RAVEN'S PASS TO KILDANGAN

Princess Haya of Jordan's GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) has run his last race and will commence stallion duties at Kildangan Stud in

Ireland next season, it was announced yesterday. The chestnut sophomore, who also bagged a top-level score in the Sept. 27 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot, will stand at an initial covering fee €40,000. Initially campaigned in the colors of breeder Stonerside Stable, Raven's Pass exploded onto the scene

with a five-length success in last year's Listed Winkfield S. at Ascot before he dished out a seven-length demolition in the G3 Solario S. at Sandown. He concluded his juvenile campaign with a third in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. His three-year-old season was chaptered by an ongoing rivalry with dual Classic winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo), who won their first three meetings, but he finally bettered that old foe at Ascot in September before he did so again when leading home a Euro exacta in Santa Anita's showpiece. "He will start at Kildangan next year, we are thrilled and it is exciting news for the stud," commented the stud's general manager Jimmy Hyland. Regular partner Jimmy Fortune, who missed out on the plum Breeders' Cup Classic ride, added, "I had some great days on him, he did nothing but improve and [trainer] John Gosden did a fantastic job on him. I still don't think we had seen the best of him, but he's the most beautiful stamp of a horse and I am sure he will make a great stallion." Raven's Pass retires with a career record of six wins from 12 starts and earnings of £1,847,661.

KING OF THE CASTLE

Noel Murphy's Castle Park Farm sold the highestpriced lot on a day when weanlings ruled at Keeneland November. On the fifth day of trading, it was a striking chestnut son of Giant's Causeway--Queen's Music who led the way on the strength of Clear Ridge Stable's \$310,000 offer. Brian Graves, sitting just under the press box on the left side of the pavilion, handled the bidding duties for Clear Ridge and saw off a challenger standing in a doorway. Weanlings accounted for the top three prices Friday. They included a \$300,000 Cherokee Run colt, hip 1536, and a \$280,000 Tiznow colt, hip 1427. "He was a gorgeous foal," Murphy said of the Giant's Causeway colt, who was catalogued as hip 1629. "We thought he'd sell pretty well because he was a lovely individual, but that was more than we thought he'd bring. He's a super, super walker with a great top line." Cont. p2

him, and for Murphy. The Irish-bred consignor hails from Galway and got into the business the old-fashioned way: "It was a family business in Ireland--my father was a veterinarian."

The peripatetic Murphy first came to the States as a student and worked at Ashford Stud for a term. He moved his tack to Japan for two years, working at Lex Stud on Hokkaido.

"Then Noel O'Callaghan of BBA Ireland asked me to come back to Kentucky to manage Green Gates, and I managed that for five years before going out on my own," said Murphy, who launched Castle Park in 1999. Castle Park's primary client is Joe Lacombe, who became acquainted with Murphy around the time that Favorite Trick was running. Murphy had done some lay-ups for the juvenile star's trainer, Patrick Byrne. The Murphy/Lacombe partnership has been a successful one. Murphy selected and purchased the mares of Lacombe's three best homebred runners in 2008, the full-brothers Slew's Tizzy and Slew's Tiznow-both by Tiznow out of Hepatica--and the good two-year-old Azul Leon, by Lion Heart out of Quick Blue.

"We also have the dam of Raw Silk (Malibu Moon), who Joe bred," said Murphy. "She won a Grade II this year. I bought the dam [Silken Sash {Ire}]for Joe in Ireland."

Castle Park is based in Georgetown, not far from Lexington. The farm is home to 55 mares year-round.

\$300,000 for Cherokee Run Colt...

Hip 1536 further illustrated that the market is still receptive to weanlings that tick all the boxes. The Feb. 8-foaled colt, a son of Cherokee Run out of the stakes-placed Limited Entry (Carson City), realized \$300,000 from buyer Ferguson Valley. The colt is likely to be pinhooked as a yearling. Cherokee Run has worked with the family before, as Betty's Star (Pentelicus), a half-sister to Limited Entry, produced MSW Cherokee Jewel, who also is by Darley's stallion.

Yesterday's second-highest-priced horse was bred by G. Watts Humphrey Jr., Susan Keller, Victoria Oliver, and G. Watts Humphrey III in Kentucky. The first named purchased Limited Entry for \$160,000 at the 2003 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale. Limited Entry carried his green and white colors to a second-placed finish in the Listed Fashion S. at Belmont the following year. This was Limited Entry's second foal. Her first, a colt by Yes It's True, was sold as a weanling at this sale last year for \$55,000. cont. p3

...\$200,000 for Unbridled's Song Mare

The top price for mare Friday at November was the \$200,000 paid by Quarter B Farm/Tim Boyer for hip 1598, the four-year-old Unbridled's Song mare Ourfavoritesong. The gray or roan sold in foal on a Feb. 16 cover to Tiznow, whose name was attached to several of the day's best performers. Ourfavoritesong sold from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency. Ourfavoritesong was a broodmare prospect when she was purchased by Shining Light Farm for \$70,000 at this sale a year ago. Ourfavoritesong is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Martha's Music and was produced by Danzig Key (Danzig), sister to Grade I winners Nine Keys (Forty Niner) and Silver Voice (The Minstrel).

Anatomy of the Sale...

The session-topping Giant's Causeway colt was produced by the winning Dixieland Band mare Queen's Music and is thus bred on the same cross that produced First Samurai. The 15-year-old Queen's Music is a half-sister to Group 2 winner Splendent (Shadeed) and Group 3 heroine Aim for the Top (Irish River {Fr}). Queen's Music is familiar face at bloodstock auctions. She sold in foal to Diesis (GB) to BBA Ireland for \$190,000 at November in 2000 and was shipped to Europe, where she produced three foals for breeder Wood Hall Stud Limited. While in Europe, Queen's Music RNA'd twice at Tattersalls December, first for 100,000gns in 2002 and then for 36,000gns a year later. Sent through the sale a third year in a row while in foal to Medicean (GB) in 2004, Queen's Music finally found a buyer when Curragh Bloodstock Agency, acting on behalf of Christoph Amerian, acquired her for only 20,000gns (\$39,750). Amerian has seen a healthy return on that investment. In 2005, Amerian sold the Medicean foal she was carrying, a filly named Contessina (Ire), for 64,000gns (\$115,214) at Tattersalls December. In 2006, he trumped that buy selling a High Chaparral (Ire)--Queen's Music colt for €230,000 (\$295,090) to the account of Paul Shanahan at Goffs November. That colt is named High Cian (Ire) and is currently racing in Europe. Queen's Music was subsequently put in foal to the Giant's Causeway stallion Footstepsinthesand (GB) and sent to Castle Park Stud in Kentucky. Queen's Music foaled a colt last year, named Beach Rhythm, who Castle Park and Amerian sold as a weanling for \$150,000 at this sale. Comparing the Giant's Causeway colt with his year-older brother, Noel Murphy offered, "He was very similar to the Footstepsinthesand, but he was a bigger, stronger horse. Murphy added that Queen's Music is not currently in foal and is booked to Giant's Causeway once again. Christoph Amerian, the man who owns Queen's Music, formerly had a farm in Ireland and is now based in Germany, where he is involved in show jumping. "He still has a few mares in Ireland, but this is his only mare in the States," said Murphy. "He mostly sells, and he buys some foals and re-sells them as yearlings."-LM

Tiz Good Timing...

When Taylor Made Farm, Louis Brooks and Jo and Sam Pollock partnered to buy the stakes-placed Wild Rush mare Dirty Rush about 90 days ago, they thought the handsome Tiznow colt by her side, which they also purchased, would make a good yearling prospect at next year's Saratoga Sale. As it turned out, the weanling proved a top draw on day five of this year's Keeneland November Sale. Selling yesterday as hip 1427, the Apr. 2-foaled colt brought \$280,000 on the bid of Pearl Street Farm. It was third-highest price for a weanling Friday. "We thought he was a nice horse," said Sam Pollock shortly after the sale. "We thought he might be a nice Saratoga horse--that's our vacation spot; we like to go up there and bring a few horses with us."

In the end, they decided to send the colt through the ring as a weanling, and were rewarded for that decision. Brooks said the group was thrilled with the final price. "We thought \$100,000, maybe \$150,000, so we were as happy as a hog in water," he said. No doubt boosted by the strong year his sire is having, the Tiznow colt was produced by the five-year-old Dirty Rush, who is a half to three stakes horses, including GI King's Bishop runner-up Social Probation (Jules), stakes winner and graded-placed Britt's Jules (Jules) and stakes winner Probation Ready (More Than Ready).

Dirty Rush had been acquired privately by Chris and Kirt Cahill, who bred hip 1427 before selling colt and mare as a package privately. It wasn't the first time Tiznow has played a role in the Pollocks' success. At the 2004 Keeneland November Sale, they purchased the Storm Cat mare Contrive for \$140,000. The following year, Contrive's daughter Folklore, from the first crop of Tiznow, became the top juvenile filly in the land. She won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and was awarded with an Eclipse. Shortly after Folklore's Breeders' Cup win, Contrive was offered by the Pollocks at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, where she was knocked down to the folks who owned Folklore--Bob and Beverly Lewis--for \$825,000. "We really like Tiznow," said Sam. "I guess he's one of our favorite stallions, and we were fortunate enough to buy a piece of a share in him this year." The Pollocks also have done well with Saint Ballado relations. They owned portions of Grade I winners Sister Act and Yankee Victor, both by the late Halo son. Just last Sunday, a horse co-bred by the Pollocks, the four-year-old treble Grade I winner Intangaroo (Orientate), was among the stars at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale after going to Frank Stronach for \$1.8 million. The Pollocks bred Intangaroo with Taylor Made Farm and sold her as a yearling for \$37,000 in 2005. cont. p5





Tiz Good Timing cont.

The Pollocks made the trek over to Newtown Paddocks to watch her sell Sunday. Asked if it was emotional, Jo quipped, "It was sad for me, because I'd like to have her back."

Jo and Sam Pollock, who do business as Pollock Farms, got into the Thoroughbred game about 20 years ago. Before that, the Alabama-based couple owned automobile dealerships and dabbled in a different kind of livestock.

"We had cattle for a long time; we raised exotic cattle," Sam explained. "We'd go to England or France and bring some over. But we slowly drifted away from cattle and toward the horses."

Ten years ago, they bought a farm in Kentucky, but currently lease the operation to Taylor Made.

"We stay up here in the summertime and keep an eye on all of our horses," said Sam.

Primarily a breed-to-sell operation, Pollock Farms owns in whole or in partnership between 20 and 25 mares. "We always sell the Grade I horses and keep the others," laughed Jo, who grew up riding horses.

You can also pick up a copy of the TDN today at the Keeneland November Sale. Louis Brooks, meanwhile, is based in Texas, where he operates a cattle ranch. He has recently become involved in wind generators, however, and says that that has become his primary business these days. Brooks is quick to praise his partners for their success.

"Frank [Taylor, of Taylor Made Farm] found the mare, and we lucked out with this one," he said, before pointing to Sam and adding, "This guy is the best partner in the world--and the smartest, too."-LM

Still Down, but Some Silver Lining...

Like the four days that preceded it, Friday's session saw sharp declines in average and median and a steep increase in the number of RNAs. The average of \$55,591 was down 38.2 percent from 2007, while the median of \$45,000 was down 30.8 percent. There were 104 RNA's yesterday, compared with 76 in 2007. One bright spot on the day was that weanlings sold well. During last year's corresponding fifth session, a total of 18 weanlings realized \$100,000 or more. That number had dropped to 13 yesterday. But in 2007, only four foals made over \$150,000, with the top two selling for \$250,000 and \$225,000. This year, seven weanlings made over that mark. That includes three at \$310,000, \$300,000 and \$280,000, respectively. "I thought the foal market today was very strong, especially at the top end," commented Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I would credit it to the strength of the physicals, as most of the weanlings were purchased by pinhookers. One of the comments that I heard was that some of the better pedigreed weanlings had been taken out, and having such a narrow band of horses that fit all the criteria meant that everyone landed on the same ones. But the pinhookers obviously are optimistic that we'll get over this bump in the market, so that's always pleasant." As one prominent pinhooker told Russell while bidding him goodnight, "Good foals are recession proof." -LM

CURLIN INTEREST REMAINS UNSOLD A

sealed-bid auction for a 20-percent interest in defending Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) failed to result in a sale, according to Sylvius H. von Saucken, the attorney for the court-appointed receiver. Bids were due by 5 p.m. Wednesday. According to a statement issued by von Saucken, the 20 percent share will be marketed privately to parties who had expressed an interest in the stake during the bidding process, though it is not certain that the negotiations will result in a sale. "Through this process, we identified that there is much love for Curlin, but this is a depressed market," said von Saucken of the Garretson Law Firm in Cincinnati. "There were no bids acceptable to the receiver. The sealed-bid process was intended to determine if a market interest existed for the 20-percent interest in Curlin. The process was not necessarily intended to result in a sale, but the receiver recognizes the pressing, but not mandatory need given this market to sell that interest. The receiver has spoken to everyone who contacted Keeneland and our office, and they have been unanimous in their praise for this champion stallion. The market echoed the same concerns we had going in, that a minority interest owned by folks with legal problems is a hard sell for those who prefer simplicity over complexity." Disbarred attorneys Shirley Cunningham Jr. and William Gallion own the 20percent interest through their corporation, Tandy LLC, which races as Midnight Cry Stables. Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables owns the other 80 percent of Curlin. "With all that being said, this process did bring forth some interested parties who have identified potential willingness to continue a dialogue concerning a private sale," added von Saucken. "We will pursue whatever actions are necessary to maximize the value of the horse. This was just the first necessary step in the receiver's plans to protect the value of Tandy's interests, including Curlin."

STARDOM BOUND TO RACE IN CALIFORNIA

IN '09 MGISW Stardom Bound (Tapit), who was purchased by IEAH Stables for \$5.7-million at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November Sale last Sunday, will be sent back to California to launch her 2009 campaign, connections announced yesterday. Sent to Three Chimneys Farm following the sale, the grey is expected to make her first start of the year in either the GIII Santa Ysabel S. Jan. 5 or the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 9 before a tilt at the Mar. 9 GI Santa Anita Oaks. "As soon as she's ready, we'll run her--we're not backing off on her," IEAH President Michael lavarone told Daily Racing Form yesterday. Winner of the GI Oak Leaf S., GI Del Mar Debutante S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, the Kentucky-bred will remain under the care of Bobby Frankel during her stay out West. "She loves the track out there," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. told DRF. "Frankel is the best horseman alive; he's going to be with her every day. He wants to help her out so much. I would love to be around her every day, but the best thing is to see her out in her own environment." lavarone added that the goal will be the GI Kentucky Oaks, but left a slight opening for a tilt at the Kentucky Derby. "She'd have to impress the daylights out of us and everybody else," he told DRF. "If she belongs there, we'll consider it."

Why I Joined the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance The last few weeks have been an important time in the history of Thoroughbred racing, with the announcement in New York of the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance. As both the executive chair of the NTRA and the president of Turfway Park, I often find myself viewing the Alliance from two distinctly different points of view. From the broad perspective of my role with the NTRA, I am exceedingly gratified that so many subsets of our diverse industry were able to put individual issues aside and collaborate for the good of all. These industry groups, which importantly included fans, were not just unified in their approval of the Alliance and their willingness to embrace changes that were, first and foremost, the right thing to do on behalf of our equine and human athletes. They also were instrumental in developing virtually every component and concept contained in the Alliance's 21 pages of reforms.

And that wide-ranging input will continue to be vital as the work of the Alliance evolves in the weeks and months ahead. Equally impressive was the industry's willingness to cede the important role of oversight to a fair but tough-minded outsider who would cut us no slack. Three things stuck out in my mind about our independent counsel Tommy Thompson after spending several hours with the former four-term Governor of Wisconsin and Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services last Wednesday: 1) he has a very high energy level and little tolerance for inaction; 2) he has a deep passion for Thoroughbred racing; and 3) he was not blowing smoke when he said he would have no problem giving racetracks and others a grade of "F" in his periodic public report cards if he found them insincere about their resolve to reform horse racing. As unsettling as the glare of public scrutiny may be to a track operator, it is exactly this brand of transparency that can help the Alliance succeed where other well-intentioned industry initiatives have failed. And to be sure, there are plenty of obstacles we all must hurdle on the road to successful implementation of the Alliance's reforms. Chief among them is the financial cost. It's safe to say that 2008 will not be chronicled as the "salad days" of our industry from a bottom-line standpoint.

The economy has played a big role in that. But so has our relative inaction on matters like health and safety and wagering security. We have no choice but to shore up the infrastructure of our sport to ensure that our future is brighter than our recent past. Does the current business downturn make it more difficult for track execs like me to do this? Absolutely, But that same business slump and the pain it brings make the need to change--and change now--inescapably apparent. It's easy to overlook problems during otherwise tranquil times, and all of us have been guilty of that at one time or another. Now, problems of our own doing (lack of reform) coupled with problems not of our doing (the economy) have made it clear that the salient question is not, "How much will it cost me to implement these reforms?" The question is, "How much will it cost me-today and in the longer run-NOT to implement these reforms?"

I am reading the New York Times bestseller "Snowball," a pretty good read about the most recognized investor on the planet, Warren Buffet. In the book, Buffett sums up his philosophy this way: "I am fearful when others are greedy, and I am greedy when others are fearful." In that vein, those who fear making investments in reform merely open the door wider for those of us who think it is not only the morally right thing to do but also ultimately the path to economic dividends. I hope the wagering public, who rightfully has demanded many of these reforms, rewards those making the investment with a greater share of their play. I trust that owners, our industry's largest lifeline of investment capital, will run their horses at facilities willing to invest in protecting those valuable assets and in conducting racing with the utmost integrity. If some view that as greedy, then I am happy to be viewed in that light.

When we made the decision to install Polytrack at Turfway Park in 2005, we faced financial costs that were staggering for a mid-sized track like ours. When I look back three years later, though, I shudder to think what things would be like for Turfway today had we not made that switch. Our racing has been safer, our field sizes have increased and our weather-related cancellations have declined. Switching to Polytrack proved to be the right decision for us back then. And I know that joining the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance is the right decision for us now.

I am pleased that 55 other racetracks see this issue as Turfway sees it and have joined the Alliance. And I'm hopeful that those who have not yet joined will soon do so. In the big picture, it doesn't really matter when a racetrack or other industry organization climbs on board-it just matters that we're all, indeed, on board. That's because Governor Thompson isn't the only one who will be grading us. Even more telling will be the grade we receive from the American public, including our fans and our prospective fans. They will be grading us individually in our local markets and collectively on a national scale. And when that report card comes, not a single one of us can afford a failing grade.




CHURCHILL REDUCES SOME PURSES Soft business levels stemming from the nation's economic slowdown and the unresolved negotiations with horsemen over distribution of the Churchill Downs simulcast signal to national advance deposit wagering outlets have prompted Churchill Downs to announce a 10-percent reduction in overnight purses for the remainder of its Fall Meet, and reductions in purses for two of the meet's major stakes races. Overnight purses will be reduced by 10 percent, effective with the racing program Nov. 12. In addition, purses will be reduced for the Nov. 28 GII Clark H. and the Nov. 27 GII Falls City H.. The Clark purse will be reduced by \$100,000 to \$400,000-added, and the Falls City purse by \$50,000 to \$150,000-added. 
