

### **2009 GRADED STAKES ANNOUNCED**

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee has announced its listing of U.S. graded stakes for 2009,



which includes six new Grade I events for the upcoming season. Most notable among the upgrades are two Breeders' Cup races which will now boast Grade I status: the Filly & Mare Sprint and the Dirt Mile. Both were ungraded when they were added to the 2008 BC F/M Sprint winner Breeders' Cup line-up in 2007 and were again ungraded when

won by Ventura and Albertus Maximus, respectively, this year at Santa Anita. The only other Breeders' Cup race to see a change in grade

was the Juvenile Turf, which goes from ungraded to Grade II for 2009. The Juvenile Turf was another new addition in 2007. None of the three new Breeders' Cup races added in 2008--the Juvenile Fillies Turf, the Marathon, and the Turf Sprint--were considered for graded status, according to Committee representatives, and will be contested as ungraded events at Santa Anita in 2009.

Pamela Blatz-Murff, Senior Vice President of Breeders' Cup Racing, commented on the announcement. "We are pleased that the Graded Stakes Committee recognized the world-class quality of the competition in our new races and we believe its decision, along with the enthusiastic reaction of the top owners and trainers in the world, is another validation of our expansion from eight to 14 championship races," she said.

The Committee, which conducted its annual grading session in Lexington, Kentucky on Nov. 24, reviewed 746 unrestricted U.S. stakes races with a purse of at least \$75,000, and assigned graded status to 488 of them, seven more than were graded in 2008. A total of 13 graded races were newly upgraded, including the six Grade I races, as well as seven Grade II races and 10 Grade III races. Two races, which had Grade III status in 2008, are no longer eligible for grading. They are Calder's Memorial Day H., which didn't carry the required \$100,000 purse minimum for a Grade III event in 2008; and Gulfstream's Deputy Minister H., which was not run in 2008 and will reportedly not be renewed in 2009.

In addition to the two Breeders' Cup races, the newest Grade I events include Belmont Park's Jamaica H., the Pat O'Brien H. at Del Mar, the Clement L. Hirsch H. at Del Mar, and the Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland.

One race was downgraded from Grade I to Grade II for 2009: the Suburban H. at Belmont Park.



Explaining the reduction, WinStar stated in a press release, "In the course of evaluating and monitoring the market over the last several weeks, it has become obvious that breeders demand even greater value for their breeding dollar. As such, WinStar has decided to respond with a value-driven adjustment

to Distorted Humor's stud fee in order to ensure the highest quality book of mares." It was previously announced that the son of Forty Niner would stand for \$225,000. "WinStar is a long term player and we have always believed in adjusting to market conditions to facilitate our shareholders,' fellow breeders' and WinStar Farm's overall success," said Doug Cauthen, president of WinStar Farm. "Distorted Humor is the Number One Covering Sire in the nation with an average of \$1,833,333. Our objective with this move is to maintain his position at the top."

### SLOW START FOR TATTS DECEMBER FOALS

There was a disappointing, if predictable, start to the Tattersalls December Foal Sale in Newmarket yesterday when just 40 percent of the lots offered changed hands. The day's 274,700gns turnover was down 75 percent on last year and the 3,614gns average fell by 56 percent, while the 2,000gns median dropped by 50 percent. The top price was just 20,000gns--a sum surpassed by 14 lots on the same day 12 months ago-and that came for lot 282, a filly from the first crop of Phoenix Reach (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) out of the Sadler's Wells mare Rasmalai (GB). The bay was consigned from Andrew Christou's Winterbeck Manor Stud, which raced the National Stud stallion. Di Turner of Leicestershire-based Lodge Farm Stud signed the ticket. "She's been bought to race and was a nice good-looking filly with a bit of scope," Turner said. "She was a bit backward and it's not been decided where she'll eventually end up, but she's gone to the National Stud at the moment." Pinhookers were largely waiting until later in the week to make their mark, but a 16,500gns Intikhab (Red Ransom) colt will be reoffered next year after selling to Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock, acting for an Irish client. "He was a very mature early foal with a good size and a good step," Brown said of lot 500, "The stallion does well, and this colt will be reoffered next year." Brown added, "I think there will be a good trade later in the week for the better foals, but he was the only one I followed in today. You've got to be trying to appeal to the imagination of yearling buyers next years and most of these today are limited on page." The bay colt, out of Munakashah (Ire) (Machiavellian), was consigned from Gazeley Stud. ### **BOBBY'S WORLD**

When it comes to domination of a single race, a few examples stand out. Woody Stephens' five consecutive

wins in the GI Belmont S. and Bob Baffert's seven straight triumphs in the GI Del Mar Futurity are feats unlikely to be achieved again. Bobby Frankel, meanwhile, has been without peer in the GI Matriarch S. and believes Precious Kitten



(Catienus) and Visit (GB) (Oasis Precious Kitten Benoit photo Dream {GB}) are "very live" to

give him his fifth successive Matriarch score Sunday.

Precious Kitten's victory in the 2007 Matriarch was Frankel's eighth win in the last 11 renewals of the Grade I event, which propelled him past Charlie Whittingham. Three of Whittingham's seven wins came with Flawlessly (Affirmed) from 1991-1993. Precious Kitten will attempt to join Flawlessly as only the second horse to win the race in back-to-back years.

The Matriarch was first run in 1981 and was contested as a 1 1/8-mile filly and mare turf event through 1994. Then, for the next four years, the distance was extended to 1 1/4 miles before it was reverted back to its original distance in 1999. Hollywood Park changed it to its current one-mile distance in 2003. The track had to cancel the race in 2005 as turf course problems forced Hollywood to scrap grass racing for the entire fall meeting.

The inaugural running of the Matriarch went to Kilijaro (Ire) (African Sky {GB}), who was trained by Whittingham and ridden to victory by Laffit Pincay Jr. The following year was the only time the race has been split into two divisions, with Pale Purple (Verbatim) taking the first leg and Castilla (Bold Reason) prevailing in the second.

Royal Heroine (Ire) (Lypheor {GB}) defeated males to win the first GI Breeders' Cup Mile in 1984, then concluded her career with a victory in the Matriarch 15 days later. Starine (Fr) (Mendocino), owned and trained by Frankel, became the second horse to complete the Matriarch/Breeders' Cup double with her 2001 Matriarch victory followed by her score in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in 2002. Intercontinental (GB) (Danehill), a Juddmonte homebred, repeated the feat for Frankel, taking the 2004 Matriarch and holding off Ouija Board (Cape Cross {Ire}) to upset the 2005 Filly and Mare Turf.

Frankel and Juddmonte have combined for three more Matriarch triumphs with Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan) in 1996, Ryafan (Lear Fan) in 1997, Heat Haze (GB) (Green Desert) in 2003 and Price Tag (GB) (Dansili {GB} in 2006. The Frankel/Juddmonte duo swept the exacta in 2004 with Etoile Montante's (Miswaki) runner-up effort.

"They always have good turf fillies and they send them over [to Southern California] this time of year," Frankel said, explaining his Matriarch success with Juddmonte runners. Frankel's other Matriarch win came in 1999 with Happyanunoit (NZ) (Yachtie {Aus}).

Chris McCarron is the top Matriarch-winning jockey with five victories to his credit, three of which came aboard Flawlessly. Whittingham and McCarron also teamed up to take the 1989 running with Claire Marine (Ire) (What a Guest {Ire}). McCarron, who retired from riding in 2002, won his final Matriarch in 2000 with Tout Charmant (Slewvescent). Among active riders, John Velazquez, Alex Solis, and Corey Nakatani have two wins apiece. In 1987, Aaron Gryder, then 17, won his first Grade I when he guided Asteroid Field (Forli {Arg}) to victory in the Matriarch.

### Skimming to British Columbia:

Skimming (Nureyev--Skimble, by Lyphard) is relocating to Pacific Stud in Langley, British Columbia. The 12year-old stallion, who won the 2000 and 2001 renewals of the GI Pacific Classic, is the sire of GI Malibu S. winner Johnny Eves, as well as stakes winners Coastal Skimming, Miller's Turbo and Skewing. From three crops to race, he has sired the earners of over \$2.5 million. "We are very excited to bring a stallion like Skimming to Western Canada," said Pacific Stud's stallion manager Roxanne Sargent. "With the unfortunate death of Regal Intention, Skimming should be very popular with fans of the Northern Dancer line." Skimming will join Joey Franco (Avenue of Flags) at Pacific Stud and the farm is offering an incentive to breeders for both stallions. Breeders who sign a contract by Jan. 9 will be offered a chance to obtain four nominations to any combination of either stallion for the price of less than three. "In an effort to offer value to breeders in this tough economic climate, we have developed what we think is a timely and economical idea for local breeders," Sargent explained. Skimming will stand for \$4,000, while Joey Franco stands for \$3,000.


