races, he was doing what he did on his pure talent," said Jones. "Now, he's starting to get a game plan. In the mornings, he's starting to spot horses ahead of him in his gallops, and wants to go by them, instead of sitting behind them. This should be a good test for him."

The colt, who RNA'd at \$725,000 as a KEESEP yearling for owner Vinery Stables, stretches out beyond seven furlongs for the first time in the one-mile Nashua. He takes on undefeated **Forty Thieves** (Read the Footnotes), who cruised to a 5 1/2-length score in the Sept. 27 NATC Futurity at Monmouth Park to go two-for-two last time out.

BIG BROWN'S STUD FEE SET

Three Chimneys announced yesterday that GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness hero **Big Brown**

(Boundary--Mien, by Nureyev) will stand for a fee of \$65,000 in 2009. "We were thinking about what he would have stood for last year, in a normal financial market, and last year or the year before a horse of his caliber would have stood for between \$75,000 and \$100,000," explained Three Chimneys' President Case Clay. "We took that number, and took a little bit off as a reflection of the current financial crisis. Also, at the September sale, it was palpable to us that stud fees needed to come down a little bit." Big Brown,

who also captured the GI Florida Derby and GI Haskell Invitational S. this year, retired with a record of seven wins from eight starts and earnings of \$3,614,500. Clay feels the three-year-old's stud fee will be well received. "We tested the market a little bit at the \$65,000 number, and got a very favorable response," he said. "We have had a lot of inquiries."

ALYSHEBA RETURNS TO KENTUCKY Story and Photos by Maryjean Wall

The least part of Alysheba's journey was the 20-minute van ride that brought him Friday from a



private farm in Lexington to his new home at the Kentucky Horse Park. The 24-year-old horse had spent two months traveling from Saudi Arabia to Dubai to Amsterdam, then on to New York before arriving in the Bluegrass.

Alysheba was returned to the United States as a gift from King Abdullah of Saudi Arabia, the result of a chance remark last January by President George W. Bush. The U. S. President was on a state

visit to Saudi Arabia and viewing horses at the King's 2,000-acre Janadria Farm near Riyadh, where Alysheba had lived for the past eight years.


According to a story told Friday during the welcoming ceremony for Alysheba, King Abdullah asked President Bush if he was familiar with Alysheba. The President replied, "Everybody knows Alysheba." With that, the King realized how important the horse was to the American people. King Abdullah decided to return the horse to the United States as a gift.

Following the ceremony, Frank McGovern, general manager for King Abdullah's racing and breeding operations, related some misadventures Alysheba experienced on his departure from Riyadh. The plane that was to take the horse from Saudi Arabia to Dubai for quarantine lost an engine after takeoff, soon after 9 a.m. The plane returned to the airport. McGovern said they all decided to leave the horse on the plane while the engine was repaired. The horse was comfortable in his stall and air conditioning was piped in for him.

The plane departed a second time about 4 p.m.--and lost the same engine. The plane continued its flight to Dubai, however, since Alysheba was the only cargo on board.

McGovern said the horse behaved like a prince throughout the two months of his journey and the various stays in quarantine. All told, the transfer of Alysheba from Saudi Arabia cost about \$200,000, McGovern said.

At the Horse Park Friday, Alysheba took in his new surroundings and promptly tried to bite his former jockey, Chris McCarron, who with trainer Jack Van Berg spoke at the welcoming ceremony. McCarron told the story of the horse righting himself after getting knocked to his knees in the homestretch of the 1987 Derby.



Alysheba's remarkable resilience in that race helped win legions of fans for the son of Alydar--Bel Sheba, who was bred at Preston Madden's Hamburg Place in Lexington.

"He had so much charisma," remarked Van Berg.

King Abdullah's breeding stables took Alysheba out of service two years ago. At the Horse



Park, Alysheba will become part of the daily shows of horses residing in the Hall of Champions.

"This horse is going to have the best of care. This place is absolutely awesome," McCarron said.

McCarron and Van Berg were among the upwards of 400 people who welcomed the 1987 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner to the Park's Hall of Champions. The 1988 Horse of the Year stepped off the van and into the stall that John Henry formerly occupied, now to be Alysheba's home.

FIRST DEFENCE RETIRED TO JUDDMONTE

GISW First Defence (Unbridled's Song--Honest Lady, by Seattle Slew) has been retired and will head to stud at Juddmonte Farm in 2009. The four-year-old will stand his first season for a fee of \$20,000 live foal. An 8 1/4length maiden winner at two, Juddmonte homebred First Defence opened his sophomore season with a Belmont allowance score, and came back to make it two in a row in the Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth Park. The bay was runner-up behind Hard Spun in the GI King's Bishop S., but was sidelined after finishing seventh in the GI Vosburgh S. He returned this season to take a Churchill allowance in May and the GIII Jaipur S. at Belmont in June, then followed a second in the July 26 GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt S. at Saratoga with an impressive 6 3/4-length triumph in the Aug. 30 GI Forego S. Trained by Bobby Frankel, First Defence retires with a record of 14-6-3-0 and earnings of \$580,534. His dam, GISW and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and GI Met Mile H. runner-up Honest Lady, is a half to Grade I-winning sires Chester House and Empire Maker. She has also produced stakes winners Phantom Rose (Danzig) and Honest Quality (Elusive Quality).

PERUVIAN CHAMPIONS NAMED Freddy Nossar's Deepak (Pikepass), front-running winner of this year's G1 South American Championship Gran Premio Asociacion Latinoamericana de Jockey Clubes E Hipodromos-Copa Falabella Mar. 15, was recognized as Peru's Horse of the Year and champion older horse on the dirt for the 2007-08 Southern Hemisphere season. The presentation of the Postin Awards was held Tuesday night in Lima. Deepak became the first U.S.-bred horse to win South America's most prestigious multinational Group 1 weight-for-age event since its inception in 1981, and is his sire's first champion. Turned out after winning the Latinoamericano to undergo arthroscopic surgery to remove a bone chip from his right knee, the four-year-old could return in the 2000-meter G3 Clasico Mariano Ignacio Prado Nov. 23. Former Peruvian-born jockey Fernando Valdizan bought Deepak on behalf of Nossar for \$12,000 from consignor Dan Mallory at KEESEP in 2005. Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}), a dual Classic winner in Peru last year and third in this year's GI Florida Derby, was champion three-year-old colt. Other champions were: Yamil Junior (Richter Scale), miler; Drogba (Arg) (Lucky Roberto), two-yearold male; Maitena (Per) (Apprentice), two-year-old filly; Granizo (Per) (Farallon P.), three-year-old turf male; Morena (Per) (Privately Held), three-year-old filly; Democracia (Per) (Play The Gold), three-year-old turf filly; Sza Sza Gabor (Per) (Shuailaan), grass mare; Allianz Arena (Per) (Prospector's Cap), older female; Dushanbe (Per) (Riyadian), grass horse; Jesus Manuel (Per) (Spend One Dolar), sprinter, Farallon P. (Fappiano), sire; and Charytin (Per) (Summing), broodmare. Peruvian Edgar Prado earned the Premio Postin Emeritus.

Our recent sale graduates include Fatal Bullet (Red Bullet), Ginger Brew (Milwaukee Brew) and the undefeated two-yearold stakes winner High Mist (Olmodavor), so a sale in 2009 provides us with an opportunity to add to our growing roster of success stories." The sale will be held Mar. 16 at the Adena Springs South training center.

SOLID RISE FOR BREEDERS' CUP RATINGS The 2008 Breeders' Cup World Championships, televised on ABC, ESPN and ESPN2 Oct. 24-25, drew 62 percent more viewers than last year. A total of 19,776,000 tuned in over the two days of coverage, up from 12,237,000 in 2007. The household rating of .7 for the nine hours of programming was up 11 percent. It was the first time that network and cable stations combined to show the broadcast. "With the expanded two-day format and the addition of ABC, we achieved one of this year's main objectives--to showcase the World Championships to a significantly larger audience," said Breeders' Cup President Greg Avioli. Capt. Candyman Can aired by 7 1/4 lengths in his 5 1/2-furlong debut at Saratoga Aug. 13 and was tabbed as a **3** "TDN Rising Star" **3**, but was a troubled sixth--beaten two lengths--as the choice on Polytrack in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity Sept. 13. Trainer Ian Wilkes has the gelding on Lasix this time. "I think it was a combination of a lot of things," said Wilkes. "Whenever you get back, it's easy to blame the track. I was coming off a maiden win at Saratoga, and he won impressively, and I went straight to a stake--and it was a very competitive stake. And maybe I just didn't come into the race right." Still, Wilkes thinks his charge can rebound here. "It was a great experience and he only got beat a couple of lengths," he said. "I think he got a lot out of it. This horse is a better horse now than he was going into that race. He's a different horse--he's put on a little weight. Physically and mentally he's a lot better." Wilkes added, "I'm glad to get back on the dirt with him. With the way he ran on the dirt at Saratoga, I think it might suit him a little better. But I don't want to make excuses and take anything away from the horses that beat us last time." Brave Victory, an impressive maiden winner at Belmont Sept. 20 in his third start, was bumped at the start of the GI Champagne S. Oct. 4 and wound up seventh. He deserves another chance here. A \$200,000 KEESEP yearling, the Robert LaPenta colorbearer RNA'd for \$490,000 at FTFFEB earlier this year.

Rachel Alexandra graduated in front-running style in her second start over this surface June 13, then came up a half-length short to Garden District (Dixie Union) in the GIII Debutante S. 15 days later. The Dolphus Morrison homebred didn't face the starter again until Oct. 17, when she drove clear to take a six-furlong allowance on Keeneland's Polytrack, and seems wellsuited to this one-turn mile. "She's very smart, never gets herself in any trouble, and has a lot of talent," trainer Hal Wiggins told Daily Racing Form. Pretty Prolific scored at first asking on this track June 22 before travelling to Saratoga. After stumbling at the start of the GII Adirondack S. Aug. 13, the chestnut recovered to be third to Mani Bhavan (Storm Boot) and Doremifasollatido (Bernstein). However, she never factored as the favorite when sixth next out in the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. Sept. 6. Trainer Reade Baker thinks a return to the Twin Spires will turn her around. "She has trained up to the race nicely," said Baker. "She ran a bang-up race here this spring, so there's no reason for her not to run well. Hopefully she'll run well and we'll go on to the [GII] Golden Rod [Nov. 29]--that's the ultimate goal."

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

Baker indicated that several things were working against Pretty Prolific at Arlington. "We told [jockey Rafael Bejarano) to take her back last time, and when she came out of the gate he kind of took a little hold of her and she resented that," said Baker. "She threw her head sideways and they got back a little bit too far, and she just kind of ran even from there. I guess the synthetic was part of it. Some of those Lion Hearts haven't fared too well on Polytrack. They had a couple of winners late at Keeneland, but a lot of them didn't do very well on the 'Poly.' So we've just got to throw that out, put her back her and see what we've got."

In response to Mr. Fierro's op/ed article published Sunday, Oct. 19, I have this to say: Mr Fierro should experience some relief in knowing that both the OBS February and March (as well as Barretts) two-year old sales have now been reduced to one breeze show. After reading his article, the two-year-old consignors were made aware of the scheduling issues that needed to be changed in order for this year's calendar to be fitting for all of those who could not miss a single breeze show, because apparently videos will not do. The time and money invested by the consignors and their financers has obviously taken a back seat to the scheduling of the breeze shows. Anyone who has experience in attempting to sell two-year-olds-in-training has probably had the misfortune of horses colicking, coming up lame, running a temperature, or any other myriad events that could happen the night before, the morning of, or even during the breeze show. The two highestpriced two-year-olds that I have sold both benefited from the second breeze shows. A Rahy filly (\$500,000, 2007 Calder sale) went: 10.1 in her second breeze show after struggling with a headwind late in the day of the first breeze when she went: 10.4. Also an A.P. Indy colt (\$500,000, 2007 OBS March) went :23.1 first time out and was able to step it up to :22.0 the second time. Let us just hope that none of our horses spook, drop the rider, get loose on the track, or have the saddle slip during their opportunity to breeze, or we will just have to wait until the OBS April or June sale. People have up to millions of dollars invested in these animals and are now limited to a single day of breezing after several months of training and expenses...as if pinhooking were not enough of a gamble! I do understand the single breeze shows in Calder and Maryland. These are not as accessible for the vast majority of the pinhookers involved, but when the sales are in our own backyard, we should take advantage of the situation. -- Justin Casse, Casse Sales










A BETTER NOVEMBER?

The yearling sales are through, the Breeders' Cup is in the books and the Thoroughbred industry once again turns its attention to bloodstock. On Sunday, the Fasig-Tipton November Sale kicks off what will be a busy two weeks in Lexington with a small-but-select 188-horse catalogue that features a slew of Grade I winners, a Breeders' Cup champion in **Stardom Bound** (Tapit) and a Broodmare of the Year in **Better Than Honour** (Deputy Minister).

The action shifts crosstown Monday for the 15-session Keeneland November Sale. A record 5,709 horses have been catalogued for November, including a pair of top-class fillies coming off the track in **Hystericalady** (Distorted Humor) and **Vacare** (Lear Fan) and a large and intriguing draft from Zayat Stables.



As with the yearling sales, the breeding stock sales that follow will be held during great economic uncertainty. The stock market continues to fluctuate wildly, and no one on Wall St. seems to know what to expect next.

Whether it was the economic turmoil, an inevitable correction spurred by overproduction, or a combination, the yearling market took a big hit this year, with numbers down roughly 15 percent in both the U.S. and Europe. The downturn is likely to carry over to the bloodstock sales, but to what extent--and at what level of the market it will affect most--remains to be seen.


"I think we've seen the top come down already," offered bloodstock agent Mike Akers. "The middle has actually been fairly stable, and the bottom nobody wants. That's a classic sign of overproduction when there's not a really strong money supply. I think if history tells us anything, when the capital markets contract, our market contracts right along with it."

Akers added that the situation should be advantageous to shoppers at Fasig and Keeneland.


"I think there will be a lot of great buys," he said.
"Now we're back to the point where price and value are a little closer together. As long as you're liquid, you'll have an opportunity to buy some horses. I'm anxious to get in there and see what I can dig out."

John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale offers the aforementioned Stardom Bound and Better Than Honor, believes the effects of the economy won't be apparent until the later books of the Keeneland Sale.

"I've been in the horse business," he stated. "It's what I do, it's what I've done for over 30 years. I've seen markets go up and markets go down. And a true constant in the marketplace is that quality always sells. Plus, because of the timeframes of what we do, anybody that buys a mare tomorrow won't be selling for probably two years. So unless you think the world is ending--and I don't--then you'll be okay. I feel very confident that the serious players and buyers are going to be engaged and are going to give what they have to for what they what. There's a place in the market, say mares up to \$50,000 or \$75,000, that will be heavily impacted by this economic downturn. And that's probably a factor more of people just not having the money to buy rather than a lack of confidence in the market."

TWO FOR THE SHOW

On Sunday, buyers will have the opportunity to bid on the rarest of offerings from the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale Sales, and they will be able to do it not once but twice. The first, **Stardom Bound** (Tapit--My White

Corvette, by Tarr Road), is a Breeders' Cup champion whose talent seems limitless. The second, **Better Than Honour** (Deputy Minister-Blush With Pride, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), is a Broodmare of the Year who stands as the lone dam in modern racing to produce consecutive Classic winners.

Stardom Bound is first through the ring. The striking gray is the pro-tem champion off her resounding victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita. Offered by Charles Cono, whose colors she carried, Stardom Bound sells as https://doi.org/10.1001/journal.com/ and (expected) future two-year-

old champion at auction? Well, isn't hasn't happened since the inception of the Breeders' Cup. Perhaps the most recent parallel was the sale of Grade I stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up Wild Fit (Wild Wonder), a filly with a light page but huge potential. She was knocked down to the Coolmore team for \$3 million at this sale in 2005 while still a two-year-old just after her Breeders' Cup effort.

Roughly four hours after Stardom Bound sells, Better Than Honour will step into the ring as hip 188. The graded stakes-winning daughter of Deputy Minister hails from a top-class family--her dam Blush With Bride was a Grade I winner, while second dam Best in Show (Traffic Judge) was herself Broodmare of the Year.

Better Than Honour has lived up to her lineage as a producer. Her third foal was Jazil (Seeking the Gold), who defeated Bluegrass Cat in the 2006 GI Belmont S. Her fourth was Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy). The big

chestnut provided her dam her second straight Belmont victoryand ensured herself champion three-year-old filly honors--when she beat eventual Horse of the Year Curlin in the 2007 Test of the Champion. Better Than Honour does not sell in foal, having

slipped to A.P. Indy this spring. She was not bred back.

Fasig-Tipton's Director of Marketing Terence Collier, who also helps man the auction stand for the sales company and who will announce both Better Than Honour and Stardom Bound into the ring tomorrow, is understandably excited at the very idea of selling the mares.

"I've enjoyed some wonderful moments in the auction stand in my 30-plus years with Fasig-Tipton, but I can't think of it getting any better than offering such a dominant two-year-old race filly as Stardom Bound and as accomplished a broodmare as Better Than Honour," he said. "Just the thought of it makes you sort of weak at the knees."

The sentiment could also probably be attributed to Hill 'n' Dale chief John Sikura, who not only consigns both, but who co-owns Better Than Honour in partnership with Southern Equine. The two operations are going separate ways after teaming in recent years to be a formidable buying force at the bloodstock sales.

"She's the rarest of all paintings," Sikura said of Better Than Honour. "I don't know what's going to happen, well just have to wait and see, but I've always found in this business that when you sell something unique and special to the marketplace, the marketplace is always rewarding of something that can't be duplicated. I feel strongly she's one of those mares, that she's one of a kind. She's only 12 years old, which makes it only more remarkable what she's done. Over a lifetime, that would be a fantastic body of work, but she's only really just started producing." Cont. p3

In addition to Better Than Honour, Hill 'n' Dale and Mike Moreno's Southern Equine are offering eight mares and six foals, all but one of which will sell here at Fasig. They include the Grade I winners **Point Ashley** (Point Given) and **Madcap Escapade** (Hennessy), as well as the former's weanling filly by Distorted Humor. Madcap Escapade's 2008 foal, a colt by A.P. Indy, will be offered as a yearling next year.

"With a horse with his pedigree and sire power, it would be very unusual to sell him as a weanling, so we all decided that it would be fairest to everybody to wait and sell him as a yearling," explained Sikura.

As for Stardom Bound, a shoo-in for an Eclipse Award after her Breeders' Cup performance, Sikura says the product sells itself.

"I think anybody who breeds or owns elite Thoroughbreds has a ready-made champion coming right off a Breeders' Cup win," he said. "And before that she had two consecutive Grade I wins, so it wasn't like it was a fluke. She seems completely unique and also one you'd have to have. That would be two good starting points for anyone." -Lucas Marquardt

Genuine Success...

Owner James Barry is having one of those rare Midas touch sort of years. First, his four-year-old Chester House colt, Divine Park, won the prestigious GI Met Mile H. in May, beating a good one in Commentator in

with a tally in the GIII Locust Grove H. at Churchill in July. This from a stable of five runners.

What's most impressive, though, is that Barry purchased the horses for a combined total of \$110,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September Sale. Divine Park's price tag was only \$20,000; Genuine Devotion was acquired for \$90,000. Kiaran McLaughlin trains both.

"Better to be lucky than good," Barry laughed last week when asked about his recent success.

Barry hopes that luck continues through tomorrow, when Genuine Devotion goes under the hammer at Fasig as $\underline{\text{hip } 149}$. Crossroads Sales Agency consigns the filly, who has now won five of eight for \$275,725 in earnings.

Perhaps more important than Genuine Devotion's success on the turf this season has been that of her three-parts brother in Europe. Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) emerged as one of the premier two-year-olds in Ireland with wins in the G1 Phoenix S., G1 National S. and G2 Railway S. for Derrick Smith, Mrs. John Magnier and Michael Tabor. He concluded his freshman campaign with four wins from five starts.

The success of the colt surely drew the attention of Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne to his yearling full-sister at the most recent Goffs Millions Sale. O'Byrne landed the filly for a sale-topping $\in 1$ million (\$1,407,000). All three horses are out of the Black Tie Affair (Ire) mare Starlight Dreams.

"We've been following his races all year," Barry said of Mastercraftsman. "We've been getting up early, usually on Sunday morning, to watch him. I thought his victories have been extremely impressive, and obviously that played a part in us deciding to enter her in the sale. My advisor is pretty much just Kiaran, and he said that you have to treat it like a business. I love the filly. She's been nothing but good to us and has provided us a lot of thrills, but from a business standpoint, like Kiaran said, you have to make the right decision for you and your family. But it's not like we're going to give her away. We'll get a fair price."

Barry has been involved in racing for about seven years. A former Wall St. trader, he now trades from home and is in the process of launching a business with his brother. Barry lives in Spring Lake, New Jersey, not far from Monmouth Park.

Barry is quick to deflect credit for his success to Chuck Simon and Kenny Lejeune, who teamed to pick both Divine Park and Genuine Devotion as yearlings, as well as McLaughlin. Cont. p4

"We bought a nice Indian Charlie colt at Saratoga," said Barry. "Kiaran wanted me to buy a New York-bred, so we got a Chapel Royal up there that we liked who I think was the day's top seller. Plus we got a beautiful Dixie Union filly that we're excited about. It's old Phipps bloodlines. They all seem nice, but we'll know more when they start running in the mornings." -LM

Irwin will be wearing a different hat Sunday, that of seller, when Team Valor offers a trio of talented fillies as racing and/or broodmare prospects.

They are:

Hip 81, Unbridled Belle (Broken Vow). A five-yearold, she captured last year's GI Beldame S. and has earned in excess of \$1.5 million. Offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency.

Hip 102, Audacious Chloe (More Than Ready). A four-year-old daughter of More Than Ready, Audacious Chloe was a stakes winner at two and three and is graded stakes placed at four. Offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

Hip 163, Jazzy (Arg) (Mutakddim). The South American-bred filly was Group 1-placed in South Africa and made a splash stateside by taking the '07 GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont. Offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency.

Since Team Valor rarely breeds, Irwin said the selling of its fillies and mares is business as usual, though he

did approach it a bit differently this year.

"Usually, we'll breed the mares and then sell them in foal," he said. "But the Fasig-Tipton Sale last year was so dynamite that it opened up my eyes. So I thought I would try this year to put some horses that were sound and still had some

racing left in them, so people would have that option. Also, I think that everybody has their own ideas who to breed to, and my ideas might not jive with whoever the buyer's might be.

"Most times, even with young mares, it seems people focus more on who they're in foal to, as opposed to what the mare is," he added. "This way, they can breed the mare to whoever the heck they want."

Irwin admits that he could be leaving some money on the table, however.

"You definitely make more when you sell them in

foal," he said. "There's more risk when you sell them open. First, you have to get them in foal. The other consideration with these horses is that some mares need to be in foal--if they're weedy kind of mares, they look better. But if you've got some terrific-looking, athletic fillies, I think people can see what they look like better.

These three fillies are particularly attractive, and I expect to receive a bonus on each of the mares based on how well-conformed they are. As an example, Jazzy is an absolute powerhouse. I've never owned a horse like her that had the depth of muscle she has. I think that if she got in foal, she'd just look like a big 'ol blob, but if you sell her as a racehorse, she's going to look fantastic and I think people will respond." Cont. p5

Irwin is well aware of the current economic climate, but believes he has some high-quality prospects.

"I'm going into the sales this year with the following attitude: I'm not giving my horses away," he said. "I realize that this is going to be the worst market we've faced probably in 22 years, something like that. But horses like these, especially Unbridled Belle, don't grow on trees. We will put reasonable reserves on them and we're hoping to sell, but I won't be giving them away."

As for the new recruits, all is well. The Storm Cat-Totemic filly that made \$1.5 million at Saratoga is being broken by Barry Eisaman's Eisaman Equine in Florida, while Kinsella, the Mr. Greeley colt that topped the '07 Saratoga Sale on Team Valor's \$2.2 million bid, had a small ankle chip removed and is now in training at GoldMark Farm in Florida.



Same Mares, Different Venue for Adena

Adena Springs will forego its usual Fasig-Tipton sale this year, but has a strong group of broodmares on offer in the Keeneland November catalogue. Adena's Mike Recio doesn't think the change will affect potential buyers.

"I don't think it will be very different," Recio confirmed. "People remember our sale over at Fasig-Tipton. It had quite a following. A lot of people came back year after year after year and a lot of good mares have come out of it."

Of the decision to cancel the Adena sale this year, Recio explained, "While the Fasig-Tipton sale was great, Frank [Stronach] really wanted to start focusing on selling mares in foal for the first time and it's all about promoting our stallions. Every year we purchase 200 to 300 mares to breed to our stallions and put right back through the sale again. We would usually have that sale at Fasig Tipton during the first week of Keeneland and we felt, if we could stagger those mares throughout, we'd probably have a better shot to reach a larger target audience of both regional and commercial breeders."

Adena is selling under its own banner at Keeneland this year. "It's just something that we're giving a try," Recio said. "We've been more than pleased with the job that everyone has done for us. At the end of the day, it is branding. We're trying to get the Adena name out there as much as we can. And get the information out to people on these mares in the best way we know how. We've always handled our own consignment of 100 or so mares at Fasig-Tipton. We're just taking it up a little bit more."

Adena will offer 16 mares in Book 1 and Recio thinks people will like what they see.

"We think they are going to be well-received because people know they get a lot of value and they get horses in foal to some nice stallions to help make your mares right off the bat," he said.

The consignment received a major update during Breeders' Cup weekend. Adena will sell **Dovie** (Coronado's Quest) (https://docs.nih.gov/hip-12), a half sister to GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality).

"I would think it will definitely increase her value," Recio confirmed. "She's a very nice-looking mare and we're happy that we own her and happy for the update. She's in foal to Ghostzapper and we're looking forward to see what the market brings for her."

The unraced five-year-old mare is out of Ascutney (Lord at War {Arg}), a full sister to the dam of E Dubai. Later in the auction, Adena will sell Soul Onarazorsedge (Carson City) (hip 1682). Out of Chatta Code (Lost Code), the 10-year-old mare is a half sister to Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Desert Code (E Dubai). She was covered by Touch Gold and Giacomo. Another highlight of the Adena consignment is Last Romance (Wild Rush) (hip 79). Stronach purchased the five-year-old mare, third in the 2006 GI Acorn S. and GI Gazelle S., for an atypically high \$810,000 at last year's November sale. "We gave guite a bit of money for her," Recio admitted. "At the time we considered her to be a part of our broodmare band. She was going to be for awhile, but we are always looking for an opportunity to turn mares into money. She's a multiple Grade I-placed mare and she's in foal to Ghostzapper on an early cover. Despite the uncertain economic climate, Recio thinks Adena is poised for a good sale. "Our consignment in the beginning is very strong. We're supporting our stallions. We have a lot of mares in foal to Ghostzapper, Awesome Again, Macho Uno and El Prado (Ire) and we'll be there from Book 1 all the way to the very end. We have mares in all price ranges and we welcome people to give us a call and ask us any questions. We expect to move quite a few mares. The market is down a little bit, but we've always offered great value for people."

White Eyes Value at Keeneland

At last year's Keeneland November sale, Dr. Catherine Whelan-White signed the ticket at \$90,000 to take home **Foufa's Hunter** (Jade Hunter) (hip 337). Then five, the mare was in foal to Stormy Atlantic. White, a veterinarian based in Finchville, Kentucky, bought the mare as part of a partnership. Foufa's Hunter will return to the Keeneland sales ring Tuesday and will be followed through the ring by her Stormy Atlantic colt (hip 338) as that partnership is dissolved.

Catherine White's exposure to racing began at an early age. "I grew up going to Churchill Downs with my father," White recalled. "He was a gambler, when it comes down to it. He loved betting the Standardbreds and the Thoroughbreds. He would take me out in the afternoons a lot of times just to see the horses and to gamble. That's how I got the love of it. We lived fairly close to Churchill Downs when I was growing up--I loved it and I loved horses, a typical young girl."

White's childhood exposure to racing led her to pursue a career with horses.

"I always knew that I wanted to eventually be involved in racing," she admitted. "I went to school and became a vet so that I could do horse work."


Her start in racing came when she owned and trained a Quarter Horse, but it was an inauspicious beginning.

"There was a three-year-old maiden Quarter Horse, which is basically unheard of," White said. "So I started training him myself at Retama Park and I had a lot of fun and decided I really liked it."

White moved back to Kentucky, married a trainer, and her involvement in Thoroughbred racing began.

"I came back to Louisville and I got a couple of investors and I bought my first Thoroughbred that we raced about six or seven years ago," White said. "I had a partnership and bought our first Thoroughbred for \$10,000--a cheap Thoroughbred. And then after that, I got a partnership with a little more money and we purchased several mares from the Keeneland sale."

White's focus is on buying mares and selling foals, but she has had some success racing. Her husband, Brian White, has eight horses in training and she herself owns four horses on the track in various partnerships.



"The focus has always been to sell and make money," White explained. "I think you are going to make more money buying and selling babies than you are getting one ready for the track. We buy and sell the babies-that's our goal, but the babies that don't make it to the sales, we end up keeping and racing. That's why we have the four in training right now."

One foal White and her partners ended up keeping is the-now five-year-old **Markum** (Louis Quatorze). She purchased the mare Wancha Back (End Sweep), with Markum in utero, for \$23,000 at the 2002 Keeneland November sale. Her partners decided to race Markum and the bay gelding, trained by Brian White, is stakesplaced and has earned \$137,942 to date. The partners sold Wancha Back's 2005 colt by Hold That Tiger for \$70,000 at the 2006 Keeneland January sale.

White admits that her success with Markum has encouraged her to get more involved in racing.

"Markum has done really well for us and is a nice allowance horse," she said. "He's been a neat horse to own and he got us more excited about the sport."

Along the way, White has been able to combine her love of racing with her work as a veterinarian specializing in equine reproduction.

"I've been a repro vet for a long time, doing broodmare work," White said. "And what we've done the last few years, we've been acquiring old very high-quality broodmares from people who can't get them in foal. We have Cuidado, the dam of [GISP] Wheelaway. They couldn't get her in foal for almost five years after Wheelaway was born and we had a foal out of her two years ago and he's one of our horses in training. And we got a filly out of her this year by Cherokee Run. So we do a lot with people that have high-end mares that have trouble getting in foal. I love doing repro and I love working with the old mares. And we've had a lot of success getting those mares in foal. It's been fun."

White purchased Foufa's Hunter last year in partnership with Oz Farm.

Asked what she liked about the mare, White said, "Her page. She's got a really really strong page, which equals out to a baby with a strong page. She's a young mare and they are really hot and it's hard to get a high-quality young mare."

Foufa's Hunter is a full sister to graded stakes winner Foufa's Warrior and a half to GISP Maryland Moon (Al Mamoon), as well as stakes-placed Full Brush (Broad Brush), Certantee (Known Fact) and Media Access (Devil's Bag).

"I like a strong running family--everything they throw runs and they have black type," White explained. "They might not be Grade I winners, but they have black type and they are solid individuals that get to the track and remain sound. And that's been my goal and that mare really fits in that criteria."

White said the decision to sell Foufa's Hunter wasn't entirely her own, as her partner has decided to reduce his bloodstock holdings.

"We're going to downsize some of his mares this year," White said. "That's why we're selling this one. He has two more mares in partnership that we will try to sell privately or sell in January."

White has high hopes for Foufa's Hunter's weanling colt.

"We love her weanling," White said. "Our concern is the market. We're not quite sure what is going to happen. Being the second day can be either a good thing or a bad thing. I'm hoping in this sale, it's going to be good because the big players will still be there. He is a really scopey nice horse that looks like he's got a lot going for him. He x-rays good, he scopes good. We couldn't ask for anything better right now. We just have to wait and see what he does at the sale. We're really happy with him. I'd like to keep the mare just based on him, but it's not all my choice."

The uncertainties in the market may help White with her shopping this November.

"I have a couple other partners and I have done some partnerships with some bigger farms around here that are looking for the bargains," she admitted. "We all think in the industry--and I think it's in the back of everyone's mind--that this is a good time to buy if you've got money sitting on the sidelines. There are a lot of people who are scared to push the button right now because they don't know where the industry and the country is going, but I think there is a possibility I'll be buying more mares at November." -- Jessica Martini

Eight Belles's Dam to Be Offered...

The tragic death of Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) in this year's Kentucky Derby transcended trade journals and websites and became headline news, sparking debate and criticism which rocked the Thoroughbred world. In addition to her fans, owner Rick Porter and trainer Larry Jones, the accident that saw Eight Belles fracture both front ankles while galloping out following her courageous runner-up effort also hit hard at Three Chimneys Farm. The Clay family's operation bred Eight Belles in partnership with Omar Trevino and Richard Nip from Away (Dixieland Band), who was a stakes winner and placed twice in Grade III company while carrying the green and gold of Three Chimneys and Nip. Now 11 years old, Away, who is reportedly carrying a full brother to Eight Belles, goes under the hammer Monday at Keeneland.

"A commercial operation sometimes has to make decisions and we took a look at her and what she's

carrying and we thought the best thing to do would be to put her in the sale and let someone else have a chance with her," explained Three Chimneys' President Case Clay. "She's been a great mare for us and our partner Richard Nip. It's a tough thing to do, but we're primarily a commercial operation and we're in the business of selling horses. When comes to Away's value, she's at her high point right now and that's why she's in the sale."

The decision was not made callously, but carefully, Clay says, adding that there is not a day that goes by where the Eight Belles tragedy is forgotten.

"With regard to Eight Belles, we believe that it was a freakish accident," Clay stated. "She was a sound horse herself and Unbridled's Song was a sound horse. We believe that she'll pass on heart and the ability to be a great racehorse. It's a bit early to tell what she passes on, but if this colt that she's carrying has any of the heart that Eight Belles had, then he should be a great racehorse."

Indeed, Away, who bankrolled \$277,550 in winning seven of her 24 career starts, has been well received as a commercial broodmare to this point. Her first foal, the four-year-old Elusive Quality gelding Escape Route, was a \$170,000 KEESEP graduate and is a three-time winner in England, while Eight Belles made \$375,000 at KEESEP in 2005. The gray won five of her 10 career outings, including the GII Fantasy S. and the GIII Honeybee S. and amassed earnings of \$708,650. Three Chimneys and partners, who have elected to retain a Smarty Jones two-year-old filly out of Away, and Case Clay indicated that their decision to keep that offspring made it a little bit easier to enter Away in the November sale. Three Chimneys recently sold an Empire Maker yearling filly for \$320,000 and the mare has a weanling colt by farm stalwart Dynaformer. -- A Carasso

Star Attraction Certainly No Laughing Matter...

A little more than four years ago, Northern Californiabased trainer Jerry Hollendorfer came to Lexington with a shopping list for a partnership including himself, noted scientist Dr. George

California wine country. Hollendorfer, who conditioned Lite Light and Pike Place Dancer to victories in the GI Kentucky Oaks in 1991 and 1996, respectively, signed the Rancho San Miguel's Tom and Nancy ticket on hip 1093 at the 2004 Keeneland Sep-

tember sale, a chestnut filly by Distorted Humor out of the Chilean champion Sacrementada (Chi) (Northair). The hammer price of \$125,000 has proven to be an absolute bargain, and the story of Hystericalady comes full circle Monday when the five-year-old makes her return to the auction house.

"I thought she was very cheap given her conformation and her pedigree," Clark said of the original purchase price. "She's out of a champion mare and by Distorted Humor, who was really on the rise at the time. There was more than just Funny Cide and it looked like at the time that he could be the horse that could replace Storm Cat. I thought there was a lot of residual value and there was almost no downside if she couldn't run.

"Before Jerry raced her the first time, he said, 'This might be the best filly I've ever had,' and I said, 'That remains to be seen. You've had some awfully good ones.' He had a couple of Oaks winners, so that was a pretty powerful comment," Clark related.

And, as it turns out, completely accurate.

Hystericalady debuted a winner and added a victory in a minor stakes at the Pleasanton meeting before being injured when sixth in the GII Sorrento S. in 2005. Given plenty of time to recuperate, she successfully stretched out at three, recording a powerful 7 1/2length victory in the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks. Clark realized he was part owner of a very talented filly, and he admits to being wowed by that effort.

"I was surprised by how much she won by that day and I think she ran a 110 Beyer that day," he recollected. "I knew we had a very, very good filly, but I didn't know that maybe she could be the fastest threeyear-old filly in the country. She proved it that day."

But there was even better yet to come as a four-yearold. On the heels of a two-turn allowance victory at Bay

Meadows in early April 2007, Hollendorfer cut Hysterical ady back to seven-eighths for her first Grade I engagement in the Humana Distaff S. on the Derby undercard.

Facing the likes of defending champion Pussycat Doll, Hysterical ady turned

in a dominating performance, registering a four-length victory over the Bob Baffert trainee.

"We'd always been optimistic and we kept reminding ourselves of Jerry's comments and he thought he had her right going into the Humana Distaff," Clark said. "Maybe this was an opportunity to prove his forecast from two years before."

Clearly a filly whose star was on the rise, she successfully transitioned back out to a route of ground later in the season, taking the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth Park, then prepped for the 2007 Distaff with a near-miss runner-up effort in the GI Lady's Secret S. in California. Cont. p11

Her effort on Championship Day is burned in Clark's memory, even if he expected the kind of bang-up performance he got. Breaking from the outside in a field of 12 in the quagmire in New Jersey, Hystericalady poked a head in front of Ginger Punch at midstretch only to lose the race by a desperate neck.

"Her win in the Humana was the first Grade I winner I've ever been a part of and last year was the first experience I'd ever had in the Breeders' Cup," he commented. "I was very optimistic going into that race, she'd proven that she could run well in the mud and she was coming up to the race extremely well. I was not surprised how well she ran that day."

Her five-year-old season was an equally consistent one. Third by a head in defense of her title in the Humana, she went on to post wins in the GII Fleur de Lis H. in June, a repeat score in the Molly Pitcher and showed she could handle 10 furlongs with a four-length score in the GII Delaware H. Clark has mixed feelings as the sale draws closer.

"I really hate to see her go," Clark commented. "It's been a storybook trip with her. She's the best racehorse I've ever been associated with and I'll be very lucky to ever have another one like that. But that's why we do it. We always hope that sometime in our career that we have one special horse, and she's the one for me." He added, "We've had conversations as to whether to run her another year. But she's in there to sell and we have a fallback strategy if she doesn't bring the price." --Alan Carasso

Zayat Horses Arrive at Keeneland...

The majority of the ready-to-run horses that make up Zayat Stables' Book 1 offering arrived at Keeneland Thursday afternoon. Eaton Sales is handling the consignment, which consists of 20 Book 1 lots, and Eaton's Reiley McDonald was pleased with what he saw when the Zayat horses got off the vans.

"I stood out here [Thursday afternoon] when they shipped in and watched this consignment walk around me here in the sun at Keeneland, and it is the best-looking collection of horses I've ever seen come out of the same barn," McDonald said. "It's a real credit to Mr. Zayat, to Sohby [Sonbol], his racing manager, and to his selection team. It really is as good-looking a collection of horses you could put together."

The Zayat horses have also run to their looks and, according to McDonald, could be carrying the colors of their new owners to victory within a matter of days of the sale.

"All but a couple of the horses in this book are coming off a win and are sitting on a race in the next couple of weeks," he explained. "That's the unique thing about this bunch of horses--you've got 18 three- and four-year-olds that you can literally walk out of this sale with and race. It doesn't take breaking, it doesn't take early training, there are no setbacks here. This is a bunch of horses that are essentially ready to go. As a matter of fact, from the consignment, there have been 11 winners from 26 starts in the month of October alone. It's pretty strong."

One of the strongest members of the Zayat consign-



ment is the four-year-old filly Baroness Thatcher (Johannesburg--Natkeeta, by Gulch), selling as hip 562. The chestnut captured the GIII Santa Ysabel S. at three and has hit the board four Grade I events, including a runner-up Baroness Thatcher Benoit finish in the GI Humana Distaff S. this term. She captured a

Keeneland allowance test in her latest outing Oct. 11. "Baroness Thatcher is sitting on a win," McDonald remarked. "She is the favorite in a Grade II this Sunday [GII Chilukki S. at Churchill], but I've asked him not to run, because she's sitting on a big race for somebody, and Mr. Zayat and I both would like for the new purchaser of a mare like this to have the chance to run her right away. There are three or four races out there in the next couple of weeks that she's ready to go for...[trainer] Billy Mott says she's ready to roll."

The Zayat horses will be on vacation for the few short days before going through the ring Monday and Tuesday.

"They'll be walked and they'll be shown quite a bit," McDonald said. "They all get a little bit of a rest, and a few days off doesn't hurt any one of these horses. In fact, we'll just freshen them a little bit, and on they go."

There will be reserves set for the Zayat horses, but it is expected that those reserves will be met.

"I haven't come up with the final strategy on reserves with Mr. Zayat, but I think it's very fair to say that Mr. Zayat intends for this to be an annual consignment to be held every year here at Keeneland, and this is our first year," McDonald said. "It's in our own best interest to place our reserves at a very very reasonable level and sell this bunch of horses. I think the reserves will be fair, low and most of these horses, if not every one, is going to go through here and hopefully sell. We're in a poor economy, we understand that. We have a really nice bunch of horses that people can go out and have immediate fun with, but we want to be very fair about what we're asking for the horses." -- Andy Belfiore





Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "Book 4 of the October Yearling Sale followed a very pleasing Autumn Horses in Training Sale, but it was a different story today. We catalogued upwards of 2,000 yearlings for the four books of the October Yearling Sale and, while Books 1 to 3 provided results that were ahead of expectations given the constant stream of poor economic news, the same cannot be said of Book 4, where uncommercial yearlings struggled to find a home."
