EUROS WIN FIVE IN FIRST SYNTHETIC BC

The first Breeders' Cup World Championships to be contested over a synthetic racing surface attracted an unprecedented number of entries from overseas--a total of 35 horses representing Argentina, Japan, South Africa and major European nations. And, for the first time in Breeders' Cup history, horses based outside of

the United States took home Breeders' Cup trophies in five of the 14 championship events on the weekend.

upset, followed three races later by a powerhouse success in the Mile by Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa). Donativum (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who bested G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Crowded House (GB) in the Tattersalls Million, provided Frankie Dettori with one of his two patented flying dismounts with a victory over fellow Euro Westphalia (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Juvenile Turf. Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), who had the curious distinction of cutting back in distance off his win in the 1 3/4-mile G1 St Leger, outfinished Eagle Mountain (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) in the Turf. To put icing on the cake, archrivals Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) and Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo), neither of which had seen one yard past eight furlongs in their respective distinguished careers, ran the guinella in the \$5-million Classic as Curlin (Smart Strike) finished fourth. "It's been an extra special day, we had a pretty good armory to come and tackle this challenge," said Dettori. "You need the stock and we had the stock this vear."

Princess Haya and trainer John Gosden capped off a memorable afternoon at Santa Anita when Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) charged down the center of Pro-Ride to post a 1 3/4-length win over Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Curlin (Smart Strike) rallied to the front on the turn and looked on his way to victory, but relinquished the lead inside the final furlong and was outfinished for third by Tiago (Pleasant Tap). MIDNIGHT LUTE REPEATS IN THE SPRINT

In the quarter-century history of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, no horse had successfully defended his championship. That all changed in somewhat miraculous fashion yesterday, when **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet), with just one seasonal appearance to his credit, came wide into the Santa Anita stretch and wore down pacesetting **Fatal Bullet** (Red Bullet) for a clear-cut victory. **Cont. p4**

PASSING THE CLASSIC TEST

Pegged as the 6-1 second choice to **Curlin** (Smart Strike) on the morning line, **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) went off at more than double those odds and rewarded the believers with a major upset. The chestnut established his reputation as a world-class miler, with runner-up efforts to **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) in

the GI St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 17 and in the G1 Sussex S. July 30 before turning the tables in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot last time Sept. 27. Still, questions abounded as he tried 10 furlongs and something other than turf for the first time. Raven's Pass broke well,

but did not look entirely comfortable down the stretch the first time, swapping leads a couple of times while tracking Curlin's every move. For his part, neither did the favorite appear completely at ease, as he received a busier ride from Robby Albarado than he is accustomed to. Still, Curlin was asked to go on the turn and the response was immediate and ominous, as the reigning Horse of the Year circled rivals to lead into the stretch. But Frankie Dettori on Raven's Pass, as if towed along by an invisible tether, followed his move on the bend and into the lane. It was clear at the eighth pole that it wasn't to be Curlin's day, as Raven's Pass rolled by to a convincing score. Henrythenavigator, also trying out the synthetic, stayed on into second, while Tiago (Pleasant Tap) outnodded Curlin for third. "I was very confident that we'd be in the top three," winning trainer John Gosden offered. "He's been improving over the fall. He's been training better and better. Mentally, he's more mature. Sometimes things just go right." The connections of Curlin would disagree wholeheartedly. Said trainer Steve Asmussen, "It was a turf race. It absolutely was the Pro-Ride surface [that beat him]. He ran his heart out and gave it all he had. He's a great horse. He's made over \$10 million."

Hailing from a strong female family including champion Petrushka (Ire) and the successful sire Spectrum (Ire), Conduit broke his maiden over the all-weather at Wolverhampton in the last of three juvenile starts and made his first two appearances of this term in handicap company, taking a rich Epsom event by six lengths on the Derby undercard June 7. Runner-up in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot less than two weeks later, the chestnut rallied to post a head win in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 29 prior to his good-looking St Leger triumph.

Staying Con-sistent...

Red Rock Canyon (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who helped set the table for stablemate Duke of Marmalade (Ire) in four of his five Group 1 victories this season,

played the role of rabbit for Soldier of Fortune this time around, getting a half-mile in :47.06 and three-quarters in 1:10.20, testing fractions for the distance. The pacesetter was always going to drop tamely away, but Soldier of Fortune raced close--perhaps too close--to that tempo

and was sent up inside of his stablemate as to challenge they approached the far turn. In the meantime, Conduit was patiently handled towards the rear and was not asked for an effort until Ryan Moore switched him out for the drive. At that point he had **Eagle Mountain (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who sat an ideal trip behind the speed, to catch and he did just that, driving past in the final furlong en route to the win. "The jockey rode a masterful race and had him in the right position," said Sir Michael Stoute, winning his fourth Breeders' Cup race. "When he asked him, the jockey got him into gear and I thought from a long way out that he was going to come and pick them up and he did."

CLOCK STRIKES MIDNIGHT

Time was not on the side of **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet). The big, nearly black hero of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint has battled injuries all year and, in his only prep for yesterday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, found

himself stymied behind a wall of horses in a frustrating 10th-placed effort in the GII Pat O'Brien H. Aug. 24. What's more, he grabbed a quarter in that defeat which would ultimately require the attention of a specialist. Yesterday, all the time and trouble proved worthwhile. Sent

off the 5-2 second choice despite the setbacks, Midnight Lute, far behind early, unleashed an explosive move nearing the quarter pole that catapulted him to victory over pace factor **Fatal Bullet** (Red Bullet) and the running on favorite **Street Boss** (Street Cry {Ire}). It was a sweet victory for trainer Bob Baffert and owners Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman. "I've never had a horse like this horse," enthused Baffert, who took the Juvenile with Midshipman two races earlier. "This is the best horse I've ever trained. I've never had a horse as massive--a beautiful, big horse. He is the perfect Thoroughbred. He's the best I've ever trained." **Cont. p5**

Shades of Da Hoss...

Last season, Midnight Lute put together a record of two wins in six starts, including visually impressive victories in the GI Forego H. at Saratoga in early September and, in the slop at Monmouth, the Breeders' Cup Sprint in October. Despite finishing second to Daaher in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile in November, Midnight Lute was named champion sprinter. He was kept in training with a goal of becoming the first horse ever to repeat in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, but injuries delayed his return. The big question coming into yesterday was if the limited preparations would be enough to get the champ back to the winner's circle.

With the race whittled to eight with the early morning vet scratch of **Cost of Freedom** (Cee's Tizzy), Midnight Lute was content to trail the smallest Sprint field history under Garrett Gomez as **First Defence** (Unbridled's Song), Fatal Bullet and **Black Seventeen** (Is It True) fought through :21 1/5 and :43 4/5 splits. The front ranked softened up, Midnight Lute swooped six or seven wide into the lane and sailed home under a full head of steam.

Of all the Breeders' Cup repeats, Midnight Lute's was perhaps most reminiscent of Da Hoss, who won non-consecutive renewals of the BC Mile with only a single start in between.

What's scary, at least for his rivals, is that his connections believe we might not have seen Midnight Lute's best effort yet.


"Garrett said there's no telling how good he is,"
Baffert said. "He looks green. I took the blinkers off of him. He made the lead and he was looking around, and that is the way he was in the paddock, looking scared of the cameras that were going back and forth." Baffert added, "Turning for home, he got a little tired. He might have been a little short today. I'd have like to put one more work into him. But you know what, he is such a great horse, and he came back. This is a beast."

THE SHIP COMES IN

Asserting himself as not only the best juvenile on the West Coast but in the nation, Darley Stable's Midshipman (Unbridled's Song) dared the field to catch him on the front end and proved too good in vesterday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, cruising home clear under the hot duo of Bob Baffert and Garrett Gomez. Two and a half months ago, Midshipman was a homebred maiden racing for Bob and Janis McNair's Stonerside Stable. He had graduated by the time Sheikh Mohammed stepped in to buy the entirety of the Stonerside operation in early September, and Midshipman quickly gave his new connections reason to dream of Breeders' Cup glory when, in just his second start, he captured the Sept. 3 GI Del Mar Futurity by a nose. Rival Street Hero (Street Cry {Ire}), third in the Futurity, was able to get the best him in the GI Norfolk S. Sept. 28, but Midshipman brought his A game in their four straight meeting.

Midshipman Sets Sail...

Drawn wide in post 11, Midshipman was on the engine from the break and was up to challenge for the lead going into the first turn under Gomez. The pair sat to the outside of slight favorite **Square Eddie** and prompted :23 2/5, :47 and 1:10 3/5 splits. Midshipman began to get away in upper stretch and was always

moving like the winner in the lane. In Baffert's opinion, the victory was enough to wrap up the juvenile championship over GI Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. winner Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}), who was not supplemented to the Breeders' Cup. "He did it going two turns, he beat the

best, and that's what it's about," Baffert said. "I could have easily have kept out Indian Blessing [second in Friday's F/M Sprint]--she didn't like synthetic. But it's the Breeders' Cup, and you have to run in it. It's a championship, all the good horses should show up, and that's what it's all about." Baffert wasn't afraid to look ahead. "When [Midshipman] kicked on for home, he showed he's the real deal," said Baffert. "That was probably the most exciting part. It's hard to come along with a horse like this. He's the kind of horse that's taken the GI Kentucky Derby, and he's just getting better and better." Sheikh Mohammed often ships his top prospects to winter in Dubai, but Darley representative John Ferguson said Midshipman's immediate future is unclear.

Freddie Head, who guided the legendary Miesque to Breeders' Cup Mile victories in 1987 and 1988, made a successful debut as a trainer on Championship Day,

saddling Wertheimer et Frere's Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) to an ultra-impressive victory in yesterday's eight-furlong test. The homebred becomes the fifth filly (sixth overall) to best the boys in the Mile in its 25 runnings and first since threeyear-old Six

Perfections (Fr), who took the 2003 Mile over this very turf course. The winning conditioner gave his filly her just due. "She's a wonderful filly," Head stated. "She's in the same class as Miesque. She was a little backward before, but now she's in the same league as Miesque."

Top Class Right From the Start...

Winner of her two starts as a juvenile, Goldikova was beaten a neck in her sophomore debut over a deep Longchamp turf Apr. 3, then had the misfortune of facing the world's best turf female, Zarkava (Ire), in her next two. Second by two lengths to the eventual Arc winner in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 11 and third to the Aga Khan runner in the G1 Prix de Diane over an extended 10 furlongs June 8. Out of Zarkava's shadow and dropped back to a mile in her last three appearances, Goldikova was flawless in annexing the G3 Prix Chloe at Maisons-Laffitte July 6 before defeating fellow filly miler Darjina (Fr) by a half-length in the Aug. 3 G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville and by a similar margin in the G1 Prix du Moulin in Paris Sept. 7.


MAKING THE MOST OF THE OPPORTUNITY

It wasn't that the junior Mandella was an abject failure in saddling the horse to three wins and a pair of graded-stakes placings from his first 12 career starts. Still, the Chases thought it was time for a change. "Sometimes things like that work out for the best," Marianne Chase explained. "Although it's always sad to move a horse somewhere else,"

and they were very good to him. And they did the very best they could. Gary loved the horse, and it was really with a very heavy heart that I moved him." Any residual effects from the decision were washed right away yesterday afternoon when the attractive bay colt came from off the pace to win comfortably in the finish. Runner-up for Mandella in the GIII Affirmed H. and to Tiago in the GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. last year, Albertus Maximus was eighth in the GI Pacific Classic and needed another three starts before taking a secondlevel Hollywood allowance Apr. 23. Fourth in the GII Californian S. May 31 and fifth over the Hollywood turf July 2, he made a winning debut for the Cerin stable, taking the Sept. 1 Windy Sands H. Garrett Gomez took the reins for the first time in his latest, rallying from seventh to round out the triple in the nine-furlong GI Goodwood S. Sept. 27.

Taking It to a Higher Level...

While his better efforts heretofore had come on or near the pace. Albertus Maximus showed a new dimension in his first two starts for the barn, relaxing early before rattling home. Such were the tactics again yesterday. Allowed to settle towards the back of the pack as Two Step Salsa (Petionville) cut out demanding splits of :22.24 and :45.02, he came out a bit on the far turn and five wide into the stretch. He challenged Two Step Salsa leaving the eighth pole and was holding the slowstarting Rebellion (GB) (Mozart {Ire}) in the run to the line. "[Jockey] Garrett [Gomez] had him in a perfect position on the first turn," said Cerin, who was saddling his first Breeders' Cup winner. "I was a little concerned when he went inside, but the red sea parted. It was a superlative performance by a superlative athlete. It feels great." Favored Well Armed (Tiznow) found a bit of trouble on the first turn, was in the clear on the backstretch, but weakened out to finish ninth.



A \$2 win bet on each has now vielded a flat-bet profit of a cool \$174 following the 36-1 boilover caused by Desert Code (E Dubai) in yesterday's inaugural Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Aside from his 60-percent strike rate over the quirky downhill turf course at Santa Anita, there was apparently little to recommend Desert Code, but the four-year-old got all the splits at just the right time beneath jockey Richard Migliore and tagged Godolphin's Diabolical (Artax) for a narrow victory. Hofmans's other bombs include Alphabet Soup, who upset Cigar at 19-1 in the 1996 Classic and Adoration, who took the 2003 Distaff field gate to wire in front of the Santa Anita faithful at 40-1. Winner of the 2007 GIII Baldwin S. over track and trip. Desert Code won the Joe Hernandez S. down the hill Mar. 22 before venturing to the synthetics. Runner-up in the GII Mervyn Leroy H. Apr. 26 and in the GIII Berkeley H. May 26, he was fifth to Street Boss in the GI Triple Bend H. July 5. He returned with a seventh in the GIII Morvich H. at this track Sept. 24, but wasn't expected to make much noise here. Well back behind a scorching early pace, Desert Code began to pick off horses after crossing the dirt, shifted to the grandstand side and surged past Diabolical in the shadow of the wire. Zappa made a move for the lead after six furlongs in 1:16.20, but the other positions remained largely unchanged as the cadence quickened for the final three-eighths of a mile. Muhannak and Pat Smullen got first run into the lane, a key tactical decision, as Sixties Icon found himself full of run, but short of room with the race on the line turning for home. Muhannak began to lengthen away from the field and held on late, as the Mike Mitchell-trained duo of Church Service (Pulpit) and veteran stayer Big Booster (Acclerator) rounded out the minor placings. "He got the perfect trip," the winning conditioner commented. "[Jockey] Pat [Smullen] just said they were crawling. We worked it out beforehand that he had to be running going into the bend. Whether that meant he hit the front too soon or not, he had to be rolling going into the bend. He got that part of it right. I felt that he was just idling a little bit there the last 50 yards, but maybe he was running on empty. I don't know. Who cares?" He added, "He's trained very well all week. He's not an easy horse to train. A big, big part of this is the team at home because he hasn't been easy." Sixties Icon was still in with a chance inside the final furlong, but could not muster the late response. "The pace was too slow," his rider Frankie Dettori explained. "I didn't want to have to go nine wide, so I waited some on the turn [the second time]. It wasn't a matter of being in trouble, really. But when I was clear, he didn't have his usual turn of foot. 

He is joined by the G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up and G1 Irish Oaks heroine Moonstone, who has to put a disappointing effort when unplaced in the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Opera here behind her. "Yeats is in good form, but it's just that maybe the season has been long," Aidan O'Brien told PA Sport. "We don't know, but he seems to be in good form at home. People say that he might not handle Longchamp, but Johnny [Murtagh] felt he didn't make enough use of him the last day. The filly, you'd imagine looking at her that she might get a mile and six, so it will be interesting." Getaway bids to provide Andre Fabre with a seventh renewal and is close to the very best over middle distances despite his obvious stamina credentials. This year's G2 Jockey Club S. and G2 Grand Prix de Deauville winner was seventh in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe over a mile and a half of this circuit last time Oct. 5 and had previously proven his staying power when winning the G2 Prix Kergorlay over 1 7/8 miles at Deauville last term. Last year's heroine Allegretto will find it tougher this time, but at least comes here off an impressive success in the Sept. 11 G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster as she bids to join the list of dual winners, which most recently included Amilynx (Fr) and Westerner (GB).

BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

Avoli Pleased With First Synthetic Cup...

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited were mostly pleased in the aftermath of the two-day World Championships, held for the first time over the newly installed Pro-Ride surface at Santa Anita. "It was a tremendous two days of racing with incredible performances both days. "We had 80,000-plus fans here over the two days and everything went smoothly in the operation--a testament to our hosts, the Oak Tree Racing Association,"

said Greg Avioli, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd., following the Championship Saturday program. "The Europeans cast down the gauntlet today by winning five races and our industry is going to have come back next year with a lot good horses if we're to take back the Breeders' Cup." Avioli also addressed complaints about the sometimes exhorbitant prices for Breeders' Cup tickets. "Our high end tickets went really fast, but those for \$150 to \$200 came up a bit high, perhaps." Despite the global economic crisis, wagering on

Championship weekend seemed to hold up and perhaps even expanded year over year. Officials at the Breeders' Cup project wagering to come it at around \$155 million worldwide, which would represent about a five-percent increase from 2007. As for Santa Anita's Pro-Ride synthetic surface, Avioli gave the track high marks and insisted that synthetic surfaces are here to stay. "Dirt tracks will continue to be around for a long time--both as a function of tradition and economics--but synthetic surfaces will continue to be important."

Breeders' Cup Friday: More Races, Sunny Skies Lead to Rise in Handle...All-source handle on Friday's 10-race card at Oak Tree was \$47,863,774, with \$6,852,096 wagered on track. The five Breeders' Cup races generated \$33,180,205 worth of handle, with \$4,315,487 bet at Santa Anita. The official attendance was 31,257. Monmouth Park, which contested three Breeders' Cup races on Friday Oct. 26, handled \$25,331,696 on that 10-race card, excluding separate pool wagering. The total wagered on the three Breeders' Cup races on the 2007 card was \$13,383,871. The official on-track crowd of 27,803 at Monmouth Park, which had to cope with rain, wagered \$5,038,975 on the full card.
