#### TATTERSALLS DECEMBER KICKS OFF

There was an air of realism in a wintry Newmarket yesterday ahead of Tattersalls' marathon December Sale, which gets underway at 10:30 a.m. this morning with a day of yearlings. These are followed from tomorrow through Saturday with six days of foals, with the best offerings appearing towards the end of the week. "The economic climate is very different to this time last year, but the markets at Tattersalls this autumn for horses in training and yearlings have proved very resilient," Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "The response to the December catalogues has been very positive with a lot of interest from the principal overseas markets and obviously the weakness of sterling against the major international currencies should also benefit the sale." There are 237 lots catalogued in today's yearling segment (the smallest number since 2001 and 44 fewer than last year), where successful recent graduates range from one end of the price spectrum--star Hungarian sprinter Overdose (GB) (Starborough), who cost 2,000gns--to the other, G1 Irish Oaks heroine Moonstone (GB), a 700,000gns yearling. "It's a strong catalogue with the added bonus of having 19 yearlings eligible for the £2.5 million Tattersalls Millions next year," continued George. "Recent graduates include Nahoodh (Ire), Moonstone and one of the outstanding buys in recent years in the unbeaten Overdose. It should give plenty of encouragement to buyers at all levels of the market." cont. p2

Exchanging a bump with Backbackbackgone at the break, the Jack o' Lantern, who graduated against \$75,000 claimers at Santa Anita Oct. 23, settled in a close-up fifth behind that rival, who carved out solid early spilts of :22.64, :45.48 and 1:09.55. Content to ride the rail all the way around, the Richard Matlowtrainee found a sliver of daylight along the inside turning for home, was guided sweetly through by Isaias Enriquez and held on gamely in the dying strides to hold off the fast-closing even-money choice Azul Leon at the wire. Ventana (Toccet) and Arashi Cat (Fusaichi Pegasus) finished in tandem to round out the trifecta. "I had a great trip," said Enriquez. "I thought [Rafael] Bejarano had the horse to beat [Backbackbackgone], because he was the speed of the race. I just let him get the lead and show me the way. Into the lane, I saw that he was pushing out the horse outside of him, and there was a chance to get to the hole before he came in. youngster by that pair's sire, Divine Light (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), that is likely to draw more than a second glance from buyers.

Lot 1056 is the sole offering from The Elms Stud, acting on behalf of French owner Yves Elliot. The bay filly's

page received a recent boost when her dam's half-sister, Lady Deauville (Fr) (Fasliyev), landed a German Group 3 to complement a quintet of listed victories. The filly is the first produce of the Poliglote (GB) mare Policalle (Fr), who is also a half-sister to Japanese Group 1 winner Fabulous La Fouine (Fr) (Fabulous Dancer) out of the European champion Mercalle (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}). French bloodstock agent Guy Petit, acting for Elliot, purchased Policalle for €80,000 at Deauville in December last year. The mare was sent to The Elms Stud, which consigned Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) to make a record 4.6 million guineas at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2006. "Guy Petit bought Policalle in France and she was sent to us," said Stephen Kemble, who manages the Northamptonshire Stud with his wife Louise. "We got her in foal to Shamardal and also foaled her Divine Light filly. The mare went back to France and the foal was deemed to be a good foal, which she is, so remained here to be put through the sale. I think she is an interesting individual, particularly with Lady Deauville gaining a Group 3 win recently. She is a very nice type, she is correct, a good size and strong."

The Admire Vega mare entered this event off her first graded victory, which came in the G3 Fuchu Himba S. at 1800m Oct. 19. Trained by Sei Ishizaka, who has already claimed a Group 1 title this year with Vermilion (Jpn) (El Condor Pasa) in the February S., Blumenblatt gave her jockey Yutaka Yoshida his first Group 1 title in almost four years and ninth overall in this race. Rahy's Attorney (Crown Attorney), the Ontario-bred winner of the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 7, raced in fifth early but was out-kicked in the stretch to finish ninth of 18. #### POSITIVE END TO GOFFS MARATHON

Goffs' November Sale came to a close yesterday with the Breeding Stock section returning respectable figures in light of the preceding foal sale's shortfalls. With the clearance rate of 67 percent matching 2007 and the average of €24,807 and median of €14,000 down by 14 percent and 30 percent, respectively, the company's Chief Executive Henry Beeby was far from downbeat. "We are very satisfied with the trade for breeding stock over the last two days, and must pay tribute to the work of our colleagues at Irish Thoroughbred Marketing, who have done a superb job of helping to attract a truly international group of buyers to the Goffs Mare Sale," Beeby commented. "On Friday, I said that we were disappointed with the results. From a Goffs point of view we have taken a big hit this week, but we are in the same position as countless others in the industry, and will work our way out of this current downturn by sticking to what we do best which is selling quality bloodstock to the widest audience." Heading proceedings was another offering from the Aga Khan's Studs in hip 1703, the three-year-old **Rayina** (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), who was snapped up by

who was snapped up by David Flood's Spratstown Stud. From a family that continues to produce smart runners such as Salford Mill (Ire), Highland Daughter (Ire) and Ryan (Ire), she is headed to the County Wicklow-based operation after a decisive bid of €100,000 won the day. "She's a lovely filly, she's a winner and it's an excellent family--in the first two dams alone you've got seven horses rated 100 or more,"

Flood explained. "She's been bought for an overseas client and in the short to medium-term, it's quite likely that she will be exported to Australia." Second best was hip 1825, the eight-year-old Green Lassy (Fr) (Green Tune), who sold to Limefield Stud in foal to Clodovil (Ire) for €60,000. From the consignment of Mountain View Stud, she is a half to the dual Group 2winning stayer Cut Quartz (Fr) (Green Tune) from the extended family of the Ballymacoll matriarch Hellenic (Ire). Shadwell's draft provided another highlight when hip 1790, the nine-year-old Najayeb (Silver Hawk) sold to the Hong Kong Breeders Club for €50,000. The half to the world-class homebred performer Sakhee was sold in foal to that champion's sire, Bahri. "She was very good value and only at the moment would you be able to buy into a family like this," explained purchaser John McGrath. "She is a daughter of a Group 2 winner, she's a half-sister to a champion in Sakhee and she's carrying a three-parts sibling to that horse. Also, I'm told that her Selkirk yearling is a very nice sort."



She has produced this year's G3 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) winner Senlis (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and was purchased by Silfield Bloodstock in foal to Invincible Spirit (Ire). "She's already proved herself a good mare, and the Invincible Spirit covering was a big attraction," Silfield's Charlie Mason commented. "We'll be bringing the foal back here next year." Margot Bloodstock later paid the same amount for Seskin Stud's hip 1780, the four-year-old Guthega (GB) (Act One {GB}), who is a half to the listed-winning and group-placed Fidelio's Miracle (Mountain Cat) from the family of top-class sprinters Asset (Ire) and Myboycharlie (Ire). The Grade I test is for fillies and mares at one mile on turf. "She was way too far back in the [GI] Yellow Ribbon [Sept. 27 at Santa Anita]," said Knapp of a sixth-place effort after trailing a 10-horse field early in her last start. I Can See is expected to be a longshot in a lineup also expected to include defending champion Precious Kitten (Catienus), Visit (Dixie Union), Cocoa Beach (Chi) (Doneraile Court), Roshani (Fantastic Light), Rosinka (Ire) (Soviet Star), Black Mamba (Black Minnaloushe), Magical Fantasy (Diesis {GB}), Criminologist (Maria's Mon) and Passified (GB) (Compton Place {GB}).

my outstanding help," Asmussen said after breaking the record with Prophesy (Pulpit)'s triumph in the first race at Remington Park Sunday. Asmussen, who has won training titles at nine tracks and is eighth on the all-time win list, maintains strings scattered throughout the continent. Best known for campaigning the 2007 Horse of the Year

Curlin (Smart Strike), Asmussen, broke the record with a victory in a \$25,000 claiming race at the Oklahoma City racetrack. "The success we've had with the Curlins and the Pyros has been fantastic," Asmussen said. "But we came from a small, Midwestern track, and I like to think that we remember where we came from."


#### **CURLIN TO PARADE AT CHURCHILL Curlin**

(Smart Strike), whose retirement from racing was announced Nov. 16, will make one final public appearance at Churchill Downs on Nov. 29, closing day of the track's Fall Meet. The 2007 Horse of the Year is scheduled to be paraded on the main track between the fifth and sixth races on the Saturday program with a "special salute" to follow. "We're thrilled to have another opportunity to showcase Curlin in front of his many fans in Kentucky," said the colt's trainer Steve Asmussen. "We've always considered Churchill Downs to be his 'home' track, and we'll always remember the standing ovation he received after winning the GI Stephen Foster." Curlin will stand the 2009 breeding season at Lane's End for \$75,000.
