite Laragh (Tapit) and Consequence (El Prado {Ire}), conditioned by his former mentor McGaughey.

"I've looked at the numbers for some of the horses in the race and she fits," Brown explained. "I am comfortable that she can compete against anyone of these horses in the east. She drew a good post and she has a good pattern, sheet-wise, and if she can just move ahead a little bit more from her last race, I think she's going to be tough. I think she has a good chance."

Poised to saddled his first horse as a trainer of record in the Breeders' Cup, Brown is starting to feel the charge that comes with the big events.

"I was ok last week, but now that I'm out here and I see all the other horses and trainers out here I am starting to get excited. I've done everything I can do. Hopefully, she can get us to the winner's circle." -*C Bossinakis*

ROMANS EMPIRE

Trainer Dale Romans came close to bagging a Breeders' Cup title not once but twice in 2004 when Kitten's Joy finished second in the Turf and Roses in May filled that same spot one race later in the Classic. During this year's championships, the Kentucky conditioner will send out two horses who will try and go one better than their predecessors. **Thorn Song** (Unbridled's Song) will try to get the job done in the Mile, while **C.S. Silk** (Medaglia d'Oro) will attempt to triumph over her peers in the Juvenile Fillies Friday. C.S. Silk, who worked a bullet five furlongs in :59.2 at Churchill Downs Oct. 17, arrived at Santa Anita Sunday. Also making the trip to California was stablemate Thorn Song, whose last official work was Sept. 24, when he went five furlongs in 1:03.4 on the turf at the Louisville oval.

C.S. Silk, who was schooled at the gate yesterday, was third in her career debut at Churchill Downs June 13 before getting the job done with an impressive 6 1/4-length victory sprinting over the main track there July 6.

"I think she has a good shot," said Romans. "I think it's one of the toughest races on the card. There are a lot of top-notch fillies who are all pretty evenly matched. I think we have as good a chance as anybody..she's training good."

In a field that includes six other graded stakes winners, the dark bay has a tall order to fill, but Romans thinks his filly is up to the task.

"Stardom Bound has to be the one that you worry about the most," admitted Romans. "I think Sky Diva is a nice one, too. I think it's a good group of fillies."

In her most recent start, the daughter of freshman sire Medaglia d'Oro, making her debut on a synthetic surface in the mile GIII Arlington Washington Lassie Sept. 6, galloped home an easy six-length winner.

"I thought her last race was very impressive," said Romans. "She handled the field with ease. She did it on the artificial surface there, and hopefully, that will translate over to this surface here. She's won on dirt and she's won on Poly, hopefully, she'll win on anything."

Romans is also keen on his entry on Saturday's card. Five-year-old Thorn Song, winner of the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 4, is set to take on an international cast of milers, including Kip Deville, Goldikova, and Precious Kitten.

"Thorn Song ran a big race last time," confirmed his trainer. "He's coming after a short rest in three weeks. We'll probably send him to the lead and see if he can keep going."



You can pick up a copy of the TDN today on the Keeneland backstretch courtesy of **Pin Oak Stud** Romans, continued, "He doesn't act like it in training. He's been a little eager training on the grass. He seems like he came out of it well."

Is Romans worried about the competition?

"The Europeans are a big unknown, but if they're going to come all the way out here, they must think they have an awful lot of horse. Personally, I think at a mile, he's the best in this country. I think he's shown that. He's run four times at a mile and he's won three and was third in the other. I think he can run with anybody in this country."

With all the confidence in his horse, Romans still feels concerned about some of the others' tactics Saturday.

"Daytona bothers me a little bit, because it looks like he's going to want to do the same thing we're going to want to do," he said. And asked what that is he replied, "Just Go." -- *Christina Bossinakis*

What They're Saying At The Cup...

Trainer Bobby Frankel, on why he decided on the GI Classic rather than the GI Turf for Champs Elysees:

"His race here in the GI Santa Anita H. [third on the Cushion Track] was good. Imagine if he wins that race. He's already got a Grade I win on the grass, so if he wins [this] one he's worth a fortune. He's the best bred horse in America. He's a half-brother to four Grade I winners [including two Breeders' Cup winners--Intercontinental (Ire) and Banks Hill (Ire)]. If the turf here might have been soft, I could have thought about running him in the Turf, but that course is nothing but hard and the Classic is a good fit for him. He handles this track good and I'm thinking the blinkers might move him up, get him more focused. If he gets the good trip and we get a little lucky, good things can happen. The 12 post is OK for him. You might be concerned about him breaking out from the outside, but they've got a mile and a quarter and he should be fine." New York-based Alan Garcia will come in to ride Champs Elysees for the first time in the Classic.

Trainer Todd Pletcher regarding the race tactics for GI Classic hopeful Fairbanks:

"The strategy is simple. We're going to the front."

Saeed bin Suroor, trainer of GI F/M Turf hopeful Folk Opera (Ire):

"We sent her to the Breeders' Cup because she handles travel very well. She went from Canada back to England, and then from England to here, and she handled it well."

What They're Saying cont.

Jimmy Jerkens on the draw of GI Juvenile Fillies starter Doremifasollatido, who will break from post 13:

"It's not good. I don't know what to tell the jockey. If he breaks good, I guess he's got to come out a little bit and try to cross over. If not, he'll have to try to tuck in. There's not much you can do about it except give him a leg up."

Steve Klesaris, trainer of GI Juvenile Fillies starter Sky Diva:

"This is a route filly to the bone. I wish the race was a mile and a quarter."

Trainer Christopher Paasch, on the pressure of training GI Juvenile Fillies favorite Stardom Bound:

"All you do from now until Friday is hold your breath until you turn blue."

Catherine Day-Phillips, who conditions GI Juvenile Fillies starter Van Lear Rose:

"She's much more confident now. She seems to lap up the click of the shutters. She's very proud of herself."

Trainer Robert Frankel, when asked who he thought would give him his best chance at a Breeders' Cup win:

"I like [Ventura, who goes in the Filly & Mare Sprint]. I like her and [GI Breeders' Cup Mile entrant] Precious Kitten. They're both doing well. Ventura loves the 'Poly.' She won on it in the U.S. and overseas. And the race might set up nicely for her. She'll be back there a bit; there's lots of speed in the race. She's a high-strung one. She's full of herself. You've got to get her out of her stall and give her some room or she'll hurt herself. Yet, when you take her over there in the afternoons, she's calm; she's no problem. You saddle her with no trouble at all. She's doing great coming up to this. She's never been better than she is right now."

Trainer Dale Romans on race strategy for GI Mile hopeful Thorn Song:

"We're just going to go. If someone wants to come with us, they're sacrificing themselves. It doesn't matter if he's on the lead, he doesn't need it. He just has that high cruising pace. He has natural speed and can sustain it. I don't think he's ever trained any better."

Trainer Eric Guillot, whose Elusive Bluff will make his first start on the main track in the GI Juvenile after two turf wins:

"Desire makes horses just like it makes people. Desire is one thing we know he's got. Put something in front of him and he goes after it. He looked like he was going to run fourth in the Pilgrim, but he really surged that last two jumps and got up. That's heart."

Todd Pletcher, trainer of Munnings, who was installed as the 7-2 morning-line favorite for the GI Juvenile after drawing post one:

"Interesting draw for Munnings. We'll send him away from there and put him in the thick of things."

Trainer Brian Koriner, who joked about the instructions he'd give Joe Talamo, pilot of Turf Sprint contender California Flag:

"You don't want to be telling these riders too much. Besides, whatever I tell Joe, he forgets it right away and does what he wants to do anyway."

Your new Op/ed section of the TDN is a great place to invite dialogue on important issues facing the industry. A couple of the recent opinions have prompted me to comment and I have two separate issues I would like to address.

First, on the topic of weakening the breed; we need to discuss the impact veterinary medicine is having on the gene pool. I am referring specifically to surgical treatments on horses in training.

I have experienced first hand the frequency with which surgery is required in order to keep horses in training. While these advancements are great in the sense that they allow us to salvage our racehorse and return the athlete to the track to fulfill his or her potential, it is also a crutch.

Assuming we are fortunate and the horse runs well after surgery, of course we are going to breed from him or her. Therein lies the problem. We produce horses that have a genetic weakness that may or may not be presented immediately in each of its offspring. But over time, some of these young trainees or their descendants will have the same issues to a lesser or greater degree. They too will seek the surgical remedy. Hence the cycle repeats itself. Over time, the breed is impacted negatively.

Before the advent of such economical surgical procedures, fewer of these horses would have fulfilled their potential and they might not have made it to the breeding shed to reproduce their genetic weakness.

Whether this phenomenon results in fewer starts I am not sure, but knowing that it takes time to come back from these surgeries I would guess it hurts the statistics for starts per year.

Unfortunately, I see no remedy for this problem.... other than a more forgiving synthetic surface. (Some might say this is another crutch, but we will leave this subject for another day.)

Second, on the subject of the worsening economics for breeders, we need to include in the dialogue the impact of larger books to stallions. It has at least two important impacts.

First is the immediate impact on the commercial breeder.

Large books are a necessity for the freshman stallion owner in order to prove up his horse in the first three years at stud. The over production floods the market with his progeny and his chances for producing a top runner are increased. This makes for more critical buyers due to the fact that the particular stallion may have 80 foals in the sale. Yes the larger book and the lower fee allowed the average mare to get to the stallion in the first place, but the sales price is reflective of the overproduction. As a breeder, if you are unlucky and have a less than stellar foal, you take a loss. Fewer progeny would help your chances to make a profit.

While I do not see a remedy to this particular aspect of commercial breeding, the point is worth making that bigger books have an important impact on the commercial breeder's economics.

After the third year, if the stallion is successful, the stud fee goes up and eventually the number of covers goes down, to some degree. And herein lies the second issue.

We need only look to the racing Quarter Horse industry to see what larger books will do to the breed. They will accelerate the selection process and narrow the gene pool. In fact, depending on how rapidly this narrowing is allowed to occur, it could have long term detrimental effects on the breed overall. Many racing Quarter Horses today have small feet and are back at the knee due to a gene pool so narrow only a handful of stallions dominate the industry.

And now, the Quarter Horse industry has recently gone beyond artificial insemination. They are harvesting multiple embryos per year from a top mare in order to find a competitive advantage in a gene pool so narrow that the measure of superiority has been reduced to less than a length at the race track. Of course this will narrow there gene pool further.

But what the heck, if they get in a bind they can always infuse some Thoroughbred blood and remedy the deficiencies. If only we could say the same.

My point is, once a stallion gets beyond the third year, it may be advisable, for the breed and the breeders, to mandate a limit to the book size. It will preserve diversity in the gene pool and make for a healthier commercial breeder marketplace.

He'll be heavily favored to do it, but Stonestreet Stable and Midnight Cry LLC's **Curlin** does have some questions to answer as he seeks to become the sixth horse to win back-to-back Breed-

ers' Cup races in the history of the event. The chestnut's season began in the Emirates, where he overwhelmed fields in a late February handicap event and the G1 Dubai World Cup, which he took by a record 7 3/4lengths. Returned to the States, he took the GI Stephen Foster H. under 128 pounds before running second to Red Rocks (Ire) in the GI Man o'War S. in his lone career visit to the infield. Contrarians will argue that the Curlin seen in his last two appearances lacks a certain killer instinct seen heretofore. He was all out to best 40-1 Past

the Point in the GI Woodward S. at Saratoga Aug. 30, and in the Sept. 27 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, he was more workmanlike than brilliant in handing the hardknocking Wanderin Boy a 3/4-length defeat. There is also uncertainty as he has never before tried a synthetic surface, one of just two in the field outside of the Euros who will test-drive it for the first time on race day. That said, in his two official works on the Pro-Ride, Curlin looked to be handling it like a seasoned professional, and trainer Steve Asmussen expects nothing short of a peak performance this weekend. "You know Curlin has always spoiled us with his consistency, and that's what we're looking for is more of the same," he commented. "It's going to be extremely competitive. 

Fabulous Strike would have been one of the favorites for last year's Sprint after his dominating 5 3/4-length victory in the GI Vosburgh S., but he was knocked out of the race by a lung infection The dark bay gelding was out of action for nearly nine months, and has only been out twice since his eye-catching Vosburgh score, but his connections have him ready to roll for this year's edition of the race. "Geez, we're tickled to death to be here," trainer Todd Beattie remarked yesterday. "It was a heartbreaker to miss it last year. It's all we've thought about since. We kept our sights set on it, and it's a pretty good vision quest to get here." The fiveyear-old made his 2008 bow against two overmatched rivals in a stakes test at Delaware Park June 21 and romped by 3 1/4 lengths. A foot injury precluded a start at Saratoga, but Fabulous Strike came back to defend his title in the Vosburgh. After pressing the pace through a half in :44.31, he battled on gamely to the wire and was beaten just a head by Black Seventeen. The Tea Party Stable homebred makes his synthetic debut in the Sprint, but he has trained extensively on the Tapeta at Presque Isle, and looked sharp as he prepped for the big event Sunday, going five-eighths in :59.20 on the Pro-Ride at Santa Anita. Beattie is confident he will handle the surface in the afternoon as well. "Everything looks good there," he said. "We've been here about eight days, and he has adjusted. He's working good and does everything I want of him. He sure likes training over the synthetic; I had a really good feeling about it." Fabulous Strike has had the lead at the first call in each of his last nine outings, and drew post 2 here, but Beattie is hoping that former claimer Cost of Freedom will come out running from the rail. "I've looked at it pretty closely," he commented. "I guess, being on the outside of Cost of Freedom, I'm not sure if that will force his hand. I'm not sure if he'll have to show more speed to get position. Fabulous Strike is usually fairly close, but I'm not convinced he has to be on the lead. I'll leave it up to Ramon [Dominguez], but I'd love to see him stalking the speed from the outside for a change, instead of the inside."

GI Champagne S. was not nominated to the Breeders' Cup and will evidently be off for the rest of the year, which takes a bit of the sheen off a solid if unspectacular renewal of the Juvenile. With the Breeders' Cup in their own backyard, the California horses may well have the upper hand. They are led by Midshipman and Street Hero, who have been separated by about a total of 2 3/4 lengths in Midshipman Benoit photo their last three. The edge might go

to the former, despite his 3/4length defeat to the hands of Street Hero in the GI Norfolk S. over course and distance Sept. 28. Midshipman beat Street Hero on debut at Del Mar Aug. 17, then came back 17 days later to win the seven-furlong GI Del Mar Futurity by a nose over Coronet of a Baron. Street Hero was another 3/4 lengths back in third. Then

Street Hero--still a maiden--was able to turn to the tables in the Norfolk, beating Midshipman by 3/4 lengths, when the latter looked like a youngster still figuring out his job description. Midshipman worked six furlongs in 1:12 1/5 at Santa Anita last Sunday. "He came out of the work good--we are all locked,

loaded and ready to go," said trainer Bob Baffert. The best chance for an East Coast-based horse may lie with Munnings. The \$1.7 million juvenile purchase ran a troubled third to Vineyard Haven in the Hopeful and was second to him in the Champagne.

J. Paul Reddam's purple and white colors were carried to victory in the '04 Juvenile by Euro import Wilko, and Reddam looks to repeat here with his new acquisition Square Eddie. Runner-up in the G3 Sirenia S. over Kempton's Polytrack before being purchased privately



by Reddam, Square Eddie made his U.S. and route debut in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 4 and ran off to a convincing 3 3/4-length win. Transferred from trainer John Best afterwards, Square Eddie has since impressed his new conditioner, Doug O'Neill. "He's an extremely classy individual and a very smart colt," said

O'Neill. "He has shown a liking

for synthetic surfaces--that's what Paul liked after he ran well at Kempton. He worked six furlongs in 1:15 and change cruising Saturday and looked really good. Like Azul Leon, he's very mature and very confident. I feel like I'm blessed. I think both horses have huge chances." Azul Leon, from the first crop of Lion Heart, flies in a bit under the radar despite his three-for-four record. The late-running colt won the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. in his second start and was awarded the victory in the GII Best Pal S. Aug. 10, but could do no better than sixth in the Norfolk. O'Neill thinks he's more than a one-turn sprinter, though. "He's training well, and distance should be no problem," O'Neill commented. "His dam, Quick Blue (Cure the Blues), won around two turns on both dirt and turf."

Wild Card...

On paper at least, Bushranger is the best qualified European-based runner to make a run at the Juvenile since Johannesburg in '01, or at least since Hold That Tiger in '02. Owned by a Coolmore partnership (as were the other two), the colt is the only dual Grade/Group 1 winner in the field, having taken the G1 Prix Morny in August and G1 Middle Park S. Oct. 3, both at or around six furlongs. He also won the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh in July. On pedigree and appearance, Bushranger seems to be a sprinting sort, and there are legitimate questions about how far he'll want to go. But those questions might be tempered by the fact that, with six starts to his credit, he boasts more experience that any other Juvenile starter.

Two decades ago, Miesque was guided by Freddie Head to a pair of Mile victories; in 2003, Six Perfections (Fr) came running to defeat a host of males over this course. Could another femme fatale be ready to have her picture taken once more? Goldikova (Ire) may have found Zarkava (Ire) too tough--what horse didn't--when second in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 11 and third in the G1 Prix de Diane June 8, but has been unstoppable since stepping out of that filly's imposing shadow. A comfortable winner of the G3 Prix Chloe July 6, the bay topped the top-class pair of Darjina (Fr) and Natagora (Fr) in the G1 Prix Rothschild Aug. 3 at Deauville, and handled a troop of Group 1 winners including Paco Boy (Ire) and Henrythenavigator in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp Sept. 7. Head hung up his tack to become a trainer in 1997, but didn't send out his first Group 1 winner until 2006. This season, however, Head has four individual top-level winners of eight Group 1 contests, and Goldikova is a serious contender to make him the first Breeders' Cup-winning jockey to later saddle a winner in the championship event. As for how his charge has progressed since the French Classics, Head offered, "I think she is a different filly now then she was then. I am not saying that she is better than Zarkava, but she is improving all the time."



five-year-old is a consistent sort who comes in fresh off four 2008 starts. The winner of last year's GIII Morvich H. over trip and track returned to collect victories in the six-furlong Robert K. Kerlan Memorial H. at Hollywood Park and five-furlong Green Flash H. at Del Mar this summer. He failed to fully capi-

talize on a blistering pace in his Morvich title defense

Sept. 24, running second to California Flag, but is nonetheless two-for-three sprinting down Santa Anita's hillside course. Get Funky drew an outside post 13.

The Contenders...

The only horse to draw wider than Get Funky is Mr. Nightlinger, a certified win machine who bookends the 14-horse field. Mr. Nightlinger boasts five straight victories entering the Turf Sprint, each coming in brilliant wire-to-wire fashion. The skein includes the GIII Shakertown S. at Keeneland in April, the GIII Turf Sprint at Churchill in May, and, in his latest, the Arlington Turf Sprint in August.

If Mr. Nightlinger isn't on the lead 100 yards out of the gate, he'll be only inches removed from it. That could equate to a hot duel with the equally fleet California Flag, the horse that took this year's Morvich in recalibrate-your-stopwatch splits of :21, :42 2/5, 1:04 4/5 and 1:11--a course record at Santa Anita. An improving four-year-old, California Flag has won three of his last four. True to Tradition carries the flag for the East Coast-based runners. The gelding captured the \$250,000, five-furlong Turf Monster H. at Philly Park Sept. 1, then shipped to annex the GII Nearctic H. at Woodbine Oct. 4.

Wild Card...

The clear wild cards this year are the Euros--the fillies Fleeting Spirit (Ire) and Only Answer (GB) and the veteran Diabolical. The latter is familiar to U.S. fans as the impressive winner of the '07 GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. on dirt. Purchased by Sheikh Mohammed after that, Diabolical hasn't lived up to expectations, but showed signs of life with a good runner-up effort in the G2 Diadem S. at Ascot Sept. 28. He's probably been facing much better than these, and is a threat if he handles the course. That can also be said of Fleeting Spirit. The three-year-old miss won the G2 Temple S. in May, was third in the G1 King's Stand S. in June, and came home fifth off the layoff in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye Oct. 5.

The inaugural \$500,000 Breeders' Cup Marathon,



which will kick off Saturday's action, is dominated by two questions: "Who can handle the distance?" and "Who can handle the surface?" Only four horses have won at the Marathon distance or longer over an allweather surface. They are **Big Booster, Delightful Kiss, Muhannak** (Ire) and **Zappa**. On paper, the pace should be honest, but riding tactics could play a determining role in who wins the Marathon.

Zappa stamped himself as a top contender for the Marathon with a gate-to-wire 6 1/2-length domination of the Cougar II H. at Del Mar July 30. With a guaranteed berth in the Marathon courtesy from his triumph in

the Cougar II--a "Win and You're In" event--and no remaining Breeders' Cup prep races beyond 1 1/8 miles on the main track, Zappa was entered against Breeders' Cup Classic contenders in his next two starts. In the 1 1/4-mile GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24, Zappa was

jostled around at the top

of the stretch and passed tiring horses to finish an honest fourth, 3 1/4 lengths behind the winner Go Between (Point Given). Zappa returned in the GI Goodwood S. at 1 1/8 miles Sept. 27, where he raced evenly to finish seventh by 4 3/4 lengths. "He won that race to get in at Del Mar and he had plenty of time [before the Marathon]," said Zappa's trainer John Sadler of the decision to prep the six-year-old in two shorter Grade I events. "We decided to enter him in the Pacific Classic, where he ran well despite not having the best trip. He did all right in the Goodwood, but he's probably a cut below the best horses." Sadler believes Zappa will be forwardly placed, but not necessarily on the lead. "I haven't seen the past performances and I only know the California horses, but we don't think we'll be far back," Sadler said. "He should get a good trip." Zappa, winner of the GII San Pasqual H. in January, is the only horse in the field who has been tested over Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface under race conditions.

Wild Card...

Sixties Icon (GB) has the sharpest form of any Marathon entrant, but has only raced over turf. The fouryear-old gelding has won three straight races, all in England. The five-year-old was a one-length winner of the G3 Glorious S. at Goodwood Aug. 1 before he closed to win by a nose in the last stride of the GIII Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury 15 days later. To complete the hat trick, Sixties Icon annexed the Cumberland Lodge S. at Ascot Sept. 28. Muhannak (Ire), a neckwinner of the Diamond S. over the all-weather at Dundalk Sept. 26, is the only European invader to have tried a synthetic surface.

The Contenders...

Delightful Kiss, the only other Breeders' Cup Challenge winner in the field, will try to come from far back. The stretch-runner earned an automatic spot in the gate

for the Marathon with his victory in the 12-furlong GIII Turfway Park Fall Championship S. Sept. 6, his first start beyond 1 1/8 miles. The gray gelding's trainer Pete Anderson, who won the 1958 Belmont S. as a jockey aboard Cavan, said he picked that spot specifically because it was a designated "Win and You're In" event. Wanting one

more prep for the four-year-old, Anderson then sent Delightful Kiss west to Golden Gate Fields for the GIII All American S. Sept. 27 on the advice of his daughter, Aggie Ordonez, who trains on the Northern California circuit. Despite cutting back to 1 1/8 miles in the All American, Delightful Kiss rallied from last of seven to defeat Awesome Gem (Awesome Again) by one length. "I'm a big believer in going long and coming back short," Anderson said. Delightful Kiss set track records in his last two starts, albeit at seldom-contested distances over relatively new synthetic surfaces. Those thinking of backing Delightful Kiss may want to



check a thermometer Saturday, as the gelding doesn't sweat and prefers cooler climates, which is why Anderson has been training the him at Golden Gate. Trainer Mike Mitchell has been pointing a pair of geldings, Big Booster and Church Service, to the Marathon, but had managed to keep their paths separate until now. Big Booster posted Big Booster Benoit a mild 7-1 upset in the GII San Juan

Capistrano at about 1 3/4 miles on turf

in April, then added a score in the 13-furlong Gallant Man H. in June. The seven-year-old was subsequently fifth in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, then found himself the victim of a slow pace in the Cougar II H. most recently, where he finished third, eight lengths behind Zappa. Church Service, hero of the GIII Dallas Turf Cup H. in May, was fourth in the GII Del Mar H. at 1 3/8 miles on turf Aug. 23 in his latest start. Cedar Mountain (Ire), winner of the Round Table H. in June and second in the GII Sunset H. in July in the last two times he went postward, broke his maiden by seven lengths in May 2007 over the all-weather at Southwell in England.

Can anyone beat the bay amazon Zenyatta? A small



but select field, including defending Eclipse Champion Older Mare Ginger Punch, will try to do just that. The truth is, it's a tall order indeed. The towering mare, who stands a hair over 17 hands, is undefeated in eight career starts, seven of which were collected in her home state of

California. After getting a late start, Zenyatta made only two starts at three, but managed to march through her conditions with aplomb. A winner in her 2008 bow in the GII El Encino S. in January, the filly made her only start out of the state a winning one, taking the GI Apple Blossom H. on the dirt at Oaklawn Apr. 5. Back at her home base of Hollywood for the GII Milady H. May 31, she overcame a tight start but proved best once again, handing Santa Teresita a 2 1/2-length defeat. A half length ahead of the talented Tough Tiz's Sis in the GI Vanity H. July 5, the four-year-old added the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. At Del Mar next time out Aug. 2. Arguably her best performance to date, however, would be her most recent when she switched into overdrive late and powered home an authoritative 3 1/2 length winner over a very worthy rival, Hystericalady.

Wild Card...

Carriage Trail gave a hint of bigger things to come when she finished third behind Hysterical Lady and Pussycat Doll in last year's GI Humana Distaff. The homebred finally collected her first graded score in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Doubledogdare S. over the Polytrack at Keeneland Apr. 18; three starts later, she added a narrow victory over the Saratoga lawn in the mile De La Rose S. July 30. Unable to overtake champion Wait a While in the GII Ballston Spa S. Aug. 21, the bay broke through with a career best in Keeneland's GI Spinster S. Oct. 5, galloping home an easy 7 3/4-length winner. The five-year-old, a winner of three of four prior starts on synthetic, looks ready to fire another big shot.

The Contenders...

Ginger Punch rounded out 2007 with five wins from eight starts, including a driving score over the ultragame Hystericalady in a soggy edition of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Monmouth. That victory clinched a

divisional title for the Adena Springs homebred, and the chestnut wasted little time resuming with the same kind flare in 2008. Fresh off a two-month respite, the champion dashed home a 6 3/4length winner in the restricted Sunshine Millions Distaff at Gulfstream Jan. 26, but was quickly humbled when a distant third behind winner Zenyatta in the Cocoa Beach (Chi) (left),

Apple Blossom. Back in the win-

ner's circle for the GII Louisville S.

May 2, she followed up with triumphs in the 1 1/16mile GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont June 14 and the Spa's GI Go For Wand H. July 26. Back to business with a narrow score in the 10-furlong GI Personal Ensign S. Aug. 22, the champion tried to take it wire-towire in her latest in the slop in the Sept. 27 GI Beldame S., but was caught at the wire by an up-and-comer Cocoa Beach (Chi). That Chilean import proved successful in four career starts in her native land, including a pair of romps in group company, before resurfacing in 2008 in Goldolphin's blue silks in the United Arab Emirates. Runner up against allowance foes in January, the dark bay reeled off to flashy victories against fillies in the UAE 1000 Guineas and the UAE Oaks. Well regarded for her next one, the filly rallied late to be third against the boys in the G2 UAE Derby Mar. 29. Given a break after that one, Cocoa Beach marked her U.S. debut with a sharp looking five-length score in the Love Sign S. going nine panels at Saratoga Aug. 29, and, despite going off second choice behind Ginger Punch in the Beldame, managed to get the best of the champion in the final strides to eke out a half-length victory. The filly, a winner in three of four starts at the nine-furlong distance, appears to peaking at just the right time to challenge the favorites.

different horse since turning five and joining Christophe Clement's barn. Purchased for \$900,000 by Robert Scarborough at last year's Keeneland November sale, the bay has already paid for herself and then some, winning five out of seven starts this term,

and bankrolling more than \$1 million in earnings. She put together a four-race winning streak over three different courses, posting tallies in Calder's Mairzy Doates H. Apr. 26, Belmont's GII Sheepshead Bay H. May 24 and GII New York S. June 21, and the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 9. Favored at 3-5 in a soggy renewal of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. last time Sept. 27, Mauralakana was uncharacteristically rank in the early stages beneath Kent Desormeaux, tossing her head multiple times before the clubhouse turn. She began to settle in fourth--while under a tight hold--as Dynaforce got away with murder on the front end, setting splits of :26.23 and :52.87. Mauralakana catapulted herself toward the lead on the turn for home, but was turned back by Dynaforce in the stretch, who had plenty left in the tank following those easy early splits. Mauralakana held on to complete the exacta. "The lack of pace and the soft going probably compromised my chances," Desormeaux said following the Flower Bowl. "I got past [Dynaforce] and I was faster than the winner, but I couldn't sustain the run. The ground caused that." The French-bred should relish the firmer conditions at Santa Anita Friday.

The Contenders...

Wait a While, the Eclipse champion three-year-old filly of 2006, has been based primarily with Todd Pletcher on the East Coast, but has really thrived when shipped to Southern California. The gray is perfect in three attempts over the Santa Anita lawn, posting wins in the 2006 and 2008 GI Yellow Ribbon S., as well as the GII San Gorgonio H. earlier this year in January. She has also run a pair of big ones over the Hollywood Park spinach, scoring in impressive fashion in the 2006 GI American Oaks and placing second in the 2007 GI Matriarch S. Wait a While has bounced back from a disappointing seventh in Saratoga's GI Diana S. July 26 with victories in the GII Ballston Spa H. Aug. 21 and the aforementioned Yellow Ribbon in her latest appearance Sept. 27.

ing her the victory, but it got her to the next step in the GI Del Mar Debutante. Switched off towards the rear of a full field, she commenced her rally on the turn, circled her rivals and ran off to a 4 3/4-length victory over Palacio de Amor (Dixieland Band). Horses that excel going one turn don't always translate that form to two turns, but such was not the case with this filly. Content to linger at the back of the field in the GI Oak Leaf S. over the Breeders' Cup course and distance, she awoke leaving the three-eighths pole and was ridden out to a 3 1/2-length score over Palacio de Amor. Stardom Bound went five furlongs in :59 1/5 at Hollywood Saturday, galloping out six panels in 1:11 flat. If Paasch is correct in his current assessment of his filly, the competition had best beware. "When [jockey] Mike [Smith] came by the other day, he couldn't believe how much better she looks since the Oak Leaf," continued Paasch. "She's gotten bigger and stronger, and he couldn't believe how well she worked." He continued, "I never take anything for granted. Two-year-olds are changing so quickly at this time of year. She's proven herself at the distance and over the surface, a big plus for us." A victory in the Juvenile Fillies will clinch a championship for Stardom Bound, who has a little added incentive to win; she is consigned to the Fasig-Tipton November sale Nov. 2.

The Contenders...

It was a classic display of the ups and downs of Thoroughbred racing. Trainer Steve Klesaris was at Keeneland Oct. 3 to saddle GI Spinaway S. winner Mani Bhavan in the GI Darley Alcibiades S., but the daughter of Storm Boot did not handle

ever we've put her on, including



Turf. She was victorious in her debut at Saratoga Aug. 25, where she was dangled for a \$75,000 claiming price. "She has a marginal pedigree, so nobody was going to jump up and claim her for \$75,000," said her trainer Chad Brown. "We wanted to put her where she could win." And she did just that, sweeping by

four-wide to win by 1 1/2 lengths. The dark bay tried stakes competition and soft turf for the first time in her next race, Belmont's GIII Miss Grillo S. Oct 1, where she closed wide once again to win by a neck. "After a two-year-old breaks maiden, you have to enter in a stakes more often than not," Brown said. The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filles Turf will be her first start outside the state of New York.

The Contenders...

Laragh began her career at Woodbine for trainer Mark



Casse, where she broke her maiden in her second start by 1 3/4 lengths over Polytrack, prompting IEAH to buy a stake in the filly. She then tried stakes company in her next start in her turf debut, the GIII Natalma S., where she faded to fifth after setting the pace over soft grass. Subsequently transferred to the

barn of John Terranova, she made a clear lead in the Jessamine S. at Keeneland on firm ground to post an 11-1 upset by 4 3/4 lengths. Terranova expects Laragh to carve out the fractions again. "She looks like a filly who knows where she wants to be," Terranova said. "Last time [jockey Edgar Prado] didn't send her to the lead, but she just went there as she gets into the bit."

Contenders cont.

Unraced since winning the Natalma by a neck is C Karma, who will make her first start away here. The Natalma, where she stalked in fourth and challenged for the lead with an eighth to go, was C Karma's first start on turf and her first beyond six furlongs. Hoping to turn the tables on Maram are the maiden Freedom Rings and **Consequence**, who finished second and fourth, respectively, in the Miss Grillo. Heart Shaped, winner of the Marble Hill S. at The Curragh in May, has been knocking heads in group competition in England, having made her latest two efforts at Newmarket. After finishing fourth in the G2 Hinton S. July 9, she returned to be fifth of 16 in the G1 Cheveley Park S. Oct. 9. The Aidan O'Brien trainee has never raced beyond six furlongs. The same goes for Beyond Our Reach (Ire), third in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh Aug 31 before she finished ninth in the Cheveley Park.

Wildcard...

There are several parallels involving **Renda** and **Sugar Mom**. Both are unraced on grass, yet their connections

have opted for this spot over the Juvenile Fillies. Renda improved vastly when stretched out to two turns, taking an off-the-turf renewal of the Junior Champion S. at Monmouth by seven Aug. 23 before she drew off to win the Brave Raj S. at Calder by

5 1/4 Sept. 27. Her freshman sire Medaglia d'Oro never tried the sod, but is a son of El Prado (Ire). Sugar Mom also won her route debut, a 1 1/16 mile off-the turf allowance at Arlington Sept. 5, before she closed five-wide to annex the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies by a length Sept. 27.

There have been seven two-time winners in the illustrious 24-year history of the Breeders' Cup, but no horse has ever annexed two different races. Several

have swung and missed, including Juvenile champ and Kentucky Derby hero Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), who finished fourth in last year's Classic. Champion Indian Blessing, the 2007 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine, looks poised to become the first to accomplish the elusive feat when she lines up as the favorite in Friday's Filly & Mare Sprint. After suffering her first two career defeats behind subsequent GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Ala-

bama S. victress Proud Spell (Proud Citizen) in the GII Fair Ground Oaks Mar. 8 and 🖸 "TDN Rising Star" S Zaftig in the GI Acorn S. June 7, it was decided to turn back the Hal and Patti Earnhardt homebred to sprints. "The stretch-outs were taking their toll on her, it was too far, so I decided to guit stretching her out, and shorten her up," trainer Bob Baffert told Daily Racing Form. The dark bay has been nothing short of spectacular since, reeling off three straight victories while showing a new dimension. A stone front-runner in her first seven starts, she rallied from fourth to post a 5 1/4-length tally in the muddy going in the GI Prioress S. July 5. "They out-footed her away from there," Baffert continued. "So [jockey John Velazquez] grabbed her, took her to the outside, and she ran a tremendous race. Shortening up, you can rate them a little bit because they're going so fast." Her new-found ability to rate proved to be key once again in the seven-furlong GI Test S. at Saratoga Aug. 2. With Velazguez in the irons for the second straight time, Indian Blessing sat a bit closer to the leaders, but the result was just as impressive--a seven-length tour-de-force. Freshened for a fall campaign, the daughter of SW & MGSP Shameful (Flying Chevron) had no problem defeating three older fillies in the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Park last out Sept. 20, rolling home to a 6 1/4-length decision. She has raced on a synthetic surface only once in her career, hanging on for a head victory in the GII Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita in her sophomore bow Jan. 13. The O "TDN Rising Star" O has been training like a rocket over the Pro-Ride since returning to the Golden State, tuning up for this with a sharp five-furlong breeze in :59.20 Oct. 18.

The Contenders...

In a contest absolutely loaded with speed, stretchrunner Intangaroo certainly merits attention. The daughter of 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Orientate went on a six-race losing streak after debuting with a win at Hollywood last June, but has really put it all together in her four-year-old season. The dark bay has annexed three wins at the highest level at the sevenfurlong distance of the F/M Sprint--the GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita Feb. 2, the GI Humana Distaff S. at Churchill on Derby day and the GI Ballerina S. at the Spa last out Aug. 24. Intangaroo marks the first Breeders' Cup starter for conditioner Gary Sherlock, who began training in 1966. Juddmonte homebred Ventura (Chester House) has made 11 of career 14 starts on turf, but has been very impressive in a handful of attempts on all-weather. A listed winner going a mile over Kempton's Polytrack last November, Ventura made her graded-stakes debut at Keeneland a winning one, rallying from 10th to collect the seven-furlong GII Vinery Madison S. over the Polytrack in April. The dark bay has raced exclusively on the lawn since, posting a career high in the GI Just a Game S. on the Belmont S. undercard, finishing second by a nose in Hollywood's GII CashCall Mile July 5, and completing the exacta against the boys in the GI Woodbine Mile S. Sept. 7.

Wild Card...

Another that figures to benefit from a hot pace is Magnificience. The gorgeous chestnut looked like racing's next superstar following an eye-catching maiden win and a dominant five-length victory in the 2007 GIII Santa Paula S. over Santa Anita's former dirt course, but an ankle chip forced her to the sidelines for an extended absence. The 🛇 "TDN Rising Star" 🛇 resurfaced with a narrow allowance tally at Hollywood in May, and has held her own versus graded stakes company since. A tardy beginning and wide trip compromised her chances when second-best behind the speed demon Dearest Trickski in the GII A Gleam H. June 28. Last of nine at the top of the Del Mar stretch in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. Aug. 24, the long-striding filly got rolling way too late and had to settle for fifth, beaten only 2 1/2 lengths by Dearest Trickski once again. Magnificience, never longer than 5-2 at the windows in six career starts, should offer plenty of value here after placing a mediocre third behind Tizzy's Tune and Tiz Elemental in the Pine Tree Lane S. at Oak Tree Sept. 28.
