KEENELAND NOVEMBER CONCLUDES

The Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale concluded its 15-day run yesterday in Lexington with figures down dramatically from a year ago. In total, Keeneland sold 3,019 horses for an aggregate of \$185,552,300. The 15-day average of \$61,462 fell 39 percent from 2007, while the median was down 42.9 percent to \$20,000. "Given the current economic factors in the world, I thought it was a very solid sale," commented Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I think, going into the sale, people in the industry realized that there was going to be a correction this year." Russell admitted the Wall Street crash in mid-September had a major impact on the November sale. "What happened in September changed a lot of things," he said. "I think that had more effect on this sale than anything else--lack of consumer confidence, lack of liquidity in the world and a strong U.S. dollar. Europe, America and now Japan are in recessions; I don't think we've ever had that before. All those factors came together, which we don't have any control over. We all knew a correction was going to take place. What we didn't know was the effect the Wall Street crash was going to have on us. Looking at the art auctions this week, all of these commodities bought with discretionary dollars are suffering greatly." All things considered, Russell said he was satisfied with the November results. "Given all that, we still had a very successful horse sale," he added. "There was great trading. We had great representation again from across the globe and across the country. Yes, we had less participation from the European sector and Australia, but all our international markets stepped up to the plate yet again." Cont. p2

CURLIN VALUED AT \$20 MILLION

The value of Reigning Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike--Sherriff's Deputy, by Deputy Minister) was set at \$20 million, according to testimony at a Frankfurt court hearing held yesterday. Bloodstock advisor Ric Waldman used that assessment while testifying as an expert witness for the group of claimants who won a settlement against the principals of Midnight Cry Stables, owners of a 20-percent interest in the stallion. According to published reports, Waldman projected that Curlin could stand his initial season at stud for \$75,000. Majority owner Jess Jackson has bid a reported \$4 million for the 20-percent interest owned by enbattled attorneys Shirley Cunningham, Jr. and William Gallion. Another hearing will be held Dec. 1, at which objections to Jackson's offer will be heard. Attorneys for Cunningham and Gallion plan to contest Waldman's appraisal.

ZARKAVA CROWNED AT CARTIER AWARDS

His Highness the Aga Khan's **Zarkava (Ire)** (Zamindar) was yesterday honored at the 2008 Cartier Awards with the coveted Horse of the Year title. During the evening ceremony staged at London's Grosvenor House

Hotel, the unbeaten homebred star of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, G1 Prix de Diane, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe received the ultimate accolade ahead of Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and

Seven Figure Lots Down at Keeneland

During the November sale's 15-day run, 19 horses sold for \$1 million or more, down from 39 in 2007. Leading the way was Hystericalady (Distorted Humor), who sold for \$3 million to the bid of John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum. Ferguson was also responsible for the sale's second highest-priced lot, purchasing Away (Dixieland Band) for \$2.5 million, as well as the fourth highest lot in Shadow Cast (Smart Strike), bought for \$2.3 million. Ferguson was the sale's leading buyer, purchasing seven horses for \$9,010,000. Taylor Made topped the consignor list for the seventh consecutive November auction, selling 322 horses for \$31,894,400. At the end of the sale, Russell did find cause for optimism. "There are several positives to take away," he said. "The market continued to receive support, though at a different level. Quality individuals sold well and were difficult to buy. And there was a strong participation from a diverse group of domestic and international buyers. Keeneland has worked very hard to develop a global network of horsemen, which we continue to expand. We've established long-term sustainable relationships with these buyers, and they were a major influence from the first day of this sale until the very last. Without their support, the declines would have been much worse."

Bernstein Colt Tops Keeneland Finale

A weanling by Bernstein topped yesterday's final session of the Keeneland November sale, with a bid of \$55,000. The colt is out of Life Happened (Stravinsky), an unraced half sister to multiple graded stakes winner Disco Rico (Citidancer). The bay, bred by Stuart McPhee, was consigned by Jim and Pam Robinson's Brandywine Farm LLC, Agent III, and was purchased by F.J.M. Stables. Life Happened, with this foal in utero, sold to McPhee for \$30,000 at last year's November sale. For the session, 150 horses sold for \$663,900. The average fell 25.1 percent to \$4,426 and the median was down 45.9 percent to \$2,000.

There was more bad news for the bloodstock industry yesterday when the first session of the Goffs November Sale witnessed a poor 25-percent clearance rate and a fall of nearly 30 percent in average. Of the 48 foals to sell on the day, a son of Modigliani, consigned as hip 134, was the main draw when selling to Bobby O'Ryan for €35,000. From Gary Swift Sales, the February-foaled colt is out of the listed-placed Yulara (Ire) (Night Shift) from the family of the top-class stayer Vintage Crop (GB). Darley's Kheleyf was responsible for the next best when a March-foaled colt was knocked down to Meadowlands Bloodstock Services for €34,000. Hip 191, from the draft of Clonbonny Stud, hails from the extended family of Pleasant Tap and Go for Gin. Of the fillies, hip 79 provided the focus and the February-foaled daughter of Alhaarth (Ire) sold to Glenvale Stud for €30,000. Consigned by Brooklyn Stud, she is a half to the talented juvenile Nubar Lady (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), who was listed placed and finished sixth in the latest renewal of the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot. Eyeofthetiger established himself as Argentina's leading candidate for the G1 Carlos Pellegrini with a hardearned victory in the Pellegrini springboard Gran Premio Copa de Oro-Copa Alfredo Lalor on Sunday at San Isidro. Ridden by Peruvian Edwin Talaverano, Eyeofthetiger collared pacemaker and outsider Royal Jabar in the final jumps to tally his first victory on turf and third graded stakes win of the year. Latency, the Pellegrini winner last year and Argentina's 2007 Horse of the Year, was third and one length clear of defending winner Life of Victory (Arg) (Incurable Optimist). The Ricardo Reighert trainee exited a runner-up effort to Body Soguero (Arg) (Body Glove {Arg}) in the G2 Clasico Comparacion at Palermo Oct. 19. Winner at three of the G1 Gran Premio Nacional (Argentine Derby) and G1 Gran Premio Republica Argentina, both over the dirt at Palermo, Eyeofthetiger's sights are now set on South America's most prestigous race, the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini Dec. 13 at San Isidro.

The 2009 Derby may still be more than six months away, but the early betting for the Epsom classic suggests that there is a good chance that the Sadler's Wells male line will add to its total of five victories in the last eight years. The colts currently quoted in the betting include several sons of Sadler's Wells himself, plus a sizeable number by his sons, led by Galileo and Montjeu.

Montjeu, of course, has already supplied the winner on two occasions, thanks to Motivator and Authorized, even though he currently has only four crops aged three or over. Those four crops by the 1999 French and Irish Derby winner have also produced two winners of the Irish Derby, in Hurricane Run and this year's winner Frozen Fire. Yet another son, Montmartre, was a sensational winner of this year's Grand Prix de Paris, a race with strong claims to being considered the French equivalent of the Derby, rather than the shortened Prix du Jockey-Club. Montjeu also sired Nom du Jeu, winner of this year's AJC Australian Derby, during the four years he shuttled to New Zealand, and you'll even find a Singapore Derby winner among his offspring.

This suggests there is every reason for respecting the classic aspirations of Montjeu's current crop of juveniles. Among them are Jukebox Jury (G2 Royal Lodge S. prior to finishing second to the current Derby favorite, Crowded House, in the G1 Racing Post Trophy), Vitruvian Man (runner-up in the G3 Killavullan S.) and the three Montieu colts which Aidan O'Brien sent to France last week for the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. These colts--Fame and Glory, Drumbeat and Hail Caesar--respectively finished first, second and sixth in a race in which the first eight were separated by less than four lengths. Although the closeness of the finish must inevitably cast some doubts on the quality of the form, Fame and Glory surely has a bright future. The Criterium was only the second start for this classically bred colt, who had been apprentice ridden when he defeated his shorter-priced stablemate Sirgarfieldsobers--a brother to Authorized--in a mile maiden race at Navan in October. The big question is how Fame and Glory will cope with much faster ground than the heavy going he has encountered on both appearances. Cont. p8

Fame and Glory thoroughly merits the description classically bred, as his dam, the group-placed Gryada, comes from a male line which exerted a strong influence on the Derby before the Sadler's Wells line came to the fore. Gryada's grandsire Mill Reef won the Derby and went on to sire two winners of the Derby, including Gryada's sire Shirley Heights. Shirley Heights, in turn, sired the runaway Derby winner Slip Anchor, while High Estate, another of his sons, provided the 1998 Derby winner High-Rise.

I hardly need add that combining Sadler's Wells with mares from the Mill Reef line has long been considered one of the surest ways of producing a classic middle-distance performer. Consequently Montjeu was guaranteed to receive numerous Mill Reef line mares and he currently has 22 foals of racing age out of daughters of Shirley Heights, plus 37 out of mares by Shirley Heights's son Darshaan.

The Shirley Heights cross has made a very encouraging start. Fame and Glory is its second Group 1 winner, following the fine French filly Montare (Prix Royal-Oak and second in the G1 Prix Vermeille), and it also produced the Group 2 winner Anton Chekhov, the Group 2-placed Washington Irving and the Group 3-placed Red Peony. Crossing Montjeu with Darshaan mares hasn't met with quite the same level of success, although the 37 foals include the Group 2 winner Honolulu, the Listed winners Lion Sands and Ayam Zaman and the group-placed Blue Bajan.

Gryada was owned by the Howard de Waldens' Plantation Stud, which enjoyed tremendous success when it sent a German mare to Shirley Heights to produce the Derby-winning Slip Anchor. Gryada's dam Grimpola was another acquisition from Germany, where she had finished third in the German Oaks and second in the 12-furlong Ludwig Goebels Erinnerungsrennen after winning the German 1,000 Guineas (in the days when it was called the Schwarzgold Rennen).

Seven of Grimpola's eight foals were by members of the Mill Reef male line, Gryada being one of her four foals by Shirley Heights. A mating to Slip Anchor produced Gryada's three-parts sister Gonfalon, who returned to Germany to produce the top filly Gonbarda and two other group winners in Gonfilia and Gonlargo. Grimpola's Darshaan filly Goonda has also done very well as a broodmare in Germany.

Lord Howard de Walden, the founder of Plantation Stud, died in 1999 and it was decided in 2005 to sell the stud and most of its broodmares. Consequently, Gryada was sent to Tattersalls' December Sales in foal to Montjeu. The mare sold for 160,000gns and duly produced Fame and Glory for the partnership of Ptarmigan Bloodstock and Kirsten Rausing. Gryada was mated to Sadler's Wells in 2006 before being re-sold for 180,000gns. The resultant colt was bought by Demi O'Byrne for 200,000gns in October.

Lord Howard de Walden's widow retained a young granddaughter of Gryada and this filly--a Galileo filly named Gravitation--scored a victory over Folk Opera at Group 3 level earlier this year.

Just about everything about Fame and Glory's background suggests he will be even more effective as a three-year-old in 2009. Next year will also see the two-year-olds from Montjeu's first high-priced crop, sired at a fee of €125,000 in 2006, following the exploits of his exceptional first-crop three-year-olds. Two colts from this crop sold for 650,000gns in October and it is a safe bet that Montjeu will again provide Aidan O'Brien with plenty of fire power next year.





This month's Listed Grand Prix du Nord winner Albahri (Fr) (Bahri) topped proceedings during yester-



day's Arqana Autumn Sale when selling for €140,000. Raced in the colors of His Highness the Aga Khan, the three-year-old gelding--who is a close relative of Sakhee-was consigned as hip 22 and was knocked down to Michel Zerolo's Oceanic Bloodstock.

Of the other flat horses in training to command interest was the Pascal Bary-trained three-year-old San Carlos (Fr) (Dr Fong), consigned as hip 71. Still seeking his first victory after making five starts, San Carlos was purchased by Abeth Mussat for €90,000. San Carlos, runner-up to the subsequent group scorer Russian Cross (Ire) in a conditions event at Chantilly in July, is from the family of Alexandrova (Ire) and Magical Romance (Ire). Later, Jiri Travnicek went to €80,000 to secure hip 102, the sophomore Safety Wire (Ire) (Anabaa) from trainer Elie Lellouche's consignment. The half-brother to last year's G1 Gran Premio di Milano winner Sudan (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) was successful in a maiden at Vichy in July and conditions race at Deauville the following month. Christos Theodorakis paid €72,000 for the John Hammond-trained four-year-old colt Bucintoro (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), consigned as hip 27. Runner-up in the Listed Prix Turenne at Saint-Cloud last September, his dam is a half to Ali-Royal (Ire), Taipan (Ire), Sleepytime (Ire) and Oonagh Maccool (Ire). At the end of selling, the average of €18,250 was down by a fraction on 2007 and the median dropped by only nine percent with the clearance rate at a healthy 70 percent. That was one of six placings at the highest level and in total, Maraahel scored in eight of his 34 starts and collected over £1.03 million in prize money. The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Angus Gold told the *Racing Post*, "Maraahel was a fantastic servant and is currently enjoying his retirement at Shadwell. Hopefully, we can find a stud job for him somewhere in the near future."

Having recruited most of their stock from Gestut Karlshof, Blankenese also enjoyed a third Derby success courtesy of Schiaparelli (Ger) in 2006. President of the Hamburg Race Club from 1988 to 2005, von Gaertner took the organization to new heights regarding its status and that of its premier Classic. Voted the honorary president of both the Hamburg Race Club and the German Jockey Club, the former lawyer will be remembered for his great commitment to domestic racing and straightforwardness.
