

WEANLINGS RULE AGAIN AT KEENOV

The stock market took yet another 400-point hit yesterday in New York, and things were not much better in Lexington, where it was another tough day of trade at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The auction suffered through a high number of withdrawls and buybacks, not to mention steep declines in the average and median. But there were a few bright spots, thanks to some spirited bidding for select weanlings. An Eaton Sales-consigned son of Indian Charlie--Willa Time (Gilded Time) proved most popular on the day, selling for a session-topping \$110,000. The April foal, catalogued as 3705 and hailing from the extended female family of MGISW Will's Way, was purchased by Shannon Run Stables.

Successful in his only prior start, a one-mile maiden at Navan Oct. 22, Fame and Glory upped his performance level to take Europe's penultimate pattern race with aplomb. The eventual winner was alert from the gate and raced under a tight hold in third through the early fractions. Shaken up rounding the home turn, he came under more vigourous urging at the quarter-mile marker and found late gears under a powerful Johnny Murtagh drive to edge out stablemate Drumbeat nearing the line. "He won impressively at Navan and had come on a lot for that [first] run," commented winning jockey Johnny Murtagh. "He ought to be a very nice middledistance horse next year." Britain's bookmaking fraternity agreed and have introduced the Ballydoyle inmate at 20-1 in ante-post lists for next year's G1 Epsom Derby. Click for the Racing Post chart. "He was a nice, big, strapping colt, not quite finished, but very good," commented Eaton Sales' Tom VanMeter. "He reminded me a lot of Indian Charlie in that he's long and scopey. There's a lot of room for improvement there. We were very happy with the price.

We were in the \$75,000 range, but we had three or four scopes on him, so we were hopeful." The Kentucky-bred colt was offered on behalf of Ohiobased Elisabeth Alexander, who purchased Willa Time for \$26,000 in foal to Southern Halo at the 2003 Keeneland January sale. From the first four foals produced for Alex-

ander by the mare, the best from a commercial perspective was another son of Indian Charlie, which made \$97,000 as an FTKJUL yearling in 2005. Willa Time was offered at this year's January sale with the Indian Charlie in utero, but she was bought back when bidding stalled out at just \$27,000. The decision proved a fortuitous one for Alexander, who founded Eutrophia Farms in northeastern Ohio in the early 1970s. The best horses to carry Alexander's light blue colors at the races are seven-time graded winner Magna Graduate and GSW Cryptoquip. The day's second-highest price was achieved by a weanling colt by leading freshman sire Tapit (Pulpit), which was hammered down to the bid of Whitechurch for \$77,000. Hip 3567 was consigned by Kitty Taylor's Warrendale Sales, agent for Highland Oaks Farm, and is out of the stakes-placed Miss Pine Top Az (Wolf Power {SAf}). She is a halfsister to Lovington (Afleet), the dam of MSW & GSP Savorthetime (Gilded Time), GSP Tizbig (Tiznow) and MSP Indy Mood For Luv (A.P. Indy). The 11th session of the November sale gets underway this morning at 10 a.m. The sale continues daily through Nov. 17.







ON CALL FOR THE CARDINAL

Canadian raiders have left their mark in races south of the border with increasing frequency over the past handful of years, and Callwood Dancer (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) looks to continue the trend this weekend in the GIII Cardinal H., the year's final graded event for turf distaffers on this circuit. Horses such as Jambalaya (GI Arlington Million, GIII Saranac S.) and Marlang (GIII Saranac S.) have successfully plundered U.S. stakes events, while Sky Conqueror did some of his best work beneath the Twin Spires, overcoming a rocky start to annex the 2007 GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic in the final jump. Callwood Dancer has been campaigned to this point in her career by Manitobabased Richard Bonnycastle's Harlequin Ranches, but a half-interest in the filly was acquired by Three Chimneys Racing off her runner-up effort in the GI E.P. Taylor S. Oct. 4. She will race in their green and gold silks Saturday afternoon. "She is a high-class race filly and seems to have improved throughout her four-year-old year," said Lincoln Collins, an advisor to Three Chimneys who assisted in the purchase. "She is a really nice filly with a good pedigree and we look forward to racing her next year as well." Callwood Dancer will remain under the care of trainer Roger Attfield and is expected to winter in South Florida, with an eye on a five-yearold campaign.

DUKE OF MARMALADE STUD FEE SET Five-time Group 1 winner Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill--Love Me True, by Kingmambo) will stand his first season at stud next year for a fee of €40,000, Coolmore announced yesterday. The four-year-old won this season's G1 Prix Ganay, G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S., G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and G1 International S. and retired with earnings over \$2.7 million. Stud fees for Coolmore stalwarts Danehill Dancer (Ire) (Danehill--Mira Adonde, by Sharpen Up {GB}), Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Urban Sea, by Miswaki) and Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Floripedes (Fr), by Top Ville (Ire)) are listed as private, while many of the Irish stud's stallions have had their fees reduced for 2009. Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill--Lagrion, by Diesis {GB}) will stand for €35,000 in 2009, down from €50,000 in his initial season this year. Footstepsinthesand (GB) (Giant's Causeway--Glatisant {GB}, by Rainbow Quest) will stand for €12,500 after standing for €20,000 in 2008 and Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill--Offshore Boom {Ire}, by Be My Guest)'s fee has been reduced from €35,000 to €27,500.

"In light of the current economic climate, we have significantly reduced the fees of our stallions across the board," commented Coolmore Manager Christy Grassick. "Coolmore has always endeavoured to stand the best horses and to offer breeders the best deals in the business."

WRITERS UP

A DAY AT THE RACES--C'MON DOWN UNDER By Earle I. Mack

Mark Twain said it best when he attended the Melbourne Cup Carnival in 1895. "Nowhere in the world have I encountered a festival of people that has such a magnificent appeal to the whole nation. The Cup astonishes me."

I was privileged to participate in "the race that stops the nation." My horse, Mad Rush (Lemon Drop Kid), was installed the 5-1 favorite, thanks largely to a stellar performance in the traditional lead-up race, the G1 Caulfield Cup, just three weeks prior.

Upon my arrival into Melbourne, following our Breeders' Cup on the 24th and 25th of October, I was greeted with a warm reception from the "Aussies." They are one of the nations in the world that that truly love Americans.

The racing in Melbourne, (a city of close to 3.5 million people), is special, and when the Melbourne Cup and its four-day carnival is staged, it's something which you have to see to believe. The Cup has certainly come of age, and, according to champion Irish Trainer Aidan O'Brien, "It's not the greatest race in the world without a reason--you don't win it that easily."

The attendance for the Melbourne Cup, which is run on the first Tuesday in November, was a staggering 107,000, plus another 12,500 staff. Over the four days of the carnival, more than 400,000 people walked through the turnstiles. To put that into perspective, the Breeders' Cup attendance was 82,000 over two days. The Cup's on-track attendance translates to more than two percent of the Australian population. In our country, that would be more than 6 million people on track.

The noise from the crowd was on the threshold of deafening; the nation held its breath as 21 of the world's best thoroughbreds thundered around this famous and hallowed turf for the most grueling two miles in racing. Cont. p6

The Melbourne Cup, which Australia has declared a public holiday, allows its 20 million-plus population to attend and capture the excitement of this amazing day. Case in point; I needed a prescription filled and every pharmacy in the citywas closed--thus we had to drive 25 miles to find one open. My friend Laurie Hunter came from America and needed an important document notarized... alas, there wasn't one to be found.

Melbourne Cup day itself is truly beautiful--run in the spring, which produces incredible weather and the prettiest roses in full bloom. Parts of the track could be mistaken for a Botanical Garden, with as many species of spring flowers you are ever likely to see.

The enthusiasm for racing in Melbourne and in all of Australia was unbelievable and, at the track, even more so. Flemington Race Track is very user-friendly, with lush green lawns, abundant flowers, four giant screens in the infield, ample seating and smartly dressed young people everywhere. The day lends itself to tremendous fashion, with the most beautiful collection of hats and women you are ever likely to see at any race day around the world, including our Kentucky Derby Day.

The lead-up to Melbourne Cup week is full of fabulous events, pageantry and lends itself to great hype.

The Cup parade is an event not to be missed on the Monday before, showcasing former greats of the race, including trainers, jockeys, horses and owners. I rode in the car at the top of the parade as the owner of the favorite, alongside Mad Rush's trainer Luca Cumani and his jockey Damien Oliver. To be able to witness these events first-hand was truly remarkable; it felt like riding in the lead car in a ticker-tape parade down Broadway. The parade is so popular that Melbourne city centre was closed as the parade wound its way through the streets in a country gripped with Cup fever!

The Aussie folk are known for two things--their love of a beer and their love of a wager--which is most evident on Cup day. On the way to the track, the TAB's (OTB) are overflowing with people having a wager. Again, to put this into perspective, more than \$A140 million was wagered by the population on the 10-race card, as compared to our \$164 million, wagered on our 12-race 2008 Derby card. What about the recession?

Luca Cumani is a brilliant horse strategist and is surrounded by a great support team with wife Sara and daughter Francesca . He placed Mad Rush to perfection and literally came within a hair of stealing the Cup from the Aussies with Mad Rush's stablemate, Bauer, a 20-1 outsider. Luca now has the dubious honor of finishing second two years in a row.

I was fortunate to have arguably Australia's best jockey, Damien Oliver, who has a record second to none in this great race. Despite Damien's best efforts, Mad Rush, well-supported as the favorite in the betting market at odds of 5-1, finished a creditable seventh, only five lengths from the winner. Cont. p7

Many experts say the Melbourne Cup, with its A\$5.56 million purse, is the toughest race to win in the world, and, after seeing it in person, I would concur with this theory. The track itself was well-watered, but fast and firm, and is sure to favor our own turf horses, but gives every horse an opportunity to win.

For the record, Viewed won the Melbourne Cup for Australia's legendary trainer Bart Cummings, who now has the won the race an unreal 12 times. He turned 81 last Friday. Bart Cummings is an Australian racing icon, so much so that the Flemington racecourse erected a bronze statue of this truly great man, who has lived and breathed this great sport.

Australia's greatest ever racehorse Phar Lap, who most Americans would know for his ill-fated trip to our country, won this prestigious race in 1930. Phar Lap means to Aussies what Seabiscuit and Secretariat mean to Americans.

So why not come Down Under and celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Cup in 2010? The purse is expected to be raised to A\$10 million, which will make it the richest handicap in the entire world. Surely, this is enough to entice the best horses, jockeys, trainers and owners.

The following advice is for anyone daring enough to participate in the Cup.

- --You don't necessarily need a two-mile horse, but one that can run 1 1/2 miles and rate well with a good turn of foot.
- --Don't think you're going to steal this race. There is no such thing as stealing the Cup.
- --Highweights don't often win, so identify an underexposed horse on his way up, about to reach peak form and you can take advantage of the handicap weight scale.
 - --Your horse must be able to handle a firm track.
- --Be on the grounds at least five weeks before the Cup in order to acclimatize and adapt.
- --A prep race wjould be desirable, either in the Grade 3 Geelong Cup or the A\$2.5 million Grade 1 Caulfield Cup, which has been a good recipe for Melbourne Cup winners in the past.

I highly recommend going Down Under for anyone who loves horse racing or just loves a festival experience.

This Carnival has captured me and it's by far the most exciting and memorable experience of my 45 years in racing--one which I will never forget.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

SAVE ON YOUR TAXES THIS YEAR THROUGH ECONOMIC STIMULUS ACT BENEFITS

Time is winding down for members of the equine industry to benefit from revisions to the Federal tax code via this year's Economic Stimulus Act. See below for details.

Economic Stimulus Act

The Economic Stimulus Act includes two tax incentives that would allow a much bigger write-off for horses and other property <u>purchased and placed in service during 2008</u>. Specifically, it allows these benefits:

- Increase in expensing allowance for horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property to \$250,000 from \$128,000 (expense allowance reverts to \$128,000 plus inflation adjustment in 2009)
- 50% bonus first-year depreciation returns for property placed in service in 2008

For details on what property qualifies under the Economic Stimulus Act, read "New Legislation Benefits Equine Industry," produced for NTRA tax seminars held earlier this year. You also may read about the new, accelerated three-year depreciation schedule for young racehorses that is effective January 1, 2009 as a result of the Farm Bill.

Officials from the Maryland Department of Agriculture have decided to place an "Investigational Animal Hold Order" on Barn 1 on the Laurel backstretch after a horse stabled there was found to be displaying neurologic signs. "We are monitoring the situation and taking the proper precautions," said Maryland Jockey Club president and chief operating officer Tom Chuckas. "We felt it was best to be proactive in communicating what we know." The order restricts the movement of horses in Barn 1. None of the others stabled there have exhibited any symptoms. The results of blood samples and nasal swabs removed from the affected horse are expected by this afternoon.

Mena to Winter in Big Easy:

Jockey Miguel Mena, who is slowly emerging as a top rider on the Kentucky racing circuit, will shift his tack to the Fair Grounds upon completion of the Churchill Downs meeting Nov. 29. The 22-year-old Peruvian reportedly considered a move to Southern California, but has reevaluated and will take up residence in New Orleans. "Miguel decided we're in good with just too many top outfits to pick up and leave," Mena's agent Steve Elzey told *Daily Racing Form*. "We're headed to the Fair Grounds after Churchill ends." Mena currently sits in a tie for fifth place among the leading riders in Louisville with nine wins through Tuesday's racing.

CDI, LAHBPA Reach ADW Agreement:

Officials at Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI) and the Louisiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (LAHBPA) have come to an agreement which will allow the distribution of the live racing signal from the Fair Grounds to most advance deposit wagering (ADW) platforms. The 2008-2009 meet in New Orleans begins tomorrow. "We are pleased to come to terms with our Louisiana horsemen on an agreement that will allow the Fair Grounds signal to be shared with national ADW outlets," said Austin Miller, president of Fair Grounds. "We are delighted to have Fair Grounds racing available on TwinSpires.com and other online wagering platforms, and we hope our customers enjoy wagering on this excellent product." Kevin Flanery, the senior vice president of CDI, said that the Fair Grounds signal was offered to Television Games Network (TVG), but that they declined to accept the signal "under the terms negotiated and approved by Louisiana horsemen," according to a release. TVG once held the broadcast rights to the track before their contract expired last year.

Sand Ridge Dies:

Sand Ridge (Known Fact--Skybox, by Spend a Buck), who was represented by his first crop of two-year-olds this season, suffered a fractured cannon bone while being led to his stall Oct. 27. After X-rays revealed that the injury was inoperable, the decision was made to euthanize the 13-year-old stallion. Sand Ridge was campaigned by Bill Peters' Thunderhead Farm and was trained by Don Von Hemel to five stakes victories and \$708,069.



NADER OPTIMISTIC ABOUT FUTURE William

Nader, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing, is optimistic that racing will move forward

and grow stronger in the wake of last year's Equine Influenza outbreak, he told a group of delegates at the Asian Racing Conference in Tokyo yesterday. While admitting that quarantine protocals put in place after the EI outbreak of 2007 still made movement of horses difficult, particularly in Japan and Australia, Nader cited two major initiatives that would help racing move forward. He pointed to the success of the Global Spring Challenge and the Asian Mile

Challenge. "The first two winners of the Global Sprint Challenge, Hong Kong's Cape of Good Hope (GB) and Australia's Takeover Target (Aus), have contributed enormously to the profile of the sport," Nader said. "And of course, the previous year, we had Australia's super sprinting filly Miss Andretti (Aus) travelling to Ascot and winning the G1 King's Stand S." Bonuses for both challenge events have been increased for 2009. The Global Sprint Challenge will offer a bonus of \$1 million, while the Asian Mile Challenge will offer a bonus of \$2 million. "Obviously we want to motivate the decision makers to go for the sky and reach for the stars," Nader added.
