Barry Weisbord, publisher of the TDN, expected to be a passive observer when he meandered out back to watch the dam of pro-tem champion juvenile filly Stardom Bound (Tapit) sell during yesterday's third session

of the Keeneland November Sale. But when bidding on the 10-year-old My White Corvette (Tarr Road--Wind Chime, by Marfa) got off to a sluggish start, he made a quick phone call to partner and friend Bobby Flay. He told the celebrity chef that the mare wasn't bringing her true value, and jumped into the scrum at around the \$600,000 mark. Weisbord soon locked horns with Becky Thomas, standing just a few yards away, and slugged through

\$10,000 increments until the \$800,000 mark, when he jumped to \$825,000 and saw the salvo unanswered. He signed the ticket as agent for Flay. My White Corvette was sold by Hunter Valley Farm for Carolyn and Fletcher Gray and partner John Youngblood. She is not currently in foal.

"We had no plans on buying her," Weisbord admitted afterwards. "We thought she'd cost too much money. Actually, I'm a bit surprised. I didn't call him until we were up to about \$500,000. And I just said, 'I don't

think she's going to bring what we talked about this morning. I don't think it's going to bring the kind of money we thought.' We saw the filly on the racetrack and we were following the filly. I actually bought some shares in Tapit, they all got picked up a few weeks ago. We've been watching pretty much how the whole

thing developed, but so has everyone else. There's not really much to think about. She's the dam of a champion and she's 10 years old."

Regarding the price, he said, "I'm a little bit surprised. By definition, there is nothing that's a bargain. It's only a bargain when everyone doesn't know about it. Everyone in the world knew who she was the dam of. I didn't think we could afford her, but we could. She'll go back to Denali."

Weisbord said that the official ownership of My White Corvette was unsettled and that the mare could be sent to Tapit once again next spring. "Certainly that would be the very logical thing to do," he said, "but that will be decided in the next little bit."

Flay, who had attended the sales earlier in the week, had returned home to New York. At Sunday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, Flay purchased the five-year-old broodmare Jewel For a King (Storm Cat--Jewel Princess), in foal to Ghostzapper, for \$500,000.

My White Corvette was preceded into the ring by her Tale of the Cat weanling filly, who also was consigned by Hunter Valley. The gray or roan filly was knocked down to Gus Bell, agent, for \$350,000, but it was later revealed that the filly had been bought back. Cont. p3

Blue Skies for the Grays...

As he signed the ticket for the My White Corvette, Barry Weisbord received a hug from the co-owner of the mare, Carolyn Gray, who also shoved a bag of peppermints into his hand. "She just loves these!" Gray said. It was a feel-good finale to Gray's involvement with My White Corvette. Along with her husband Fletcher and partner John Youngblood, Carolyn had purchased My White Corvette for \$90,000 at this sale in 2002 for \$90,000. At the time, the stakes-winning My White Corvette was carrying her first foal, the Monarchos filly Moneypenny.

"We loved her physical appearance," Youngblood explained yesterday when asked what first attracted them to the mare.

"Her temperament, too," added Carolyn Gray. "She was wonderful to be around."

The Grays brought the mare back to their Grayson Farm in Pleasant Hope, Missouri, which is located just outside of Springfield.

"Our program is that we breed everything in Kentucky, then we bring them back home with us," she explained. "They come back to Kentucky to foal. But 'Corvette' has been here all year, since she foaled."

The Grays make their living through the 110-acre Grayson Farm, though they maintain a modest-sized broodmare band of five or six mares. They were previously involved in racing Quarter Horses before buying their first mare at Keeneland in 1991. Youngblood owns automobile dealerships.

With My White Corvette in their band, the trio bred and sold the now five-year-old Moneypenny (\$77,000 KEESEP yearling), the four-year-old filly Delta Breeze (Gulch) (\$45,000 KEESEP yearling) and the three-year-old colt Just a Warning (Silver Deputy) (\$80,000 KEESEP yearling). In the spring of 2005, they decided to send the gray My White Corvette to another gray, first-year stallion and Grade I winner Tapit, by Pulpit.

"We go and look at all the sires and try to match physicals with our mares," Gray explained. "We try to increase the strengths of our mares with the strengths of the sire, and we thought Tapit was a very good fit for her. He was a really good racehorse himself."

They sold the resulting foal, a filly later named Stardom Bound, for \$50,000 at the 2007 September Sale. Six months later, Stardom Bound was hammered down to trainer Christopher Paasch and owner Charles Cono for \$375,000, and the rest is history. Stardom Bound won three Grade Is this term, including the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and on Sunday sold to IEAH Stables for \$5.7 million. The Grays were on hand at Fasig-Tipton Sunday to watch her sell.

"She was always a nice filly with a nice temperament, just like the mare," Gray said of Stardom Bound. "We have a very small farm, and we just ran her in the pasture with one other filly growing up. That's what we usually do, run three or four foals together and come back and sell them as yearlings. We just put the weanling in this year because she was such a nice individual and to showcase the mare."

Gray admitted that parting with My White Corvette was tough, but said, "I know she's going to Craig [Bandoroff] at Denali, which I'm very pleased with because I can go visit her. If she'd gone to Japan, it would have been a lot harder. [Still], it was very hard to give her up."

As for the hammer price, Gray said, "I think for this market, it's probably okay. Anytime you can make a profit, you have to be pleased. In a different market in a different year, she could have brought three times that. But we weren't in that position. We're always very reasonable [with our reserves]. I wish them all the luck, because she's a lovely mare. I think they should do very well with her at that price. She doesn't have any problems and you can't erase what's on the page." -LM

Explosive Start to KEENOV Day 3...

Just six hips into the third session of the Keeneland November sale, Robert B. Berger went to \$330,000 to get the the five-year-old broodmare **Delicate Dynamite** (Old Trieste--Majestic Dy, by Dynaformer). The chestnut, in foal to now-sire Tiznow, was consigned by John J. Greely Ill's Wintergreen Farm as agent for Combustion Racing.

Combustion is the nom du course of a nine-member group headed by Greely's University of Kentucky buddy Todd Creek.

"They are energy traders--hence the name Delicate Dynamite and Combustion Racing," Greely explained. "This was the first horse they ever bought."

Three years ago, Creek put together the group and got in touch with his college friend.

"Todd gave me a call; he wanted to buy a two-yearold in training," Greely recalled. "He came out when this

filly was a yearling, but he didn't buy anything that year. I introduced him to Mike McMahon, and he bought her privately from Mike."

McMahon Bloodstock had purchased Delicate Dynamite, who was bred by Dr. and Mrs. R. Smiser West and Mr. and

Mrs. MacKenzie Miller, for just \$25,000 as a KEESEP yearling. After changing hands, she made her debut under the Combustion colors at Ellis Park in August of 2005 and made the game look easy for the newcomers, breaking her maiden in special weight company by 3 3/4 lengths as a 9-1 chance.

The filly was runner-up in the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies in her second appearance. By the time she was retired this past spring, she had won seven of 27 starts, including the Truly Bound BC H. and Chou Croute BC H. at Fair Grounds and the Goddess S. at Delta Downs, and bankrolled \$368,404.

The Combustion partnership put her in foal to Tiznow, then reaped the rewards at Keeneland November.


"We were happy with the price," Greely said. "I think last year or two years ago, she would have been worth probably 25 percent more than in this market. It was basically live money in there the whole time--we set a reasonable reserve, and I don't think Keeneland even bid on our behalf."

He added, "They are having a lot of fun. Besides actually seeing a mare having a foal, they've been through the whole thing--from the sales to the races back to the sales--so they've run the gamut with her."

Some of the members of the group have now branched out on their own.

"They haven't bought any more horses as Combustion Racing, but a couple of the people in the group have bought horses individually," Greely offered.--AB

King for a Day...

Roderick Wachman's Kingswood Farm doesn't boast great numbers, but has been quietly racking up solid scores thus far at November. Kingswood's lone entry in Book 1 was hip 167, a dark bay weanling colt by Street Cry (Ire) who was knocked down to T. Hyde for \$200,000. Bred by Kingswood and David Egan, the colt was produced by the Dahar mare Saintly Speaking, whom Wachman had acquired for \$45,000 in 2004. It was Saintly Speaking's second weanling by Street Cry to sell at Keeneland November. In 2005, Kingswood sold Streets Apart, from Street Cry's second crop, for \$100,000.

Kingswood had four more horses go through the ring yesterday, and again weanlings from the consignment sold well. A colt by first-crop sire Silver Train (Old Trieste), bred by Kingswood Farm, et al., made \$100,000 as hip-619, while another weanling colt, by Langfuhr, realized top dollar for a Kingswood client when Southern Equine representative Eric Guillot purchased the bay for \$300,000. It was the second-highest price for a weanling on the day.

Hip 828 is by Lane's End's Langfuhr from a family that helped make the farm what it is today. The colt is out of the now 18-year-old mare Run For Lassie (Fappiano), who shares a second dam with A.P. Indy, Summer Squall, etc. Run for Lassie is a half to four stakes horses, including the dam of 2008 all-star Duke of Marmalade (Ire). As a broodmare, Run for Lassie had produced three stakes horses, including GSW Madison's Charm (Capote), by the time that she sold last November to agent Hugo Merry Bloodstock for \$75,000. She was carrying hip 828 at the time. The resulting colt, who was foaled a raised at Kingswood, was bred under the name Oscar Stud.

"He's a Middle Eastern businessman based in Kuwait," Wachman explained of Oscar Stud's chief. "He breeds and keeps them to race if he wants, or he'll sell if they're nice. He keeps a few mares here and a couple in Ireland."

Though he was confident the Langfuhr colt was a very nice animal, Wachman admits that he was pleasantly surprised by the final price.

"We knew he'd bring six figures, but we didn't expect that," he said. "Half of that would have been plenty. It was a nice surprise, and those surprises are rare in this market. It's tricky. But it's been good--we've brought in three colts who have made a total of \$600,000, off stud fees that totaled \$80,000, so I'd say it's been a good week for our weanlings."

From Kildare, Ireland, Wachman is the brother of trainer David Wachman ("We all have our crosses to bear," Roderick quips).

"We've all been involved for a while--not through direct family, but indirectly," Wachman explained." I've got an uncle who's a bloodstock agent, my grandpar-

ents were big into racing, my cousin--Andrew McKeever--trains here at Keeneland."

Wachman first came to the States 14 years ago. "I started working for Fred Seitz and then for John Stuart, and then I set off on my own seven years ago," Wachman said. Kingswood will offer a total of eight horses at November, and sold slightly less than that

number at September, according to Wachman. Kingswood, based in Kentucky, is home to between 50 and 100 mares, depending on the time of year, 10 of which are owned by Wachman personally.

"But I'd like to make that six," he said. "I tried to sell one this morning [hip 634, the stakes-placed More Than Ready mare Double Faced, RNA'd for \$50,000 while selling in foal to Lion Heart]. I've got one more to come [he later sold hip 965, the 14-year-old stakes-producing El Gran Senor mare Cacinella for \$65,000]. These aren't bad mares, but it's tough, and I think it's going to get very, very tough over the next couple of days. I think getting stud fees back is going to be a dream."

Wachman said he'd like to see farms be proactive in reducing service fees.

"It's very hard to breed a nice horse," he said. "You can get a lot of foals, and not very many of them tick all the boxes. The reality is now, with all the vetting and the inspections, they know everything about a horse before they start. You need a lot of luck. We had Eric Guillot and another big operation on the horse, and without the other, the horse may have made \$150,000. If you get two big players, two end users, it can change the equation. But if you don't..." -LM

Andrews Active at Keeneland...

The sale of the 11-year-old Heavenly Cat (Tabasco Cat--In Excelcis Deo, by Forty Niner) during Tuesday's session of the November sale capped a string of success for Helen Andrews's Twin Hopes Farm, Andrews purchased the chestnut mare, in foal to Grand Slam, for \$485,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. She sold the Grand Slam colt for \$650,000 at the 2004 November sale. An Unbridled's Song colt out of Heavenly Cat was a \$475,000 2005 November weanling and a Pulpit filly brought \$260,000 at this year's September sale. Andrews's association with Heavenly Cat came to an end Tuesday when the mare, in foal to Bernardini, sold to Mike Ryan for \$750,000. Andrews admitted it was a hard decision to sell the mare. "I decided to sell her for financial reasons," she explained. "She's been very good to me, but I was very happy with where she went and very very happy with the price." Heavenly Cat was followed into the sales ring by her weanling filly by Ghostzapper, but the bay failed to sell at \$150,000. "The weanling will probably sell as a yearling," Andrews said. "I think he just needs more time." A lifelong love of horses led Andrews to buy her own farm in Ohio in 1984. "I loved horses from a young age and I always wanted to breed horses," she recalled. "I eventually got to a place where I could do it. Cont. p7

"I started very small and went on from there. And I've had a lot of help from people like Viking Stud." In 2000, Andrews relocated all her horses to Kentucky and began her longtime association with Viking Stud, which consigned Heavenly Cat Tuesday. While her primary focus is breeding for the sales ring, Andrews does have a few horses in training. She was represented on the track this summer by the two-year-old Prairie Blues (Rossini), who is now two-for-two after winning the Iowa Sorority S. in August and by homebred Forest Whispers (Forestry), who romped home by 10 lengths in her debut at Prairie Meadows in June. Andrews currently has a broodmare band of eight and, while she admits she'd like to expand, any increase will have to wait. "I'd love to expand, but I can't afford it right now," she explained. "The economy isn't so good right now and I need to sell more. I have two more mares to sell at Keeneland and one in January. And I have two weanlings selling [Thursday]." Through Viking Stud, Twin Hopes will today offer the mare Jurisprudence (Seeking the Gold) (hip 1119), in foal to Discreet Cat, and a pair of weanlings by Bluegrass Cat. Hip 1046 is a filly out of South Bay Cove (Fusaichi Pegasus), who was purchased for \$500,000 out of the 2006 Keeneland November sale, while hip 1366 is a daughter of Killoe (Kris S.) purchased in utero for \$340,000 in January.

Woodland Farm Lands Capeside Lady for \$500,000...

The seven-year-old Grade II-winning Capeside Lady (Cape Town--Grey Lady Type, by Zen), selling in foal to Empire Maker on a Mar. 17 cover, elicited the secondhighest bid for a broodmare yesterday when knocked down to Woodland Farm for \$500,000. A daughter of a stakes winner and a half to the stakes-placed Your Hour's Up (Freud), Capeside Lady captured the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks and was third in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. before being sent through the 2005 Keeneland November Sale. Purchased for \$700,000 by Dapple Bloodstock, agent, as a racing prospect, Capeside Lady returned to win the following season's \$100,000 Bayakoa S. at Oaklawn racing for Dapple Stable. She was retired for the 2007 breeding season and sent to A.P. Indy. Offered at last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, she was bought back for \$1.1 million. Capeside Lady foaled an A.P. Indy colt this spring and was sent to Juddmonte Farms' Empire Maker. Woodland Farm was easily the session's top buyer, acquired nine head for \$2.21 million. Through the sale, Woodland has purchased a total of 16 head for \$4.12 million, second only to John Ferguson's \$9.01 million amount buyers. -LM

El Corredor Colt to Eldon Farm...

Eldon Farm manager Ronnie Rhodes was forced to \$330,000 to bring home a weanling son of El Corredor late in Wednesday's third session of the Keeneland November sale. "We thought he was a top colt," Rhodes said of the bay who was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent. "He has a good shoulder and great walk. He looked like a runner. That's the reason that we bought him. Everyone is really happy that we got him. We're really high on this colt." The weanling is out of stakes-placed Boundless Beauty (Copelan) and is a half brother to stakes winner Make Mine Minnie (Honour and Glory). Boundless Beauty is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Valid Goddess (Valid Appeal). Ken Luke's Virginia-based farm has been known to reoffer its weanling purchases at yearling auctions, and Rhodes left open that possibility for this weanling. "We'll make a decision on that later," he commented. The El Corredor youngster was Eldon Farm's second acquisition at the November sale. The farm purchased a weanling filly from the first crop of Henny Hughes (Hennessy) Tuesday for \$200,000. Rhodes admitted competition can be tough at November. "The market is like it always is -- the good ones are selling," he said. "I've missed out on a couple because of price. But we're happy with what we've got."

The Cat's Meow...

WinStar Farm's GI Haskell Invitational S. hero **Bluegrass Cat** (Storm Cat) attracted a solid book of mares his first season at stud. A case in point is Lady Melesi (Colonial Affair). From the family of champions Relaxing and Easy Goer, the multiple stakes winner was runner-up in the GI Milady BC H., as well as the GIII Dogwood S. and GIII Sixty Sails H. First or second in nine of her 14 career starts, she earned \$389,190, and was purchased for \$475,000 by G. Watts Humphrey while carrying her first foal at KEENOV in 2002.

The chestnut has done well in her second career as well. Her first foal turned out to be MGSP Doc Cheney (Saint Ballado), and her third was SW Roman Emperor (Empire Maker). She produced a son of Bluegrass Cat in February. Consigned by Lane's End, agent, the colt brought a final bid of \$280,000 at KEENOV yesterday.

WinStar Farm signed the ticket on the chestnut.

"He was bred by Watts Humphrey and [John Cline II and Robin Cline], and we've been on the farm to see

him," WinStar's Doug Cauthen said. "We've seen him develop, and he just showed himself so well here. It's a great family and, like a lot of [the Bluegrass Cats], he had a lot of leg and a lot of scope. He looks like a horse that's going to be a great yearling and, hopefully, a great two-year-old and racehorse. "That mare is an example of Bluegrass Cat's book," he added. "He got a great book of mares, and she is good representa-

tion of it. And they raise 'em right at Shawnee, so we were happy to support them."

Time will tell if Lady Melesi's latest foal will race in the WinStar colors, or head back to the sales ring.

"Some of the weanlings we've bought might come back in the yearling sales; some we'll take them and break them and put them in our racing stable," Cauthen said. "We'll evaluate it--if that colt looks like he might be a star at the Saratoga sale next year, we'll show him to the market again, but if not, we're happy to race him."

From 12 Bluegrass Cat weanlings to go through the sales ring to date, 10 have sold for an average of \$164,200 and a median of \$160,000. The early results have Team WinStar smiling.

"We're really pleased--it's great," Cauthen remarked. "Bluegrass Cat had a whole lot of scope and quality, which I think everybody is excited to see.

"Obviously, we think he's a great stallion, but now it's the job of the foals to do it on their own," he continued. "And they have--they've been really well received. All the right players are bidding on them and buying them, trying to get them, and we've supported him; we've bought a couple, which we try to do with all our stallions. We're really excited about him."

Bernardini Weanlings Well-Received...

Weanlings from the first crop of champion **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) have also been hot commodities at this year's bloodstock sale. Six of the seven Bernardini yearlings to go through the ring sold for an average of

\$456,666 and a median of \$275,000. Bernardini's nearest competitor is his stablemate at Darley, **Henny Hughes** (Hennessy), whose first-crop weanlings have averaged \$172,500, with a median of \$142,500. Bernardini stood his first season for \$100,000; Henny Hughes for \$40,000.

Leading the way for Bernardini's youngsters was the \$1.475-million filly who was purchased by Reiley Mc-Donald on behalf of Chesapeake Partners during Book 1. The filly was produced by the Storm Cat mare Teeming, a daughter of Sunday's \$14-million Better Than Honour and a sister to Rags to Riches, et al. Darley's John Ferguson purchased Bernardini's highest-priced colt, going to \$360,000 for a half to Banshee Breeze (Unbridled) out of the 18-year-old Banshee Winds (Known Fact).

"He just had a tremendous first book of mares," said Darley's stallion nomination manager Charlie Boden

when asked about the reception Bernardini's received. "He had 64 individual Grade I winners or producers, and the foals we've seen have lived up to their pedigrees. They don't look they'd necessarily be the 4 1/2-furlong types--they have size, some leg and some stretch and look like Classic-type horses, if you can say that about a foal. They would lend themselves to look like A.P. Indy horses, and the market likes that."

Boden said the traits of Bernardini's foals include, "a pretty head and eye, a nice shape, plenty of leg and a lot of quality."

Bernardini got 123 mares in foal during his first season at stud and again enjoyed a full book this spring, according to Boden. For 2009, Bernardini's fee has been reduced to \$75,000.

"We dropped the fee because of the way the market is, not because we were abandoning him at \$100,000," said Boden. "The first year he stood at \$100,000, a season sold at a charity auction for \$280,000, no guarantee, so we know the \$100,000 was below market value. But we wanted to lead the charge to lower fees a little bit, because we felt the market dictated that. He's going to be very popular at \$75,000. I anticipate there'll be a lot more mares offered than we'll be able to accommodate." -LM

Bolger Gets His Galileo...

When bidding on hip 263 stalled at \$725,000 during Monday's opening session of the November sale, the weanling filly by Galileo (Ire) was led out unsold. But a deal was struck shortly after the bay exited the ring

that will send the weanling to Europe with trainer Jim Bolger. "Jim was the last live bid and we negotiated after the sale and the price was fair," explained Fergus Galvin, General Manager of Hunter Valley Farm, which consigned the filly. Out of Altana (Mountain Cat), the weanling is a full sister to Irish group winner Galatee (Fr). Winner of the 2006 G3 Blue Wind S., Galatee was trained by Bolger. The condi-

tioner has enjoyed great success with offspring of Coolmore's Galileo. The Irishman trained G1 Epsom Derby winner New Approach (Ire) and G1 Matron S. winner Lush Lashes (GB) and he also bred G1 Juddmonte Coronation Cup winner Soldier of Fortune (Ire).

The More Things Change...

The figures on day 1 of Book 2 at Keeneland November continued the trend that has plagued the sales market this year. The session average was off 33.3 percent, and the median was down 36.5 percent. Over the first three days of the sale, the average has dropped off 36.7 percent, and the median has fallen 34.2 percent. But Keeneland Director of Sales Goeffrey Russell maintained an upbeat attitude. "I thought it started off very well," Russell said. "In general, given the state of the world, it was very good. Just look at commodities world-wide; we follow the same thing. It's not surprising. But what I think is good is that there's active trade here--active trade with an international feel to it as well, so that's good. Yes, they're trading at a lower level, but there's still active trade there." The results took very few unawares. "Everybody foresaw a correction going into this year's sales," Russell remarked. "The [economic] events of September exasperated us, that's all. The amount of the correction is larger than what we all thought July 1, but that's the result of what happened in the middle of September. This is a global problem; this is a many-industry problem. It's not just restricted to the Thoroughbred market. It's a world-wide economic crisis. When you trade horses at this level, what you need is a positive attitude, and I think the market's done a very good job with that."

FEW ARE CALLED

Without question, an independent assessment of the 'top of the November market' must cover the first three days of selling: Fasig-Tipton's one-day Sunday extravaganza plus Keeneland Book 1. In 2005, the last year before the Fasig sale took flight, there were 793 horses catalogued over those first three days of selling. A total of 536 were listed as sold (68 percent of those catalogued), and Fasig's \$32-million gross accounted for about 17 percent of the three-day total of around \$190-million.

In 2006, Fasig jumped the number catalogued to 256, which resulted in a \$64-million gross, about 30 percent of the combined three-day market. But for 2007 and for this year, as in 2005, Fasig's catalogue was in the 180's. Last year their \$52-million gross accounted for 23 percent of the combined three-day market of \$230-million, as Keeneland Book 1 grossed \$178.5-million.

Different story this year--in some ways. Fasig's clearance rate from the catalogue was in fact almost exactly the same as for Keeneland Book 1--a dismal 48 percent. Fasig's gross of \$70-million was way up on 2007, and their market share of November's first three days leapt from 23 to 44 percent; though, as usual, it's not all as straightforward as it might look. Almost a third of Fasig's gross was the \$23.5-million Southern Equine principal Mike Moreno spent buying out partner Jay Sikura from six mares, including Better Than Honour, and one foal. You can never accurately factor these things in, but there's a case for saying if you counted all the Southern Equine purchases from the Hill 'n' Dale consignment as being made in 30-cent dollars, the 'real' Fasig gross would be more like \$54-million, compared to last year's \$52-million. But that would assume last vear's \$52-million was all made in 100-cent dollars. which I suspect would be a brave assumption.

But the bigger story, without doubt, was the collapse of Keeneland Book 1, which lost half its gross, from \$178-million last year to just over \$90-million this week --in other words, nearly half the gross. With actually a few more catalogued in Book 1 this year, the number sold dropped from 380 last year (64 percent of the 2007 Book 1 catalogue) to 299 this year (49 percent of those catalogued) -- a 25-percent drop in the clearance rate from the catalogue. If you prefer to calculate from number sent through the ring, it was a 20-percent drop in that clearance rate, from 80 percent of those offered in 2007 to 64 percent this year. However you dissect it, the news for Keeneland wasn't very good. There's no other conclusion to draw except the obvious: even given overall market declines, Fasig's Sunday sale has now seriously impacted Keeneland Book 1. With big plans afoot for Fasig-Tipton under their new, Dubai-based ownership, Keeneland faces the most serious challenge to their traditional market share we have seen in many years.

The surge in Dubai-based market share in the Kentucky auction market was also very evident in the statistics on new stallions; in this case it was the dominance of the young Darley stallions, while Coolmore's Ashford operation must be listed among the missing. Of the four leading stallions by weanling average, with three or more sold during the first three days, three stand at Darley: Bernardini (A.P. Indy), of course, was leading first-year weanling sire, with six sold, averaging \$456,666. Henny Hughes (Hennessy; eight averaged \$172,500) and Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song; three averaged \$81,666) are also Darley stallions. The fourth was WinStar's Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat; six averaged \$167,000). There were five first-year covering stallions with three or more sold during the first three days: four stand at Darley, the exception being Gainesway's Corinthian (Pulpit), who had three mares sell in foal (of six offered), for an average of \$345,000. Darley had Hard Spun (Danzig), nine sold (of 19 offered) for an average of \$452,222; Street Sense (Street Cry), five sold (of 11 offered), for an average of \$412,000; Discreet Cat (Forestry), three sold (of five offered) for an average of \$178,333; and Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor), three sold (of seven offered), for an average of \$156,666 (all statistics per Instatistics, through Tuesday). But the uncomfortable news for everybody was that those five combined had 48 offered through the ring, but only 23--less than half --sold. In tough times, proven sires often become safer options for breeders than the formerly commercially invincible young prospects. Cont. p14





The prices on the super-select lots were plenty strong: but, between withdrawals and RNA's, fewer than half those originally catalogued for the first three days were actually listed as sales." - Bill Oppenheim

Though there was ample evidence that the 'good stuff' was every bit as expensive as it has been--if not more so, as there were so few that 'cleared the bar'--it was also abundantly clear that there was a serious shortage of the top prospects. No doubt, the Keeneland Book 1 catalogue was way down, not just because of Fasig, but also because the desirable prospects were simply not there in anything like the same numbers as in the past few years. Ultimately, though, it all does have to come back to the chain of supply and demand. Owners of racehorses, collectively, still lose half their money. If racehorse owners had a fighting chance to make money through purse earnings (not through having to sell their horses), the tail could stop wagging the dog, and the market could behave like a market should: demand-driven not by the greed generated by the previously easy money in trading breeding stock, but by the feasibility of creating a viable economic model based on racing horses. That really must be the next attainable medium-term goal for the breeding community. That will be a complex and difficult endeavor, but long-term it is the only way for the breeding industry itself to be viable. And you know what? Yes, we can.



I would make the comment that I guess we've gotten spoiled here at Keeneland, but our fans love the computer-chip tracking technology we have where we are able to identify where every horse is in the race. I found the simulcast signal presentation hard to follow, as far as what horse was where. I would hope we never again run a Breeders' Cup without some kind of tracking technology to identify where every horse is every step of the way.

I attended both days at Santa Anita as a lifelong racing fan. The racing was superb, which is the most important thing. However:

- 1. I would much prefer an equalization in the "importance" of races: there is no reason why gender should be the arbitrary deciding factor of who races when. Fourteen races in two days is terrific, but why not mix them up? The Cup will only be a truly international event when America joins the rest of the world and drops gender as a basis for scheduling. The rest of the world finds it quite normal to even have girls and boys race together--what a concept!
- 2. \$400 for seats an eighth of a mile from the finish line is ridiculously high, and not affordable for next year, particularly when airfare is added. It would have been a nice gesture to at least have given us a free program.
- 3. A grand opportunity to showcase the sport to Americans on television was wasted by splitting Saturday's card between two different networks. (Since I was at the track, I pre-set my recorder to get the full both days, and not knowing the Saturday card was split, I do not have the last five races.) I can't imagine how many people were literally turned off by having to figure out where to go right in the middle of the card, and to leave the Cup for "regional college football" was inexcusable. (Do major networks leave a presidential election to report on the winner of a junior league ping-pong tournament somewhere in Kansas?)
- 4. There is no reason to hold the Cup at the same race-track two years running. Nor is there any reason to return to Churchill Downs, which was the worst-managed (for lowly spectators like me) event I've ever attended (of at least eight Cups), except for Lone Star, which was beyond bad. Suggestion: alternate the Cup between Santa Anita and Belmont Park. Both are easily large enough to accommodate crowds, and do not burden either coastal residents nor those in the middle with having to make long trips to attend. Santa Anita has a synthetic surface and a passable turf course; Belmont has a fine dirt surface and a fine turf course.
- 5. I have been a passionate racing fan for more than 50 years, but I will not be attending any more Breeders' Cups unless seat prices come down and the venue is sensible and attractive to horses coming from all over the world, regardless of their preferred racing surface. Open it up. And get it on network television!

POST-ELECTION SCORE CARD & UPDATE ON LAME DUCK SESSION

NTRA lobbyists at the Alpine Group in Washington, D.C. have analyzed Tuesday's election results in a "score card" that is available on www.SupportHorseRacing.org. Simply click on Election Day Score Card from the home page to read their analysis.

With the election now behind us, it appears Congress is set to reconvene for a one-week "lame duck" session starting Monday, November 17. This will be the final session of the 110th Congress. A lame duck session is so named because some of the legislators on hand were either 1) not re-elected or 2) did not run for re-election, which means they will not be in office when the 111th Congress gets sworn in next January.

A lame duck session is likely to focus on a new stimulus bill to jump start the economy.

INITIATIVE Maryland voters approved Tuesday the proposed state constitutional amendment authorizing the State to issue up to five video lottery licenses for the installation and operation of up to 15,000 video lottery terminals for the purpose of raising revenue for education, according to a Magna Entertainment Corp. release. The Maryland Jockey Club, an MEC subsidiary, expects to pursue a VLT license for Laurel Park as soon as practicable after the administrative aspects of the license application process are finalized by applicable regulators. The Maryland Jockey Club also expects that both Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course will be entitled to share of Maryland VLT revenues through purse contributions. "Today is a very important day for horse racing in Maryland," said Tom Chuckas, President and Chief Operating Officer of the Maryland Jockey Club. "The voters of Maryland have approved a measure that we at the Maryland Jockey Club are confident will help save an industry that we love and that employs thousands of Maryland residents. We expect that introducing VLTs in our State will put Maryland racing back on a more even playing field with its neighboring states."Delaware and Pennsylvania currently have slots already in place.


