#### READY FOR A 'BREAK' OUT PERFORMANCE

sharp wire-to-wire Belmont maiden win at first asking July 17, looks to rebound from an eighth-place finish behind Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}) in the Oct. 4. Gl Champagne S. in Sunday's GIII Nashua S. at Aqueduct. The handsome bay has returned with a pair of solid moves over the Belmont training track, and trainer John Kimmel believes that a

change in tactics may have been to blame for the double-digit defeat in the Champagne.

"He came out of the [Champagne] in good order," Kimmel commented. "I tried to change his running style around. We drew the one hole twice in a row and it was one of those situations where I didn't want to get stuck up in a real fast pace by having to send him out of there. So we took him back, but he just got bombarded with dirt for so long that I think he just got discouraged. He made kind of half of a middle move, and then [jockey Richard Migliore] had to angle him out wide around the final half of the turn and he was just empty. I don't think he has to be as far back as he was. He was pretty far back. Him and the jock were so covered in mud. Hopefully we could draw a little bit to the outside [in the Nashua] where we can get a little bit of a more advantageous draw."

Prior to the Champagne, Break Water Edison turned in a pair of solid performances at the Spa. Following his 4 3/4-length tour-de-force maiden victory, he was a very encouraging second in the GII Saratoga Special S. Aug. 14. cont. p2

press {Ire}, by Ahonoora {GB}) for the 2009 season, according to Darley yesterday. The winner of five Group 1 races over two seasons on the track, the three-year-old colt, who will stand his first season at Dalham Hall Stud in England, was retired following a runaway victory in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 18. Winner of the G1 Dewhurst S. and G1 National S. at two. the chestnut also added the G1 Irish Champion S. 

"I loved his performance in the Saratoga Special," Kimmel continued. "It was only his second start. He was wide around the entire turn. He made a nice finishing move. The winner kind of snuck through on the inside and saved a lot of ground and they both finished with good energy. I thought that was a very good run."

The son of MSW & GSP August Storm (Storm Creek) returned on quick notice to finish fourth in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. Sept. 1. After veering out and bumping soundly with Desert Party (Street Cry {Ire}) shortly after the start, Break Water Edison recovered nicely to vie for early command with Vineyard Haven. Pinned on the inside of the eventual winner, he battled through a half of :45.17 before tiring in the stretch to complete the superfecta.

"I made a mistake and probably ran him back too quickly in the Hopeful," Kimmel admitted. "I think I kind of knocked his weight off and he kind of fell out of his feed tub a little bit."

Jockey Alan Garcia, who rode Break Water Edison in his first two career starts, will be reunited with the \$150,000 KEESEP yearling in the Nashua. Garcia was aboard for Break Water Edison's latest five-furlong workout, which he completed in 1:02.24 Oct. 27.

"He's a fit horse," Kimmel said. "He got pretty tough with Alan going to the pole. He probably went three quarters in 1:15."

Kimmel purchased Break Water Edison on behalf of Gindi earlier this year at the OBSMAR Two-Year-Olds in Training sale for \$525,000. He was consigned by Joe Appelbaum and Carlos Morales's Off the Hook LLC pinhooking operation. Breeders' Cup Juvenile victress Stardom Bound (Tapit) and Juvenile Turf third-place finisher Coronet of a Baron (Pure Prize) were sold at the same auction.

"He was a very nice physical horse that looked very good on a racetrack, passed all the parameters and had some pedigree," Kimmel said when asked what attracted him to Break Water Edison at OBS. "I liked what I saw. I thought he stood hands and shoulders over the majority of the other ones. As you've seen in the Breeders' Cup, these young horses that were in the upper echelon of the two-year-old market, they show. It's not easy picking, and you have to overpay sometimes, but they do perform well." --S.S.


TATTERSALLS HIT CONCLUDES Tattersalls' largest ever Horses In Training Sale concluded yesterday evening, producing a solid set of figures after a strong international trade. The 19.7 milliongns turnover was down 15 percent from last year, the 21,059gns average was down 14 percent, while the 8,000gns median fell by 27 percent. The clearance rate was 78.8 percent. Topping yesterday's session at 65,000gns was the smart handicapper Satu (Ire) (Marju), purchased by agent Bobby O'Ryan, who outbid trainer Gary Moore. The gelding was bought as a jumping prospect and will join Irish trainer Eoin Doyle. "I liked his run when he was third at Doncaster last month, and he'd been bought to go jumping, but could go back on the Flat next year," said Kilkenny-based Doyle. Second highest price of the night was Whenever (GB) (Medicean {GB})-a dual winner last year--who will return to Richard Phillips' stable under new ownership after making 60,000gns. "The Autumn Horses in Training Sale has made great progress over the past few years with turnover all, but doubling in the period 2002 to 2007 from 12 million gns to 24 milliongns," explained Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony. "Naturally, expectations were lower this year given the prevailing economic realities, but with the market at Tattersalls displaying a heartening resilience, we have recorded turnover of almost 20 milliongns, the third highest in the sale's history."

#### Strength from the Bench...

Reflecting on the buying bench at this year's venue, Mahony added, "The huge diversity of buyers has always been the unique feature of the Autumn Horses in Training Sale, and even in these uncertain times, we have been overwhelmed by an influx of buyers from throughout the world. To have a European record price of 600,000gns for a colt in training yet again demonstrates the enduring demand for quality horses even in these testing times, and the high clearance rate is a tribute to the global reputation of the Autumn Horses in Training Sale. The contribution from our loyal Middle Eastern clients has been immense at all levels of the market and it has also been particularly encouraging to have seen our new association with William Inglis' and the success of recent sale graduates attracting more participation from Australasian buyers than ever before."

"He will be last turning out of the straight the first time, that's his pattern and we won't be changing," Kavanagh said. He added that the odds were very tight for a horse going to the 2500 metres for the first time, but Whobegotyou does seem to have the Derby at his mercy. As jockey Michael Rodd said Saturday, "The sky's the limit." Jockey Shane Dye has declared he is fit to ride Carnero (Aus) (Carnegie {Ire}) despite suffering a shoulder injury in a trackwork fall Tuesday. Dye was hurt when his mount had a heart attack and crashed through a running rail at Randwick. "It was one of those things that happen sometimes--it was no one's fault," Dye said. Carnero was fourth behind Whobegotyou in the AAMI Vase.

Turf Sprint, will get another chance in the GIII Hollywood Turf Express Nov. 29, while BC Juvenile Fillies Turf fifth Emmy Darling (Graeme Hall) will reappear in the one-mile Miesque S. Nov. 28. Black Mamba (NZ) (Black Minnaloushe), seventh as the favorite in last Friday's GII Las Palmas H., may make her next start in the GI Matriarch Nov. 30.

AZUL LEON TO HOLLYWOOD PREVUE Joseph LaCombe's Azul Leon (Lion Heart), winner of the sixfurlong GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship in July, will make his next start in GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Nov. 23, according to trainer Doug O'Neill. The bay was granted the victory via the disqualification of Kelly Leak in the 6 1/2-panel GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 10, but finished out of the money in his two most recent starts--both over a mile--including a ninth in the 1 1/16-mile GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 25. In related news, Square Eddie (Smart Strike), also campaigned by O'Neill, will be pointed toward a 2009 campaign. Owned by J. Paul Reddam, the chestnut finished second behind Midshipman in the Juvenile.

"After he won the Newburgh H., we knew straight away that this was our Melbourne Cup horse," bin Suroor said. "Unfortunately, these things happen all the time."

The Thoroughbred Owners of California sent a message to its membership Wednesday night with regard to the impasse on interstate advance deposit wagering. Currently, the TOC is withholding its approval of ADW contracts for interstate wagering due to a dispute over the division of interstate ADW revenue. In their statement, the TOC said, "For nearly seven years now, California racetracks and horsemen were locked into contracts that required us to split between 3.5 percent and 5 percent of wagered dollars, while the ADW providers retained up to 16 percent of those dollars--six to nearly nine times what purses received in CA. We were not alone in this predicament. Out-of-state horsemen and tracks similarly receive far less than a fair share."

In an effort to work out what it felt would be a more equitable business model, the TOC negotiated a compromise on the rate structure with the four licensed ADW companies in California--Youbet, XpressBet, TVG and Twin Spires--for a nine-month period earlier this year. The experimental period also did away with exclusive contracts, allowing all four California ADW companies to offer wagering on the racing from Santa Anita, Hollywood Park, Golden Gate and Bay Meadows from the beginning of the 2007 Hollywood fall meet last October until the end of the '2008 Hollywood spring/summer meet this July.

TOC President Drew Couto talked with *TDN* Editor-in-Chief Andy Belfiore to explain why he feels the non-exclusive distribution aspect of the experiment was a success, why rate negotiations following the experimental period broke down, and what the prospects are for agreements with ADW companies going forward.

# What were you hoping to accomplish during the experimental period?

Drew Couto: At the time, we were locked into these exclusive broadcast and wagering contracts. Hollywood Park last fall was the first of our California meets to come out from under a TVG exclusive. We had said in advance of that that we were not going to approve any more exclusive arrangements with regard to wagering. We're just not going to do that. And we're certainly not going to do that at the rates that had previously been in place. Everybody understood that we were done with that, and it was decided that we were going to implement ADW, both in state and out of state, on a nonexclusive wagering basis. All of the licensed ADW companies, at least in California, would have access to the signals, and we would get compensated for the interstate ADW at a higher rate than we had been under the old TVG agreements. Now, we had rates in existence that were higher than what we agreed to for the experiment, but we agreed to drop some of them, because we said we're going to prove to you that nonexclusive wagering distribution is the way to go. But we also said we're going to revisit these rates when the experiment is all done, because these rates are not equitable to horsemen and racetracks.

#### Was the experiment a success?

DC: What we found was that we had growth. The ADW companies made more money--in fact, for example, TVG made a heck of a lot more money just on the Santa Anita period. We went through that and we said, 'Hey, this works. We need to continue this and revisit the rates.'

# Why did negotiations break down after the experimental period?

DC: As soon as it was done, at the end of Hollywood Park, TVG said, 'No, we're going back to our original exclusive model,' and they forced Del Mar, Fairplex and Oak Tree to continue under the final seasons of their existing exclusive contracts. When the Oak Tree meet finished [last Sunday], it was the first time in California that we didn't have any ADW contracts in place going forward. Well in advance of this, in June, we told all the ADW companies and our track partners that when the Oak Tree meet was over, and we were out from under the last of the exclusive contracts, it was going to be a whole new ball game. We were going forward with a non-exclusive model, and with different rates-rates more fair to horsemen and racetracks. That was four months ago. And here we are now, in typical fashion, with the ADW companies not taking it seriously until now. It's standard operating procedure in this industry.

TVG has been putting the burden of blame regarding the interstate ADW impasse on the TOC, and have encouraged their subscribers to call the TOC to complain. Have you had many calls?

DC: We've had a few calls, we've had a few emails, and we've tried to answer all of them. It's remarkable-at least half of them come back and say, 'Gee, we had no idea. Thanks for responding--we didn't expect a response. And we didn't know the situation.' It's just unfortunate that TVG wants to misuse its privilege and assets. No responsible company I'm aware of would use its assets in that way when they're in business negotiations with another party. We're frustrated.

An ad on TVG states that the horsemen's revenue from interstate ADW during the 2008 Hollywood spring meet would have been \$500,000 less under the TOC's newly proposed business model. In your statement, you counter that the new model would have produced \$165,000 more for horsemen from TVG alone, and \$633,000 more overall. Where does the discrepancy come from? DC: Let me ask you this. If somebody said, 'We're willing to pay you X percent,' and my response was, 'I want X percent plus two percent,' which do you think is going to generate more revenue? X, or X plus two? If you look at the big picture, what we're talking about is a solution that involves all four ADW companies licensed in Califonia, and I can guarantee you that, in the aggregate, we are not talking about a loss of revenue for the horsemen. We're simply not.

In the statement released Wednesday, TOC said that they had been in good faith negotiations with Youbet and Xpressbet. Where do negotiations stand now?

DC: Since that statement came out, miraculously, we've now had very good conversations with all of the ADW companies. All of a sudden, everybody recognizes that it's time to sit down and talk. I shouldn't say everyone--TVG is still sort of dragging its feet--but I think everybody else has come to the realization that we owe it to the industry, the fans and to ourselves to get very serious. I think, with the companies beyond TVG, we are making substantial progress.

#### Is there a the solution?

DC: We're looking at a way of doing this that would be, I hate the expression 'win-win,' but we feel confident that our latest proposal is one that recognizes the objectives of the ADW companies and encompasses a model that will solve the problem for all of us. They just have to want to do it.

Can you say when you think agreements might be reached with ADW companies?

DC: I wish I could say it was yesterday, but it's still going to take a little more time. But the gravity of the situation is finally setting in, and I think there are going to be some constructive days ahead.






