THE LADY IS A TOPPER

With a superb race record and by one of the top stallions in the world, **Hystericalady** (Distorted Humor) figured to be among the most desirable offerings during yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland November Sale in Lexington. Selling just before the noon hour, the handsome chestnut indeed drew plenty of interest, with Darley representative John Ferguson landing the broodmare and/or racing prospect for a session-topping \$3 million. "She was an outstandingly tough racing filly," Ferguson commented afterwards. "Obviously, we followed her with interest for years. She's been so consistent and she's out of a top, top South American mare; she was an obvious candidate." Asked if Darley intended to keep the mare in training at six, Ferguson commented, "I'll talk to the boss [Sheikh Mohammed] and see what he says. But I would think it's unlikely." Regarding the price, Ferguson said, "I think it was a fair price. She's a top racemare, and we're obviously going through difficult times, but at the end of the day the real quality will sell well." **Hystericalady** sold as hip 53 from the draft of Taylor Made Sales Agency. *cont. p4*

INTO THE LIGHT

At the Keeneland September Sale two months ago, Bill Farish watched the first foal from his talented racemare **Shadow Cast** (Smart Strike--Daily Special, by Dayjur), a filly by A.P. Indy, sell to John Ferguson for \$1 million. Yesterday, Ferguson was back for mom. Doing his bidding from his usual perch out back, Ferguson saw off all challengers to land the seven-year-old **Shadow Cast** for \$2.3 million--the third-highest price during yesterday's opening session. Ferguson was representing Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation. The mare sold in foal on an Apr. 19 cover to Bernardini, who stands at Darley.

DAM OF EIGHT BELLES TO DARLEY

The 11-year-old **Away** (Dixieland Band--Be a Prospector, by Mr. Prospector), dam of the brilliant, but ill-fated **Eight Belles** (Unbridled's Song), was the focus of a spirited bidding duel that involved at least three parties late yesterday afternoon. With just over an hour left in the session, **Away**, a handsome chestnut carrying a full-brother to **Eight Belles**, stepped into the ring as hip 271. John Ferguson, in back, locked horns with Southern Equine's Mike Moreno and Eric Guillot, who were front and center in the pavilion, and a third bidder looked to be Lincoln Collins. In the end, Darley's bloodstock rep wouldn't be denied and landed **Away** for \$2.5 million. **Away** was covered this year by **Unbridled's Song** on May 6, three days after the tragic breakdown of **Eight Belles** in the GI Kentucky Derby. In addition to finishing second in the Run for the Roses, **Eight Belles** won the GII Fantasy S. and GIII Honeybee S. **Away** was produced by an unraced half-sister to successful sire **Belong to Me** and is a half to stakes winner **Rich Find** (Exploit). **Away** was consigned by Three Chimneys, who owned the mare in partnership with Omar Trevino and Richard Nip. An **Empire Maker** filly out of **Away** sold for \$320,000 at the Keeneland September Sale. Trevino, as agent, was listed as the buyer. *cont. p2*

TEEMING WITH POSSIBILITIES

John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency was front and center at Fasig-Tipton Sunday with the \$14-million sale of **Better Than Honour**. At Keeneland Monday, it was a weanling granddaughter of that celebrated mare that created a stir. The bay filly from the first crop of champion **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) out of **Teeming** (Storm Cat) sold for \$1.475 million to the bid of Chesapeake Partners. The weanling was co-bred by Sikura and his father-in-law Ed McGhee. "That was a spot-on offering," Sikura said after the seven-figure sale. "We thought she was fabulous. What with **Better Than Honour** and the notoriety of selling her yesterday, we were hoping she would be fairly well-received." *cont. p2*

For Three Chimneys' Case Clay, it was tough parting with a mare that carried such great sentimental value. He said that he was happy the mare wound up with Sheikh Mohammed. "It wasn't that easy [deciding to sell], but we're a commercial operation and she's probably at the high point of her value," he said. "Plus we've got the two-year-old filly by Smarty Jones [the unraced Anchors Away], and that takes a little of the sting out of it. At least we have some of the family." He added about Away, "She's just all class. We were going over thoughts of what she might bring, and she really doesn't have any holes. She a proven broodmare, she did it on the race track, and she's a beautiful mare." -LM

Bernardini Weanling Nets \$1.475 million...cont.

While Better Than Honour's headline-stealing act may have helped her granddaughter attract potential bidders, the weanling was a standout in her own right. "We thought she was a fantastic filly," Sikura admitted. "She has an incredible pedigree and is a great individual." Sikura bred and raced Teeming, herself a \$1.5 million KEENOV buy, and still co-owns the seven-year-old mare with McGhee. "[Teeming] is a big, beautiful classy mare with a world of racing ability. She won three of her four starts and in her first start [and only loss] she didn't break from the gate. She was bred to be a world-class filly, but unfortunately got injured." Out of Better Than Honour, Teeming is a half-sister to back-to-back GI Belmont S. winners in champion Rags to Riches and Jazil, as well as to GII Peter Pan S. winner Casino Drive. Yesterday's seven-figure weanling was Teeming's second foal. "She has an A.P. Indy filly named Cascading who was going to sell in September, but we decided to keep her to race," Sikura said. "She's in foal to Distorted Humor." Bidders looking to add a daughter from the family may have missed out on their chance. "I would strongly feel like from here forward you won't see any of her fillies at auction," Sikura said. "This was a unique circumstance. She's by a freshman sire. We hoped and felt that Better Than Honour would really set the table yesterday. That was the reason to be here today and it looked like it worked."-JM ..cont. p4

Hystericalady Tops Kee Day 1...cont.

Hystericalady's first trip to Keeneland came in 2003, when she sold as a November weanling to Wark Bloodstock for \$100,000. The daughter of Chilean champion and MG1SW Sacramentada (Ire) (Northair) returned a year later and did marginally better, eliciting a bid of \$125,000 from West Coast trainer Jerry Hollendorfer. Hollendorfer bought her for a partnership that included Rancho San Miguel's Tom and Nancy Clark, Dr. George Todaro and himself. Hystericalady developed into a star, first out west and then on the East Coast. Through four seasons on the track, she won eight stakes, including the GI Humana Distaff, back-to-back renewals of the GII Molly Pitcher BC H. and this year's GII Delaware H. She also was a game second in last term's GI BC Distaff at Monmouth. Thus far, she's won 11 of 23 starts for earnings of \$2,390,556. Hystericalady preceded her third trip to the Keeneland sales pavilion with a fifth in the Ladies' Classic at the most recent renewal of the Breeders' Cup. A few interested parties took a last look at the well-made mare as she nervously took laps around Keeneland's rear walking ring yesterday and Tom Clark, Todaro and Hollendorfer kept close tabs from the back as she entered the ring. Bidding was focused in front through much of the bidding, but John Ferguson, chewing on his reading glasses under the rear bid spotter, finally jumped in at \$2.6 million. He bid twice more, landing the mare at \$3 million. Hollendorfer was the first to congratulate him. "He just wanted me to know that she was 100-percent sound," said Ferguson. "We're very happy, but we're also very sad to lose her," Clark said. "It's been an incredible experience for all of us, buying her as a yearling and now, four years later, selling her here. It's been my dream to have a horse like this, and it finally happened. That's why we're all in racing. We got a chance to live our dream; not many people do, so I feel fortunate. I think it was a fair price for everybody." Clark said what separated Hystericalady from other horses was her heart and attitude. "Nothing ever bothered this mare, from day 1," he said. "There was a never wasted piece of energy. She'd come back from racing and just eat her carrots. And she has a huge heart. She gave 100 percent all the time. She was an amazing horse." Clark said he, Todaro and Hollendorfer are currently partners on "five or six" race horses, and while Clark and Todaro are involved in some breeding partnerships, he said they never really considered adding Hystericalady to the fold. "I think she was just a little too expensive for all of us," he laughed. "At some point, I think we thought it would be better for us to move on. I think we're generally more interested in racing than the broodmare business, so it was natural for us to move on after her racing career. But she really is sound. I think a number of the people who vetted her were amazed at how clean she is. She has absolutely nothing wrong with her. She's the type of individual that the breed needs--she's incredibly sound. I hope she passes that on to her babies." -LM

Chesapeake Partners Get Their Weanling...

Chesapeake Partners recognized a unique opportunity and didn't let the moment pass them by, bringing home yesterday's top-priced weanling. "We bought her for some people who want to buy the best foals and yearlings we can find," said Reiley McDonald, who signed the ticket for a group he labeled, "A few new players and some old ones you'd all know." McDonald added, "We thought she was the best weanling at the sale. And of course, we know what the pedigree is. We've been watching it all week. You don't get a chance to buy into that family that often. She's bred like some good horses." McDonald left open the possibility of a return trip through the sales ring for the bay filly. "We may see her again at an auction, or we may race her," he said. "We're wide open." Of the seven-figure price tag, McDonald said, "Is the price ever OK when it's above a million dollars? You reach a level where you have to stop, but there's also the point of how bad do you want her and how bad do your partners want her. We decided that, if we bought one here, it would be her. It's a start; it's a big start. We might buy some more."-JM

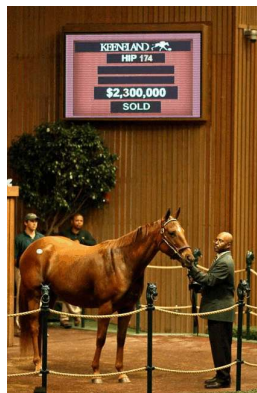

"She's a beautiful mare," said Ferguson. "We bought the A.P. Indy filly out of the mare in September. We bought the filly for the same reason we bought the mare. She's a very athletic filly and the mare has got a great record. She's a Grade I winner from a great family. And that was about the price we expected to pay. She will remain in America. And we haven't decided who will breed her to next." Farish watched the action alongside his father, Will Farish, while sitting inside the pavilion. Shadow Cast was consigned by the Farish family's Lane's End Farm as hip 174. Shadow Cast has a special place in Bill Farish's heart, as she

was only the second Grade I winner he bred and the first he raced himself. The A.P. Indy filly that sold in September was his first seven-figure yearling as breeder. "Yeah, she was definitely pretty special," Farish said when asked about Shadow Cast. "It's always bittersweet to sell one like that. I'm assuming John Ferguson bought her, so she's going to the same place her yearling went." Farish said economics was the driving factor to offer the mare, winner of the 2005 GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga, at auction. "With a mare like her, you'd like to sell them in the first three years of production, or wait until they've proven themselves as broodmares," he explained. "I would have loved to have kept her, but sometimes you have to sell." Shadow Cast foaled a Storm Cat colt this spring that was not offered yesterday. Farish still owns Shadow Cast's dam, the Dayjur mare Daily Special, whom he bought for just \$60,000 at this sale in 1998. -LM

Romance is \$1.35 Million

Who says you can't put a price on love? Japanese businessman Nishimura Senji put his Grade I stakes winner **Romance is Diane** (In Excess {Ire}--Romantic Fibs, by Prized) through the sales ring yesterday and enjoyed a handsome payday when the four-year-old racing or broodmare prospect sold for \$1.35 million to the bid of Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm. Senji and Shigehiro Hatake's involvement with racing began when Hatake purchased Romance is Diane's dam Romantic Fibs (Prized) for \$77,000 out of

the 1995 Barretts March sale. She won only once in five starts, but has had more success as a broodmare. The mare's first foal, Romanceishope (In Excess {Ire}), won the 2001 GII Del Mar Derby racing in Hatake's name. His younger full sister, who failed to sell at \$37,000 as a FTKJUL yearling, went one better than that. The filly won the 2006 GI Hollywood Starlet and earned \$662,718 while racing in Senji's name.

"It's a very good time," Hatake admitted after yesterday's seven-figure success. "I'm very excited--I don't believe it. We thought maybe \$1 million--this is too much." Hatake did admit he had a sense that Stronach might be interested in his Grade I-winning mare. "I met Mr. Stronach in the elevator of the hotel this morning and he said 'Good morning,' to me, and I don't even know him." Based in California, Senji owns a metal fencing company. Hatake is a vice president in the company. With a band of eight horses, Hatake is already looking forward to upcoming racing seasons when he expects an additional two foals from Romantic Fibs to hit the track. The 15-year-old mare produced a full brother to Romance is Diane and Romanceishope, named Romance is Sosa, this year, and she has a yearling colt by Bertrando named Romance is Family.

Carrying on the Family Tradition...

In 1986, Jim Fleming purchased the 100-acre Tyreel Stud on Australia's Nepean River in New South Wales, and he quickly turned it into one of the premier commercial Thoroughbred breeding operations in the Southern Hemisphere. Fleming passed away last December, but his son Dean has taken over the Tyreel operation, and both he and his brother have brought their wallets to Lexington. Paul got the party started at Fasig-Tipton Sunday, going to \$2 million to purchase the broodmare prospect Sharp Susan (Touch Gold). Freyer Blood-

stock signed the ticket. It didn't take long for Dean to jump into the game. Sitting with BBA Ireland rep Adrian Nicoll on the auctioneer's left, he went to \$1.3 million to get the second lot through the ring at Keeneland, the four-year-old broodmare **Diamond Necklace** (Unbridled's Song--Helsinki {GB}, by Machiavellian). A stakes-placed half-sister to champion Shamardal (Giant's Causeway), the grey is from the family of top-class racehorse and sire Street Cry (Ire). She is in foal to Giant's Causeway. "You can't get much better than that family," Dean Fleming said. "She is a magnificent-looking mare, and we're very happy to have her." Bred by Brilliant Stable, Diamond Necklace was a \$1.15-million KEENOV weanling purchase by John Sikura. She raced for Mrs. John Magnier and was stakes-placed in 10 starts. The mare is not the most expensive KEENOV purchase ever for the Flemington family. Nicoll signed the ticket on the broodmare Warrior Queen (Quiet American) at \$2 million for Tyreel in 2002. The price turned out to be a bargain. The first Tyreel foal out of the mare was MGSW A.P. Warrior (A.P. Indy), who brought \$1.3 million as a KEESEP yearling. The second was \$3.8-million KEESEP yearling Egyptian Queen (Storm Cat), and the third was \$2.2-million KEESEP sale Desired (Storm Cat). Diamond Necklace will also be visiting U.S. sires, at least for a couple of years, and will be residing at Ashford Stud. "We're actually here to try to buy mares to bring back to Australia, but this mare would suit anywhere in the world," Deam said. "But we'll leave her here for now--she'll stay here for a couple of years." Sharp Susan will also be remaining stateside for a couple of seasons before heading Down Under. "I own the farm outright, but my brother Paul has five or six beautiful mares and, fortunately for me, he has his mares at Tyreel," Dean remarked. The Fleming brothers were admittedly hoping that the current state of the economy in the U.S. might depress prices a bit. "We came here hoping a few might fall through the cracks, but that doesn't really happen at this level," Dean said. "But I still thought [the price for Diamond Necklace] was a good value." Australian sales have bucked the trend and held up well this year, but Fleming believes the global financial unease will catch up to the Southern Hemisphere market. "We'll be down next year, when the April sales start," he predicted.-AB

The Oxbow Incident...

Art and Stephanie Preston's Oxbow Racing purchased **Ermine** (Exchange Rate--Red Mischief, by Thirty Six Red) for just \$45,000 as an OBSAUG yearling, with the intention of pinhooking her the following season. But bidding hit the brakes at \$37,000 when they sent her to the OBSMAR sale, and they brought her home and sent her to the track. It proved a most wise decision. Conditioned by Ronny Werner, Ermine got warmed up with a couple of second-place finishes in two starts at two. She blossomed in subsequent seasons, winning the GII Falls City H. at three and the GI Apple Blossom S. at four, and retiring with a record of 16-5-5-0 and earnings of \$880,134. The five-year-old mare, in foal to A.P. Indy, was back in the ring as part of the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment at Keeneland November yesterday, and this time the competition was much more spirited. When the hammer finally fell, it was Katsumi Yoshida who had made the winning bid at \$1.3 million. "I thought it was a fair price; I thought the buyer got good value," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "She was such a good racemare--really, really brilliant. And I think Exchange Rate is a surging young stallion. She's in foal to A.P. Indy, and there won't be too many more of those opportunities coming down the line. I valued her between \$1.2-1.6 million, so she was right in the middle." *cont. p8*

The Prestons originally intended to sell Ermine as a broodmare prospect at the Fasig-Tipton November sale last fall, but she RNA'd at \$1.45 million. "When she came off the track last year, like a lot of mares, she didn't look quite as good as she does now," Taylor explained. "She also went through the ring pretty early last year, and maybe we overestimated where the reserve should be. But she had a year to acclimate and get in foal. [The Prestons] regrouped, and they got a fair price." Oxbow Racing is not Art Preston's first Thoroughbred venture. Preston, who is involved in oil exploration in Texas, operated Prestonwood Farm with brothers Jack and J.R. in the 1980s and '90s. Prestonwood raced champion Groovy and GI Belmont S. hero Victory Gallop, and owned two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile champ Da Hoss in partnership. The 400-acre Prestonwood property was sold to Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt in January of 2000 and renamed WinStar Farm. Ermine was the most expensive of three broodmares purchased by Yoshida at the KEENOV opener. He also picked up nine-year-old **Lead Story** (Editor's Note--Gwenjinsky, by Seattle Dancer), in foal to A.P. Indy, from Lane's End for \$700,000; and four-year-old **Quick Little Miss** (Freud--Swift Girl, by Unbridled), in foal to GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), for \$1.2 million. Quick Little Miss was also consigned by Taylor Made.-AB

My Favorite Mistake...

On paper, White Fox Farm appeared to make a shrewd acquisition when they picked up **Quick Little Miss** (Freud--Swift Girl, by Unbridled) for \$425,000 at KEENOV last year. White Fox Farm is the operation of Karen and Dewey White, who have a 1,000-acre farm in Winder, Georgia. The Whites bred Quick Little Miss to Street Sense, sent her back to the sale under the Taylor Made Sales Agency banner, and celebrated when she brought \$1.2 million from Katsumi Yoshida. But, as Taylor Made's Mark Taylor explained, there's more to the story than meets the eye. "It's a great story," Taylor said. "They bought her last year, and when they got her home, they liked her, but Dewey really wasn't supposed to be bidding on her. She wasn't on their original list. Karen gets to pick the bloodlines, then she gives her list to Dewey and he picks out the physicals and does the bidding. That's how their program works, but Quick Little Miss wasn't on Karen's list. So they decided to breed her and send her back to the sale this year. "Then Sky Diva jumps up under the first dam, and all of a sudden the pedigree got a whole lot fancier. It was a great opportunity for them." Quick Little Miss was a solid runner herself, winning the Mocassin S. and hitting the board in the GI Hollywood Starlet S., GI Oak Leaf S. and GII Santa Ynez S. She bankrolled \$287,080.

Unraced when the catalogue was printed, Quick Little Miss's half-sister Sky Diva (Sky Mesa) broke her maiden by 10 at Delaware in September, captured the Oct. 4 GI Frizette S. and was most recently third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 24. And the dam is a half to Pure Clan (Pure Prize), who added to the family value when taking the GII Golden Rod S. at two, then was third in the GI Kentucky Oaks and, after switching to the turf, captured the GI American Oaks.

But Quick Little Miss really takes after her sire's side of the family tree. "We sold Mariah's Storm [to Coolmore] when she was carrying Giant's Causeway, and, of course, Freud is a full to Giant's Causeway," Taylor said. "If you look at Quick Little Miss and at Mariah's Storm, they are clones. We have a picture of Mariah's Storm, and we've been showing everybody the picture...they say, 'why are you showing me the picture when I can just look at the mare?' But it's not Quick Little Miss, it's Mariah's Storm. Now we hope she can replicate the exploits of her paternal granddam." Dewey White is a real estate developer, and the Whites also raise Black Angus cattle on their Georgia farm. Their two sons run the contracting business started by their father. The Whites got involved in the horse business in 1978 when a client didn't have the cash to make a payment, and offered three Thoroughbreds instead. They now keep a small broodmare band numbering about 15, and breed to sell.-AB



A New Beginning for Wild Gams...

It's been an up-and-down few months for New Farm owner Everett "Eb" Novak, at least when it comes to his Thoroughbred holdings. In August, Forest Wildcat, the stallion who he had raced and later stood in partnership with Brookdale Farm, died unexpectedly at the age of 17. "That was really horrible," Novak said yesterday. "He was a very, very good sire, and he was in the middle of his best year." But yesterday, Novak got a measure of consolation

when his five-year-old homebred filly Wild Gams made \$1 million to the bid of Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings representative John Moynihan. Fittingly, Wild Gams was one of Forest Wildcat's best runners and was his richest money earner, having banked nearly \$1.2 million. She sold as a racing and/or broodmare prospect. Novak purchased Wild Gams's dam, the stakes-winning Quiet American mare Diamonds and Legs, privately after she was retired from racing in 1999 and sent her to Forest Wildcat the following spring. The resulting offspring was the colt Wild Legs, who failed to make the races, but Diamond and Legs's next two trips to Forest Wildcat produced a pair of stakes winners. That including her '02 foal, the male Diamond Wildcat, and Wild Gams in '03. Sadly, Diamonds and Legs died while foaling the next spring. As a racehorse, Wild Gams was a late-running sprinter who annexed seven black-type events and was first or second in 15 of 23 starts. In her most recent, she ran the highly regarded Indyanne to a head in the Oct. 4 GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. just a few hundred yards away over the Polytrack at Keeneland. "She's a really nice mare, and if I was at a different stage of things, I'd keep her," said Novak. "But my operation is based in New Jersey, so I'd have to ship her to Kentucky to be bred, and I thought it was best to sell and let others breed her to the \$200,000, \$300,000 stallions." Novak, who has been in the Thoroughbred business "only since 1970," currently has about 70 horses, including 18 broodmares, 18 or 20 yearlings and 10 or 12 weanlings. He lives with his wife Nancy at New Farm, which is based in Marlton, New Jersey. When told that Moynihan purchased Wild Gams on behalf of Jess Jackson's Stonestreet, Novak exclaimed, "Oh, if he sends her to Curlin, he's going to have one nice horse on his hands! She's great--she's all heart--and I really think Curlin is one of the best horses we've seen in a long time." -LM

The First Kiss is the Sweetest...

About four years ago, Drs. Timothy and Vesna Kriss decided to dip their toes in the Thoroughbred breeding industry and privately purchased their first horse, a young broodmare prospect named Kiss a Miss (Kissin Kris), in partnership with Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. The mare was sent to Hill 'n' Dale's El Corredor, and in 2005 produced her first foal, a filly later named Backseat Rhythm. The Krisses, doing business as Spast Farm, and Hill 'n' Dale sold Backseat Rhythm to Paul Pompa, Jr. as a yearling for \$75,000. The filly was offered as a juvenile but was bought back for \$240,000. That proved the right move for her new connections when the three-year-old Backseat Rhythm became a bonafide turf star this season with victories in the GII Lake Placid S. and GI Garden City BC S. and a closing second in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. On Sunday, Backseat Rhythm was offered by Pompa at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, but was led out of the ring unsold at \$2.5 million. Yesterday, it was Kiss a Miss's turn to go under the hammer. Offered as hip 71 by the Krisses and Sikura through the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale, Kiss a Miss attracted plenty of interest and was ultimately knocked down to the Saudi-based S.K.A.S. for \$1.4 million. Foaled in 1998, Kiss a Miss hails from a family cultivated by John Franks. She was sold as a juvenile in training for \$60,000. Put through the 2003 Fasig-Tipton November Sale after assembling a solid race record that included a graded stakes placing and earnings of over \$265,000, Kiss a Miss RNA'd for \$75,000. She was later purchased privately by Sikura. "I thought it was a good, solid, tough family," Sikura explained. "I did a lot of work for John Franks, and she comes from one of his best families. Plus, she had some ability on the track. We were lucky that her first foal turned out the way she did; it really elevated the value of the mare." Sikura added that he was satisfied with the price. "She met our expectations, and maybe exceeded them a little bit, but when you have a young mare whose first foal is a Grade I winner, you expect them to sell well," he said. After parting with Backseat Rhythm was a yearling for \$75,000, Sikura and the Krisses sold a Vindication--Kiss a Miss colt, the current unraced two-year-old Barney Bass, for \$32,000 at the '07 September Sale, and two months ago sold a yearling filly by Vindication to Legends Racing for \$240,000. Kiss a Miss sold yesterday in foal on a Feb. 29 cover to El Corredor. Timothy Kriss practices neurosurgery in Versailles; Vesna Kriss is a tenured professor at the University of Kentucky and specializes in pediatric radiology. -LM

Tom Ryan is methodically building a quality broodmare band. The Bostonian was shut out during bidding Sunday at Fasig-Tipton, but struck early during Monday's opening session of the Keeneland November sale. Ryan, acting with the help of Denali Stud's Craig Bandoroff and signing the ticket as Dattt Stable, purchased **Danzig's Humor** (Lemon Drop Kid), for \$650,000. "I met Tom Ryan a few years ago at Saratoga," Bandoroff explained. "He's always liked the horses and has always raced a few. He has some in training with Mark Hennig." Ryan decided a couple of years ago to increase his involvement in racing to include breeding. "He said he wanted to try to put a breeding program together over several years," Bandoroff said. "We bought a few mares last year. So this is year two of a multi-year program." Danzig's Humor, an unraced three-year-old, is a half sister to Distorted Humor and is in foal to Awesome Again. During last year's Keeneland November sale, Ryan purchased the mare **Royal Cheer** (Royal Anthem), in foal to Mr. Greeley, for \$200,000. Bandoroff added that quality was being stressed over quantity. "We're selective," he confirmed. "We just bid \$1.3 million last night [at Fasig-Tipton] and just got outbid on that one. We bought one this morning. We're not buying a lot. We're just trying to pick and choose." Bandoroff said Ryan is aiming for a broodmare band of approximately 12 to 15 mares. Ryan was also an underbidder yesterday on the \$1.2-million **Quick Little Miss** (Freud).-JM

Numbers Way Down On Day 1...

Numbers during yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland November Sale were off significantly from 2007 figures. But sale officials were quick to point out that last year's Day 1 was a record-breaking session that included a then-world record broodmare, the \$10.5-million Playful Act (Ire) from the Swettenham Dispersal, and also included such mares as Spun Sugar (\$4.5 million) and Kamarinskaya (\$3.2 million), as well as Melhor Ainda, Rosa Parks (GB) and Sand Springs, each of whom made \$2.3 million. cont.

Still, yesterday's average of \$322,289 was off 42.7 percent from last year's corresponding figure of \$562,186. Perhaps more tellingly, the median of \$185,000 was off 32 percent from last year's \$272,500. Of concern, too, was the steep rise in RNAs. Yesterday, a total of 92 horses failed to meet their reserves, compared with the 2007 figure of 19.2 percent. That represents a 99-percent increase in RNAs. In all, 28 horses made \$1 million or more in 2007, compared with 11 yesterday. Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales, commented on the numbers, and how much the declines were attributable to a weaker catalogue and how much to a struggling economy. "Last year we had 28 million-dollar horses, and this year we had 11. Is that the economy or the catalogue? I think both," Russell offered. "There were certain horses today that I thought could have gone further and didn't. I think both factors come in. But this is a marketplace. People come to trade horses. Every so often, it's a boom market, and every so often it's not. Life will continue on." Russell said he did expect the RNA rate to drop in the coming days. "I think the higher-end market tends to have a higher not-sold rate," he said. "And last year was unreal--a 19-percent not-sold rate is unreal. There were a couple of horses today that I thought should have sold, but that's just my opinion." -LM

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

CLASSIC ASPIRATIONS

When I was first lucky enough to visit Gainesway Farm in the late 1980s, it was rather like worshipping at the heart of the thoroughbred world. In 1986 there were more than 40 stallions in residence and it was a magnificent opportunity for me, as a European, to re-new acquaintance with such stars as Lyphard, Riverman, Vaguely Noble, Blushing Groom, Sharpen Up, Irish River, Lear Fan and Green Dancer. And for the American aficionados there were such as Broad Brush, Cozzene, Mt. Livermore, Afleet, Icecapade and In Reality, plus winners of the Kentucky Derby, Preakness S. and Belmont S.

Of course, the thoroughbred industry has undergone enormous change since then, but Gainesway remains one of the must-see farms for any visitor to Kentucky. The stallion team is down to 10 these days, following the death of the veteran Cozzene in October, but the last few months have been exciting times for Gainesway, thanks to the two stallions which joined the team at the end of 2004. One of them, the Wood Memorial winner Tapit (Pulpit), has done so well with his first runners that his fee has been raised from \$12,500 to \$35,000, at a time when many fees are heading in the opposite direction. His aptly-named daughter Stardom Bound was in the headlines again at the weekend when she changed hands for \$5.7-million at Fasig-Tipton.

The other Gainesway first-crop sire in the news is Birdstone (Grindstone), who is up to seventh on the freshman sires' table. This Marylou Whitney color-bearer has three stakes winners among his first 22 runners and he became only the third, following Lion Heart and Candy Ride, to be represented by two graded winners when Livin Lovin took the Gill Tempted S. two days ago. Birdstone had earlier been represented by Mine That Bird, whose collection of prestigious Canadian stakes races includes the Gill Grey S.

When Birdstone retired to Gainesway, his advertisements claimed that "no colt of his generation can match his record." He had become only the second horse ever to take the Champagne S. at two and both the Belmont S. and Travers S. at three, and he had ended Smarty Jones's gallant bid for Triple Crown honors in the Belmont. In the process, Birdstone pushed his earnings past the \$1.5-million mark, yet his fee was set no higher than \$10,000--just 1/10th of the price charged for Smarty Jones. At two, Birdstone ranked fourth among the colts on the Experimental Free Handicap, on 124, and only two American colts--Smarty Jones and Kitten's Joy--were weighted above him on the World Rankings for three-year-old.

So why was Birdstone so cheap? My guess is that his connections were keen to compensate for the fact that he is a son of Grindstone. The fee for this winner of the 1996 Kentucky Derby has been as low as \$3,500 for the last two years, with Birdstone having the unwanted distinction of being the only offspring of Grindstone to have won a race above Grade III level.

Grindstone may have failed to live up to expectations but there can be few complaints about his branch of the Mr. Prospector male line. Birdstone is the most recent of seven individual Triple Crown event winners from the Fappiano line. Indeed, he was the third generation from this line to win either the Kentucky Derby, Preakness or Belmont, following Unbridled and Grindstone. It's interesting that both of Gainesway's successful new sires have Unbridled in their pedigree, Tapit being out of an Unbridled mare.

Birdstone certainly merits the description classically bred. His dam, the Storm Bird mare Dear Birdie, made a slow start to her broodmare career, but then produced the champion filly Bird Town and Birdstone in consecutive years, to take the title of Broodmare of the Year. Bird Town owed her championship to victories in the Kentucky Oaks and Acorn S.

Birdstone's second dam, Hush Dear, notched no fewer than five Grade II victories at up to a mile and a half during three years on the track, so Birdstone had every right to flourish over 10 and 12 furlongs at three. Indeed it was his stamina which helped him end Smarty Jones's Triple Crown aspirations.

He also possessed a measure of speed though, as he showed when he demolished the opposition in a six-furlong maiden at Saratoga. And--as its roll of honor shows--you need a pretty fast horse to win the Champagne S.

All this is good news for the connections of Birdstone's juvenile stakes winners, as they can be expected to continue improving. Livin Lovin's first three dams were sired by Captain Bodgit (Florida Derby and second in the Kentucky Derby), Hostage (Arkansas Derby) and Secretariat (Triple Crown), so she should have the necessary stamina for such races as the CCA Oaks and Alabama S., should she prove good enough.

The Results Are In

A little over four years ago, the TDN began recognizing what we called TDN Rising Stars. The purpose was simple. We wanted to help our readers identify those horses which, based on a particularly impressive victory, we felt showed great promise. Horses that are recognized as Rising Stars most often are graduating from maiden special weight company, but occasionally an eye-catching allowance victory will merit a Rising Star designation. Horses in stakes races are not considered, as those horses are, in general, on your radar already. By contrast, we know you often don't have the time to watch every important maiden or first-level allowance race across the country each day, and we have aimed to be your eyes and ears at from Gulfstream to Churchill, from Saratoga to Santa Anita and beyond.

The response from our readers has been overwhelming. From gauging promising young sires' progeny, to getting a hint as to what families are heating up, to identify prospects for private purchase, they have found myriad ways to employ Rising Stars in their daily business.

We are often asked what the criteria to be tabbed a Rising Star. Frankly, there is no set formula. It is typically a combination of a number of factors. The quality of the race certainly comes into play, as does the winning time and margin of victory. Perhaps most important is the manner in which the race is won--is the horse striding out at the wire, is he in hand or under an all-out drive, etc. We don't get it right every time. We've missed some that deserved to be Rising Stars, while others were named Rising Stars who, when all was said and done, probably didn't deserve to be. But in all, we're proud of the record we've put together selecting Rising Stars.

Let's face it, tooting your own horn is uncouth. Yet, it's looking increasingly unlikely our competitors will do it for us. So here's a look at some important stats regarding horses named Rising Stars--a total of 286--from Oct. 1, 2004 through the present. It is important to note that two-year-olds of 2008 who were named Rising Stars are not included in the numbers. Even though these horses include runners like Grade I winner Mani Bhavan (Storm Boot) and Group 2 heroine Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), many are too lightly raced to accurately evaluate their talent.

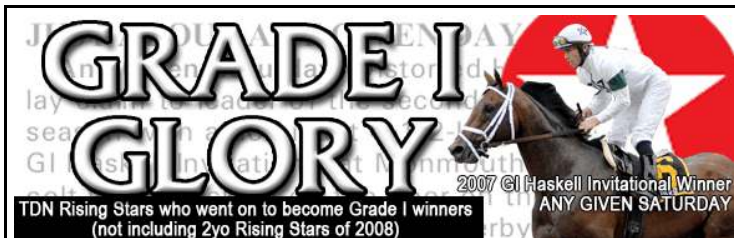


