She entered the ring to a round of applause, even before the bidding started, but you could have heard a pin drop in the pavilion just before the hammer fell at a new world record \$14 million. The last horse through



the ring at yesterday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale in Lexington, Broodmare of the Year **Better Than Honour** (Deputy Minister--Blush With Pride, by Blushing Groom {Fr}) was selling to dissolve a partnership, and it was majority owner Mike Moreno of Southern Equine who was re-

sponsible for the final bid. Moreno already boasted a 70-percent share in the 12-year-old mare, and he never hesitated as the bidding sped million by million to the final salvo. "I think we had live bidding up to \$12-13 million," Moreno said. "There was no reserve on her. But we were only going to sell her if it was a big number that we couldn't refuse. Fourteen million wasn't it-but we'd be willing to take offers." **Cont. p2**

KEENELAND LOOKS TO CARRY ON

There was a fair amount of momentum generated last night across town, and officials at Keeneland will hope there is something of a trickle-over affect when the auction house kicks off its massive November Breeding

assive November Breeding Stock Sale this morning at 10 a.m. A record 5,709 horses are set to go under the hammer over the course of the next 15 days, including 2,893 broodmares, 2,267 weanlings, 542 horses of racing age and seven stallion prospects.


"Keeneland's November Sale offers the largest and

BOUND FOR STARDOM


Her name says it all. **Stardom Bound** (Tapit--My White Corvette, by Tarr Road) first made headlines when she broke her maiden in the Sept. 1 GI Del Mar Debutante, and she lived up to the hype with an eye-catching score

in the Oct. 24 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Ready for her close-up when they hand out the Eclipse Awards, the long-legged grey added to her reputation when bringing a final bid of \$5.7 million at Fasig-Tipton yesterday. But the filly might have to share the spotlight with her new owners. Mi-


chael lavarone signed the ticket and he wouldn't reveal who his partners in Stardom Bound might be, but he did say, "There will be some fun people in the group, some celebrities--but I think they might be angry if we said who they are now." lavarone outlasted a determined Frank Stronach who, bidding out back, went all the way to \$5.6 million. The proceedings seemed to stall at that point, but, just before the hammer fell to Stronach's volley, lavarone, sitting with trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. on the auctioneers' left, countered, and the pro-tem champion was his. **Cont. p3**

The dam of seven foals to date, Better Than Honour produced GI Belmont S. winner Jazil (Seeking the Gold), champion Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and GSW Casino Drive (Mineshaft) in the three consecutive years. "She's the best mare in the world," Moreno said. "She's a Pi-

casso." The bay has the two-year-old Man of Iron (Giant's Causeway) and a yearling by Giant's Causeway. She slipped this year, but Moreno is not concerned. "She had seven babies in a row--she needed a break," he remarked. "Now she's had a year off, and hopefully she'll have another four or five in a row." The mare will be bred to A.P. Indy. "Why fix something that's not broken?" Moreno said. "Hopefully we'll have her [to the breeding shed] early. She's open and ready to breed--we'll have her there at the end of February." He added, "Now we

just need another Rags to Riches and we'll be in good shape." Very active at the Keeneland September sale since 2006, Moreno is shifting his focus. "I'm in this for the long term, and I primarily want to breed to race," he said. "I want to focus on the broodmare side. It's the best way to have success. Going into this business by buying auction yearlings, to me, is not the way to do it. When you buy mares, you are buying assets. And with this mare, I have a pedigree that only I and a few others own."

"Rick wouldn't let me say no," lavarone remarked. "We wanted her. She came in at a little more than we wanted, but if you're going to spend \$5 million, you might as well go for \$5.7 million. But we were getting pretty close to the end. One more bid and we might have been out of it; I don't think we were going more than one more."

Still, the IEAH Stables principal was more than satisfied with the final outcome.

"She's a big beautiful filly, and we know she can run. She has plenty of residual value, and we've taken bigger risks than that," he said.

Dutrow added, "I love her--I told Mike after the Breeders' Cup, 'We've got to get this one--we've got to have her.' And when I went to see her, she seemed so sweet and laid back. She's our kind of horse. I can't wait to train her."

Does the New York horseman expect Stardom Bound to be as tough to beat at three as she was at two?

"What's going to stop her?" he laughed.

And will she be pointed for the GI Kentucky Oaks, or will Team lavarone look to make it two in a row on the first Saturday in May?

Dutrow wouldn't commit one way or the other so early in the game, but said, "It will be a big weekend if it works out the right way."

For now, the Breeders' Cup heroine will have the chance to rest on her laurels.

"We'll give her some time here in Kentucky, let her graze and put some weight on her, and get her ready for her three-year-old campaign," lavarone said.

Humble Beginnings...

Bought for just \$50,000 as a KEESEP yearling by Michael Yates, Stardom Bound was pinhooked for \$375,000 as an OBSMAR juvenile. The John Hancock on the ticket was that of trainer Christopher Paasch, buying for owner Charles Cono.

Paasch liked the filly right from the beginning.

"You know when you've got a good horse when you start putting the babies together, galloping them," he



said. "She would drop her head on go with the other horses, and the other horses would come back winded and she'd come back just playing and bucking."

Consignor John Sikura of Hill 'n' Dale kept Cono in the bidding until it reached \$4 million, then bowed out.

"We just wanted to make sure it was a kentuckyoaks.com fair market, to make sure there wasn't some aberration and she brought half of

what she should have," Sikura said "But the mare sold on her own merits--the market determined her value."

Added Cono, "We just came in to see if the number was right, and if it wasn't we'd take her home. That's the best horse we've ever had. It's the best horse l've ever seen, to tell you the truth. I like the money, but I like the horse, too."

home. Mulholland had just one horse entered at Fasig-Tipton November, hip 5, the six-year-old **Malibu Mint** (Malibu Moon--Ivory Mint, by Key to the Mint). In foal to Mr. Greeley, the mare brought \$1.3 million from the bid of John Ferguson, but Mulholland was not in the mood to celebrate.

"It's hard to complain when you get that kind of money, but we will miss her, and the money is not that important," said the petite horsewoman. "We had her for a little over two

Kentucky-bred retired with a record of 25-8-4-1 and earnings of \$783,829.

"We will certainly miss Malibu Mint," Mulholland said. "She has been a member of the family. We worked very closely with her, and my mother came in for her races. It was a wonderful experience. I know a lot of people say this, but it truly was a privilege to be around her."

Mulholland would have liked to keep the mare, but practicality won out over sentimentality.

"At times like this it is very hard, but, because we are a small farm, regrettably, we have to run it like a business," she explained.

But there is some consolation in knowing Malibu Mint has the best of new homes.

"It's hard to celebrate when you are letting go of a horse of a lifetime, but we are deeply grateful that she will be staying in America and going to Darley," Mulholland remarked. "We know she will have the finest of care and the finest of stallions. And the best thing is that Mr. Ferguson invited us to come over and give her carrots. She loves carrots! We were very touched by that." -- AB

It's a Mad, Mad World for Hill 'n' Dale ...

The unofficial dispersal of the horses owned in partnership by Hill 'n' Dale Farms and Southern Equine was an unqualified success, especially from the perspective of Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. In addition to Better Than Honour, who made a sale-topping \$14 million, Hill 'n' Dale was the consignor--and buyer--of hip 2, the Grade I winner **Madcap Escapade** (Hennessy--Sassy Pants, by Saratoga Six). Sikura, sitting up the press box, saw off a challenger seated down below in the pavilion to purchase the seven-year-old mare for \$3.1 million. Madcap Escapade sold in foal on a June 3 cover to A.P. Indy.

When the dust settled, Sikura and an unnamed partner were simply buying out Southern Equine's 25-percent interest in Madcap Escapade. At the 2006 Keeneland November Sale, Sikura had gone to \$6 million for Madcap Escapade, then in foal to Pulpit, in partnership with Mike Moreno's Southern Equine. Sikura and Southern Equine purchased her from Bruce Lunsford, who had raced her to seven wins in nine starts. After the \$6-million transaction, it was reported that Lunsford bought back a 50-percent interest in the mare.

If it indeed was Sikura and Lunsford retaining their shares in the mare, Southern Equine was bought out of its 25-percent interest to the tune of \$775,000.

"We're thrilled to keep her," Sikura said. "She's a mare that has done nothing wrong. She had the most expensive weanling in North America [last year] as her first foal. She's back in foal to A.P. Indy, and her brother has won a stakes. I think it was a grand opportunity. I'm thrilled to retain an interest."

Sikura confirmed he had a 25-percent interest in the mare before the sale and that he now owns 50 percent.

"I thought it was a great opportunity," he added. "One of my reservations about putting a mare like that in the sale was that she had two foals, and is back in foal on a cover in the first week in June. That's always the worst time to sell a mare. I think the fact that mare held up the way she did is a real testament to the physicality of the mare and her ability. I'm thrilled to own a world-class mare."

Madcap Escapade's first foal, a filly by Pulpit, was purchased as a weanling by Southern Equine for \$1.7 million last year at Keeneland November. Madcap Escapade had an A.P. Indy colt this spring and, according to Sikura, is currently carrying a filly by that sire. Sikura said he hadn't made any breeding plans for 2009. -LM





Cajun Power...

While Hill 'n' Dale retained an interest in Madcap Escapade (Better Than Honour wasn't the only mare Southern Equine retained), the Louisiana-based outfit walked away with the majority of horses they had owned with John Sikura's operation. The reason was



simple math. With the exception of Madcap Escapade, they owned a 70-percent share of all the horses, meaning they were essentially paying only 30 percent of the whatever the hammer price. Mike Moreno and Eric Guillot got the day kicked off with hip 34, the Grade I winner **Point Ashley** (Point Given--Golden Thatch, by Slew o'Gold).

The four-year-old was purchased for \$1.4 million. Southern Equine also purchased hip 33, the Distorted Humor weanling filly out of Point Ashley that preceded her dam into the ring. The filly went for \$275,000. Racing for Zayat Stables, Point Ashley won the GI Del

Mar Debutante as a juvenile filly of 2006.

Injured shortly thereafter, she was offered up at the 2007 Keeneland January Sale and promptly topped that event, with Hill 'n' Dale and Southern Equine partnering to purchase the newly turned three-year-old for \$1.8 million. The Distorted Humor filly was her first foal, and she sold back in foal to that sire on a May 19 cover.

About 45 minutes after acquiring that pair, Southern Equine went to \$1.1 million for hip 52, the five-year-old **Sensation** (Dixie Union--Ryn, by Mr. Prospector). A Grade III-winning juvenile, Sensation was purchased for \$475,000 as a 2004 Keeneland September yearling by Castletop Stables and was later acquired privately by Hill 'n' Dale and Southern Equine. She produced her first foal this year, a Giant's Causeway filly. That filly sold yesterday, too, going to Roman Bloodstock for \$130,000. Cont. p9

Southern Equine's third-biggest bid of the night came for another mare they owned with Hill 'n' Dale, the impeccably bred three-year-old filly **Surprises Welcomed** (Storm Cat--Welcome Surprise, by Seeking the Gold). They had teamed to buy the full brother to Mr. Sekiguchi for \$3 million at the 2006 Keeneland September Sale. Last night, Moreno and Guillot, sitting in the press box, went to \$2.5 million for Surprises Welcomed, who was catalogued as hip 68. Surprises Welcome was produced by a half to A.P. Indy, Summer Squall, et al. She has hit the board in each of her five starts, but has yet to graduate yet, most recently running second in six-furlong allowance race at Golden Gate.

"We'll race her a few more times, but obviously she's from one of the best families in the world, so she's a potential blue hen mare that we're looking for our program," said Moreno. "She's one we wanted to keep."

Another they clearly wanted to keep was hip 122, the stakeswinning five-year-old mare **Crystal Current** (A.P. Indy--Dream Supreme, by Seeking the Gold). While Crystal Current was a fine racehorse, taking the Suncoast S. at Tampa, her appeal was clearly based on an impressive page.

Her full brother is GI Hopeful S. hero and new Coolmore sire Majestic Warrior, and both her dam and second dam were Grade I winners in New York. Hill 'n' Dale and Southern Equine had originally acquired Crystal Current privately from owner/breeder Kinsman Farm, and yesterday Southern Equine went to \$3.1 million to purchase the mare outright. Crystal Current's only foal, a weanling colt by the late Maria's Mon, was hammered down to Darley's John Ferguson for \$350,000, the top price for a weanling on the day.

From Moreno's perspective, buying back the horses is simple; we liked 'em then, why wouldn't we now?

"We are happy with what we bought in the partnership, and so we're buying most of them back," he explained. Moreno pointed out the merits of a mare like Point Ashley.

"She's a young mare, a Grade I winner with tons of ability on the racetrack who has a nice family," he said. "She's only had one baby who was a May baby who was very correct. We bought the baby back, too."

Moreno and Guillot said that planned on being busy as buyers over the next few days at Keeneland November.

"It's a buyers' market, and we're buying," Moreno said. "It's a good opportunity for us."

Asked if they had a number in mind of how many mares they'd like to go home with, Guillot asserted, "Four hundred." Get ready, Keeneland. *-LM*

Patience Pays Off...

Shadwell Farm was decidedly quiet for most of yesterday's sale. Shadwell Vice President Rick Nichols sat on the sidelines until there were fewer than 10 hips left to go through the ring, then he went to work. When the dusted settled, he had gone to \$2.7 million to get GISW Lear's Princess (Lear Fan--Pretty City, by Carson City). She was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale, who also offered world-record broodmare Better Than Honour. Ironically, it was Lear's Princess who bested Better Than Honour's champion Rags to Riches in what turned out to be that filly's final start, handing her a half-length defeat in the GI Gazelle S. last September.

"She's a big honest filly, and her pedigree fits into our European program very well," Nichols said. "And we knew her very well--she was trained by [Shadwell conditioner Kiaran McLaughlin], and we followed her career."

While the four-year-old will remain in the States, her progeny are likely to head overseas.

"We will keep her here and breed her, but we'll breed her with an eye toward Europe," Nichols said.

Lear's Princess, who was also runner-up in the GI CCA Oaks and GI Alabama S., retired with a record of 10-4-3-1 and earnings of \$491,870. It has not yet been decided who she will be bred to.

Stronach Strikes at Fasig...

Adena Springs' Frank Stronach was reportedly shut out on the \$5.7-million Stardom Bound, but made amends by landing a handful of other top prospects. His two top buys each came at \$1.8 million--and came two hips apart. Standing in back under the bidding stand, Stronach went to that amount for hip 157A, the Grade I-winning three-year-old filly **Ariege** (Doneraile Court), then doubled up by landing hip 159, the treble Grade I-winning four-year-old **Intangaroo** (Orientate). Stronach also purchased **Honey Ryder** (Lasting Approval), as hip 175, for \$1.75 million.

- Hip <u>84</u>, Valid Lil (Valid Expectations), for \$140,000

- 5. Hip 154, Heartfelt (Kafwain), for \$75,000

Asked if he was making a concerted effort to be more active in the bloodstock market, he said, "No, it's just there's some great racemares here. I'm in the stallion business, and I wanted to get some great mares for them."

He added that he felt there was fair value in the market for both buyers and sellers. "If you've got something special, the money is there," Stronach said. -LM

Two Millions Reasons To Sell...

There was a smattering of high-priced buybacks yesterday, but **Sharp Susan** (Touch Gold--Winter's Gone, by Dynaformer) wasn't one of them. The fouryear-old, consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency for WinStar Farm as a racing/broodmare prospect, brought \$2 million from Australian-based Freyer Bloodstock.

Still, WinStar nearly brought the filly back home. "She was close to her reserve, but she sold," said

WinStar's Bill Casner. "We hoped she would bring a little more, but that was where we chose to sell her."

Sharp Susan is a multiple graded winner of \$477,926, but it was her pedigree that really got the bidders going. The dark bay is a half-sister to Grade I winners Spring At Last (Silver Deputy) and Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band).



"Spring At Last is a stallion we'll be standing next year, and he is going to be a wonderful stallion," Casner said. "This mare has the opportu-

nity to produce stallions--it's a wonderful pedigree."

Sharp Susan was bred by WinStar, who later sold an interest to IEAH Stables. Unfortunately, she is the next-to-last foal from her prolific dam. The mare, who was barren in 2005 and slipped in 2006, has a yearling colt by Storm Cat, but died last spring.

"Winter's Gone was a tremendous mare, but she had an event when she was foaling last year and we lost her," Casner said. "She was just a young mare, and it was a huge loss, a tremendous loss."

What made Team WinStar decide to send Sharp Susan through the ring?

"She was a partnership horse, and we have horses at the farm with similar bloodlines," Casner explained. "You'd like to keep them all, but you've got to sell some. We are in the business of selling horses, and these are all business decisions."

Diane Perkins's Wimborne Farm. He paid \$70,000 for the gray filly, a daughter of the turf sire Lasting Approval. While that sire might have been less than fashionable, Greathouse was impressed with the filly's page.

"With her, it was less about looks than about pedigree," he said. "There was a whole lot of pedigree over at that dispersal, if you could last long enough." Honey Ryder is a half to GSW Cuando Puede (Lord at War {Arg}) and MSW & MGSP Cuando (Lord at War {Arg}). As a racehorse, Honey Ryder lived up to that page.

- BREEDERS ONLY -

She developed into one of the top grass mares of her generation for trainer Todd Pletcher. She banked nearly \$2.8 million while winning the GI E.P. Taylor S. and GI Flower Bowl Invitational and also ran second in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. This was actually Honey Ryder's second trip to the Fasig Sale. She was entered here in 2006, but was led out of the ring unsold at \$1.8 million.

Interestingly, Greathouse made a few other purchases at the Wimborne dispersal that proved fortuitous. Also for \$70,000, he bought the broodmare La Comete (Holy Bull). The mare is now better known as the dam of this year's GI Champagne S. runner-up Munnings (Speightstown), whom Greathouse had sold for \$150,000 as a FTSAUG yearling. Munnings was later sold to Coolmore connections for \$1.7 million.

The 12-year-old La Comete was also offered last night. Catalogued as hip 156, she was purchased by Russell J. Bennett, agent, for \$230,000 while in foal on an Apr. 23 cover to Speightstown.

"She was a heavy-made mare, and she passed that along to her foals," explained Greathouse. "There's nothing wrong with that, because a horse like Munnings can obviously run."

In the end, Greathouse was pragmatic about selling off mares so close to his heart.

"A person in my position isn't always able to assemble mares like Honey Ryder--the kind of mares you'd like to make a broodmare band out of," he said. "My first choice would be to keep these mares for the next 10 years, but money has a way of raising its ugly head."

Greathouse also started the re-loading process last night. Signing the ticket as Glencrest Farm LLC/Miller, he bought hip 53, a weanling filly from the first crop of Henny Hughes. The filly, who was consigned by Belvedere Farm, Inc. (Marty Takacs), agent, is a half-sister to MGSW Feline Story (Tale of the Cat).

"We tried to buy fillies earlier and didn't get them bought, but we'll go on to the next sale," said Greathouse. "That's what we do--we trade horses. Sometimes you're lucky at it, and sometimes you're damn unlucky." -LM

Magnificience Brings \$1 Million...

Magnificience (Stormy Atlantic--Fashion Delight, by Fappiano) was tabbed a **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** after winning her debut in jaw-dropping fashion back in



March of 2007. She confirmed she indeed was a rising star with a facile victory in the GIII Santa Paula S. a few weeks later, but she was sidelined with an ankle chip and went missing for 13 months. Racing for a partnership that included trainer Bruce Headley, who had purchased her as a yearling for \$120,000, as well as Hill 'n' Dale Farm, Tom Lenner and Irwin Molasky, Magnificience returned this season at four, but clearly wasn't the same animal as she was last

year. She has won one of five starts with a runner-up finish in the GII A Gleam H.

Buyers clearly remember her brilliance, though, and the striking chestnut, selling yesterday as a broodmare prospect only, elicited a bid of \$1 million from Darley agent John Ferguson. John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned the filly as hip 3, was happy with the result.

"Unfortunately, she had some issues this year," he said. "I think she was bought very well, because in my mind, she was certainly a mare of Grade I ability. She didn't reproduce her form of last year, but students of the game who really followed the races know what she did in her first two starts. She's a mare that's beyond what's on the page. For a Grade III winner to bring a million dollars--they don't. So certainly [the buyers] were of the opinion she was a world-class race horse, which she was. We stand the horse [sire Stormy Atlantic], so obviously we thrilled with it." -LM

Ferguson Makes Presence Felt Early...

Darley's John Ferguson kept himself plenty busy at yesterday's sale. Spending much of the afternoon and evening positioned underneath the rear bidding stand, Ferguson purchased no fewer than three mares and a weanling colt for his boss, Sheikh Mohammed. Ferguson purchases included:

- Hip 4, Magnificience (Stormy Atlantic), for \$1 million
- Hip 5, Malibu Mint (Malibu Moon), for \$1.3 million
- Hip 25, Panty Raid (Include), for \$2.5 million
- Hip 121, Maria's Mon--Crystal Current weanling colt for \$350,000

Ferguson said the common theme among the mares was that all were top-class race horses in the United States. "Historically, we've a lot of top European mares,



Europe of the years," he explained." It's nice to be able to fill up a broodmare band with mares that are more suited to American racing, and I would say that all three of these fit that mold."

Ferguson was quick to compliment Fasig-Tipton on the group of fillies and mares they'd assembled, but said that he had seen evidence that the struggling economy was indeed affecting trade.

"I think they've done an outstanding job and that's a credit to them, and I hope they sell well," he said. "But at the end of

the day, there are a lot of factors outside the bloodstock industry which well affect how much the mares make. But I don't think a sales company could do more in getting the best mares available. I think there are two ways in looking at things, and one way is that things are tough. On the other hand, there's great value to be had, and it's a great opportunity if you interested in the breeding business to get involved. You can come here and buy mares that you might not have been able to afford a couple of years ago. I think this should be taken as a time for opportunity rather than a time for misery."

Ferguson was asked by one reporter if Darley was increasing its involvement at Fasig-Tipton because Sheikh Mohammed has ties with its new ownership. Ferguson replied, "Sheikh Mohammed has nothing to do with the company. Abdulla Al Habbai is the man who owns this place through his company, Synergy Investments, and it makes no difference at all. We'll go where the horses are." -LM

Sellers opted to buy back a half-dozen lots at more than \$600,000 yesterday at Fasig-Tipton November. The highest-priced RNA on the day was <u>hip 103</u>, the three-year-old **Backseat Rhythm** (El Corredor--Kiss a Miss, by Kissin Kris), who was led out unsold at \$2.5 million. Hidden Brook, agent for owner Paul Pompa Jr., bought the filly for \$75,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Pompa sent her back through the ring at Barretts March last year, but brought her home when the bidding fizzled out at \$240,000.

The bay has rewarded that faith many times over. Second in the GI Frizette S. and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies on the dirt at two, she proved even more valuable when switched to the turf this season. Backseat Rhythm won the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. and the GII Lake Placid S. and came flying late to be second in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 11. Her record stands at 13-4-2-3 with a bankroll of \$707,195. Cont. p15

Her connections feel she has the potential to add to the coffers on the track next year, and decided to roll the dice and keep her once again.

Explaining the decision, Hidden Brook's Jack Brothers said, "Paul likes to stick out his toe in the water, but she was coming off three excellent races in row. She was a fast-closing second in one of the most prestigious races in the country for three-year-old fillies last time out, and she's just finding her best form.

"She's as good a filly as we've had, and we can campaign her next year and then maybe come back to November." What's behind the trend toward high-priced buybacks?

"I can't speak for the others, but when you have a filly with racing value, there are so many places to go with her next year, including the Breeders' Cup," Brothers remarked. "And it's part of our program--it's the same thing we do with the two-year-olds. We take the two-year-olds to the sale, but we're not afraid to protect them. This is the same scenario."

But just what was the reserve set on Backseat Rhythm? Brothers didn't say, but he did offer with a smile, "We were very close. We got to the one-yard line, but it just didn't happen."--*AB*

Stars Shine At Fasig-Tipton...

Despite a slumping economy and a sales market that has been decidedly bearish, the numbers were up sharply at Fasig-Tipton November. "We were up 35 percent in gross from last year," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson. "The average was up 59 percent and the median went from \$180,000 to \$250,000, up 39 percent. The not solds were up this year, but it is a more selective world that we're living in." The sales company was not surprised by the stellar success. "This is a lot better catalogue than we've ever had before, and that contributed," Robertson said. "We had the best mares we've ever assembled, and the numbers needed to be up." He added, "It's like I said this summer--the horse sales are a lot better off than the 401Ks--my 401K has pretty well tanked since the summer." The icing on the cake was the world-record sale of Better Than Honour to cap off the evening. "How do you appraise her?" Robertson said. "She is what she is--the best there is. And everybody loves a world record."--AB

A Tough Act to Follow...

This year's edition of the November sale has some big shoes to fill. It was in the latter stages of the first session when the Sangster Family's Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) made her much-anticipated appearance in the Keeneland sales pavilion. In the several minutes to follow, bidding on the five-year-old mare boiled down to a fascinating and gripping duel between John Ferguson for Sheikh Mohammed and representatives of Coolmore, the famed Irish stud which Robert Sangster helped to develop into one of the world's most prominent nurseries. At the end of the war, it was Ferguson who signed the ticket; the hammer price of \$10.5 million easily established a world record. In a strong economic environment, turnover exceeded \$340 million, also a new standard, while the average topped \$100,000 and the median remained static. But that was then and this is now, and now there is uncertainty and a bit of uneasiness, as buyers and sellers alike attempt to assess how so many horses will find new homes in an economic climate that can be best described as volatile. Still, optimism reigns, and the November sale boasts many success stories. Forever Together, who could be voted an Eclipse Award as champion turf mare, sold as a weanling at Keeneland in 2004, while other November graduates include Commentator, Mauralakana (Fr), Kodiak Kowboy, Recapturetheglory and Diamond Stripes, to name but a few. Additionally, the 2008 November sale features a large number of horses with current race form, including consignments from Zayat Stables, Woodford Racing and Shadwell Farm. "The quality of these offerings from these and other consignments has made this sale an important stop for buyers looking for top quality, proven racehorses that are ready to perform at the highest levels of racing anywhere in the world," Russell noted.

Another Home-Run Horse for Hunter Valley?

It's already been a terrific year for the Hunter Valley consignment of Fergus Galvin and Adrian Regan. The duo consigned a \$1.2-million son of A.P. Indy--Pyramid Lake to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale, and things are liable to remain rosy for the operation Monday at Keeneland when Mary Delaney (Hennessy), a filly raced in partnership by Galvin, takes her place in the sales ring.

A daughter of Crafy Emerald (Crafty Prospector) from the extended female family of GISW Thorn Song (Unbridled's Song), Mary Delaney was hammered down to Galvin's longtime associate and friend Stephen Hillen for \$85,000 as a KEESEP yearling back in 2004 and was sent overseas, where she was a maiden winner at Lingfield and placed on two other occasions for trainer Mark Wallace.

"With the prize money over here, Mark always felt



"She was unbeatable in that four or five-month stretch," Galvin commented. "Winning a Grade II in your backyard at Keeneland is a thrill most people wait a lifetime for. It was a huge thrill to claim the scalp of such a great filly. It was a huge achievement to win like she did at Keeneland."

Mary Delaney was retired by Galvin and his partners at the end of 2007 and was bred to Mr. Greeley.

"It's a good cross and she's the sort of mare that would fit on either side of the water," said Galvin. "We want a potential buyer to have that option. She's by Hennessy, and Mr. Greeley is an international sire, and we didn't want her to be labeled for one country or another. We wanted to leave that option for a potential buver.

"She is stunning to look at. She's got tremendous quality about her and she catches the eye. Mr. Greeley gets good-looking horses and it was an ideal fit for her. Whenever you have a Storm Cat-line mare, the Mr. Prospector line is the first you look at."

Mary Delaney clearly holds a special place in the hearts and is the focal point of the Hunter Valley draft. But Galvin admits Monday's events will be difficult to watch.

"She gave us some huge thrills along the way and It's a tough decision to sell her, but when you're in my position, it's an economic decision. "We've thought very long and hard about [keeping her]. To have the best race filly you've ever owned and quite possibly ever will own, to have to put her through the ring, it's obviously a very tough decision, but sometimes your head has got to rule over your heart. We're a commercial operation and we're trying not to fall in love with every animal you've got, but that's going to be difficult given the thrills she's given us."

Fergus Galvin, Hunter Valley Farm

"Everybody is kind of holding their breath as the sale comes along. A lot of times the market defies a lot of trends or what's happening globally. There's a lot of talk that there's going to be a drop in the sale, but I think the quality at the mid to top end is going to stay very healthy. The weaker mares people are going to struggle with, especially the exposed ones. I think there will be a pretty good correction at the lower end."

Case Clay, Three Chimneys Farm

"I am going to try to be realistic about the market. What we're trying to do in valuing the mares is to take their values last year and taking off a percentage. Whether it's 25 or 35 percent, I guess we'll see, but I think overall, mares are worth less than what they were last year. I guess the positive thing about that is there are going to be some good buying opportunities."





Trainer Paul Blockley was recently hit with a 2 1/2year ban by the British Horseracing Authority, pending appeal, for alleged corrupt practices, but his outsider Zafisio lit up the boards here. The 28-1 shot led home an overseas exacta with a head defeat of Prince Siegfried in France's penultimate Group 1 event of the year. Stepping up from a debut third at Sandown Aug. 14, he made a quick reappearance and shed his maiden status at Ayr Aug. 27 before registering a first stakes win in the Sept. 13 Listed Stardom S. at Goodwood. He lined up for this coming back from a fourth in the G2 Prix de Conde at Longchamp Oct. 19, and delivered an irresistible late surge to garner a personal-best success. The bay colt stalked the front rank in a handy sixth after a level break and was stirred into action at the top of the home run. Weaving his way into contention approaching the final eighth, he was driven out in the closing stages to assert superiority. "My instructions were to lead if nothing was willing to go on, but they went a good early pace, so I didn't need to," explained jockey Dominique Boeuf. "He really found his stride two furlongs out and, when he did, he really went. He has a lot of courage and I'm sure he will stay further." Zafisio is set to renew rivalry with runner-up Prince Siegfried in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud Nov. 12. "The ground was very much in his favor and we knew we came into the race with a big shout," Blockley admitted. "Members of the French press telephoned me beforehand, and I told them I really thought he would be in the first three." Aidan O'Brien's headline horse **Septimus** looms larger than life over Tuesday's A\$5.5-million Melbourne Cup, but a sense of quiet confidence is emanating from the **Mad Rush** camp following his supremely eye-catching fourth in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 18. Mad Rush has continued to please trainer Luca Cumani since. Cumani's Purple Moon (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) went within a



half-length of snaring Australia's iconic race last spring, and the conditioner rates lightly raced Mad Rush as a better Cup prospect. He will carry 13 pounds under

weight-for-age and 11 less than his potential nemesis, Septimus, and he has gifted rider Damien Oliver's Aussie know-how. Oliver has four Cup wins under his belt to date to his advantage. Mad Rush gives the impression he will enjoy Flemington's spacious track, and Cumani haslearned lessons after coming tantalizingly close last spring. "You don't really need an out-and-out two-mile horse," Cumani explained. "What you need is a horse that goes a mile and a half well, has the ability perhaps to stay further, but also has got a turn of foot. Purple Moon was just that kind of horse, and I think both Mad Rush and [last start Geelong Cup winner] Bauer (Ire) (Halling) are exactly that kind of horse."

Cumani was delighted with barrier four, saying, "We will be up there and in the firing line. We could not be happier." He echoed trainer Dermot Weld's comments when he said 2008 was a year of opportunity for the eight international horses because "I don't think there's a Makybe Diva in there this year." With Australians resigned to overseas domination in one form or another this year, Mad Rush has firmed to A\$5 favorite ahead of Septimus on TAB Sportingbet. That runner's sensational 13-length G1 Irish St. Leger victory Sept. 13 has Aussies in awe, but O'Brien, clad in overalls and gumboots and meticulously shadowing his trio's every move at Sandown, is cautious. "I don't think he's unbeatable," O'Brien said. "This is horse racing. Every horse is beatable. He has proven to be a good horse in our part of the world."

Swirling Storm...

Topweight Septimus is certainly the subject of blazing headlines, but perhaps not for all the right reasons. The import with an imposing record heads Aidan O'Brien's trio of Cup runners, and Racing Victoria stewards have expressed concern about the possible use of pacemakers in the wake of comments O'Brien made on television. O'Brien said his horses had suffered in the past two Melbourne Cups from an inconsistent speed, and a strong tempo would give them their best chance. **Cont. p27**

At Sandown, Septimus has always tended to work behind his stablemates, being allowed to catch up, and he has drawn beside 50-1 chance Alessandro Volta (GB) Montjeu (Ire). Chief Steward Terry Bailey said he had examined videos of Septimus' overseas performances, but said he was yet to decide whether to discuss the issue with O'Brien, adding that jockeys would be reminded pacemakers are forbidden in Australia. Meanwhile, part-owner Derrick Smith has declared he will instruct O'Brien to scratch the horse if the Flemington track was deemed too firm. "I've got to think of the horse first. He's too valuable," Smith said after the barrier draw on Saturday night. "The horse means so much to me. The last thing I would want to do is go away from here with the Cup and not the horse. I would rather have the horse than the Cup," Smith told Melbourne's Herald Sun newspaper. Victoria Racing Club chairman Rod Fitzroy conceded the track was too firm on and said it would be watered before the Cup. "In hindsight, I think the track should have had five millimeters last night, but we will be watering tonight and again tomorrow if it is needed," he said Saturday evening. The issue of track ratings ahead of the Cup is always thorny. In the past, Dermot Weld has complained about dry tracks, while in 2006 trainer Lee Freedman voiced his concerns about the track before Maybe Diva (GB) duly won.

The Darshaan Factor...

Septimus comes armed with an impressive record on the track, but the son of Sadler's Wells (Ire) also has the Darshaan factor in his favour. Neither his sire or his damsire have had many representatives in these parts, but Darshaan has had eight winners from 12 runners as broodmare sire here. Morever, the Sadler's Wells (Ire)--Darshaan cross has yielded 10 exceptional Group 1 winners including High Chaparral (Ire), Islington (Ire), Marienbard (Ire), Ebadilya (Ire) and Milan (GB).

Experience Counts...

One with the runs on the board is canny Irish trainer Dermot Weld, the only European trainer to have sent out a Cup winner, with Vintage Crop (Ire) (Rousillon) in 1993 and Media Puzzle (Theatrical {Ire}) in 2002; stablemate Vinnie Roe (Ire) (Definite Article {GB}) was runner-up in 2004 and fourth in 2002. Weld has the lightly raced Profound Beauty engaged, but the trainer has reservations about her ability to get the two-mile trip. Coming off a three-month layoff, Profound Beauty set a track record over 2800 meters in the Listed Challenge S. at Leopardstown July 16 before finishing third in the G3 Ballyroan S. at her last start on Aug. 17. "It's probably a year too soon to be honest; next year was going to be her year," Weld said. "But she has a good weight, so we decided to take our chance. If she can go the two miles is the unknown factor...she's relaxed, and we're hopeful."

Weld has engaged Glen Boss, reasoning that the jockey impressed him when he partnered Makybe Diva (GB) for her 2004 win from Vinnie Roe (Ire). "I thought Vinnie Roe was the best horse I brought down here and he would be very hard to beat," Weld said. "But Glen got up on the inside and the rest is history. Experience is very important because in many ways Profound Beauty is inexperienced, and this is quite a big challenge for her." In a column in *The Daily Telegraph*, jockey Glen Boss said: "My mare worked brilliantly and easily had the measure of her opponent (**Varevees**). Profound Beauty's work was very sharp, she has electrifying acceleration and it just got me thinking whether she is more a 2400-meter horse," said Boss, who is chasing his fourth Melbourne Cup win.

Zarita Scratched...

Zarita has been scratched out of Tuesday's A\$5.5million Cup due to a virus, according to published reports. Her withdrawal leaves the current field at 23. Last autumn, the Pat Hyland trainee captured both the G1 South Australia Derby and G1 South Australian Oaks.

Despite leaving some 45 Group 1 winners among 345 stakes winners globally to date, a Melbourne Cup winner is absent from the honour roll for epoch-making stallion Danehill, who died in May 2003 and whose



hoto final crop are now four-yearolds. Danehill dramatically reshaped the Australian Thoroughbred courtesy of a slew of precocious juvenile sprinters, but he was capable of siring high class stayers, Westerner (GB) being the most obvious example. He made more of a mark on the G1 Australian Cup over 2000 meters with Dane Ripper (Aus), scoring that trophy in 1998 after winning the G1 Cox Plate the provious spring, while Elystroom

previous spring, while Elvstroem (Aus) won the Caulfield Cup (2400 meters) before he was fourth to Makybe Diva (GB) in the 2004 Melbourne Cup. Victoria Derby winner Nothin' Leica Dane (Aus) was a memorable second in the '95 edition of the Melbourne Cup--and then there's the indefatigable **Zipping**. The seven-year-old, out of a half-sister to MG1SW Scorpion (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), is lining up for his third crack at the big one, having filled fourth place for the past two years. If inexperience at the trip is a concern for fellow Danehill representative Profound Beauty, it is hardly so for this Lloyd Williams-owned veteran who has a record of 32-11-2-6 for earnings of A\$1,935,695. Bred by Swettenham and sold for A\$190,000 at the 2003 Inglis Easter Sale, Zipping has been ticking along quietly with a third tilt at the Cup in mind. Off the board at his 2008 bow in the G1 Newmarket H. Mar. 8, he was put away again and produced for the G2 Dato Tan S., where he again failed to flatter. But sent over further on Oct. 4, Zipping was an eye-catching third in the G1 Turnbull S. before he was a game runner-up to Maldivian in the Cox Plate Oct. 25. In the frame three times at Group 1 level, Zipping has hardly been a headline horse to date but if he justifies his owners' faith that he can indeed stay the trip on Tuesday, he'll add a posthumous honour to Danehill's repertoire.



Dissatisfied by the division of revenue from advance deposit wagering on California racing from outside the state, the Thoroughbred Owners of California decided to withhold their approval allowing ADW companies to offer betting on the current Hollywood meet to their out-of-state customers. TOC President Drew Couto outlined the California horsemen's side of the story in Saturday's *TDN*.

TVG is one of four ADW companies licensed in California. They have been running ads during their racing broadcasts encouraging out-of-state subscribers to call the TOC to complain about current impasse. Today, TVG's General Counsel John Hindman offers his company's take on the situation.

Do you think TVG has been fair in the fees it has paid to horsemen and racetracks in the past?

John Hindman: TVG fully recognizes, and always has, the importance of ADW companies supporting live racing and tracks and horsemen. Our business model, from the inception, has been more generous to tracks and horsemen in terms of the fees that we return to the industry than anybody else's. For instance, this year, if we do \$500 million in wagering, we'll return between \$60-\$65 million to tracks and horsemen. In terms of our record, there is no company that has done more to ensure that advance deposit wagering is helping live racing than TVG. It's with that background that we approach this. From a philosophical standpoint we don't disagree that ADW needs to support tracks and horsemen. And we practice what we preach, so we're perplexed by this situation.

Have you attempted to negotiate with the TOC on the out-of-state ADW?

JH: We've had a relationship with the TOC for years; earlier this year, they informed us that the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group was going to be their "brokerage" for these sorts of things. And we've had a lot of communications with the THG--literally, over the last week, almost every day. Any idea that we're not being communicative is inaccurate. We've had discussions with them since January. We had a meeting with them in Del Mar in August, and we laid out what our business model for returning revenue to tracks and horsemen is, in case anybody was unaware of it. The fact is that we've been paying back more than two-thirds of takeout from ADW to the racing industry for years, which is more than what the THG representatives have been advocating. We made clear that's the way we would continue to operate as it related to Hollywood Park this fall. In another effort in mid-October--well before the start of the meet--we informed the entire TOC Board of the fact that under our existing Hollywood Park agreement, TVG returned 67 percent of all of the takeout to tracks and horsemen during the spring/summer meet--and it was a non-exclusive wagering arrangement. This fall we are operating under the same arrangement, which is what TVG and Hollywood Park had during the ADW experiment, and the TOC was first to say that the experiment was a huge success. We hoped they would continue to support Hollywood Park and TVG for the fall meet, but they didn't.

What do the horsemen want that TVG is not giving them?

JH: That's a really good question. The THG sent a proposal around on Tuesday, which was the day before the Hollywood meet started. It was the proposal that they wanted all of the ADWs--I assume, I know we received it--to look at for the Hollywood Park meet. I had a lengthy conversation with the THG representative and walked through it with him and made sure that I understood the proposal, which was basically that 60 percent of takeout would go back to the tracks and horsemen. And then I said let's overlay it with what TVG did for the spring/summer meet. We would have paid back less money to tracks and horsemen under the THG plan than we actually did, about \$500,000 less.

Of course, no THG model can wipe away what TVG's existing contractual obligations and legal obligations are. But, basically, their plan is that if you already have to pay fees to tracks and horsemen, those fees are credited against what you might owe to the THG. The net-net of it was, it's not that we would have gotten \$500,000 back; we would have owed nothing to the THG, so no additional money would have gone to either side. We don't believe that their reasoning for excluding TVG from out-of-state wagering really could be economics, because it's not a reason. In terms of what any additional agreements with the THG or anybody else would accomplish, it's almost of no point, because they really wouldn't do anything. So, from an economic perspective, we don't understand it. I've also heard, 'Even if TVG pays back a certain amount to the racing industry, other ADWs don't.' Well, I don't know what other ADWs do, and obviously we don't have any control over that. If that's the rationale for withholding the signal from TVG, we don't understand it.

If the THG model doesn't cost TVG any more, why not agree to it?

JH: Because it's a very complicated proposal. What they're trying to do with one Hollywood Park meet is to leverage everybody into a national program or a national proposal for all tracks and horsemen's groups. And they sprung this on us a day before the Hollywood Park meet opened. It would have been very difficult for TVG to respond in full and conclude something. But we immediately communicated back to the THG to say what some of our issues are. For instance, they have a provision for television fees in their arrangement that we're concerned about. We told them how we think it could be made better. They have other provisions that are very complicated. Also, since what they are trying to is use the Hollywood Park meet to do something more than Hollywood Park, it's hard to evaluate that in a vacuum without knowing what other tracks think about it or what other horsemen think about it.

A case in point is, under their proposal, the money gets reallocated in large part from one set of tracks and horsemen's groups to another sets of tracks and horsemen's groups. So for instance, under the proposal they put forth Tuesday, the source market fees that we would pay to Kentucky tracks and horsemen from Hollywood Park bets would decrease 56 percent. That should be a consequence that everybody fully understands and is on board with. It's very complicated and it's something that's much larger than Hollywood Park. But what we're trying to make people understand, as it relates to Hollywood Park or anything else we're doing right now, is that nobody is being economically short-changed by TVG, and we're doing what we've always done, which is making sure that our activities support live racing and tracks and horsemen.

Would it be a bad idea to have a national standard for the agreements between ADW companies and horsemen?

JH: Anybody who has been in the business, on any side of it, would say that there is some benefit to uniformity, because right now every situation is very unique and it can be very difficult to navigate the circumstances from jurisdiction to jurisdiction. On the other hand, I'm not sure if there will ever be a "one size fits all" solution because, number one, different states have different laws and, number two, different racing represents different values to any off-track wagering provider, be it TVG, or New York City OTB or another ADW provider. A system that basically says, 'No matter who you are or where you come from, everybody should get the exact same thing,' I don't know whether or not that will ever work.

The other thing is, the horsemen want all of the ADWs to unilaterally agree to one model. Well, in the world in which we operate, the tracks are also a very important variable in this equation, and I'm not aware of any tracks that have signed onto this model. So, if you're signing onto something that the people you have to get the content from--meaning the racetracks--may not agree with, you're probably not serving yourself very well.



What is TVG's plan going forward?

JH: We're trying to help people understand that, as it relates to TVG, what we're currently doing serves everybody well in the market place and that we should move forward, at least for this meet, and continue to do business the way that we had been doing business. And again, all we're proposing is to do business the same way we did under the ADW experiment, which many people, including the TOC, viewed as a tremendous success.

According to the TOC, the rates agreed to during the experimental period were lower than what they feel is equitable. Does TVG feel those rates were fair?

JH: The out-of-state rates they received under the experiment were significantly higher than A) What they had been receiving, and B) What they're receiving from almost every other out of-of-state outlet in the country, almost all of whom they're continuing to allow to take bets on Hollywood Park today. We paid 7 percent from out-of-state wagers during the experiment to Hollywood Park, and it's hard for us to swallow the fact we're not being allowed to take bets at that rate when other entities such as certain off-track betting companies that also do ADW are paying Hollywood Park less than 3 percent. It makes no sense to us. And second of all, if you go back to the THG model, we're getting to a certain point here where all you're doing is trading money between tracks and horsemen's groups. If TVG didn't have any other contractual or legal obligations, and if TVG did the THG model for this Hollywood Park meet, it would result--and this is just one example I mentioned earlier--in a 56-percent decline on those bets in source market fees to Kentucky. We're trying to support all tracks and horsemen with ADW and so, at a certain point, it becomes an issue where one track or horsemen's group thinks they should be getting more than another track or horsemen's group. And when it comes to the horsemen, they're all supposed to be part of this new organization, so it makes it confusing to us..

I do this every day and it takes a while for me to understand what it all means. If what they want to do is install a national footprint for horse racing, then everybody should be fully aware of how that impacts their individual interests. You do that through communication, which is what we're doing every day. And you do that through an education process. We've certainly been trying to educate people about what we do, and we're trying to be educated as to what everybody else's plans are.

What was your intention when running the ads regarding the impasse on TVG, and what has the response been?

JH: To educate and inform, those were the reasons for the ads. We have a national television network that's in 31 million homes, showing Hollywood Park every day, but people outside California can't place a bet on Hollywood. It's incumbent upon us to try to explain the situation as we understand it--and to explain it from a fan's perspective, because obviously our first concern is serving the patrons, and we're not able to do that right now. Secondly, from a horseman's perspective, the ads provide information that we think is relevant to the situation--such as the fact that our existing model paid the tracks and horsemen over \$500,000 more during Hollywood's last meet than what's being proposed now by TOC and THG; I think that it's an important fact that people should know.

The response to the ads has been good. Obviously, the racing fans are disappointed that they can't wager on Hollywood Park, but I think they appreciate that we are explaining the situation to them the best that we can.

Is there a solution to the impasse?

JH: To me, no roadblocks are insurmountable and we'll continue to work with the industry in good faith on this very important topic. At the same time, what is a roadblock is shutting fans out at a time when neither California racing nor racing nationally can really stand much more pressure than it's already under. Our fans are the most important thing, so what we're the most concerned about is being able to serve them, and also being able to serve the tracks and the industry that we're supporting. And right now, in the California situation, we're being blocked from doing that.

We're never pessimistic and we're always looking for solutions. And at this point, what we've been able to do is at least make sure that fans and horsemen understand the circumstances as we understand them, so it will inform the discussion.--Andy Belfiore







ROAR DIES IN ARGENTINA Argentina's 2004

leading sire Roar (Forty Niner--Wild Applause, by Northern Dancer) died last week from failing health at Haras La Esperanza in Argentina. The 15-year-old stallion, out of multiple graded-stakes producer and earner Wild Applause, stood the Northern Hemisphere breeding season at Tom and Nancy Clark's Rancho San Miguel in California for \$7,500. He had returned permanently to Argentina in June after he was recently acquired privately by Raul Lottero's Haras La Esperanza. Roar did not cover any mares this season at La Esperanza. The winner of the GII Jim Beam S. and GIII Swale S. shuttled to Argentina for the first time in 1997 and stood through the 2000 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Carlos Blaquier's Haras La Biznaga. Roar sired 42 stakes winners and 22 graded stakes winners. In addition, he is the sire of nine Group 1 winners and seven South American champions, many of them in Argentina and is also the broodmare sire of Group 1 winners Stormy Vil (Arg) (Bernstein) and Greco Tom (Arg) (Shy Tom). Through Oct. 27, his progeny have earned purses totaling \$21,675,973. "Roar was highly successful and a proven sire," said Raul Lottero, owner of Haras La Esperanza. "He was a beautiful horse and will be missed."
