three furlongs in :35.60 over Hollywood's Cushion Track Thursday. The John Best trainee will be making his third career start in Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity. He is coming off a maiden win over Lingfield's all-weather track Oct. 15. "We sent Square Eddie to run in the GI Lane's End Futurity in Kentucky and sold

him before the race to J. Paul Reddam," explained Best assistant Martin Smith. "We're doing a similar thing with this horse. A few people have inquired, but nothing has been decided."

THE FAST AND THE "FRUMIOUS"

Speedy Northern California invader **Frumious** (Grindstone) will put a three-race winning streak on the line when he takes on a deep field in Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood.

Trained by Jeff Bonde, the dark bay debuted in the Solano County Juvenile S. in July, and ran well to finish

third after dueling through rapid fractions of :21 1/5 and :43 4/5. After enjoying a clear lead in the stretch, he got leg weary late, and crossed the wire 2 3/4 lengths behind the winner.

"It was a disappointing day because we thought he could win," Bonde said of his charge's unveiling. "Somehow, he

stepped on his shoe in the gate--the starter handed us the shoe after the race--so he only ran with three. He came up with a bit of a shin after the race, so we backed off him for a bit. That was his only loss and he's done everything right since." **Cont. p2**

BREEDERS REACT TO CUP DECISION

Following outcry from owners and breeders, the Breeders' Cup announced Tuesday that it would reinstate its stakes program which supplements stakes purses at tracks throughout North America. Despite this aboutface, some breeders remain dissatisfied with how the Breeders' Cup handled the issue and have lingering concerns about the long-term viability of the stakes program.

"I was horrified," breeder Peter Blum said of the Breeders' Cup's initial decision to eliminate the program. "It was beyond comprehension. Helping as many people as possible is a lot more important than just helping the most wealthy."

Blum says he may cease to nominate his horses to the Breeders' Cup, fearing the program will be suspended after 2009.

"Unless there are some changes, I'm seriously considering not nominating because I think the actions have been totally irresponsible," Blum said. "It was reinstated, but how do I know they won't do the same thing again? There was going to be so much pressure exerted that they had no choice but to reinstate it. They basically violated the rights of people [who had previously nominated]--and they knew it."

Blum also said he knows other breeders who may decide to no longer nominate their horses, but declined to give names.

William Heiligbrodt, an owner and breeder from Texas, expressed the same concern about the health of the stakes program, which he sees as important to "regional" participants.

Heiligbrodt, a trustee for Breeders' Cup Ltd, said he has "financial information that indicates [the Breeders' Cup has] decisions to be made on how they spend their money." Possible actions include reducing purses for the two-day World Championships and/or cutting funding for the stakes program--or eliminating it completely.

Frumious resurfaced in a 12-deep maiden special weight going five furlongs at Golden Gate Sept. 21 (<u>Video</u>), and fought his way clear following a :21 2/5 opening quarter to graduate by a half-length.

"He broke his maiden over some decent colts from L.A. that came up," Bonde offered. "Craig Dollase had a nice baby in there and Pete Miller had a couple in there, too. We thought he ran a creditable race that day. He probably was a work short, too."

Things didn't go quite as smoothly for the George and Mary Clare Schmitt colorbearer in his next start--a six-furlong first-level \$32,000 optional claimer Oct. 23 (Video)--but the result was still the same. Already a handful for jockey Chris Landeros while racing on the lead in the early stages, Frumious became even more unruly as a riderless horse split him and another rival down the backstretch to take the lead. Floated out seven wide by that foe at the top of the straight, Frumious continued to race on gamely down the center of the course to score by a length.

"A horse lost his rider leaving the gate and carried him to the outside fence," Bonde recalled. "He probably ran an eighth of a mile further that day than anybody else did, and he still won. That made everybody in Northern California think he was something worth watching."

Stretched to a mile in his latest Golden Gate test Nov. 13 (<u>Video</u>), Frumious enjoyed a clear lead through fractions of :22 3/5 and :46 3/5, was challenged on the turn for home, and had another gear for the stretch, spurting away to take it by two lengths.


"The kid [Landeros] let him run away from there and then got him to relax up the backside," Bonde said. "I thought his first quarter was a little quick, but he seemed to have plenty left."

All systems appear to be a go for Saturday, based on the Cal-bred's six-furlong bullet over the Hollywood Cushion in a sharp 1:11 4/5 Dec. 12. Conditioner Craig Dollase has been overseeing Frumious's preparations since his arrival from Northern California two weeks ago. Jockey Victor Espinoza, who was aboard for the move, will ride Frumious for the first time in the Futurity.

"He worked very well," Bonde said of the move. "He went slow early and kicked strong late. His last eighth was in :11 1/5. Craig was quite impressed and Espinoza felt the same way. Strong finish, relax early and kick late; we're hoping we'll get that kind of race out of him."

With plenty of early speed entered, the horseman is confident that his charge can relax in the early going.

"I never thought he was a run-off type of horse," he said. "I think he's rateable. Pace makes the race. If they're going too fast, naturally you don't want to be in front."



The first foal out of the unraced Gold Legend mare Eternal Legend, Bonde purchased the son of the 1996 Kentucky Derby winner as a yearling for \$17,000 at last year's Barretts January sale.

"He's an impressive horse to look at," Bonde said. "Good-sized animal and pretty well-conformed. He's jet black with a white muzzle. He's just a nice-looking individual."

Bonde, a staple on the Northern California circuit since the 1970s, learned his trade working for conditioner Jerry Dutton before taking out a trainer's license in 1973 at the age of 19. The 54-year-old campaigned Spain (Thunder Gulch) to a trio of Grade I placings and a fourth-place effort in the 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies before she was transferred to Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Along with Spain, Bonde also considers GSW Mr. Doubledown (Alwuhush) as the best to ever walk his shedrow. --S.S.

Breeders React to Cup Decision (cont. from p1)

"I would like to see a balance between the [World Championships and stakes program]," Heiligbrodt said. "For the horses bred in Texas or outside Kentucky, the best benefit comes from this stakes program. But the Breeders' Cup needs to determine what the people who are paying the fees want. I don't think everybody understands these numbers, including me. I'm hoping there won't be a material deterioration in the nomination fees so we can have both--like we did in 2008--on a comfortable basis."

Another breeder, Rob Whiteley of Liberation Farm in New Jersey, said he was disappointed with how the Breeders' Cup handled its initial decision to eliminate the stakes program.

"Not providing a foreshadowing or a detailed rationale for the decision was a pretty serious error," Whiteley said. "It certainly doesn't make sense to make the people who write the checks angry, then go back to them and ask for more money."

Whiteley wasn't surprised that breeders like Blum were upset at the Breeders' Cup's decision to suspend the program after nomination fees had been paid, but believes the discourse the initial announcement generated may prove to be beneficial to racing.

"When people have expectations, the disappointment will be big," Whiteley said. "If there is a silver lining in this, it may be that a line of communication has been opened up other than business as usual." -Jon Forbes

Breeders' Cup Defends Investments

The Breeders' Cup has posted a memorandum on its web site in the wake of criticism of its investment strategy. (Click here for the complete memo). According to figures in the memorandum, the Breeders' Cup portfolio outperformed the S&P 500 by more than 11 percentage points on a year-to-date basis through Nov. 30, 2008. In the memo, Breeders' Cup chief financial officer Matthew Lutz attributed much of that outperformance on "the decision by the Investment Committee to overweight fixed income securities beginning in the third quarter of 2007, thereby reducing the portfolio's exposure to the market's declines in equity values in 2008." The memorandum also states that the current balance in reserves is \$30.3 million.

HKIR WINNERS SET TO VENTURE ABROAD

Two of the locally based winners of Group 1 events at last Sunday's Hong Kong International Races, as well as the luckless Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}), are being seriously considered for an overseas trip during the early part of the new year. Good Ba Ba (Lear Fan), who successfully defended his title in the G1 Hong Kong Mile, could be aimed at a start in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Mar. 28, pending the approval of owner John Yuen, who is reportedly personally adverse to travel, but has allowed trainer Andreas Schutz to ship the gelding to Japan twice for a pair of failed attempts in the G1 Yasuda Kinen. "The one thing I'd definitely say is that we won't go to Japan again," Schutz told South China Morning Post. "But the race in Dubai is worth a lot of money and I think it's something we need to think seriously about," he added, referring to the \$5million pot for the Duty Free. Trainer John Moore is looking Down Under for a possible next start for Inspiration (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), who shocked the G1 Hong Kong Sprint field at 67-1. The gelding is likely to be nominated to the G1 Lightning S. over 1000 meters at Flemington Jan. 31. "Now that he's won at international level, there is really no choice but to press forward with him in races of this kind," Moore told the Post. "I think the main thing with him is to keep him fresh. He's always sprinted very well when he's been trained that way." The conditioner is also mulling over the option of the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic for Viva Pataca, who was fourth in the G1 Hong Kong Cup after encountering a world of trouble. The gelding was favored in the 2400-meter event last March, but covered ground and could not catch Sun Classique (Aus). "I've said it many times I'd love to win a Group 1 on foreign soil and I do believe Viva Pataca is the right horse to do it," Moore told the publication. "The thing is, he's so much more relaxed and settled this season than last, and that would be a big asset if he was travelling." The final decision, Moore says, rests with owner Stanley Ho.



How will the economy affect your breeding decisions this winter and your buying decisions at the sales



VIVIEN MALLOY, OWNER, EDITION FARM IN NY

In short: a lot. I have been offered some incredible deals on stallion seasons--meaning last year, it wouldn't

have happened. I won't go into details, but, let it be said that the stallion owners/managers have been a great help to us small breeders. Things like two mares for one price on two stallions at a farm--and good ones, too. And they're stallions I would be breeding to anyway. There's also foal sharing; pay from proceeds [of future sales]; no payment at all for a season, just 50 percent of the state breeder awards; and, of

course, all are stands and nurses, live foal.

On the purchasing question, I will not be purchasing any mares for awhile. I have nine mares now, and of course, if the fillies I have racing now turn out to be stakes horses (one is already twice placed in stakes company), I will keep and breed them.

BOB COSTIGAN, OWNER/BREEDER

It's my belief that for people investing in Thoroughbreds, they have at this time a once-in-a-generation opportunity. I have been a small owner and breeder now for the past 14 years, and I have never been more excited about the future. I buy a yearling or two a year and breed a few mares every year, and watch the industry very closely. Stallions have become more affordable and consignors have become more reasonable. From my point of view, there could not be a better time to invest in Thoroughbreds. The program at Woodbine is the best managed in North America and is becoming increasingly competitive. That means that I need quality stock.

Never in my time as an owner has quality stock been so available at these price levels. It gives someone like me, who focuses on quality not quantity, a welcome opportunity to continue to upgrade. Every obstacle that comes along in this business is either an opportunity to grow and think differently, or to use as an excuse to believe we are stuck. I can see the opportunity and expect to avail of it in 2009.

We will have six horses in training next year, which is the highest number we have ever had. We have high hopes for all of them, like all owners. The secret to an investment return is what you pay for that initial investment that is what determines the size of your profit or loss. Everything's on sale, 50 percent off.

I will be breeding and buying in 2009. I would rather buy a well-bred filly or colt then a hedge fund any day. I know a lot of my friends wished they had in 2008.

MARTIN O'DOWD, MANAGER, RUNNYMEDE FARM

Runnymede is proceeding with cautious optimism with regard to a 2010 yearling rebound, and has al-




ready secured seasons for about 80 percent of our mares for next year. While remaining committed to giving priority to mating our mares to stallions that are genetically and physically compatible, we are giving a premium to good value stallions with reasonable books.

Although this market lends a good opportunity to acquire some nice mares at a discount from previous

years, we find that Runnymede is at capacity with an attractive band of mostly young broodmares. Therefore, we don't have any plans to expand the band further, unless some rare gem happens to cross our path.

DES RYAN, FARM MANAGER, DELL RIDGE FARM

As far as the economy goes on breeding our mares, we have cut all our stud fees in half for each mare and are in no hurry to book them in the hopes that some fees will come down more. If not, we will go to another stallion. Stud fees have been too high for several years and needed to be adjusted. If you have a nice individual by a \$30,000 stallion, he will sell just as good as one by a \$200,000 stallion and you will get a bigger return with less original risk. We have enough mares for now, and will sell anything that we feel does not fit our program open instead of putting them in foal. As seen in November, you can buy mares for less than the stud fee of their covering sires.





ROB WHITELEY, LIBERATION FARM

The economy weighs heavily on us all, but there are two kinds of breeders...those who depend on profitability and bank loans to stay in place, and those who don't. The latter have sufficient wealth that they can use losses as tax write-offs or are able and willing to sustain losses in order to pursue their passion and enjoy this wonderful avocation or life style. I am one of the former, who somehow has to find a way to make ends meet, to make my annual revenue match my expenses each year. One very bad year and I am gone.

That said, in this time of crisis in the economy, and sadly, an even greater crisis in our industry, I and others like me need to reduce our stud fee expenditure to rock bottom levels simply to survive, while still keeping an eye on providing a product with some modicum of commercial appeal. A daunting task.

Toward that end, I am supporting the stallion owners who have all along realized that breeders are their partners in "making" their stallions and who offer serious discounts, the most generous incentives, and the most favorable payment terms. Darley receives unfair criticism from some competitors because they are willing to accept payment out of proceeds, and sometimes with forgiveness for any balance due if the yearling does not bring the stud fee. In my opinion, this should be the industry standard, especially in our present economic circumstances. Stonewall Farm, in addition to deep discounts for multiple mares and return breeders, provides incentives to breeders who produce graded stakes horses or high-priced yearlings. A few other stallion owners are starting to see the business sense in these practices and some of them will get my business.

Generally, however, I am putting off many of my breeding decsions until after the January sale and into February or later, because I expect a continuation of the statistics that show just how bad things are. For the forseeable future, I will not "reach" and pay anything close to retail for any stallion, no matter how well they are performing at the moment. Sometimes people forget that we will be selling the resulting offspring 2 1/2 years from now and the stallion may be cold or not be in fashion at the time. The more we pay up now, the harder we can fall. Furthermore, I was a very young man when I went to a concert and heard Bob Dylan sing the lines, "the losers now are later to win, the times they are achangin." That refrain has stuck with me all these years and applies regularly to our horse business.

With regard to how my purchases may change given present economic circumstances, except for purchasing the odd individual, when we're deep in a hole with slippery sides, why would we keep digging?

Play Fellow Dies:

Play Fellow (On the Sly--Play for Keeps, by Run for Nurse), winner of the 1983 GI Travers S., was euthanized Wednesday at Nuckols Farm in Midway due to the infirmities of old age. The 28-year-old stallion stood his entire stud career at Nuckols before being pensioned in 2004. Play Fellow also won the 1983 GI Blue Grass S., GI Arlington Classic and GI American Derby, as well as the 1984 GII Donn H. He was fourth in the 1983 GI Kentucky Derby and fifth in the GI Preakness S. Play Fellow is the sire of 1989 GI Blue Grass S. winner Western Playboy and of graded stakes winner Nuits St. Georges.

Yesterday's Results:

9th-FGX, \$46,000, Opt. Clm. (\$40,000), NW2X, 3yo/up, f/m, a5 1/2fT, 1:04 4/5, fm. LADY CHACE (f, 3, Tiznow--Squall City {SW, \$173,190}, by Carson City) failed to hit the board in stakes company while under the tutelage of Todd Pletcher earlier this winter and spring before heading to the barn of Steve Margolis in July. Fifth at a similar level going a mile on the turf at Ellis Park in her first start for her new conditioner July 27, the \$290,000 KEESEP yearling was fourth last time out on the main track there Aug. 14. Let go at 19-1 here, the threeyear-old showed good early speed, took over after three furlongs, and despite jumping tire tracks in the stretch, held off the oncoming charge of Luna Dorada (Seeking the Gold). 

GREG CHILDS ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT

Former New Zealander Greg Childs, who has ridden the winners of 72 Group 1 races and most famously guided the great Sunline (NZ) to 21 of her career victories, has announced his retirement following this Saturday's meeting at Flemington. "I have given it 110 percent over the years, but I've lost the aggression to chase good rides and to get out and make it happen," Childs, who posted over 2100 wins in his 30 years in the saddle, told Australian Associated Press. "I've climbed to the top of the mountain, but now the time has come to hang my boots up and go on with other things in my life." The leading apprentice rider in New Zealand during the 1979-1980 season, Childs relocated to Melbourne in 1990. Near the end of the decade, the rider began a relationship with trainer Trevor McKee and his talented galloper Sunline. In all, the team combined for a total of 33 starts and 21 wins, 10 of those at the highest level, including a pair of Cox Plate scores and a memorable overseas success in the G1 Hong Kong Mile. Twice a winner of the Melbourne jockeys' premiership, Childs also partnered Northerly (Aus) and Railings (Aus) to victories in the G1 Caulfield Cup in 2002 and 2005, respectively.
