

BAFFERT DOUBLE-FISTED IN CASHCALL Trainer Bob Baffert will saddle a pair of colts--



and Ventana (Toccet)--in Saturday's \$750,000 GI CashCall Futurity as he seeks a record-equalling fourth victory in the contest. The three-time Eclipse Award-winning conditioner previously won with Real Quiet in 1997, Captain Steve in 1999 and Point Given in 2000. Pioneerof the Nile, third in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity before running fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will break from post five with Garrett Gomez in the irons. His stablemate will have the services of Corev Nakatani and has drawn the eight hole. "Ventana is speed, and Pioneerofthe Nile is more of a

stalker," said Baffert. "Ventana has been disappointing...He's a big fast horse, and we'll let him go out. The way speed has been carrying, we'll see how far he can take them." The trainer added, "Pioneerof the Nile will run farther. He looks awesome. He deserves to be the favorite." Fellow CashCall hopeful Chocolate Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}), winner of the Real Quiet S. over track and trip Nov. 8, was timed in :52.40 for a halfmile breeze at Santa Anita vesterday morning.

BREEDERS' CUP CONFIRMS CONTINUATION OF 2009 STAKES PROGRAM

The Breeders' Cup Board of Directors has confirmed the continuation of its stakes program for 2009. "We temporarily suspended the Breeders' Cup stakes program last week with the goal of achieving a balanced budget for 2009 in the face of declining revenues," said Breeders' Cup Chairman William S. Farish Jr. "Since then, we have been urged by a number of leading nominators and Trustees to reconsider. Given the economic circumstances of our breeders, and with our goal of being responsive to our nominators, we have listened and have authorized a portion of the Breeders' Cup reserve funds be made available to maintain the stakes program in 2009." Details of the stakes schedule, as well as the Breeders' Cup Challenge program, will be announced early next year.

Among the leading breeders to voice an opinion on the matter was John Sikura, president of Hill 'n' Dale Farms. He termed the initial decision announced on Dec. 12 "ill-advised," but was pleased that the Breeders' Cup Board heeded the outcry. "I think that the reaction of the Board was an acknowledgment that the membership did not agree with the decision, and that the decision to reinstate was based solely on the reaction of the membership," said Sikura. "It had a full and complete effect on the reevaluation." Sikura continued, "At the very least, if you're planning to change a program, you have to do so based on actual projections. I feel that since people have paid to the Breeders' Cup program for 2008, that there's a group of benefits that you receive by your inclusion in the membership. And since they're already paid for, it's hard to change, for lack of a better word, the benefit package after you've cashed the check. I hope and trust that the decision in its wording--that we'll fund through 2009 and then we'll no longer fund it--isn't a fait accompli. I don't think that's a given, nor do I think that it's something that will be accepted just because it is stated. If it turns out that it's an impossible program to run and the economy continues to decline and you can't keep pace with commitments then you have to take a look at all of vour various programs. I'd rather be an optimist and say we're working towards a goal of increasing revenues, and we're going to do everything that we can to continue funding all of our significant racing programs." Sikura continued, "I do agree, at the very least, that you have to make the commitment through 2009. I've



expressed both privately and publicly that once you make a commitment, racetracks, horsemen and owners are depending on purses as funded because they were promised. You can't, in the first week of December, decide that January is a new day, and we will not honor our commitments.

"For me, the overriding issue was the fact there is abundant reserves to more than cover this shortfall. Those reserves--I happen to think they are excessive--



I think that the role of the reserves is not to participate in investment markets and try to grow them. I feel that the contract of the breeders who give you this money is to engage this money in our business, and be proactive to support purses and to promote racing. But even if you have the right to take a portion of these monies to pursue other activities, there's plenty of funds to cover this emergency. If you say it's a rainy day fund, then it looks to me that we're in the midst of a flood. That's when you have to engage the money.

"I'm very happy that there was resolution and, hopefully, this sends a message to people that have felt powerless and excluded in the organization that if enough people have a uniformity of thought--a position that they rally behind--that the Board is open to considering the strong feelings of the constituents. So if you're reactive that way, then I think it sends a positive message. When people engage and express an opinion, and enough of them do, it looks like it can have an effect, and I think it's something to be optimistic about."

FOR NAYEF SEASONS, A LAST CHANCE AT AUCTION Young sire Nayef got off to a quick start at

stud with horses like Group 1 winners Lady Marian (Ger) and Tamayuz (GB) emerging from his first crop. The three-year-old Lady Marian won the G1 Prix de l'Opera in her most recent and subsequently sold to Sheikh Mohammed for 1.8-million guineas at Tattersalls. Tamayuz, also three, captured the G1 Prix Jean Prat. Nayef has also been represented by Group 2 winner and G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Spacious (GB), stakes winner Magic

Eye (Ire) and a handful of other stakes horses.

Demand for the Gulch stallion, then, figured to be high for 2009. That proved doubly so when Shadwell, which stands Nayef at its Nunnery Stud in England, announced that he would stand for just £15,000 in the upcoming season and would have his book set at around 95 mares. Shadwell reserves about 35 of those slots for close associates, with the 60 open to outside mares. Demand was so strong that Shadwell received some 360 applications for Nayef.

After hand-picking 55 mares, there were just five spots left in Nayef's book. That's when Shadwell decided to do things a bit differently. Instead of saying no to the vast majority of the 305 applications left,

Shadwell opted to let the free market, via the internet, work its magic.

"We were obviously delighted by the interest in Nayef for 2009, but at the same time very disappointed that we could not provide more people with nominations when his book closed," explained Shadwell Stud Director Richard Lancaster. "As a way of helping those breeders that did not get a nomination, we decided to use the online

Thoroughbred auction website chepstows.com as an opportunity for those breeders to secure a Nayef nomination. The result has been a great success."

Through chepstows.com, the five nominations sold at $\pounds 29,000, \pounds 28,000, \pounds 27,500, \pounds 27,500$ and $\pounds 25,500$, with the final nomination selling Tuesday afternoon.

BROWNIE POINTS RETIRED, GOING TO STREET CRY Pin Oak's graded stakes winner Brownie Points (Forest Wildcat--Stylish Society, by Forty Niner) has been retired, according to *Daily Racing* Form. The versatile five-year-old mare is booked to Street Cry (Ire). Second to Hystericalady in the



GIII Azeri BC S. Mar. 9 at Oaklawn in her 2008 opener, the chestnut split Zenyatta and Ginger Punch as the runner-up in the GI Apple Blossom H. the following month before getting her picture taken in the GIII Ouija Board Distaff H. on the turf at Lone Star in May.

The homebred later defeated males in the DeBartolo Memorial BC H. in September, "She won stakes at two, three, four and five, and she won stakes on the dirt and on the turf," trainer Donnie Von Hemel told DRF. "She was just a great mare, one of the best we've had a chance to train. We'll miss her a lot." A daughter of MSP Stylish Society, Brownie Points compiled a record of 27-9-8-4 while earning \$951,230. In addition to her eight black-type triumphs, she placed in six graded events aside from her Apple Blossom effort. "Some of her best races might not have been her winning races," Von Hemel added. "She ran second in the Apple Blossom to Zenyatta, beating last year's champion mare, Ginger Punch. Winning the race at Lone Star this year, the graded stakes, I think that was big for her, and beating the boys at Remington was fun, too."

VLTS PROPOSED AT BELMONT In his executive budget proposal released Tuesday, New York Gov. David A. Paterson has proposed allowing video lottery terminals at Belmont Park, a move that he hopes will help close a massive \$15.4-billion deficit facing the Empire State. Paterson believes a VLT facility at Belmont could net the state \$370 million in franchise fees that could be put toward the state's 2010-11 budget. VLTs have already been approved for Aqueduct and are slated to be installed in the coming year by Delaware North. A potential adversary of Paterson's proposal is fellow Democrat Sheldon Silver, the influential state assembly speaker from Manhattan. Silver has stated his opposition to slots at Belmont, citing its close proximity to Aqueduct. The two tracks are located nine miles apart.

PROUD TOWER TOO BACK IN TRAINING Proud

Tower Too (Proud Irish), who began his stud career last season at Tommy Town Thoroughbreds in California, is back in training and connections are hoping the sixyear-old can return to Dubai in March for the G1 Golden Shaheen. Trained by Sal Gonzalez for owner/breeder



Daniel Cardenas's Tricar Stable, Proud Tower Too won the 2006 Golden Shaheen, as well as the 2005 GI Malibu S. He retired in the fall of 2007 after reinjuring a tendon and was bred to 18 mares in 2008, with all 18 reported in foal. "He looked so

good in the middle of the year

that we decided to train him," Gonzalez explained. "He's not had any problems since then. He's a natural racehorse. The minute I put him back on the track, all he wanted to do was gallop." Proud Tower Two worked six furlongs at Sunland Park Dec. 12 in 1:16.40 and could be back in action at the New Mexico track in the coming weeks. "Our plan is to go forward and run him when he is ready, in the next two to three weeks, and hopefully make the trip back to Dubai," Gonzalez continued. "We want to go back to Dubai because we liked it so much. We're hoping he stays sound." To date, Proud Tower Too has hit the board in 14 of 22 starts with seven wins and earnings of \$1,735,572.
