





## TATTERSALLS CONCLUDES WITH QUIET DAY

Tattersalls' December Sale finished last night with a quiet breeding stock session. A three-year-old colt sold as a jumping prospect to top the trade at 65,000gns. Champion jockey Ryan Moore outbid agent Geoffrey



Howson for First Avenue (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}--Marciala {Ire}, by Machiavellian), a flat handicap winner for Michael Tabor and trainer Michael Jarvis. "Dad [trainer Gary Moore] had other things to do today, so asked me to come up and bid for this horse," explained Moore. "I think he'll be going hur-

dling, and he's shown a liking for soft ground. I'm not sure if Dad has an owner for him."

Thursday's session was representative of a sale which suffered major declines across-the-board. The December Sale turnover of 49,901,250gns was 51 percent down on last year, while the 11,000gns median, 45 percent down on 2007, was the lowest since 1998. The 39,138gns average dropped by 35 percent. There were bright spots, however. Well-bred, accomplished mares were, as ever, in demand, as witnessed by John Ferguson's sale-topping 1.95-million guineas bid for **Saoirse Abu** (Mr. Greeley) during Monday's opening session. Other highlights included the 1.8-million guineas **Lady Marian (Ger)** (Nayef) and the 1.7-million guineas **Princesse Dansante (Ire)** (King's Best). All three were session toppers and all purchased by Ferguson on behalf of Darley's Sheikh Mohammed.

"This has been a year of stark contrasts," said Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony. "The Tattersalls year began with record-breaking sales in February and at both the Craven and Guineas Breeze-Up sales, despite a sense of disguiet surrounding the economic outlook. The July Sale, although solid, did not match the levels of recent years, and as the sheer scale of the economic upheavals became apparent, the autumn sales season was approached with a degree of apprehension. Fortunately, throughout the 2008 sales season, the contribution from our overseas buyers has been outstanding, but the implications of a mismanaged domestic economy have been very evident. Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale displayed remarkable resilience, as did the Autumn Horses in Training Sale, but it has been clear over the last two months that the bloodstock industry is anything but immune from the impact of a global economy painfully short of confidence." BAUER WON'T BE DQ'D FROM CUP FINISH

The G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up **Bauer (Ire)** (Halling) will not be disgualified from a placing despite having been treated with shockwave therapy within seven days of the race, an infraction of the rules in Australia, the country's Racing and Sports reports. On Wednesday, it was revealed that stewards were investigating the matter after they learned that trainer Luca Cumani accepted the advice of a local veterinarian to treat Bauer on the Thursday before the Cup. Cumani later said he was unaware of the rule. According to Racing and Sports, the English-based Bauer was treated to his hindquarters in the Sandown quarantine center by Racing Victoria Limited veterinary surgeon Dr. Rob McInnes. RVL Chief Steward Terry Bailey said that stewards were confident the form of treatment did not significantly enhance Bauer's performance in the Cup and brought the matter to a close on advice of RVL's senior Queen's Counsel, Dr. Cliff Pannam. "That advice is that, in circumstances where the otherwise ineligibility of Bauer was caused as a result of actions taken by a veterinary surgeon specifically assigned by RVL to be responsible for the veterinary care of the visiting horse, and who Mr. Cumani for that very reason was entitled to assume was fully familiar with the Australian Rules of Racing, [the rule] can have no application," Bailey told the publication. "In these circumstances it is not open to RVL stewards to apply the rule." Bauer earned A\$835,000 in purse money.

Mahony continued, "The industry has experienced a prolonged period of unprecedented growth since the last downturn in the early 1990s, with sales turnover at Tattersalls growing by almost six times between 1992 and 2007. The key now is to adjust as quickly as possible to the prevailing market conditions. The combined British and Irish foal crops are at an all-time high, driven by the sustained growth of recent years, and the 2008 sales season has illustrated graphically that the market is unable to absorb the numbers. This is an observation which we made last year, and that was after a record-breaking December Sale. The need for adjustment is now rather more pressing, with the impact of the downturn being felt in all sectors of the industry.

"Even in a period of sharp declines it is, however, important to accentuate the positives. It would be fair to say that the 2008 December catalogue lacked the extraordinary strength and depth of 2006 and 2007, but buyers have consistently remarked that quality individuals were still very hard to buy.

"Our vendors have responded swiftly and positively to a challenging time as the market finds a new level, and the weaker currency looks set to benefit our multitude of overseas buyers for a while to come. The December Sale has, as ever, acted as a magnet for bloodstock professionals from all corners of the world, and we are enormously grateful for the support. We will, as ever, work tirelessly to ensure that the industry's confidence in us is repaid, and that Tattersalls continues to remain the focal point of the European bloodstock industry for both buyers and vendors alike."

#### JAPAN CUP DIRT CONTENDERS ON TRACK

The three foreign invaders for Sunday's main event were out for routine trackwork Thursday morning, a few hours before post positions were drawn for the nine-furlong event. **Tin Cup Chalice** (Crusader Sword),



winner of eight of his nine career starts, including a last-out victory in the Oct. 4 GII Indiana Derby, had Edgar Prado in the irons yesterday morning as he took two tours of the Hanshin main track. "He was very relaxed this morning during his exercise, the dirt feels good, and he seems to have recovered

from the long trip," the Peruvian commented. Tin Cup Chalice is owned, bred and trained by Mike Lecesse, who is pleased with how things have gone thus far.

"He looks good and I think he's gained 4 to 5 kilograms since he's left the quarantine station," he explained. "Since we found out he was going to race on a right-handed course, we breezed the horse a few times in that direction at home, and every work has been better." The bay will depart post eight on Sunday. IEAH Stable, Andy Cohen and Pegasus Holding Group's Frost Giant (Giant's Causeway), upset winner of the GI Suburban H. this past summer, drew an inside post in stall two and was guided through his work by Rudy Rodriguez. "He was more aggressive at the guarantine stables, but he's getting used to the environment here and looks comfortable, happy and relaxed," the exercise rider said. Regarding the right-handed course at Hanshin, he offered, "We just have to get used to the system--how they run over here. But I think the horse is used to it because he raced in England before he was brought to the U.S. The surface is much different and sandier, but I hope the horse likes it on the day he runs." Mast Track (Mizzen Mast) jogged one lap of the track, then schooled in the paddock and saddling area. The bay, who took the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in gateto-wire fashion in June, was partnered by Jose Cuevas yesterday morning. "He did some speed work yesterday, so he just jogged today," he said. "He moved very good and smooth." Mast Track was given post 13. Vermilion (Jpn) (El Condor Pasa) pulled stall number six for his title defense, while GII Peter Pan S. winner Casino Drive (Mineshaft) will leave from the 11 hole.

Since finishing third in his debut in July, Calder-based **Big Drama** has done little wrong. The son of Montbrook is on a four-race winning skein that includes the Dr. Fager S., Affirmed S. and In Reality S. divisions of the Florida Stallion Series, with each victory coming by daylight margins. He'll get a serious class test here by the likes of **Terrain**. That gelding was awarded the victory by DQ in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity in September, then proved his mettle with a second to Square Eddie in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and a good fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 25. He returns to the dirt for the first time since winning the Mountaineer Park Juvenile in early August. **Skipadate**, by contrast, will be making his first start on anything but grass. The Heiligbrodt colorbearer was beaten just two heads in the With Anticipation S. at Saratoga and GIII Summer S. at Woodbine, but was well back in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

Returned to trainer Dale Romans's base in Churchill after the Breeders' Cup, C. S. Silk resumed working right away and, if her morning drills are anything to go by, she is no worse for the wear for the trip out west. Livin Lovin completed the exacta in the GIII Mazarine S. at Woodbine in October, then broke through in the GIII Tempted S. at Aqueduct Nov. 2. Just Jenda is an interesting option. Trained by Larry Jones and owned by his wife Cindy, the chestnut miss romped in her debut at Philly Park in September, then put up a repeat performance in the Brandywine S. there Oct. 28, registering a ninelength dismantling over the slop.

"We are firm believers in the Canadian program and where it is heading. Marcavelly was a phenomenal racehorse at two and three. He is the total package with looks, talent, pedigree and class. I look forward to seeing his babies hit the ground, as we will be aggressively supporting him in the sales ring and on the race track, especially with the lucrative Ontario-sired

program in place." Sonbol admitted state-bred programs were targeted for Zayat Stable's new stallion prospects. "I think it's very important to look at the regional market, especially with the changes in purse structures," Sonbol said. "Not every horse fits in every region." As for how Marcavelly fits in the Canadian marketplace, he continued, "We ship some of our mares to Canada to foal and then we have no one to breed them back to. I think many of the Kentucky mares will find Marcavelly very attractive with his turf and Polytrack form. He has the pedigree and the looks. #### NYRA ANNOUNCES '09 STAKES SCHEDULE; BUMPS PURSES TO 13 GRADE I RACES The New


York Racing Association announced its 2009 stakes schedule, which includes an increase in purse for 13 Grade I events. The schedulewas approved by NYRA's Board of Directors at its monthly meeting yesterday and now awaits approval from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. The Grade I season in New York will kick off at Aqueduct on Saturday, Apr. 4, with the \$750,000 GI Wood Memorial for three-year-olds at nine furlongs and the \$300,000 GI Carter H. for three-year-olds and up at seven furlongs. The 141st running of the \$1-million GI Belmont S. will be held on Saturday, June 6. The biggest race of Belmont Park's Fall Championship Meet, the \$750,000 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational at a mile and a quarter, will be run on Saturday, Oct. 3. NYRA also announced it was renaming the Aqueduct H. in honor of Evening Attire (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), who won the race in 2002 and retired this year at the age of 10. 


