SUGAR RAY SETS RECORD AT TATTERSALLS

Sugar Ray (Ire) (Danehill) became the dearest male horse in training to pass through a European sale ring in Newmarket when making 600,000gns at Tattersalls during yesterday's second session of the Autumn

and trainer Sir Michael Stoute. Anthony Stroud--who

was underbidder to Mags O'Toole on Sugar Ray as a yearling--landed the prize this time, but only after shaking off a string of opponents. O'Toole, jumping trainer Robbie Hennessy and Kern Lillingston's Alastair Donald were among them, but the underbidder was leading Dubai owner Malih Al Basti. "He's been bought to race at the Dubai Carnival on behalf of a long-established client, but I won't say who," said Stroud. "It was a great deal of money, but with what's happening with Dubai racing, you need a good horse to compete. He cost more than we expected, but he fitted the profile for Dubai very well." Sugar Ray passed the previous record for a male horse in training set by J P McManus when buying jumping prospect Garde Champetre (Fr) for 530,000gns at Doncaster in 2004. High-rolling jumping buyers showed little sign of being hit by the recession with trainer David Pipe paying 310,000gns for six-time Flat winner Master of Arts (Swain {Ire}) to go hurdling. "We've had our eyes on him for a while and he's been bought for an existing owner," said Pipe. "He looks an exciting prospect." Cont. p2

MIDNIGHT LUTE RETIRES TO HILL N' DALE


Two-time GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet--Candytuft, by Dehere) has been retired to John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Lexington.
He will stand for \$20,000 live foal and will be available

for inspection at Hill 'n' Dale beginning Friday. Raced by Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman, the five-year-old Midnight Lute culminated his career with a second consecutive Sprint victory Saturday, in which he stopped the clock for the six furlongs in 1:07 flat--the fastest in the history of the

race. Midnight Lute also won the GIII Perryville S. at three and the GI Forego H. at four. He earned a 124 Beyer Speed Figure in the latter, the highest this decade by a sprinter. Midnight Lute, named champion sprinter last term, is the only horse in history to win the Sprint twice. "He's the perfect Thoroughbred," trainer Bob Baffert commented. "He's the best I've ever trained. I can't put into words how good this horse is. All of my client's will be breeding their best mares to him--Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) and Tough Tiz's Sis (Tiznow), for starters." Added Sikura, "Midnight Lute is perfection in his conformation. Big, long, beautiful and perfectly correct. He is breathtaking to look at and we expect him to be a top sire."

Washington Irving Brings 300,000gns...

Trainer Howard Johnson and owner Graham Wylie spent 300,000gns on Aidan O'Brien's G1 Derby fifth Washington Irving (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) with BBA Ireland's Eamonn Reilly the underbidder. "He's got to be good to have finished 6 1/2 lengths behind New Ap-



proach," said Johnson. "We'll castrate him and then give him a rest. We'll school him over a few poles in the spring but he won't race over jumps this season, we'll run him on the flat next year. We

could start out in the G2 Yorkshire Cup at York." G2 Richmond S. winner Prolific (Ire) (Compton Place {GB}) will join Hong Kong trainer John Moore after selling for 230,000gns to Alastair Donald of Kern Lillingston. Iran-based owner Dr Farid Bordbar was underbidder. "He'll join John Moore, who has done well recently with Kings Falcon (previously Copywriter), who is one of the best three-year-olds in Hong Kong," said Donald. "Prolific is a very good-looking horse and he had a troubled passage in the G1 Middle Park S." U.S. purchasers are notably down in numbers this year, but California-based handler Jim Cassidy and owner Deron Pearson did make the trip to Newmarket. Through Gordian Troeller, they bought Souter's Sister (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), winner of the G3 Oh So Sharp S. earlier this month, for 150,000gns. "Her form speaks for itself and she was a good-looking sort, a real big strong filly," said Cassidy. "Hopefully she can make her own pedigree. There are races for her at Hollywood later this year, but she's run 10 times, so we'll probably wait with her for the winter meet at Santa Anita and start her off in a listed race in February before she goes into graded company." It took over 12 hours to get through the 294 lots offered yesterday. Selling resumes this morning at 9:30 a.m.

STREET CRY UP TO \$150K; STREET BOSS AT \$25K; MOST OTHERS REDUCED AT DARLEY

Sheikh Mohammed's Darley America has announced the stud fees of its 16 stallions for the 2009 breeding season. The operation's flagship stallion Street Cry (Ire),

sire of last Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Distaff heroine Zenyatta, saw his fee go up to \$150,000, from \$100,000 in 2008. The fees for Elusive Quality, sire of GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Raven's Pass, and E Dubai, sire of Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Desert Code, have remained the same, at \$75,000 and \$15,000, respectively. Every other Darley stallion has seen his fee lowered. The lone new addition at Darley, multiple Grade I winner

Street Boss (Street Cry {Ire}), will stand his initial season for \$25,000. "Darley is reducing all stud fees in the U.S. with the exception of Street Cry, Elusive Quality and E Dubai, all of whom had Breeders' Cup winners over the weekend," said John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor said. "We are hopeful that by the time the decisions of 2009 are judged at the yearling sales in 2011, that there will have been an upturn in the economy, but we believe that breeders looking for value in 2009 have the greatest chance of success."

DISTORTED HUMOR FEE CUT TO \$225K WinStar Farm's leading sire **Distorted Humor** (Forty Niner-Danzig's Beauty, by Danzig) will stand the 2009 breeding season for \$225,000. That's down from his 2008

fee of \$300,000. "Distorted Humor is in his prime and is one of the few stallions that can consistently command seven figures for a yearling year after year," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "This fee acknowledges the market adjustment, and we now feel his 2009 fee is right on the money for both

our shareholders and breeders." During the current year, the 33 Distorted Humor yearlings to sell have averaged \$416,220. The leading first-crop sire of 2002 and America's leading sire of stakes winners in 2005, 2006 and 2007, the 15-year-old stallion is currently fourth on the leading sire's list. "Distorted Humor has already proven himself to be among the elite sires in the world-only one other sire in the past 30 years has led the U.S. in stakes winners three years in a row, and that was Danzig," Cauthen added.



CURLIN RETURNS TO CHURCHILL DOWNS

Stonestreet Farm and partners' Curlin (Smart Strike) has returned to familiar surroundings at Churchill Downs following a Monday flight from Southern California. Curlin, coming off a disappointing fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, returned to the track around 5 p.m. was led off a van by assistant trainer Scott Blasi as trainer Steve Asmussen looked on. Asmussen said Curlin came out of the Classic in good shape, but immediate plans for his future have not been set. "The only thing that has been discussed was his travel arrangements back here to Kentucky," said Asmussen. "We made it back, we'll relate where he's at now, walk him, pet on him a little while, give him a little lovin', and leave it at that." Asmussen added that, regardless of whether Curlin is retired to stud or continues in training, he has great respect for the colt's majority owner, Stonestreet's Jess Jackson. "Mr. Jackson's guite the sportsman," he said. "He left a lot of money on the table to bring him back [to race in 2008], and he tried different things with him, like the turf in New York and the synthetic track there [at Santa Anita]. He's a true sportsman. The fans wanted to see him run and Mr. Jackson allowed that to happen."

THE THREE-SURFACE SOLUTION

This year's two-day, 14-race Breeders' Cup meeting delivered a much-needed shot in the arm to our business. Nobody died, which was a win in itself. From the TV coverage, and confirmed by those on the ground, the event went off really well. LA lends itself to celebri-



ties, and the Breeders' Cup marketers, headed by CEO Greg Avioli and CMO (Chief Marketing Officer) Peter Land, did a great job of turning them out, including the 'Governator' of California, Arnold Schwarzenegger

, who presented the trophy for the Classic. And to whom did he present the trophy? John Ferguson, who was up and down like a jack-in-the-box, collecting his third trophy of the afternoon for the Maktoum family. Two of the three were bred by Stonerside: Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) and Juvenile winner Midshipman (Unbridled's Song), one of two winners on the card for synthetics critic Bob Baffert. Former California trainer John Gosden conditioned the other two Maktoum winners, both ridden by Frankie Dettori, and both racing in Princess Haya's colors (Raven's Pass and Juvenile Turf winner Donativum [Cadeaux Genereux]).

The meeting was a huge success from a European perspective, capped off by a very significant European one-two in the Classic, in which **Curlin** (Smart Strike) ran below even his post-Dubai figures and could finish only fourth, the last in a long line of East Coast and/or dirt-only runners who drew a blank. Form on 'synthetics,' as they now seem to be called, was a big help.

Though the European impact over the meet's two days was a big story in itself, the one-two finish of Raven's Pass and **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) was very important from a form perspective. Raven's Pass's winning Beyer number was only 110, very low for a Classic; Curlin's three dirt wins since his return from Dubai had been accomplished with Beyers of 110-112-111; so, beaten a little under three lengths, he ran about five pounds below his post-Dubai winning numbers.



He had run a 114 when he won last year's G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup, and a career-high 119 when winning last year's Classic in the Monmouth slop.

The reason I say it is so significant from a form perspective is that, combined with New Approach (Galileo)'s rout of his rivals in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket, this year's Classic result demonstrates that the 2008 G1 English 2000 Guineas was a vintage renewal. There, you'll remember, Henrythenavigator beat New Approach, with Raven's Pass fourth. Each has now gone on to prove himself a really top-class colt, and all three are cracking sire prospects. New Approach, who also raced in Princess Haya's colors (which are looking pretty lucky right about now), retires to Dalham Hall in Newmarket. Henrythenavigator, who I thought excelled himself in defeat (though one of three runner-up finishes over the two days for the Coolmore team), retires to Ashford, in Kentucky. At this writing no announcement had been made about Raven's Pass.

Three weeks ago, in the Tattersalls' Million sales race at Newmarket, Donativum had beaten **Crowded House** (Rainbow Quest) over seven furlongs. Donativum became a lot better bet in the Juvenile Turf after Crowded House blew by the opposition to win the one-mile G1

Racing Post Trophy, at Doncaster, earlier on Saturday. Crowded House received a Racing Post Rating (RPR, same scale as Timeform) 121 to establish himself as a major contender for next year's G1 Epsom Derby. Interestingly, Donativum's Beyer figure of 93 in winning the Juvenile Turf was actually higher than Midshipman's (91) in winning the Juvenile--suggesting this was far from a vintage Juvenile. They were still two huge results for owner Paul Reddam

and his agent, Jamie McCalmont, who bought all or majority interest in Crowded House and Juvenile runner-up **Square Eddie** (Smart Strike) within the space of a week for Reddam late last month.

Though the meeting thankfully went off with no breakdowns on the track, the track's synthetic surface did arouse controversy, particularly among a selection of veteran trainers who just don't like it that much. But 'Safety is Paramount,' so I reckon synthetics are here to stay. But it looks like what's happened is that North American racing has suddenly evolved into a three-surface industry. It may be that in the not-too-distant future the Breeders' Cup will have to card races over all three different surfaces – dirt, turf, and synthetic. Why not? Let every dog have his day--though it may mean running the races over three days (oh mercy) at two different racetracks. But that's in the future; for the moment the industry can breathe a collective sigh of relief that everything's gone right, for once.

Though **Zenyatta** (Street Cry) is unbeaten in nine career starts (seven this year), my vote for Horse of the Year still goes to Curlin. He was beaten the two times he went off dirt this season, but was five-for-five on

dirt, and became the all-time leading earner, and the first horse to top the \$10 million earnings mark, in North America. As much as she towers over the opposition among distaffers, she would have to have done a **Zarkava** (Zamindar), the three-year-old filly who won the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, to have got my vote. In other words, she would have to have run in, and



"Second-half North American and European sales so far (overwhelmingly yearling sales) are down over \$150-million in gross from 2007, or 19 percent. With only one percent fewer catalogued than last year, 10 percent fewer sold (clearance rate from catalogues down from 67 to 61 percent), with the average down 9.5 percent, from just under \$80,000 to just under \$72,000. North American sales (2/3rds of the number sold) were down 17 percent in gross, European sales down by 22 percent."




The November Sales...

It seems like half the field from Friday's Filly and Mare Sprint is in this Sunday's upcoming Fasig-Tipton November Sale--actually, I think it's six of the fourteen runners, along with Juvenile Filly winner and pro-tem Eclipse Award winner Stardom Bound (Tapit), and a few other stakes winners and assorted runners from the weekend, and before. This has become a really successful one-day 'boutique' sale. It's much harder to compare mixed sales from one year to the next because of what can be radically different catalogues. Yearling sales tend to be more stable in terms of the composition of the catalogues from year to year. Having said that, the numbers from the November sales' first three days the last two years (Fasig on Sunday, Keeneland Book 1 next Monday and Tuesday) may well give us a good means of comparison. In 2006, the year Fasig's sale really took off, it grossed \$64 million (256 cataloqued). Keeneland Book 1 grossed \$150 million, so the first three days combined grossed \$214 million. In 2007, Fasig catalogued about the same number (184) as this year (188), and grossed \$52 million. Keeneland Book 1 rose to \$178.5 million, meaning the first three days totaled around \$230 million. I'd say that makes the over-and-under for the first three days this year, given general economic conditions, about \$200 million.

There is a very interesting group of sires making their sale debuts with their first crop of weanlings this year. **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy), champion three-year-old in Barbaro's year, will undoubtedly be this sire crop's commercial star. He could get a massive boost early next Monday morning with hip number six at Keeneland, a half-sister by Bernardini to this year's G1 Dewhurst winner, **Intense Focus** (Giant's Causeway). In all, Bernardini has 12 weanlings catalogued in the first three days (one at Fasig, 11 in Keeneland Book 1).

But there is also a massive blast of Storm Cat appearing, with 38 weanlings catalogued in the first three days by four sons or grandsons of Storm Cat. G1 Haskell winner and G1 Kentucky Derby, Belmont, and Travers second Bluegrass Cat, by Storm Cat himself, has 15 catalogued in Book 1. 


