



MAGIC MILLIONS BOOK 1 CONCLUDES

GOLD COAST, Australia--Book 1 of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale drew to a close with a post-racing evening session on Saturday. Figures continued to trend above last year and one more seven-figure lot was added to the sale's total of nine when trainer Mark Newnham spent A\$1.1-million on a daughter of Snitzel (Aus) (lot 830).

The clearance rate climbed with each of the four sessions of the sale and closed at 88.7%. A total of 684 yearlings were sold over 3 1/2 days for A\$155,952,000, compared to the A\$134,292,500 made by 649 youngsters 12 months ago. The average climbed 10.2% to A\$228,000, and the median of A\$170,000 represented a 6.25% gain.

Mark Newnham was a longtime assistant to trainer Gai Waterhouse before going out on his own two years ago, and one of the many Group 1 winners he had the fortune to work with in his prior role was Sweet Idea (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}). When he saw a filly from Widden Stud at Magic Millions that reminded him of that former luminary, Newnham went higher than he ever had for a yearling to secure her for a group of undisclosed owners.

ROOKIE STALLIONS MAKE FOR AN INTERESTING TRAIL By Daithi Harvey

This year's ITM Irish Stallion Trail caught me slightly unawares as it was brought forward two weeks from its original end-of-January slot. As this was my third year to follow the trail, I decided that having concentrated on Leinster-based studs the previous two occasions--as one who is based near The Capital, would be inclined to do--instead I would check out what some of our rugby rivals had to offer all the way down in Munster. My plan was to start with Tipperary's finest then travel north east, stopping off at some significant markers before getting back to 'The Pale' in the evening. An early start had me passing through Fethard at 9.30 a.m., ahead of schedule to begin the day at Coolmore and I resisted the temptation of knocking on the door of McCarthy's Pub on the off chance they would be serving a full Irish, instead trusting that sustenance would be available a few miles down the road. SUNLIGHT OVER THE GOLD COAST

Sunlight (Aus) (Zoustar {Aus}) has done little wrong in her short career, and the 2-year-old filly rewarded her ladies syndicate of owners on Saturday with a win in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic in addition to the A\$325,000 lion's share of the Magic Millions Women's Racing Bonus, which is a total of A\$500,000 split between the first four all female-owned runners across the line. From the first crop of her sire, Sunlight was a A\$300,000 purchase by trainer Tony McEvoy, Aquis Farm and Blue Sky Bloodstock from the Gold Coast Yearling Sale one year ago. Third on debut in the Oct. 7 Maribyrnong Trial S., Sunlight was given 11 weeks off and returned to break her maiden in an explosive performance at the Gold Coast on Dec. 23. She was similarly impressive when winning over the same course last weekend, and McEvoy was bullish after signing for her full-sister at Magic Millions on Thursday, saying, "if someone said to me she ran last Saturday and broke a class record I wouldn't believe them." "That's the one we were waiting for the last three days, so it was nice we were able to get her," Newnham said. "We thought she was going to be pretty dear, we thought she was the best one here, and you have to pay for them. It's the first time I've gone past a half-million, but that's how much we liked her and hopefully she can re-pay us."

The bay is the first foal out of the New Zealand Group 3 winner Intimate Moment (NZ) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"She looks a natural, has a really strong pedigree behind her," the trainer said. "You'd nearly give up if she couldn't run. She looks an early type, a good strong-bodied filly. She's bred to run early and she reminds me a bit of Sweet Idea. She was able to do it at two, three and four so hopefully this filly can do the same."

Another daughter of Snitzel caused a stir late in the session when bought by Damon Gabbedy of Belmont Bloodstock for A\$575,000. Consigned by Arrowfield Stud, lot 852 is out of the Group 2-winning and Group 1-placed Just Dancing (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus), and a half-sister to the stakes-placed Ideal Guide (Aus) (Red Ransom).

Sales Ring Luck For Gollan...

Trainer Tony Gollan's Ef Troop (Aus) (Spirit of Boom {Aus}) ran a good race in defeat but ended up luckless when fourth in Saturday's Magic Millions 2YO Classic, but the trainer had better fortune across the street a few hours later when prevailing for a filly by I Am Invincible (Aus) (lot 792) at A\$625,000. Offered by Yarraman Park, which stands the sire, the bay is out of the fivetime winner Harlem Heat (Aus) (Xaar {GB}), already the dam of a stakes-winning 2-year-old in Harlem River (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). Gollan said he thought the filly had the goods to take him back to the A\$2-million 2YO Classic next year.

"I thought she was a really nice filly," he said. "I wasn't sure coming here on Saturday night I'd be able to afford her, she looks like such a 2-year-old type and we were lucky enough to secure her. She's out of a real fast-running family, the mare's already got a stakes-winning 2-year-old and she looks ready made for the race next year." **Cont. p4**

Gollan said Ef Troop had exited the Classic in good order. The prior stakes winner was involved in some early bumping before setting the pace, but ultimately folded late on behind Sunlight (Aus) (Zoustar {Aus}).

"He had a really hard run but he pulled up quite well," Gollan said. "We'll take it day to day but he has recovered beautifully; he has great powers of recovery, that horse. Here's hoping he looks good tomorrow and we'll decide what to do with him in the next few weeks."

Aquis Farm, the part owners of Sunlight, were also back on Saturday evening to reinvest some of the winnings, and they also spent A\$625,000, for them on lot 803, a colt by Written Tycoon (Aus) who is a full to the stakes-placed Written Consent (Aus). The colt was consigned by Woodside Park Stud.

I Am Invincible has been extremely popular at Magic Millions this week, and another daughter of the sire from Yarraman Park (lot 821) was sold on Saturday night to Craig Rounsefell of Boomer Bloodstock for A\$525,000. Rounsefell a short time later spent the same amount on Sun Stud's athletic daughter of Tapit (lot 831). That filly is out of Inventive (Dixie Union), who was bought by Sun Stud, under its former moniker Eliza Park International, at Keeneland November in 2014 in foal to Bernardini for \$80,000. That price looked like a bargain two years later when Inventive's Klimt (Quality Road) won the GI Del Mar Futurity. Sun Stud had in the meantime exported the mare to Australia carrying this filly, and they sent her back, put her in foal to Medaglia d'Oro and sold her for \$800,000 at the most recent renewal of Keeneland November.


McEvoy Lights Up The Ring...

Sunlight's trainer Tony McEvoy was also looking to restock his stable for next year's Magic Millions Raceday on Saturday evening, and he went to A\$475,000 for lot 799, a daughter of Not A Single Doubt (Aus) from Newhaven Park. The filly is the first foal out of the American listed winner Hello (Smoke Glacken).

"She wasn't overly big, but she walked like a 16.2-hand horse," McEvoy said. "She had a beautiful big stride about her, balance and strength. Newhaven Park know how to breed a proper horse and every time you buy a horse off that farm you know it has every chance. I loved her, she has a family to back her up. he could get here next year." **Cont. p5**

McEvoy revealed he decided this week to stock up early in the yearling sale season.

"I came here not expecting to buy as much as I have, but when I looked at the horses, they're high quality; you'll be lucky to see this quality of horse anywhere else in the sales in the rest of the year, so I decided to take advantage of that," he said. "Over the years the sales get dearer, not cheaper."

Of Sunlight, now favoured for the G1 Golden Slipper, McEvoy said, "Wasn't she a star today? There was carnage [interference], which is sad for the big races, and she was involved in it a little bit, but she handled it well. She had composure and she showed her class. She went home and straight into her feed. She's just like her trainer--a good eater."

Strong Results For First-Season Sires...

A handful of first-season sires enjoyed strong results on Saturday evening. Newgate's Wandjina (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) was the sire of a A\$350,000 colt bought by trainer Ciaron Maher, and his barnmate Deep Field (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}) had a A\$300,000 filly bought by David Redvers and Tony McEvoy-connections of Sunlight, who is herself sired by another young son of the late Northern Meteor (Aus) in Zoustar. Horse of the Year Dissident (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}), who also stands at Newgate, had a colt sell to New Zealand interests for A\$260,000, while Darley's Brazen Beau (Aus)--a son of the red hot I Am Invincible (Aus)--had a filly sell to Chris Waller and Guy Mulcaster (the duo that bought Winx) for A\$250,000. Coolmore's Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) also had a A\$250,000 sale on Saturday evening.

Driving through the majestic entrance to Coolmore, one is reminded what a global and aesthetically stunning enterprise has been forged by John Magnier and his associates in the last 30 years. My initial awareness of brand Coolmore stemmed from their former national hunt stallion Deep Run (GB), sire of that legendary race mare Dawn Run (Ire) and who just seemed to be champion national hunt sire every year in the 80s. Since then it has morphed into a global colossus.

People say Ireland is renowned for brands like Guinness or U2, I say Coolmore.

Friday's visit to the stud allowed me the opportunity to see arguably the best and factually the most expensive stallion in the world. Galileo (Ire), who has just turned 20 years of age and who now has a 24-hour bodyguard. Is it any wonder that he has round-the-clock protection, as he has now become a national institution and as Maurice Moloney, our host for the morning said, "Firstly aren't we lucky here in Coolmore to have him, secondly, isn't Tipperary lucky to have him and finally isn't Ireland lucky to have him." His staggering covering fee is at least twice as high as any other stallion in the world and not surprisingly the majority of his covers will be allocated to Coolmore's own mares with about 30 paid nominations in his book for 2018. Moloney confirmed Darley to be among the list of the customers under the 'paid nomination' column and also that Coolmore would be utilising Darley's flagship stallion Dubawi (Ire) for a number of their mares this year. All is well in the bloodstock world, as simple business principles have come to the fore.

As Galileo is in the twilight of his career, there were a number of young pretenders to his throne on parade in Coolmore and one who is built very much in the mold of his father is **Gleneagles (Ire)**. The dual Guineas winner, who stands a shade under 16 hands, also inherited the same panther walk from Galileo and given his first foals averaged just over a £100,000 in 2017, it is safe to say his stock have been well received so far. Another of Galileo's sons **Churchill (Ire)** is an entirely different model and Ryan Moore must have felt a long way from the ground whenever he rode this fella and he has that great laid back attitude one often seems to associate with big horses. Looking at him, it is a surprise that he was a European champion 2-year-old but no shock that he was a top-class 3-year-old. Galileo's other son recently retired to Coolmore is **Highland Reel (Ire)** and several of the other trail hoppers in attendance expressed their surprise that a seven-time Group 1 winner of over \in 9 million would be introduced to stud at a relatively low fee of \in 17,500. Maurice Moloney had to agree that they may have erred on the side of caution when setting his fee as he noted he was also "one of the soundest horses that Aidan ever trained."

This being my first visit to Coolmore in over three years, I had not seen Australia (GB) since he retired from racing and I must say it is amazing how a stallion can transform from a wiry athlete into a masculine bull of an animal within a couple of seasons of covering and Australia is a fair example. He never exactly 'filled the eye' when racing, but this regally bred horse now ticks almost every box, and with his first runners set to grace tracks this year it will be fascinating to see if that final, most important box gets ticked; hard to imagine it won't. While only time will tell if any of these stallions step up to the mark and emulate their father just as Galileo has done his own sire Sadler's Wells, Coolmore are also seeking to fill the void left by the untimely death in America of Scat Daddy. In Caravaggio they might just have a successor and this steel grey speedster certainly looked the part as he strode out for viewers. Maurice Moloney predicted his coat will be a lot whiter this time next year after a season's covering, as he simultaneously removed his cap to reveal his own greying thatch, as if trying to prove similar strenuous activity affects us men in the same way. They don't come any more handsome than **Camelot (GB)** and after admiring him for a while, I offered my thanks to my hosts while administering a dose of caffeine before making my way across country towards Ballylinch Stud, passing through some villages and townlands en route that I think may not yet have been discovered.

Ballylinch Stud have no new rookies for 2018, but again I find it interesting to see how young stallions alter from one year to the next. Make Believe (Fr) is one who I thought has developed well in the last 12 months but pride of roster has to go to Lope De Vega (Ire), who at a 2018 covering fee of €60,000, is inching towards elite stallion status. Mark Byrne, who looks after nominations in Ballylinch is predicting a big year for the stallion as his crops bred from his best mares received emerge. Lope De Vega has also found favour in the southern hemisphere where his son Vega Magic (Aus) has become by far the stallion's biggest earner, with his second placing in last year's The Everest contributing over £800,000 to his haul. Classic winner and Classic sire Lawman (Fr) has surely become a very good value stallion at a fee of €15,000 while **New Bay (GB)** isn't lacking for mare support given his powerful ownership triumvirate of China Horse Club, Juddmonte and Ballylinch, who are committed to making him a success. Fascinating Rock (Ire) holds the distinction of being the highest-rated son of Fastnet Rock (Aus) and his owner Maurice Regan has also been on a buying spree this past year, acquiring numerous choice mares to aid the horse's second career.

At this stage the Coolmore coffee and cakes seemed like a lifetime ago and once the Ballylinch stallions had strutted their stuff, I retreated into their plush marquee for a quick taste of their beef casserole and just in case anyone thought this was a script for John Catucci's 'You Gotta Eat Here!', I can assure readers the objective of the day was to view stallions so I declined dessert and got back on the trail towards Kildangan Stud.

On arrival at Kildangan, Godolphin chief executive Joe Osborne enquired if I would be reviewing their food or their stallions so for the record, their spicy parsnip soup certainly helped warm the cockles on what was a pretty cold afternoon. However my main reason to visit Darley's Irish HQ was to see their new boys for 2018, **Ribchester (Ire)** and **Profitable (Ire)**. Richard Fahey has said he would train 300 horses if he had them but he'd probably need double that number through his hands to unearth one as good as Ribchester and this four-time Group 1 winning son of Iffraaj (GB) will begin covering at a fee of \in 30,000. Profitable (Ire) is pitched in a bit lower at \in 12,000, but as a Group 1winning sprinter by Invincible Spirit his appeal is obvious. Eamon Moloney (a nephew of Coolmore's Maurice) was on MC duty in Kildangan and I was delighted when he announced **Teofilo (Ire)** as the next to parade. The 14-year-old looks magnificent and he has sired a Group 1 winner for every year of his life and with 17 stakes winners in 2017 his top level tally looks highly likely to overtake his age this year. **Slade Power (Ire)** also looked a picture and he is one of a number of stallions who will make the betting market for leading first season sire in 2018 quite interesting.

I had time for one more stop and with two interesting additions to their roster this year, I decided the Irish National Stud would be my final destination. I arrived just as a parade had commenced and I had to battle for a viewing spot as a group of 40 Czech breeders had commandeered all the best vantage points. The stud's CEO Cathal Beale must be pleased with his first six months in the job; he managed to recruit two very interesting stallions in National Defense (GB) and Decorated Knight (GB) while also launching a new bloodstock investment scheme. Beale was proud to show off his new stallion acquisitions and even though Invincible Spirit (Ire) is showing none of his advancing years--the 21-year-old was keeping his long suffering handler Michael 'Daffer' Kelly on his toes--it is important for the stud to establish a potential successor to him. National Defense is a son of Invincible Spirit who Criquette Head-Maarek trained to win the G1 Prix Jean Luc-Lagardere in 2016 and the smooth-walking 4-year-old oozes quality and athleticism. In Decorated Knight the stud may just have clinched the deal of 2017. The horse has serious stallion credentials; a three-time Group 1-winning son of Galileo out of a full-sister to both Giant's Causeway and You'resothrilling, who just happens to be the dam of the Galileo Group 1 winners Gleneagles (Ire), Marvellous (Ire) and Happily (Ire). If that wasn't enough, Decorated Knight stands for a covering fee of €15,000. Cont. p8

Who says there is no value out there? As mentioned earlier, a year is a long time in a young stallion's life and that year has been physically kind to Free Eagle (Ire). While his first foals didn't really light up the bid boards at the sales last year, Beale is confident his yearlings will fare much better at the sales this autumn. We all know how fickle the market can be, but it's way too soon to write off this horse and those who did pinhook a foal by him last year could be sitting on a decent investment.

So having covered the guts of 300km I pointed the chariot home and began to wonder to myself, just how many miles of manicured beech hedging did I drive by during the day?

'FIRE' CROWNED IN LEVIN CLASSIC

Tabbed the 6-4 favourite in the 1600-metre G1 Levin Classic at Trentham on Saturday, **Age of Fire (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) duly delivered, getting his first black-type win and going from G1SP to G1SW in the space of 1:36.63. Retained rider Opie Bosson combined with the strapping bay proved a potent combination for Te Akau Racing and co-trainers Jamie Richards and Stephen Autridge, succeeding over fillies **Belle Du Nord (NZ)** (Reliable Man {GB}) and GSW **Savvy Coup (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}).

"That's why he's paid the big retainer," said Richards to NZ Racing. "He's a lovely, big horse and he pinned his ears back, he was in for the fight."

Able to secure a rails run in midpack for the first half of the race, traffic issues aplenty appeared imminent for Bosson and Age of Fire. Swinging him sharply away from the fence inside the 600-meter marker, Bosson's tactics paid off, as the hulking colt had clear sailing and began to let down with a vengeance inside the final quarter mile. Savvy Coup matched the colt's move to his inside, while Belle Du Nord was hanging tough on the rails, with Age of Fire only besting the distaffers in the final handful of strides. **Cont. p9**

The margins told the tale, with Age of Fire a neck to the good of Belle Du Nord, who was only a nose better than the ultra game Savvy Coup.

"He is a lovely colt and his work in the last few weeks has been outstanding," said Bosson, who was riding Age Of Fire for the first time. "He's a big horse, but light on his feet. I was a little bit worried across the top when there wasn't much speed, but once I got into the clear, he showed that powerful finish. Well done to Stephen and Jamie and the team--another Group 1 for the tangerine."

"My gut feeling is that we'll go to the [Feb. 10 G1] Herbie Dyke S. to give him another chance at a Group 1," Richards said of the joint-favourite for the Mar. 3 G1 New Zealand Derby.

Bred by Roncon in New South Wales, Age of Fire was raised at Coolmore Australia, before catching the eye of Te Akau Racing's David Ellis at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. Bought for A\$400,000 out of the Erinvale Thoroughbreds consignment, the bay took some time to come to hand and debuted with a second at Riccarton Park as a sophomore on Sept. 9. Off the mark going 1400 metres there on Oct. 7, he earned a Group 3 placing in the G3 Barneswood Farm S. at Ashburton later that month and continued to progress with a closing second to fellow Te Akau silksbearer Embellish (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}) in the G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas returned to Riccarton on Veteran's Day. Prior to his Levin triumph, Age of Fire closed resolutely to win a 3-year-old feature by a nose at Ellerslie on Boxing Day.

Sunlight has likely expanded her camp of believers after Saturday's performance. The bay was involved in some ugly bumping in the opening stages of the race as they exited the chute; sandwiched between Ef Troop (Aus) (Spirit of Boom {Aus}) on her outside and Meryl (Aus) (Epaulette {Aus}) to her inside, Sunlight found herself squeezed but Jonker (Aus) (Spirit of Boom {Aus}) just off the flanks of that trio copped the worst of it, slamming into the rail as Ef Troop sprinted away for the lead. Sunlight and jockey Luke Currie remained composed about three lengths off Ef Troop and on the outside of Meryl and when they turned into the straight they quickly shook off the latter rival and set their sights on Ef Troop. The colt put in a valiant effort but Sunlight proved too classy, sweeping past approaching the 100 metre mark and holding on comfortably as Fullazaboot came flying down the middle of the track to nip Outback Barbie, who put in a similarly eye-catching rally to his inside.

"It's a big thrill and it's brilliant for our brand--what a great filly," McEvoy said. "The key was getting her here when we did, she's been able to acclimatise and handle the heat really well. Having the preparation where she ran up here last week, when the high pressure was on today she lifted late."

As previously mentioned, McEvoy--who also trained last year's 2YO Classic winner Houtzen (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus})--bought Sunlight's full-sister on Thursday, and the A\$600,000 price tag looks like money well spent. McEvoy said at the time he hoped the filly would race for a similar syndicate and she now has big shoes to fill. Sunlight becomes the first stakes winner for her sire and dam is the second stakes horse for her dam, Solar Charged, whose 3-year-old filly is the Group 3-placed Sheikha (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}). Solar Charged foaled a Sebring colt last year.

Exciting 3-year-old colt Pierata (Aus) (Pierro {Aus}) overcame an inside barrier to score Queensland racing's biggest-ever payday, earning a A\$500,000 bonus on top of the A\$1.2-million lion's share of the Magic Millions 3YO Guineas. Pierata earned the Summer Crown bonus for winning three of the five races in the series: the Dec. 2 Winning Rupert Plate at Doomben and the G3 Magic Millions Vo Rogue Plate at the same track on Dec. 30. Pierata had broken his maiden in his second of four tries at two and missed the spring season. Pierata, from the first crop of leading second-crop sire Pierro, was a A\$160,000 purchase by trainer Greg Hickman from the Kitchwin Hills draft at the 2016 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

"It's such an achievement to be able to do this, we've been up here for eight weeks and the horse hasn't put a foot wrong," said Hickman. "Corey's got a big opinion of him, he's stuck with him for four runs and he's justified everyone's faith in him today. He'll improve again, next preparation you'll see a nicer horse again, that's the scary thing about it, he's just got so much improvement."

INSTILLED REGARD PROVES 'BEST' IN LECOMTE



Instilled Regard storms clear in the Lecomte | Hodges Photography

California invader **Instilled Regard** (Arch) provided his owner, OXO Equine's Larry Best, with his first graded stakes win with a decisive victory over previously undefeated "**TDN Rising Star**" and 6-5 favorite **Principe Guilherme** (Tapit) in Saturday's GIII Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds. The winner earned 10 points towards a start in the GI Kentucky Derby.

Sent off as the 2-1 second choice, the \$1.05 million OBS March purchase was aggressively ridden from the 10 hole by Javier Castellano to sit in a tracking third as regally bred **Believe in Royalty** (Tapit--Believe You Can) was chased by turf stakes winner **Snapper Sinclair** (City Zip) through an opening quarter in :23.48. Passed by a pair of rivals to his inside, the dark bay maintained a close watch on the leaders from a three-wide fifth through a half in :47.52.

Instilled Regard swiftly gained ground up the outside to be even with new leader Snapper Sinclair turning for home as Believe in Royalty called it a day and Principe Guilherme ranged up on the outside. The Jerry Hollendorfer pupil seized control in early stretch and a game Snapper Sinclair tried to run with him for a few strides, but proved no match for his rival. Instilled Regard kicked it into overdrive in the final sixteenth, powering clear to a 3 3/4-length victory. Principe Guilherme, who broke from post 12, overtook Snapper Sinclair late to be second. **Cont. p3**

'FIRE' BACK TO WINNING WAYS IN JEROME

Last term's GI Champagne S. upsetter **Firenze Fire** (Poseidon's Warrior) rebounded off a lackluster effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last out Nov. 4 with a narrow victory in Aqueduct's Jerome S. Saturday. The Jerome was downgraded from a Grade III to a listed stakes for 2018, but still awards the winner 10 points towards a spot in the gate for the GI Kentucky Derby.

Hammered down to 2-5 favoritism while cutting back to one turn here, Firenze Fire was unhurried early, running two wide at the back of the tightly bunched sextet as second choice **Seven Trumpets** (Morning Line) clocked a comfortable opening halfmile in :50.81. The chalk advanced up the outside on the backstretch run to be third as Seven Trumpets retained control, albeit while bearing out a bit on the far turn. 

Third next out behind GSP "TDN Rising Star" and Smarty Jones S. contender Mourinho (Super Saver) next out sprinting at Santa Anita Sept. 30, the dark bay graduated by 4 1/4 lengths when stretched to 1 1/16 miles next out in Arcadia Oct. 29. That was just the first of many high-priced purchases for the Boston native's OXO Equine. Best went to \$1.05 million for Instilled Regard, who RNA'd for \$110,000 at the 2016 Keeneland September sale, at last term's OBS March sale after the colt breezed in :20 4/5. He snapped up Beyond Ambition (Tapit), who, like Instilled Regard, was from the consignment of Tom McCrocklin and is now trained by Hollendorfer, for \$1.1 million at the same sale.

Best has had five horses race with just two wins in 12 starts, both coming from Instilled Regard. Cutter Helm (Super Saver), a

\$150,000 KEESEP buy trained by Mike Stidham, crossed the wire first on debut at the Fair Grounds Nov. 18, but was disqualified to second and was most recently fifth in NOLA Dec. 22.

Pedigree Notes:

Instilled Regard is the 37th graded stakes winner for the late Arch, who passed away in January of 2016 at the age of 21 due to a heart attack. The winner is out of the Phipps-bred Enhancing, a daughter of champion Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold); and half-sister to MGISW millionaire Good Reward (Storm Cat) and GSW Pure Prize (Storm Cat). The 10-year-old mare produced a colt by threetime Eclipse winner American Pharoah Apr. 20 and failed to get in foal when bred back to Lemon Drop Kid.

Ultra Brat notched her first graded tally Saturday in Gulfstream's GIII Marshua's River S. Eagerly tugging her way up to be second early, the bay was hot on pacesetting Gianna's Dream (Twirling Candy)'s tail through soft opening splits of :26.37 and :51.42. Given her head by pilot Nik Juarez, the homebred instantly seized control entering the turn for home. Grade I winner Dream Dancing came after her in the lane, but Ultra Brat had plenty left in the tank and bounded clear to score. King's Ghost completed the trifecta.

Winner of the 2016 Christiecat S. at Belmont, Ultra Brat closed out that season with a 36-1 upset of the course-and-distance Tropical Park Oaks and was subsequently shelved for 11 months. Returning Nov. 26 at Aqueduct, she finished fourth in the Autumn Days S. going six panels on the grass under Juarez.

"I don't think we had a specific issue," wining trainer Graham Motion said in reference to the lengthy layoff. "She just had like nagging problems and we gave her a break, and it just took her a little longer to get back to the races than I thought. It looks like it worked out pretty well. The one thing Nik said was that he just wanted her relaxed because she was pretty keen last time sprinting. But it set up well today. She likes this track. It obviously suits her."

Pedigree Notes:

Owner/breeder Alex G. Campbell, Jr., purchased the winner's second dam for \$220,000 at the 1988 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale. She went on to win the 1989 GI Demoiselle S. following a runner-up effort in that year's GIII Miss Grillo S. for trainer Rusty Arnold. Ultra Brat's dam Prof. McGonagall won three of her 11 starts, bankrolling \$106,630. *Cont. p10*

Prof. McGonagall has produced 10 foals to date, including Grade III winner and Grade I-placed It's Tea Time (Dynaformer), also trained by Arnold.

The 18-year-old mare's recent produce includes the now-3-year-old gelding Moveslike Molasses (Malibu Moon), who has won once in five starts for Motion; a 2-year-old colt by Hard Spun and a yearling colt by Triple Crown winner American Pharoah. Prof. McGonagall, a half-sister to GSW and sire Kukulcan (Cox's Ridge), was bred back to Uncle Mo last spring.

Ultra Brat also hails from the female family of two-time champion female sprinter Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band).

PEGASUS CONTENDERS PREP AT GPW

GI Cigar Mile victor **Sharp Azteca** (Freud), GSW **War Story** (Northern Afleet) and MGSW **Gunnevera** (Dialed In) both tuned up for the Jan. 27 GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. with fivepanel breezes over a sloppy Gulfstream Park West track Saturday morning.

Piloted by jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr., Sharp Azteca covered the distance in a sharp in 1:00.60 (4/23) (video). A close and gutsy second to Battle of Midway (Smart Strike) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the bay romped by 5 1/4 lengths last time in the Cigar Mile Dec. 2.

"He was sharp--visually, very impressive. He was clipping off :12's," said Pegasus World Cup stakeholder Ron Paolucci, who struck a deal with Sharp Azteca's owner Ivan Rodriguez last week to run the 5-year-old in the \$16 million event. Paolucci and trainer Jorge Navarro, conditioner of Sharp Azteca, will also be represented in the Pegasus by War Story, who worked the same distance in a bullet :59.60 (video). Fifth to champion Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) in last year's Pegasus, the GII Brooklyn S. winner was last seen finishing fourth to likely Pegasus favorite Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 4.

"Jorge said last week this was going to be his money work for the Pegasus, and he's one of those he can work however you want him to work," Paolucci said. "I think we got out of it what we needed."

Gunnevera also breezed five furlongs Saturday under jockey Luis Saez, covering the distance in 1:03.60 (16/23) in company with a stablemate (video). The chestnut will run in the Pegasus for owner Salomon Del-Vallee and Pegasus stakeholders William Gallo and Bella Inizio Farm.

"It was very good. The track was very sloppy this morning, so I told Luis to take it easy," trainer Antonio Sano said. "He went in 1:03 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:16."

A two-time graded winner, Gunnevera finished second in the GI Travers S. Aug. 26 and dead-heated for fifth in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Seeking the Soul Breezes for Pegasus

GI Clark H. upsetter **Seeking the Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}) put in his penultimate breeze in preparation for the Pegasus at the Fair Grounds Saturday, covering five furlongs in 1:00.40 (2/60).

"We're really happy with him," trainer Dallas Stewart said. "He went well, he came back great and looked sharp. We're getting ready to march on and get ready. When you're two weeks out you want to get a good work in him and the next one, we'll just go slower."

Stewart added that the homebred would breeze once more in NOLA next weekend before shipping to Florida Jan. 24.

NYRA ANNOUNCES WOOD MEMORIAL PURSE BONUS

The New York Racing Association will implement a bonus program for potential starters in the GII Wood Memorial S. Apr. 7 at Aqueduct that could increase the purse to \$1 million, it was announced Saturday.

If any horse in the field wins a Grade I or Group 1 prior to participating in the Wood Memorial, NYRA will increase the total purse by \$250,000 if the horse is declared an official starter.

"The goal of this bonus program, which can raise the Wood Memorial purse to \$1 million, is to bring the most talented 3-year-olds in the country to the Wood on Apr. 7," said NYRA President and CEO Chris Kay. "Racing fans can look forward to a tremendous card on Wood Day that includes prestigious races such as the Carter H., Gazelle, Bay Shore and Excelsior."



The task facing Stronger Than Ever in Saturday's Silverbulletday S. looked on paper to be a stiff one and the public bet her accordingly. But the grey filly rallied stoutly from the rear and outslugged MGSW and 'TDN Rising Star' Wonder Gadot to take this first local step towards the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Void of early speed, Stronger Than Ever dropped out to the rear of the field before actually working her way into the picture at the midway stage. She gained ground under a Florent Geroux hold on the turn, was steered out wide and looked as if she was going to run away with it a furlong from home. Wonder Gadot boxed on gamely down on the inside, but Stronger Than Ever did slightly the better work late to post a narrow success. Missive stayed on at one pace for third ahead of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' third Blonde Bomber (Fort Larned). **Cont. p3**

Winner of a Churchill maiden Sept. 16 and a one-mile Keeneland allowance Oct. 20, Stronger Than Ever was never in it when seventh in the GII Golden Rod S. in Louisville Nov. 25 and was exiting a distant third in the Dec. 17 Trapeze S. at Remington Park.

The 30th black-type winner for her sire, Stronger Than Ever was the most expensive of her sire's 11 foals to sell in 2015 and was the priciest of 49 yearlings to sell in 2016. Produced by a stakes-placed daughter of SW Stellar Affair, Stronger Than Ever descends from the female family of Curlin. Broken Silence was sold in foal to Ghostzapper for \$170,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale. The produce she was carrying at the time, a filly, fetched \$435,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. The mare was represented by a colt of 2017 by Verrazano and was most recently bred to the latter's sire More Than Ready.

Farrell captured a pair of graded stakes at Fair Grounds in early 2017--the GII Rachel Alexandra S. and the GII Fair Grounds Oaks --before finishing last in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 5 at Churchill Downs. A well-beaten fifth in the Dogwood S. at Churchill Sept. 23, she exited a victory in the GII Chilukki S. under the Twin Spires Nov. 4.

The dark bay raced off to grab the early lead, but was pressured to the outside by Terra Promessa (Curlin) through opening fractions of :23.32 and :46.94. The two of them were six lengths clear of the field entering the far turn as Farrell found another gear at the top of the stretch. Farrell put that rival away, but had to hold off the late charge of Ever So Clever inside the final furlong for the wire-to-wire victory.

"Just handicapping the race, I was kind of hoping we would draw outside Terra Promessa, just to kind of make it a little simpler," said winning jockey Channing Hill. "But the filly broke sharp today and put me on the pace. Her ears never came back until I asked her to run. That other filly [Ever So Clever], give her a lot of credit. January 14, 1932...Jockey Eddie Arcaro rode his first career winner at Agua Caliente.

January 15, 1932...Australian champion Phar Lap arrived in San Francisco. He was shipped by steamship to the U.S., en route to Agua Caliente in Mexico, where he was to make his North American racing debut in the March 20 Agua Caliente H., then the continent's richest race.

January 15, 1969...Barbara Jo Rubin was named to ride in a race at Tropical Park. Thirteen male riders subsequently boycotted the race rather than compete against a female, and were fined \$100 each.
