BAKER'S DOZEN FOR OPENER

A field of 13 was entered yesterday for Sunday's GIII Pocahontas S., the co-featured event on opening day of the live fall race meet at historic Churchill Downs. Oddsmaker Mike Battaglia had a difficult time separating the top four, but made **Sassy Image** (Broken Vow) a lukewarm 9-2 morning-line favorite. Trained by

Dale Romans, who took the 2008 Pocahontas with Sara Louise (Malibu Moon), the chestnut filly broke her maiden beneath the Twin Spires last spring, then was runner-up to Worstcase-scenario (Forbidden Apple) in the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga Aug. 19. She enters Sunday's event off an

even eighth in the Oct. 9 GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland. Westrock Stable's **Decelerator** (Dehere) is the lone graded winner in the field, having taken the GIII Debutante S. at this track in the spring. Off form since, she is a 10-1 chance on the morning line. **Vertical Vision** (Pollard's Vision) is one of two dual stakes winners in the field along with Indiana-bred **Running Bride** (Cherokee Run). Owned by Heiligbrodt Racing Stable, Vertical Vision showed speed aplenty to win the Prairie Gold Lassie July 18 and most recently the Prairie Meadows Debutante Sept. 18. She need only see out the one-mile trip to be a major factor in the Pocahontas.



ZENYATTA THE CLASSIC FAVE...IF SHE GOES

With all signs pointing towards a **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) start in next Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Santa Anita oddsmaker Jon White intends on making her the favorite for the \$5-million event. "Zenyatta not

only is 13 for 13, she has been the favorite in her last nine races," said White, also a commentator for HRTV. "Granted, this would be the first time Zenyatta has run against males, plus she's never gone farther than a mile and an eighth. But Zenyatta likes Santa Anita's main track and it looks like she actually

might thrive going a mile and a quarter. I also think she will get a lot of play because of her big-time reputation." He continued, "Some may feel that Europe's **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) will be the Classic favorite. But I expect Zenyatta to be a lower price than Rip Van Winkle. Rip Van Winkle has been the favorite only twice in eight career starts. He also will be running on a synthetic surface for the first time, so there will be bettors who have reservations about him on the surface. As it stands right now, I'm planning to make Zenyatta the 5-2 favorite for the Classic, with Rip Van Winkle next at 7-2."

SWEET HEARTH MISSES CUP

Investimenti Immobiliari's **Sweet Hearth** (Touch Gold) will be forced to miss her two possible engagements at Santa Anita next weekend after scoping dirty. Runner-up in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 3, the three-year-old held entries in the Dirt Mile and Filly and Mare Sprint and trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told the *Racing Post* yesterday, "She scoped dirty this morning and I can't risk traveling her now."

WAGERING MENU ANNOUNCED

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited have announced the wagering menus for the championship programs Nov. 6 and 7 at Santa Anita Park. Among the wagering opportunities are Ultra Pick Sixes, offering guaranteed pools of \$500,000 for Friday and \$2 million for Saturday. If Friday's sequence is not hit, there will be a carryover into Saturday's program. There is a mandatory payout Saturday. There will be two Pick 4 opportunities each day, with a \$500,000 guaranteed pool on Friday and \$1 million Saturday. For the first time, a special Daily Double will be offered linking Friday's GI Ladies' Classic to Saturday's GI Classic. Super High Fives (aka Pentafectas) will be offered on the Ladies' Classic and the Classic. Additionally, a Head2Head Jockey Bet is also available, with the objective being to select the jockey who pilots the most winners over the two days. Last year, over \$155 million was bet on the Breeders' Cup worldwide.

MELBOURNE CUP FLEMINGTON Nov. 3, 2009



KIRKLEES CATCHES THE EYE Kirklees (Ire) (Jade Robbery) was eye-catching at Sandown yesterday morning when Godolphin jockey Kerrin McEvoy partnered the consistent six-year-old, moving off from the 1400 meters and allowing him to stride home over 1200 meters in 1:16, with his final 400 meters coming in :24. "It was good work and I think he has improved since the Caulfield Cup," McEvoy said of Kirklees, who was wide throughout before finishing seventh in that Oct. 17 contest. Kirklees will be ridden by Frankie Dettori, who is seeking his first Melbourne Cup after 11 previous attempts. McEvoy will partner Crime Scene (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}), a disappointing sixth in the G3 Geelong Cup Oct. 21. Godolphin trainer Saeed bin Suroor, set to arrive Friday, has yet to decide whether the six-year-old will wear blinkers in Tuesday's Cup.

Question Mark over Efficient...


The Lloyd Williams-owned Efficient (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), who shares the top line of ante-post betting at A\$6.50 alongside Viewed (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}) and country-trained Alcopop (Aus) (Jeune {GB}), is an uncertain starter in Tuesday's Cup. Racing Victoria stewards ordered veterinary examinations on three horses at the Macedon stables of trainer John Sadler and, while C'est La Guerre (NZ) (Shinko King {Ire}) and Zipping (Aus) (Danehill) were passed fit for racing, a question mark remains over Efficient, hero of the 2007 Melbourne Cup. Racing Victoria reported that the stable was managing a recurring injury in Efficient's right foreleg, and noted the gelding had raced successfully despite the condition, capturing the G1 Turnbull S. at Flemington Oct. 3 last out. However, Racing Victoria veterinarians will assess the grey before he is allowed to take his place in the field.

Hayes Import Fails to Impress...

Trainer David Hayes has brushed aside concerns about a less-than-impressive gallop at Sandown by recent import Changingoftheguard (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), a last-start sixth in the St. Leger after over-racing in the feature at Doncaster Sept. 12. The four-year-old former Aidan O'Brien trainee, second in the Ebor one start back, was sold to a group of Hayes' clients. It was anticipated he would start in the G1 Mackinnon S. Saturday but the entire suffered a hoof abscess 10 days ago. Changingoftheguard galloped with the Herman Brown-trained Mourilyan (Ire) (Desert Prince {Ire}) who left Changingoftheguard three lengths in arrears over the line.

Hayes pointed out that Mourilyan (Ire) had worked over a much shorter distance and had more in reserve and told stewards the horse had not missed any work due to his hoof problem. "Trackwork isn't everything and I expect him to be racing midfield in the cup," he said, adding it was important that jockey Glen Boss would be able to settle the stayer and avoid him racing fiercely.

Daffodil Blooming...

The classy Kiwi Daffodil (NZ) (No Excuse Needed (GB)) has recovered well from a deep cut sustained to just below her knee when a game fourth in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 17--an effort that saw her Melbourne Cup quote trimmed from 20-1 to 14-1. "It was a deep cut that swelled up, but she is excellent now. You can hardly see it at all," trainer Kevin Gray said of his first Melbourne Cup runner. "We gave her a few days off and put her on light duties, but it was not so severe that you could not work her. She has trained on well and we are very pleased with her." Daffodil opened her Group 1 account in the NZ Guineas last November, and added the G1 AJC Oaks at Randwick Apr. 18 to her record. She came back to take the G1 Windsor Plate Sept. 19 before finishing fourth in the G1 Kelt Capital S. at Hastings Oct. 3.

Melbourne Cup Notes cont. Cummings Bides His Time...

Bart Cummings will bypass Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S. with Cox Plate victor So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral (Ire) in favor of the G1 Emirates S. Nov. 7. The famed conditioner said he wanted to give the sophomore time to recover from his Moonee Valley exertions. Well-fancied Melbourne Cup hope Viewed (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}), aiming for back-to-back wins in Tuesday's big race after scoring in the Caulfield Cup Oct. 17, will again use the Mackinnon as a launching pad. Cummings also has G1 Toorak H. winner Allez Wonder (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), rated 25-1 at present, and Caulfield Cup runner-up Roman Emperor (NZ) (Montjeu {Ire})--on the second line of ante post betting at 10-1--as certain starters in the Cup. The "Cups King" aims to secure a berth for either Dandaad (NZ) (Istidaad) or Naval Escort (NZ) (Montjeu {Ire}) by running both in Saturday G3 Lexus S., a race whose winner is exempt from ballot.

SALES NEWS

TATTS AUTUMN HIT SALE CONCLUDES An

international clientele helped Tattersalls' Autumn Horses in Training Sale reach its conclusion last night with solid figures. The sale's 19,333gns average price was eight percent lower than last year, but the 9,000gns median rose by 13 percent. The 17,457,800gns turnover dropped by 11 percent, while the clearance rate improved from 79 percent to 85 percent. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "Our 2009 yearling sales outperformed expectations and this week's sale has continued in a similar vein," said Mahony. "The Autumn Horses in Training Sale is a unique fixture and yet again it has attracted a uniquely diverse crowd of buyers all of whom have contributed to a sale which has produced a significant increase in the median as well as a higher clearance rate than last year. "The sale was perhaps a touch short of obvious stars and, considering the strength of the market, the handful of high-profile withdrawals was a little disappointing, but overall this has been another week which has provided encouragement for the industry. Quality horses have sold particularly well with buyers from all corners of the world providing stern competition for the domestic buyers from both the Flat and National Hunt fraternities.

As ever our Middle Eastern buyers have had a massive impact on the sale and it has been equally gratifying to have seen the success of past graduates from the sale attracting an unprecedented number of Australian buyers. The key to the enduring success of the Autumn Horses in Training Sale is its ability to attract buyers in numbers at all levels of the market and our promotional visits to emerging markets throughout Europe and further afield, many of them in conjunction with British Bloodstock Marketing, continue to bring new faces to the sale."

Entry to yesterday's lower key session cost vendors £300, compared to £475 on the previous three days and business was a far cry from earlier in the week. Yesterday's top price was just 55,000gns, paid by agent Geoffrey Howson for two-year-old Rezwaan (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) (hip 1265), a recent Nottingham nursery winner for Hamdan Al Maktoum and trainer Ed Dunlop. "He's been bought for Gallagher Equine and is going back to Pat Gallagher's farm in Kent and then he'll decide on a trainer," said Howson, after outbidding trainer William Knight. "He's a lovely looking horse who vetted well and should make a nice three-year-old."



"We're closing our present location after 28 years, and we're moving to a new location in about two months," Long explained. "We decided to do a cocktail party on our last night in conjunction with the charity, since the horsemen have been so good to me over the last 28 years. It's a pay what you want [party], and a portion of those proceeds are going to go to Horses and Hope."

The farewell to the Dudley's Square location will be held tonight from 6-9 p.m. Long, a lifelong Kentuckian, is involved in a number of civic organizations, including the Board of the Lexington Chamber of Commerce, the Downtown Lexington Corporation, Lexington Convention and Visitors Bureau, Lexington Civic Center Board and the Fayette Alliance. During yesterday's festivities at Keeneland, Long was sitting with Ann Evans, the executive director of the Governor's Mansion.

"[Horses and Hope is] Jane Beshear's initiative, because Jane Beshear is quite an equestrian herself and has a passion for horses," Evans explained. "She also has a passion for women's health, and has combined the two." "This particular charity is raising money so that women who work on racetracks across Kentucky-on the backside, as well as the women [that work] the betting windows that don't have insurance, they can get screened for breast cancer by a mamogram truck brought to the track," Evans said. According to www.horsesandhope.org, breast cancer is the second-leading cause of death for women in the Bluegrass State, and between 2,800 and 3,200 women are diagnosed each year. To date, approximately 1,200 women have been screened through the initiative's efforts.





SILVER PATRIARCH DIES The National Stud announced that Silver Patriarch (Ire) (Saddler's Hall {Ire}--Early Rising, by *Grey Dawn II) died from natural causes in his paddock yesterday morning. He was 15. Campaigned by breeder Peter Winfield and trained by John Dunlop, the grey was narrowly defeated by Benny the Dip in the 1997 G1 Epsom Derby, but captured the G1 St Leger S. later that season. He won the G1 Coronation Cup and G1 Gran Premio del Jockey-Club the following year, and was retired at the end of his fiveyear-old campaign with a record of 24-8-6-2 and earnings of £918,254. Silver Patriarch began his breeding career at the National Stud in 2000, and moved to Wood Farm Stud for the 2008 and 2009 seasons. He was pensioned this past June due to declining fertility, and returned to Newmarket for his retirement. Brian O'Rourke, the National Stud's managing director, said, "We are deeply saddened by the loss of Silver Patriarch. He had so many fans because of his terrific career on the racetrack, and he was always a very great favourite amongst our visitors during his stud career. We had hoped that he would be able to enjoy a long retirement back here with us at the National Stud, but sadly it was not to be. He will be greatly missed here, and our condolences are sent to his owners; to John Dunlop who looked after him throughout his racing career; and to Pat Eddery who formed such a tremendous association with him, riding him in 21 of his 24 races."
