MAKING PLANS FOR STARDOM

Stardom Bound (Tapit)'s 2009 itinerary could include stops in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Kentucky Derby, IEAH Stables Co-President and Co-CEO Michael

lavarone told *Thoroughbred Daily News*. IEAH recently purchased the 2-year-old filly for \$5.7 million at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November Selected Fall Mixed Sale in Lexington and immediately announced plans to campaign her in California in 2009. Having now laid out a more specific schedule for his filly, lavarone said her 3-year-old campaign would commence

with the GI Las Virgenes in February and the GI Santa Anita Oaks the following month. Should she run well in both races, lavarone said the Santa Anita Derby Apr. 4 would likely be next. "If she runs the way she's supposed to run in those races, overpowers her competition and has nothing left to prove against fillies, then we'd try the Santa Anita Derby," he said. The next step could be the Kentucky Derby. "If she has proven to us that she belongs in a race like that, it is something we will strongly consider," he said. lavarone understands that the Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) situation has made some hesitant to run a filly in the Kentucky Derby, but he is confident that the race is a good fit for the right filly. "We've seen horses like Goldikova (Ire) and Zarkava (Ire) beat males this year," he said. "Kip Deville is a top-class horse and he ran all out in the Breeders' Cup Mile, and Goldikova beat him easily. I don't think fillies are necessarily overmatched against colts or it's dangerous to run them against colts. If she were to win the Santa Anita Derby, we'd be crazy not to come back in the Kentucky Derby."

Stefan Friborg's G1 1000 Guineas heroine Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) looks likely to remain in training at four after connections revealed a possible change of plans. Although the grey is entered in the Tattersalls December sale, the consistent Group 1 performer may stay with trainer Pascal Bary for a trip to Hong Kong before embarking on a 2009 campaign. "She is still in the sales and we won't be

ager Patrick Barbe told Racing Post. "We put her in the sales in August, when the catalogue was being compiled and, at that stage, she hadn't finished second in the [G1] Prix de la Foret, and top milers like Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) and Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) were still in training. They will be gone to stud next year, along with Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) and several others, sowe think Natagora may have opportunities to win some more of the major prizes. She might also take on some of the big sprint races next year, we shall just have to see, and there's a possibility she'll go to Hong Kong to race there in December. She's got an entry in a mile race and a sprint, but the shorter event is likely to be a target for Marchand d'Or (Fr) (Marchand de Sable), so, if she goes, it's quite likely the mile will be the race that's chosen for her."

ARIEGE TO LA BREA

Ariege (Doneraile Court), purchased by Adena Springs for \$1.8 million at FTKNOV, has rejoined trainer Bobby Frankel's Southern California string and will start next in Santa Anita's seven-furlong GI La Brea S. Dec. 29, according to Daily Racing Form. Previously campaigned by IEAH Stables and Pegasus Holding Group Stables, the versatile three-year-old captured the GI Santa Anita Oaks and the GII Stonerside Beaumont S. on synthetics, and also placed third in the grassy GI Garden City S. Last seen finishing fifth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. Oct. 11, the dark bay returned to the worktab with a four-furlong move in :49.40 at Santa Anita Nov. 18.



SEVEN SET TO AUDITION IN PREVUE

A field of seven--headlined by MGSW Azul Leon (Lion Heart) and unbeaten Backbackbackgone (Put It Back)--is shaping up for Sunday's GIII Hollywood Prevue S., according to Hollywood Park Stakes Coordinator and Assistant Racing Secretary Dan Edison. Azul Leon, a winner of his first three starts, including the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. in July, cuts back to seven furlongs following a ninth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 25. Backbackbackgone, tabbed as a TIDN Rising Star" of following a 10-length debut win at Bay Meadows in May, most recently annexed the Jack Goodman S. at Oak Tree Oct. 18.

Eugene Melnyk homebred Congor Bay (Speightstown), who has won his first two starts at Woodbine by a combined margin of 8 3/4 lengths, is expected to make the trip from Canada. Jack Goodman third- and fourth-place finishers Arashi Cat (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Ventana (Toccet), Barretts Juvenile S. winner and California Cup Juvenile S. runner-up Triumphant Flight (Chullo {Arg}), and recent Oak Tree \$75,000 maiden claimer winner Jack O' Lantern (Flatter) round out the likely field.

Sunday, Kyoto, Japan

MILE CHAMPIONSHIP S.-G1, ¥213,000,000, 3yo/up, 1mT

A full field is expected for Japan's top race over the metric mile, and the \$2-million feature has attracted a single foreign invader, GI Woodbine Mile hero Rahy's Attorney (Crown Attorney). The four-year-old arrived in Japan Nov. 11 following a 24-hour journey from his Woodbine base and seems to have taken the trip in stride. "His condition has not changed since he was

back home," said exercise rider Tyler Gaskin. "He has overcome the transportation and is doing very well. If he can maintain his form after all of the transportation [Canada to Narita/Shiroi to Kyoto], I think he can run fairly well in the

race. He is a clever horse, so as long as he can give it his best, he will have a chance to finish near the top." Rahy's Attorney completed his stay in quarantine Monday and was transferred to Kyoto Racecourse the following morning. The gelding cantered one lap of the turf course Wednesday morning under the watchful eye of trainer Ian Black. "He's in good condition and I'm happy with that," he commented. "I checked the turf this morning and found it a bit firm, but I don't think it's too firm for him, and I'm sure he can handle it. The jockey, Slade Callaghan, will be riding him [Thursday] morning. He'll probably do some strong work down the stretch on the turf track." The expected race favorite is Super Hornet (Jpn) (Rodrigo de Triano), the 2007 runner-up who will use the race as a prep for the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 14.

The third-highest price yesterday was €58,000, paid for Churchtown House Stud's colt by Aussie Rules (Danehill), who also featured prominently during Tuesday's trade. Hip 591 is out of a half-sister to the Ballydoyle juvenile winner Mississippian (Ire) from the family of the top-class Italian runner Distant Way and was knocked down to Bobby O'Ryan. Nineteen lots earlier, Powerstown Stud went to €54,000 for Acorn Stud's hip 572, a son of Kyllachy (GB) whose dam is a half to the top-class sprinter Danehurst (GB) and 2003 G3 Prix Penelope heroine Humouresque (GB). Kildaragh Stud's hip 609, a son of Bahamian Bounty (GB) out of a half to champion Marotta (Fr) was knocked down to Redpender Stud for €50,000 and McKeever St Lawrence snapped up Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs colt from the first crop of Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill) consigned as hip 699. His dam is a half to the Listed winner Maycocks Bay (GB), whose juvenile filly Sariska (GB) scored on debut at Newmarket earlier this month, and he fetched €41,000. While the clearance rate improved on the first two days to stand at 55 percent, the gross was under half that of 2007 and the average of €12,522 and median of €8,000 fell by 38 and 48 percent, respectively. 

ADW COMPANIES TO LOSE CALIFORNIA LI-

CENSE? At a meeting Tuesday, California Horse Racing Board officials opted not to renew licenses for four major account-wagering companies: Television Games Network, Twinspires.com, XpressBet and Youbet.com, Daily Racing Form reported. Their licenses are currently set to expire Dec. 31; if they are not renewed prior to the end of the year, then no account-wagering company will be permitted to offer wagering on California racing, or to take bets from a resident of that state, CHRB Chairman Richard Shapiro told DRF. CHRB officials indicated that the ongoing problems between horsemen and the ADW companies led to their decision not to renew licenses. "I'm not finger-pointing," Shapiro told DRF. "I'm not blaming one company or one group. But we are not going to allow this to happen anymore. This needs to be resolved. Why in the hell should we go through the licensing process when the players themselves can't figure out a way to maximize the benefit of account wagering?" DRF also reported that the officials from the Thoroughbred Owners of California, along with members of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group, were slated to meet yesterday with representatives of TrackNet, a company owned by Churchill Downs Inc. and Magna Enterntainment, in hopes of getting Hollywood's signal on Twinspires.com and XpressBet, the ADW interests owned by Churchill and Magna, respectively.

Texas Gets Go Ahead...

The Texas Horsemen's Partnership (THP) and the state's tracks have reached an agreement with TrackNet, allowing the signals from Texas tracks to be shown on Twinspires.com and Xpressbet, according to DRF. No Texas tracks had been sending their signal out since April, when the THP withdrew its approval. The new agreement is slated to run through Dec. 31, 2010; financial details were not disclosed. As of yet, neither TVG nor Youbet.com will be able to take the signal from Texas tracks. The television rights will be held by HRTV, which is owned jointly by Magna and Churchill. Magna operates Lone Star Park, the largest racetrack in Texas. The THP had earlier been allied with the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group (THG), but Bob Reeves, president of the latter association, told DRF that he was not part of the Texas negotiations.



NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

LAME-DUCK SESSION FOCUSED ON AUTO INDUSTRY BAILOUT. OTHER ECONOMIC CONCERNS

The lame-duck session of the 110th Congress, which began on Monday, November 17, has morphed into one focused on the struggling Big Three automakers.

Senate Democratic Leaders support awarding a \$25 billion loan package, out of the \$700 billion financial market bailout package passed by the House in October, to General Motors Corp., Ford Motor Co. and Chrysler LLC. Senate Republican Leaders prefer automakers use the \$25 billion Congress authorized for retrofitting auto plants to meet fuel-efficiency standards. This impasse means lawmakers will likely revisit the issue early in the start of the 111th Congress, which convenes January 6, 2009.

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) refuted talk that the lame-duck session might continue into December to resolve the automaker bailout.

"I don't see the likelihood of a (December) session," Pelosi said. "We will either have the votes to do this now or will have to take it up in early January. Not doing it now is a danger."

Other topics at this session include a possible new economic stimulus package and an extension of unemployment benefits.



George Woolf Finalists Announced:

Santa Anita Park announced the five finalists for the 2009 Santa Anita George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award yesterday. This year's finalists--Gary Baze, Calvin Borel, Javier Castellano, David Flores and John Velazguez--will face an electorate comprised of their peers. The winner is set to be announced in January and the award will be presented in late March or early April. It honors and recognizes those riders whose careers and personal character earn esteem for the individual and the sport of Thoroughbred racing. The winner's trophy is a replica of the full-size statue of George Woolf which adorns Santa Anita's Paddock Gardens area. The statue was created through donations from the racing public after Woolf's death following a spill at Santa Anita on Jan. 13, 1946. Woolf, who was regarded as one of the nation's top jockeys, was affectionately known as "The Iceman," and was revered by his colleagues as a fierce competitor and consummate professional. READY TO RUN SALE WEATHERS THE STORM

New Zealand Bloodstock's 2008 Ready-To-Run Sale of Two-Year-Olds managed to withstand the exterior forces of a global economic slowdown and posted just marginal declines versus last year's event. While the clearance rate dropped to 67 percent this year from 70 percent in 2007, the average of NZ\$60,366 was off by 1.3 percent, while the median of NZ\$33,000 dropped by 8.3 percent. From the 247 horses sold, 17 made in excess of NZ\$200,000 versus 14 last November. "In view of the challenges facing everyone in the current market conditions, the results of the past two days have really been well in excess of our expectations," commented Petrea Vela, managing director--sales and marketing for NZB. "Heading into this sale we were certain that results would be down on last year, but to see such strength from the market here has been a fantastic result." She continued, "Particular credit must be paid to the great number of both international and local buyers that came to Karaka this week. We're very grateful for their efforts to be here and their support of the sale with their purchases, and hope that they are justly rewarded on the racetrack." The overall sales topper went through the ring during Tuesday's opening session, when hip 62, an Esker Lodge-consigned son of Red Ransom--Lady Circles (Aus) (Ascot Knight), was purchased by Singapore-based trainer Stephen Gray for NZ\$400,000. "We'll send him down to my parents' place [in Palmerston North] to mature and will race him in New Zealand before we look at taking him to Singapore," the Kiwi expatriate explained. "We're in no hurry with him, and will look to start him as a late two-yearold or early three-year-old." Cont. p8
