




Smarty Jones' KEIAI GERBERA Wins First Time Out by 5 (see ATW p. 6)

SUPER SIX AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

Six weanling colts brought six figures to lead the way on Monday's eighth session of the Keeneland November



Sale in Lexington. The top price on the day was paid by agent Ben Glass for a colt from the third crop of star freshman sire Tapit. Gary and Mary West's bloodstock advisor went to \$250,000 to acquire the bay, catalogued as hip 2816. The Feb. 24-foaled colt was produced by the nine-year-old Green Dancer mare Rhumba Punch. He is half-brother to this year's good two-year-old Lyin' Heart (Lion Heart), winner of Lone Star's Trial S. at first ask-

ing and that track's in T.T.A. Sales Futurity. Lyin' Heart was also second to Screen Your Friend (Friends Lake) in the GIII Bashford Manor S. Hip 2816 was consigned by Jody and Michelle Huckabay's Elm Tree Farm.

The only mare to reach six figures Monday was hip-2993, the nine-year-old Cordoba (Unbridled--Russian Flight {Ire}, by Siberian Express). The stakes-placed miss, consigned by James M. Herbener, Jr., agent, was purchased by agent H. Albina for \$100,000. She sold in foal on a Feb. 26 cover to Dixie Union.

While the strength of the weanling market continued to be a pleasant surprise at November, overall numbers once again revealed steep declines (see below figures). Cont. p2

Tears of Joy...

Jody and Michelle Huckabay, who own and operate the Kentucky-based Elm Tree Farm, have the tear ducts of daughter Caroline to thank for yesterday's \$250,000 session topper. Back in 2000, Jody purchased a strapping daughter of Green Dancer as a yearling for \$25,000 at the September Sale. Rumba Punch would grow to be nearly 17 hands, but she was injured in her lone start as a two-year-old and had to be retired. The Huckabays sent Rumba Punch through the 2002 November Sale as a broodmare prospect. That's when Caroline, just five years old, turned on the waterworks.

"We had some partners and we had every intention of selling Rumba Punch," explained Jody. "But Caroline looks up at me and starts crying and asking me not to sell her horse. So I was a parent that day."

Huckabay bought out his partners and signed the ticket for just \$7,000.

"We were like, well, what are we going to do with her now?" laughed Jody.

Fast forward six years, and Rumba Punch is now the dam of four horses. Elm Tree sold the first, Makani (Runaway Groom), for \$57,000 as a yearling, then bought back Better Than Swiss (Tomorrows Cat) as a yearling for \$20,000. Rumba Punch's third foal was the Lion Heart colt Lyin' Heart, who sold to Kirk Robinson for \$100,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton July Sale. As a two-year-old of '08, Lyin' Heart emerged as a solid horse in the Midwest, winning the T.T.A. Sales Futurity at Lone Star and completing the exacta in the GIII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill.

His success convinced the Huckabays to offer Rumba Punch's latest foal (she was barren in '07) as a weanling, and vesterday that Tapit colt exceeded all expectations when Ben Glass, agent for Gary and Mary West, purchased him for \$250,000.

"Oh, absolutely not," Jody replied when asked if he expected anything in that ballpark. "We were hoping, if we got lucky, that we might get \$100,000. We put him in because of Lyin' Heart, then all of a sudden Tapit just catches on fire. But he is a very nice colt. He vetted well and we got two racehorse people hooked up, and it was just a very pleasant surprise." Tapit, who will stand the 2009 season at Gainesway for \$35,000, is the sire of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Stardom Bound.


WinStar Farm was the immediate underbidder, with Woods Edge Farm's Peter O'Callaghan also in the mix, according to Huckabay.

Asked to compare yesterday's session topper with Lyin' Heart, Jody offered, "They were two totally different horses. This horse looks like he can run a route of ground and is just a very good, long-legged, lanky colt. Lyin' Heart was very muscular and very well put-together, but he was built like a Quarter Horse. I think this will be a bigger, leggier horse, while Lyin' Heart is a more compact horse, like his father." Rumba Punch is currently in foal to Cherokee Run.

On a day when weanlings accounted for the top six prices, Huckabay said he was surprised at the ongoing strength of that sector of the market.

"We've been trying to buy a few mares, and the mares you really want, they're fairly strong. But the weanlings are unbelievable," he said. "I think it's extremely strong if you have the physical and jump through all the hoops; it's a very strong sale. But if you don't--if you don't--then it's another story. And we've been there as well."

As for the success of the Tapit colt, Huckabay is quick to give credit where credit is due. "Caroline's the only reason we have Rumba Punch," he said. "It's been a blessing in disguise, let me tell you." -L Marquardt

Chapman Looking for Smarty Dates...

Patricia Chapman and her late husband Roy enjoyed the thrill of a lifetime when their homebred **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality) won two-thirds of the Triple

Crown in 2004. Chapman has been able to relive those glory days now that Smarty Jones's offspring are off

and running on the race-track.

Chapman was at the Keeneland November sale last week looking to add to her select broodmare band, specifically shopping for mares that would work well with the champion, who retired to Three Chimneys in 2005.

"We had two mares and I just bought three more, so that makes five," Chapman said yesterday. "Right now I think that's a good number. I may be back next November if something fits real well with Smarty Jones. I reeval-

uate each year. I don't know what I'm doing, but I have good people advising me in Robert and Case Clay and the fabulous staff at Three Chimneys."

One of Chapman's newest acquisitions was **Dynamist** (Dynaformer--Arjunand, by Diesis {GB}) (hip 1033). In foal to Harlan's Holiday, the six-year-old mare sold at Keeneland Thursday for \$360,000.

Chapman says she has three basic criteria for picking out mares.

"I look for size, temperament and for a good family," she explained. "There were plenty last week that I loved the breeding, but they weren't quite big enough. I look for a mare over 15.3 [hands]."


Chapman admits she enjoys attending the auctions.

"I love walking around the sales, looking at mares and bidding," she commented. "Then when they get over \$1 million, I say, 'Oh, no. I don't want to go that high.' I could sit there and watch every horse sell. And I love to walk out back and watch all the important people."

Smarty Jones and his connections became a national phenomena in 2004, winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. and drawing scores of fans to watch him gallop in the mornings at Philadelphia Park. After the hubbub of the Smart Jones days, Chapman finds another benefit at the sales.

"It's like I'm incognito," she laughs. "No one recognizes me anymore."

Chapman keeps busy following Smarty Jones's first crop to hit the track. Now seven, the stallion has eight winners from 24 starters. His most successful runner to date is the filly Be Smart, second in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland.

"Every June I go to Lexington on a tour of the farms," Chapman said. "And I get to see maybe 30-40 of his

babies. And I follow them and watch their works and following their races. It's so exciting. I just love it."

Chapman has a son of Smarty Jones currently in training with the Derby winner's trainer John Servis. Ritzy Jones debuted Nov. 3 at Delaware Park, finishing fifth.

Through it all, Chapman never forgets where it all started.

Way back in 1999, David R. Mueller reached in to claim the stakes-placed Lyphard's Wish (Fr) mare Wishful Legacy for \$50,000. The then-five-year-old made five starts for Mueller and trainer James Baker, with her best efforts a pair of consecutive runner-up finishes in \$50,000 claimers at Churchill. Wishful Legacy might not have paid for that claim on the track, she's turned into a very solid producer for the Mueller Farms broodmare band. Yearlings out of the mare have sold for up to \$300,000 (The Mr. Greeley male Authoritative brought that as a short yearling at the 2004 Keeneland January Sale), and have sold for \$75,000 (2x) and \$45,000. This weanling colt, from the first crop of dual Grade I hero Borrego (El Prado {Ire}), became her second-highest-priced sales horse, however, when Blue Sky Stables went to \$175,000 for the Feb. 11-foaled gray. John Stuart's Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, incidently, has consigned all of the Mueller Farmsowned horses out of Wishful Legacy.

Storm Cat may have been pensioned and some of his more popular sons, such as Hennessy, Forest Wildcat and Storm Boot, may no longer be with us, but there are still plenty more chapters to be written in the Storm Cat story, judging by the past few months.

Of course it has been Giant's Causeway who has been Storm Cat's main standard-bearer in 2008, with an impressive total of 11 Northern Hemisphere graded/group winners. Tale of the Cat and Stormy Atlantic--both past holders of the title of champion sire of juveniles--have also done well, each being responsible for the earners of more than \$7 million this year.

Several cheaper sons of the Overbrook star have also

been drawing attention to themselves, none more so than Bernstein, who has taken fourth position among the sires of two-year-olds, thanks largely to his three juvenile graded winners. Pure Prize, whose fee remains at \$12,500 in 2009, will surely be very popular again following the exploits of Pure Clan, Cowgirls Don't Cry and Coronet

of a Baron. And Van Nistelrooy, whose fee has been cut from \$25,000 to \$15,000, reminded us of his considerable potential when Nistle's Crunch gained a well-deserved first graded success in the GIII Commonwealth Turf S. at Churchill Downs.

Van Nistelrooy (named after one of Holland's top soccer players) was the least expensive of Ashford's 15 stallions when he stood his first Northern Hemisphere season at a fee of \$7,500 in 2004. This modest fee reflected the fact that his racing career had ultimately failed to fulfil the high hopes raised firstly by his powerful pedigree and then by his first few racecourse appearances.


Bred by Stonerside Stable, Van Nistelrooy was consigned to Keeneland's 2001 September Sale. Despite the terrible gloom which hung over proceedings after 9/11, the Storm Cat colt became the second-highest-priced yearling in September Sale history, when Demi O'Byrne went to \$6.4 million to secure him for the Coolmore partnership.

No doubt the Coolmore team was hoping that the youngster would develop into another Giant's Causeway for them. Giant's Causeway had retired at the end of 2000 with a 13-9-4-0 career record, and there were a few similarities between the two. Both are chestnuts with a blaze and lengthy white socks (Van Nistelrooy having three, compared to Giant's Causeway's two), and they were both out of mares with some Hail to Reason blood. Van Nistelrooy's dam, the Halo mare Halory, had already been represented by four graded winners, most notably the GI Blue Grass S. winner Halory Hunter, and another Halo mare had produced the Grade I winner Harlan to Storm Cat. Clearly the youngster had a lot to live up to.

The early signs were encouraging. Van Nistelrooy was ready for action in July 2002 and quickly recorded three consecutive victories over the Curragh's seven furlongs. Although he'd had to work hard to snatch victory in a listed race and in the G2 Futurity S., his rider claimed he was simply lazy and Van Nistelrooy started a hot favorite to become a Group 1 winner in the National S. on his fourth start. Although he couldn't wear down Refuse to Bend, there was still plenty of merit in this performance, as Refuse to Bend went on to win the 2000 Guineas.

Another defeat followed 13 days later when Van Nistelrooy finished third as favourite for the G2 Royal Lodge S., in which he encountered traffic problems. He then became one of three Aidan O'Brien challengers for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Arlington and was far from disgraced in finishing fifth to Vindication on an unfamiliar surface.

The next news we had of Van Nistelrooy came in July 2003, when it was announced that he had been retired due to injury and was heading to New Zealand to stand at Trelawney Stud. That first season in New Zealand was to produce Boundless, winner of the G1 New Zealand Oaks in March this year, but Boundless was by no means the first to draw attention to Van Nistelrooy, as his first American crop earned him a top-five finish among the freshman sires.

Although Van Nistelrooy's stud fee helped him attract 186 mares in his first season, for an initial crop of 122 named foals, his book of mares was probably more notable for its quantity than its quality. He has done outstandingly well for a \$7,500 stallion to sire five graded/group winners from this crop. Nistle's Crunch is the fifth, and he follows Set Play (GI Del Mar Debutante), Strike the Deal (G2 Richmond S. and runner-up in the G1 Middle Park S.), Elusive Lady (GIII Tempted S.) and Raymi Coya (G3 Oh So Sharp S.). as a two-year-old. Elusive Lady is out of an unraced Unbridled's Song mare, while Raymi Coya is out of an unraced Maria's Mon mare who sold for \$30,000 as a yearling. Nistle's Crunch, for his part, is the first foal of Sam Eye Am, a minor stakes winner over a mile. I believe he is only the sec-

ond graded winner out of a daughter of the high-class handicap horse Island Whirl, whose eldest daughters are 23 years old. And I think Nistle's Crunch is the first graded winner to have a second dam by Henbane, a stallion whose main claim to fame was that he was a half-brother to the Epsom Derby winner Henbit.

In other words, Van Nistelrooy deserves plenty of credit for each of his five graded winners.

I wonder whether his purchasers considered it a plus or a minus that he is inbred 3x3 to the great Northern Dancer. In retiring him to stud in Kentucky a wider range of bloodlines was made available to him and none of his stakes winners has Northern Dancer nearer than the fifth generation in the bottom half of its pedigree.

The question now is how quickly Van Nistelrooy is going to build on his bright start. I think a measure of patience is going to be required, as--in common with so many of today's young stallions--the number of mares visiting him declined in his second, third and fourth seasons. His second crop is only half as big as his first, and his third and fourth are smaller still (he is credited with 44 live foals in his fourth crop, born earlier this year). The good news is that he attracted more than 170 mares at an increased fee of \$25,000 in 2008, so his two-year-olds of 2011 should be well worth keeping an eye on.

ZENYATTA GREAT, BUT NOT HORSE OF THE YEAR By Bill Finley, special to espn.com

Zenyatta is a magnificent filly who completed a perfect year with a rousing win in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic. Maybe the best filly to race this decade, she's worthy of respect, admiration, platitudes and, of course, the older filly and mare championship. But that's it. She picked the wrong year to be good. Zenyatta is not the Horse of the Year. Curlin is.

Historically, fillies have to beat colts to be named

Horse of the Year. The only exception is when there is the rare year where no three-year-old or older male does anything exceptional. That hasn't been the case in 2008. While Curlin certainly didn't help his Horse-of-the-Year case with a fourth-place finish in

the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, a race he was supposed to win, his overall body of work during the year was outstanding.

Except for one day at Santa Anita, Curlin was the best non-turf horse in the world. He conquered Dubai. He won the GI Stephen Foster, the GI Woodward and the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. For the second straight year, he eclipsed \$5 million in earnings, and he became the first North American-based horse to top \$10 million in career earnings. From the time he burst on the scene with a huge maiden win at Gulfstream Park, he has had an historic campaign. The 2008 season has been a big part of it. Bill Finley cont. p9





Horse of the Year ordinarily goes to a male horse who had a special year. Curlin's year, by any definition, was special.

The filly Azeri was named Horse of the Year in 2002 and did not face the boys, but that was a year when no male did anything special. War Emblem was named

three-year-old champion and Left Bank was the older horse champ. Both had relatively modest credentials.

Since the inception of the current Eclipse Award format, the only other fillies to be named Horse of the Year were All Along (1983) and Lady's Secret (1986). Lady's Secret defeated males in the GI Whitney in 1986 and All Along won three North American races against males in 1983.

The closest thing racing has seen to Zenyatta in recent years is Personal Ensign. Like Zenyatta, she was seven-for-seven during her four-year-old season in 1988. Like Zenyatta, she capped her year with a win in what was then called the Breeders' Cup Distaff. But she was passed over for Horse of the Year by Alysheba, the outstanding male horse to race that year.

You can't fault trainer John Shirreffs and owners Jerry and Ann Moss for not running Zenyatta in the Breeders' Cup Classic. They put her in the race where she belonged and they collected \$1,080,000 for winning an event where she had the competition at her mercy. But if they truly wanted to take a shot at Horse of the Year, they should have entered her in the Classic. That way, she could have won the title on the racetrack.

Zenyatta is a magnificent filly, but there's no precedent for her being named Horse of the Year over a colt like Curlin. Maybe they'll bring her back next year and try again and, perhaps, aim for the Classic. Until then, they're going to have to settle for being second best.

Let it Ride...

There's little doubt that the nature of the Pro-Ride synthetic surface at Santa Anita had an effect on the outcome of the Breeders' Cup races. As is so often the case with synthetic surfaces, front-runners had a miserable time during the two days of Breeders' Cup racing, something that has been noted just about everywhere. Not a single Breeders' Cup race run over the synthetic track was won wire-to-wire and deep closers won most.

But the track also seemed biased toward outside paths, something few have noted. Over the course of two days, including the non-Breeders' Cup races, only one horse won from the one or two post on the Pro-Ride track and that was Zenyatta, who spent most of her race on the outside.

All through the Oak Tree meet, inside posts fared poorly. In sprints, posts one and two were a combined 18-for-272 for the meet for a measly winning percentage of 6.6 percent.

Considering how the track played during the Breeders' Cup, one of the most impressive horses to race over the two days was a loser. In the Juvenile, Square Eddie immediately went to the rail under Rafael Bejarano, set the early pace, dropped back to third and was then coming on again at the end to finish second. It remains to be seen how he will handle a non-synthetic surface, but he ran a tremendous race and deserves to be near the top of anyone's list of 2009 Derby contenders.


