O'BRIEN CONFIDENT WITH CLASSIC CONTENDERS

Trainer Aidan O'Brien, overseeing his charge's final preparations for Breeders' Cup Championship weekend, had high praise for Classic hopefuls **Duke of Marmalade** (Ire) (Danehill) and **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo). Both Group 1 winners will be making their first start on

the synthetic track. "These two colts are as good as colts as we've ever had," O'Brien said. "They have tough constitutions. They both handle fast ground. Obviously, the Duke stays very well. We're not sure about Henry, but he looks like he could get a mile and a quarter." Duke of Marmalade won five straight Group 1 races this year before running seventh in the

G1 Prix de l' Arc de Triomphe last time out. "Obviously, you'd say a mile and a half on the grass might not be an ideal prep for the Classic, but the Arc was there and it's such a prestigious race and worth so much money, we felt we had to let him take his chance when the ground was OK," O'Brien explained. The trainer added that the four-year-old came out of the Arc in good shape. "He's in good form and the minute Johnny [Murtagh] came in after the Arc he said he pulled up real good. Always, the lad's first impressions are what you like to hear. He was very happy. He didn't come in for one minute and say he was gone or down. If he did, you'd be worried. He said he never really got into top gear." *Cont. p2*

INDYANNE OFFICIALLY OUT OF F/M SPRINT


David and Jill Heerensperger's Indvanne (Indian Charlie) was officially scratched from the Filly & Mare Sprint yesterday after spiking a temperature earlier in the week. "It's not a really bad situation," said trainer Greg Gilchrist. "Everything she has, on a scale of 1 to 10, you're talking about a three. That's where we'd like to keep it. If we went over there and ran her, instead of having a 101 temperature, she'd probably be 104. Instead of a minor cough, you'd have a major cough, and instead of leaving a little feed, you'd have a lot of feed. So with things like this, things can turn serious if you don't treat them right." According to Gilchrist, the filly, who had to endure a three-hour delay while shipping down from her Northern California base, may have been fighting off something minor, and her recent campaign and travel schedule may have resulted in her fever. "In any case, I feel that she wouldn't have run well even we decided to press ahead, so in fairness to her, to the owners and everyone who would put a bet on her, why would we want to run a horse that we knew wouldn't give a good performance. I can tell you that if this race were next week, I'm sure she'd probably be in it." Giving credit to the filly's owners, Gilchrist added, "I am very fortunate that the Heerenpergers are very agreeable with all this. She's been a good filly to us, and we just want to do what's right for her." The winner of three of four starts this term, the grey romped home a 9 ½-length winner in the GIII Azalea S. July 12 before finishing only a half-length behind Porte Bonheur in the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga Aug. 23. In her most recent start, the three-year-old won the GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. over Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 4.

NEW RIDER FOR SMOOTH AIR


Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz) will have a new rider for the GI Classic. The sophomore has been ridden in all 11 of his starts by Manoel Cruz, but Rafael Bejarano has the mount Saturday. Owner Brian Burns of Mount Joy Stables said the change was a "personal decision." The Calder-based Cruz rode Smooth Air to wins in the GII Hutcheson S. and GII Ohio Derby and finished 11th aboard the colt in the GI Kentucky Derby.

ELUSIVE BLUFF OUT OF JUVENILE

Southern Equine Stable's Elusive Bluff (Elusive Quality) has been scratched from Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile after suffering a bruised hoof. "Just another day in paradise," trainer Eric Guillot guipped yesterday. "That's racing. It was a freakish thing. In the bulb of a back foot, he bruised the shell. He was dead lame yesterday afternoon. We decided to scratch last night. He's walking fine this morning, but he can't put any weight on it, so he can't jog. He'll be 100 percent next week, but that doesn't help us right now." Elusive Bluff would have been making his first start on the main track in the Juvenile. In two grass starts, he won a Belmont maiden at first asking Sept. 5 and, after being purchased privately by Mike Moreno's Southern Equine, rallied to take the GIII Pilgrim S. in New York Oct. 1.

MAST TRACK QUESTIONABLE

Dirt hopeful **Mast Track** (Mizzen Mast), battling a quarter crack all week, came back from his Thursday morning gallop moving uneasily. "It's bothering him a little bit," admitted owner/breeder/trainer Bobby Frankel. "We'll see how he is in the morning."



FASTER THAN A SPEEDIN' BULLET

A half-dozen three-year-olds have managed to take down their elders in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and

two of those used a victory in the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint as a springboard to success on Championship Day. The first of those was Reraise, who parlayed his win at Turfway into a 7-2 score at Churchill 10 years ago. The other horse to complete the KY Cup/Breeders' Cup double was Cajun Beat, who came to Santa

Anita a decided longshot in 2003, but walked away the 22-1 upsetter. Danny Dion's **Fatal Bullet** (Red Bullet) isn't necessarily bred to excel at six furlongs, but that he has, and he brings a record of seven wins from eight starts over synthetic tracks into this year's Sprint. For good measure, he hasn't been beaten at three-quarters of a mile and trainer Reade Baker says his charge is ready for his stiffest test to date. "As a three-year-old, he has an advantage," he said. "He's beaten older horses already this year and three-year-olds are likely to improve at this time of year, while the older horses tend not to. He's got a great post and if he runs well on the artificial surface, there are a lot of positives."



NO WAY OF STOPPING

After a busy Wednesday morning full of Breeders' Cup-bound runners making their rounds, a huge crowd gathered yesterday near Santa Anita's Clockers Corner to get a glimpse of the stars. Defending GI Breeders'



Cup Classic champion Curlin (Smart Strike) duly made his circuit, but it was the late-morning appearance of Zenyatta (Street Cry (Ire)) that had the crowd buzzing. The rangy filly left her Hollywood Park home Wednesday afternoon to school in the paddock here, and was well aware of all eyes being on her as she stepped onto the track. Her famous stride on display, she

Sarah Andrew looked every part of her 3-5 morning-line price for today's

GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic nee Distaff. Trainer John Shirreffs seemed fairly relaxed back at the barn as Zenyatta and stablemate Tiago (Pleasant Tap) cooled out.

"She really is something, isn't she?" he said with a smile. "Nothing intimidates her."

Shirreffs took his time bringing along the dark bay, who didn't make it to the races until Thanksgiving of her three-year-old season, when she was tabbed as a **O "TDN Rising Star" O**. While there were certain expectations from the start--she is a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Balance and possesses an undeniable presence--Zenyatta has established a remarkable reputation just 11 months after her debut.

"She came in with the reputation of having a big stride and might be nice, but we never thought we'd be in this position--to have her be eight-for-eight, and going into such a big race as such a favorite," said Shirreffs, a Kansas native, who is looking for his first Breeders' Cup winner.

Zenyatta has employed the same style in each of her eight starts: breaks in no big hurry, lopes along near the

back of the pack and shifts into gear approaching the far turn. She'll likely work out a way to do it from her inside post this afternoon, according to Shirreffs.

"The good thing about having the rail is that I told [jockey] Mike [Smith], 'They're not even going to know where you are," he said.



Tiago cooled out at the same time as his celebrated stablemate. A hard-fought winner of the GII Oaklawn H. back in April, he looks to be rounding into form just in time for the Classic. The Moss homebred surged late to finish second in the GI Goodwood S. Sept. 27, and Saturday's additional furlong is right up his alley.

"He's doing very well," said Shirreffs.

A multiple Grade I winner at three in 2007, the big bay will stand at Adena Springs upon his retirement, but it's not clear when exactly he'll join his GI Kentucky Derbywinning sibling Giacomo (Holy Bull) in the stallion barn.

"A lot will depend how he does Saturday," said Shirreffs. -M Kizenko

SUTHERLAND CONFIDENT IN 'BIRD'

Jockey Chantal Sutherland will be competing in her first Breeders' Cup Championships this year, and the Canadian jockey is confident that the two-year-old colt **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) will give her a good chance at a win. Mine That Bird carries a four-race winning

skein into the GI Breeders'
Cup Juvenile, including a lastout victory in the GIII Grey S.
at Oct. 5. The Grey was Mine
That Bird's first route attempt,
and he relaxed well under
Sutherland, who also rode
him in his two previous efforts. "He can do anything,"
Sutherland asserted. "He has

tactical speed and can be close to the pace. He's very jockey friendly; he'll do whatever you ask of him." As for his ability to handle Santa Anita's Pro-Ride surface, Sutherland said, "It feels very similar to the surface at Woodbine, and I've noticed that the Woodbine horses have been doing well over it. I worked him the other day and he went over it beautifully." Mine That Bird was trained by David Cotey at Woodbine, but has since been moved to Richard Mandella's barn. Before Sutherland rides Mine That Bird in the Juvenile, she'll pilot another horse shipping from Canada, Van Lear Rose (Stroll). The filly goes in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "I like her a lot, too," Sutherland said.

ADMIRAL ON THE LOOKOUT

Back in 1990, Vincent O'Brien was represented by his one and only Breeders' Cup starter, Royal Academy, who got up in the last jump of the Mile to prevail under his equally legendary rider, Lester Piggot. O'Brien's son Charles was in the winner's circle that day as his assistant. Having previously worked for John Gosden during that trainer's stint in California, O'Brien took out his own license in 1993. He'll have his first Breeders' Cup starter Saturday when Lord Admiral (El Prado {Ire}) runs in the Dirt Mile. The seven-year-old, owned by the elder O'Brien, will break from the outside.

"I've been compromised slightly by the draw," O'Brien admitted. "Twelve of 12 is definitely not what I was looking for, especially with that short run into the first bend."

This isn't Lord Admiral's first trip to California--two years ago, the bay ran third by 1 1/2 lengths to Aragorn (Ire) in the GII Oak Tree BC Mile. He returned to Ireland to win the G3 Ballycorus S. last year before having a very productive winter in Dubai. He kicked off 2008 with a win in the G3 AI Rashidiya, ran third to Archipenko in the G2 AI Fahidi Fort and topped Jay Peg (SAf) in the G2 Jebel Hatta. Drawn on the far outside in the G1 Dubai Duty Free, the veteran rallied to finish a deceptive 10th to Jay Peg in that \$5-million affair at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29.

"This has probably been his best year," O'Brien offered. "He needs very little training, which helps his longevity, obviously. He doesn't really do anything between his races. He ran very well in the Duty Free-again, he had a terrible draw...he made up an awful lot of ground and was beaten only four lengths. It was actually a very good run."

The Pennsylvania-bred got back on a plane following a fifth to New Approach (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S. and had a rough time of it in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland, finishing fourth by 1 1/2 lengths Oct. 4. O'Brien thought about taking on the top three finishers that day--Thorn Song, Shakis (Ire) and War Monger--again in the \$2-million Mile, but opted for this spot instead.

"It was partly because he'd already been here a couple of weeks and trained well on it [the synthetic surface]--he seems happy on it," explained O'Brien. "And partly because it looked to be the weaker race."

Black Mamba bypassed the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf for this softer spot. The bay mare has hit the board in all 11 of her U.S. outings and all but one of those have been graded affairs. She won the June 29 GII Beverly Hills H. at Hollywood and the Aug. 3 GI John C Mabee H. at Del Mar. She was hardly disgraced with a lateclosing third-place effort behind Wait a While and Vacare in the Sept. 27 GI Yellow Ribbon S. The consistent Roshani was uncharacteristically off-the-board when seventh in the Oct. 3 GI First Lady S. That was the five-year-old's first start since winning the May 17 GIII Galorette H. at Pimlico. She captured her only other start over this course in a one-mile optional claimer Mar. 9. Valbenny, a two-time graded stakes winner at Hollywood last summer, finished fifth in the Yellow Ribbon in her first outing for trainer Bobby Frankel.





Solid support for the three-year-old glamour filly Samantha Miss ensured she shares favouritism with Kiwi mare Princess Coup at A\$3.60 as she aims to achieve what MG1W Miss Finland (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) could not. Miss Finland was the last filly to tackle the Cox Plate, finishing sixth two years ago. "It obviously takes a very special filly to win it, because only one has, but my filly is very sensible and I think she'll handle the occasion," trainer Kris Lees said. "She was only ever going to this race if she continued to be totally dominant against her own age and sex, and she's done that. If she's back here next year, she'll have eight kilograms more, but you have to ask yourself if she'll be any better. Was Miss Finland any better at four than three?"

Alamosa Camp Increasingly Confident...

Mick Price lost Cox Plate prospects Fantastic Light (Aus) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) and Pompeii Ruler (NZ) (Genuine {Jpn}) to setbacks in recent weeks, but the trainer is increasingly confident about last start G1 Toorak H. winner Alamosa. "This horse is full of himself and right at his absolute top," Price said, adding a four-week break between starts was ideal for the entire. "In the Toorak, he drew a gate where we were able to ride him mid-field with cover, and I was happy with the way he hit the line. We always planned to ride him off the speed in the Cox Plate, and I would think barrier seven is the ideal gate for some others to go forward and for us to stay out of trouble. I really don't think 2040 meters holds any fears for him. He's a four-year-old entire now and he's ready to go. I won't have any excuses."

Big Ask for Raheeb...

Big spender Nathan Tinkler, who has outlaid A\$40 million on 240 yearlings and a considerable sum on tried horses, mares and stallions in the last 12 months, has his first Cox Plate starter with Raheeb, a reported A\$1 million purchase for Tinkler's Patinack racing operation. Raheeb tracked Alamosa into the race, but was unable to match his turn of foot when third in the Toorak H. Oct. 11. He is yet to win beyond 1600 meters.

Sirmione Set to Deliver Milestone for Bart...

Bart Cummings' 250th Group 1 victor is proving elusive, but the Sporting Hall of Famer has Group 1 Australian Cup winner **Sirmione** in the Cox Plate. That one has defeated Princess Coup twice at Group 1 level over 2000 meters, in last spring's Mackinnon S. and in the Australian Cup earlier this year. Jockey Damien Oliver said, "He doesn't have to improve a massive amount to be in the finish. He can turn his form around pretty quickly, so if the race is more truly run he'll be in the finish". Cummings has won three Cox Plates, with Taj Rossi (Aus) (Matrice {Aus}), Saintly (Aus) (Sky Chase {NZ}) and Dane Ripper (Aus) (Danehill).

Among Rau's other achievements are the G2 German 1000 Guineas wins of Rose of Zollern (Ire) in 1999 and Anna Monda (Ger) three years ago and Donaldson (Ger) in the 2006 G1 Bayerisches Zuchtrennen, while highlights this season include the successes of Abbadjinn (Ger) in the G3 Benazet-Rennen and G3 Silberne Peitsche, Egerton (Ger) in the G2 Hansa-Preis and Abbashiva (Ger) in the G3 Grosse Hessen Meile.
