WAR CHANT in '08 10 SHs in the U.S. and Abroad

KEENELAND NOVEMBER MARCHES ON

A filly from the first crop of graded stakes winner Congrats (A.P. Indy) was the top weanling at yesterday's 11th session of the Keeneland November Sale, bringing a final bid of \$70,000. The bay (hip 4013), bred by Cloverleaf Farms in Kentucky, is out of Saramy



(Personal Hope); she is a half-sister to Babaganush (Capture the Gold) and stakes-placed Springs Road (Repent). She was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CXXXIV, and was purchased by Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock. Also bringing \$70,000 was **Seedling** (Forestry--Viva, by Pulpit), an unraced three-year-old filly in foal to War Front. The bay (hip 4020) was consigned

by Claiborne Farm, agent, and was purchased by Carlos S.E. Moore, agent. She is from the family of Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero, as well as graded stakes winners Wild Applause, Hero's Honor and Roar. Quick Command (Gold Legend--Jet Route, by Alydar), a fiveyear-old mare in foal to Bernstein, sold for \$100,000 on the bid of E-Stable. The mare (hip 3995) was consigned by Belvedere Farm, Agent I. E-Stable purchased Quick Command, in foal to Touch Gold, for \$15,000 from last year's Fasig-Tipton November Adena Sale. For the session, 230 head sold for \$2,993,700. The session average fell 27.1 percent to \$13,016 and the median fell 28.6 percent to \$10,000. Of the 395 catalogued for the session, 103 were withdrawn and, of the 292 offered, 62 failed to sell for a buy-back rate of 21.2 percent. Through 11 sessions, the average, \$80,246, is down 35.7 percent from a year ago, and the median is down 38 percent to \$31,000. The buy-back rate is 29.6 percent. The sale, which runs through Monday, continues this morning at 10 a.m.

JACKSON MAKES BID FOR CURLIN SHARE

Majority owner Jess Jackson has submitted a bid to to buy out the remaining 20-percent share in 2007 Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike), Jackson spokesman Kevin McGee confirmed last night. Jackson owns 80 percent of the four-year-old, while the Midnight Cry Stable of disbarred attorneys Shirley Cunningham Jr and William Gallion retains a 20-percent interest. Jackson's bid comes after a sealed-bid process conducted by a court-appointed receiver failed to result in a sale of the minority interest. Jackson's bid needs court approval and a hearing will be held Monday, with a second hearing scheduled for Dec. 1.

He spent 18 years at Harrah's Entertainment, where his titles included Gulf Coast region president, senior vice president and general manager of Harrah's Cherokee Casino Hotel, the Showboat Casino Hotel and Harrah's Joliet casino. "Churchill Downs Incorporated is among the gaming industry's most elite and respected names, and I am excited to bring my expertise to the company during this time of expansion and growth," O'Donnell said. "Calder is about to embark on an exciting new chapter in its history as planning continues for its future slot facility. I look forward to working with the outstanding employees at Calder Race Course and the management team of CDI as we continue to build on the excellent foundation already laid for the success of racing and gaming in Miami."

SHUG McGaughey (Carriage Trail):

I like Giant's Causeway. I have had three in my barn, and Carriage Trail is the best one. I think they are smart, but aggressive. I don't think they like to be messed with a whole lot. You sort of have to let them do what they want to do. The ones I have had have been

fairly precocious. They are eager with what they want to do.....

DALE ROMANS (Swift Temper):

I have nothing but good things to say about Giant's Causeway.
Including one that I have who is just now coming around, I have had three in my barn. The first two were both rugged, solid horses. They were good-minded horses and none had airway problems...



Neil Drysdale (Aragorn, Model):

The ones I have had, I liked a lot. Aragorn was the complete racehorse. He was a good-looking, well-balanced horse, but he didn't like soft ground. That cost him the Breeders' Cup (2006 NetJets Mile, gr. IT, in which he finished second). Aragorn was a late-develop-

ing horse, but in Giant's Causeway's first year as a stallion, he had the two best 2-year-olds in Europe. The Giant's Causeways also seem to do very well on the synthetics. They are like he was; they are sound horses. They can run early or can run late. They can run on dirt, on turf, or on synthetics.

Naissance Royale was a very genuine and game filly and very sound. She retired sound and could have gone on another year. I have not had that many, but I am a big fan of the sire. All of mine were perfectly manageable. They were all ready to

run in the fall, but not in June. In my program, which is probably slower than most trainers, they responded very well. They were either average size or taller than average size. I would love to have more in my barn.

John Shirreffs (Imagine):

I like them (Giant's Causeway foals) a lot... They are two-turn-type horses. They act like they have class along with their talent. He's kind of like Unbridled (as a sire). He can get you one that's good, and he can get you one that will take you to special places. They are "typey" Thoroughbreds.

BRERETON JONES NAMED KTO HORSEMAN

OF THE YEAR Airdrie Stud owner Brereton Jones has been named the recipient of the 2008 Warner L Jones Jr Horseman of the Year Award, presented annually by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners, Inc. Jones will receive the award Nov. 15 during the KTO's 20th annual awards dinner at the Kentucky Derby museum. Since 1989, the KTO has presented the award to a member of the racing industry who displays the spirit and passion for the sport exhibited by the late Warner Jones, Jr. Brereton Jones, governor of Kentucky from 1991-1995, and his wife Libby established Airdrie Stud in 1972. He is a founding member and chairman of the Kentucky Equine Education Project.

TED SIEGEL PASSES AWAY Longtime horseman Ted Siegel, 66, died Monday in Greenwich, Connecticut. Siegel served as farm manager at Farnsworth Farms. He also served as trainer for Tartan Farm and Mare Haven Farm. "He was an extremely nice fellow and a good horseman," said J. Michael O'Farrell of Ocala Stud Farm. "He was a quality person and I always thought a lot of him. He is gone too soon and will be missed." While manager of Peter Brant's White Birch Farm, Siegel worked with subsequent champion Gulch. "He was the kind of person you could look in the eye and know you were getting the truth," said Michael Hernon of Gainesway Farm. Siegel is survived by his wife Wendy; sons, Jon Siegel of PM Advertising and Ted Siegel, as well as four grandchildren. 

Laurel Horse Positive for Equine Herpesvirus:

A two-year-old filly in the Laurel Park barn of trainer King Leatherbury has tested positive for equine herpesvirus. A hold order has been placed on Barn 1 at the track, which means no horses in the barn will be permitted to train or race pending further testing. Equine herpesvirus causes upper respiratory infection and can lead to neurological disease. Four horses died at Pimlico and Laurel during a 2006 outbreak. "Today's news is disappointing, but we have already put the proper precautions into place to control the situation," said Maryland Jockey Club racing secretary Georganne Hale. "We learned a great deal from 2006 and now know to shut things down immediately if there is a possible case so as to reduce the possibility of it spreading. The one advantage of having this happen in Barn 1 is that is already isolated from much of the backside."

Mixed Results as Suffolk Downs Closes:

Suffolk Downs wrapped up its 2008 racing season with declines in live wagering and attendance, but with an increase in all-sources handle. On-track handle for the 102-day live meet was down seven percent from last year, as was attendance. All-sources handle was up 11 percent on the strength of 13-percent growth in transmitted handle. "We averaged almost one horse more per race this year, and that, combined with increased coverage from TVG, helped bettors around the country find the Suffolk Downs simulcast signal," said Chip Tuttle, chief operating officer of Suffolk Downs. "Even with those gains, declines in attendance, live handle, and our overall handle on-site, and the deteriorating economy, make business conditions very difficult for facilities like ours that do not have the competitive advantage of expanded gaming." In 2007, Suffolk Downs bucked national trends with increases in live handle (14 percent) and attendance (22 percent). Winston Thompson bounced back from an injuryshortened 2007 campaign to capture his fourth Suffolk riding title in five years and his fifth overall at the East Boston oval. Thompson was the lone rider to top the century mark for the meet, recording 101 wins from 647 mounts (16 percent). John Rigattieri continued his reign atop the trainer standings, earning his fifth consecutive title. Rigattieri saddled 66 winners from 295 starters (22 percent).


