BAFFERT PAIR WORK FOR FUTURITY

Trainer Bob Baffert, who enjoyed a two-three finish in Saturday's GI Hollywood Starlet, expects to have a onetwo punch again in next Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park. Baffert confirmed both Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker) and Ventana (Toccet) for the race after the pair worked at Santa Anita Sunday. Pioneerof the Nile went five furlongs in :59.60 and stablemate Ventana worked a bullet six furlongs in 1:11.40. Corey Nakatani was aboard for both. Nakatani will ride Ventana in the Futurity, while Garrett Gomez has the call on Pioneerof the Nile. "Ventana is speed and Pioneerof the Nile is more of a stalker," Baffert said, "Ventana has been disappointing, but today was the best work I've seen. He's a big fast horse, and we'll let him go out. The way speed is carrying [at Hollywood], like yesterday in the Starlet, we'll see how far he can take them." Ventana, a first-out winner at Belmont in September, is coming off a third-place effort in the Nov. 23 GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Pioneerof the Nile, a maiden winner over the Saratoga lawn in August, was third in the Oct. 4 GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and is coming off a close-up fifth-place finish in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "He looks awesome," Baffert said. "He deserves to to be the favorite." Others expected for the Futurity: Azul Leon (Lion Heart), Chocolate Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}), J. P. Jammer (Old Topper), I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even), Frumious (Grindstone), Axel Foley (Officer) and Backbackbackgone (Put It Back).

Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Cup cont. Knocking at the Door...

Eagle Mountain, who began his career in the Aidan O'Brien stable, was the seven-length victor of the G2 Juddmonte Beresford S. at the Curragh as a juvenile, then annexed the G2 Royal Whip S. by 2 1/2 over the same course at three. He had always come up a bit short in Group 1 company, however, as he was second to Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the Epsom Derby,

third to Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Irish Derby and was nosed-out when runner-up to Literato (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}) in the Emirates Airlines Champion S. After the tough beat in the Champion S., Eagle Mountain was transferred to Michael de Kock's shedrow, but was soon injured and forced to

the sidelines. De Kock had the four-year-old in sharp form for his return in the Joel S. before Eagle Mountain was second best to Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) in the Breeders' Cup after leading in the stretch. Eagle Mountain's connections were seeking their second Group 1 victory in Hong Kong this year as de Kock, owner Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and jockey Kevin Shea had already teamed up with Archipenko (Kingmambo) to win the Group 1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in April.

A Clear View...

Eagle Mountain was away midpack and raced in the two path while sixth around the first bend. Shea then guided Eagle Mountain to the outside up the backstretch and kept his mount in the clear around the far turn. With 400 meters remaining at the top of the stretch, Shea got to work and Eagle Mountain responded emphatically to take command within a sixteenth of a mile. Balius closed stoutly to the outside, but couldn't get near Eagle Mountain. "I am very thrilled to win this, especially as it didn't go exactly to plan," Shea said.

"We had to resort to Plan B. I was wide on him, and he was mucking around a bit turning for home," Shea continued. "But when I pulled him out to challenge, he picked up really well." De Kock said the time off may have benefitted Eagle Mountain. "I knew he was in great shape coming into the race," de Kock said. "Maybe his injury was a blessing in disguise as he had



an enforced rest and the chance to mature. He came here a fresh horse. He ran a massive race in America and has come on again. He'll go back to Dubai and we'll decide which race to aim him for. I've thought for a while he might be as good as Archipenko and Sun Classique [Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}], and after today he may even be better." The sailing wasn't as smooth for Viva Pataca, who raced towards the rear early and couldn't find room until there were 150 meters left. The favorite split horses, then

angled over to the rail and rallied to grab fourth from Bullish Luck in the final strides. "I was hammered at the 1000-meter mark," lamented Viva Pataca's jockey Darren Beadman. "We were knocked around from pillar to post." Out of Control (Brz) (Vettori {Ire}), representing the Bobby Frankel barn, was marooned out in post 14 and was caught eight paths from the inside rail on the first turn and raced evenly in the stretch to finish seventh. "That was a good run, but his draw in 14 didn't help us," said jockey Garrett Gomez. "He was very wide, but that is the luck of racing." Artiste Royal (Ire) (Danehill), trained by Neil Drysale, was able to save ground from post two, but lacked room at the top of the lane and was 11th after lacking the needed rally. "It was like an apprentice race: interference all over, and I got no breaks at all," said his jockey Oliver Peslier. It was last year's champ Good Ba Ba leading home a 1-2-3 for the locals as foreign invaders, including GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Kip Deville (Kipling) and G1 1000 Guineas heroine Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}), failed to land a blow. Good Ba Ba's victory in the 2007 renewal of the Mile, which came by a short head over Creachadoir (Ire) (video), was the second in a five-race winning streak that was capped by a victory in the G1 Champions Mile Apr. 27. The skein was broken with a well-beaten try in the G1 Yasuda Kinen in Japan June 8, and following a few months rest, he could do no better than sixth in the Listed Sha Tin Trophy Oct. 26 and third in the Listed Cathay Pacific International Mile Trial here Nov. 23. Still, trainer Andreas Schutz said in the week leading up to this that Good Ba Ba was back to his best, and that proved to be the case.

Good Ba Ba was content to race under cover in midpack as the 65-1 bomb Egyptian Ra led the charge. Natagora was well-placed in the slipstream of the pace-

setter, but a headstrong Kip Deville was forced to race wide in fourth and was never able to settle. Good Ba Ba was behind a wall of horses as they made the right-hand turn into the stretch, but his pilot, Christophe Soumillon, was a picture



of poise and patience. Once Soumillon was able to move to the outside at the 300-meter mark, Good Ba Ba did the rest, unleashing a devastating turn of foot and rolling home much-the-best in course-record time.

Soumillon, who was replacing jockey Olivier Doleuze, was effusive in his praise. "I have ridden some horses with a good turn of foot, and maybe he's not Zarkava (Ire), but winning this race today for the second time makes him the best miler in the world," he said. "I'm very happy to have won the race, but I'm feeling sorry for Olivier, but these things happen in racing."

Schutz added, with a wry smile and referring to Good Ba Ba's disappointments in the Yasuda Kinen, "As for the future, we'll go for the big races here and think about Dubai, but not Japan!"

Kip Deville cornered wide turning into the stretch and by the 400-meter pole was already struggling for run. He wound up ninth. "It was just the wrong way 'round for him, and he was never tracking comfortably," said rider Cornelio Velasquez. Garrett Gomez, on the other half of the American entry in the race, Awesome Gem (Awesome Again), echoed that sentiment. "He was lost out there, he was changing his legs, he was confused," said Gomez, who finished 12th on Awesome Gem.

The race favorite, Armada (NZ) (Towkay {Aus}), loomed a threat in the lane, but just couldn't match strides with Good Ba Ba. "Very disappointing," said jockey Douglas Whyte. 

The well-travelled Doctor Dino, Group 1-placed in six countries, returned to Hong Kong to defend his 2007 Vase title by a half-length over the unlucky Purple



Moon. The French-bred was forced to trail the field behind a slow pace after breaking from the outside. Turning into the straight, Doctor Dino began making up ground under Olivier Peslier and overtook Purple Moon inches from the line. "He moved well down the back straight, and being on the outside helped him," Peslier said. "He takes a little time to wind up, but the horse who came at me on the outside [Jaguar Mail] also helped me." Winning trainer Richard Gibson added, "Doctor Dino has joined an elite band of

horses to win this race twice. He's a very unique, powerful athlete and I am very proud of him." The narrow loss was another tough beat for the Luca Cumanitrained Purple Moon, who missed by just a half-length in last year's G1 Melbourne Cup and was coming off a ninth-place finish in the Nov. 30 G1 Japan Cup. Cumani was not discouraged by the loss. "I am very proud with the way the horse ran," Cumani said. "I don't mind when they get beaten when they run to their very best." Purple Moon's rider Jamie Spencer was also satisfied with his mount's effort. "He has done nothing wrong; it was a big step up on his effort in Japan," Spencer said. "He was the winner everywhere bar the line."



Doctor Dino, winner of last year's GI Man O' War S. at Belmont Park, was making his sixth start of the year. The chestnut was third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March before winning the G2 Gran Prix de Chantilly. He had been off since running fifth in the Oct. 4 GI Canadian International. Click for

"It's a surprise, but it was a gem of a ride from Darren [Beadman] as he was able to tuck in behind them,"



Moore continued. "He has always shown abundant speed and today he had the right run." Favored Apache Cat was forced to wait for running room, but finished well to be third. The favorite's trainer, Greg Eurell, said, "No excuses, he hit a flat spot as he always does in his races, but then he ran on again, but just didn't have enough petrol in the tank today."




