the grey filly came up a head short to GSW Game Face last out in similar contest Nov. 15 over a sloppy Churchill strip. "I wanted to take a shot [here]," said winning trainer Ian Wilkes. "It's a shame that Mr. [Ken] Jones [of Guam who owned Domino Stud with his wife Elaine] passed away not too long ago, and a shame that he wasn't here--he really loved this filly. That's the biggest disappointment of it all because she's just getting better and better." Miss Isella has been entered in the Keeneland January Sale, but, "whether she goes in is another thing," said Wilkes.

Tattersalls December Sale Foal Sale

TATTS TRADE PICKS UP There were three sixfigure lots as trade stepped up a gear at yesterday's third foal session of the Tattersalls December Sale in Newmarket headed by hip 990, a 180,000gns Galileo (Ire) colt bought by pinhooker Timmy Hyde of Camas Park Stud in Co Tipperary. Hyde outbid Paddy Twomey for the colt, who was bred by Brian Hammond's Ashley House Stud, and sold from Trickledown Stud. "He was a grand horse and a good mover, and there's a fair chance he'll be resold next year; he'll probably come back here," said Hyde. "His sire has been flying ever since he started--he gets every sort of winner and really has taken over from the boss man [Sadler's Wells]." Yesterday's figures were again well short of their 2007 equivalents. The 3,381,100gns aggregate was down by 43 percent, the 22,244gns average by 36 percent and 13,000gns median by 41 percent. The clearance rate was 70.7 percent. Dalakahani (Ire), sire of GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Conduit (Ire), was another stallion to bring a six-figure price via hip 865, a colt bred by Frank Dunne and offered from Liam Cashman's Rathbarry Stud. Willie Browne of Meadowlands Stud outbid Ed Sackville for the colt at 115,000gns. "That was a little more than I intended to pay, but, as I've said before, I think there is more safety at the top level of the market," said Browne. "But the sire's flying, and these Dalakhanis are very hard to buy. The pedigree was quite decent, and I'd say he'll almost certainly be coming back here." Brown added, "I got 10 in Goffs last week, and also seven or eight in America. They've stayed out there and I'll probably sell more yearlings in the States next year; I just wonder if their economy might recover more quickly than ours, although I'm no economist."

Hip 831, a 110,000gns Invincible Spirit (Ire) colt, was the other to make six figures when agent Peter Doyle outbid Browne for the Shoreham Stud offering. "I've bought him for a client to resell next year. The individual is what really counts although of course it's also important that he's by a proven stallion," said Doyle. The sale continues today with a session starting at 10:30 a.m.

Honorable Mention...

Thursday's session topper heralded a brave new dawn for breeder Brian Hammond of Ashley House Stud in Devon. The Galileo colt out of the Mark of Esteem (Ire) mare Honorine, part of the Trickledown Stud consignment, was the first youngster to be of-

fered by Hammond's operation since a serious upgrading of his mares several years ago. The colt sold to Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud for 180,000gns.

"I got involved initially through racing syndicates then decided I wanted to breed my own," said Hammond. "I had a printing company in Exeter for 23 years and, for the last


five years of that, I was running the stud alongside it. I realised when I sold the company that the mares I had then weren't good enough, so I sold them all."

A meeting with pedigree consultant Michael Youngs led to he and Hammond teaming up in order to improve the quality of stock at Ashley House Stud, which is now home to four mares.

Hammond said: "Michael is very experienced and points me in the right direction. We bought fillies from the racetrack, so it's a long procedure. This is the first sale from my upgraded mares, so I'm delighted with that. I had no yearlings to sell this year, but next year the plan is to sell three.

"I have only a little stud and that's the way it's going to stay: small," Hammond added. "But we have everything there, and this was just what we needed to give us a push. We've had another bit of luck on the racetrack this year as one of the mares has Montmartre (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the family, and she has a nice filly to sell next year."

"The way the first few days of this sale went, we were very apprehensive today, and I wouldn't have been surprised if he had made only 40 or 50,000gns, not that I would have let him go for that," Hammond explained. "Being a small stud and running it as a business, I obviously have to have some money coming back in. I will reinvest some of it now and this will give me the

option of perhaps keeping something to race myself." One filly that has been retained already is Honorine's first foal, Early Morning Rain (Ire), an unraced two-yearold by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), who will remain in training next year. Honorine herself is currently in foal to Singspiel (Ire).


