

STARS ABOUND AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

A star-studded cast has been brought together for today's Fasig-Tipton November Selected Mixed Sale at Newtown Paddocks in Lexington. A total of 188 horses



have been catalogued, including 80 racing and/or broodmare prospects, 50 in-foal mares and 52 weanlings. There are no fewer than 15 Grade I winners, 15 Grade II winners and 18 Grade III winners in the sale.

"We've got a great group of horses on the grounds," confirmed Fasig-Tipton President and CEO Boyd Browning, Jr. "People have been busy and the weather's been great the last few days. We're excited. We're ready to go."

Browning's enthusiasm is understandable given the strength

of a Fasig sale that has grown in stature in leaps and bounds over the last five years. One of the highlights of the show will be the last horse through the ring tonight, reigning Broodmare of the Year **Better Than Honour** (Deputy Minister).

"It's a great honor and a great responsibility to showcase one of that quality," said Browning. "It truly is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for somebody to acquire a mare that has done it all--a great racemare, a great family and a great producer. She's the real deal."

Before that, though, there will be plenty of talented horseflesh on offer. Stardom Bound (Tapit) is the expected juvenile filly champ off her victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, while Madcap Escapade (Hennessy) was one of the flat-out fastest fillies to race in the past five years. Intangaroo (Orientate) and Panty Raid (Include) each showed their prowess at several different tracks, while Backseat Rhythm (El Corredor) emerged as one of the better three-year-old fillies on the grass this season.

The one question on everyone's mind is how an ailing economy will affect the marketplace. For his part, Browning has taken a decidedly zen-like approach to it.

"You know, we can't control the economy, so we try to spend our time on the elements we can have an impact on," he said. "We're going to have to live with whatever the international economy is doing at the time."

SARA LOUISE DISAPPEARS IN POCAHONTAS

Eldon Farm's **Sara Louise** (Malibu Moon), a \$550,000 FTFFEB graduate, turned in a strong five wide rally to annex yesterday's GIII Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs by an eye-catching 3 3/4 lengths over **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro). Her final time of 1:34.57 was nearly three-fifths of a second faster than the GIII Iroquois S., which was contested one race later. "She's probably as good a filly as I've ever had and maybe as good as some of the best horses," trainer Dale Romans said. "I mean, she's a serious filly." **Cont. p7**

Capt. Candyman Can (Candy Ride {Arg}) made amends following his sixth-place finish in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity Sept. 13 with a three-length decision over Monty's Best (Montbrook) in Saturday's GIII Iroquois S. beneath the Twin Spires. "He relaxed today and was going pretty good," jockey Julien Leparoux said. "He didn't fight me and he finished a little bit. He got a little tired at the finish. I think he's going to get a little bit more fit with this race. He got a little tired at the end, so we'll see what happens and see if he can improve next time. He broke his maiden very impressively so we've liked him since that day. He's good." According to trainer lan Wilkes, Capt. RINGSIDE... with Lucas Marquardt

FOR FOJAN, A SPECIAL MARE


The crash of Comair Flight 5191 at Blue Grass Airport in the early morning hours of Aug. 27, 2006, was a striking blow to the people of Lexington. The Thoroughbred community wasn't spared, as several well-respected horseman were among the casualties. Included was George Brunacini, who owned and operated Bona Terra Farm, a 200-acre commercial operation based near Georgetown, Kentucky. Brunacini was a successful real estate developer in Albuquerque, New Mexico, before launching Bona Terra in 1996. Among others, Brunacini bred GI Travers S. winner Flower Alley and GII Beaumont S. heroine Victory U.S.A. A year before the crash, Bona Terra sold Flower Alley's dam, Princess Olivia, to Japanese interests for \$825,000.

In addition to three daughters and a son, George left behind his fiance and partner of 10 years, Emilie Fojan, a soft-spoken, Austrian-born trainer.

Hard as it was, especially in those early months, Fojan carried on under the Bona Terra banner. She sold off some of Bona Terra's best mares that November, and was still in the process of halving its 60-strong broodmare band at Keeneland January when the 13-year-old Ascot Knight mare High in the Park went under the hammer. She was one of the few mares to make Fojan's short list. Fojan thought High in the Park would make a fine replacement to some of the pricier mares she was parting with, and was somewhat surprised when she landed the mare for just \$3,500.

"I was sitting there in January, and I was just so upset," said Fojan. "I was literally sobbing in the pavilion, because we'd sold two mares before her and I was thinking, 'This isn't really happening.' She was really the only mare I wanted to buy."

Fojan had a reason to like the mare. She had seen High in the Park's fifth foal, a Chester House colt named Divine Park, work at Turfway Park, and the strapping bay caught her eye with a snappy three-furlong breeze in :34 and change.

"I had seen that he had some great works other than

that one, and I was thinking that maybe I could get her," Fojan explained. "Luckily for me, she had slipped [her foal], and I think I was the only person on her and got her for \$3,500. I was thrilled to get her for so cheap, because I thought I was going to have to spend around \$25,000 or so."

Divine Park was an unraced three-year-old when Fojan purchased his dam as EMFO Racing, but a month later, in February,

he debuted a winner at Aqueduct. Divine Park established a new track record at Keeneland winning his second outing, a seven-furlong allowance, and in his third start he won the GIII Withers S.

"Here we were selling all our good mares, and here I am getting another good one," Fojan said. "It was like it was meant to be."

This year, Divine Park notched an important victory in the GI Met Mile and is now retired to Airdrie Stud to stand stud.

"He's a beautiful animal; he's just gorgeous," said Fojan.

Divine Park's success convinced Fojan that now is the right time to sell his dam, and today, High in the Park, now 14, enters the ring at Fasig-Tipton as hip-155. High in the Park is the lone horse in the EMFO Racing draft at Fasig and is in foal to a leading juvenile sire in Medaglia d'Oro on a Mar. 10 cover.

"I was lucky that I liked Medaglia d'Oro, because I bred her back to him and he's having such a great year," said Fojan. "It's a beautiful match and she's in foal on an early cover."

Fojan does have some reservations about the current economic climate, though.

"I don't know what the market's going to be like, because everything's so up and down," she said. "But I feel like I'm not going to just let her go because of the economy. If she doesn't bring what I think she should, I'll just bring her home and have the baby."

These days, Bona Terra is home to about 20 or 25 mares, and Fojan still trains young horses at the Kentucky Training Center on Paris Pike.

"I've kept on trucking as best I could," she explained. "I always trained the leftover babies that could not be sold, and now I've got a few great clients. We do a lot of breaking and legging up and getting them ready, and then they go on to do bigger and better things."

As she was preparing to send High in the Park to Fasig last week, Fojan reflected on the day back in January in 2006 when she first purchased the mare.

"I liked her, but for some reason it was like I had to have her," Fojan said. "It was so strange because she turned out to be a really nice mare." She adds with a little laugh, "Sometimes there is help from above."

Mildly urged on the turn for home, she enhaled the leaders while racing five wide, ducked in briefly after striking the front at the top of the lane, and drew away impressively once straightened out. Sara Louise may start next in the GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Nov. 29. "We'll talk about it with Mr. Luke and with Bill Graves to see if that makes sense or just put her up for the rest of the year and get her ready for Gulfstream," Dale Romans said. It wasn't the best of trips for slightly favored Rachel Alexandra, who was caught in traffic on the turn for home and was later bumped in the stretch by the tiring Petty Things (Put It Back), but was unable to match strides with the victress once clear.





South Australian trainer Leon Macdonald was left shaking visibly as 100-1 chance Rebel Raider proved superior over the 2500-meter trip of the Victoria Derby, denying odds-on Whobegotyou by a decisive margin. Rebel Raider became the first Group 1 winner for Reset (Aus), whose oldest progeny are three. Rebel Raider's effort epitomised the stamina and toughness of his paternal grandsire and the turn of foot of his Group 1-placed dam.

With all eyes on Whobegotyou, who settled among the tail-enders some 20 lengths from the early leaders The Tiger (Aus) (Catbird {Aus}) and Orca (Aus) (Carnegie {Ire}), Rebel Raider took the more than 110,000 racegoers by surprise as he launched an attack from the 300-meter marker. Jockey Claire Lindop shadowed the favourite as he came out widest into the straight and began his challenge, but Lindop's mount Rebel Raider proved more adept at the trip. After missing the start and coasting along out the back, Pre Eminence rallied to snare third place.

Under the Raider...

Rebel Raider was runner-up in a restricted race at Cheltenham in South Australia Sept. 27, then a disappointing fifth in the Listed Hill Smith S. at the same venue Oct. 11. Sent across the border to Victoria, he was third in the Listed 3YO Classic at Geelong Oct 22 ahead of this steep step up. Macdonald said although Rebel Raider, a A\$150,000 Magic Millions graduate, had shown improvement at his last outing, the win took him by surprise. "He's a bargain buy now. He was quite a nice horse. I liked him and he's certainly done the job today," Macdonald said, "I'm still shaking." Celebrating her first Group 1 win, Lindop said she never doubted Rebel Raider could stay the trip. "He's not the easiest horse in the world to prepare, but everyone in the stable from the strappers up got behind him to produce what he did today," she said. Whobegotyou's jockey Michael Rodd said: "He was beaten by a better horse on the day. I followed the winner nearly every step of the trip but unfortunately he was just too strong for us". Many leading trainers are arguing to reduce the Derby to 2000 meters, saying it is too difficult for early threeyear-olds to tackle the 2500 meter trip. Click for the Racing Post chart.

Sept. 27. Sent to Melbourne, he was a game fifth behind Maldivian (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) after fighting for the lead in last Saturday's G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley. Ridden back in the field after racing keenly in the Cox Plate, Theseo gave Waterhouse her fourth Mackinnon victory after collaring Barbaricus by the merest of margins on the line, with last spring's Mackinnon S. winner Sirmione in third. 
At only his fifth outing, the immensely exciting homebred Northern Meteor lived up to expectations, scoring a half-length victory in a race that has produced a bevy of successful stallions including his own sire, who won the sprint for trainer Lee Freedman in 1996. Hailed as the emerging spring pin-up horse after star galloper Weekend Hussler (Aus) ended his spring campaign, Northern Meteor crash-landed with aplomb at Flemington less than three months after making his race debut. Bred by Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud, Northern Meteor was an ignominious seventh of nine on debut Aug. 7 at a Sydney midweek meeting, and had excuses when third at his second midweek outing Aug. 27. He figured it out during a six-week let-up and returned to the same Canterbury track to win his maiden Oct. 8 in track record time, before repeating the dose in the Listed Brian Crowley S. Oct. 18. It was then that connections revised plans for the colt to contest a Listed provincial feature and targeted the Coolmore Stud S.

Sent straight to the grandstand side of the straight and kept under a tight hold by jockey Nash Rawiller, Northern Meteor stayed out of trouble and was allowed his head at the 200 meter mark, with fellow Sydney sophomore Fist of Fury hot on his heels. "He's an extremely promising horse and he has plenty of scope for improvement," Rawiller commented. "He has a sensational sprint but he might get over further as he develops." Waterhouse has suggested the colt is an ideal prospect for Royal Ascot's Kings Stand S. and Golden Jubilee S. "He's such an exciting horse with just a tremendous turn of foot," she said. "He was very relaxed the whole way and it's hard to get the smile off my face." Gooree manager Andrew Baddock added, "The sky is the limit with this horse ... he could easily go to Ascot." WRITERS UP

AN AMERICAN IN MELBOURNE

By Bill Finley

The Melbourne Cup isn't on the radar of most American owners, which is probably a mistake. The purse is about \$3.6 million, it's as prestigious as any race in the world, it attracts crowds in excess of 100,000 and any top-class American horse with the staying power to excel at two miles is bound to have a solid chance. It's a challenge worth tackling, which hasn't escaped at least one American owner.

Earle Mack, who is the senior partner and CFO of a New Jersey-based commercial real estate development firm and has campaigned numerous stakes winners, is quietly confident that his racing stable is about to land its biggest prize yet. Mack owns Mad Rush, the second choice in early betting for Tuesday's Melbourne Cup at Flemington Racecourse. Mad Rush, who was bred in Kentucky by Avalon Farm, would not be the first American-bred to win the Melbourne Cup, but Australian racing officials have told Mack that he would be the first American owner to win the race.

"It's an honor and a privilege to bring a horse here," Mack said by phone from Melbourne. "I feel like I'm representing my country. To me, it would be like winning the Ryder Cup or an Olympic gold medal. To win this would be a special thrill for me."

Mack bought Mad Rush at the 2005 Keeneland September yearling sale for \$80,000 and sent him to England to be trained by Luca Cumani. A late-developing son of Lemon Drop Kid, Mad Rush didn't start until his three-year-old season and won only one of four starts that year, earning just \$15,326. He hit his stride this year and has been at his best in long distance races. When he finished second in the Group 2 Prix Kergolay, a mile-and-seven-eighths race run in August at Deauville, Mack and Cumani knew they had a serious Melbourne Cup contender.

Mad Rush competed next in the 1 1/2-mile G1 Caulfield Cup, the main prep for the Melbourne Cup, and finished fourth. But he was closing strongly inside the final 200 yards, performing like a horse who was crying out for more distance.

"Luca feels he'll be much better at two miles," Mack said. "And he's yet to have a chance to run at two miles."

He was ridden in the Caulfied Cup by top Australian jockey Damien Oliver, who will also be aboard for the Melbourne Cup. Oliver is a two-time Melbourne Cup winner.

"I feel he's definitely come on," Oliver told Australian reporters last Wednesday after working Mad Rush. "I don't think he needs to make much improvement. He feels just as good if not a bit better than he did at Caulfield."

For Mad Rush, a difficult assignment has become easier in recent days. Caulfield Cup winner All the Good (Ire) (Diesis {GB}), who is part of the potent Godolphin team, has been scratched due to a foreleg injury and 2007 Melbourne Cup winner Efficient was also a recent defection. Still another top contender, Yellowstone, has been battling a hip injury, but is expected to run.

"You hate to see good horses drop out because you understand about the hopes and dreams of the people involved," Mack said. "It took years to develop these horses from the time they were yearlings. But that's what happens in this sport. You hope for the best and prepare for the worst."

The likely favorite is Septimus (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), from the Coolmore team who romped by 13 lengths in the Irish St. Leger in September. Like Mad Rush, Septimus has had to go through a lot to get to the Melbourne Cup. The trip from Europe is a long one and the foreign horses are required to train at a quarantine center. That worries Mack, but he has confidence in his horse.


"I am guardedly optimistic about our chances of winning," he said. "It's a tough field. The racing here is top quality. Horse racing is so important to the people in Australia and that's why they keep investing a lot of money in farms and breeding. They are buying horses in America and Europe and they are breeding to many of our stallions who have become shuttle stallions."

Mack knows that Mad Rush has been handed a difficult assignment. But he also knows that he has a horse who can handle the task to come. Someday, an American is going to break through at the Melbourne Cup. Earle Mack would be delighted to be the one.



NYRA Launches Jockey Health Programs:

The New York Racing Association announced it has implemented two programs to ensure the best care possible when a jockey is injured. NYRA racetracks will now use the Jockey Health Information System, a secure online database which was first implemented at the recently concluded Keeneland Fall Meeting. The system stores jockeys' updated medical histories and allows emergency medical personnel at racetracks to instantly access that information in the event of injury. Additionally, NYRA launched the Jockey Medical Advocate Program with the start of the Aqueduct Fall Meeting Oct. 29. Registered nurses serving as medical advocates will be on-call during all NYRA races. In the case of injury, the medical advocate will meet the injured rider at the hospital to ensure he or she receives good care, and will also assist the jockey and family members with medical and administrative matters. "We very much appreciate the leadership of The Jockey Club and Keeneland in developing the Jockey Health Information System and are proud that, along with the Jockey Medical Advocate Program, we've taken significant steps forward in supporting the health and welfare of these jockeys," said NYRA Senior Vice President of Human Resources and Labor Relations David Smukler. 





Why did you select the Breeders' Cup Mile as a target for Goldikova?

Because I've been living in the United States for a long time and I think the Breeders' Cup Classic and Mile are some of the most

prestigious races. If she's in good shape, I'd love to come back next year. And at Santa Anita [during the Breeders Cup], we've raced three times and won three times. (The Wertheimers' other Breeders' Cup wins came in the 1993 GI Turf with Kotashaan (Fr) (Darshaan {GB}) and the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies with Halfbridled (Unbridled).

How many horses do you own now? Around 120 or 130. Basically, we have about 70 births of foals per year. We breed horses in the U.S. in Lexington at Hagyard Farm and in Europe.

First win as an owner? [My brother and I] took over the family operation. It really didn't matter if my father won or my grandfather would win. It made no difference to me because it was always exciting.

How has racing changed since you first got involved? When I first started, you had more family-operated involvement. Now you have fewer traditional operations, but you still have some families like the Phipps family.

What is your favorite racetrack and why? If I don't say it's Longchamp, people will complain! But I really like Santa Anita because the weather is great and there's the view of the mountains. And then there's Belmont.

What is your favorite vacation spot? Deauville in Normandy. Or Lyford Cay in the Bahamas. I also like Vail.

Favorite book: It's too hard to name just one. I read a book a week. Mostly history books, all from the Middle Ages to Egyptian history to modern history.

Favorite food or meal? A good steak. Black and blue.

Most fascinating backstretch character you've met? Alec Head.


