### AGA KHAN PAYS TRIBUTE TO ZARKAVA

On the night his unbeaten homebred filly **Zarkava** (**Ire**) (Zamindar) was named Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old filly at Monday's 2008 Cartier Racing

Awards in London's Grosvenor House Hotel, the Aga Khan elaborated on why Zarkava meant so much to him, explaining that the filly's


great granddam had been named after his daughter Princess Zahra, who also attended the Cartier Awards.

"I would like to thank Cartier for the prize that has been given to Zarkava and just share with you what she means to me," he said when accepting the champion three-year-old filly award. "When my father was killed, there was a filly in training called Petite Etoile. She was my first Classic contact with racing. She was trained here in England by Noel Murless and ridden by Lester Piggott. She only had one daughter at stud, by Habitat, and I love my daughter, so I called that filly by the name of my daughter, Zahra, and this family has continued to produce exceptional fillies through to this day. So Zarkava goes back to my grandfather's time, to my father's time, and the family carries the name of my daughter and so she is very special and I think very exceptional. Sometimes we are associated with fast ladies, and this is a case when I am very happy to be associated with a fast lady!"

After collecting the Horse of the Year Award, the Aga Khan added, "Thank you very much for the honour and I have to mention my daughter. She bred Mandesha (Fr) and she bred Darjina (Fr) and she will probably be putting her father back out to the field! I want to say that, as a traditional breeder, Zarkava is probably the greatest reward that any breeder could ever have. If you are in this industry and you like breeding and not only racing, this is the greatest, greatest reward that any owner could have because, whether we admit it or not--and men can be kind of macho--we depend on the ladies in this game. They are the ones who produce the winners. And some of them we try to make faster than others."

### BYRON COLT TOPS GOFFS SECOND DAY

A colt from the first crop of Byron (GB) (Green Desert) topped proceedings during the second session of the Goffs November Foal Sale yesterday when selling to Peter Doyle Bloodstock for €58,000. Following a low-key opener Monday, trade recovered as the quality improved and demand for freshman sires like Byron, who captured the 2003 G2 Mill Reef S. and following year's G2 Lennox S., was notable. Consigned as hip 386 by Ballinacurra Stud, the topper is out of a half to last year's G3 Prix d'Aumale winner Top Toss (Ire), who added the most recent renewal of the G3 Prix de Psyche to her tally. Coolmore's Ad Valorem (Danzig), who was also successful twice at the top level in the 2004 G1 Middle Park S. and 2006 G1 Queen Anne S., enjoyed the runner's-up spot after his January-foaled colt from the draft of Lewinstown Farm sold to Glenvale Stud's Flash Conroy for €47,000. Hip 320 is out of a half to the stakes scorer Wixoe Express from the extended family of Mill Native. Conroy also snapped up Taroka Stud's hip 492, a son of fellow freshman Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill) out of a half to this year's listed scorer Savarain (GB) for €35,000. Completing the clean sweep for first-crop sires was Ballinacurra's hip 308, a son of Darley's Iffraaj (GB) (Zafonic) who sold to Rathbarry Stud's Liam Cashman for €42,000 and Cloncahir House Stud's hip 484, a son of Aussie Rules (Danehill) whose dam is a half to the group scorer Alexis (Ire) purchased by Meadowlands Bloodstock Service for €40,000. 
Gosden and his wife Rachel-they say the opposite! They are so worried--one about what I am going to say, and the other about what I am not going to say. I will just say what I feel and what I think. This is a huge honour and it is the most presti-

gious award I've ever, ever received. It is prestigious because of the rather famous name. Cartier, thank you so much. It is also prestigious because this is the most difficult competition in the world, and to receive an award like that when there are so many good animals, so many good trainers and riders, and so many generous owners, is outstanding. But obviously I'm especially proud of this filly, who is without a doubt the most brilliant thing I've ever bred, and I have to thank [John] Gosden. But I really want to thank [jockey] Jimmy Fortune. He never once took this filly as seriously as she took herself and absolutely did his best to relax her and say, 'This is not that serious and you needn't be so wound up.' He's not only a brilliant rider, but a brilliant horseman, so I thank him from the bottom of my heart."

Strawbridge added, "Finally people ask me how did I breed such a wonderful animal, and I can only think of an old friend's expression: 'Every now and then a blind pig finds an acorn!'"

### Three For Coolmore...

The Coolmore team were once again prominent on Cartier night. The indomitable veteran Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) won his third consecutive champion stayer award, while Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) took the champion two-year-old colt award and Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) landed the champion older horse award. David Nagle, who jointly owns and bred Yeats, collected the prize won by the seven-year-old and confirmed the horse would be staying in training next year.

"On behalf of John and Sue Magnier, [my wife] Diane and myself, thank you Cartier," he said. "It's a great honour to win this prestigious award. To win it once is a great honour, but to do it three years in succession is awesome for us all. Being in the horse business, it means so much to have a horse of the calibre of Yeats, and to win the [G1] Gold Cup, a race with so much history. It's wonderful to be associated with such a horse. All credit must go to [trainer] Aidan O'Brien and his team in Ballydoyle, and [jockey] Johnny Murtagh. What a job they have done to keep this horse sound and sweet for five or six years. Rumour has it that Yeats has been trying to duck through the gate at Ballydoyle and head for Coolmore, but we hope that Aidan will keep him sweet and get his mind on the racecourse for one more season! Johnny Murtagh collected Duke of Marmalade's award along with J P Magnier, son of John and Sue Magnier. "Not many jockeys are lucky enough to stand up on this stage, and it is a wonderful night," said Murtagh. "It has been a huge privilege for me to ride the horses, and I would like to thank John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith and their families for all the support they gave me--they didn't tie me down to any instructions and they said 'You talk a good game, let's see what you are made of.' Thankfully, it worked out well for me this year. We have a lot of nice horses for next year, so hopefully we will be here again in 2009. Thank you very much."

J P Magnier added, "On behalf of my parents, I would like to thank Cartier for another great evening. I would also like to thank Aidan and all the team at Ballydoyle, and of course the man beside me."

### Princess Haya's New Approach...

Sheikh Mohammed's wife Princess Haya of Jordan received the champion three-year-old colt award for the exploits of G1 Vodafone Derby hero NewApproach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). It was the Jim Bolger-trained colt's second consecutive Cartier after gaining the two-year-old colt accolade in 2007. "I'm really honoured and grateful for receiving this trophy," said the Princess. "It's wonderful to be associated with a horse like this, and it's all thanks to my husband Sheikh Mohammed. What's made it all the more special for us is how kind people have been such as you and the people of England. They have participated in every stride that he took. It's been a dream of a year so far and I can't tell you how grateful I am. Thank you so much."



## FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



### NO BAILOUT HERE

The final week of Keeneland, set against the backdrop of ever-weakening stock prices (and the everstrengthening dollar--what's that about?), did not mate-



rially change the picture we outlined last week: as the Weekly Sales Ticker shows, when you add in Fasig-Tipton's one-day, \$70-million extravaganza which kicked off proceedings, the combined November sales gross dropped 35 percent, from a record \$393 million last year, to just under \$256 million this year. Seven-figure filly and mare sales, headed by Better Than Honour's record \$14-million price tag, accounted for 31 percent of the combined gross this year, whereas last year \$1-million-plus fillies and mares accounted for 28 per-

cent of the combined gross. For the other 99 percent of horses sold this year, the gross was down 38 percent. That's probably as close as we can get to estimating the real decline.

Possibly even more disturbing is the drop in what we called the 'clearance rate,' or listed sales. Back in the days when 10 percent withdrawals from the catalogue was the normal rate, it was fine to calculate 'clearance rate' from the numbers which actually went through the ring. That percentage (sold/ring) dropped from 78 percent to 72 percent this month; in other words, last November 78 percent of the horses which went through the ring were listed sales, while this November the corresponding figure was 72 percent. However, that doesn't nearly tell the whole story, which is why this year (for the Weekly Sales Ticker) we've taken to calculating 'clearance rate' from the number catalogued instead. Even at last November's record sales, there were 20 percent withdrawals from the catalogues; this November the withdrawal rate was up to 26 percent. Over twice as many horses are being withdrawn before they go through the ring as was the case a few years ago, and many of these are late withdrawals, as consignors conclude (from no vets or scopes on foals, to a trickle of lookers on mares) there is no point in sending a horse through the ring when they're 99 percent certain they're going to be taking them home anyway.



There can be no more definite illustration of this market's weakness than the combined November clearance rate from the catalogues of 53 percent, down from 62 percent last year. In 2007, if you catalogued a horse to a November sale, there was a five in eight chance you would end up with a listed sale; this year, that was barely above four in eight. So if you had a horse catalogued this November, there was barely a 50-50 chance it was going to find a new home.

In troubled times in our business, the bloom tends to come off the rose a little bit for the newest, brightest stars as breeders and buyers rediscover, at least to some extent, the virtues of 'proven' sires (though they, too, have been redefined in recent years, from sires of 10 percent stakes winners and above, to sires of six percent stakes winners and above). We can see this by looking at TDN's Instatistics tables, which do use number through the ring and sold. For the overall November market, this figure, remember, was 72 percent. For the top 12 sires on average with six or more sold from their first crops of weanlings (F2008 sires), the combined percentage sold, of those sent through the ring, was 67 percent; while for the top 12 sires by covering average with their first mares sold in foal (F2009 sires, again with six or more sold), the rate was just 62 percent--in both cases, below the overall November percentage.

In keeping with the theme of 'top strongest,' the four sires whose first foals averaged over \$100,000 enjoyed the highest clearance rates 'through the ring.' Runaway first-crop leader Bernardini (A.P. Indy) had six sell from seven offered (86 percent), averaging \$456,666. The other three with six-figure averages were three of the

four prospective upper-tier Storm Cat-line horses we identified before the sales: Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) had 12 sell of 15 offered (80 percent), for an average of \$158,916, narrowly ahead of Henny Hughes (Hennessy), who had 13 sold from 19 offered (68 percent); the other six-figure sire was First Samurai (Gi-

ant's Causeway), with 10 sold of 14 offered (71 percent), for an average of \$101,950. Of the other eight sires which averaged above \$30,000 with six or more sold, only Silver Train (Old Trieste; 26 sold of 32 offered, 81 percent) and Aragorn (Giant's Causeway; 16 sold of 21 offered, 76 percent) saw more than two-thirds of their weanlings offered listed as sales. As Aragorn figured, going in, to rank with the three other Storm Cat-line horses which actually ended up averaging over \$100,000, his \$35,168 average for those sold (off a \$30,000 stud fee in 2007) has to be classed as disappointing.

Among the top 12 first-year covering sires, the top three by average, combined, sold barely over 50 percent of those offered--37 of 71. Hard Spun (Danzig) topped the list with a \$356,571 average, but with only 14 sold from 28 offered. Darley barnmate Street Sense (Street Cry) averaged \$322,222, but with nine sold from 17 offered; and third-ranked Corinthian (Pulpit) had 14 in-foal mares (of 26 offered) average \$174,928. Five stallions on the list, though, did see more than 75 percent sold, of those offered: fourth-ranked Invasor (Candy Stripes, 88 percent); Half Ours (Unbridled's Song, 89 percent); Discreet Cat (Forestry, 79 percent); After Market (Storm Cat, 75 percent); and Master Command (A.P. Indy, 81 percent). But, as covering sire statistics only really measure the quality of mares to which a stallion was bred, it's hard to know if their statistics are as significant as those for sires with their first weanlings, which of course are actual horses on the ground. 


"Going into further debt to pinhook weanlings or buy mares evidently hasn't looked a very attractive option to potential buyers this month. On top of our own industry's overproduction issues (for everything below the top tier never too many of those), the global financial crisis has undoubtedly discouraged all but the doughtiest of buyers. The result was a drop in the clearance rate from 62 percent of those catalogued to the November sales last year, to 53 percent this year; a 35 percent drop in the overall gross; and a 27 percent drop in the average for those which did get sold. Expect to see further downward revisions of 2009 stud fees." - Bill Oppenheim

We can certainly see the effects of Darley's two-year buying spree, in which they seemingly attempted to buy every top three-year-old they could which was not already owned by Coolmore. Seven of the 24 stallions on the two top-12 lists stand at Darley's Jonabell base, including two of the top three (Bernardini, which they bred, and Henny Hughes) with their first foals this year, and the top two (and four of the top seven) with their first mares in foal. By contrast, Coolmore had just one representative between the two lists, Ashford's Scat Daddy (Johannesburg), who ranked ninth among first covering sires. To be fair, though, everybody knows Darley had a lot of catching up to do on that front, and Coolmore's now-primarily homebred operation did produce Ashford's top new prospect for 2009, Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo). Along with Three Chimneys' Big Brown (Boundary) and somebody's Curlin (Smart Strike), they will have one of the three most

expensive debuting North American sires next year.

Keeneland November concludes the major North American sales in 2008, though of course there are a few regional sales yet to come (gulp). But the international sales circus now moves back across the Atlantic, and Goffs' massive November sale is already underway. Monday's opening session of foals at Goffs saw the lowest clearance rate I think I've ever seen at a major sale: 75 percent of those sent through the ring did not sell at Goffs on Monday, meaning only 25 percent (48 sold, of 193 offered) were listed as sales. Traditionally the lowest tier of Europe's major-sale foal market (only 40 percent sold on the corresponding day last year), Monday's results definitely don't set the bar for the next four weeks of sales in Kildare, Newmarket, and Deauville; but they may set the tone. Having said that, Tattersalls' December "Mares etc." catalogue, which kicks off on Monday, Dec. 1, is comprised of some pretty decent stock. Goffs sells mares this weekend, and Tatts sells foals (more or less in ascending order) next week. The next 10 days don't figure to be that pretty, either. **CURRAGH REGAINS FIXTURES** Officials at The Curragh yesterday welcomed the return of seven fixtures previously scheduled for elsewhere as a result of the proposed redevelopment plan which is now on hold. After the announcement that the €100-million revamp was shelved due to the economic downturn, Horse Racing Ireland handed back the Kildare venue's prized contests the G1 Moyglare Stud S., Goffs Millions, G1 Irish St Leger and G1 National S. The Curragh's redevelopment scheme, which was due to be financed by Horse Racing Ireland, industry donations, bank borrowings and the Turf Club's resources, has already seen phase one completed. Nick Wachman, Senior Steward of the Turf Club, explained the need to stop ahead of the second phase set for July 2009. "Happily, everyone in Irish racing understands that there is a real need to develop the Curragh in order to create facilities that are commensurate with the world class racing that this wonderful track produces," Wachman-commented. "We are confident that the project will recommence at an appropriate time."

## EHV-1 TESTS NEGATIVE AS LAUREL PARK RE-OPENS DOORS TO OFF-SITE RUNNERS

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) announced yesterday that the final 20 samples from Laurel Park's Barn 1 tested negative for neurologic equine herpesvirus (EHV-1), and the Maryland Jockey Club promptly amended its restrictions on off-site runners racing at Laurel Park. On Nov. 14, one day after a two-year-old filly in King Leatherbury's barn tested positive for EHV-1, the Maryland Jockey Club announced that, until further notice, no horses would be allowed to ship into Laurel Park except those from the Bowie Training Center. However with vesterday's news that all of the nearly 60 horses tested at Laurel are negative for the virus, the Laurel racing office said it will begin taking entries from other jurisdictions. There is a caveat, however. Those runners will not be allowed to leave the grounds until the 21-day hold order on Barn 1 is lifted by the MDA. According to the MDA, an aggressive testing protocol along with no positive tests or signs of disease may allow the hold order to be lifted earlier than the current Dec. 6 release date. "Our restrictions last Friday were a precautionary measure," said Tom Chuckas, president and chief operating officer of the Maryland Jockey Club. "Since then the other 25 horses in Barn 1, plus all 31 lead ponies, have tested negative, so this was the next logical step in light of the test results." In related news, Daily Racing Form reports that Nin (Parker's Storm Cat), the juvenile filly that prompted the scare, was euthanized on Saturday night. The filly had shown signs of improvement on Thursday, but her conditioned took a downturn over the weekend and she was put down.






