COSMOPOLITAN CAST DESCENDS ON SHA TIN

A total of 56 horses, including a record 39 overseas representatives, have been extended invitations to the Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International Races Dec. 14

at Sha Tin Racecourse. Among that number are 16 Grade/Group 1 winners from 11 different racing jurisdictions from all over the world. "Such has been the demand for places, we believe each of the four Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International Races will see full fields of 14 runners," said Bill Nader, the former New York Racing Association executive who now serves the Hong Kong Jockey Club as its executive director of racing.

The United States has four invitees, led by **Kip Deville** (Kipling). Arguably the strongest American contender in the history of the HKIR, the gray, coming off a runner-up effort in defense of his G1 Breeders' Cup Mile title, will look to unseat reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year **Good Ba Ba** (Lear Fan), who posted a narrow victory in last year's G1 Hong Kong Mile; and French Classic winner **Natagora (Fr)** (Divine Light {Jpn}). The IEAH runner touched down in Hong Kong yesterday and looks in fine fettle. The richest of the four events, which offers combined purse money of HK\$62 million (about \$8 million), is the G1 Hong Kong Cup, in which local favorite **Viva Pataca (GB)** (Marju {Ire}) looks to improve on his runner-up effort from last year. The six-year-old import prepped for the Internationals with an exceptionally easy victory in the Cup Trial Nov. 16. The overseas contingent is headed up by **Eagle Mountain (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up who will be making just his third start of the year; and the globe-trotting **Linngari (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}), a Group 1 winner in Germany in 2008 and having the final start of a consistent career. Twelve of the 14 runnings of the G1 Hong Kong Vase have gone to horses trained in Great Britain or France, and **Doctor Dino (Fr)** (Mutathir {GB}) returns to the scene of one of his best victories.

To successfully defend, he'll need to deal with 2006 G1 St Leger hero **Sixties Icon (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}); **Muhannak (Ire)** (Chester House), victorious in the Breeders' Cup Marathon; and **Packing Winner (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), conqueror of Viva Pataca in a domestic Group 1 in May. The G1 Hong Kong Sprint figures a wide-open affair and has attracted the likes of Australian superstar **Apache Cat (Aus)** (Lion Cavern), winner of five consecutive Group 1 events in 2008; Godolphin's **Diabolical (Artax)**, who was just touched off in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint; and South African sensation **Mythical Flight (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) and Europe's top sprinter, **Marchand d'Or** (Marchand de Sable).

UNBRIDLED'S SONG'S FEE ADJUSTED

Following the trend of many top farms in the industry, Taylor Made Stallions has announced that **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled), who was initially scheduled to stand in 2009 for \$150,000 stands and nurses, instead will stand for \$125,000 stands and nurses. Unbridled's Song is represented by three new grade I winners this year, including champion two-year-old male contender Midshipman. The stallion's success this year has prompted an "unprecedented demand in seasons for Unbridled's Song compared to recent years," according to a farm release. "However, given the adjustment in fees of two of the breeds other great stallions, namely A.P. Indy and Distorted Humor, we feel it is in the best interest of our customers to readjust Unbridled's Song's 2009 fee to \$112,500 live foal payable Nov. 1, or \$125,000 stands and nurses. Taylor Made will be honoring this fee schedule for anyone who has already booked a mare to Unbridled's Song for 2009."

Pam York, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey, hopes **Criminologist** (Maria's Mon) has a smoother trip in Sunday's GI Matriarch S. than she experienced in a flight from New York Monday. "I hope we win a Grade I with him and continue to do as well with him as Vladimir Cerin," McLaughlin said. "Obviously, the hopes are to go to Dubai. Whether that's the G2 Godolphin Mile or

the G1 Dubai World Cup, we'll let him tell us." McLaughlin added that Albertus Maximus will be aimed at the Jan. 31 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. On the board in 10 of 15 starts to date, Albertus Maximus has won five times and earned \$908,230.

FROST GIANT ARRIVES, MAST TRACK

CONFIRMED FOR JC DIRT Frost Giant (Giant's Causeway), who upset this year's GI Suburban H. at 40-1, arrived early yesterday morning at Narita Airport for his intended start in the G1 Japan Cup Dirt at Nakayama Racecourse Dec. 7. The five-year-old was then transported to the Shiroy Quarantine Center, completing a 15-hour journey from his New York base. "He was very anxious when we arrived at Narita, but he seems to have relaxed inside the horse van," said assistant trainer Rodolfo (Rudy) Rodriguez. "We've come all this way, so we will give it our best to win the race." Though Rodriguez was aboard for the Suburban win, the chestnut, owned by IEAH Stables, Andrew Cohen and Pegasus Holding Group, will be partnered by Cornelio Velasquez in the Japan Cup Dirt. The jockey will remain in the region to pilot Kip Deville (Kipling) in the G1 Hong Kong Mile the following weekend. **Mast Track** (Mizzen Mast), the GI Hollywood Gold Cup hero who is owned, bred and trained by Bobby Frankel, departed Los Angeles International Airport Wednesday on a Tokyo-bound flight. The four-year-old will have the services of Garrett Gomez in the JC Dirt, which is run this year over the distance of nine furlongs.

FOREIGN CONTINGENT ARRIVE FOR CUP

The quartet of foreign-based hopefuls for Sunday's G1 Japan Cup made an uneventful 100-minute journey from the Shiroy Quarantine Center to Tokyo Racecourse yesterday morning to complete their race preparations. Robert S. Evans's **Marsh Side** (Gone West) is looking to become the first American-trained horse since Golden Pheasant in 1991 to take down the \$5-million event. The five-year-old is in line for a bonus of nearly \$1 million if he were able to add the Japan Cup to his victory in the GI Pattison Canadian International S. at Woodbine Oct. 4. Assistant trainer Derek Oldham has been pleased with Marsh Side since their arrival in the Orient. "He's in good condition and everything is going as planned," he offered. "He's put on a bit of weight since his last race and he's fit." **Papal Bull (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), runner-up to Duke of Marmalade (Ire) in this year's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., can pick up about a half-million dollar bonus with a win. He looks to improve on his effort from last year, when he was seventh, beaten about five lengths at 51-1. Also representing the overseas challenge are **Sixties Icon (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), fifth as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Marathon Oct. 25; and **Purple Moon (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), runner-up in the G1 Melbourne Cup and recently a close second in the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris Oct. 19.

DECLINES CONTINUE AT TATTERSALLS Day 2 of the December Foal Sale at Tattersalls in Newmarket again produced figures markedly down on their 2007 equivalents, as pinhookers proved to be highly selective about which youngsters they sought for resale next year. The turnover of 746,100gns fell by 69 percent, while the 6,783gns average dropped by 57 percent and the 4,000gns median dipped by 60 percent. The clearance rate was just 55 percent. The session's top price came for hip [610](#), a Royal Applause colt sold by Ted Voute who realized 52,000gns by the time Camas Park Stud's Tim Hyde Jr. had outbid David O'Callaghan of Yeomanstown Stud. Hyde bought Royal Applause's GI Breeders' Cup Mile third-place finisher Whatsthescript (Ire) for 70,000gns as a foal four years ago, though he ended up reselling him for the same sum as a yearling. "Although I didn't make money on Whatsthescript you could say the sire has been lucky for me," said Hyde. "This colt has been bought for resale and he's from a very good family. I liked the fact he's out of a Danehill mare." The next highest price came for a first-crop 30,000gns Indesatchel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) colt consigned as hip [531](#) from Terry Holdcroft's Bearstone Stud and bought by David Brown of Furnace Mill Stud. The colt's Haafhd (GB) yearling half-brother was purchased by Hamdan Al Maktoum for 160,000gns at this auction house's October Yearling Sale. "He's been bought for resale and I hope the two-year-old, who is with Barry Hills, goes on next year. I quite fancy the sire. He's by Danehill Dancer, and I've seen one or two of his foals who look nice athletic sorts," said Brown. The sale continues today with a bidding starting at 10:30 a.m.

November 30, 1989...Jockey **Kent Desormeaux** surpassed Chris McCarron's 15-year record for most number of victories in a single season when he rode his 547th winner for the year at Laurel Racecourse.

December 1, 1962...Ten thousand fans attended a ceremony at Tropical Park in honor of **Carry Back's** retirement. By Saggy out of Joppy, Carry Back was known as "the people's horse." He retired after 55 starts with earnings of more than \$1 million.

JACK O' LANTERN SIDELINED Jack o' Lantern

(Flatter), upset winner of Sunday's GIII Hollywood Prevue S., suffered a condylar fracture in his right front leg during the race, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "He was sore cooling out," explained trainer Richard Matlow. "It's only the second [condylar fracture] I've had in 45 years of training. It's probably better than a ligament." Jack O' Lantern has won two of three starts to date. Prior to his Prevue win, the dark bay colt captured a \$75,000 maiden claiming event at Santa Anita Oct. 23.

HELLO BROADWAY OUT OF REMSEN Hello Broadway (Broken Vow), second in the Nov. 2 GIII Nashua S., will miss Saturday's GII Remsen S. after missing training time due to an elevated temperature and inflamed throat, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The half-brother to Nobiz Like Shobiz jogged on Sunday and Monday, but missed a gallop on Tuesday during a heavy rainstorm. "I didn't want to take him out and get him soaking wet after having his resistance down," explained trainer Barclay Tagg. Hello Broadway will ship to Florida next week and will be pointed to the GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Jan. 30.

LAUREL HOLD ORDER LIFTED A hold order on Laurel Park's Barn 1 has been lifted after all 25 horses in the barn tested negative for equine herpesvirus. The order was put in place Nov. 12 when a two-year-old filly from the barn contracted the virus. "Today MDA and Maryland Racing Commission veterinarians examined all 25 horses in Barn 1, confirming that all appear healthy and we lifted the hold order," explained state veterinarian Dr. Guy Hohenhaus. "We are pleased and relieved that this situation ended so quickly and want to take the opportunity to remind horsemen at the track and on farms across the stable to remain vigilant in their biosecurity practices to prevent this and many other illnesses in their horses." The negative nasal swab and blood samples were taken Monday, nine days after the last known viral exposure in the barn. The Maryland Jockey Club has also lifted restrictions on horses leaving Laurel Park.

FUNNY CIDE TO KENTUCKY HORSE PARK

Kentucky Derby winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) will take up residence at the Kentucky Horse Park on Dec. 5. Since his retirement from racing in 2007, the eight-year-old gelding has been a pony in the barn of his trainer Barclay Tagg. "The rigors of racing and training for several years have started to cause him mild discomfort recently as he continued working on a regular basis as my stable pony," Tagg explained. "So now the time has come, as he is turning nine years old, to really retire." Jack Knowlton, managing partner of Sakatoga Stable, added, "The 10 owners of Funny Cide are truly honored that the Kentucky Horse Park has invited him to reside in its Hall of Champions. We are pleased that his large fan base will have an opportunity to visit him at this wonderful facility not too far from his greatest triumph." Funny Cide is the second Derby winner to join the Horse Park this fall. He joins 1987 Derby champion Alysheba who arrived at the park in October.

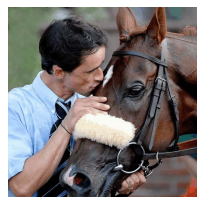

Maryland Jocks Shifting Tack to New York:

Sheldon Russell, who sits atop the rider standings during the current fall meeting at Laurel with 40 victories, announced that he will be moving his tack to New York for the winter. "I have been thinking about this for some time," Russell said. "You rarely get these opportunities and this move will help me become a better rider." Last week Russell, whose promising career has been hindered by injuries, had his apprentice season extended 136 days by the Maryland Racing Commission after the rider submitted medical records substantiating racing-related injuries. Russell, who has missed time with two separate vertebrae injuries as well as a broken wrist, will now ride with the weight allowance until May 3, 2009. Also moving her tack for the winter is Rosie Napravnik, who informed the Maryland Jockey Club communications staff that she would be riding at Aqueduct, beginning this Saturday, a month sooner than expected. The jockey colony also lost Ryan Fogelsonger earlier this year. The 2002 Eclipse Award winning apprentice is now riding at Hawthorne after a solid meet at Presque Isle Downs.
