TIZ THE LAW BACK TO HIS BEST IN HOLY BULL

While it briefly looked like he was finding similar traffic trouble to what he faced when a disappointing third in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 30, last year's leading juvenile colt Tiz the Law (Constitution) kicked off his sophomore season Saturday with an impressive tally in Gulfstream's GIII Holy Bull S. Drifting up to 6-5 at the off as well-connected **Toledo** (Into Mischief) took late action, the blaze-faced bay broke like a shot but rider Manny Franco took a hard hold of him to concede the early advantage to Ete Indien (Summer Front). He found himself shuffled all the way back to fourth heading down the backside after getting squeezed out of a spot, and had to be guided into the clear and ridden along by Franco to find a more comfortable position. Ete Indien got the half in :46.60, and Tiz the Law was soon on him as they headed for home. Tiz the Law had about a half length on his pesky foe when he hit the quarter pole and, after crossing over on him once clear, pulled away to a threelength victory. There was a chasm of 11 lengths back to Toledo in third.

"He ran like I expected him," Franco said. "He got out of there and I was able to decide where I wanted to be. For a second, I had to make the turn and I was back on the rail, but when I saw those guys putting pressure on, I was able to drop back and get outside where I wanted to be. After that, he jumped in the bit and I was traveling like I wanted."

THOUSAND WORDS THREE THOUSANDTH WINNER FOR BAFFERT

Albaugh Family Stables and Spendthrift Farm's \$1-million Thousand Words (Pioneerof the Nile) provided Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert with his 3,000th career victory--and eighth in this race--with a gutsy effort in Saturday's GIII Robert B. Lewis S. at Santa Anita. A debut winner sprinting here Oct. 26, he was last seen besting GI TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Anneau d'Or (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GII Los Alamitos Futurity Dec. 7 and was pounded down to 3-5 to remain unbeaten. Breaking in slightly, the bay was unhurried early by Flavien Prat as fellow Baffert trainee High Velocity (Quality Road) showed the way. Thousand Words was able to creep closer up a wideopen rail into a :47.20 half, and bowled his way through a tight seam between High Velocity and Tizamagician (Tiznow) at the head of the lane. He eventually wore down his stablemate before holding off longshot Royal Act (American Pharoah) by 3/4 of a length. Cont. p5

The recipient of a strong 90 Beyer Speed Figure for a 4 1/4-length debut score against fellow New York-beds at Saratoga Aug. 8, Tiz the Law turned in another powerhouse performance when besting Saturday's GIII Swale S. third Green Light Go (Hard Spun) in the GI Champagne S. going a one-turn mile at Belmont in October. His connections opted to skip a cross-country trip to Santa Anita for the GI TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and instead gave him a tour around Churchill Downs in the Kentucky Jockey Club, but he could only manage third in the slop at 3-5 with some traffic trouble that many felt he should've overcome. Last month's GIII Lecomte S. winner Enforceable (Tapit) finished one spot behind Tiz the Law in that event.

"His race was perfect," said trainer Barclay Tagg, who teamed up with owner Sackatoga Stables to take the 2003 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner another New York-bred in Funny Cide (Distorted Humor). "We told [Franco], 'Stay off the rail no matter what you have to do. Lose the ground and go around them... It worked out perfectly."

Tiz the Law could make his next start at Fair Grounds.

"We'll try to stretch it out a little bit," Tagg said. "They're just young horses. We'll probably go to Louisiana [for the Mar. 21 [GII] Louisiana Derby], but I'm not sure."


Part of a huge first season with runners for his young sire Constitution, Tiz the Law's dam took the 2009 GII San Gorgonio H. over nine grassy panels. Tizfiz's full-brother Fury Kapcori was a Grade I-placed juvenile and annexed the GIII Precisionist S. as a 4-year-old on the Santa Anita main track. Tizfiz produced a Mission Impazible filly in 2018 and colt by the same New York-based sire in 2019. She was bred back to Constitution for 2020.



"He ran very well," Prat said. "He put me in a good spot and he was comfortable down there. He took the dirt well and when I asked him to run, he really accelerated."

Baffert said, "Prat knows him pretty well; I didn't give him any instructions. Both riders were kind of on their own. Prat says he is getting better, he was a sort of immature colt. He grinds and you gotta really work at him. Being stuck down inside he got the worst of it. Usually a young horse like that they don't run that well and they don't respond. He's got that big long stride and the further the better with him. You could tell about the last 50 yards he was really getting going. He came back he wasn't even tired so that is a good sign. He is progressing with every race and to win three in a row like that it is pretty impressive."

As for his own career milestone, the conditioner said, "I've always thought things happen for a reason. Running in the Bob Lewis, with a horse named Thousand Words and going for 3,000 wins. I mean you can't make that up. I had a feeling it was going to happen in this race. I've had a lot of good people work for me through the years, the first 50 wins were probably the hardest, 100 were life changers. I feel very blessed and fortunate that I've been able to last this in this business and do so well in this business after coming from the Quarter Horse business. I've never dreamt of coming into Thoroughbreds, there was never one instant I was thinking about it. I came over with Mike Pegram and Hal Earnhardt who I still have after all these years, they are a big part of the team." Cont. p6

Thousand Words is one of 14 graded winners for his late sire, who of course was also responsible for the Baffert-trained Triple Crown-winning sire of Royal Act. He was his sire's second most expensive yearling (and most expensive colt) when he brought and even \$1 million at the 2018 Keeneland September sale. Dam Pomeroys Pistol, a MGSW sprinter for owner/breeder/trainer Amy Tarrant, sold for \$475,000 to Mike Ryan at last month's Keeneland January sale in foal to Arrogate. A full-sibling to Thousand Words was born dead in 2018, and Pomeroys Pistol produced a Hard Spun colt in 2019.

Max Player went from maiden winner to graded winner by outstaying his competition in Saturday's GIII Withers S. His victory was both the first black-type and graded for sire Honor Code (A.P. Indy), whose Lane's End barn mate Tonalist was also represented by his first graded winner Saturday in the form of GIII Forward Gal S. romper Tonalist's Shape. Awkward early but flying home late when second on debut going a mile at Parx Nov. 12, Max Player broke through in the slop by 4 1/4 lengths back in Bensalem Dec. 17, and was flattered when three of the foes behind him that day came back to grab their diplomas.

Climbing into the kickback a bit while third last around the first bend, Max Player advanced out wide down the backside behind splits of :23.96 and :49.16. Seemingly ridden busily while losing ground heading for home, he started to find his best stride near the quarter pole and was one of many still in with a chance at that point. GII Remsen S. winner Shotski boxed on up front, but Max Player continued to grind it out down the center of the track and struck the front in the final sixteenth before widening his advantage to a convincing margin.

"It was a good thing I watched his replays coming into today," said winning rider Dylan Davis. "He doesn't like too much kickback. He broke well for me today and right when the first kickback came to him into the first turn, he immediately got distracted. I got him back outside and he got on pace and started running well. Going into the second turn, he was traveling well and I had to get into him early because he started getting a little green. Once he got to the stretch he was all business." Cont. p7

Conditioner Linda Rice added, "He's becoming more professional all the time in his morning workouts. Anyone that watched his two races at Parx could see he ran pretty green... He got pinched out a little bit into the first turn and Dylan [Davis] did a nice job of getting him back into the race and into the clear. He had a bit of a wide trip, but it was a great ride by Dylan. He's shown us in the morning that he's had a lot of run at the end of his workouts."

Of what could be next for the colt, Rice said, "I would think the [Apr. 4 GII] Wood Memorial would be the right spot. I don't want to shorten him up to one turn in the [Mar. 7 Gotham at the Big A]. We'll point towards the Wood and whether we do something in between, [owner/breeder George Hall] and I will figure that out."

Pedigree Notes:

'TDN Rising Star' Honor Code (A.P. Indy) annexed the trackand-trip GII Remsen S. late in his 2-year-old season in 2013, and added highest-level wins in the Metropolitan H. and Whitney S. as a 4-year-old. Broodmare sire Not For Love is responsible for the dams of eight other graded winners, including Max Player's half-brother Seahenge and two-time Horse of the Year California Chrome, who also hails from the A.P. Indy sire line. Dam Fools in Love was an \$80,000 yearling who earned her stakes victory going a two-turn seven furlongs at Delta Downs.

Her half-brother International Star (Fusaichi Pegasus) swept the Fair Grounds graded Triple Crown preps in 2015, the same year Fools in Love produced Seahenge (Scat Daddy), who would sell to Coolmore's MV Magnier for \$750,000 at the following year's Keeneland September sale. Seahenge went on to take the G2 Champagne S. and finish third in the G1 Darley Dewhurst S. in 2017, and Fools in Love brought \$1 million from Cheveley Park Stud in foal to Speightstown that Keeneland November. She failed to have a foal in 2018, but produced a Ulysses (Ire) colt in 2019.

Since returning from an 18-month absence and joining this barn early last year, Midcourt had not finished outside the top three and that streak continued Saturday with a powerful frontrunning display in the GII San Pasqual S. at Santa Anita.

Though there appeared to be plenty of speed signed on, none of those that showed the most early interest seemed overly keen to make the running, and Victor Espinoza seized the initiative, sending Midcourt into the lead passing under the line with a circuit to travel. Allowed to roll along comfortably through a half-mile in :47.31, the 5-year-old was asked to quicken at the 3 1/2-furlong pole and led clear passing the quarter pole. He responded to a couple of right-handed cracks of the whip inside the furlong marker and proved not for catching.

Runner-up in maiden company in his return to action just shy of a year ago, Midcourt strung together four in a row, including the Comma To the Top S. at this venue Oct. 27 from off the pace and Del Mar's GIII Native Diver S. on the engine Nov. 23. The dark bay was off slowly when last seen in the GII San Antonio S. Dec. 28 and could finish only third behind 'TDN Rising Star' Gift Box (Twirling Candy).

Midcourt is out of Mayo On the Side, who upset Azeri (Jade Hunter) in the GI Humana Distaff H. for Lothenbach Stables and Carl Nafzger back in 2004. Midcourt, who is also a half-brother to the dam of Mexican Horse of the Year Kukulkan (Mex) (Point Determined), is the last listed produce for his dam.





Last term's GII Saratoga Special S. winner and GI Champagne S. runner-up Green Light Go and the runaway debut winner Untitled (Khozan) took all the money here, but it was Mischevious Alex who ran more like an odds-on favorite.

Swiftly into stride from the inside post, the last-out runaway winner of the Parx Juvenile S. held inside position at the fence as the two market leaders lingered behind. Both Green Light Go and Untitled were up and down approaching the stretch, but Mischevious Alex, who turned for home in complete command, had plenty left and shot clear en route to a daylight victory.

Mischevious Alex, a narrow debut winner at Parx last June, was a close third in Monmouth's Sapling S. Sept. 1. He followed his lone off-the-board finish in the grassy Laurel Futurity Sept. 21 with an impressive score with blinkers added in the Parx Juvenile last time Nov. 5.

"If you throw out this horse's turf race, he should be undefeated," winning trainer John Servis said. "He's always been a push-button horse, but very green. When we did decided to put the blinkers on him, that's when he started to mind his business. I really think, me personally, a one-turn mile is going to really hit him on the head. Is he a mile and a quarter horse? I don't think so."

Two-time winner White Pants Night was purchased as a broodmare prospect by WinStar Farm for \$100,000 at the 2014 KEENOV Sale. 

Not away particularly quickly, the favorite advanced down the backside and was third out in the clear as they entered the bend. She seemed to idle for a few strides midway around the turn, but Eclipse-winning pilot Irad Ortiz, Jr. soon gave a confident flick of his stick and she started to take off. She bounded clear in upper stretch, and was wrapped up late after proving too much for her competition to handle.

Debuting Nikki and Papa, a \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream purchase last term, broke in very badly from the rail, but ran well to make up the ground she spotted her more experienced foes to get up for third.

"I got a perfect trip," said winning pilot Irad Ortiz, Jr. "She broke out of there a little slow, but she usually does that. She worked her way up pretty quick and after that I just went with the flow. When I asked her turning for home, she really responded. She did everything right."

Joseph added, "It's so important that she wins a graded stake because they paid good money for her and now it makes her valuable in that sense. This race came by design. It was to give her a break for the Forward Gal and go through the Gulfstream series because they have a good series for 3-year-old fillies. Today was the first stepping stone. She did everything we asked. She was a farther back in the beginning. I know cutting back, she doesn't really want to be [sprinting], but it was the right way to get her where we need to get her. She did everything we asked and we can't be more proud of her.

"She's not flashy, but she's going to do what she needs to do. I'm just glad to have her and thankful that the owners put her in our barn. She's won with four different riders and she could have probably won with four different trainers. All being well, we'll go in the [Feb. 29 GII] Davona Dale and the [Mar. 29 GII] Gulfstream Park Oaks. That would be a good plan for her."

Pedigree Notes:

Tonalist's Shape was the also first black-type winner for her Classic-winning 'TDN Rising Star' sire. She RNA'd for \$60,000 at OBS April after breezing in :10 2/5. Her dam annexed the Panthers S. going a mile at Prairie Meadows in 2013 and was second by a nose sprinting on the Turfway all-weather in the 2014 Holiday Inaugural S. Second dam Hi Tech Honeycomb also took the Panthers in 2002, and was graded-placed on the grass and in the slop. ZAYAT ADDRESSES MAKER COMPLAINT

Jay Ingle, an attorney with the Lexington, Kentucky-based law firm Jackson Kelly PLLC, released a statement on behalf of owner Ahmed Zayat Saturday morning addressing the complaint filed by trainer Mike Maker in Jefferson County Court this past Thursday seeking better than \$120,000 in alleged unpaid training bills.

"This lawsuit from Mike Maker is absurd," the statement read. "Ahmed Zayat made all payments required under his prior settlement with Mr. Maker until MGG seized control of Zayat Stables' bank account last month. It is outrageous for Mr. Maker to cry foul given that he agreed to the terms of the workout, which Mr. Zayat has fully honored in an effort to keep his business afloat and repay each of his creditors. To suggest he's done anything less and accuse Mr. Zayat of fraud is scurrilous and defamatory. Mr. Zayat fully expects this lawsuit will be

dismissed and intends to seek appropriate sanctions against Mr. Maker for pursuing this malicious action."

Zayat Stables and its horses were put into receivership Jan. 22 and a \$23-million lawsuit was filed MGG Investment Group in Fayette County courts. In an action of his own Jan. 28, Zayat filed a motion asking the same court to dissolve the receivership and to allow MGG and Zayat to resolve the dispute in a different manner.

Chiefswood Stable homebred **Edge of Fire** (Curlin) was crunched into 17-10 favoritism off a morning line nearly three times that and the money proved smart indeed, as the chestnut wheeled off heels passing the midstretch marker and went on to a deceptively easy two-length debut score and '**TDN Rising Star**' honors in the process.

Away fairly, but given a busy ride by Jose Ortiz, Edge of Fire--who blew out three furlongs in a bullet :35 1/5 Jan. 28--was rousted along and responded to sit just behind the leading trio while well in hand on the turn. Held together into the final three-sixteenths of a mile, Ortiz switched him out at the furlong grounds and never asked his colt for anything approaching a top effort while edging away to score by daylight. The well-tried **Tapi Frost** (Tapizar) hit the front inside the eighth pole, but was no match for the winner and settled for second.

The winner is the first foal from his dam, third in the 2015 GIII Selene S. and a daughter of Chiefswood's Essential Edge (Storm Cat), victorious in the grassy GII Canadian S. and third in the Bison City S. during her sophomore season. Edge of Fire's third dam Rose of Tara (Ire) (Generous {Ire}) was a half-sister to champion Salsabil (Ire) and G1SW Marju (Ire) and served as the second dam of MGSW Flameaway (Scat Daddy). Chiefswood's MGSW and Woodbine course-record holder Tiz A Slam (Tiznow) also appears under the third dam. Leading Edge is the dam of the 2-year-old filly Hard Edge (Hard Spun) and a yearling Pioneerof the Nile filly. She was most recently covered by Justify.

FRIENDS CELEBRATE WIN IN AFRICA'S RICHEST RACE

They say winning is more fun with friends, and that was certainly the case on Saturday for The Big Five Syndicate—a group of familiar industry faces from Ireland and the U.S.—as it celebrated its victory in the CTS 1600, Africa's joint-richest race with a purse of R5-million (£252,322/€300,317), at Kenilworth Racecourse in Cape Town, South Africa, with the ascendant 3-year-old colt **Count Jack (SAf)** (Jackson {SAf}).

The Big Five comprises Mick Flanagan, Tom Ryan, Craig Bernick, David Cox, Justin Casse, Ross Doyle and Anna Doyle, the latter of whom was in Cape Town to collect the trophy with husband Peter. The CTS 1600 was one of two sales races staged on the G1 Sun Met undercard, in addition to the CTS 1200. Both are non black-type races restricted to graduates of Cape Thoroughbred Sales yearling sales and are the joint-richest races in Africa with purses of R5-million apiece.

About an hour after the race on Saturday afternoon, Mick Flanagan was heading into Dublin to celebrate at the rugby with Ross Doyle and David Cox, and he explained how he and Ross Doyle landed on Count Jack for R250,000 (£12,616/€15,016) at the 2018 Cape Premier Yearling Sale. Cont. p2

Somewhere along the way, the Sport of Kings became the racing industry. That was inevitable because that's the way of the modern world in which most people have to earn a living. However, for many it remains a sport in which the joy comes from taking part, with the wins being the icing on the cake and any financial return a bonus.

Few have played the game with a truer Corinthian spirit or more successfully than Bertram and Diana Firestone, who have graced the upper echelons of the sport which they love for half a century.

Last month, Mr and Mrs Firestone, with a characteristic absence of fanfare, completed the dispersal of their stud as their last broodmare Tap Shoes (Tapit) passed through the ring at the Keeneland January Sale, along with two yearlings and a couple of 2-year-old fillies.

"When I was starting out, I used to tag around at the sales in Johannesburg with Peter Doyle, so for the last five or six years we all met down there after Christmas in January and that year we teamed up and bought a couple horses," Flanagan said. "The

other horse we bought, he won a couple races and we sold him on to Mauritius. We saw this colt at the Kieswetters' farm [Highlands Stud, in the Western Cape and formerly owned by the Beck family] and liked him. We all sat with each other at the sale and ate and drank together, and ended up buying him together."

The other colt was a R525,000 (£26,494/€31,533) son of Gimmethegreenlight (Aus), and while Flanagan admitted he blew the budget, he is betting his partners have forgiven him.

"Tom Ryan is in the partnership, and at the time I asked him to come in he said, 'don't spend more than \$10,000," Flanagan recalled. "Well, I ended up spending about \$50,000 on the two

horses. I gave him the bad news a few days later, but he was game and he's had a blast as well."

Flanagan is well-versed in the South African industry, having spent some of his formative years working in the nation.

"We've been going down to South Africa for years," he said. "I

first started going there when I was about 19 or 20. I worked for Mick Goss at Summerhill Stud and then was an assistant to Mike de Kock, so I've always had a bit of an attachment to the country. I try to go down there once or twice a year. It's a pity I couldn't be there today but we will be back, and onwards and upwards with Count Jack."

After the group secured Count Jack two years ago, they sent him to trainer Brett Crawford.

"We've had horses with Brett

Crawford before and he's a great guy, he's based in Cape Town and knows exactly what he's doing," Flanagan said. "He's done a fabulous job with the horse; he's not the easiest horse in the world, he's quite a handful, but he's obviously done a great job."

Count Jack didn't step out until after his third birthday last September, and after running fourth first out he graduated at Kenilworth on Oct. 29. He slipped back to fifth in a 1400 metre handicap two weeks later but bounced back to win a pair of handicaps over the CTS 1600 course and distance prior to Saturday's mild upset win at 15/2.

"Brett was always high on this horse," Flanagan said. "He gave him a bit of time but once he hit the track he hit it running. [Jockey] Pierre Corne Orffer, who is a great friend of mine who I used to pal around with when I worked for Mike de Kock in Durban, he gave the horse a great ride [on Saturday]. It's good for a number of different reasons and everyone's gotten a kick out of it."

South Africa's complicated equine export protocols have meant that yearling prices in the country have typically been capped, as it is difficult and expensive for buyers to export their purchases and for breeders to trade in foreign markets, but that element combined with a weak currency, on the flip side, has meant that shrew overseas shoppers can find horses at a premium with a good shot at making money racing locally.

It was announced last autumn, however, that purses at most of the country's tracks would be slashed by an average of 13%. One of the country's most important races, the G1 Sun Met also staged on Saturday, was among the races hit hardest, its purse dropped from R5-million to R3-million.

But Flanagan-who has had pieces of up to six horses in training at a time in South Africa-said there is still upside to buying and racing horses in South Africa.

"I've been doing this four or five years now and I've only sent money down one time," he said. "I think the cost to reward ratio racing a horse is actually very good there. The landscape is obviously changing with a couple guys no longer involved and different things happening politically, but it's a good, fun place, and who doesn't love winning races in Cape Town in the month of January? It provides a great platform for people to get into horses and enjoy it. I can't see us not doing it again. It's been a pretty sweet experience. It's just a bloody great day."

The Firestones have thus brought the curtain down on one of the most special bloodstock operations of the modern era, one which has been a successful, popular, passionate and dignified player at a high level on both sides of the Atlantic since they enjoyed their first top-level victory in May 1971 when King's Company (Ire) (King's Troop {GB}) landed the Irish 2000 Guineas at the Curragh before taking the Cork And Orrery S. at Royal Ascot the following month.

By this time, Bertram Firestone had built up a successful real estate business in the U.S., primarily in Florida. (He would later merge his real estate and racing involvements when for a time he owned both Gulfstream Park and Calder Racecourse). He and his wife were not, though, coming to ownership as inexperienced enthusiasts but as long-standing, hands-on horse-people. Both were extremely competent show-jumpers

and for many years they hunted in Virginia with the Loudoun and Middleburg Hunts. Mr Firestone had spent a summer early in the 1950s as an exercise rider for Charlie Whittingham at Santa Anita. Later in life he would put the skills which he had learned there to good use when he rode in a couple of amateurs' races in Ireland, winning the Madhatters' Private Sweepstakes in 1974, and also training some of their own horses in the U.S. for a period in the early 1980s. Meanwhile Diana Firestone would always be involved in the breaking-in of the horses on their stud.

King's Company's success stemmed from a union of kindred spirits because he was trained by one of the legends of the saddle. The colt had been raced as a 2-year-old by Mrs. R. Vereker when, trained at The Curragh by David Ainsworth, he had won two of Ireland's premier juvenile events, the National S. and the Irish Chorus S.

Sent to Tattersalls's 1970 December Sale in Newmarket, he was bought there by Mr Firestone for 35,000gns and sent back to Ireland to join the first-season stable of the great horseman Willie Robinson, who was setting up as a trainer after a stellar race-riding career which had seen him complete the treble of the three greatest jumps races (the Grand National, Cheltenham Gold Cup and Champion Hurdle) and also ride a place-getter in the greatest Flat race, bringing Paddy's Point (GB) (Mieuxce {Fr}) home second in the 1958 Derby.

With one of the best colts in Europe on their hands, the Firestones were in a perfect position to establish their own stud. Consequently, they bought Gilltown Stud and Sallymount Stud in Co. Kildare from the Aga Khan, and King's Company retired to the historic 1,200-acre Gilltown property in 1972.

Thereafter the Firestones increasingly became highly successful as breeders as well as owners, to the extent that they were honoured in America with the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Owners in 1980 and the New York Turf Writers Association Award for Outstanding Breeders in 1982.

The Firestones' next top-class horse was, like King's Company, also trained in Ireland. Red Alert (Ire) (Red God {Ire}) won the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot and Stewards' Cup H. at Glorious Goodwood in the summer of 1974, ridden each time by Johnny Roe. As had been the case when they had sent King's Company to Willie Robinson, with Red Alert they again gave a budding trainer a chance. Dermot Weld had taken over his father's stable

at The Curragh at the end of the 1972 season and Red Alert proved to be one of the horses who put him on the map. This turned out to be the start of a beautiful friendship, with the Firestone/Weld combination becoming as harmonious and long-lasting as it was successful.

Dermot Weld took time to reflect on them as both patrons and friends. He said, "They were wonderful owners to train for. We had a lot of success together: Classic winners, Group 1 winners, many stakes winners. Blue

Wind winning the Epsom and Irish Oaks and being the Champion filly of her year was a highlight. She was very, very good, a brilliant filly. Theatrical was a very good horse; second, beaten half a length, in the Irish Derby and then going on to win all those Grade Is in America."

Weld continued, "They loved Royal Ascot and we had some great days with them there. Nanticious winning the Ribblesdale S. and Day Is Done taking the Norfolk stand out. And going right back we had Red Alert. That was right at the start of my career and it was a great boost to a young trainer to be training for major international owners. They gave me great support throughout.

"On a personal note, they became great friends of our family and I enjoyed many days out hunting with them when they were Joint-Masters of the Kildare Foxhounds. They were much more than just owners: they were and are great friends, wonderful people." Having got the ball rolling in Europe, the Firestones soon began having top-class winners back home in the U.S. too. In 1975 they owned the two best 2-year-olds in the land. Mr Firestone raced the Leroy Jolley-trained Honest Pleasure (What A Pleasure) who was awarded the Eclipse Award for champion 2-year-old colt in 1975 as a result of his victories in the GI Arlington-Washington Futurity, the GI Laurel Futurity and the GI Champagne S. Mrs Firestone raced the Jolley-trained Optimistic Gal (Sir Ivor) who ended the year as the top-weighted filly on the 2-year-old Free Handicap after victories in five graded stakes including the GI Matron S., the GI Selima S. and the GI Frizette S. Both horses excelled again the next year, Honest Pleasure taking the GI Flamingo S., the GI Florida Derby, the GI Blue Grass S. and

the GI Travers S. as well as finishing second in the GI Kentucky Derby; and Optimistic Gal winning the GII Kentucky Oaks, the GI Alabama S., GI Delaware H. and GI Spinster S.

The Firestones' next champion was What A Summer (What Luck) who, trained by Jolley, was awarded the Eclipse Award for champion sprinter in 1977 after a campaign which yielded victories in four graded stakes headed by the GI Go For Wand H. The same year they nearly won another Classic in Europe when the aforementioned Weld-trained

Nanticious (Nantallah) was beaten in a photo-finish in the G1 Irish Guinness Oaks after winning the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot.

One could say that the Firestones enjoyed their golden racing age through the '70s and '80s. The champions just kept coming. Pole position in their pantheon has to go to the mighty Genuine Risk (Exclusive Native), one of the few fillies to take the Kentucky Derby (in 1980). Leroy Jolley had been understandably cautious about taking on the colts at Churchill Downs but the Firestones (who were always happy to have their fillies or mares take on the males, as Genuine Risk had already done when a strong-finishing third in the GI Wood Memorial S.) decided upon the bold option, with the confidence of jockey Jacinto Vasquez helping to firm up the plan. Happily, fortune favoured the brave, Genuine Risk going one better than both Honest Pleasure and the Firestones' brilliant home-bred General Assembly (Secretariat) had done.

The latter was a terrific horse who won the GI Hopeful S. as a 2-year-old in 1978 and then broke Saratoga's 10-furlong record when winning the GI Travers S. at three. He subsequently spent several seasons in the '80s at stud in Ireland at Gilltown alongside their 1980 GI Laurel Futurity winner Cure The Blues (Stop The Music).

Inevitably, 1980 ended with Genuine Risk, who had followed up her Kentucky Derby triumph by taking the GI Ruffian H. back against her own sex, honoured with the Eclipse Award for champion 3-year-old filly. The following year further honours flooded in. Blue Wind (Ire) (Lord Gayle), the Oaks winner at both Epsom and The Curragh, was champion 3-year-old filly in both

Britain and Ireland, and the Francois Boutin-trained April Run (Ire) (Run The Gantlet) was champion 3-year-old filly in France; while G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Play It Safe (Ire) (Red Alert {Ire}) was champion 2-year-old filly in France. Further Royal Ascot glory came that year courtesy of the victory of Day Is Done (Ire) (Artaius), trained by Weld to win the G3 Norfolk S.

April Run had been a wonderful filly as a 3-year-old in 1981 but proved even better in 1982. In addition to a

rewarding campaign in France, she landed two championship events in the U.S., the GI Turf Classic (repeating her win in the previous year's renewal) and the GI Washington DC International. She ended the year with the Eclipse Award for champion female turf horse and as champion older mare in France. Her final appearance of the season came in Tokyo when she finished third in the G1 Japan Cup behind another Firestone horse, the Stanley Hough-trained Half Iced (Hatchet Man). There was plenty of jocular family rivalry in the unsaddling enclosure afterwards as Mr Firestone observed, "I am happy that my horse won the race and my wife's horse was third!" (This came about because, while they owned the horses together, they would generally put the fillies in her name and the colts in his)

The two batches of yearlings which the Firestones dispatched to Dermot Weld's Curragh stable in the autumns of 1983 and '84 each yielded a home-bred star. In the early days, Flash Of Steel (Ire) (Kris {GB}) fared better, as he showed by taking the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas in 1986.

Even as youngsters, though, Theatrical wasn't far behind; witness his win in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial and his second place in the G1 Irish Sweeps Derby of 1985. In maturity, however, Theatrical reigned supreme. Transferred to the U.S., he scooped the Eclipse Award for champion male turf horse under Bill Mott's care in 1987, the award being a formality after he had won six Grade I races, culminating in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, through the season.

Unsurprisingly, the professionals who have enjoyed the Firestones' patronage speak of them with genuine warmth and affection. Bill Mott's respect for them is immense, regarding them as key people in the development of his career.

"I can take you back to when I started training for them," he

said. "I was training in Kentucky on the Kentucky/Chicago/New Orleans/Arkansas Midwest circuit. Their manager called me and asked me to interview for a position in the fall of '86. They flew me up to Catoctin Stud and offered me a job, which would take me from my place in Kentucky, where I was doing well, to New York.

"This was a great opportunity to break into New York, training all their horses there. Initially I didn't know about Theatrical, who was with Bobby Frankel at the time, but

after a couple of months Mr Firestone asked me to train him too. He was my first champion, winning six Grade I races in '87 including my first Breeders' Cup race, and being champion turf horse. "

Mott continued, "They were so generous to me, giving me that great opportunity. Moving from the Midwest to New York, sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn't. But training for them was wonderful. They were the most generous and kind people you could possibly have worked for. They had already had great success with horses like Honest Pleasure and Genuine Risk, and it was a great to know them, befriend them, be around them. They were so good to me and my family. Everyone who spent time around them seemed to do well and be better for the experience.

"They are great horse-people. They understand horses, understand racing. They are people who are passionate about the horses themselves, and when people are passionate about the horses as individuals, then it makes it easy for everything to go well."

The year following Theatrical's tour de force saw Grade I glory for another former Weld inmate, Gaily Gaily (Ire) (Cure The Blues), taking the GI Flower Bowl H. from Mott's barn. She was a terrific mare, landing her first pattern win (in, appropriately, the G3 C. L. Weld Park S. at The Curragh) in 1985 and her final one (in the GIII Modesty H. at Arlington Park) in 1990. In 1988, another Eclipse Award came the Firestones' way when the Jonathan Sheppard-trained Jimmy Lorenzo (GB) (Our Jimmy) collected champion steeplechase horse.

The couple began to scale back their involvement at the end of the 1980s, selling Gilltown and Sallymount back to the Aga Khan in 1989. They also sold Catoctin, their 2,000-acre stud in Virginia, but they did replace it with another magnificent, albeit smaller, property, Newstead. Top-level success started to come less frequently, although their home-bred 1992 GI Hollywood Derby hero Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}) won four graded stakes for them before being sold and picking up an Eclipse award in 1994 for his new owner. Other stars whom they bred who ended up winning big races for others included 1981 Washington DC International winner Providential (Ire) (Run The Gantlet), 1993 G1 Melbourne Cup and dual G1 Irish St Leger hero Vintage Crop (GB) (Rousillon) and Steady Flame (GB) (General Assembly), a three-time champion sprinter in Hong Kong (where he raced as Quicken Away). The terrific home-bred Winchester (Theatrical) became their final winner at the top level when carrying their green and white livery to victory in four Grade I races between 2008 and 2011. He was trained by Dermot Weld for the first of those wins (in the 2008 GI Arlington Million) and by Christophe Clement for the subsequent ones.

Clement has been their American trainer in recent years and he leaves one in no doubt how much he has valued his association with the couple, reflecting, "It was an honour when Mr and Mrs Firestone contacted me through Fiona Craig to train for them. Very rarely will one train for people who have been a leading owner and breeder in both the States and Europe. It was also a touch intimidating, as Mr Firestone had a great knowledge of racing through his time as a trainer and in racetrack ownership."

He added, "Of course, it has also been very rewarding to have stakes horses for them like Winchester, who won multiple Grade Is in New York. Mr and Mrs Firestone are wonderful owners: they are great horse-people and the horses always come first."

The Firestones loved every aspect of their transcontinental racing enterprise, with horses trained in the U.S., Ireland and France (and occasionally in England). They delighted both in the general sporting involvement and in their success, and would invariably travel to the big races, wherever they were. Of all the destinations, though, Ireland arguably suited them best and they

made many friends there. Life in Kildare revolved around horses and horse-people; not just around the racehorses and breeding stock, but also the stable of hunters which they rode with the Kildare Hunt.

Aside from Dermot Weld's jockeys Mick Kinane and Pat Smullen, another horseman who featured in their life in Ireland was the great T. P. Burns, the legend of the saddle who as an apprentice between the wars had ridden gallops alongside Steve Donoghue and who in 1957 had recorded the remarkable double of riding a winner over jumps at the Cheltenham Festival in the spring and a British Classic winner (the Vincent O'Brien-trained Ballymoss (Ire) (Mossborough {GB}) in the St Leger) in the autumn. Burns, long since retired from the saddle, was working as an assistant to Weld when the idea was floated that he might ride in the odd veterans' race. When the 65-year-old finally rode his last winner (at Punchestown in July 1989) it was on board the Firestones' Old Man River (GB) (Artaius).

Pat Smullen, who rode their Irish horses in more recent years, winning big races on the likes of 2002 G3 Ballycorus S. victrix Rum Charger (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire) and her son Winchester as well as 2001 G3 Greenlands S. winner Final Exam (Ire) (College Chapel {GB}), reflects, "For me, personally, first and foremost, they are a lady, Diana, and a gentleman, Bert. That comes before any business associations. It was always a pleasure to ride for them. They have a great knowledge of the game which always shone through, especially when anything went wrong. They could read a race from a jockey's point of view and were so understanding. I have nothing but good memories of great enjoyment with them."

On the fringes of top-class competition in 2019, the G3 Sandown Classic Trial winner Bangkok made the switch to the all-weather in effortless fashion to open up new possibilities. Also runner-up in the 12-furlong G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot in June and in York's G3 Strensall S. over nearly nine furlongs in August, the bay was last seen finishing second in the Qatar Derby at Doha in December. Anchored in mid-division early, he was eased into contention down the back straight and after seizing control with a furlong remaining readily drew clear.

Bangkok's listed-placed dam has proven a prolific producer, responsible for five black-type performers including the listed winner and Polytrack specialist Matterhorn who was also placed in last year's G2 Huxley S. and G2 Solonaway S., G3 Brigadier Gerard S., G3 Superior Mile and G3 Winter Hill S. Her daughter Mujarah (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) threw Ribchester (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) who conquered the G1 Queen Anne S., G1 Lockinge S., G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois and G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. A daughter of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Mehthaaf (Nureyev) from the famed dynasty of the high-class Elnadim (Danzig) and Occupandiste (Ire) (Kaldoun {Fr}), her yearling filly is by Churchill (Ire).

ONE WORLD UPSETS SUN MET

Runner-up in the G1 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate on Jan. 11, **One World (SAf)** (Captain Al {Saf}) made amends in a thrilling stretch duel with **Rainbow Bridge (SAf)** (Ideal World) in Saturday's G1 Sun Met at Kenilworth in Cape Town, springing a 15-1 upset

with favoured **Hawwaam (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}) coming from further back to be third.

Unbeaten through his first five runs at two, One World picked up a listed win at the end of that season and earned a first pattern win at three in the G2 Concorde Cup before finishing third in the G1 Cape Guineas. He took the R5-million CTS 1600 on this card a year ago and picked up a Group 3 win going a mile off a three-month rest last April. He picked up another Group 3 dropped back to seven furlongs at Durbanville in October before taking a Kenilworth conditions race and finishing second to Vardy (SAf) (Var) in the G2 Green Point S. on Dec. 14. He was again second to that rival in the Queen's Plate, but turned the tables here while racing beyond a mile for the first time, with Vardy failing to factor in sixth.

Spotting the pacesetting Head Honcho (SAf) (Querari {Ger}) a length through the first mile of the race, One World was left with the lead when that rival promptly retreated turning for home. Defending Sun Met winner Rainbow Bridge emerged from the pack and looked likely to blow right by One World, but the latter was game on the rail and held his rival at bay to win by a head.

Pedigree Notes

One World is the second black-type horse out of Aquilonia (GB) (Giant's Causeway), a granddaughter of Dinalina (Fr) (Top Ville {Ire}), best known as the dam of G1 Prix de Diane winner Caerlina (Ire) (Caerleon). Caerlina's descendants include G1 Prix Jacques le Marois winner and young sire Al Wukair (Ire) (Dream Ahead), as well as the 2018 G3 Prestige S. victress Antonia de Vega (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}). Aquilonia was bought for 95,000gns out of the Tattersalls December Mares Sale in 2006.

Prague | TDN AusNZ

In the Sydney juvenile features, it was a clean sweep for trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace and jockey Tom Marquand. Along with the likes of Cellsabeel (Hinchinbrook), Muntaseera (I Am Invincible) and A Beautiful Night (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), the stable has an array of 2-year-old talent to call on.

In Melbourne, Mildred was a gallant winner of the G3 Lamaro's Hotel South Melbourne Chairman's S. to boost trainer Grahame Begg's hopes of another G1 Blue Diamond S. victory after winning it with the now Widden Stud-based Written By in 2018.

Away Game was in dazzling form in Queensland in her summer preparation with success in the Listed Calaway Gal S. ahead of her dominant victory in the Magic Millions 2YO and she continued where she left off in some style on Saturday.

"She's thrived since then and she travelled down here well. When this race came up light I thought great, she can get enough money to get in the G1 Golden Slipper," said Ciaron Maher, who prepares the filly with David Eustace.

The winning cheque Away Game earned in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic, a Restricted Listed race, doesn't count toward a place in the Golden Slipper.

Away Game jumped well to land in front, but she didn't have it all her own way in a small field with September Run (Exceed And Excel) keeping her honest, but she kicked strongly to surge clear 200 metres from home under rider Tom Marquand to beat Centimental (Snitzel).

"She looked a bit lost out in front, but got the job done. She's now a dual stakes winner very early in her career," Maher said. "Tommy rode her very well and it's great to get another winner for the Mathiesen family.

"She's a very valuable filly and it's on to the Slipper. She might not race again before that, we'll just see. She doesn't need a lot of racing.

Marquand said Away Game's performance emphasised her class and tenacity.

"She had to do it the hard way, they didn't make it easy for me in front. She showed equal measures of grit and determination and she's clearly very talented and up with the best."

Away Game was sold at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling for \$425,000 by breeder Mill Park Stud and is a daughter of Elusive Wonder (Elusive Quality {USA}). Also the dam of the Listed Dequetteville S. winner Modern Wonder (Snitzel), Elusive Wonder was a 2-year-old winner and stakes placed and is a half-sister to the Listed McDougall S. winner Tantra (Royal Academy {USA}). It's also the family of the Listed Rotorua S. winner Oak Park (More Than Ready {USA}).

Colt stays unbeaten

Away Game's barnmate Prague (Redoute's Choice) kept his perfect record intact in the Canonbury having posted an impressive debut victory at Canterbury Park last month.

Marquand kept the colt one off the fence close to the pace and when he asked him to let down in the straight, the response was impressive and he strode away to beat Global Quest (More Than Ready {USA}).

"I just love his progression. He went to his first start and I thought he would improve in the coat and I'm rapt with him. He's a pretty exciting horse," Maher said.

"I had a bit of a feeling about him today with the shades on. There was a bit of timing about him and, again, the team have done a great job.

"Tom is riding up a storm and he had to feel for him, he got a bit lost when he got to the front, but he's a strong rider. "His old man Redoute's has passed away and hopefully he can fill the void in time. He's a very relaxed customer with a lot of improvement to come.

"He pinned his ears back and he's working out what it's all about. He's a great physical, very natural and a lovely temperament so he ticks all the boxes."

Maher has yet to decide whether Prague runs again before the Golden Slipper.

"He might need one more to get a bit more money and experience. I'm very, very happy," he said. "The stable is going well and it's exciting times. We just try and place the horses where we think they are best suited."

Marquand said he was confident of success with Prague a fair way out.

"He popped up into the bridle and three furlongs from home there was relatively little doubt what he'd do and he was strong to the line."

Prague was bred by GSA Bloodstock and was bought out of Bhima Thoroughbreds' draft at the Gold Coast by Aquis and Phoenix Thoroughbreds for \$1.6 million.

He is a half-brother to the two-time Group 1 winner Stratum Star (Stratum) with their dam Purely Spectacular (NZ) (Pins). She is a sister to the stakes winner and Group 1 performer Raid (NZ) and they are direct descendants of the former champion 3 and 4-year-old Emancipation (Bletchingly).

Rain no problem

At Caulfield, Mildred had to overcome a heavily rain-affected track in her first appearance since the spring and she did it in style, leading all the way under Jordan Childs.

"She goes out and puts it in the line every time, it's very exciting. I thought she might have been a bit underdone, but her work during the week was very encouraging," Begg said. "She'll probably run in the Talindert S. next, it's all about optimising her value with as much black type as possible."

Mildred is raced by Begg's father Neville, also a Group 1 winning trainer, and partners and was a \$45,000 purchase out of Middlebrook Valley Lodge's draft at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale.

She is a daughter of the Magic Millions 3YO Trophy winner Tempest Tost (Statue Of Liberty {USA), who has a 100 per cent record at stud with all four of her foals to race successful.

The mare is a half-sister to the G1 Salinger S. winner Notoire (Export Price {Fr}) and the Listed winner Well Known (The Pug {GB}). The pedigree also features the multiple stakes winner Happy Hippy (Shamardal {USA}), who also ran third in the G1 Queen of the Turf S.
