CURLIN'S RACING CAREER OVER

Reigning Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike--Sherriff's Deputy, by Deputy Minister) will not race in

2009, according to a report in Sunday's New York Times. Stonestreet Stable's Jess Jackson told the Times he was open to the idea of running Curlin again this year, but said that there weren't any races left in North America rich enough to attract his horse. He also ruled out a start in the Japan Cup Dirt Dec. 7 because of problems with quarantine regulations.

Jackson told the newspaper that he felt the big chestnut had little left to prove on the racetrack.

"I've been blessed to have him and to have seen him run over 20 some odd months," Jackson said. "I have such warm memories of him. I just don't see how it could get any better."

Stud plans for next year have not been finalized, although one option is for the G1 Dubai World Cup hero to stand at Jackson's Stonestreet Farms in Lexington, Kentucky. Jackson told the *Times* that several major breeding farms in Kentucky have been in touch with him to express their interest in acquiring Curlin as a stallion.

"I'm going to breed 20 or so of my very best mares to him, no matter where he stands," Jackson said. "And we have some beauties. I really am eager to see his colts and fillies race and see what he produces."

Curlin, who became the first North American-based horse to surpass the \$10-million barrier when successfully defending his title in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Sept. 27, sustained two losses this year, finishing second on turf in the GI Man o'War S. in July and fourth on Pro-Ride in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Oct. 25. Jackson told the *Times* that had Curlin won the Man o'War, he might have raced him next year in rich grass events around the world.

"The turf was the area I wanted to expand on because, internationally, there is a great prominence for horses that compete on the turf," Jackson said. "My other personal goal has been to contribute to the breed. Balancing those things and the fact he could always get hurt, it led me to believe he had no future just running on the dirt. To race merely on dirt for inadequate compensation and to deny his genes to the gene pool of Thoroughbreds, that's not something I wanted to do." Curlin cont. p2

SUNLINE SERIOUSLY ILL IN NEW ZEALAND

Champion mare **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun $\{GB\}$)--Songline $\{NZ\}$, by Western Symphony), a 13-time

Group 1 winner in Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong, is reportedly seriously ill with laminitis resulting from complications after surgery for colic in July. Owners, including retired trainer Trevor McKee, will decide in coming days whether to euthanize the 13-year-old mare. McKee's son, trainer Steve McKee, told New Zealand Press Association, "She's got laminitis, which stems from the toxins of the colic working through her body and into her feet. She hasn't been in a good way at all. We had a guy go over from Sydney to operate on

her and cut the tendons in the legs, which changes the angle of the feet. We hope that will help her recover, but it's still too early to say." Among 27 stakes wins, Sunline notched 13 Group 1 victories and placed a further seven times at the highest level, including back-to-back wins in the G1 Cox Plate in 1999 and 2000, and was victorious in Group 1 company each year from 1998 to 2002. Jackson currently owns an 80-percent share in Curlin. The other 20 percent is owned by Midnight Cry Stable, an ownership group consisting of two lawyers

currently in jail for allegedly defrauding their clients. Jackson is attempting to buy out the lawyers, but declined to comment to the *Times* on those negotiations.

Tabbed as a ♥ "TDN Rising Star" ♥ following his sensational debut on Feb. 3, 2007 at Gulfstream, Curlin went on to capture 10 of his next 15 starts. Included in his trophy case are the aforementioned pair of

Jockey Club Gold Cups, the Dubai World Cup and Breeders' Cup Classic, as well as the GI Preakness S., GI Woodward S., GI Stephen Foster H., GII Arkansas Derby and GIII Rebel S. His record stands at 16-11-2-2 with earnings of \$10,501,800.

"He's had a stellar racing career," Jackson continued. "I think he's one of the top 10 horses since 1900. How he rates versus others, it's not merely about statistics."

everyone's attention following his debut, and a deal worth a reported \$3.5 million was quickly struck for an 80-percent share of the colt. He was turned over to trainer Steve Asmussen after getting his start for Helen Pitts. The group buying the majority interest was a partnership consisting of Stonestreet, Padua Stables and George Bolton, and Curlin carried all four sets of colors to victory during his championship campaign. Padua's interest was acquired for an undis-

closed sum in November following the Breeders' Cup, and Jackson bought out Bolton in December to hold the 80-percent interest.

After winning the 2007 GIII Memorial Day H. at Calder for trainer Harry Benson, Dry Martini made two starts for Barclay Tagg, capturing the GII Prairie Meadows Cornhusker H. at the end of June before finishing fifth in Lawyer Ron's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga the following month. The grey didn't face the starter again for 13 months, coming in fifth for conditioner Ronald Spatz in a Calder allowance Aug. 3. Turned over to Billy Turner, the Florida-bred ran fourth in the Devil Diver H. at Belmont Sept. 7, then was second to Formal Decree (Ger) on the turf in the Strawberry Burrah H. Oct. 2, and most recently ran fifth to that rival in the GIII Knickerbocker H. on the Belmont sod Oct. 25. The five-year-old was adding blinkers this time, but was content to lope along at the back of the pack as Temporary Saint showed the way through splits of :24.16 and :47.43. Shaken--not stirred--up heading into the far turn, Dry Martini came rolling with a four-wide move, hit the front in midstretch and splashed home to collect his third graded stakes success. Six weeks after her title defense in the Cox Plate, Sunline ventured outside Australasia to post a sensa-

tional victory over Fairy King Prawn (Aus) in the G1 Hong Kong Mile (video). The mighty mare retired after finishing fourth to Northerly (Aus) in the 2002 Cox Plate with a record of 48-32-9-3, picking up a check every time she faced the starter for a bankroll of A\$11,351,607. Sunline is the dam of four foals to date, including a Hussonet filly foaled at Waikato Stud last November. Her first foal, Sunstrike

(NZ) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), was retained by her owners Thayne Green and Steve and Trevor McKee. The four-year-old is currently winless in five starts. Sunline's second foal, a colt by Zabeel (NZ) named Sun Ruler (NZ), fetched NZ\$2 million to the bid of Don Ha at NZB Premier Sale in 2007, but has yet to race. Sunline also has an unnamed filly by Rock of Gibraltar foaled in 2006.

Indescribable graduated from the maiden ranks in her fourth start last September on Presque Isle's Tapeta, but promptly rattled off three straight wins, including an 8 1/2-length score on the Keeneland Polytrack the following month and an allowance on the turf at Hollywood in December. Switched to the main track thereafter by previous trainer Graham Motion, the chestnut ran fifth to Zenyatta in the GII El Encino S. at Santa Anita Jan. 13 and third to Carriage Trail in the

GIII Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland Apr. 18. The four-year-old went out a winner for Motion in the GIII Arlington Matron H. May 26 before following the rest of owner Don Adams's string to trainer Bill Mott's shedrow. Sixth in the GIII Chicago Breeders' Cup H. June 28, she came back to be third to Ginger

Punch in the GI Go for Wand H. July 26 at Saratoga, but was given some time off following a distant fourth to that champion in the GI Personal Ensign H. Aug. 22 at the same track. Catching a yielding course for her return to the turf, Indescribable was off slowly and raced in the penultimate spot through the opening six furlongs run in 1:17.97. The homebred was still out of the picture as they straightened into the lane, but came running up the center of the course and got up in time to prevail in a tight finish. "That was fun!" said winning rider Kent Desormeaux. "At the 3/16-pole, I thought I had no chance. But, as they say in Europe, 'when she presented herself' and got clear, she really leveled out and took off. She did not have any trouble with the ground at all. 

Ridden by an inspired Adrian Gianetti, he got the best of favored City Banker in the stretch to pull clear late under left-handed urging for a convincing win. Frankie Dettori finished 11th aboard Balcarce Nov (Arg) (Romanov {Ire}).

Tecla Shiner's victory in the Derby capped off a Clas-

sic double for his sire, a a Grade III-winning son of A.P. Indy--Navarra (El Gran Senor) who stands at Hernan Ceriani's famed Haras La Quebrada. The chestnut became the third Group 1 winner from his sire's 2005 Argentine crop, which also includes Guineas hero and inaugural Coronacion winner Mi

Miss Match crowned herself as Argentina's top three-year-old filly on dirt by defeating Guineas heroine Savoir Bien in this epic renewal of the Argentine Oaks. The bay daughter of Indygo Shiner survived a jockey's claim of foul before being declared the winner, while favored Cagnotte finished third with Frankie Dettori in the irons. With this victory, Miss Match clinched the first edition of the lucrative Coronacion Championship, earning her connections an additional P170,000 for accumulating the most points in the inaugural championship for sophomore fillies. 

Team USA Beats Team World in Rider Cup:

The riders of Team USA nosed out Team World 10 points to 9 1/2 in yesterday's inaugural "Rider Cup" for charity at Churchill Downs. The five-race series, which awarded points to team members for their placings in each race, came down to the final event, the eighth on the card. While Team USA had an 8 to 6 1/2 point advantage, Team World--consisting of jockeys born outside the U.S., had Ramon Dominguez aboard 4-5 favorite Game Face in the eighth race. Dominguez notched three points for the win aboard the chestnut filly (see above), but Calvin Borel, riding Miss Isella, needed just two points for second to secure the victory for Team USA. Game Face edged Miss Isella by head, but Team USA prevailed in the Cup standings. "I knew I had to run second to get it for the team," Borel said. "Heck, she ran so good I almost won. She ran a heck of a race. I knew we had to run second if [Game Face] won to hang on. We did it and got lucky. It was a lot of fun." Fellow Team USA rider Robby Albarado added, "Those guys actually thought they were going to beat us. We had a lot of fun; we should do this again." One rider for each race was selected to represent the team by their celebrity team captains. Hall of Fame jockey Pat Day represented Team USA, and Hall of Fame rider Angel Cordero Jr. captained Team World. No jockey could be chosen more than twice in the series. Points were awarded on a 3-2-1 scale for first-, second- and third-place finishes in each race. If neither jockey hit the board, the rider with the best finish was awarded a half-point. Team USA was crowned the winner, and a \$10,000 donation will be made to the charities of the team's choice. The charities of the Team World will receive a \$5,000 donation.
