F2003 SIRES: REPORT CARD

Usually, I try to make the case that we have to wait until the year a sire has his first four-year-olds racing-when they are third-crop sires--to have a good idea of whether they're going to make the grade or not. Even this is asking a lot in a commercial environment where recovery of capital puts the pressure on breeders to decide even when a sire has two-year-olds (dangerous), or, at best, three-year-olds at the races. If a stallion hasn't got some name horses racing for him by the September sale of the year he has his first three-year-olds racing, he's sure to be severely punished in the marketplace.

Every once in a while, though, it can take even longer for a leader from a particular sire crop (those whose first foals were born in the same year) to emerge. It

seems that the North American sire crop whose first foals arrived in 2003, with five-year-olds in 2008, is such a group (see Table, p4). At the end of 2007, the leading third-crop sire was Broken Vow, who ranked 17th on the 2007 North American General Sire List (per bloodhorse.com), with

2007 progeny earnings of almost \$6.1 million. Second leading third-crop sire was Tiznow, 29th on the General Sire List, with 2007 progeny earnings of over \$4.9 million. These two were tied with El Corredor for the highest 2008 stud fee for the F2003 group at \$30,000, with Florida imports Exchange Rate and Songandaprayer each priced at \$25,000. It looked like a perfectly reasonable group of mid-range sires, with no standout.

How the picture has changed, at least in one respect. Tiznow will finish the year ranked number three on the 2008 General Sire List, with earners of more than \$8.7 million. These include 13 stakes winners, seven of them graded. He's sired four Grade I winners this year, including GI Travers S. and GI Santa Anita Derby hero Colonel John, GI Goodwood S. winner Well Armed and GI Belmont S. victor Da' Tara, earning Tiznow a big jump in stud fee, to \$75,000 for 2009.



UNDEFEATED FILLIES LIKELY FOR OLD HAT

Dare to Dream Farm's **Frolic's Dream** (Smoke Glacken) and Martin Schwartz's **Elusive Heat** (Elusive Quality) are the headliners among a field of "six or seven" sophomore fillies expected to go postward in Sunday's GIII Old Hat S., according to Gulfstream Park Stakes Coordinator AI Fox. Frolic's Dream, a 3/4-sister in blood to the outstanding distaffer Smok'n Frolic, is perfect in her three trips to the post for trainer Marty Wolfson. The grey filly has won consecutive stakes events, scoring by 12 3/4 lengths in the Oct. 18 Cassidy S. at Calder prior to a handy 1 1/4-length victory in the John Franks Juvenile Fillies S. Nov. 8. Frolic's Dream completed her preparations for the Old Hat Monday morning at Calder, going a half-mile in :48 4/5. **Cont. p4**

Tiznow has separated himself from the pack and gained elite status. It didn't always look like it was going to happen, but he did win the GI Breeders' Cup Classic twice, defeating Giant's Causeway (now number two on the General Sire List) the first time, and that year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sakhee for his second win.

The other four sires that stood this year for \$25,000-\$30,000 all had seasons more in line with what they'd


previously shown. El Corredor, who ran a close second to Tiznow on the 2005 Freshman Sire List, has been fourth or fifth by annual progeny earnings among the sire group every year since. His runners made over \$4.5 million this year, ranking him 47th on the General Sire List, and his stud fee

drops a tick, to \$25,000. Songandaprayer, who started in Florida but came to Kentucky after finishing fourth on the 2005 Freshman Sire List, had 32 two-year-old winners this year and is surely poised for a big 2009. He has also dropped a tick, from \$25,000 to \$22,500.

Another import to Kentucky from Florida, Exchange Rate, will stand his second Kentucky season for \$25,000, same as his first; he leads this group with 7.8 percent stakes winners from foals, and is second only to Tiznow, with 2.5 percent graded-stakes winners from foals. Also remaining the same as in 2008 is Broken Vow, at \$30,000. He ranks 38th on the General Sire List this year, with the earners of almost \$4.9 million, including nine 2008 stakes winners. Overall, he ranks second to Tiznow in career progeny earnings.

Tiznow's progeny have earned almost \$16.5 million; Broken Vow's have earned \$14.7 million, almost \$2 million clear of Trippi (\$12.7 million) in third, and El Corredor (\$12.6 million) in fourth. Trippi, a son of End Sweep who stood in Florida, has been sold to South Africa, and is just completing his first season at stud there.

The market has never really forgiven Point Given for his dismal start as a freshman sire: in 2005, he sired just two winners from 17 starters, and ranked 33rd on that year's Freshman Sire List. He's come a long way since then--he even has an above-average 1.12 ABC index for his two-year-olds--and the numbers suggest he is now underrated, at a "retail" price of \$15,000, relative to the others in his sire crop. He ranks 33rd on the General Sire List this year, with progeny earnings just under \$5.1 million, which makes him second in the group in 2008. His "big horse" this year is Go Between, winner of the GI Pacific Classic, and now with earnings topping \$2.9 million.



Moreover, Point Given's 3.24 all-weather cumulative average-earnings index ranks him even ahead of Tiznow (2.75) in that category, and is best among all F2003 sizes

As mentioned in last week's column, Ghostzapper's half-brother City Zip, who started out in New York with 20 first-crop two-year-old winners and was third leading Freshman Sire in 2005, had five two-year-old stakes winners this year from his first Kentucky crop, including unbeaten GII Saratoga Special S. winner Run Away and Hide. He has a relatively high 7.3 percent stakes winners from foals (second to Exchange Rate in that category), though is relatively low (1.2 percent) for gradedstakes winners. Nevertheless, in the true mold of Carson City, he's clearly a very effective sire of precocious horses. The Florida sire Put It Back also made last week's list of recommendations. He has way outsired his opportunity, including a 2.56 mid-year APEX A Runner index, without the benefit of a rich state-bred program like City Zip had (and Freud has) in New York. He's also run up a 2.59 cumulative All-Weather AEI, again without the benefit of any Florida track racing on a synthetic surface. He must be a good sire. He also has four Group 1 winners from two crops in Brazil.

Two other regional sires from this group with good numbers are New York's Freud, a full brother to Giant's Causeway; and Gone West's son Trajectory in Ontario. Both have good numbers for their regions. Freud has a 2.25 ABC Runner index (essentially, meaning 17 percent of his runners break even or more), and a 1.98 index for two-year-olds. Trajectory, admittedly benefiting from the all-weather track at Woodbine, has a 2.38 cumulative AEI on those surfaces; he registers a very respectable 2.70 A Runner Index, and is 2.89 for ABC two-year-olds! Neither has sired a graded-stakes winner, though.

In the first four years their progeny have raced, the group of what I would call the 14 most prominent North American F2003 sires have sired, among them, 4,002 foals of racing age, which have earned a total of a little under \$143.2 million, or an average of \$35,780 per foal. They have sired 179 stakes winners (4.5 percent of foals), of which 52 (or 1.3 percent of foals) are graded-stakes winners. These numbers do not seem particularly high, but, to some extent, these are the realities of big-book percentages, and illustrate the difficulty of being too dogmatic about what constitutes a good, or even respectable, sire these days.

It's also worth noting that, at least when we did the figures Aug. 1, eight of these sires (Tiznow, Broken Vow, Exchange Rate, Songandaprayer, Point Given, City Zip, Put It Back and Trajectory) all had A Runner indexes of 1.98 or higher--indicating they are all siring horses people are making money on: a horse has to earn over \$100,000 in a season to become an A Runner in North America.

Perhaps significantly, too, though, the six from this group standing for the highest 2009 stud fees all had ABC Runner indexes between 1.43-1.55. This measures runners that earn above \$50,000 or so in a season, and these six would be producing about 12 percent ABC runners from starters. That's about the average for commercial sires, and reinforces the view that there are a number of useful sires among this group, with Tiznow's breakthrough year in 2008, when he sired four Grade I winners, propelling him out of the pack into the top rung of sires.

But Tiznow is not the very best sire whose first foals arrived in 2003 and raced in 2005. That is Galileo, leading sire in Europe in 2008, and probably the most expensive sire in the world for 2009. He stood for €225,000 in 2008 and, though listed as private in 2009, his fee is unlikely to be much less than that.

Whether he's the most expensive sire in the world or not, he's probably the best sire in the world right now. He did have 459 foals in his first four crops, which is more than any of the 14 American sires we've been reviewing (Broken Vow is tops among them, with 404). Nonetheless, he has sired 22 group winners, 4.8 percent of foals.




"Here are the final figures for the 2008 North American and European sales which we have covered in this feature. There were 41,713 catalogued, down five percent. The number sold was 23,602, down 14 percent, meaning the 'clearance rate' from the catalogues dropped from 62.2 to 56.6 percent. The gross was down 24 percent, or nearly \$450-million, to just under \$1,415,850,000; and the average for those sold was down 12 percent, from \$67,898 to \$59,989, or just under \$60,000."




Tiznow, tops among the 14 Americans in both categories, has sired nine graded winners, 2.6 percent of foals.

Galileo has sired, in his Northern Hemisphere crops, nine Group 1 winners. Even running for significantly lower purses, his runners have earned \$26.8 million; Tiznow, the top American sire, has just under \$16.5 million in progeny earnings. But that's why Galileo is not just the F2003 number one; he's the world number one. The rest don't suffer that much by comparison when you consider 99 percent of all breeders can't afford to breed to Galileo; it's just interesting to see where the current top actually is. PERRONE TAKES MEDIA ECLIPSE Vinnie Perrone of the Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred has been honored with the 2008 Media Eclipse Award for Writing in the Feature/Enterprise category. Perrone, a native of Hartford, Connecticut who now resides in Maryland, won the award for his feature "Recalling Clem Fiorio's Matchless Gift for Life." The late Clem Fiorio, a longtime Maryland handicapper and oddsmaker, was Perrone's mentor. "He was a proven, dynamic, illustrious horse-picker, a student of bloodlines, a titan of the turf," Perrone wrote in the article. "I had a flimsy notion a furlong meant an eighth of a mile. That knowledge Clem doubtlessly imparted. From 1980, he'd escorted me across the theoretical turf with avuncular care and a gardener's patience, schooled me on the crafting and nuance of the graded race line, the importance of time, of changes in medication, equipment and stable, of workouts and training patterns, of breeding, track biases and layoffs..." Fiorio passed away last May. Perrone, a graduate of the University of Maryland, worked at the Washington Post from 1979 to 1997. "The Eclipse Award, for me, is the Holy Grail," he said. "The years I covered racing were the most rewarding of my career. It is both gladdening and bewildering to win this award. Capturing Clem Florio is like trying to capture the Grand Canyon with a store-bought Instamatic camera." Honorable mention in the Feature/Enterprise category went to David Papadoupoulos for "Horse Traders," which appeared in Bloomberg Markets. The Eclipse Awards ceremony will take place in Miami Beach Jan. 26.

FAIR GROUNDS OPENS GATES TO SHIP-INS

TODAY Fair Grounds announced late Monday night that, while there is still a barn under quarantine due to

an outbreak of equine herpes virus, the Louisiana State Racing Commission will begin allowing horses to ship in and race at the track today. "As we continue to monitor the situation, we are pleased that all parties were able to come to this agreement," said Fair Grounds Vice President and Gen-

eral Manager of Racing Eric Halstrom. "We look forward to welcoming back ship-ins beginning Wednesday." Ship-ins were allowed last Friday and Saturday, but were prohibited Sunday and Monday. Any horses shipping to Fair Grounds now will be required to have a records of a certified veterinary inspection in the last 48 hours, a herpes vaccination from not less than 14 and not more than 90 days previously, and have a normal temperature reading on arrival to the track. A total of six horses in Barns 4A and 4B at Fair Grounds have tested positive for EHV-1, but only the first horse involved has shown clinical signs of the disease.


ST JOHN'S GOSPEL (g, 2, Activist--St Johns Prospect, by Press Card), second by a head at 9-1 odds in his debut facing \$40,000 maidens at Philly Park Nov. 2, returned to be a close-up second in the Christopher Elser Memorial S. over this distance Nov. 16. Given a 4-1 chance in the seven-furlong Pennsylvania Nursery S. Dec. 6, he broke his maiden in style with a 2 3/4length victory. The 5-2 second chance in this valuable allowance, he raced wide as the 1-2 chalk Rhyad (Essence of Dubai) sailed through fractions of :22 1/5 and :45 2/5 splits on the front. Rhyad, who earned an 89 Beyer in a maiden score Dec. 6, looked to be home free in midstretch, but St John's Gospel clawed his way to even terms in the dying strides before a final surge put him in front by a head. The winner's sire is a 14-yearold son of Wild Again who won one of five lifetime starts for owner Jerry and Ann Moss and trainer Bobby Frankel. A \$240,00 yearling, he was produced by graded stakes winner Voodoo Lily (Baldski) and is a half to four stakes horses, including the \$4.4 million yearling Shah Jehan (Mr. Prospector). Activist was fifth in both Captain Bodgit's GI Wood Memorial and Free House's GII Swaps S. in 1997. Activist, who stands at Godstone Farm in Pennsylvania for \$1,500, has 70 named foals from seven crops and three black-type winners. Lifetime Record: SW, 4-2-2-0, \$108,160. O-Lee R Christian. B-Judith M Barrett (PA). T-Andrea Gonzalez.

9th-TAM, \$20,200, Alw, NW1X, 2yo, a1mT, 1:40, fm. ALLIE'S EVENT (g, 2, Wild Event--Crewsin' Allie, by Manlove) got his nose down to take his debut going six furlongs over Turfway's Polytrack Sept. 27. Fourth in a Keeneland allowance Oct. 18, Allie's Event closed from well back to earn place honors in his route and grass debut at Churchill Downs Nov. 8. Hammered down to 1-2 favoritism off that effort, the gelding was content to race in mid-pack off a half in :48.98. 
