Oliver Peslier may have described Artiste Royal (Ire) (Danehill) as a "pick-up" mount, but the French jockey

certainly isn't unfamiliar with the seven-year-old contender for the G1 Hong Kong Cup. Artiste Royal began his career in France, where he was ridden five times by Peslier, including to victory in the Listed Prix Ridgway. After he was imported to the U.S., Artiste Royal captured the 2007 GI Clement Hirsch S. and the

2008 GI Charlie Whittingham H. Artiste Royal drew barrier two for Sunday's Cup. "It's a good draw and a nice ride to pick up," Peslier said. "I rode this horse to wins when he was in France and I won on his mother, too." Artiste Royal is out of the Manila mare Agathe, who was ridden by Peslier to victory in the 1994 G3 Prix Psyche de Psyche at Deauville.



post five. Trainer Michael de Kock was content with the assignment. "It's a good shot, but he's a versatile horse anyway," de Kock said. "He's fit as a fiddle and as good as I've ever had him." Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}), Hong Kong's reigning champion older horse and runner-up in last year's Hong Kong Cup, will break from barrier six. "It's an ideal gate which leaves lots of options for [jockey] Darren [Beadman]," said

trainer John Moore. "We've got the favorite [Eagle Mountain] drawn inside us, which is also a plus. I've never had him better--third time lucky, I hope." Viva Pataca was fourth in the 2006 Hong Kong Cup. Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was assigned post 10, creating a tepid response from trainer Jim Bolger. "It's not ideal, but I'll go there with no pre-conceived ideas," Bolger said of his filly's post. "There's no point in having a fixed plan," he added. "We'll leave it to [jockey] Kevin [Manning]." Balius (Ire) (Mujahid) will break from barrier 13 of 14, but his conditioner Carlos Laffon-Parias was unconcerned. "Not worried; he's not going to be on the lead anyway," Laffon-Parias said. Out of Control (Brz) (Vettori {Ire}), the Bobby Frankel trainee who has finished second in three Grade I events in the United States this year, drew the outside. Coverage cont. p2

CATHAY PACIFIC HONG KONG VASE-G1

Trainer Luca Cumani was on hand for the first time to see his G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Vase hopeful Purple Moon work out. Purple Moon worked over 1200 meters on the turf, culminating in a :24.3 split, and his trainer was more than pleased with him. "He looks great and we are very happy with him," said Cumani. "It was a non-event in the Japan Cup as he was impeded and there was no pace. His ninth position doesn't look very pretty, but in the end he was finishing strongly and was only beaten four lengths." Looking ahead, Cumani added, "The main worry on Sunday is the pace but we will have him in a better position than we did in Japan."

Also having recently arrived in Hong Kong was trainer Richard Gibson, who paid his first visit of the week to Sha Tin to oversee the final preparations of defending Vase champion **Doctor Dino** yesterday. The six-year-old worked on the all-weather track under his regular rider Eric Gandon. The chestnut, who looked to be taking a fair hold of the local surface, was caught in :25.8 over the last 400 meters. "He seems in good form," Gibson confirmed. "But the worry is that it might be a tactical race. He seems to me to be similar to the way he was last year. Of course he's a year older, but he hasn't lost any of his ability."

Jockey Darren Beadman reported that **Douro Valley**, despite apparent doubts surrounding his ability to go right-handed, had no problem coping with the change of direction Thursday from his usual anti-clockwise style in Melbourne. "He tracked very well on the right leg and he felt terrific to me," said Beadman. "I think he'll be hard to beat. He's 10 out of 10."

Andrew Balding, trainer of **Buccellati**, didn't seem too perturbed as his charge hung left during his spin up the all-weather track yesterday, though it seems punters can expect the four-year-old to finish closer to the stands' rails on Sunday. "He's a bit of a monkey and always does that," confirmed Balding. "It is nothing new. He's perfectly well."



"She's a classy filly. She breezed just before she left New York...She's all set. I'm just trying to keep her happy." Laragh, one of five supplementary entries in the lineup, will break from post two in a field of seven under Edgar Prado. "She's broken well every time she's run," said Terranova. "She has been a front-runner lately, but she would have no problem sitting off another horse if it wanted the lead." The grey is a winner of two of five starts and has amassed earnings of \$246,365 for co-owners IEAH Stable, Golden Goose Enterprises and Pegasus Holdings. "She's a good-feeling filly who loves to train," continued Terranova. "She's very smart, very aware, but not a nervous filly. She's very mature mentally. She's very easy to be around." As for home Terranova expects his star filly to perform Saturday, he added, "She couldn't be doing any better. She hasn't lied to us yet, so I don't expect her to now."

GRACE SHIPS IN FOR DAHLIA Grace and Power,

who shipped in from Maryland to run second behind Country Star in last year's GI Hollywood StarletS., has made the trip cross country once again, this time to run

in the GII Dahlia H., Hollywood's closing-day feature Dec. 21. "She's been here 10 days," confirmed trainer David Hofmans said of the three-year-old filly, who is owned by New York chef-restaurateur Bobby Flay. "That's why the owner sent her out to me: to run in the Dahlia." Grace and Power, previously trained by Steve Klesaris, comes off a fifth-place finish in an allowance race at Woodbine Nov. 23--her first start in six months.

"I met [Bobby Flay] once at the Breeders' Cup and he called me and asked if I could take the filly," said Hofmans. "She looks terrific. She's worked here once and will work one more time next week for the Dahlia." Looking ahead, Hofmans added, "She's had a prep race. She will probably stay here for the La Canada Series after the Dahlia." Victor Espinoza has the call.

ing runner to date is Advice, third in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity. Invincible Spirit (Ire) (Green Desert) set the previous record when he was represented by 35 first-crop winners in 2006.

FAIR GROUNDS CANCELS DUE TO SNOW Winter weather and track conditions forced the Fair Grounds to cancel its Thursday program with the New Orleans

PANEL LOOKS AT SAFETY ISSUES

Shortly after a panel of prominent veterinarians proclaimed that breakdowns continue to be the "Achilles Heel" of racing and that pre-existing conditions are a major factor in most fatalities on the racetrack, a panel

of industry representatives discussed some of the major initiatives that have been undertaken in recent months to improve equine health hand safety on Thursday afternoon in Tucson as the 35th annual Symposium on Racing and Gaming drew to a close.

The first panel, moderated by Kristin Hix, legal associate for The Jockey Club, featured Drs. Rick Arthur of UC-Davis and the California Horse Racing Board.

C. Wayne McIlwraith of Colorado Statue University and Sue Stover of UC-Davis, and it focused on the reporting and prevention of racing injuries.

Stover discussed an ongoing post-mortem program in California and said "we have learned a lot, and I'm optimistic that we have the opportunity to increase the prevention of injuries."

McIlwraith talked about his work with Dr. Mick Peterson, a mechanical engineer at the University of Maine. Arthur said, "If there's one takeaway from today, it's that 90 percent of the catastrophic musculoskeletal injuries we see have pre-existing pathology at the injury site...I said it 20 years ago at this conference and I'll say it again: breakdowns are the Achilles Heel of racing."

All three vets were encouraged that ongoing research studies, necropsy programs and new tools such as the Equine Injury Database and a pre-race veterinary exam module offered by InCompass, can and will decrease equine injuries.

Hix provided an update on the Equine Injury Database that The Jockey Club launched in July. To date, as of December 1, 74 racetracks representing 80 percent of the total racing days in North America have signed up to participate, and there are more than 6,000 injury reports in the database.

The second panel, moderated by Dan Fick, executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club, featured Ed Bowen (representing the Thoroughbred Safety Committee), Bob Elliston, executive chairman of the NTRA, and Tom Ludt, chairman of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Thoroughbred Action Committee.

Fick and Bowen provided summaries of the history, mission and accomplishments of the Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summits and the Thoroughbred Safety Committee, respectively.

"In my view, the industry is attuned to the need for reform," Bowen said.

Ludt talked about TOBA's Thoroughbred Action Committee and cited TOBA's plans to enact a grass-roots campaign on the local level in 2009.

"We want to put more pressure on states and racing commissions," he said. "Our goal is to have a TOBA rep at every state racing commission meeting in 2009."

Elliston covered the establishment and initiatives of the NTRA's Safety and Integrity Alliance, citing implementation (of recommendations), compliance and industry buy-in as key ingredients to its success.

The symposium drew approximately 700 attendees, according to Doug Reed of the University of Arizona Race Track Industry Program, which hosts the event.

WHO'S BIG BROTHER?

"Pick up the trades on any given day and [try to] figure out who Big Brother is," Ed Martin, president of the ARCI began this panel session, which dealt with federal and state alternatives in the wake of the 2008 congressional hearings. These hearings put racing under the microscope, and many of the stakeholders worried about Big Brother.

The first panelist, Fred Pope, offered the alternative of changing the current Interstate Horseracing Act.

"The truth of the matter is racing is more involved with government than any other sport, and it's at the core of our industry," said Pope. He suggested that the IHA make the following changes: to change "horsemen" to "race horse owners," to eliminate the approval of horsemen in receiving state, and to mandate that host tracks and purse accounts receive 50 percent of off-track bets. "The tracks will [have] greater incentive to package and promote their product," said Pope.

Jay Hickey, president of the American Horse Council, suggested that we should be worried about Big Brother, but added "every organization should work together... we can do it on our own."

Regarding medication use, Hickey said the same arguments being made 30 years ago are being made now. The difference, in Hickey's words, is "potential public pressure."

In response to Pope's talk, Hickey worries about changing the IHA. "It's not easy to pass federal legislation, and the process might be worse than the cure," said Hickey.

The final panelist, Rick Masters, offered a potential alternative to federal regulation in the form of interstate compacts. The benefits of these compacts are efficiency, flexibility, and they avoid federal intervention.

"Compacts should be used as a middle ground instead of Big Brother," said Masters. To conclude, Martin posed the question, "Could we have a revolution in every state?"

"[We could] amend the IHA to make states able to have compacts," said Masters.

Pope, however, had a different opinion. "Too many people have the power to say no."

"[There is] no way to pass federal legislation if the industry is not on the same page," added Hickey.

Bluntly, we will review every aspect of every sale, which may well result in a contracted sales program in 2009. This will lead to some tough decisions, both internally and externally, but they will not be shirked as our ultimate goal must be to ensure that Goffs remains strong and vibrant in order to continue to serve the needs of the Irish and global bloodstock community." Heading yesterday's trade was a weanling colt by Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill) consigned by Confrey Stud. Out of Silver Pursuit (GB) (Rainbow Quest), a full-sister to the 1995 GI Santa Anita H. winner Urgent Request (Ire), hip 671 was purchased by Louise Walshe for €18,000. Ken Condon paid €11,000 for the Derrinstown-consigned hip 552, the two-year-old colt Quiet Ocean (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) out of the 1997 G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Asfurah (Riverman), and that price was matched shortly after by Bobby O'Ryan for a member of the same draft in hip 555, the winning three-year-old colt Takween (Ire) (Nayef). Beeby reflected on the tumultuous year when adding, "By any standards, 2008 has been an extraordinary year and will undoubtedly be remembered for all the wrong reasons. As an independent bloodstock auction house run by lifetime industry professionals, we have been and are in this together and will work through this current downturn with the industry as we have done in the past.
