New SH for a Top Synthetic Sire POINT GIVEN

MINORITY INTEREST IN CURLIN UNSOLD

A judge ruled Monday to reject the proposed bid for the 20-percent interest in reigning Horse of the Year

Curlin (Smart Strike), according to published reports. Curlin's majority owner, Stonestreet Stable's Jess Jackson, had offered to buy out embattled co-owners Shirley Cunningham and William Gallion, who race as Midnight Cry Stables, for \$4 million. But Circuit Judge Roger Crittenden yesterday ruled against the sale after lawyers representing Cunningham and Gallion objected, saying the offer was too low. The offer was based on an

assessment of Curlin's value by bloodstock consultant Ric Waldman, who estimated Curlin's worth at \$20 million in light of the current economic turmoil. Following that assessment, it was announced that Curlin would begin his stud career at Will Farish's Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky for a fee of \$75,000. Reached by phone yesterday, Farish said that the ruling didn't have any direct effect on Lane's End's agreement with Jackson to manage the horse. "We're just very pleased to have the horse, and we're only managing for the co-owners, whoever they may eventually be," said Farish. "That's really our only role in it." Curlin, who was paraded at Churchill Downs Saturday, arrived at Lane's End Sunday morning and is getting on well in his new environs, Farish reported. "He's in great shape," he said. "He's a little bit chilly, like everyone right now, but he had a good trip over and is settling in fine." Farish added that the newest addition to the Lane's End roster has attracted plenty of interest from breeders. "His book is filling up quickly--he's a popular boy," said Farish. Curlin's book will likely be capped around the 120 to 130 mark, but, Farish said, "We'll let him tell us as we get into the season." Yesterday's ruling means that, for the moment at least, both Cunningham and Gallion will remain partners in Curlin. The former attorneys were both disbarred after being found to have defrauded clients in a class-action lawsuit involving the diet drug fen-phen.

"SAOIRSE" STARS AT TATTERSALLS MONDAY

Trainer Jim Bolger's Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley), a dual Group 1 winner last season, was the star turn at the first breeding stock session of the Tattersalls December Sale in Newmarket last night when selling for 1.95 million guineas to John Ferguson, acting for Sheikh Mohammed. The

three-vear-old went on to run

third in this year's G1 1000

Guineas, and she stood out Monday. Ballylinch Stud's John O'Connor, James Wigan and underbidder Peter Doyle all went after the chestnut. "She won't run again, and we look forward to seeing her foals," said Ferguson. "We'd seen her at the races and she was a beautiful filly. To win both the [G1] Phoenix S. and [G1] Moyglare S., you have to be an exceptional two-yearold. Sheikh Mohammed has been lucky with Balanchine and West Wind (GB) from this family and, although we don't normally plan before buying a mare, the cross of a mare by (Mr. Greeley's sire) Gone West and Montjeu (Ire) produced Motivator (GB), so she could easily go to Montjeu's best son Authorized (Ire)." SPRINGSIDE UNDERGOES SURGERY

GII Demoiselle S. winner Springside (Awesome Again), who broke down after her 9 1/2-length victory at Aqueduct Saturday, shipped to the New Bolton Equine Medical Center Sunday, and underwent surgery yesterday. The two-year-old filly suffered a fractured right front pastern. "They're going to put screws in it," trainer Josie Carroll said. "I'm waiting to hear the results of the surgery; we don't have a prognosis at this point." A \$335,000 KEESEP purchase for James and Alice Sapara, Springside broke her maiden in her third start, then tried two turns for the first time in a Woodbine allowance Oct. 2 and galloped to a 10-length victory. She was sent off at 5-1 in the Demoiselle, her first conventional dirt start, and came flying from the back of the pack to win as much the best, but was injured and had to be pulled up just strides after the wire. Her record stands at 5-3-0-0, with earnings of \$190,163.

"I am happy with that," confirmed Bolger. "She is a very good filly and it is just a pity she got injured--she pulled muscles in her back. I was very happy with her in the 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, she just went wrong afterwards and that was unfortunate. She has a great pedigree, there is a lot of quality on her page and she is a really nice prospect as a broodmare. Her mother is still quite young, and Darley have her, too." O'Coileain added, "Maybe in 10 years' time I'll have a couple of Saoirse Abus out in the field, but for me she was too valuable to hold on to. I'm in the business of buying yearlings and will maybe invest in some after this." The sale continues today at 9:30 a.m.

Michel Zerolo of Oceanic Bloodstock was underbidder for the lightly raced three-year-old, for whom Grant Pritchard-Gordon and Jamie McCalmont also showed an interest, "She's for an established client and will probably join David Hayes, and hopefully, go for the Melbourne Cup next year," said de Burgh. "She will hopefully be the new Makybe Diva (GB). She had all the attributes to suit Australia, she's a lovely rangy filly without many miles on the clock, she stays and looks like she will improve physically. The Australian prize money is also outstanding." Successful in two of her four career starts, including the G3 Give Thanks S. at Cork in August, Unsung Heroine made rapid progress for trainer Tommy Stack. On only her third outing, the three-year-old chased home GI Breeders' Cup Turf victor Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani (Ire)) in the G1 St Leger in September, and she rounded off her 2008 campaign when a head second to Crystal Capella (GB) (Cape Cross (Ire) in the G2 Pride S. at Newmarket. 
Dancer is also far enough back in her pedigree to give plenty of choice about who she could go to," said Gold. "I don't know if she'll stay here or go to America--

foal to Pivotal (GB). "She will hopefully continue to build for the future of Newsells Park Stud, and she has the top-class bloodlines to help achieve that," said Warren. "The aim is to make the stud one of the leading nurseries in the country." Lodge Park Stud's Seamus Burns, breeder of G1 Epsom Derby winner New Approach (Ire) (Galileo), paid 450,000gns for Group 3 winner Grecian Dancer (GB) (Dansili) {GB}, who was covered by Galileo (Ire). "I loved her as a yearling when John Ellis sold her, then saw her at The Curragh and saw her today," said Burns. "Galileo's the boy now and whether she has a colt or a filly doesn't matter."



Just Say Noe...

The second Breeding Capital investment partnership managed by Simon Marsh, who purchased Dress Uniform (Red Ransom), a sister to G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Casual Look for \$550,000 at Keeneland November, secured dual Group 3 winner Noelani (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) for 420,000 guineas yesterday through Charlie Gordon-Watson. She was covered by Danehill Dancer (Ire). "She's a Group 3-winning full-sister to a champion (Namid {GB}) and in foal to a very good horse, and she's also be Indian Ridge, whose a very good broodmare sire," said Marsh. "The first Breeding Capital partnership finishes in 2010 and the new one will end in 2012. We raised the money for the new partnership from January to March and were oversubscribed." Profit fot Sparsholt Stud Filly...

Reid Coulter was delighted after watching lot 1629, Cooden Beach (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), realize a significant return for his client, Sparsholt Stud, when selling to Charlie Gordon-Watson for 170,000 guineas. Consigned by Coulter's Blueblood Stud, the eight-year-old daughter of Joyful (Ire)--in foal to Rail Link (GB) (Dansili {GB})--made a 165,000 guineas profit on the price paid by Sparsholt's owners Peter and Sally Hunt at Tattersalls in November 2005. The appreciation in value is largely attributable to the mare's first foal, Shaweel (GB) (Dansili {GB}), among the front rank of British-trained two-year-olds and winner of the G2 Gimcrack S. at Newbury in August. The Hunts established Sparsholt Stud in 2003 with only two mares. Coulter has been instrumental in the farm's success, buying mares on its behalf and advising on matings. "We only paid 5,000 guineas for Cooden Beach three years ago and she has done well for us in the interim," said Coulter, who consigned four lots during the session. "It is not a great year to sell, but it was the right time to sell her and she went for about what I expected. All in all, I'm happy with what the horses made today given that the market isn't particularly strong. Turning a profit like that on Cooden Beach certainly helps." Coulter and Sparsholt Stud are already looking ahead to next year's sale with Hidden Meaning (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), a half-sister to the ill-fated 1993 1000 Guineas runner-up Niche (GB) (Risk Me {Fr}), whose two-yearold colt Senor Mirasol (GB) (Deportivo {GB}) scored in a listed stake and was third in the G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte. "Hopefully, I have another like Cooden Beach for next year," Coulter said. "I paid 3,500 guineas for Hidden Meaning four years ago--she's the very first mare I bought for Sparsholt. She has done really well this year as the dam of the good two-year-old Senor Mirasol."

Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt, is out of the prolific stakesproducer Saganeca (Sagace {Fr}), making her a half-sister to G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud hero Sagacity (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}). "I love the pedigree; it is a wonderful pedigree that I think will go on and breeders are jumping into it," said Jacobs. "The Danehill Dancer colt foal she is carrying will be sold." Since the passing of his billionaire father in September, Jacobs, along with his stepmother Renata Jacobs, has taken on the responsibility of overseeing the family's bloodstock interests that include Newsells Park Stud in England, Main Chance Farm in South Africa and the German arm, Gestut Fahrhof. "At Newsells, we are trying to carry on as planned," added Jacobs. "It is a family operation, with my father's wife and myself running things. I have been running the family business [Jacobs Holding] for five years now, that keeps me busy, so horses are for the weekend." As well as overseeing a business empire that includes the world's largest raw chocolate producer, Barry Callebaut, Jacobs still finds time for the family's considerable breeding operation that has recently experienced an exciting development, the arrival of Newsells Park Stud's first stallion, G1 Eclipse S. winner Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). "We have 90 mares at Newsells here in England, 90 in South Africa and 70 in Germany, so it is quite an operation," said Andreas Jacobs. "It is very hard to work on the mating plan. Mount Nelson is already with us. It was always the plan to stand a stallion at Newsells, but it was important not to rush in. We wanted to know our mares better before we brought in a stallion. After seven or eight years experimenting, we felt that now was the time to stand a stallion. Financially, we probably should have done it a few years down the line, but you only live once and, for the development of the stud, the time to do it is now. My father was determined to get a stallion and it is sad that he is not here to see it happen. The stud will strongly support Mount Nelson, and we will be behind him for the long-term."



Dancesowell (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) could be on her way to Kentucky and the Brookdale Farm broodmare band after the hammer came down in favour of Joe Seitz at 100,000 guineas. Out of Italian Group 3 winner Aim For the Top (Irish River {Fr}), the four-year-old filly was consigned by trainer John Murphy's Highfort Stud. Lot 1699 won a 12-furlong maiden in Ireland last year and is a full-sister to G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up Dance To the Top (GB). Seitz, whose father Fred established Brookdale a mile outside of Versailles, Kentucky in 1983, is a regular visitor to Park Paddocks and was pleased to acquire the daughter of Sadler's Wells. "Plans for the filly are to be determined. I'll go away and think about options," said Seitz. "She made the list and was by a nice sire. It seems like Sadler's Wells is respected no matter where you go in the world; he has a fantastic reputation." When asked about the price, Seitz added, "I paid what I thought I would have to pay for a nice filly like this. The market seems to have adjusted a bit but quality is still sought after and is tough to buy. We've been coming here for 10 years now and it is just a great collection of horses with deep pedigrees from classic families."



Current Residence: Monrovia, CA. Jack O' Latern was coming off a victory in a \$75,000 maiden claiming race. What made you decide to take a shot in the Hollywood Prevue? Desperation! I have two colts in that category. We

were looking for a "non-winners other than" allowance and they didn't write any races. So I'm sitting with two horses and I didn't want to run them against each other, so I figured I'd run the other one in the next book and decided to run this one [Jack O' Latern] in the stake. I thought he'd keep his condition and I could run him back another time. Everybody killed each other off and we closed up the inside.

What is your biggest accomplishment since you've been involved in the business? Surviving for 45 years! Probably the best horse I ever trained was Reraise (Danzatore). I ran him one time and sold him before he won the 1998 Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Favorite television show? CNN.

What is your favorite vacation spot? We used to go to Alaska and it was the most beautiful place I had ever been. I recommend it to everybody. I flew into Anchorage and took a domed train to Fairbanks and went to Denali Park.

We intend to just hand-walk him [Tuesday], like today."

Winners of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile may have a virtual stranglehold on the Eclipse Award for two-year-old colt, but--with the notable exception of Street Sense--they have struggled to make an impact on the Kentucky Derby. The same can't be said of the Remsen S., which has provided five Derby winners in the last 50 years, thanks to Carry Back, Northern Dancer, Pleasant Colony, Go For Gin and Thunder Gulch.

Of course, only the last two won the Remsen after the Breeders' Cup came into existence, but the last 25 editions of the Aqueduct contest also feature such notable winners as Java Gold (Travers S., Whitney H.), Scan (a dual Grade I winner at three), Pine Bluff (Preakness S.) and Coronado's Quest (Haskell Invitational and Travers S.). Importantly, the most recent winners were Bluegrass Cat (Haskell Invitational and second in the Kentucky Derby and Belmont), Nobiz Like Shobiz (Wood Memorial) and Court Vision (winner of the Hollywood Derby two days ago). Not bad going, I'm sure you'll agree, for a race which was downgraded from Grade I to Grade II as long ago as 1987.

If Old Fashioned, this year's impressive winner, develops into a top-class three-year-old--and there's every reason to think he will--perhaps the Graded Stakes Committee will have to consider restoring the Remsen to Grade I.

The Taylor Made team is one outfit that won't be worrying whether the Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner or the Remsen winner makes the bigger impact next year, as Midshipman and Old Fashioned are both sons of Unbridled's Song. This 15-year-old stallion has been in great form with his two-year-olds in recent weeks, and Old Fashioned was one of four juvenile winners by him last Saturday. Altogether nine juveniles by Unbridled's Song won 10 races at maiden level or above during November and they have helped boost their sire's juvenile earnings to nearly \$2 million. One of them, Rockport Harbor's sister Song of Solomon, achieved TDN Rising Star" status at Philadelphia when she streaked home nearly 14 lengths clear. Old Fashioned had also been nominated a Rising Star after he'd put even more daylight between himself and the opposition at Delaware on his second start.

shortage of stamina. He appears to be a conventional-sized individual, even though his bloodlines had the potential to produce something very big. Unbridled's Song is 17 hands, which is understandable for a colt whose sire Unbridled, grandsire Fappiano and broodmare sire Caro Old Fashioned & trainer Larry Jones were all advertised as standing 16.3 hands. Seth Hancock has said

in the past that he wishes he had bred more big mares to Unbridled, who seemed to be suited by breeding type to type. Old Fashioned's breeders may have taken a similar view, as the colt's dam, the Kentucky Oaks third Collect Call, is by another 17-hands stallion in Meadowlake.

Unfortunately, Meadowlake's size was accompanied by soundness problems. The story goes that this son of Hold Your Peace was bought by his owner because he thought he looked like Secretariat. The resemblance seemed to be more than just a fancy when Meadowlake sailed home 22 lengths clear in a six-furlong maiden on his debut. This stunning debut led to his being pitched straight into Grade I company less than three weeks later, in the Arlington-Washington Futurity, and Meadowlake again drew comparisons with Secretariat by easing home the winner by nearly 9 lengths. Unfortunately he was seen out only once more, when he won a six-furlong allowance in the June of his second season.

Meadowlake's stallion career got off to a great start when Meadow Star, a member of his small first crop, achieved champion status by winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. It wasn't until Greenwood Lake emerged from his 10th crop that he came up with another Grade I winner, but he finished his career with a flourish, siring the Grade I-winning fillies Wildcat Bettie B, Meadow Breeze and Sutra in his last few crops. The best winner out of a Meadowlake mare prior to Old Fashioned was that eyecatching sprinter Henny Hughes.

I described Old Fashioned's dam Collect Call as a Kentucky Oaks third, but she was much more than that. Her May 20 birthday didn't stop her becoming a minor stakes winner at two, and she then progressed so well that she won the GIII Santa Ysabel S. on her sophomore debut and the British Columbia Oaks.

She was also placed twice at Grade I level at four, when she mixed it with the likes of Azeri, Affluent and Starrer. As she raced a total of 17 times, she was clearly much sounder than her sire.

Collect Call's first foal, the Fusaichi Pegasus filly Kauai Calls, sold for a session-topping \$2 million as a Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling in 2005.

Old Fashioned also sold very well, for \$800,000, but his year-younger half-brother by Ghostzapper was unsold at \$635,000 in September. Even with that setback, Collect Call has proved a wonderful purchase for Rod and Lorraine Rodriguez, who paid \$250,000 to acquire Collect Call in the September of her two-year-old season, at the Marshall Naify estate dispersal.

Perhaps the best thing about Collect Call is that she is bred along similar lines to that fine racemare Mitterand. This winner of the GI La Canada S. was by Hold Your Peace out of Bold Ruler's daughter Laredo Lass, whereas Collect Call is by a son of Hold Your Peace out of a daughter of Laredo Lass. Mitterand is nowadays best known as the dam of French Deputy, a good racehorse and an even better stallion. The Japanese star Kurofune and the top-class, but short-lived, Left Bank headed the impressive number of graded winners sired by French Deputy before his sale to Japan in 2000.

The presence in his pedigree details of a proven stallion of French Deputy's achievements will prove an invaluable help when the time eventually comes for Old Fashioned to retire. Before then, though, I'm expecting to see him continue to justify his Rising Star status, and it will be fascinating if both he and Midshipman make the line up next May 2.

The 16-year-old stallion has sired 20 group/graded winners to date, including yesterday's Tattersalls topper and champion Finsceal Beo (Ire).

The adjusted fees are: Empire Maker (Unbridled), \$75,000 live foal; Mizzen Mast (Cozzene), \$17,500 live foal; first defence (unbridled's song), \$17,500 live foal; and aptitude (a.p. indy), \$10,000 live foal.

TCA Establishes Retraining and Retirement Fund:


